Budget Transfers:

The Board approved budget transfers for Overtime and Contractual Snowplowing due to increased winter demands. The transfers were \$60,000 to the Street Division Overtime Account and \$125,000 to the Contractual Snowplowing Account.

Suggested Change of Venue- 4th of July Concert & Fireworks:

The Board approved of the change in venue for the 4th of July Concert and Fireworks from Hampe Park to McCaslin Park.

Memorial Park Monument Purchase:

An award of purchase for the replacement of the monument honoring fallen soldiers and emergency response workers was awarded to Kowalski Memorials. The memorial cost of \$4,800 and the Park District has agreed to share the cost.

2008 Flexible Pavement-Change Order #1 -Acceptance:

The Board approved Change Order #1, for -\$46,274.49, the final balancing change order for unneeded contract quantities, final payment of \$42,787.78 for Plote Construction, Inc. and acceptance of the public improvements for the 2008 Flexible Pavement Project.

Overhead Sewer Program:

This is a memo from Community Development Director Bob Glees of January 15, 2009, the purpose of which is to request Village Board approval for a program to reimburse homeowners for certain costs associated with the installation of overhead sewers in their homes.

EqualLogic Storage Recommendation:

The Board approved the purchase of an EqualLogic Storage System from Dell under a State Contract for \$84,199.60 making four annual lease payments of \$21.049.90.

Ordinance 2009-01-01 Establishing an Overhead Sewer Program:

COMMENTS:

Trustee Fenner on Item G-7 complimented and congratulated IT Coordinator Marc Talavera for all the ideas and research that he does to keep the Village on the cutting edge of IT technology while saving money at the same time.

REGULAR MEETING:

G-5: Commemorative Coins:

Village Manager Breinig presented three proposals of coins that were suggested as a commemorative for the 50th Anniversary. He said that the enameled finish is much more expensive and considering all of the detail of the anniversary logo, it would be very difficult, and expensive to duplicate. There are several other finishes and choices of design, but as seen in the memo, the costs, compared to the lapel pins, is quite a difference in the cost. It was the consensus of the Board to order more lapel pins.

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

Trustee Drager said that it was good to have the County Commissioners meet with the residents. He said that he believes that things will be fine, but it will take everybody working together and it will take time. God Bless our new President, God Bless everyone and God Bless America and always, always Pray for our Troops.

Trustee McCarthy also thanked the County Commissioners for meeting with everyone, especially Jim Zay. He said that the Martin Luther King Memorial was very impressive

once again. Trustee McCarthy said that one more time it is time for baseball sign-ups, kids and managers.

Trustee Fenner also reiterated how great the program was yesterday and the part of it that included College Tours where freshman and sophomore kids are taken on tours of colleges and they come back knowing what it takes for grades and for funds and Outreach Community Center is always willing to take donations to keep this program going and reaching even more students.

Trustee Weiss reiterated the thanks to the DuPage Board members and to the Wheaton Christian Church for their contributions to the community as well as the Chamber of Commerce and their members that contribute to our Christmas Sharing Program.

Trustee Schwarze also thanked the DuPage County reps for being here. He also recognized the efforts of the Wheaton Christian Church, Our Savior Lutheran Church. In regard to our new President, this is a new day and it is very exciting. Trustee Schwarze said, on a more somber note, the Board had a budget meeting prior to this meeting and as many of residents may not know, there is no Carol Stream Village property tax, and most of the money for the budget comes from sales tax and the Board are going to have to make many tough decisions as to keep within the money that comes in as sales tax. So it's to everybody's benefit if everyone does what they can to shop in Carol Stream.

Trustee Gieser said that the Martin Luther King presentation was well attended. He congratulated the new President and encourage people to have hope. He is one man and everyone needs to do their part to make America what it should be. He also congratulated the Citizen of the Year nominees who are all volunteers that make Carol Stream such a wonderful place to live.

Mr. Breinig said that amount donated to Christmas Sharing by residents of community was \$3,380.57. He said that this has been a very trying winter as shown by the funds transfer for snow removal, and he wanted to share what he and the Trustees have heard from residents, that are public works department does a great job with what they have had to deal with. He reminded everyone to remove their cars off the street so the plows can get the whole street done; especially those who forget to move their cars back onto their driveways when they are done shoveling.

Village Clerk Melody reminded everyone that the Clerk's Office is now accepting petitions for nominations to the April 7th Consolidated Election.

Mayor Saverino said that he was impressed that the members of the County Board made their presentation and brought along the County Engineer. He thanked LuAnn and the Chamber for their contribution to Christmas Sharing and for always being there to help members of the community when disaster strikes. Mayor Saverino said that the meeting is running late because all of the residents that wanted to speak about the flood issues was given time to do so, but he recommended that the next meeting about these issues be held on a different night than the Village Board meeting and then there won't be such tight time restrictions. Mayor Saverino said that the Police Department has had 106 more DUI arrests than last year, which is a great thing. Another good thing is that our Police Volunteers gave 2,747 hours last year and said that he is working on a project that would provide each volunteer with a sweatshirt that would identify them just the same way the red t-shirts do. Mayor Saverino said that in regard to the overhead sewer ordinance there will be an information packet regarding how it has to be done and that for families that qualify, there will matching funds up to \$2,500. Mayor Saverino thanked Public Works for their fine work on keeping the snow cleared.

Presentation of the Colors was done by Cub Scout Pack 190 of Roy DeShane School and led those in attendance in The Pledge of Allegiance.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION & PUBLIC HEARINGS: Recognition of Police Department Volunteers:

Sgt. Brian Pece congratulated CST John Marciniak and the Police Department Volunteers for the great work that they do for the Village. Sgt. Pece said that in 2008, they have surpassed all other records, having 2,748.75 hours, and increase of 71% over last year and presented a check for \$57,971.13 which represents the amount of money the volunteers saved the village. Acknowledging the Volunteers with the most hours were Bill Macofsky, 821.5 hours, Joyce Cardone, 287.25 hours and Ron Mason 156 hours. Sgt. Pece said that while these are the top three for volunteer hours, the other 52 volunteers also put in a lot of valuable hours.

