Award of Bid for 2009 Streetlight Replacement Project – Gaffney's PMI:

Bids were received and publicly read on October 13, 2009 for the 2009 Streetlight Replacement Project. The low bidder for both base bid of the LED lights and for the alternate HPS light was Gaffney's Protective Maintenance, Inc. of Batavia, IL in the base bid amount of \$55,490,00.

Bond Reduction #1 – Lowes:

Lowes has submitted Reduction Request # 1 for a reduction of Bond # 104-286-630 for improvements at 400 Army Trail Road. All of the work as shown on the reduction request has been completed per the approved plans and Village specifications. The total reduction authorized is \$796,262.62 with the remaining security balance of \$55,264.08. The Board approved the reduction.

2009 Asphalt Patching Program:

REGULAR MEETING:

Local Amendment to the International Fire Code:

Trustee Manzzullo said that at the last meeting, the Board asked staff to develop this Ordinance for presentation at this meeting. He said that he has reviewed some of his old notes on this matter as he was on the Plan Commission at the time. Trustee Manzzullo said that there were examples of what other communities were doing as far as smoking shelters went and he believes that the Commissioners came up with the best solution as far as a fair solution for smoking shelters going forward. He said that he can see why the Village did not disallow the use of temporary structures in 2007 and 2008. Trustee Manzzullo said that the Board is facing the same decision again in 2009/10 and he is ok with allowing one more year of not disallowing the use of these structures providing they meet all the criteria that is spelled out in this amendment that is before us; that the fabric of the tent be flame retardant, that the tent contain at least one portable fire extinguisher, that the employees of the establishments or businesses, using these types of structures be trained on the use of the required fire extinguisher and that the tent do not contain any heating elements or lighting equipment of any kind. Trustee Manzzullo said that he would like to amend # 5 the effective time to be one year instead of two years, and on page 4, that it shall be effective through 10/31/2010 and not 2011.

He made a motion to make those amendments.

Trustee Weiss said that he stated at the last meeting, that the proposal was something that the Carol Stream Fire Protection District is not recommending. They do not recommend lowering the standards to allow this and they are the experts. This is an issue of public safety, not an issue of convenience for businesses or for consumers and it is the Fire Department's responsibility to give us recommendations and he will continue to object and vote no on the proposal.

Trustee Schwarze said he questions the time frame being recommended, and said that if it is approved, regardless of what business it is, that date of 10/31/10 could work against a business owner next fall. If the weather is too cool and a business owner wants to put up a smoking shelter, he would have to put it up October 1st and then take is down October 31st.

Trustee Gieser said that he agrees with Trustee Manzzullo in that there should be no heat inside the area, but there should also be no service, no drinks, no lighting, and no food, as per the State regulations.

Mr. Breinig said that the regulations regarding service in the smoking shelter is a State Statute and so it was not included in the Zoning Code. Mr. Breinig said that if a permanent structure could get a building permit, it could go up immediately with no amendment to the Fire Code and no Board approval. The issue with this relates to it being a tent or a membrane structure, it has nothing to do with the use of the tent, per se, it is the fact that a tent can't be used in this capacity.

Trustee Schwarze asked if the question of furniture inside the structure is addressed and if not, can it be added to this amendment. Attorney Diamond said that it could be added to item # 4, that it shall contain no heating or lighting equipment or any furniture. Trustee Schwarze then explained the testing for non-flammability of any item, but specifically for the tent fabric. Trustee commented that he has had residents comment on how safety has been the criteria for so many other matters, why not for smoking shelters and he said that not everything is black and white as some people make it out to be. He said the Board would not do anything to compromise safety to anyone in the Village and things have to be looked at on an individual basis.

Trustee Fenner said that she knows that a person cannot walk out in public with an alcoholic beverage, so is the tent at Flip Flops considered a part of the building and Mr. Breinig responded that it is on a fenced patio, so a person can move from inside to the outside patio and shelter. He added that the wait staff is not required to bring additional drinks or food out to the shelter.

Resident Suzanne Hlotke addressed the Board saying that she disagreed with Trustee Schwarze on the issue of safety. She noted the Red Light Cameras and seat belts initiatives are all being done for the safety of the municipality. Ms. Hlotke said that the Board should listen to the experts when they say it is not recommended that this Code be changed.

Trustee McCarthy said that he agrees with Trustee Schwarze in that there are times that are not black and white. This is something that we have asked to have moved farther away from the building than the State regulation. We have added a request for a Fire Extinguisher and training, and flame retardant material. The Board is trying to give businesses the opportunity to be able to grow their business to the point where they can put a permanent structure in. Trustee McCarthy noted the requirements for flame retardency and noted that this will be a three sided structure with no door or fourth wall. Trustee Schwarze said that this issue is important because of my profession, but not

everything is as black and white as what was stated.

Trustee Manzzullo commented that this is a temporary amendment, whether for one or

two years, and at the end of the time, the Code will revert back to its current status.

