### Presentation on National Health Care Reform

Employee Relations Director Rebholz introduced Jennifer Schroeder, Area Assistant Vice President, Compliance Counsel for Gallagher Benefits Service, Inc. who updated the Village Board on the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA). The agenda includes the following items:

### **PPACA Overview**

- The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), commonly called Obamacare or the federal health care law, is a United States federal statute signed into law by President Obama on March 23, 2010.
- Represents the most significant regulatory overhaul of the U.S. healthcare system since the passage of Medicare and Medicaid in 1965.
- The *intent* of PPACA is primarily to decrease the number of uninsured Americans and reduce the overall costs of health care.
- It provides a number of mechanisms—including mandates and subsidies to employers and individuals in order to increase the coverage rate.
- Additional reforms are aimed at improving healthcare outcomes and streamlining the delivery of health care.

- PPACA requires insurance companies to cover all applicants and offer the same rates regardless of pre-existing conditions or gender.
- The Congressional Budget Office projected that PPACA will lower both future deficits and Medicare spending.

### Where We've Been

- W-2 reporting:
  - Employers filing 250 or more W-2s in 2011: The cost of health care for the 2012 tax year must be included on W-2s issued in January 2013
  - Employers filing less than 250 W-2s in 2011: The reporting requirement is delayed until further guidance
- Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC):
  - For open enrollments beginning after 9/23/2012 and plan years beginning after that date, the plan must distribute SBCs
  - Carol Stream: SBCs being distributed at open-enrollment and to newly eligible
- Women's Preventive Care Requirements
  - Non-grandfathered plans beginning on or after August 1, 2012

### Where Are We Today - 2013

- Health Care Flexible Spending Account (FSA) annual elected amounts are limited to \$2,500 per participant for plan year beginning in 2013
- *Notice of Exchanges* must be sent to <u>all employees</u> prior to October 1, 2013 and to all new hires within 14 days
- PCORI (Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute) Fee:
  - Payable in July 2013 for plan years ending between October 1, 2012 and December 31, 2012
  - Payable in July 2014 for plan years ending in 2013
  - Calculation based on number of participants
  - First year \$1, subsequent years through 2019 \$2, per participant

### Where We're Going - 2014

- Employer Shared Responsibility
  - Employers with at least 50 FTE's must provide minimum affordable health coverage to all employees working 30 hours per week or more, or be subject to a potential penalty
- No pre-existing condition limitation
  - Health plans may not impose any preexisting exclusions/limitations for any participant
- Maximum waiting period
  - A maximum 90-day waiting period may be imposed
- Automatic Enrollment
  - Employers with more than 200 employees will have to *automatically enroll* participants in the health plan (currently delayed until further guidance)
- Plan Design Maximums
  - out-of-pocket expenses cannot exceed HSA-compatible limits
  - *deductible* cannot exceed \$2,000/\$4,000 (possible application to large groups awaiting guidance) for small groups

### **Employer Penalty**

Employer plans with at least 50 full time equivalent employees

• Must offer coverage to significantly all FTEs or face a \$2,000 penalty per FTE (minus first 30)

- The plan must pay at least 60% of covered expenses and no employee's cost for self-only coverage can exceed 9.5% of income\*\* or incur a penalty equal to the lesser of: \$3,000 per FTE receiving tax credit\* or \$2,000 per FTE (minus first 30)
  - \* Only applies to FTEs with household incomes of 400% of FPL or less
  - \*\* Proposed safe harbor for employers

### Village of Carol Stream Facts

- The Village provides coverage to all full-time employees
- The Village pays 80% of covered expenses (well above 60% required by PPACA)
- The lowest paid employee's cost for self-only coverage is 3.4% of their income (below 9.5% limit under PPACA)
- No penalty applies! (with possible exceptions)

### **Additional Financial Implications 2014**

- Reinsurance Contributions
  - All insured <u>and</u> self-funded plans must pay a quarterly payment to establish a risk fund for coverage on the Exchange
  - \$63.00 per covered life per year in 2014
- Fully Insured Carrier -Premium Tax
  - Based on market share
  - \$8 Billion in 2014; indexed for future years
  - Only applies to health insurers
  - Will cause premium increases
  - Some carriers already assessing for 2013

### Where We're Going - 2015

- Temporary employees no longer subject to measurement period rules
- Results
  - 90-day maximum waiting period applies
  - Health insurance must be offered to temporary employees who work at least 30 hours per week for 90 days or more

### Where We're Going - 2018

• 40% tax on high cost plan excess amounts at 10% annual trend:

### 2012

- Family = 1,294/mo. or 15,528/yr.
- Individual = \$480/mo. or \$5,760/yr.

