



<u>Historical Recollection Series - The Early Development of Park Services</u>

Mrs. Barbara O'Rahilly, former Executive Director of the Carol Stream Park District will be attending the upcoming April 20th meeting to talk about the establishment of the Carol Stream Park District and the gradual development of recreational services in the Carol Stream community. Attached is a page from 'Build Your Own Town' by Jean Moore that chronicles some of the early developments in the establishment of this district and its associated facilities.

The Community Improvement Committee held the third annual Citizen of the Year dinner honoring residents for their volunteer services to the community. The program had originally been initiated by the first Carol Stream Jaycee unit.

On February 18, the Carol Stream Park District filed formal condemnation proceedings against Durable Construction Company to acquire the 46-acre tract and private swim club on the property. A settlement was made before trial began with the land being acquired for \$125,000 and the pool for \$26,000.

Carol Stream had a new village administrator, Darrell Brewington and a new police chief, Vernon Krahn.

The Community Improvement Committee assumed parade duties for the second community celebration in as many years. A Decade of Progress was the theme for the village and park district. Teen Queen for the June 5-6 events was Joanne Jirsa and the Teen King was Tom Marmitt.

As the Carol Stream News began its third year of operation, the cost to residents was increased to \$2 annually.

On July 20, parishioners at St. Luke Catholic church bade farewell to their first full-time pastor, the Rev. John Sullivan who grew up in nearby Glen Ellyn. He was replaced by the Rev. John Kosmal.

On July 20 three American astronauts landed on the Moon. Taking the first steps was Neil Armstrong. On July 21 at its monthly meeting, the Carol Stream park board named its new facilities for the three men who took part in the mission. The park bears the name of Armstrong, the new community center then under construction was named for Edwin Aldrin and the swimming pool was named for Michael Collins. It is believed that this was one of the first incidents of naming facilities for the three astronauts.

As school bells rang in the fall of 1969, District 93 schools had 1,250 students registered. The park-school concept of sharing facilities and personnel advanced to a point where Charles J. Siegler, science teacher and coach at the Jay Stream Junior High School, also served as part-time administrator for the park district. He taught school in the mornings and worked at the park district matters in the afternoon. It was this concept of the two taxing bodies working together that enabled the park district to offer programs to residents although it had no facilities for several years after its formation.

At Christmas, the public library decorated its tree with some unusual homemade ornaments. Each one carried the name of someone who had donated to the library during the past year.

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In April, the village residents joined in the nationwide celebration of Earth Day. The event focused on the conditions of our environment and how to help our planet survive in the world of modern technology. Proving that not all programs had to be elaborate ones, the Carol Stream Cub Scouts Pack 193 helped clean up the local environment. They collected 25 bags of litter and branches and piles of wood from the stream which formed the back boundary line for homes on the east side of Silverleaf Boulevard.

One measure of community growth is the scope of the service and civic groups which are organized. A name added to the list in 1970 was that of the Carol Stream Lions club.

Fire service for the district was being delivered from the new fire station located at 3N020 Kuhn Road.

Aldrin Community Center was opened in the late summer. It housed the park district headquarters, activity rooms, a kitchen and a community room for large meetings.

The official census showed a population of 4,000 residents, an increase of 500 percent in just 10 years.

Members of St. Andrew United Methodist Church bade farewell to their first pastor, the Rev. Joseph Housh in October. Members welcomed the Rev. Rodney Dillinger and his family in November.

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In February, the village welcomed its third administrator, John Adamson, a veteran of Vietnam. The community honored him and his family with a reception in Aldrin Community Center.

Pastoral changes continued in the village as the Village Church welcomed a new pastor, the Rev. Stanley Baldwin. By summer, the Rev. Thomas White had been appointed by the Joliet Diocese to replace the Rev. John Kosmal at St. Luke's.

A new organization, the Fraternal Order of Police (F.O.P.) was formed by members of the Carol Stream Police Department. The organization was concerned with the welfare of policemen and the community with special emphasis on programs for youth.