Police Department Receipt of Award for National Night Out:

Officer Garza stated that on August 5th 2008 communities across the national celebrated the 25th annual National Night Out. This event is to strengthen neighborhood and community partners and send a message to criminals, letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back. Every year the Police Department with the Outreach Community Center have a community barbeque at Community Park. In 2008, for the entire State of Illinois, only thirteen Villages received this award and Carol Stream was one of them. He thanked the Community Outreach Center, especially Vanessa Roth, and the rest of the staff. He also thanked the Village Board for sponsoring the event. On behalf of the OCC, Vanessa Roth said that they are honored to be a part of this event each year.

Proclamation Declaring February 12, 2009, as Abraham Lincoln Day was read by Trustee Schwarze.

Historical Recollection Series: Early Development of the Library:

Resolution 2389, ADOPTING MUNICIPAL LEGISLATIVE POSITIONS AND PRIORITIES FOR THE 2009 LEGISLATIVE SESSION.

Trustee Schwarze said that there is a lot of information in the program by the DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference. He said that he was somewhat in agreement with most of them, but there were a couple of items that he is not comfortable with. One involves doing a blended salary average for pension calculations for newly hired Police and Fire Fighters and that it grandfathers in those who are currently hired, if it were to take effect. He said that it is a disservice to those veterans who 20 or 30 years and work on a couple of years at a top position and then retire with less than what is allowed currently. Another issue he has is with amendment to the Public Safety Employment Benefit Act regarding insurance for those who suffer a disability event that would keep them from being able to work and the definition of "unreasonable hardship". He said if those words were removed it would be acceptable. Trustee Schwarze said that because he is a Fire Fighter, he will abstain from voting on this issue.

Mayor Pro-Tem Fenner said that the Municipal Legislative positions and priorities has always been presented to us in a packet since we have a representative on that Board with input. Traditionally, we run into a certain legislative action or priority that we, as a Village, don't necessarily agree with. But because we are looking at what is best for the entire region, or all of our members, we will take a step back to support the entire legislative package, but then when we go down to Springfield, on the drive-down to talk about it, we can express our own view.

Trustee McCarthy moved and Trustee Gieser made the second to adopt the Municipal Legislative Positions and Priorities for the 2009 Legislative Session of the DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference. The results of the roll call vote were:

Trustee McCarthy also thanked Lynn O'Dell for her contribution to the History of the Library. He also noted that the three candidates for Village Board Trustee have agreed among themselves that they will not be putting out political signs for the April election. Trustee McCarthy commented on the happening in Springfield last week, where all of the senators agreed on one thing and he

hopes that they will Keep It Going and agree to get more things done for the State and its citizens.

Village Manager Breinig said that on the Consent Agenda for this meeting, the Trustees approved the study of the Carol Stream Venture Subdivision, but for that to go without kind of notice is probably an understatement of its import. That is the engineering analysis of the flooding that occurred in Chatham area that has been complained about at several meetings by the residents. This project is going to make some headway in getting some answers for all of us. The other part is that staff has submitted to the County. our draft of the scope of services for Original Carol Stream in the Klein Creek area. Variations - Sign Code

Mario Spina, Angel Associates was sworn in as a witness in this matter. Mr. Spina presented his request to amend the approved PUD Plan by removing one of the buildings. He is also requesting a Sign Code variation to allow two ground signs on Schmale Road.

There were no comments or questions from those in attendance at the call for public hearing.

Mr. Glees reported that Mario Spina, Vice President of Angel Associates LP is requesting an approval of modifications of an approved final PUD Plan and a variation to allow an additional ground sign. In August of 2008, the Village Board approved the Final PUD Plan and the proposed commercial development in the 3.4 acre property located within the southeast corridor of Schmale Road and St. Charles Road. The approved development contained three (3) buildings, a car wash, and a 10,000 sq.ft. in-line commercial center and a 3,000 sq. ft. stand-alone building with an unspecified use. As explained in the

applicant's cover letter, the state of the economy, difficulty in securing tenants and the cost of the underground storm water vault system have caused the applicant to request an approval of an amendment to the final PUD Plan to delete the stand-alone building from the Plan. In addition, the Plan Commission should also recall that the applicant's original request for a Sign Code variations were for a ground sign taller and greater that the area than permitted by the Sign Code. At their April, 2008 meeting, the Plan Commission advised the applicant that they could not support the Sign Code Variations and directed the applicant to continue to work with staff to refine his request. The applicant has modified his signage plans and is requesting a variation to allow an additional ground sign. With respect to the revisions of the final PUD Plan, staff has evaluated the positive and negative aspects of the proposed revisions to the Plan. The only potential negative aspect of the plan is that the property may generate less sales tax revenue for the Village under the revised plan, since the plan will have 3,000 fewer square feet of commercial space. However, it should be noted that since the use of the third building was unspecified, there is not quarantee that the building would contain significant sales tax revenue generating From the positive standpoint, the proposed revised plan will provide a more substantial buffer between the adjacent apartment complex and the proposed commercial development will provide more parking and more parking lot green space and will have a less congested circulation pattern. Staff finds that the revised plan is still consistent with the purpose and intent of the Planned Unit Development section of the Zoning Code and can support the applicant's request to amend the plan, subject to certain site plan recommendations that are listed in the staff report for this meeting. With respect to the Sign Code Variations, the applicant's original Sign Code variation application included a request to allow a ground directory sign that was fourteen (14) feet in height and 120 sq.ft. in area. The applicant has revised the request and is now seeking a variation that would allow an additional ground sign on the Schmale Road frontage. The applicant wishes to install ground signs on either side of the access drive leading to Schmale Road. Staff would note that both signs are proposed to measure six (6) feet in height, which complies with the Sign Code requirement. The signs are also shown to measure only 40 Sq. Ft. in area, which is significantly smaller than the 72 sq. ft. allowed for a single use building and 96 sq. ft. allowed for a directory sign. Staff believes that there are several factors that support the applicants Sign Code Variation request as discussed in the staff report. Staff can support the Sign Code request as the request is supported by the unique aspects of the property and will result in signage that is consistent with other ground signs in the Schmale Road commercial corridor, however staff would note that for the Plan Commission's information, the request is simply for a variation to allow an additional ground sign. The Sign Code allows ground signs up to 96 sq. ft. in area for a directory sign, and 72 sq.ft. for a single use building. While the signs indicated on the applicants request are much smaller the this. If the Plan Commission were to wish to place limitations on the sign area for the Schmale Road signs they should consider doing so by means of an additional condition of approval. Staff recommends approval of the modifications to the final PUD Plan and of the Sign Code Variation subject to the conditions noted in the staff report.

