Overweight/Oversize Vehicle Permits

The Village of Carol Stream enforces overweight/oversize commercial vehicle(s). The primary duties of Truck Enforcement are:

- Enforcement of weight & size violations
- Checking truck safety violations and driver's license classification violations.

You will need an overweight/oversize commercial vehicle permit for any movement on the Village of Carol Stream maintained roadways with a non-divisible load that exceeds the following maximum weights & dimensions:

- 80,000 lbs gross weight
- 20,000 lbs single axle
- 34,000 lbs tandem axle
- 8' 6" width
- 13' 6" height
- 55' length

All permit requests **must** include a copy of Illinois State Permit and DuPage County Permit along with a check payable to the Village of Carol Stream. Fees for permits are:

- \$50.00 Single Trip (7 days)
- \$80.00 Round Trip (14 days)
- \$150.00 Multiple Trip (120 days) State & County permits must be issued and valid for the same time period.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

AGREEMENT: The acceptance of the permit by the grantee constitutes an agreement that the movement will be made strictly in compliance with the terms set forth in the permit.

JURISDICTION: The permit is effective only insofar as the Village has jurisdiction and does not release the grantee from complying with other existing laws that may apply to the movement.

OVERWEIGHT MOVEMENTS: An overweight permit authorizes the movement of a vehicle or a reasonably disassembled single object loaded on a vehicle combination. If stated in the permit, the object may include an attachment; however, it must be securely mounted on the object being moved. The attachment may not be hauled as a separate object on the vehicle combination.

LOCATIONS WHERE PERMIT IS NOT VALID: The permit is not valid on any highway or bridge posted for a load limit less than the gross weight of the move, on any highway closed to traffic, and on any highway not maintained by the Village of Carol Stream.

AUTHORIZED TIMES OF MOVEMENT: Movements are authorized from one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset, Monday through Friday, and from one half hour before sunrise until noon, Saturday. Movements are further restricted on specified holidays, beginning at noon the day preceding the holiday or the holiday weekend. The specified holidays are: new Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

HIGHWAY CONDITIONS: Movements shall not be made when highway is covered with snow or ice.

INCLEMENT WEATHER: When visibility is unduly impaired by rain, snow, fog, smog, or at any time travel conditions are considered to be unsafe by the Carol Stream Police Department.

RIGHT-OF-WAY DURING MOVEMENT: Insofar as practicable, movements shall be confined to a single traffic lane and shall be made in such a manner that the rest of the roadway will be open at all times so the flow of other traffic will not unnecessarily be obstructed. Also, insofar as practicable, other traffic will be given the right-of-way over this movement. The driver shall remove the vehicle from the roadway when necessary to allow an accumulation of traffic to pass or when so directed by a police officer.

SPEED: Maximum speed shall be 45 m.p.h. on all permit movements or 5 m.p.h. above the minimum posted speed limit, EXCEPT when otherwise specified on the permit. Legal weight, legal height movements up to and including 10 feet wide are allowed to travel at the legal maximum speed limit.

LEGAL HEIGHT MOVEMENTS: Permit authority is not required for the movement of vehicle(s), inclusive of load, not exceeding the legal height limitation of 13 feet 6 inches as established in Chapter 15 of the Illinois Vehicle Code. Therefore, no action is taken by the Village, either separately or in conjunction with authorizing an otherwise oversize or overweight movement, to ensure adequate clearance of structures for a vehicle(s), inclusive of load, not exceeding 13 feet 6 inches overall height.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE LIABILITY: The grantee assumes all responsibility for injury to persons or damage to public or private property, including his own, caused directly or indirectly by the transportation of vehicles or vehicles and objects authorized under this permit. The grantee agrees to hold the Village of Carol Stream harmless from all suits, claims, damages, or proceedings of any kind and to identify the Village of Carol Stream for any claim it may be required to pay arising from the movement.

LIABILITY INSURANCE: Owner and/or operators of escort vehicles or vehicles with oversize loads exceeding 10 feet in width, 13 feet 6 inches in height, 110 feet in length, or overweight must have in effect or be self-insured in the minimum amount of \$500,000 per occurrence combined bodily injury and property damage.

RED FLAGS: The extremities of all oversize vehicles, vehicle combinations or loads, and all protruding objects shall be marked with clean red flags not less than 18 inches square.

ESCORT VEHICLES: One escort vehicle will be required on all loads more than 12 feet wide. Escort vehicles shall display red flags at the extremities, display "OVER SIZE LOAD" signs, be equipped with an operating rotating or flashing amber light mounted on top, and be operated by properly licensed operators at least 18 years of age. A pole for measuring vertical clearances shall be mounted on the lead escort vehicle for moves in excess of 14 feet 6 inches in height. The driver of the escort vehicle must be in radio contact with the driver of the permit vehicle.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. Check heights of structures prior to move to ensure adequate clearance.
2. Specifically check overhead structures located _____.
3. To ensure the safety of other traffic: (a) One escort vehicle shall be provided; (b) Two escort vehicles shall be provided, a height pole shall be mounted on the lead vehicle.
4. Booms on cranes and similar construction equipment shall be adequately secured to prevent movement while in transit.

§ 8-2-5 OVERWEIGHT AND/OR OVERDIMENSION VEHICLES.

