The following are brief descriptions of those items approved on the Consent Agenda for this meeting.

Carol Stream Library Annual Report 2011-2012:

The Village Board received the Carol Stream Library Annual Report 2011-2012. Village Manager Breinig was directed to submit any questions from the Village Board to the Library regarding the annual report.

Award of Contract - LED Street Light Upgrade Project:

The Village approved award of contract for the LED Street Light Upgrade Project in the Spring Valley and Western Trails subdivisions to H & H Electric Company in the amount of \$289,595.70. This project is being funded by a grant in the amount of \$350,000 from the Illinois Department of Economic Opportunity.

2012 Flexible Pavement Project - Change Order #1:

The Village Board approved Change Order #1 to the 2012 Flexible Pavement Project in the amount of \$273,088.49 to add Thunderbird Trail from County Farm Road to Kuhn Road.

Presentation of 2011 Annual Report:

The Village Board received the 2011 Annual Report.

Resolution No. 2591, Declaring Surplus Property Owned by the Village of Carol Stream:

The Police Department requested one Konica Minolta copier/fax/scanner be declared surplus property. The Public Works Department requested one 1967 water tank trailer be declared surplus. The Village Board approved Resolution No. 2591, declaring surplus property owned by the Village of Carol Stream.

Farmhouse Lease Agreement - Carol Stream Park District Request to Install a Sidewalk and Signs:

The Village Board approved the Park District request to install a sidewalk and signs at the historic farmhouse located at 301 Lies Road which is being used as Park District administrative offices.

Regular Bills and Addendum Warrant of Bills:

The Village Board approved the payment of the Regular Bills dated June 4, 2012 in the amount of \$855,229.18. The Village Board approved the payment of the Addendum Warrant of Bills from May 22 – June 4, 2012 in the amount of \$761,031.09.

Non-Consent Agenda Items

Report on Request for Establishing a Klein Creek Trail:

A request was made by Carol Stream Bikes, a local bicycle advocacy group, to establish a Klein Creek Trail through original Carol Stream by traffic signing and pavement markings. This report addresses the request by identifying what the Village has accomplished, what is being planned, what needs to be included in a Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan, what it would take to complete a Plan, how a Plan should be developed and issues that need to be addressed. The Village Board discussed various sign and trail marker options for bike paths which staff will further investigate. There was general Board consensus the Village should work to improve and implement existing bike trails before spending money to establish new ones. The Village Board concurred with the staff recommendation not to proceed with a Klein Creek Bike Trail but rather to pursue improvements to other bike trails including addition of trash receptacles, signage and navigation markers and publicizing existing bike trails in the Village.

Resolution No. 2592, Approving an Incentive Agreement with Zones, Inc.:

Trustees Weiss and McCarthy questioned several provisions in the agreement. Manager Breinig and the Village Attorney clarified that the incentive is not directly tied to the cost to build-out of the Zones facility but rather is just a condition of them moving into the community. Village Attorney Rhodes stated that the range for the additional first year payment is tied to projected construction costs which are not specifically known at this time but fall within the range specified in the agreement. The developer will begin receiving incentive payments upon moving out of Bensenville and into Carol Stream. Zone's commitment to stay in Carol Stream is 10-years under the terms of the incentive agreement. Trustee Schwarze questioned the number of jobs that will be created in Carol Stream and the amount of sales they will generate. Village Manager Breinig and Attorney Rhodes stated that there may be some new jobs created at the Carol Stream facility but it is anticipated most employees will come from the Bensenville location. The \$20M minimum sales that will be generated are consistent with past Village Board

policy to provide incentives to companies that generate this threshold of sales. If sales fall below the \$20M threshold then Zones would not receive the rebate for the specified period of time.

Report of Officers:

Trustee Weiss wished his wife a Happy Birthday tomorrow. He mentioned that the former Village Manager of Addison, Anthony J. LaRocca was a major influence on his decision to get into local government and that he was his mentor. He was the former Village Manager of Addison and hired Trustee Weiss 28 years ago. Mr. LaRocca recently passed away at age 83. He was truly a "people person" and served in many capacities for the Village of Addison.

Trustee Schwarze stated he was excited to see new businesses such as Zones, move into the community and encouraged everyone to shop Carol Stream.

Trustee McCarthy reminded everyone to come out to enjoy the summer concerts at the Town Center which kicks off this Thursday night. Applications for entering the 4th of July parade are still being accepted (www.carolstreamparade.com) and can be emailed to csjuly4thparade@aol.com. We are 2 months away from the Youth Council 7th annual Music Fest. There are currently 15 bands scheduled to play. Sponsors are being solicited by Youth Council members who are also organizing the entire event. Anyone wishing to sponsor the event can make donations to the Youth Council at the Village Hall. Any monies not used for the Music Fest on August 11 will be used for the Christmas Sharing program.

Trustee Manzzullo asked everyone to remember and pray for our troops and their families.

Trustee Frusolone commended the Police Department, Fire District and DuPage County Coroner's Office for coordinating the Fatal Prom demonstration at Glenbard North High School and stated it was very well organized and realistic. She stated last week she attended the DARE graduation for Jay Stream School with Mayor Saverino. She thanked Officer Diane Wells who attended her last graduation as the DARE Officer as she will be going back out on street patrol. She congratulated her son Anthony and Village Clerk Beth Melody's daughter Melisa who graduated from Glenbard North High School yesterday.

Village Clerk Melody congratulated the 2012 graduates of Glenbard North High School.

Mayor Saverino also thanked Officer Wells for her work on the DARE program and stated he was very committed to this program as Mayor. He stated June 30 is the deadline for purchasing vehicle stickers before fines are levied and encouraged everyone in the Village to purchase their stickers on time. He stated that the Daily Herald published the list of students on the Academic Team and that Glenbard North High School graduate Adam Alfredo Ball ranked 3rd out of 621 students with a GPA of 5.77 on a 5.0 grading scale and an ACT of 36. He stated he noticed someone buying all the newspapers at a local convenience store and it turns out it was the father of Adam Ball. Last Friday the Police Department hosted the Cop on Top charity fund raiser for Special Olympics.

Benjamin Middle School – 28W300 St. Charles Road First Amendment to the Annexation Agreement

PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to present to the Village Board an amendment to the annexation agreement with the Benjamin School District No. 25, and to recommend approval. The proposed amendment is for water service to be charged at the resident rate and for waiver of the *Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee*, and would result in the refund of that fee.

BACKGROUND

In the 1990s, the Village of Carol Stream developed an Ultimate Service Area plan for sanitary sewer and water main extensions into the Village's Southwest Planning Area. The Ultimate Service Area was divided into three phases, with the Phase One Project Area generally consisting of the North Avenue corridor to just west of Morton Road, and the Morton Road corridor from North Avenue to just past Timber Lane. After the initial construction of water main and sanitary sewer in the Phase One Project Area was completed in 1996, the Village of Carol Stream established a recapture fee (the *Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee*) as a prerequisite for connection of properties to the new utilities.