Commissioner Spink commented that this development has been named Carol Court and there is already a street with that name and that this should be called something else. She asked what materials would be used for the fence and Mr. Spina said that he has not decided but is considering a wood fence. Commissioner Spink asked if Mr. Spina agreed with the conditions and was told he does.

Commissioner Manzzullo commented that he likes this plan much more than the first plan. He asked about a potential condition of approval to limit the size of the signs.

Chairman Michaelsen suggested that the maximum sign area should be 40 square feet each and Mr. Spina agreed. Chairman Michaelsen asked about the size of the landscape islands and Mr. Spina provided an explanation.

Commissioner McNally recommended approval, with the conditions noted on the request and the additional condition of sign size for Schmale Road signs as no larger than 40 sq. ft., Commissioner Smoot made the second. The results of the roll call vote were:

Mario Spina of Angel Associates is requesting modifications to an approved Final Planned Unit Development Plan and a Variation to allow an additional ground sign for the proposed commercial development at 293 and 295-313 S. Schmale Road. In August of 2008, the Village Board approved Ordinance 2008-08-42, which approved the Final Planned Unit Development Plan for Angel Associates' commercial development on the 3.4-acre property located within the southeast quadrant of Schmale Road and St. Charles Road. The approved development was to contain three buildings: a car wash, a 10,000 square foot inline commercial center and a 3,081 square foot stand-alone building.

The applicant states that, due to the economy, difficulty in securing tenants, and the cost of the underground storm water vault system, he wishes to amend the approved Final PUD Plan to delete the stand-alone building from the plan. The Village Board may also recall that the applicant's original application included a request for Sign Code Variations to allow a ground sign that was taller and greater in area than permitted by the Sign Code. At the April 14, 2008, Plan Commission meeting, the Commission advised the applicant that they could not support the Sign Code Variations and directed the applicant to continue working with staff to refine his request. The applicant has since modified the signage plans and is requesting a Variation to allow an additional ground sign on Schmale Road.

The staff report and supporting documentation were transmitted to the Village Board with the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PC/ZBA) packet on February 6, 2009. At their February 9, 2009, meeting, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the request for Modifications to the Approved PUD Plan, and approved the applicant's request for Sign Code Variation, by a vote of 7-0.

If the Village Board concurs with the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals recommendation for approval of the request for Modifications to the Approved PUD Plan, they should adopt the necessary ordinance.

Requests for Variations to the Sign Code may be granted by the PC/ZBA. If no action is taken by the Village Board, the decision of the PC/ZBA becomes final 21 days after the date the request first appears before the Village Board. The Board may choose to act on the request, either to approve or deny, any time within the 21-day period, in which case the decision of the Board is final.