Changes in the top administration at Glenbard District 87 sent a new principal to Glenbard North, Bert Weber. Ray Livingston had been named as an assistant superintendent to Dr. Dean Stoakes.

In December, the Community Improvement Committee asked persons who were interested in establishing a recycling center for paper, glass and aluminum to contact committee members.

County residents voted approval of a new vocational-technical high school, DuPage Area Vocational Education Association (DAVEA).

1972

In March, several groups met with the Wheaton Jarcees to plan local participation in the program Operation Red Ball. Designed originally by an Addision Jaycee, the program involved affixing an adhesive red ball sticker to the windows in rooms where children or handicapped people slept. In case of a fire or other emergency, the red balls would indicate areas for the firemen to look for people who might need special assistance.

Continued growth in Glenbard District 87 was noted as the district opened its fourth school, Glenbard South, at Park Boulevard and Butterfield Road.

In August, the Carol Stream Park District announced plans for its latest holiday celebration, "Labor Day In The Park". This was a community effort across the nation as groups tried to find alternatives to the high volume of traffic on the roads over this last long weekend of summer. Ball games, picnics, special events, band music and special rides for youngsters were featured.

Near the end of August, the village as well as the entire Chicago area was flooded by one of the worst floods of the past century. The natural waterway system through the village brought runoff from the east and the north turning ordinary streams into rivers. Village and park district officials learned where changes had to be made in their drainage systems. One result was more emphasis on water retention and detention ponds to control future flooding problems.

Hubert Watkins, an early Carol Stream resident and one of the original police volunteers, was named police chief.

The Carol Stream Public Library celebrated its 10th anniversary on September 30. The facility had become a vital part of community life furnishing residents with information, pleasant hours of reading, records and programs aimed at encouraging children to read more.

In November, the Carol Stream village government continued its never-ending quest for adequate space to house a wide range of municipal services. The new village hall was located on a long, narrow strip of land fronting on Village Court with an address on North Gary Avenue. The police department was located in the lower level.

Michael Tuman was the first paid fire chief at the Carol Stream Station. A referendum realigned the old boundaries of the Keeneyville Fire Protection District and the name was changed to Carol Stream Fire Protection District. Keeneyville Fire Company and fire station became a part of the Bloomingdale Fire Protection District in the rearranged districts.

DAVEA held classes in the vocational-technical department of College of DuPage as it worked on completion of its own facility.

1973

In April, the Community Improvement Committee donated a tree to help the village landscape its new village hall lawn.

In July, the Carol Stream Lions Club presented the village with a new bulletin board which stands today near the intersection of Gary Avenue and Village Court.

The village and the Illinois Arts Council encouraged another new event in the village, an Arts 'N' Fun Festival held along Gundersen Drive near the apartment complexes. It was an opportunity for local residents to display arts and crafts.

The year ended with officials of the Carol Stream Public Library complaining the facility was overcrowded.

On a tract of land which at one time had been proposed as the site of a major hospital, St. John of the Maltese Cross, the medical park of Mona Kea opened its first offices. Today, with the corner of the tract at Schmale and Thornhill occupied by Gary-Wheaton Bank, the medical complex has 80 professional occupants practising in all fields of medicine.

1974

This was another celebration year. The village was 15 years old and the park district was now 10 years old. The Art'N'Fun Festival was held in Armstrong Park, sponsored by the village and the park district. It has been held in this location since 1974.

In February, the Community Improvement Committee donated a weather station to the District 93 schools. It also offered scholarships for those teachers who wanted to study more about environmental education.

In May, the Carol Stream Public Works Department showed off its new garage at Randy Road and Bonnie Lane. One of the most popular items on display was the new \$23,000 street sweeper.

The Lutheran Church of the Master on Kuhn Road welcomed a new pastor, the Rev. Gregory Hoy.

Don Vilendrer was named chief of the Carol Stream Fire Protection District.