The 2012 Southwest Water Main Extension Project is taking place outside of the 1996 Phase One project area, and none of the properties that will be served by the 2012 project were included in the 1996 recapture calculation. It is for these reasons that, at a Village Board workshop on August 16, 2010, staff recommended and the Village Board concurred that payment of the Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee should not be required as a prerequisite for connection of properties to the new utilities in the 2012 project area. The

specific staff recommendation to which the Village Board gave their concurrence is as follows:

"Staff recommends that recapture not be required as a condition of connection to the 2010 [sic] Southwest Water Main Extension, and that the recaptures specified in the preannexation agreements for Benjamin School and McCaslin Park be waived."

It should be noted that the Annexation Agreement for Benjamin Middle School was approved on August 18, 2008, prior to the policy direction given at the August 16, 2010, workshop.

DISCUSSION

Attached for the Village Board's reference are copies of the public notice, the draft First Amendment to the Annexation Agreement for Benjamin Middle School, and the Annexation Agreement. The proposed amendment is being brought to the Village Board in order to follow up on the policy direction regarding the waiver of the Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee, and also to provide consistency with the agreement with the Carol Stream Park District for McCaslin Park. In a recent amendment to the McCaslin Park agreement, the Village Board approved charging the resident rate for water usage. Staff recommends that this precedent be followed for all public taxing bodies in the Southwest Planning Area, and the proposed amendment would make the necessary revision to the Benjamin Middle School agreement.

The Village Attorney has reviewed the draft amendment and finds it acceptable. Highlights of the amendment are as follows:

- 1. The Village would refund the *Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee* in the amount of \$9,679.12 less the cost of the water meter (\$1,819.16), for a net refund of \$7,859.96.
- 2. Benjamin Middle School would pay the resident rate for water usage.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the First Amendment to Annexation Agreement. If the Village Board concurs with the staff recommendation, they should approve the necessary ordinance.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO ANNEXATION AGREEMENT SOUTHWEST CORRIDOR

This First Amendment to Annexation Agreement is made and entered into this _____ day of June, 2012, by and between the Village of Carol Stream, an Illinois municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Village") and the Board of Education of Benjamin School District No. 25, Du Page County, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as the "Owners").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Village and the Owners entered into an Annexation Agreement, adopted by the Village of Carol Stream under Ordinance No. 2008-08-44, dated August 18, 2008, with respect to a parcel of property legally described within the attached Exhibit A (hereinafter the "Annexation Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Village and the Owners desire to amend certain of the provisions of the Annexation Agreement under the terms and conditions as provided herein; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 65 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, Section 5/11-15.1-3 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-15.1-3, the Mayor and Board of Trustees conducted a public hearing with respect to this First Amendment to Annexation Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises and agreement contained within this First Amendment to Annexation Agreement, the Village and Owners hereby agree as follows:

- The above recitals are an integral part of this First Amendment to Annexation
 Agreement and are incorporated by reference herein.
 - 2. Paragraph 7 of the Annexation Agreement is hereby revised as follows:
 - 7. The Owners shall not be required to pay any Special Southwest Utility construction fee as a precondition to connecting to the Village water and sewer systems. The Village shall refund to the Owners the amount of \$9,679.12

previously paid by the Owners at the time the Annexation Agreement was executed, less the cost of a water meter in the amount of \$1,819.16, for a net refund in the amount of \$7,859.96.

- 3. Paragraph 8 of the Annexation Agreement is hereby revised as follows:
 - 8. The Owners shall connect to the Village's sewer and water systems, utilize only Village water at such time as said systems are available and abandon all wells upon the Property. The Owners shall abide by the same laws and ordinances, rules and regulations with respect to water and sewer service as consumers and customers within the corporate limits of the Village. This provision includes, but is not limited to, any water conservation requirements, including sprinkling bans or limitations which may be imposed by the Village. The Owners shall not be required to pay any Village connection charges or tapon fees in order to connect to the Village systems. Until the Property is annexed to the Village, the Owners shall pay one hundred per cent (100%) of the customer charges applicable to users within the Village.
- 4. All provisions of the Annexation Agreement not otherwise amended by this First Amendment shall remain in full force and effect, it being the intention of the Parties to amend only those provisions as set forth herein.

ANNEXATION AGREEMENT SOUTHWEST CORRIDOR

This Agreement made and entered into this ______ day of August____, 2008, by and between the Village of Carol Stream, an Illinois municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Village") and the Board of Education of Benjamin School District No. 25, Du Page County, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as the "Owners").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Owners are the Owners of record of certain real estate, described as follows:

That part of the West Half of Section 25, Township 40 North, Range 9, East of the Third Principal Meridian, described as follows: Commencing at the Northeast corner of South Half of the Southwest Ouarter of said Section 25; thence North 00° 27' 48" East along the East line thereof for a distance of 1531.32 Feet; thence North 89° 32' 12" West 40.00 Feet: thence South 70° 00' 00" West 537.00 Feet; thence South 20° 00' 00" East 100.00 Feet to the point of beginning of this description; thence South 70° 00' 00" West 238.00 Feet; thence North 90°00' 00" West 170.00 Feet; thence South 35°00' 00" West; 170.00 Feet: thence North 55° 00' 00" West 97.99 Feet; thence South 1° 04' 07" East 534.94 Feet to a point 574.32 Feet North (Measured at right angles) of the North line of the South Half of the Southwest Quarter of said Section 25; thence North 88° 55' 53" East 64.25 Feet to a point of curve; thence Easterly along an arc of a circle convex Southerly having a radius of 367.00 Feet for a distance of 128.11 Feet; thence South 21° 04' 07" East along a radial line of the last described arc for a distance of 133.0 Feet; thence Northeasterly along another arc of a circle, having a radius of 500.0 Feet and being concentric with the first described arc for a distance of 304.56 Feet to a point of tangency; thence North 34° 01' 53" East tangent to last described arc for a distance of 451.85 feet to a point in the arc of a circle whose center is along the last described tangent line extended; thence Northwesterly along said arc of a circle, having a radius of 380.0 Feet for a distance of 238.55 Feet to a point of tangency; thence North 20° 00' 00" West tangent to last described arc for a distance of 54.88 Feet to the point of beginning, in Du Page County, Illinois.