- (A) It shall be unlawful for any person to be in control of, to drive, to park, or move on, upon or across or for the owner to cause or knowingly permit to be parked, driven, or moved upon or across, any street or highway under the jurisdiction of the village, any vehicle or combination of vehicles exceeding the size and weight limitations stated in the ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 15-102 (width), ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 15-103 (height), ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 15-107 (length) and ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 15-111 (weight).
- (B) Size and weights limitations while operating on village streets shall not apply to fire apparatus or equipment for snow or ice removal operations owned or operated by or for any government body or to implements of husbandry temporarily operated or towed in a combination in the furtherance of a farm or agricultural endeavor and to any vehicle or combination of vehicles operating under the terms of a valid oversize and/or dimension permit issued by the village under the authority of § 8-2-6.
- (C) Where lower size and weight limits or other restrictions are imposed by ordinance under authority of ILCS Ch.625, Act 5, §§ 15-316 and 15-317, and signs indicating such limitations or restrictions are posted, it shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle or combination of vehicles in excess of such size or weight limitations or in violation of such restrictions.
- (D) It shall be unlawful to operate any "construction vehicle" as defined herein on any street in the village when signs are posted on that street prohibiting "Construction Vehicle."
Construction Vehicle shall be defined as any vehicle over 10,000 pounds actual weight, registered gross weight or G.V.W.R. that is required to comply with ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, §§ 12-712 and 12-713 on identification required to be displayed.
- (E) Whenever any vehicle or combination of vehicles is operated in violation of this section, the owner and/or driver of such vehicle shall be deemed guilty of such violation and either or both the owner or driver of such vehicle may be prosecuted for such violation. § 8-2-6 PERMITS FOR OVERWEIGHT AND/OR OVERDIMENSION VEHICLES.

- (A) The village with respect to any street or highway under its jurisdiction may upon application to the Village Engineering Department on forms provided by the village and good cause being shown therefore issue a special permit authorizing the applicant to operate or move a vehicle or combination of vehicles of a size or weight of vehicle or load exceeding the maximum specified in § 8-2-5. The applicant shall furnish the following information in the special permit application:
- (1) The name and address of the owner or lessee of the vehicle.
 - (2) Applicant's name.
 - (3) Type of permit request whether it be for a single trip, round trip, or multiple routing.
 - (4) The description and registration of the power unit.
 - (5) Description of the object or vehicle to be moved.
 - (6) The number of axles of the vehicle or combination of vehicles.
 - (7) The axle weights of all single, tandem or series axles.
 - (8) Gross weight of the vehicle.
 - (9) The width, length and height of the vehicle and load.
 - (10) The origin of the load within the state of state line if the origin is outside the jurisdiction of the village, copies of all county and/or state permits must be attached to the application prior to approval and issuance of a village special permit.

(11) Requested routing over village streets and to specific location.


- (B) The owner or his or her agent shall submit an application fee of \$50 for a single routing which will be valid for seven calendar days, \$80 for a round trip routing valid for 14 calendar days and \$150 for a multiple routing valid for a period not to exceed 120 calendar days. Permits are valid only for the dates specified on the permit and for the specific vehicle, load and routing as established by the Village Engineer or designee. No substitution of vehicle, load or routing is permitted without expressed written permission by the Village Engineer or his or her designee and carried in the vehicle to which the permit applies.
- (C) The Village Engineer or his or her designee is authorized to approve the application for approved routes. Upon approval and payment of all required fees, the Village Engineer shall issue a permit allowing passage of the oversize and/or overweight vehicles over village streets. The permit shall be specific and contain:
- (1) Permit number.
 - (2) The dates the permit is valid.
 - (3) Whether the permit is single, round or multiple routing.
 - (4) The description of object or vehicle to be moved.
 - (5) Authorized gross weight, axle weights, width, length and height.
 - (6) The authorized routing over village streets including the origin and termination point with the village.
 - (7) The fee paid.
 - (8) The date and signature of the Village Engineer or his or her designee.
 - (9) In addition, the permit will specify general conditions that the permittee must comply with that are consistent and reasonable for the protection of the general public and village streets. A copy of all permits issued

will be provided to the Patrol Lieutenant of the village Police Department for information and compliance.

- (D) It is the duty of the permittee to read and familiarize himself or herself with the permit provision upon receipt. Undertaking of the permit move is deemed prima facie evidence of acceptance of the permit and that:
- (1) The permittee is in compliance with all operation requirements;
 - (2) All dimension and weight limitations specified in the permit will not be exceeded;
 - (3) All operation, registration and license requirements have been complied with;
 - (4) All financial responsibilities, obligations and other legal requirements have been met; and
 - (5) The permittee assumes all responsibility for injury or damage to persons or to public or private property, including his or her own, or to the object being transported, caused directly or indirectly by the transportation or movement of vehicles and objects authorized under the permit. He or she agrees to hold the village harmless from all suits, claims, damages, or proceedings of any kind and to indemnify the village for may claim it may be required to pay arising from the movement.
- (E) The permit shall be carried in the vehicle to which the permit applies at all times while operating on streets within the village and shall be exhibited upon demand to any enforcement officer, police officer or other authorized official of the village.
- (F) Whenever any vehicle is operated in violation of the provisions of a village permit whether it be by size, weight or general provisions, and either or both the owner or driver of such vehicle shall be deemed guilty and either or both the owner or the driver of such vehicle may be prosecuted for such violation. § 8-2-7 VEHICLES PROHIBITED ON CERTAIN STREETS.

As provided under the authority of ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 15-316, it shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle upon any street where the operation of that vehicle is prohibited by ordinance and where signs of such prohibition are posted. (Am. Ord. 93-04-40, passed 4-13-93)




Carol Stream