The Bicentennial Commission announced it was seeking old mementos, historical news clippings, pictures or letters dealing with the early years in the village.

At the same time, Wilbur Kent, an original member of the park board and now its new administrator, sought out residents who might be interested in establishing a local museum—a project under consideration by the Bicentennial Commission. By the time fall ar-

Sign Code Variations

Last fall, John Bucaro of Auto Showcase commenced operation of a Suzuki motorcycle, all terrain vehicle and scooter dealership within the building at 106 N. Schmale Road. Since 2006, this building has been used as the service facility for the adjacent Auto Showcase dealership at 545 E. North Avenue, and that use continues along with the Suzuki motor sports business. With the opening of the Suzuki business last fall, Mr. Bucaro wished to install a Suzuki sign on the south building façade, but staff could not approve the sign permit because the sign did not comply with the area allowance for wall signs in the business district. Mr. Bucaro was very concerned about the negative impact of not having Suzuki signage on the building when the new business opened, and so he submitted a request to the Village Board for temporary approval of the sign in accordance with \$1-1-17 of the Village Code. At their meeting on November 17, 2008, the Village Board granted temporary (120 day) approval to allow a Suzuki sign to be installed on the south building façade, subject to several conditions, the most notable of which were that Mr. Bucaro had to submit an application for a Sign Code variation for the sign, and that such request must include the construction of a parapet wall at the middle portion of the south building wall. The purpose of the parapet wall is to screen existing rooftop mechanical units, increase the area of the building façade, and raise the height at which the Suzuki sign could be installed.

Mr. Bucaro is requesting a variation from the Sign Code provision requiring that the blank wall area between multiple wall signs be included in the overall sign area calculation for the signage on the south building elevation. Mr. Bucaro is also requesting the same variation for a Suzuki motorcycle logo sign that was installed on the east building elevation without a permit, as well as a variation from the Sign Code requirement stipulating that in the event that there are multiple signs, the placement of all signs cannot extend above or below the largest sign.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PC/ZBA) packet on April 10, 2009. At their April 13, 2009, meeting, by a vote of 6-0, the PC/ZBA approved the Sign Code variations subject to the conditions noted in the staff report.

The Plan Commission has the authority to approve or deny Sign Code variation requests. However, the Sign Code grants the Village Board the opportunity to affirm or reverse the decision of the Plan Commission within 21 days of the date that the request first appears before the Village Board. If the Village Board chooses to take action on the Sign Code Variation request, their decision is final. If the Board chooses not to take action within the 21-day period set forth in the Sign Code, the decision of the Plan Commission is final.

Variations for Landbanked Parking

Banner Service Corporation has filed an application for variations to allow 22 parking spaces to be landbanked on the property at 494 E. Lies Road in association with a planned 15,000 square foot addition to the building. Banner Service Corporation, a precision metal bar processing business, presently has 68 employees, and employment is expected to increase to a maximum of 80 employees following the occupancy of the building addition. The site currently has 108 parking spaces, but after some minor alterations are made to the parking lot to accommodate the building addition, 100 parking spaces will remain. Based upon the proposed use of space in the building following the completion of the addition, the Zoning Code will require 122 parking spaces. Due to the relatively low employee count, the applicant is seeking a variation to landbank 22 spaces.

Of the 22 proposed landbanked spaces, seven spaces are proposed to be provided in a greenspace area near the northwest corner of the site, while the 15 remaining proposed spaces would be achieved through the reconfiguration of the existing southern parking lot from its current two-way, perpendicular parking layout to a one-way, diagonal parking layout. The reconfiguration would allow an additional row of spaces to be installed along the southern property line, thereby increasing the number of spaces in the southern parking lot from 58 spaces to 73 spaces. The applicant is also requesting a variation to allow these 15 spaces to be landbanked within the existing asphalt parking lot area, as opposed to as greenspace, as required by the Zoning Code.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PC/ZBA) packet on April 10, 2009. At their April 13, 2009, meeting, by a vote of 6-0, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the variations to allow landbanked parking, subject to the conditions noted in the staff report.