(hereinafter referred to as the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire that the Property be annexed to the Village on the terms and under the conditions hereafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, the Property is not located within the corporate boundaries of any municipality, but is within the planning area of the Village, and may be now or will, within a period of twenty (20) years, be contiguous to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to enter into a binding agreement with respect to the future annexation of the Property and to provide for various other matters related directly or indirectly to said future annexation, in accordance with the provisions of 65 ILCS 5/11-15.1-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined that the future annexation of the Property would further the orderly growth of the Village and promote the general welfare of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, agreements, terms and conditions herein set forth, the Owners and the Village agree as follows:

- 1. The provisions of the preamble hereinabove set forth are hereby restated and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. The Owners, within thirty (30) days after a written notice from the Village indicating that the Property is now contiguous to the Village, shall submit to the Village an executed Petition for Annexation and plat of annexation in the form provided by law. The Owners shall pay the publication fees and recording fees.
- 3. This Agreement shall be binding upon the Owners, as well as the Owners' successors, assigns and heirs. This Agreement shall constitute a covenant running with the land and shall be binding upon all persons taking any interest or right in the Property after the date of the execution of this Agreement. Any person acquiring any rights or interest in the Property after the date of this Agreement shall be bound by the terms thereof and shall be deemed to have accepted and approved this Agreement in full. The Property may not be annexed to any City or Village other than the Village of Carol Stream during the term of this Agreement.
- 4. If ownership of the Property or any portion thereof changes subsequent to the execution of this Agreement and prior to annexation, the new Owner or Owners shall submit to the

Village a properly executed acknowledgement and acceptance of this Agreement within thirty (30) days of acquiring such interest which shall also notify the Village of the identity of the new Owner and the new Owner's address and telephone number. It shall be the responsibility of the new Owner or Owners to see to the submission of these items. Provided, however, the failure, refusal or neglect to submit these items shall in no way affect the continued validity of this Agreement.

- 5. The Village may record any Petition for Annexation submitted and this Agreement in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds of DuPage County.
- 6. The Owners and the Village respectively agree to do all things necessary or appropriate to cause the Property to be duly and validly annexed to the Village as promptly as practicable after the Property becomes contiguous to the Village. Upon contiguity, the Village either on its own or with any other properties may, at any time prior to expiration of this Agreement, annex the Property. The Owners, or their successors in interest, shall assist the Village and take all actions or steps necessary, including, but not limited to, preparing and executing new petitions for annexation, waivers and plats to accomplish said annexation. The Owners shall, at the expense of the Village, within fourteen (14) days after receiving a written request from the Village, join in any court proceeding, (represented by an attorney experienced in such matters chosen by the Village), which can result in the annexation of the Property. wither itself or along with other Property, to the Village. Upon annexation, the Property shall become subject to all applicable ordinances of the Village, except as may be otherwise provided in law or this Agreement.
- 7. The Owners may connect to the Village water and sewer systems, upon payment of the Special Southwest Utility construction fee in the amount of \$9,679.12 which shall be paid at the time the Agreement is executed.
- 8. The Owners shall connect to the Village sewer and water systems and utilize only Village water within one year from the date of this Agreement. The Owners shall abide by the same rules and regulations with respect to water and sewer service as consumers and customers within the corporate limits of the Village. This provision includes, but is not limited to, any sprinkling bans or limitations which may be imposed by the Village. The Owners shall pay regular Village connection charges and tap-on fees. Until the Property is

- annexed to the Village, the Owners shall pay 150% of the customer charges applicable to uses within the Village.
- 9. Upon annexation, the property will be zoned to permit public school and related activities. All new development on the property, after the execution of this Agreement, shall take place only in accordance with the provisions of the Planned Unit Development section of the Carol Stream Zoning Ordinance. The Village shall retain authorization for site plan approval for all new construction on the property. The site plan approval shall include the approval of ingress and egress, location and number of structures, parking, lighting, drainage, subdivision code and all other requirements of the Village's Planned Unit Development Ordinance, and other ordinances of the Village dealing with land development or construction, unless jurisdiction is otherwise exercised by another entity (such as the Regional Office of Education) by law. The Village Board, either with or without a public hearing before itself or some Board or Commission, may waive by motion the necessity of the Owners to comply with all such provisions. Whenever in this Agreement prior to annexation the Owners are required to seek approval of the Village for a plan, permit or other activity, the Owners shall be required to pay to the Village the appropriate fee associated with the review, inspection and administration of that municipal regulation. Provided, however, that where there is additional supervision and payments required by the County, the Village shall choose to reduce the amount of the fee or charge to reflect, in those cases where it is applicable. the fact that the Village may, at its option, permit the regulation and personnel time of the County to suffice with a second level of action by the Village. The Owners shall also pay such fees as are normally paid to outside consultants to review documents and applications. During the life of this annexation agreement, neither the Owner nor any tenant on the Property shall enter into a sales tax rebate agreement which would cause sales at retail to be reported as approved in another jurisdiction which agrees to return a rebate.
- 10. The Parties may seek to enforce the terms of this Agreement through a suit seeking specific performance, damages, injunction and its costs of enforcing the agreement, including attorneys' and expert witnesses' fees. The parties intend that the standard, which a court would use under such circumstances, shall be the same standard which would be used if the Property were within the Village. The intent of the Village and the Owners in agreeing to the provisions of this Agreement is not to unduly restrict the ability of the Owners to develop the Property, but rather to make certain that the Property, which will ultimately be

- within the corporate boundaries of the Village, is developed fully in accordance with the ordinances of the Village.
- 11. Where land annexed to the Village is not annexed to any fire protection district or park district, the Owners shall promptly, upon annexation to the Village, petition for annexation to the Carol Stream Park District and the Carol Stream Fire Protection District.
- 12. The Parties or their successors or assigns, may, in equity, by suit, action, mandamus, injunction, or other proceedings in court, enforce and compel the performance of this Agreement, including suits for specific performance, but they may not seek monetary damages.
- 13. This Agreement may only be amended by written instruments signed by both parties, and after the procedures required by law or ordinance to cause the amendment of an annexation agreement.
- 14. The term of this Agreement shall be twenty (20) years from the date of execution hereof. And, if permitted by law, within one (1) year before or after the expiration of the initial twenty (20) year term, the Village may, at its option, extend the term of this Agreement for an additional 20 years if the property has not been annexed by the Village.
- 15. If any portion of this Agreement or ordinance enacted pursuant hereto shall be declared invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this Agreement as a whole other than the part so declared invalid. The parties shall then negotiate in good faith to seek to reestablish the powers and duties found to be invalid. The Owners or the Village shall be obligated to execute any document or take any additional action which may be required to correct any defect which has resulted or could result in the invalidation of this Agreement in whole or in part.
- 16. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts of duplicate originals or with multiple signature pages each of which shall constitute and be deemed one and the same document.
- 17. The undersigned Owners warrant that it constitutes all Owners of the Property and that it has full authority and power to sign the Agreement and any petitions submitted hereunder and that it has not and will not take any action to change ownership in the Property until after this Agreement is recorded.

Second Amendment to the Annexation Agreement

PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to present to the Village Board an amendment to the annexation agreement with the Carol Stream Park District, and to recommend approval. The proposed amendment is for waiver of the *Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee*, and would result in the refund of that fee.

BACKGROUND

In the 1990s, the Village of Carol Stream developed an Ultimate Service Area plan for sanitary sewer and water main extensions into the Village's Southwest Planning Area. The Ultimate Service Area was divided into three phases, with the Phase One Project Area generally consisting of the North Avenue corridor to just west of Morton Road, and the Morton Road corridor from North Avenue to just past Timber Lane. After the initial construction of water main and sanitary sewer in the Phase One Project Area was completed in 1996, the Village of Carol Stream established a recapture fee (the Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee) as a prerequisite for connection of properties to the new utilities.