### 2018

- Family = \$2,292/mo. or \$27,500/yr.
- Individual = \$850/mo. or \$10,200/yr.

The following are brief descriptions of those items approved on the Consent Agenda for this meeting.

### Triple C Development, LLC, - 120 S. Gary Avenue:

The Village Board concurred with the Plan Commission recommendation to approve a Special Use Permit for a car wash (Automobile Laundry) and a Zoning Map Amendment – Rezoning from B-2 to B-3 for a car wash at the vacant property between White Castle and Holiday Inn at North and Gary Avenues.

### Klein Creek Flood Plain Structure Phase II Demolition Project - Change Order No. 1:

The Village Board approved Change Order No. 1 for the Klein Creek Flood Plain Structure Phase II Demolition Project extending the demolition and restoration interim completion dates by thirty (30) days to May 26, 2013 and July 1, 2013 respectively and reducing the contract \$560 from \$27,870 to \$27,310 (\$300 increase for additional fence removal and \$860 decrease for less sidewalk replacement).

# Ordinance No. 2013-06-27, Ascertaining the Prevailing Rate of Wages for Laborers, Workers and Mechanics Employed on Public Works Projects of the Village of Carol Stream:

The Village Board approved Ordinance No. 2013-06-27, ascertaining the prevailing rate of wages for laborers, workers and mechanics employed on public works projects of the Village of Carol Stream as mandated by state law. Trustee LaRocca expressed frustration over this State of Illinois mandate that adds extra costs to Village projects and increases taxpayer funding.

# Ordinance No. 2013-06-28, Amending Chapter 11, Article 2 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances by Increasing the Number of Class V Liquor Licenses from zero (0) to five (5):

On May 6, 2013 Ordinance No. 2013-05-13 was passed creating a Class V liquor license for video gaming. This ordinance increases the number of Class V licenses from 0 to 5 to be issued to the following establishments: Club Shotz, Village Tavern, Manhattan's, Pub Yahoo and Spectators Pub and Grill. The Village Board approved Ordinance No. 2013-06-28, amending Chapter 11, Article 2 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances by increasing the number of Class V liquor licenses from zero (0) to five (5).

# Ordinance No. 2013-06-29, Amending Chapter 11, Article 2 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances by Decreasing the Number Of Class C Liquor Licenses From 20 To 19 (Joe's Liquor Cabinet, 180-182 N. Gary Avenue) and Increasing the Number of Class C Liquor Licenses from 19 To 20 (NBC Liquor & Tobacco, Inc., 180-182 N. Gary Avenue):

Documentation has been received by the Clerk's Office from Attorney Darryl Lem that the sale of Joe's Liquor Cabinet to NBC Liquor & Tobacco is scheduled for June 18, 2013. The Village Board approved Ordinance No. 2013-06-29, amending Chapter 11, Article 2 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances by decreasing the number of Class C liquor licenses from 20 To 19 (Joe's Liquor Cabinet, 180-182 N. Gary Avenue) and increasing the number of Class C liquor licenses from 19 To 20 (NBC Liquor & Tobacco, Inc., 180-182 N. Gary Avenue) subject to closing of the sale of the business.

Ordinance No. 2013-06-30, Approving a Special Use Permit to Allow an Automobile Laundry in the B-3 Service District and a Zoning Map Amendment to Rezone a Property from B-2 General Retail District to B-3 Service District (120 S. Gary Avenue):

The Village Board passed Ordinance No. 2013-06-30, approving a Special Use permit to allow an automobile laundry in the B-3 Service District and a Zoning Map amendment to rezone a property from B-2 General Retail District to B-3 Service District (120 S. Gary Avenue), (See Consent Agenda item 1 above).

### Resolution No. 2666, Declaring Surplus Property Owned by the Village of Carol Stream:

The Village Board approved Resolution No. 2666, declaring various Public Works equipment surplus to be sold or scrapped and a 4-piece sectional and three paintings in the Finance Department declared surplus so that they can be disposed as surplus property.