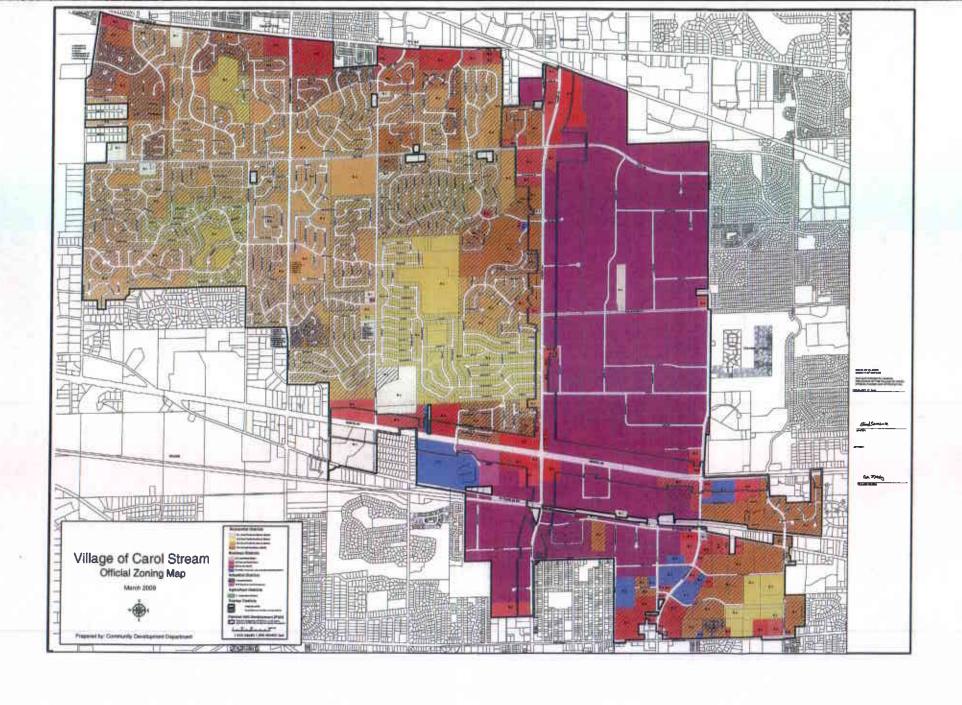

On February 10, 2009, the Village of Carol Stream publicly opened bids for the Replacement of Evergreen Drive Sanitary Lift Station. Thirteen bids were received. From a low of \$254,900 to a high of \$549,478. The low bidder, Szabo at \$254,000, only provided a Bid Bond of 5%, instead of the required 10% and they did not indicate in their bid that they had received Addendum #3. It is therefore recommended to reject this bid and award to the second lowest bidder, who completely complied with the project specifications, Glenbrook Excavating and Concrete, Inc., at \$281,000. This amount is well below the Engineer's estimate of \$475,000 and our budget of \$500,000.

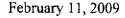
Attached is a summary of the bids received and a recommendation from our consulting Engineer.

Our pre-bid opinion of probable cost for this Project was \$475,000.00.

We have analyzed each of the bids and found the bid of the low bidder, C.Szabo Contracting, Inc. (CSCI) to be non responsive. CSCI failed to provide the required bid security of 10 percent of the total amount of bid. CSCI provided a bid security in the form of a bid bond for only 5 percent of the total amount of the bid. CSCI also, as noted, did not acknowledge addendum No. 3 on the bid form. However, they did acknowledge receiving the Addendum No. 3 by fax. In any event, we consider the insufficient bid bond and failure to acknowledge the addendum a nonresponsive bid.

Therefore, we find Glenbrook Excavating & Concrete, Inc. (GECI) to be the lowest, responsible, and responsive Bidder.

GECI successfully completed the Village's Tubeway Lift Station Replacement project in 2007. Therefore, based upon our familiarity and past working relationships with GECI, we believe that GECI is qualified to complete the Project.

Subject to review by the Village Attorney, we recommend the award of the Contract to Glenbrook Excavating & Concrete, Inc. in the amount of \$281,000.00.

Attached is a proposed amendment to our existing Design agreement with Baxter & Woodman consulting engineers to provide the construction engineering services for the planned construction of the Evergreen Drive sanitary lift station. The cost will be determined on a time and material basis, not to exceed \$37,000. This is comparable to the \$38,000 engineering fee we paid during the construction of the Charger Ct. lift Station and less than the \$53,714 construction engineering fee paid for the Tubeway Dr. station.

Baxter & Woodman were the engineers who provided the 2003 overall evaluation of the Village's lift stations and provided the design and construction supervision for the reconstruction of both the Charger Court and the Tubeway Drive sanitary lift stations. Both of these projects were completed in a timely manner, and the design and eventual construction of both facilities have resulted in excellent capital improvement projects for the Village.

It is my recommendation that Baxter & Woodman consulting engineers of Crystal Lake, Illinois, be awarded the engineering construction services contract for the Evergreen Sanitary Lift Station as outlined in the attached Amendment. The proposed not to exceed fee is within the budgeted amount for the construction of these facilities.

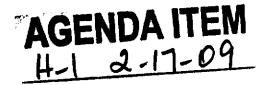

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO A FINAL PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT PLAN (293-313 S. SCHMALE ROAD)

WHEREAS, Mario Spina, Vice President of Angel Associates, LP, has requested approval of an Amendment to a Final Planned Unit Development Plan (Ordinance 2008-08-42) for the 3.4 acre property located within the southeast quadrant of Schmale Road and St. Charles Road, in accordance with Section 16-16-5(B)(1)(b) of the Carol Stream Zoning Code to delete a stand alone building from the Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals of the Village of Carol Stream, at their February 9, 2009 meeting, recommended approval of the Amendment to the Final Planned Unit Development Plan provided certain conditions are met and has filed its recommendations with the Village Board of Trustees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the property legally described in Section 1 of this Ordinance, commonly known as 295-313 S. Schmale Road, shall be granted an Amendment to a Final Planned Unit Development Plan approval in accordance with the Final Planned Unit Development Plan (Exhibit A) and Overall Landscape Plan (Exhibit B), drawn by Gleason Architects, PC, 769 Heartland Drive, Unit A, Sugar Grove, IL 60554, provided the following conditions are met:

- 1. That all conditions of approval from Ordinance 2008-08-42 shall be valid and in effect except where the conditions herein are more restrictive or more specifically relevant to the revised Final PUD Plan design.
- 2. That each of the two ground signs along the Schmale Road frontage shall be no larger than 40 square feet in area.

3. That the development of the site and buildings will comply with all State, County, and Village Codes and requirements.

Turf Replacement – Park and School Districts

The Park District has submitted a request for a special use to increase the intensity of use for the football field at Glenbard North High School. Attached you will find a request for waiving of fees associated with the special use request. In the past the Village has waived fees for other governmental bodies and staff recommends approval of the fee waiver.

A stormwater submittal is also required for replacement of the turf at the football field. Consistent with practice of waiving fees for other governmental bodies staff recommends that all fees be waived except any out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the Village.

This request is for Village fees only. In making this recommendation, staff is not recommending relief from required zoning or stormwater approvals.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT REGARDING FACILITIES CONSTRUCTION COSTS AND RECREATIONAL USE BETWEEN GLENBARD TOWNSHIP HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 87 AND CAROL STREAM PARK DISTRICT (GLENBARD NORTH HIGH SCHOOL STADIUM FIELD)

This Agreement is made between the Board of Education of Glenbard Township High School District No. 87, DuPage County, Illinois (the "School District") and the Board of Commissioners of the Carol Stream Park District, DuPage County, Illinois (the "Park District").