If the Village Board concurs with the PC/ZBA recommendation regarding the variations to allow landbanked parking, they should approve the variations, subject to the conditions contained in the Ordinance, and adopt the necessary Ordinance.

Plat of Consolidation, Plat of Easement Abrogation

Village Green Companies is requesting approval of a final plat of consolidation for the former French Quarter Apartments, now a part of the Parkway Commons apartment complex, at 545-595 Gundersen Drive. The Parkway Commons property consists of two parcels, and the north-south parcel line between the two parcels runs through the location of the new clubhouse being constructed by Village Green. On May 19, 2008, the Village Board approved Ordinance No. 2008-05-20 granting approval of an amendment to the Final PUD Plan for Parkway Commons. The conditions of approval of that ordinance include:

- 4. That a plat of consolidation must be approved by the Village Board prior to issuance of a building permit for the clubhouse
- 5. That a plat of utility easement or a plat of utility easement vacation must be approved by the Village Board prior to issuance of a building permit for the clubhouse

The Community Development and Engineering Services Departments have reviewed the plats and find them to be in conformance with the requirements of the R-4 General Residence District, which is the zoning classification for the lots.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PC/ZBA) packet on April 10, 2009. At their April 13, 2009, meeting, by a vote of 6-0, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Plat of Consolidation. No action was required of the Plan Commission for the Plat of Easement Abrogation.

If the Village Board concurs with the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals recommendation, they should approve the requested Plat of Consolidation and Plat of Easement Abrogation and adopt the necessary Resolution.

Consulting Engineering Services

This project has received American Recovery & Reinvestment Act funding approval through the DuPage Mayors & Managers Conference (DM&MC). The estimated construction cost of \$809,000 for this Local Area Pavement Preservation (LAPP) resurfacing project is being funded 100% by federal economic stimulus monies and has strict deadline dates.

Previously the design, plans and contract documents were prepared in house. With the elimination of the Civil Engineer position, Engineering can no longer perform these functions totally in house. Thus we requested and received a proposal from TranSystems Corporation to provide Phase I & II engineering design services for the referenced project. See attached. TranSystems Corporation has been involved with the project since its inception, by helping the Village obtain the funding. They also assisted the Village with the construction management services on two previous LAPP projects. They performed these services adequately and therefore no other proposals were sought.

The cost estimate for consultant engineering services is \$36,311.26, which is to prepare plans and contract documents in accordance with state and federal requirements. The cost estimate is within the typical range of 4% to 6% of the construction cost estimate. This project wasn't specifically identified in the Capital Improvement Program budget and therefore a budget amendment will be needed. However, due to the Village receiving federal funding for construction, Engineering Staff recommends that the Phase I & II Engineering consultant contract be awarded to TranSystems Corporation at a cost not to exceed \$36,311.26.

EXHIBIT A – SCOPE OF ENGINEERING SERVICES

Project Description

This project involves preparing construction plans and specifications for the Local Agency Pavement Preservation (LAPP) project along Lies Road from the east edge of Kuhn Road to the west edge of Gary Avenue in the Village of Carol Stream, a distance of approximately 5,280 feet.

Project Scope of Work:

The scope of work includes a 2.5" mill and overlay of this roadway section. It will also involve removing and replacing deteriorated portions of curb and gutter and sidewalks. Areas of extensive deteriorated pavement will be patched after the milling and before the overlay is constructed. Structure adjustments or reconstruction as well as parkway restoration will be performed.

TranSystems will prepare the contract plans, specifications, and cost estimates for a March 2010 contract letting through IDOT. The work shall be prepared in accordance with IDOT requirements for LAPP projects including obtaining Categorical Exclusion Group I approval. The plans and specifications will provide sufficient guidance to the contractor necessary to bid the project, provide the contractor with geometric layout requirements to allow the contractor to establish controls during construction, and include sufficient details for completing the street resurfacing. The Police Department requests approval to purchase a police traffic sports utility vehicle under state bid. We are also requesting permission to waive formal bidding procedure. This vehicle is E-85 compliant.