### Raffle License Request-Village of Carol Stream-Concert for the Troops:

The Village Board approved a request and waiver of fee and manager's fidelity bond for the Village of Carol Stream in connection with its Concert for the Troops to be held on June 13, June 20, and July 11, 2013 at the Ross Ferraro Town Center.

### 2012 MFT Audit Report from IDOT:

The Village Board received the 2012 MFT Audit Report from IDOT.

### Regular Bills and Addendum Warrant of Bills:

The Village Board approved the payment of the Regular Bills dated June 17, 2013 in the amount of \$2,158,107.77. The Village Board approved the payment of the Addendum Warrant of Bills from June 4, 2013 – June 17, 2013 in the amount of \$495,394.22.

### Report of Officers:

Trustee Gieser reminded everyone that 4th of July Parade applications are available online at <u>www.carolstreamparade.com</u> and proclaimed "Go Hawks" in the Stanley Cup finals with the Boston Bruins.

Trustee Frusolone stated the Village's Police Department took 1st place in the Illinois Traffic Safety Challenge and 1st place for the Impaired Driving Award. She stated she participated in the active shooter exercise at Glenbard North High School and commended Police Chief Orr, Commander Jungers and the rest of the Police Department for proactively training for this potential occurrence. She wished her mom and dad a Happy 50th Wedding Anniversary.

Trustee Schwarze stated he and the Fire Protection District participated in the Active Shooter exercise as medical responders. He stated the Village Board met prior to the Board meeting to discuss the Affordable Care Act and the impact it will have on the provision of health care for employees. He stated staff was doing an excellent job keeping abreast of and informing employees of changes in health care laws. He reminded everyone to please shop Carol Stream.

Trustee McCarthy reminded everyone the Youth Council is having its 8<sup>th</sup> annual music fest on June 29<sup>th</sup> from 4:00 p.m. – 10:00 p.m. He thanked Perry Johnson for providing a discounted rate on a sound system and Trustee John LaRocca on behalf of the A.J. LaRocca Foundation for paying the cost of the sound system. Sweat Mornings Café will be there, Culver's is donating Ice Cream Sundays again and Mayor Saverino made a cash donation. He thanked all of the sponsors and stated their donations allow the Youth Council to take the keys and drive the event on their own. The Thursday night concert this week features The Neverly Brothers and Charkies restaurant. He stated the Relay for Life this past week was well done. He encouraged residents who wish to learn about the operations of the Police Department to attend the Citizen's Police Academy this fall.

Trustee Weiss stated DuPage County is hosting an online job fair this week with 24 cooperating employers. Information is available at <a href="www.worknetdupage.org">www.worknetdupage.org</a> until 4:00 p.m. on June 21, 2013. He stated he was a HAM radio operator (call sign: WA9YQK) as is Dave Baker (call Sign: WD9GWC) the Village broadcast director and Governor Quinn proclaimed this week Amateur Radio Week in Illinois. He stated there are several field demonstration day events scheduled including one at Pan Fish Park in Glen Ellyn by the Wheaton Community Radio Amateurs and one by the York Radio Club, Elmhurst at the Addison Village Hall this coming weekend. For more information, please contact Trustee Weiss or visit one of the field events.

Trustee LaRocca stated the first two Thursday night concerts have been great and thanked the sponsors, staff and residents for coming to the Town Center concerts. He asked residents to please remember to water newly planted parkway trees.

Village Manager Breinig stated the Village will be conducting cash raffle drawings to support our troops at the Thursday night concerts through July  $11^{\rm th}$ . The Bud Swanson Memorial Run funding Sarcoma research/cure will be held this Saturday June  $22^{\rm nd}$  at the Town Center. The deadline for displaying vehicle stickers is June 30. The Village will sponsor a carnival on June 27 – June 30. with free rides for individuals with special needs on Saturday from 11:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. There is an opportunity for residents to make a donation to the parade committee on their water bills this month and next month.

The Police Department Requests Village Board Approval to Purchase a

New LiveScan Machine in the Amount of \$32,994.00

Our LiveScan machine is nearing the 10-year productive life recommended by the manufacturer. The Police Department had budgeted for a new LiveScan machine this fiscal year during the 5-year budget plan.