WHEREAS, the Illinois Constitution and statutes encourage and permit intergovernmental cooperation between units of local government; and

WHEREAS, the School District is the owner of a high school building and surrounding campus, known as Glenbard North High School (the "School"), which includes a stadium complex (the "Stadium"), all situated within the geographical boundaries of the Park District; and

WHEREAS, the School District intends to enter into a contract for the construction of a synthetic turf sports field at the Stadium, related storm water management and remediation improvements, grading, fencing, an underground drainage system, a base and sub-base support system for the turf, the purchase of turf grooming equipment required for turf maintenance (the "Turf Project") and the installation of new lights at the stadium (the "Light Project"; collectively the Turf Project and the Light Project shall be referred to in this Agreement as the "Project"). The construction is anticipated to be completed for use during the 2009 - 2010 school year; and

WHEREAS, the Park District and School District have mutually determined that it would be in the best interests of the citizens of the community to utilize the synthetic turf field of the Stadium during certain hours for community recreation activities sponsored by the Park District, when the Stadium is not utilized for educational purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Park District has determined that a synthetic turf field at the Stadium would be appropriate, useful and necessary in order to provide the citizens of the community with necessary recreational facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Park District has agreed to reimburse the School District for a portion of the costs of the Project in exchange for certain commitments from the School District for use of the Stadium by the Park District; and

WHEREAS, the School District has determined that the Park District's use of the Stadium for community recreation activities during the agreed hours would not interfere with the School District's delivery of curricular and extra-curricular educational services to its students and residents, and has further determined that such use will enhance the delivery of such educational services; and

WHEREAS, the constituencies of both the School District and the Park District will be more effectively and economically served by the School District and the Park District sharing the costs of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises contained herein, the School District and the Park District agree as follows:

I. <u>Term and Termination</u>. The term of this Agreement shall be from the Effective Date, as defined in Section VIII.N through December 31, 2023, unless earlier terminated as provided in this Agreement. The School District and the Park District shall have the right to terminate this Agreement prior to December 31, 2023, only in the event the School District

decides to sell the School, the Agreement is terminated by the School District in accordance with Section III.A, the Agreement is terminated by the Park District in accordance with Section III.B.1 or Section III.C, the Stadium turf requires replacement in accordance with Section IV.B, the parties cannot agree on a schedule of use under Section V.B.2, or a party is in default under Section VIII.E. At any time, the parties may agree in writing to extend the terms of this Agreement for a specified period of time.

II. Rent. Unless otherwise expressly provided, no payments in the nature of rent or payment for services rendered shall be due either party, as the Park District's contributions and the mutual covenants contained in this Agreement are sufficient consideration and the Park District's interest under this Agreement is not a leasehold interest.

III. Construction Costs and Management.

A. <u>School District Payment</u>. The School District shall make all payments to the various vendors for all costs related to the Project, including all fees and costs for architectural services, construction, approved alterations, modifications and resulting change orders; provided that if the lowest responsible bid amount related to the Turf Project exceeds \$1,400,000, the School District may, in its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement. A rendering of the Project is attached as Exhibit A.

B. Park District Contribution.

1. <u>Turf Project Costs.</u> Subject to the terms of this Agreement, the Park District shall pay 50% of the costs for the Turf Project (the "Turf Contribution") to the School District to help defray the costs of the Turf Project; provided that the Park District

shall only be obligated to pay for 32% of the costs attributable to the storm water management and remediation improvements, and further provided that the Park District shall only be obligated up to an additional \$20,000 for all design, architectural, engineering, soil testing, topographical survey and permitting fees/costs/expenses (also referred to as 'soft costs'). The Park District's Turf Contribution shall not exceed \$600,000. If the lowest responsible bid amount would result in the Park District's Turf Contribution, including the costs attributable to the storm water management and remediation improvements, to exceed \$600,000, the Park District may terminate this Agreement upon (i) providing written notice of its termination to the School District within 14 days after receiving notice of the bid amount; and (ii) the Park District's payment, within 14 days after receiving a written invoice from the School District, of 50% of the costs (capped at the \$20,000 sum for 'soft costs' referenced above) incurred by the School District related to the Turf Project.

- 2. <u>Lighting Costs</u>. Subject to the terms of this Agreement, the Park District shall pay 50% of the costs associated with installing new lights at the stadium (the "Light Contribution") to the School District to help defray those costs; provided that the Light Contribution shall not exceed \$75,000. The Turf Contribution and the Light Contribution shall be collectively referred to as the "Park District Contribution" in this Agreement.
- 3. <u>Payment of Park District Contribution</u>. The Park District shall pay the Park District Contribution to the School District in two equal installments, payable when

the Project is 50% and 100% completed. The School District's architect shall certify in writing the completion percentages and submit a copy to the Park District. The School District shall give written notice of the amount due along with the architect's certificate of completion to the Park District. The Park District shall be provided an opportunity to review and comment on the notice of amount due and/or the certificate of completion and the Park District will make payment to the School District within 30 days after receipt of the written notice.

C. Review of Plans. Upon receipt of the initial plans and specifications for the Project, the School District shall deliver such documents to the Park District for its review. If the Park District believes that the plans and specifications are not consistent with the scope of the Project and/or this Agreement, the Park District shall provide written notice to the School District of that concern within seven days after the Park District's receipt of the plans and specifications. The School District shall consider the Park District's comments and make any changes the School District, in its sole discretion, deems appropriate. The School District shall notify in writing the Park District of its decision within seven days after receipt of the Park District's written notice. Thereafter, the Park District may terminate this Agreement within five days after receipt of the School District's written decision, provided that the Park District shall pay, within 14 days after receiving a written invoice from the School District, 50% of the costs (capped at the \$20,000 sum for 'soft costs' referenced in Section III(B)(a) above) the School District incurred for the completion of the plans and specifications for the Turf Project.