For the proposed 2009-2010 Fiscal Year budget, the department has identified a need to replace the police traffic SUV. The old traffic SUV will be integrated into the patrol division as a replacement for an outgoing patrol squad.

I recently received the State of Illinois bid for vehicles. The Chevrolet Tahoe PPV Police Interceptor is one of the state bids for the full-size police patrol vehicles. We have utilized this model of vehicle in traffic for over four years. It is dependable and large enough to accommodate the officers, electronic equipment and police equipment that the traffic squad must contain. This vehicle will use E-85 fuel. The state bid vendor is Miles Chevrolet, 150 W. Pershing Road, Decatur, Illinois.

I am requesting approval from the Village Board to order this traffic sports utility vehicle. I am also requesting that the Village Board waive the bidding process for this purchase because it will be made under the State bid price

The total cost for this Chevrolet Tahoe PPV Police Interceptor police patrol vehicle is \$26,399.66. This total does not exceed the proposed budgeted amount for the vehicle.

Beginning in 2004 the Village Board has authorized a contract with Northern Illinois University (NIU) to perform various tasks associated with implementation of GIS use in Village operations. This project was envisioned as a progressive ongoing program as the Village further integrated GIS capabilities into its functions. These GIS tools help Village staff in numerous ways from planning for the development of the North Avenue corridor to identifying locations of known sexual offenders and meeting federally unfunded mandates such as mapping storm sewer outfalls required by National Pollution Discharge Elimination Study Phase II. Included in the proposed 2009-10 Budget are funds for continued implementation and maintenance of the Village's GIS.

Staff has identified and prioritized tasks to be performed during the current fiscal year. These tasks are included in the attached contract from NIU. These tasks may change as priorities change within the Village. I have also attached an update on the status of projects undertaken in the current fiscal year.

NIU has provided the Village with a contract that amends their previous contract by extending it another year. This contract will allow the Village to meet its GIS objectives without hiring additional staff. The GIS contract will continue to focus primarily on maintenance of existing databases rather than new project development. This will allow us to reduce the number of GIS support hours included in the contract. The contract amount this year is \$19,863 which is a 6.6% reduction in cost from last year's contract. Staff has reviewed the contract and finds it acceptable and recommends that the GIS services contract be awarded to NIU in the amount of \$19,863. There are sufficient funds included in the proposed 2009-10 budget to pay for these services.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING VARIATIONS FROM SECTION 16-13-2(G) FOR PARKING SPACE LANDBANKING (494 E. LIES ROAD)

WHEREAS, Mark Redding, President of Banner Service Corporation, has requested variations in accordance with Section 16-13-2(G) of the Carol Stream Zoning Code to allow for the landbanking of required parking spaces, and to allow spaces to be landbanked on existing asphalt areas as opposed to on greenspace areas at 494 E. Lies Road in the I-Industrial District; and

WHEREAS, there is sufficient land on this property to provide the required parking spaces, but due to the employee counts of the businesses in the building, the owner feels that the installation of the number of parking spaces required by the Zoning Code is not necessary at this time; and

WHEREAS, the owner of the property has agreed to install the total number of required parking spaces required by the Zoning Code, if deemed necessary in the future, and will "land bank" an area of sufficient size to accommodate the required number of parking spaces; and

WHEREAS, the Combined Plan Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals, pursuant to proper legal notice, held a public hearing on April 13, 2009, concerning these requests; and

WHEREAS, the Combined Board has filed its minutes with the Corporate

Authorities regarding a motion to recommend approval of these variations subject to
conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that granting of these variations would not be inconsistent with surrounding uses, nor would it be contrary to the intent of the Zoning Code of the Village of Carol Stream.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS; as follows:

SECTION 1: That Banner Service Corporation, currently in operation on the property legally described below, commonly known as 494 E. Lies Road, be granted a variations from Section 16-13-2(G) of the Carol Stream Zoning Code in order to allow landbanking of 22 required parking spaces and for 15 of the landbanked spaces to be landbanked on existing asphalt as opposed to within greenspace area, in the I-Industrial District, provided the following conditions are met:

- 1. If deemed necessary by the Village, the landbanked parking stalls shall be installed by the property owner as shown on Exhibit C. The applicant shall obtain the required permits from the Village before commencing construction on the parking lot improvements.
- 2. The applicant shall be responsible for maintaining at least 100 actual parking spaces on the site at all times, unless and until the Village requires the installation of all or a portion of the landbanked stalls.
- 3. If installed, the parking spaces shown in the landbanked areas shall meet the greenspace and striping requirements at the time of installation, and shall also meet the other Village Code requirements, such as the maximum allowable slopes for parking lots.
- 4. At the same time that a new tenant enters the building, the property owner shall either apply for a reaffirmation of the landbank variation, which will require review by the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals and final approval by the Village Board, or they shall provide the number of parking spaces required by the Zoning Code based upon the use of space of the building tenant(s).
- 5. That the applicant shall obtain a building permit and install a proper trash enclosure for any outdoor trash dumpster by September 1, 2009.
- 6. The facility must comply with all state, county and Village codes and requirements.



SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law, provided, however, that this Ordinance is executed by the owners of the subject property or such other party in interest, consenting to and agreeing to be bound by the terms and conditions contained within this Ordinance. Such execution and delivery to the Village shall take place within sixty (60) days after the passage and approval of this Ordinance, or within such extension of time as may be granted by the corporate authorities by motion.

SECTION 3: That failure of the owner or other party in interest, or a subsequent owner or other party in interest, to comply with the terms of this Ordinance, after execution of said Ordinance, shall subject the owner or party in interest to the penalties set forth in Section 16-17-7, A and B of the Village of Carol Stream Zoning Code, and/or termination of the special use after notice and public hearing in accordance with the procedures required by statute and the Carol Stream Zoning Code.







On April 7, 2008 the Village board accepted the Fountains At Town Center subdivision improvements. The developer posted two maintenance securities at the time of acceptance. These securities ensure against defects in material or workmanship should they occur within the one year warranty period.

Engineering Staff performed a punch list inspection and transmitted a list of defects to the developer, Town & country Homes (T&C) on March 31, 2009 and April 2, 2009. See Attached. This was done in accordance with the provisions of the maintenance security.

The developer has not been able to complete the repairs due to inclement weather. They have communicated their intentions are to extend the existing securities for an additional six months and complete the repairs. However, the Village must promptly make a claim on the bond or risk losing our rights to make a claim.

In order to make a claim the Village Board must pass a resolution declaring subdivision improvements have not been adequately completed. Village Attorney Stewart Diamond, has provided Engineering with the appropriate resolution. See attached. Therefore, Staff recommends the Village Board approve this resolution. If the developer posts an extended bond or completes the repairs, the Village will promptly rescind our claim.



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

WHEREAS, passing a comprehensive Capital Infrastructure Program in the 2009 Legislative Session is critical to Illinois; and

WHEREAS, ten years have passed since the Illinois General Assembly and Governor last passed and signed into law a comprehensive Capital Infrastructure Program; and

WHEREAS, the Motor Fuel Tax has not been changed since it was raised to 19 cents a gallon in 1990; and after expenses are removed the balance of the 19 cent Motor Fuel Tax is distributed as follows: 45.6% to the state, 26.7 % to municipalities; 19.1% to counties; and 8.6% to townships; and

WHEREAS, it is extremely important that the dollars are divided by formula and that the current formula is kept intact; and that units of local government have the

opportunity to control what projects will be funded in their respective jurisdictions;