The 2012 Southwest Water Main Extension Project is taking place outside of the 1996 Phase One project area, and none of the properties that will be served by the 2012 project were included in the 1996 recapture calculation. It is for these reasons that, at a Village Board workshop on August 16, 2010, staff recommended and the Village Board concurred that payment of the Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee should not be required as a prerequisite for connection of properties in the 2012 project area to the new utilities. The

specific staff recommendation to which the Village Board gave their concurrence is as follows:

"Staff recommends that recapture not be required as a condition of connection to the 2010 [sic] Southwest Water Main Extension, and that the recaptures specified in the preannexation agreements for Benjamin School and McCaslin Park be waived."

It should be noted that the Annexation Agreement for McCaslin Park was approved on January 19, 2010, prior to the policy direction given at the August 16, 2010, workshop. The First Amendment to the Agreement was approved on September 6, 2011, to authorize the Park District to construct a portion of the Village's water main extension.

DISCUSSION

Attached for the Village Board's reference are copies of the public notice, the draft Second Amendment to the Annexation Agreement for McCaslin Park, the Annexation Agreement, and the First Amendment to the Annexation Agreement. The proposed amendment is being brought to the Village Board in order to follow up on the policy direction regarding the waiver of the Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee.

The Village Attorney has reviewed the draft amendment and finds it acceptable. If the amendment is approved, the Village would refund the *Special Southwest Utility Construction Fee* in the amount of \$1,296.31.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the Second Amendment to Annexation Agreement. If the Village Board concurs with the staff recommendation, they should approve the necessary ordinance.

This Second Amendment to Annexation Agreement is made and entered into this _____ day of June, 2012, by and between the Village of Carol Stream, an Illinois municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Village") and the Carol Stream Park District, Du Page County, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as the "Owners").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties wish to enter into a binding agreement with respect to the future annexation of the Property and to provide for various other matters related directly or indirectly to said future annexation, in accordance with the provisions of 65 ILCS 5/11-15.1-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined that the future annexation of the Property would further the orderly growth of the Village and promote the general welfare of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, agreements, terms and conditions herein set forth, the Owners and the Village agree as follows:

- 1. The provisions of the preamble hereinabove set forth are hereby restated and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. The Owners, within thirty (30) days after a written notice from the Village indicating that the Property is now contiguous to the Village, shall submit to the Village an executed Petition for Annexation and plat of annexation in the form provided by law. The Owners shall pay the publication fees and recording fees.
- 3. This Agreement shall be binding upon the Owners, as well as the Owners' successors, assigns and heirs. This Agreement shall constitute a covenant running with the land and shall be binding upon all persons taking any interest or right in the Property after the date of the execution of this Agreement. Any person acquiring any rights or interest in the Property after the date of this Agreement shall be bound by the terms thereof and shall be deemed to have accepted and approved this Agreement in full. The Property may not be annexed to any City or Village other than the Village of Carol Stream during the term of this Agreement.
- 4. If ownership of the Property or any portion thereof changes subsequent to the execution of this Agreement and prior to annexation, the new Owner or Owners shall submit to the Village a properly executed acknowledgement and acceptance of this Agreement within thirty (30) days of acquiring such interest which shall also notify the Village of the identity of the new Owner and the new Owner's address and telephone number. It shall be the responsibility of the new Owner or Owners to see to the submission of these items. Provided, however, the failure, refusal or neglect to submit these items shall in no way affect the continued validity of this Agreement.
- 5. The Village may record any Petition for Annexation submitted and this Agreement in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds of DuPage County.
- 6. The Owners and the Village respectively agree to do all things necessary or appropriate to cause the Property to be duly and validly annexed to the Village as promptly as practicable after the Property becomes contiguous to the Village. Upon contiguity, the Village either on its own or with any other properties may, at any time prior to expiration of this Agreement, annex the Property. The Owners, or their successors in interest, shall assist the Village and take all actions or steps necessary, including, but not limited to, preparing and executing new petitions for annexation,

waivers and plats to accomplish said annexation. The Owners shall, at the expense of the Village, within fourteen (14) days after receiving a written request from the Village, join in any court proceeding, (represented by an attorney experienced in such matters chosen by the Village), which can result in the annexation of the Property, wither itself or along with other Property, to the Village. Upon annexation, the Property shall become subject to all applicable ordinances of the Village, except as may be otherwise provided in law or this Agreement, provided that no change in ordinances shall become effective on the property until six months after their passage.

- 7. The Owners may connect to the Village water and sewer systems, upon payment of the Special Southwest Utility construction fee in the amount of \$1,296.31 which shall be paid at the time the Agreement is executed.
- 8. The Owners shall connect to the Village sewer and water systems and utilize only Village water within one year from the date of this annexation. The Owners shall abide by the same rules and regulations with respect to water and sewer service as consumers and customers within the corporate limits of the Village. This provision includes, but is not limited to, any sprinkling bans or limitations which may be imposed by the Village. The Owners shall pay regular Village connection charges and tap-on fees. Until the Property is annexed to the Village, the Owners shall pay 150% of the customer charges applicable to uses within the Village.
- 9. Upon annexation, the property will be zoned to permit public park and related activities and any purposes, activities and developments authorized to an Illinois Park District under the Illinois Park District Code, presently and as amended from time to time. (70 ILCS 1205/1-1 et seq.) All new development on the property, after the execution of this Agreement, shall take place only in accordance with the provisions of the Planned Unit Development section of the Carol Stream Zoning Ordinance. The Village shall retain authorization for site plan approval for all new construction on the property. The site plan approval shall include the approval of ingress and egress, location and number of structures, parking, lighting, drainage, subdivision code and all other requirements of the Village's Planned Unit Development Ordinance, and other ordinances of the Village dealing with land development or construction, unless jurisdiction is exclusively assigned to another governmental entity by statute. The Village Board, either with or without a public hearing before itself or some Board or Commission, may waive by motion the necessity of the Owners to comply with all such provisions. Whenever in this Agreement prior to annexation the Owners are required to seek approval of the Village for a plan, permit or other activity, the Owners shall be required to pay to the Village the appropriate fee associated with the review, inspection and administration of that municipal regulation. Provided, however, that where there is additional supervision and payments required by the County, the Village shall choose to reduce the amount of the fee or charge to reflect, in those cases where it is applicable, the fact that the Village may, at its option, permit the regulation and personnel time of the County to suffice with a second level of action by the Village. The Owners shall also pay such fees as are normally paid to outside consultants to review documents and applications. During the life of this annexation agreement, neither the Owner nor any tenant on the Property shall enter into a sales tax rebate agreement which would