In 2012, we received a verbal quote from our new sales rep for MorphoTrak, the company that we purchased our machine. She reviewed our information and quoted a price totaling \$17,545 for all requested purchases. We advised that we budgeted \$45,000 but she assured us that we did not need all of the equipment needed to replace or update our equipment. On November 2, 2012 we received a written quote from her. In light of this information, we reduced our budget request for this fiscal year to purchase the machine equipment to \$17,000.

In February 2013 we made contact with MorpoTrak again. Our rep said that the quote she provided earlier is still current. Again she said that we did not need the other equipment or updates and the quote she provided was correct. On February 27, 2013, the written quote was issued to us again.

On April 3, 2013 I authorized the order for the new machine and equipment. It takes about 6 weeks to receive the equipment and have it installed. We did not have to provide a purchase order at the time, but we would be billed after installation.

On April 29, 2013, I met with Chuck Thomas, Sr. Sales Manager for MorphoTrak. He related that when the technicians were assembling our order, they realized the equipment ordered did not match our current system. He was contacted and he spoke with the sales rep. The new sales rep that provided the \$17,545 quote was mistaken. She provided information for a portable LiveScan system, not the machine we have. He could not explain how this confusion arose on her part, since our system paperwork and our conversations clearly referenced our machine.

He apologized and said that a correct quote would be forthcoming.

I have the old quotes and an apology email from Chuck Thomas explaining their error.

I received a new quote on June 11, 2013. Mr. Thomas assured me this was the correct information for our system. The total is \$32,994 which includes the printer and warranties.

We reduced our estimation for LiveScan expenditures in this year's budget to \$17,000 based on the original quote, so some of the funds we need are not budgeted. Since many of our arrests are drug related, 1505 funds qualify for unbudgeted items for the police department.

The cost of the warranty for the LiveScan machine is \$3,808 which is budgeted for.

Since the remaining is not budgeted for, we can use the 1505 account to cover the remaining \$12,186.00.

I request Village Board approval for the purchase of a new LiveScan Machine, with required printer and warranties. The unbudgeted amount will be covered by 1505 funds. The total purchase order is \$32,994.

Recommendation to Award a Contract for Construction Services - LED Street

Light Replacement Project Phase II – Utility Dynamics Corporation

The current budget contains \$325,000 for construction of the LED Streetlight Replacement Project Phase II, which will provide new lights, poles, conduit, cable and control boxes for thirty-three new energy-efficient LED street lights in the Western Trails subdivision. Bids for this project were opened on Thursday, June 20, 2013. Sixteen contractors received bid packets and three returned bids.

Three bids were received (same three firms as last year) and the low-bidder is Utility Dynamics of Oswego, with a bid of \$277,904.00. (Last year's low bidder was H&H Electric Company). The engineer's estimate was \$326,695.

References and bid documents submitted by Utility Dynamics have been checked and verified to be in compliance with bid requirements. The bid tabulation and recommendation letter from the Village's consulting engineer is attached.

Staff recommends that the Mayor and Board approve a Motion awarding a contract to Utility Dynamics Corporation in the amount of \$277,904.00 for construction of the LED Street Light Replacement Project Phase II.

Finally, with the low bid coming in approximately \$47,000 below the grant amount, staff will be working with the engineer and the contractor to determine if additional replacements can be added to the contract in order to take full advantage of the budget amount of \$325,000. Any addition to the contract award would be brought back to the Village Board for approval.

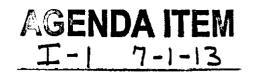

Stormwater Management & Conveyance Easement and

Storm Sewer and Indemnification Agreement

The Village of Carol Stream has received a plat granting us an easement for the purposes of conveying and managing stormwater. This easement gives the Village very broad rights to construct, repair, operate and maintain storm sewer system and stormwater management facilities on private property. This easement is a requirement of the DuPage County Countywide Stormwater & Flood Plain Ordinance and must be granted to the Village.

As part of this project, the Village allowed an existing storm sewer to remain under the building addition rather than being rerouted. The plat provides for future storm sewer locations in case the pipe under the building needs to be abandoned. Due to this unusual circumstance, the owner has agreed to indemnify the Village from any liability if the pipe should fail in the future.