Trustee Manzzullo moved and Trustee McCarthy made the second to amend the proposed ordinance to a limit of one year, sunsets on October 21, 2010, and to prohibit the introduction of any furniture in the enclosed area. The results of the roll call vote were:

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

Trustee Manzzullo thanked Mr. Breinig for his recollections of the Village from the perspective of a person living through the changes as he grew up and said that it was very interesting. He ended asking everyone to pray for our troops and their families.

Trustee McCarthy said that the Youth Council has been working on 450 Christmas stockings to be given out with the Christmas Sharing Project. He noted that it is getting darker earlier and asked that parents be sure that their children have some kind of reflective elements on their clothing, shoes and bicycles so drivers can see them.

Trustee Fenner thank Mr. Breinig for his recollections. She said that she had a close call on her trip to the meeting tonight with several kids on bikes and echoed Trustee McCarthy on making sure there are reflectors on bikes and clothing as well. Trustee Fenner reminded all residents that leaf burning is not permitted.

Trustee Weiss announced that for those that are interested, the Pace Suburban Bus System will have a public hearing regarding the future of Route 711, as well as Route 657, in Bloomingdale and Glendale Heights tomorrow, Tuesday, October 20 from 4:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the College of DuPage Open Campus Center Building, west side of the campus in Glen Ellyn. The public is encouraged to attend to give testimony, especially users of the route. People rely on the bus service particularly for getting to school, employment and getting around their communities. Trustee Weiss said that the Village has gone on record stating that they encourage continued funding of those services and it is important, that if you believe public transportation is important to the community that you attend this hearing. Users can also submit testimony and feed back comments on line through the Pace Bus Website. Trustee Weiss said that there is a service that is available in DuPage County called the Early School Leaver Program. It is a County program for residents between the ages of 17 and 21 who did not complete High School but want to back to take a GED test or other career and workplace skill training. There will be free informational meetings on these programs on October 21st, November 18th and December 9th. For more information the number to call is 630-691-7577.

Trustee Schwarze reported that there is information in the Fall Newsletter and the web site regarding the 2010 Census. There was also outreach done at the Open House at the Fire District, Water Reclamation Center and the District 25 Fun Fair at Evergreen School. There will also be a meeting for the Apartment Managers in regard to getting the census done in their complexes. Trustee Schwarze congratulated Deputy Chief O'Brien for the Departments' 2nd place at the National Law Enforcement Challenge, he thanked Mr. Breinig for his recollections of the Village. He thanked everyone that attended the Fire District Open House and Mike Scaramella and Public Works for their assistance.

Trustee Gieser thanked Mr. Breinig for his recollections and noted that he grew up on Thunderbird Creek saying he didn't agree with Joe's assessment. He said that the Fall Festival at Evergreen School was well attended. Halloween is coming up and Trick or Treating hours will be from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Trustee Gieser said that there will be

another Historic Round Table with Village Managers with John Adamson, Greg Bielawski and Joe Breinig discussing their terms.

Mr. Diamond thanked Mr. Breinig for his remarks, they brought back wonderful memories.

Mr. Breinig said that Item G-1 on the agenda, in regard to the street light replacement contract, imbedded in that is the Energy Efficiency Block Grant that is from the stimulus funding to upgrade the lighting to LED on Spring Valley Road. The WRC open house was very successful and staff would like to thank the Park District for the shuttle bus service they provided. It has not been done before and it really made things go a lot more smoothly during the peak hours. Mr. Breinig said that residents can sign up for enewsletter now and there is a video for Halloween safety that is being distributed to all of the schools. This is a cost savings project that not only save personnel going from school to school, but also allows teachers to use it at a time it will fit into the school day. It was stated that this will also be on the website.

Mayor Saverino thanked Luanne Triolo for her efforts on the Food Drive that was done by the Rotary Club and said that it was unbelievable the amount of food that was donated for the Food Pantries in the area. Mayor Saverino commented that the residents of the Village are the most generous and giving he has ever seen. Mayor Saverino commented that bus service in Newport Village has ended, and there will be 50 students walking down Munson to Kuhn Road and the on to the High School and at night they will walk the reverse route. He asked residents to be careful morning and evening with these students walking or riding bikes. In June of 2008, the Village entered into a design contract with Baxter & Woodman Consulting Engineers for the replacement of the Evergreen Drive Sanitary Lift Station and the Tubeway Drive Storm Water Lift Station. The intent was to get both of the replacement stations designed and then construct the Evergreen station during 2009 and the Tubeway Drive station during 2010. The reconstruction of the Evergreen Drive station is nearly complete, having been put into operation on October 21st of 2009.

The Tubeway Storm Water Lift Station was constructed in 1974, making it now 35 years old. Last year one of the two pumps failed and had an estimated replacement cost of \$12,379. Inasmuch as the station was scheduled for replacement in 2010, we decided to forego the repairs at that time and to closely monitor its operation. As a stormwater station, this facility sees its least use during the winter season. In order to begin construction on the Tubeway Drive station as early as possible in 2010, so as to have it in operation as soon as possible during its season of heaviest use, I am recommending that we go out for construction bids as soon as possible this fall.