- cause sales at retail to be reported as approved in another jurisdiction which agrees to return a rebate.
- 10. The Parties may seek to enforce the terms of this Agreement through a suit seeking specific performance, damages, injunction and its costs of enforcing the agreement, including attorneys' and expert witnesses' fees. The parties intend that the standard, which a court would use under such circumstances, shall be the same standard which would be used if the Property were within the Village. The intent of the Village and the Owners in agreeing to the provisions of this Agreement is not to unduly restrict the ability of the Owners to develop the Property, but rather to make certain that the Property, which will ultimately be within the corporate boundaries of the Village, is developed fully in accordance with the ordinances of the Village.
- 11. Where land annexed to the Village is not annexed to any fire protection district, the Owners shall promptly, upon annexation to the Village, petition for annexation to the Carol Stream Fire Protection District.
- 12. The Parties or their successors or assigns, may, in equity, by suit, action, mandamus, injunction, or other proceedings in court, enforce and compel the performance of this Agreement, including suits for specific performance, but they may not seek monetary damages.
- 13. This Agreement may only be amended by written instruments signed by both parties, and after the procedures required by law or ordinance to cause the amendment of an annexation agreement.
- 14. The term of this Agreement shall be twenty (20) years from the date of execution hereof. And, if permitted by law, within one (1) year before or after the expiration of the initial twenty (20) year term, the Village may, at its option, extend the term of this Agreement for an additional 20 years if the property has not been annexed by the Village.
- 15. If any portion of this Agreement or ordinance enacted pursuant hereto shall be declared invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this Agreement as a whole other than the part so declared invalid. The parties shall then negotiate in good faith to seek to reestablish the powers and duties found to be invalid. The Owners or the Village shall be obligated to execute any document or take any additional action which may be required to correct any defect which has resulted or could result in the invalidation of this Agreement in whole or in part.
- 16. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts of duplicate originals or with multiple signature pages each of which shall constitute and be deemed one and the same document.
- 17. The undersigned Owners warrant that it constitutes all Owners of the Property and that it has full authority and power to sign the Agreement and any petitions submitted hereunder and that it has not and will not take any action to change ownership in the Property until after this Agreement is recorded.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO ANNEXATION AGREEMENT SOUTHWEST CORRIDOR (McCASLIN PARK)

This First Amendment to the Annexation Agreement Southwest Corridor is made and entered into this day of 2011, by and between the Village of Carol Stream, an Illinois municipal corporation (herein after referred to as the "Village") and the Carol Stream Park District, Du Page County, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as the "Owners")(the Village and the Owners are sometimes collectively referred to as the "Parties"):

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto have previously entered into an agreement titled "Annexation Agreement Southwest Corridor" dated January 11, 2010 ("Annexation Agreement"), and

WHEREAS, the Parties seek to amend said Agreement to accommodate changes in circumstances regarding access to water mains, and use of existing well and septic for the Carol Stream Park District's McCaslin Park, most notably that McCaslin Park is to be developed prior to the time that the Village of Carol Stream will have extended its water main to that vicinity, necessitating the Carol Stream Park District to extend said water main now, and

WHEREAS, in order to formalize and memorialize the agreements of the Parties the Annexation Agreement must be amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Village and the Owners hereby agree to amend the Annexation Agreement as follows:

- 1. Paragraph Eight (8) of the Annexation Agreement is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:
 - Subject to the conditions set forth herein, the Owners shall construct and extend the potable water main along the North Avenue frontage of the McCaslin Park property for a suitable distance so as to provide water service to the facilities in McCaslin Park, said extension to commence at the existing water main located within the North Avenue right-of-way at the southeast corner of the McCaslin Park property. Said water main extension shall be constructed in strict accordance with the plans and specifications previously approved by the Village and shall be subject to Village inspection and approval. The Village agrees to reimburse the Owners for the cost of the water main extension, provided that the cost of the water main extension shall be based upon bid unit prices of a competitive bid approved by the Village prior to construction. The Owner shall be responsible to construct, at their sole cost and expense, the private service lines necessary to connect to the municipal water or sewer system. The Owner shall be allowed to connect to the municipal water system. Prior to connection, the Owner shall, at their own cost and expense: a) disconnect (excepting the continued use of the well for the Coyote Crossing Mini Golf building, see below) the current water service from any existing well and eliminate any cross connections; b) discontinue use of any existing well as a potable water supply; and c) execute an Application and Consent to Rules - Carol Stream

Water Service User, Exhibit A attached hereto. The Owner shall be allowed to use the existing well solely for service at the Coyote Crossing Mini Golf building, provided, however, that at such time as the Property is annexed to the Village, the Owners shall disconnect the well and connect to the Village's water system at their sole cost and expense. In the event that the well is determined to be contaminated or is determined to be crossconnected with the Village's water system, the Owner shall be required to abandon and cap the well in accordance with applicable law. The Owner shall abide by the same ordinances, laws, rules and regulations with respect to water and sewer service as consumers and customers within the corporate limits of the Village, including, but is not limited to, any sprinkling bans or limitations which may be impose by the Village. The Owner shall not be required to pay the Special Southwest Utility construction fee. The Owner shall not be required to pay the regular water and sewer connection fees, with the exception of pass-through costs. Until the Property is annexed to the Village, the Owner shall pay 100% of the customary water charges applicable to uses within the Village.

2. All remaining provisions of the Annexation Agreement not amended herein shall remain in full force and effect.

EXHIBIT A APPLICATION AND CONSENT TO RULES CAROL STREAM WATER SERVICE USER

The Applicant certifies that he/she/they are the owners ("Owners") of the Property with the common street address of:

This form is an application to receive water from the Village of Carol Stream ("Village") potable water system at the above-specified address and to consent to the rules instituted from time-to-time by ordinance or administrative rule of the Village, or by State statute, which provides the terms and conditions under which residential water users may receive potable water service from the Village.

The Owners hereby consent and acknowledge that in their use of the potable water service of the Village they will fully comply with all such rules, regulations and statutes ("Rules") and that they will do so whether the Property at which they receive water is located within or outside of the corporate boundaries of the Village of Carol Stream. If the Property is located outside of the boundaries of the Village, the Owners consent to the jurisdiction by the Village of the exercise of its ordinances regulating the potable water system, including civil or quasi-criminal penalties, as if the Property were contained within the corporate boundaries of the Village. The Owners will not raise any lack of jurisdiction as counter-claim, affirmative defense or as a motion to dismiss, to any claim, demand or suit, but may defend against any such action by the Village in the same way as if the Property were located within the corporate boundaries of the Village.

The Owners consent to the shut-off of potable water service by the Village in the event that the Owners fail to: (1) Properly connect to the Village's system; (2) Report water leaks or any contamination; (3) Except for any water well allowed by the Village to be used for non-potable purposes, seal any water well on the Property within sixty (60) days after the connection of municipal water and not to install another well while Village water service is provided and furnish the Village with written evidence that the well has been sealed and no new wells put into service; (4) Abide by all of the rules and regulations applicable to a residential water user including but not limited to restrictions on water usage; (5) Promptly pay the water bills.