The agreement was prepared by and revisions approved by the Village Attorney, and the owner has agreed to reimburse the Village for those costs. 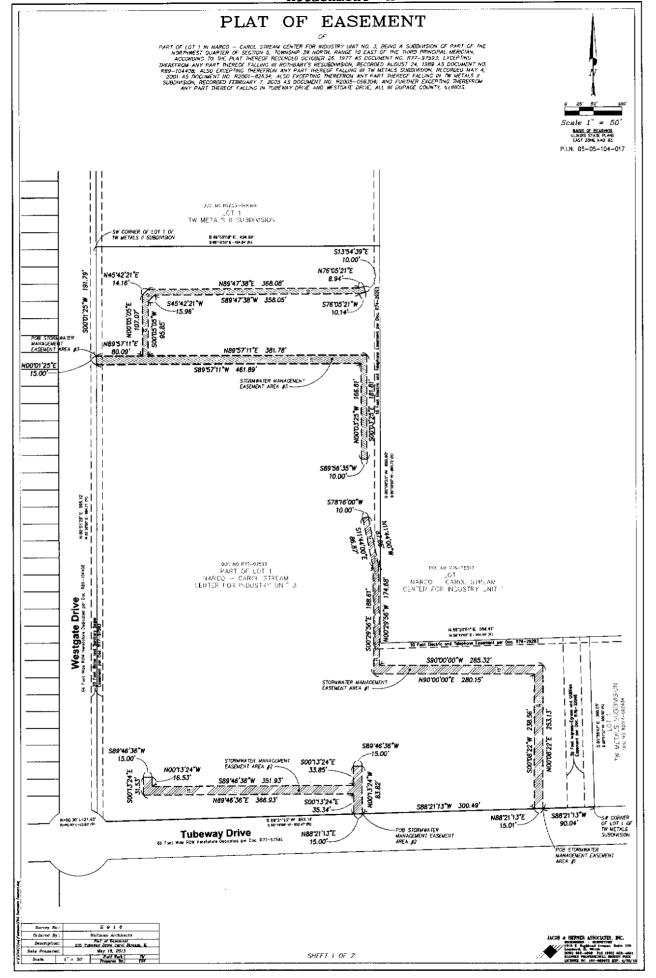

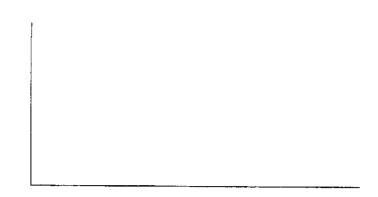

### STORM SEWER AND INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of June, 2013 by and between the Village of Carol Stream, an Illinois Municipal Corporation, (the Village) and Carol Stream Metal Owners, LLC (the Owner).

### WITNESSETH

Whereas, the Owner is the Owner of certain real property (the Property) legally described in Exhibit A attached hereto and commonly known as 235 Tubeway Drive, Carol Stream, Illinois; and

Whereas, the Property is currently improved with an industrial building; and

Whereas, the Owner desires to construct an addition to the existing building at a location where such addition would be located above a private storm sewer as shown upon the plan attached hereto as Exhibit B; and

Whereas, the Village has advised the Owner that the existing private storm sewer should be removed and abandoned and a new storm sewer constructed at a location that is not located below any building; and

Whereas, the Owner has requested that the Village allow the building addition to be constructed on top of the storm sewers and has agreed to assume all responsibility for and damages to the Owner's property or to others caused by damage to or the failure to maintain or repair the existing storm sewers and to indemnify the Village, its officers, agents and employees for all liability arising out of the Owners construction of the building addition on top of the existing storm sewers; and

Whereas, the Village has agreed to allow construction of the building addition on top of the existing storm sewers subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Village and Owner agree as follows:

1. The foregoing recitals are made a part of this Agreement.

- 2. The Village hereby agrees to allow the Owner to construct a building addition on the Property legally described in Exhibit A as set over the existing storm sewers as forth in the plans attached hereto as Exhibit B.
- 3. The Owner shall maintain, operate, repair, reconstruct and replace the storm sewers located upon the Property, including the storm sewers located under the building addition in accordance with the laws and regulations of the Village.
- 4. The Owner grants to the Village and its designees the right of access upon, over and across the Property to inspect the storm sewers located thereon and to perform any maintenance of said storm sewers which the Owner has failed to perform, if such failure continues for thirty (30) days after written notice from the Village of such failure.
- 5. The Owner shall be liable to the Village for the cost of any necessary maintenance or repairs so performed by the Village and shall promptly reimburse the Village for such costs, with interest at the statutory prejudgment rate calculated from the date of expenditure. All costs expended by the Village for the maintenance or repair of the storm sewers shall be a lien upon the Property, which lien may be foreclosed upon the Property to ensure reimbursement.
- 6. The Owners of any portions of the Property shall be jointly and severally liable for the reimbursement of or payment to the Village, as may be required by the foregoing provisions. If title to the Property is vested in a land trust, the beneficiaries thereof shall be personally liable for all obligations imposed hereby upon the Owner of the Property or portion thereof owned.
- 7. No connections shall be allowed to the northern storm sewer located inside the building/building addition and any current connections shall be eliminated/capped as denoted on the approved Village civil engineering drawings.
- 8. No future connections shall be allowed to the northern storm sewer located inside the building/building addition and no offsite areas shall be allowed the use of the storm sewers.
- 9. The Owner hereby releases the Village, its officers, agents and employees from any and all loss, damage, liability or expense of the Owner from any damages of whatever type or nature to property of the Owner arising out of or in connection with the location of or the construction, maintenance or repair of the northern storm sewer located under the building addition or the Village's allowing the Owner to build a building addition over the storm sewer.
- 10. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Owner shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Village, its officers, agents and employees and each of them from and against any and all claims, loss, costs, damage, expense and liability of every kind or nature arising out of or in connection with the location of or the construction, maintenance or repair of the northern storm sewer located under the building addition or the Village's allowing the Owner to build a building addition over the storm sewer.
- 11. All notices, certificates, approvals, consents or other communications desired or required to be given hereunder shall be given in writing at the addresses set forth below, by any of the following means: (1) personal service, (2) overnight courier, or (3) registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested.

- 12. The Village shall have all remedies at law or equity to enforce this Agreement, including all remedies for abatement of a nuisance, which remedies shall be cumulative and not exclusive. If a judgment is entered against the Owner, the Owner shall pay all reasonable attorney's fees and costs of the Village.
- 13. Failure to enforce a right granted under the terms of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such right or any other rights hereunder.
- 14. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois and venue shall be fixed in the Circuit Court of DuPage County, Illinois.
- 15. This Agreement shall be recorded with the Recorder of Deeds of DuPage County and shall run with the land and shall be binding upon the Owner, its successors and/or assigns.
- 16. If any provision of this Agreement, or any Section, sentence, clause, phrase or word, or the application thereof, in any circumstance, is held to be invalid, the remainder of this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid part were never included herein, and this Agreement shall be and remain valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

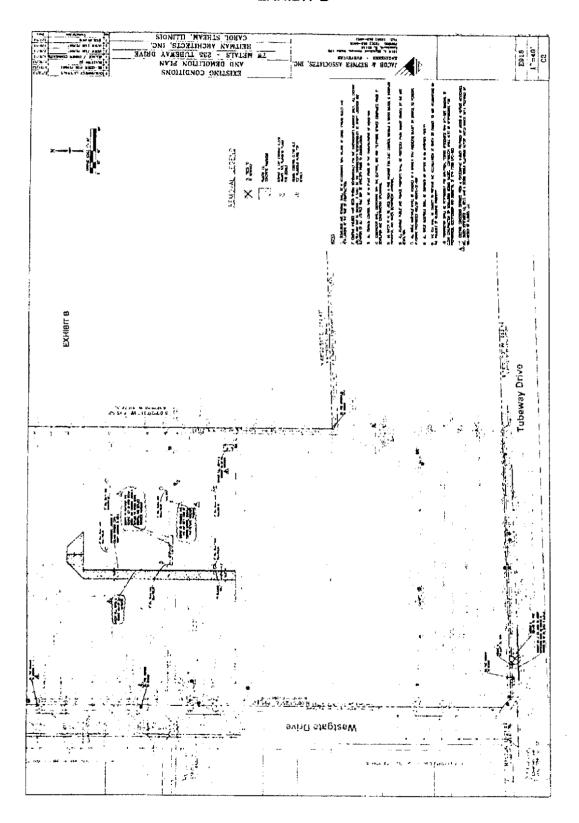