- D. <u>Contract Administration</u>. The School District shall administer the contracts in good faith and, unless the School District fails to exercise good faith, the Park District shall not make any claims against the School District for such administration.
- E. Change Orders. During the course of construction of the Project, certain alterations, modifications and resulting change orders from the final plans and specifications may be required. The School District shall have sole discretion related to the approval or denial of change orders, but shall provide the Park District with written notice of a proposed change order and the date that the School District will take action to approve the change order and the method by which the change order will be approved. If the Park District believes that the proposed change order is not consistent with the scope of the Project, the Park District shall provide written notice to the School District of that concern within seven days after the Park District's receipt of the proposed change order. The School District shall consider the Park District's comments and make any changes the School District, in its sole discretion, deems appropriate. The School District shall notify in writing the Park District of its decision within seven days after receipt of the Park District's written notice. No change order shall cause the Park District's Turf Contribution, including the costs attributable to the storm water management and remediation improvements, to exceed \$600,000 [inclusive of the 'soft costs' limited to the \$20,000 pursuant to Section III(B)(1)] or the Park District's Light Contribution to exceed \$75,000; provided, however, that if lowest responsible bid amount approved by the parties resulted in the Park District's Turf Contribution, including the costs attributable to the storm water management and remediation improvements, and subject to the limitation of 'soft costs' at

the additional sum of \$20,000 pursuant to Section III(B)(1) to exceed \$600,000 and the Park District did not terminate the Agreement in accordance with Section III.B.1, then no change order shall cause the Park District's Turf Contribution, including the costs attributable to the storm water management and remediation improvements, to exceed the amount that the Park District would have paid pursuant to the lowest responsible bid.

F. <u>Construction of Track</u>. The Park District acknowledges that the School District intends on refurbishing and resurfacing the track around the Stadium, which construction will occur at the same time as the construction of the Project. The costs of the track improvements shall not be included in the costs of the Project. Any additional costs, or damages, to the Turf Project due to the construction of the track improvements shall be paid by the School District.

IV. Additional Costs.

A. Operational Costs. The School District and the Park District shall proportionately (based upon actual usage) share in the operational costs of the Stadium, which include costs for turf and light repair and maintenance, and custodial maintenance of the Stadium. In addition, the Park District shall pay for its actual metered utility use when using the Stadium. The Park District's portion of the operational costs and utility use shall be paid twice per year to the School District within 45 days after receiving an itemized invoice from the School District. The School District shall notify the Park District of the amounts due by January 1 and July 1 of each year.

B. Turf Replacement Costs.

- 1. Determination of Need to Replace Turf. The parties acknowledge that the turf may need to be replaced within eight to 15 years after the Effective Date of this Agreement. If, during the term of this Agreement, one party is of the opinion that the turf requires replacement, it shall notify the other party in writing. Within 30 days after receipt of the written notice, the non-initiating party shall notify the initiating party if it agrees or disagrees. If the parties agree that the turf needs replacement, the parties may mutually agree to terminate this Agreement or the parties shall replace the turf in accordance with Section IV.B.2. If the non-initiating party does not agree that the turf needs replacement, the parties shall hire a recognized turf expert to examine the field and provide an opinion as to the need to replace the turf. The parties shall share the costs of the turf expert equally. If the turf expert opines that the turf will not need replacement within the 24 months after the date of the expert's report, this Agreement shall continue without replacement of the turf. If the turf expert opines that the turf will need replacement within the 24 months after the date of the expert's report, the parties may mutually agree to terminate this Agreement or the parties shall replace the turf in accordance with Section IV.B.2 below.
- 2. Payment of Turf Replacement Costs. If the parties replace the turf during the term of this Agreement, the Park District shall pay 50% of the costs for the turf replacement (the "Park District's Turf Replacement Payment") to the School District to help defray the costs of the turf replacement, up to an agreed upon maximum cost. If the

parties undertake the replacement of the turf, the provisions of Sections III.B.3 and III.C-E shall control.

V. <u>Use of Stadium.</u>

A. <u>School District Use</u>. The School District shall at all times be the sole owner of the Stadium and the Park District shall have no right or interest therein, except for the right to use the Stadium, as provided in this Agreement. The School District shall have the right to use the Stadium at any time that it is not in use by the Park District, as set forth in the Master Use Schedule, attached as Exhibit B.

B. Park District Use.

1. Facility Use. In consideration of the Park District Contribution, the School District shall allow the Park District to use the Stadium and the Stadium's ancillary facilities (including but not limited to restrooms, storage areas, lighting panels, the sound system, the concession facilities the press box and the west parking lot, hereinafter the term "Stadium" shall include the ancillary facilities) during the times set forth in the "Master Use Schedule" attached to this Agreement as Exhibit B, subject to the limitations provided in Section V.B.3. The Park District shall also be entitled to reasonable modes of ingress and egress to and from the Stadium during those times for the limited purpose of gaining access to the Stadium. The Park District and other organizations not affiliated with the School District shall only be allowed to use the Stadium for programs and activities authorized by the Illinois Park District Code (70 ILCS 1205, et seq.). In addition, the Park District shall have no right to use any other

portion of the School District's property except as specified herein, as permitted by the School District in writing, or as set forth in a separate agreement between the parties.