Subject to Village approval, the Owners may be allowed to keep and maintain an existing water well only in accordance with the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The water service connection and the well system plumbing must meet the requirements of the current edition of the Illinois Plumbing Code.
- 2. The private well must be used strictly for irrigation of lawn and landscaping.
- The installation must be approved by the Village's building official as providing
 positive separation between the public water supply system and the private well
 system.
- 4. The property owner must consent to inspections by the Village of Carol Stream at reasonable hours for the purpose of ensuring that positive separation exists between the public water supply system and the private well system.
- 5. The well must comply with the requirements of the DuPage County Health Department.
- 6. A notice of supplemental well must be recorded on the property title in accordance with the requirements of the DuPage County Health Department.

APPLICATION AND CONSENT TO RULES CAROL STREAM WATER SERVICE USER

- 7. The well must be inspected and sampled at the owners' expense by the DuPage County Health Department.
- 8. The well must be tested annually at the owners' expense, and the results provided to the Village within seven working days.
- 9. If the private well is ever found to be contaminated, it must be capped and taken out of service in accordance with the requirements of the DuPage County Health Department.
- 10. If contamination is found to exist in another well in the vicinity of the property, and the Village determines that there is reasonable cause to conclude that the threat of contamination exists, then the private well must be capped and taken out of service in accordance with the requirements of the DuPage County Health Department.

In promulgating Rules and notifying the Owners of the existence of such Rules, the Village shall only be required to take such actions as it takes with regard to other residential water users of the Village's system.

The Owners may require, from time-to-time, in writing, a list of the Rules of the Village applicable to their use of potable water and payment for such water and information regarding any loan applicable to the Property. It shall be the obligation of the Owners to make any subsequent Owners of the Property aware of the Application and Consent herein granted. The Village shall accept this Application and Consent by initially providing potable water to the Property. The Owners shall procure the signature of all Owners of the Property at the time of the execution of this document, but the failure to do so shall not release or waive the obligations of those parties that do execute this Application and Consent form for which they shall be jointly and severally liable for the obligations provided for herein both financial and with regard to the Rule.

Consultant Inspection Services for the 2012 Carolshire

Commons Comprehensive Inspections Project

PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to present to the Village Board a proposal for consultant services for the inspection of interior and exterior common areas at Carolshire Commons Condominiums, and to recommend approval.

BACKGROUND

Carolshire Commons Condominiums, located on the north side of Elk Trail west of Gary Avenue, was originally constructed in 1977 as an apartment complex, and later was converted to condominiums. The property is 10.45 acres in size, and includes 18 three-story buildings of 12 units each, for a total of 216 units. Although all of the units are privately owned, many are occupied by renters. Based on field observations and reports from residents, Carolshire Commons is known to exhibit the following quality-of-life problems:

- General disrepair of buildings, units and common areas.
- Failed parking lot pavement.
- Unsecured rubbish areas.
- Unmaintained, cluttered and nonfunctional recreational areas.
- Unsanitary conditions.
- Insect and rodent infestation.
- Vandalism.
- Security concerns due to damaged or inoperative lighting, doors, windows, and locks.

The Village of Carol Stream has received complaints periodically regarding the above issues, both from Carolshire residents and others who observe the property while passing by. We would offer the following examples of interaction between the Village and Carolshire in recent years:

- In 2006, after receiving a number of complaints, Community Development conducted inspections of the common areas at Carolshire Commons, and followed up with enforcement of Property Maintenance Code violations.
- In 2007, at the March 5th and March 19th Listening Posts, residents from Carolshire Commons addressed the Village Board and presented a letter which identified problems and requested assistance from the Village. Village staff subsequently met with the Carolshire Commons Condominium Association board in an effort to address the problems and identify causative issues; unfortunately, the factors which constrain the Condominium Association's ability to manage its property are largely beyond the control of the Village, such as delinquent association fees and poor private infrastructure characteristics, and so little progress was made in addressing the residents' complaints.
- In 2010, after the collapse of a deteriorated building entry canopy, the Village of Carol Stream placed the Condominium Association on notice regarding unsafe building entry canopies, and shortly thereafter placed the Association on notice regarding unsafe balconies. Since that time, the Association has removed all of the canopies and replaced all 144 balconies in the complex.
- On April 16, 2012, after Carolshire residents appeared at the April 2nd Listening Post, the Police Department conducted a public meeting to hear resident complaints and offer information. Following that meeting, Village staff met with Klein, Thorpe and Jenkins staff to discuss effective strategies for addressing quality of life issues at Carolshire Commons. Community Development staff also met with the Director of the DuPage County Department of Community Services to obtain information regarding programs and resources. As a result of those meetings, the attached draft Action Plan was developed.
- On May 2, 2012, Community Development met with the Condominium Association Operations Manager to request a schedule for completion of code violation abatement work at Carolshire, and to advise that the Village intended to become a more active partner in addressing needed improvements. The Operations Manager would not commit to a schedule and expressed opposition to Village involvement.

DISCUSSION

As recommended by the Village Attorney, the first step in the Action Plan for addressing quality of life concerns at Carolshire Commons Condominiums is to conduct a comprehensive inspection of the interior and exterior common areas. This work will require the use of consultant services, as Community Development

is not able to take on such a project using in-house resources. It is staff's intent to seek the cooperation of the Condominium Association in this initiative; however, it should be noted that if the Association is uncooperative, the Village and its duly authorized agents have the legal authority to access the public common areas and conduct inspections for the purpose of enforcing the Building, Fire and Property Maintenance Codes.

In order to obtain the services of a qualified code consultant to perform the desired code inspections, prepare professional inspection reports and provide necessary support services, staff prepared the attached Request For Proposal (RFP). We believe it best to keep the Village's building codes consultant, B&F Technical Code Services, separate from this code enforcement initiative, and so we chose to seek a proposal from the other code consultant the Village has used with good results, TPI Building Code Consultants. As noted in the RFP, the scope of consultant services includes comprehensive inspections, documentation of existing code violations in the interior and exterior common areas, preparation of detailed reports and associated documents, coordination with Village staff, and appearance in court if necessary.

Attached is the proposal received from TPI Building Code Consultants. We note that, although the amount of time necessary to perform the desired inspections and produce reports can be estimated with good accuracy, it is impossible to estimate the amount of time the consultant may need to spend on meetings and court appearances. Therefore, the consultant's proposal provides an hourly rate with a not-to-exceed amount for inspections and reports, and simply an hourly rate to be applied as needed for meetings and court appearances. We would also note that, while this initiative was not contemplated during preparation of the current budget, discretionary funds for inspection services are budgeted in the Community Development Consultant Services account, and so the necessary funds are available for this project.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the attached contract with TPI Building Code Consultants to provide consultant services on the *2012 Carolshire Commons Comprehensive Inspections Project* at an hourly rate of \$84 per hour with a not-to-exceed fee of \$10,584.00 for inspections and reports, and \$84 per hour for meetings and court appearances on an as-needed basis. If the Village Board concurs with the staff recommendation, they may authorize the Village Manager to execute the contract by motion.