To accomplish the bidding phase and to be prepared for construction engineering services during construction, it will be necessary to amend our current engineering services agreement to include additional engineering services.

Attached is Amendment #2 to our existing Baxter & Woodman Engineering Service Agreement to provide these additional consulting engineering services. The amendment provides \$3,000 for the bidding phase and provides a not-to-exceed amount of \$37,000 for part-time engineering construction services. This is the same amount that was in the original agreement for the Evergreen Station. This project is budgeted in the Village's capital improvement plan at a construction cost of \$350,000. Its funding will come from the General Corporate Fund reserves.

It is, therefore, my recommendation that Amendment #2 to the Engineering Service Agreement with Baxter & Woodman Consulting Engineers of Crystal Lake, Illinois, be amended as proposed in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.

A public hearing, consistent with state law, has been scheduled for Monday, November 2nd, to receive comment on the proposed property tax levy of the Carol Stream Public Library. Periodically questions are raised about the need for the Village to approve the Library's tax levy. The accompanying legal opinion prepared by the Village Attorney in 2007 outlines the Village's responsibilities and obligations. The Village Attorney has confirmed that the law on this matter is unchanged from 2007.

The Village is obligated to approve a Library levy that is no greater than what would be permitted if the Village were a non-home rule municipality. Minimally the Library is entitled to, and the Village is obligated to approve, the levy allowed under the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law otherwise known as the "property tax cap". As the Village Attorney advised in 2007 the law is quite clear on this obligation.

The Village as a home rule unit of local government has the ability to approve a property tax levy in excess of the limits of the property tax cap. If the village does not wish to approve a property tax levy in excess of the property tax cap, it can either request the Library to reduce the levy to the amount permitted under the property tax cap or make the reduction itself.

At this time it is unclear if the proposed Library levy exceeds the property tax cap. One element of the calculation of property tax rates under the tax cap is "new property". New property includes new improvements or additions to existing and property that was exempt the prior year but is now non-exempt. This amount is not typically available when the levy is prepared and is not known until the levy is finalized in the spring.

A preliminary evaluation of the proposed 2009 Library levy reveals an increase of \$51,736.70 from the 2008 actual levy. The CPI used to compute the tax cap for the 2009 levy year is .1%. Applying .1% to the 2008 levy results in \$3,404.82. The difference is \$48,331.88. The amount of new growth is unknown and it is unclear if \$48,331.88 exceeds the amount generated by new growth.

Not levying a property tax significantly limits the Village's ability to assess the Library's proposed levy for conformity with the property tax cap. The Village has no reason to track or project new property subject to property taxation.

If the Village Board would like additional information, staff recommends tabling action on the 2009 property tax levy until the November 16, 2009 meeting. This will allow additional time to discuss the request with the Library and others. Deferring action until November 16th will not jeopardize the Library or its levy.

At its meeting on Monday, November 5, 2007, the Village of Carol Stream will consider the annual tax levy for the municipality. The Village of Carol Stream itself does not currently levy a real estate tax for corporate or other Village-directed services. The Village, however, is obligated by law to levy on behalf of the Carol Stream Library Board. In Illinois, library services are generally provided in two ways. The citizens of many municipalities in unincorporated areas receive library services from library districts. These are separate governmental bodies, which are entirely independent from the municipal government. In the Village of Carol Stream, and in several other nearby communities, like the nearby Village of Glen Ellyn, library services are provided through a library board. Although that governmental body has some associations with the village, its officials are independently elected and, in almost every instance, possess independent authority from the Village government.

If a library board wishes to request the issuance of bonds, it must seek the approval of the village board. If a village board consents, the question of the issuance of bonds then goes before the voters of the community. The Village of Carol Stream also must adopt the real estate tax levy applicable to the Library Board. So long as the Library Board stays within the provisions of the so-called "tax cap," the Village Board has no discretion whatever to deny the request by the Library Board for a specific levy or to make changes in the levy itself. The statutes of the State are entirely clear on this issue. The Carol Stream Village Board also has the ability, as a home rule unit, should it wish to do so, to approve a levy for the Library Board, which would be in excess of the limitations in the tax cap. The Library Board acquires no independent home rule powers itself. This year, the Library Board has made a request, which is within its powers even if the Village of Carol Stream was a non-home rule community. In addition, the public hearing, which the Village will conduct on Monday evening, is done on a voluntary basis, and is not required by law because of the limited nature of the levy requested by the Library Board.

In conclusion, although the Village of Carol Stream will voluntarily hold a public hearing regarding the levy of the Library, it is required by law to approve the levy sought by the Library Board for this fiscal year. Even as a home rule unit, the Village has no ability to reduce or modify the library levy. The Village Board, as it conducts the public hearing, is certainly free to allow representatives of Library Board to further explain the levy and it is required by law to allow citizens who favor or object to the levy to ask questions and to publicly state their views.