2. Scheduling Park District's Use. Prior to January 1 of each year of this Agreement, designated representatives of each party shall meet to complete the Master Use Schedule, which shall be subsequently approved by the Superintendent of the School District and the Executive Director of the Park District, or their designees, and shall not require further approval by the Boards of either party. Each party's use of the Stadium during a given year shall be substantially the same as the amount of time the party used the Stadium in the prior year. If the parties cannot reach agreement regarding the Master Use Schedule for a given year by January 1 of that year a party may terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to the non-terminating party by January 15 of that year and the Agreement shall terminate effective June 1 of that year, unless an earlier termination date is agreed to by the parties in writing. In the event the parties do not reach agreement on the Master Use Schedule due to the School District's breach of its obligation under this Section V.B.2 to allow the Park District to use the Stadium for substantially the same amount of time as the prior year, the Park District shall be entitled to a pro rata refund of its Turf Contribution, including the costs attributable to the storm water management and remediation improvements ("Total Park District Payments"). The pro rata reimbursement shall be determined by dividing the Total Park District Payments by 120 and multiplying that amount by the number of months remaining from the date of termination until the 10 year anniversary of this Agreement.

- 3. <u>Limitation on Park District's Use of Certain Facilities</u>. The Park District's use of the facilities listed in this Section shall be limited as provided below and in the Master Use Schedule, attached as Exhibit B, unless an alternative use by the Park District is approved by the Superintendent of the School District, or the Superintendent's designee, in writing:
 - a. <u>Concession Facilities</u>. The School District may make concession facilities available to the Park District for specific defined events, as specifically identified in the Master Use Schedule. The Park District shall ensure that users of the concession facilities are trained in the use of the concession facilities and the concession facilities are properly cleaned and secured after use.
 - b. <u>Sound System</u>. The Park District may use the sound system. Only game announcements or program related announcements or recordings shall be broadcast over the sound system. The Park District shall ensure that users of the sound system are trained in the use of the sound system.
 - c. <u>Press Box</u>. The Park District shall use the press box only for youth football. Only appropriate users shall be allowed in the press box during Park District use. The Park District shall ensure that the press box is properly cleaned and secured after use.
- 4. <u>Compliance with Law and School District Policies</u>. The Park District agrees that it shall conduct its activities in accordance with the Illinois Park District Code. The Park District will abide by and enforce the School District's regulations as

contained in Board Policy 3.20 and other reasonable and applicable regulations and policies as approved from time to time by the School District's Board, so long as such School District policies and regulations are consistent with this Agreement. In addition, Park District users shall not wear steel cleats and will not utilize any sharp objects at the Stadium that adversely affect the turf or the track at the Stadium.

- 5. <u>Treatment of School District Residents</u>. The Park District agrees that all residents of the School District shall be considered residents of the Park District when registering for Park District programs conducted solely or primarily at the Stadium.
- 6. School District Use of Park District Equipment. It is understood by and between the parties that certain items of equipment provided by the Park District for its programs, may, upon request of the School District, be utilized jointly for School District and Park District activities. The School District agrees to reimburse the Park District for direct cost of repair or replacement of said equipment, except for reasonable wear and tear, if such equipment is damaged as a sole and direct result of the School District's usage of the equipment. Any request for reimbursement by the Park District in this regard shall include a written detail of all damages sustained and cost incurred, including statements and/or bills for materials and services necessary to correct the damage.
- C. <u>Non-Scheduled Use: Changes to Master Use Schedule</u>. In the event that special needs to utilize the Stadium arise for either the School District or the Park District, either party may request a modification of the Master Use Schedule by written notice of at least thirty days or such lesser time as shall be agreed to by the Superintendent of the School District and the

Executive Director of the Park District, or their designees, and the other party shall make its best effort to accommodate the other's special needs. Absent a written approval by the Superintendent of the School District and the Executive Director of the Park District, or their designees, no temporary change shall be considered approved. To avoid confusion, both the School District and the Park District agree to maintain the Master Use Schedule, which shall include all temporary changes in a convenient place easily accessible to the public. In addition, the following additional groups may use the Stadium in accordance with this Agreement and subject to the Master Use Schedule: (1) with the School District's written consent, other organizations when neither the School District nor the Park District desire to use the Stadium Facilities; or (2) approved Park District affiliates, listed on Exhibit C to this Agreement. The Superintendent of the School District and the Executive Director of the Park District, or their designees, may agree to the inclusion of additional Park District affiliates, who shall be added to Exhibit C. Notwithstanding the provisions in this Section V, if an Illinois High School Association ("IHSA") event is subsequently scheduled at the Stadium for a time when the Park District has a scheduled event under the Master Use Schedule, the IHSA event shall take precedence.

VI. General Use Provisions.

A. Maintenance of Stadium.

1. <u>School District Responsibilities</u>. The School District shall provide its usual and customary custodial services to the Stadium in accordance with the School District's regularly scheduled working hours or at the discretion of the School District.

Fees for overtime custodial services may be assessed to the Park District in accordance with School District policies and procedures. The School District agrees to cooperate with the Park District to minimize custodial services.

2. Mutual Responsibilities. The parties shall keep clean and in good order, condition and repair the Stadium during their period of use. At the close of each instance of use, each party shall leave the Stadium in substantially the same condition as at the outset of each instance of use, ordinary wear and tear excepted. It will be the responsibility of each party to leave the Stadium in the same condition as it received it and to place all refuse in the refuse receptacles at the Stadium. Should the Park District fail to meet this standard and as a result the School District incurs additional custodial or other costs, the Park District agrees to promptly reimburse the School District for these added expenses. The Park District, within 30 days after receiving an invoice from the School District, shall reimburse the School District for the costs the School District incurs for repairs and/or replacements of any damage to the Stadium, the track at the Stadium, or any other School District property, including without limitation fixtures and furnishings, which occurs as a result of or in connection with the Park District's use of the Stadium or by the Park District's employees, volunteers, participants or agents. For purposes of this Section, direct costs of custodial services shall include: (i) the hourly salary, wages, benefits and applicable employer contributions and Workers' Compensation premiums as required by applicable federal and state laws; and (ii) costs of supplies and equipment used to perform the custodial services.