Overview of the Project


The Village of Carol Stream Community Development Department requests a proposal to perform Residential Building Code, Fire Code and Property Maintenance Code inspections of the interior and exterior common areas at the Carolshire Commons Condominiums property. The purpose of the inspections is to determine violations of the applicable codes in order to ensure that the properties in Carolshire Commons meet Carol Stream's codes and ordinances. With the resulting inspections report, the Village intends to work with the Condominium Association to abate the violations. This initiative will benefit Carol Stream and the residents of Carolshire Commons by clearly establishing and enforcing the community's minimum housing standards, providing consistent enforcement of codes, and protecting property values.

General Community and Project Information

Carolshire Commons is located on the north side of Elk Trail, west of Gary Avenue, in the Village of Carol Stream. The property is 10.45 acres in size, and includes 18 three-story buildings of 12 units each, for a total of 216 units. The 18 buildings were constructed in groups of three, as shown on the aerial photo below. The property was originally constructed in 1977 as an apartment complex, and later converted to condominiums. Although all of the units are privately owned, many are occupied by renters.

Need for the Project

The most prevalent problems in Carolshire derive from poor property maintenance. The Village routinely receives complaints from Carolshire Commons residents regarding the living conditions in their neighborhood. Over the years, inspection staff from the Village of Carol Stream and the Carol Stream Fire Protection District have brought code violations to the attention of the property management and sought abatement, with limited success. In 2010, after a collapse of a deteriorated building entry canopy, the Village of Carol Stream placed the Condominium Association on notice regarding unsafe building entry canopies and balconies. Since that time, the Association has removed all of the canopies and replaced all 144 balconies in the complex; however, much work remains. Recent complaints and field observations emphasize the following problems:

- General disrepair of buildings, units and common areas.
- Failed parking lot pavement.
- Unsanitary conditions.
- Insect and rodent infestation.
- Unsecured rubbish areas.
- Unmaintained, neglected and cluttered recreational areas.
- Vandalism.
- Security concerns due to damaged or inoperative lighting, doors, windows, and locks.

Scope of Services

The project area will consist of all interior and exterior common areas in the Carolshire Commons Condominiums legally accessible to inspectors. Specific work tasks will include the following:

- 1. Develop inspection checklists.
- 2. Conduct comprehensive inspections of all common areas, including grounds, building exteriors and common areas inside the buildings that are legally accessible for inspection. Obtain photos (and videos if judged beneficial) to document the violations. Inspections shall be based on the adopted building and property maintenance codes of the Village of Carol Stream, which are as follows:
 - International Building Code, 2006 Edition
 - NFPA 70 National Electrical Code, 2008 Edition
 - Illinois Plumbing Code, Current Edition
 - International Mechanical Code, 2006 Edition
 - International Fire Code, 2006 Edition
 - International Residential Code, 2006 Edition
 - International Property Maintenance Code, 2006 Edition
 - International Fuel Gas Code, 2006 Edition
 - International Energy Conservation Code, 2006 Edition
- 3. Prepare a clear, thorough and organized inspection report documenting code violations, with code citations. Village staff will review the report and may request clarifications or corrections.
- 4. Attend meetings as necessary. This will likely include an initial meeting with Community Development, Police and Fire Protection District staff, possible coordination meetings during the course of the inspections, a final meeting to discuss the results of the inspections, and a possible meeting to present the report to the Condominium Association.
- 5. Provide support as necessary during prosecution of violations, including appearance in court if necessary.
- 6. Carry out support tasks as necessary and directed on an as-needed basis.

Responsibilities of Village Staff and Other Village Resources

The Village staff will do the following:

- 1. Coordinate with the Condominium Association and property owners.
- 2. Develop informational materials.
- 3. Provide a database with property and owner information.
- 4. Prosecute violations.

General Information

All documents, inquiries and correspondence relating to or in reference to this RFP shall become the property of the Village of Carol Stream upon receipt. Any restrictions on the use of data contained within the proposal must be clearly stated within the proposal itself.

The Village of Carol Stream reserves the right to reject the proposal in whole or in part, to waive all formalities, and to accept the proposal if determined to be in the best interests of the Village. AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM,
DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS ASCERTAINING THE
PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES FOR LABORERS, WORKERS AND
MECHANICS EMPLOYED ON PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS OF SAID VILLAGE

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works." approved June 26, 1941, as amended, (820 ILCS 130/1-12); and,

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Carol Stream employed in performing construction or public works for said Village of Carol Stream.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of this Village is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing

rate of wages for construction work in DuPage County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June of the current year, a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the Village of Carol Stream. The definition of any terms appearing in this ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of this Village to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Village this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The Village Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area that the determination of prevailing wages has been made, a notice of its determination in substantially the following form:

"Please take notice that the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, has investigated and ascertained the prevailing rate of wages in accordance with Chapter 820 ILCS 130/1-12, Illinois Compiled Statutes, and that a copy of such determination is on file in the office of the Village Clerk of the Village of Carol Stream, and is available for public inspection by any interested party".

Such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of the Village of Carol Stream.

SECTION 7: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

Explanations

DUPAGE COUNTY

IRON WORKERS AND FENCE ERECTOR (WEST) - West of Route 53.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

TRAFFIC SAFETY - work associated with barricades, horses and drums used to reduce lane usage on highway work, the installation and removal of temporary lane markings, and the installation and removal

of temporary road signs.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walls, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN

Low voltage installation, maintenance and removal of telecommunication facilities (voice, sound, data and video) including telephone and data inside wire, interconnect, terminal equipment, central offices, PABX, fiber optic cable and equipment, micro waves, V-SAT, bypass, CATV, WAN (wide area networks), LAN (local area networks), and ISDN (integrated system digital network), pulling of wire in raceways, but not the installation of raceways.

MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all material that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installation of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone,

granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and exteriors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and exterior which are installed in a similar manner.

MATERIAL TESTER I: Hand coring and drilling for testing of materials; field inspection of uncured concrete and asphalt.

MATERIAL TESTER II: Field inspection of welds, structural steel, fireproofing, masonry, soil, facade, reinforcing steel, formwork, cured concrete, and concrete and asphalt batch plants; adjusting proportions of bituminous mixtures.

Class 5. Bobcats (all); Brick Forklifts; Oilers.

Class 6. Field Mechanics and Field Welders

Class 7. Gradall and machines of like nature.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Two or three Axle Trucks. A-frame Truck when used for transportation purposes; Air Compressors and Welding Machines, including those pulled by cars, pick-up trucks and tractors; Ambulances; Batch Gate Lockers; Batch Hopperman; Car and Truck Washers; Carry-alls; Fork Lifts and Hoisters; Helpers; Mechanics Helpers and Greasers; Oil Distributors 2-man operation; Pavement Breakers; Pole Trailer, up to 40 feet; Power Mower Tractors; Self-propelled Chip Spreader; Skipman; Slurry Trucks, 2-man operation; Slurry Truck Conveyor Operation, 2 or 3 man; Teamsters; Unskilled Dumpman; and Truck Drivers hauling warning lights, barricades, and portable toilets on the job site.

Five axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnatrailers or turnapulls when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 16 cubic yards; Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Oil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; Slurry trucks, 1-man operation; Winch trucks, 3 axles or more; Mechanic--Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Six axle trucks; Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of sand, cement, marble chips, and all other materials that may be used by the Mosaic Terrazzo Mechanic, and the mixing, grinding, grouting, cleaning and sealing of all Marble, Mosaic, and Terrazzo work, floors, base, stairs, and wainscoting by hand or machine, and in addition, assisting and aiding Marble, Masonic, and Terrazzo Mechanics.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A FIRST AMENDMENT TO AN ANNEXATION AGREEMENT (BENJAMIN MIDDLE SCHOOL – 28W300 ST. CHARLES ROAD)

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Benjamin School District No. 25 is the owner of the property located at 28W300 St. Charles Road, Benjamin Middle School, such property being legally described as follows:

PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to briefly explain the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning's (CMAP) Local Technical Assistance Program, and to request Village Board approval of a Resolution of Support for the Village's application for CMAP staff assistance in the preparation of a new Comprehensive Plan.

DISCUSSION

In 2005, the Illinois General Assembly formed CMAP to integrate the planning of land use and transportation for the seven-county Chicago metropolitan region. (The Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission, "NIPC", and the Chicago Area Transportation Study, "CATS", were consolidated within CMAP). In October 2010, CMAP adopted the Go To 2040 Regional Comprehensive Plan for the Chicago area. Also in October 2010, CMAP received a \$4.25 million Sustainable Communities Regional Planning grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to facilitate the implementation of the Go To 2040 plan.

To accomplish the goal of implementing the principles of the *Go To 2040 Plan* at the local level throughout the region, CMAP created the Local Technical Assistance (LTA) program. Through the LTA program, successful applicants receive CMAP assistance to undertake planning projects that are consistent with the principles of *Go To 2040*. One type of project eligible for assistance through the LTA program is the development of comprehensive plans.

Carol Stream's Current Comprehensive Plan

The Village's current Comprehensive Plan, prepared by the DuPage County Regional Planning Commission, was adopted in 1982. Good planning practice dictates that Comprehensive Plans should be prepared once every ten years, and that plans should be updated at the five-year midpoint. It should come as no surprise that the Village's 1982 Comprehensive Plan no longer has value as a land use and planning policy document for the community.

Starting in 2006, at the beginning of each year's budget process, Community Development Department staff has suggested that the Village should consider including funds in the budget to hire a planning consultant to prepare a comprehensive plan for the Village. In various goal setting sessions and retreats, the Village Board has acknowledged the importance and need for the Village to prepare a new comprehensive plan. However, in an era of declining revenues and a protracted economic recession, the Village has been unable to allocate the funds to hire a consultant to prepare a comprehensive plan. Staff estimates that at least \$120,000 would be needed for consultant services to allow for the preparation of a comprehensive plan for the Village.

Local Technical Assistance Program - Call for Projects

CMAP recently announced its second call for projects for communities wishing to receive assistance through the LTA Program. (A table of the projects approved through the first round of funding is attached for your information.) Community Development staff has been researching the program and attended a workshop at CMAP in May. At this time, we recommend that the Village submit an application to CMAP's LTA Program for assistance in preparing a new comprehensive plan for Carol Stream. If our application is approved, CMAP would provide assistance in the form of CMAP staff resources to undertake the development of a new comprehensive plan. Community Development Department staff would closely monitor the project and be involved throughout the project. (For informational purposes, to offset the time that we believe Village staff would need to allocate toward this project, the current fiscal year budget includes \$20,000 for the Village to hire a planning consultant to manage other development petitions while Village staff works with CMAP staff on the comprehensive plan project.)

Applications for the second round of LTA program funding are due August 1, 2012, and staff has begun the background work necessary to prepare an application. CMAP has suggested that applicants should submit various examples of community support for their applications. Village Board approval of the attached Resolution would be a clear indication that the elected officials of the Village of Carol Stream are supportive of CMAP assistance for the completion of a new comprehensive plan for the Village.

RECOMMENDATION

If the Village Board wishes to pursue staff assistance from CMAP for a new comprehensive plan through its LTA program, the Board should approve the attached Resolution.

Request for Waiver of Sign Permit Fee for Bud's Run

PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to present to the Village Board a request from Sharon Swanson for waiver of the sign permit fee for special event signs to be posted at Town Center Park for the *Celebrate Life Bud Swanson Memorial 5K Run/Walk* event (*Bud's Run*), and to recommend approval of the request.

DISCUSSION

Attached is a copy of an e-mail from Sharon Swanson, the *Bud's Run* Race Director, regarding special event signage for this year's event, which is scheduled to take place on June 23rd at the Town Center. Mrs. Swanson wishes to place two banner signs, one on the Lies Road frontage and one on the Gary Avenue frontage. The signs can be approved in accordance with the provisions for Special Event Signs as set forth in the Sign Code. Mrs. Swanson is requesting that the fee for the required sign permit be waived.

The Village typically waives certain fees, such as raffle license fees and amplification permit fees, for community organizations. However, the waiver of building and zoning permit fees, which are greater in cost and cover the Village's cost of providing services, has only been done for other taxing bodies. In reviewing Mrs. Swanson's request, staff must be concerned with the precedent it sets.

Staff would note that *Bud's Run* has been issued a Use Permit (attached) for use of the Town Center for their event, and that the fee for this permit was waived. This is consistent with policy direction received from the Village Board in 2009, whereby staff no longer actively markets the use of the Town Center, but simply processes requests for use on a case-by-case basis and administratively waives use fees only for those organizations that have received

prior fee waivers. In addition, as is customary for this event, the Village Board waived the fee for the sound amplification permit (attached) at their May 7, 2012, meeting.

In evaluating the request for waiver of the sign permit fee, staff would note the following:

- The request is being made by an organization for which a Use Permit has been issued for the use of the Town Center.
- The fee requested to be waived, that of a sign permit fee for temporary special event signage, applies to the advertisement of the event for which the Village has already approved use of the Town Center.
- In addition to waiver of fee for the Use Permit, the requestor has also received approval for the waiver of fee for an amplification permit for the event.
- The requestor is a not-for-profit organization whose purpose in holding the event is to raise funds for the public benefit.

In consideration of the above, staff believes the precedent that would be set by the waiver of the sign permit fee for *Bud's Run* would apply to a very select set of circumstances, similar to those noted above. Therefore, we have no objection to Mrs. Swanson's request.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the request for waiver of fee for the permit for special event signage for *Bud's Run*, to take place at the Town Center on June 23, 2012. If the Village Board concurs with the staff recommendation, they may approve the request by motion.