- B. <u>Keys and Alarm Codes</u>. The School District shall provide the Park District with necessary keys and alarm codes to allow the Park District access to the Stadium without the need of having a custodian or other school personnel present. The Park District shall be responsible for securing the Stadium properly upon leaving.
- C. <u>No Improvements</u>. The Park District shall not modify, alter, or place permanent fixtures or improvements in the Stadium in any way without the prior express written approval of the School District.
- D. <u>Supervision</u>. Neither party shall have any responsibility whatsoever for supervising the other's programs, use of the Stadium, or supervising the other party's employees, volunteers, participants and/or agents. Each party shall be solely responsible, at its own expense, for providing adequate adult supervision at all times in connection with its use of the Stadium. Neither party shall be responsible in any way for employment of personnel to implement or supervise the other party's programs at the Stadium. Each party acknowledges and assumes complete responsibility for its staff or volunteers used to supervise its activities hereunder.
- E. <u>Representation of Programs</u>. Each party shall represent its programs as its own programs and at no time shall represent any sponsorship or other involvement by the other party.
- F. <u>Required Waiver</u>. For programs where either party requires participants to sign a waiver, release, indemnity or hold harmless form, the party requiring the waiver, release, indemnity or hold harmless shall add the other party, its Board members and employees as additional beneficiaries under such form.

- G. <u>Untenantability</u>. In the event the Stadium or the School is damaged and rendered untenantable by fire or other casualty during the term of this Agreement, the parties agree to work in good faith to restore the Stadium to public use making use of insurance proceeds available. If insurance proceeds are not available, the School District and the Park District agree to meet and negotiate in good faith to contribute 50%, each, to the restoration of the Stadium to school and public use.
- H. <u>Suspension of Use</u>. In the event of an emergency, safety issue, or failure to maintain insurance, or any other condition that constitutes a substantial threat to the health or safety of the School District's students, employees or others, as determined by the School District in its sole reasonable discretion, the School District may immediately suspend the Park District's activities hereunder until such condition has been remedied to the School District's satisfaction in accordance with this Agreement.

VII. Insurance and Indemnification.

- A. <u>Insurance</u>. Each party, at its sole cost and expense, shall keep in full force and effect at all times during the term of this Agreement insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property, which may arise from or in connection with this Agreement. Each party shall provide coverage that is at least as broad as:
 - 1. Comprehensive general public liability insurance, including contractual liability coverages, and such other types of insurance in such amounts and with such A-rated companies as are reasonably acceptable to the School District and the Park District, but, in any event, no less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$10,000,000.00

aggregate and an umbrella policy no less than \$1,000,000.00. Such insurance shall be evidenced by annually providing to the other party copies of the policies and/or certificates of insurance, naming the other party, its board, board members, employees and agents as an additional insured and providing that the insurance may not be modified, terminated, cancelled or non-renewed without at least 30 days advanced written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the other party.

- 2. Casualty insurance in the amount of the full replacement cost of the party's property and betterments (including alterations or additions performed by a party to its property), which insurance shall include an agreed amount endorsement waiving coinsurance limitations.
- 3. Each party shall keep and maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance covering all costs, statutory benefits and liabilities under State Workers' Compensation and similar laws for their respective employees. Any employee claim related to this Agreement will be the responsibility of the party employer and the other party shall have no obligation whatsoever to provide workers' compensation for the other party's employees.
- B. <u>Indemnification</u>. The School District and the Park District each agree to mutually indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other party and their respective board members, officers, employees and agents from all claims, causes of action, liability, damages, whether to person (including death) or property, costs (including reasonable attorneys' fees) and losses (collectively "Loss") where and to the extent the Loss arises out of the acts or omissions of the

indemnifying party.

C. No Waiver of Tort Immunity Defenses. Nothing contained in this Section VII or in any other provision of this Agreement, is intended to constitute nor shall constitute a waiver of the defenses available to the parties under the Illinois Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act, with respect to claims by third parties.

VIII. Miscellaneous Provisions.

- A. <u>No Assignment</u>. No party may assign any rights or duties under this Agreement without the prior express written consent of the other party.
- B. <u>Successors</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon the successors of the parties' respective governing boards.
- C. Relationship of the Parties; No Third Party Beneficiaries. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to consider any party or its respective employees, volunteers or agents as the agents or employees of any other party. Nothing contained in or done pursuant to this Agreement shall be construed as creating a partnership, agency, joint employer or joint venture relationship between the School District and the Park District. Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, this Agreement is entered into solely for the benefit of the contracting parties, and nothing in this Agreement is intended, either expressly or impliedly, to provide any right or benefit of any kind whatsoever to any person or entity who is not a party to this Agreement or to acknowledge, establish or impose any legal duty to any third party. No claim as a third party beneficiary under this Agreement by any person, firm, or corporation shall be made or be valid against the School District and/or Park District.

D. Entire Agreement. This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement of the

parties with respect to the matters contained in this Agreement and this Agreement supersedes

any and all prior agreements and understandings, whether written or oral, formal or informal,

Default and Termination. In the event that one party believes the other to be in E.

material default under this Agreement, the non-defaulting party, acting through its chief

administrator, shall notify the defaulting party in writing and allow the defaulting party 30 days

from the date of receipt of notice to cure the default. If the default is not then cured, the non-

defaulting party may terminate the Agreement by serving written notice on the defaulting party

and termination of the Agreement shall take effect 30 days after receipt of the notice by the party

in default.

F. Notices. Any notice or communication permitted or required under this

Agreement shall be in writing and shall become effective on the day of mailing thereof by first

class mail, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid or by a national overnight courier.
