The following is a brief description of those items placed on the Consent Agenda for this meeting.

Request for purchase of Emergency Advisory Radio System:

The Board waived the bidding process and approved a request for purchase of an AM Emergency Advisory Radio System from Information Station Specialists, as a sole source provider, in the amount of \$30,575.00.

Trustee Gieser said that he loves the idea of using a low power radio station to alert residents to emergency situations. He noted that the station can also be used to advise residents of other local events and opportunities.

Acceptance and final payment- Tubeway Drive Sanitary Lift Station:

The Board accepted as designed and completed, the Tubeway Drive Sanitary Lift Station and approved a change order reducing the project cost by \$3,500 and approved the final pay out to Glenbrook Excavating & Concrete, Inc. in the amount of \$47,250.00.

Purchase of new Radar Units:

The Board declared surplus five radar units that will be used as a trade-in on the purchase of five new units from Decatur Electronics in the amount of \$7145.00 less the trade-in amount of \$1200.00 for a total cost of \$6225.00.

Award of Bid: Video Security Monitoring System:

Sealed bids for the system were opened on February 29, 2208 and the Board awarded the bid to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder, Video and Sound Service, Inc. at a cost of \$68,976.00, and that the additional hard drive chassis be included for an additional \$1211.95.

The Board approved the request for a sound amplification permit and a waiver of fee for the Carol Stream Park District for their 10 year reunion of the Kids World Playground at Armstrong Park, May 10, 2008.

Regular Bills, Addendum Warrant of Bills, Treasurer's Report 2/08:

The Board approved the payment of the Regular Bills in the amount of \$466,433.97. The Board approved the payment of the Addendum Warrant of Bills in the amount of \$733.729.76.

The Board accepted the Treasurer's Report for the month ending 02/29/2008.

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

Trustee Drager thanked Al Turner and his Public Works Department for their handling of the snow event. He noted that Spring is around the corner and he suggested that residents take some action to clean up everything that was buried under the snow, repair fences and take care of any winter damage on their property. Pray for our troops. Trustee Drager asked about several young people sitting in on the meeting and Mayor Saverino asked them to identify themselves. They said they were students from Wheaton North High School and they were working on an assignment on Government in Action. Mayor Saverino invited the students to ask any questions they might have, and noted since all of the items on the agenda were passed on the Consent Agenda it looks like the Trustees dashed through the meeting. He said that while it might look like that, it is not true. Everyone on the Board receives a packet every Friday evening that contains all of the back-up materials for every item on the agenda. This gives the Trustees time to read through the material and get in touch with the Staff on Monday if they have any questions. Mayor Saverino also noted that the same information can be read on the Village' web site. One of the students asked if most Board Meeting Agendas were approved by consent. Attorney Diamond said that the whole idea of the Consent Agenda is to take matters on which everybody agrees and get them taken care of so that the other matters can be discussed in more detail. This was an unusual agenda where none of the items had to do with Zoning or Planning, which are items that can produce questions and discussions on whether a proposal fits in with the overall plan for the Village. Mr. Diamond explained that the manner of the handling of items on the agenda has been set out in the State Statutes and it works mainly to keep meetings on track to allow the business of the Board to be concluded. He continued to explain the rules for Executive Session and it was noted that even though the subject for these sessions are limited, they must also be tape recorded so that there is a record of the discussions

should further information be required. In response to the question as to whether the Trustees get together to discuss the agenda items, Mayor Saverino stated that the Open Meetings Act requires that if three or more Trustees meet, they must notify the pubic through the news media that there will be a special meeting. Mr. Breinig added that if someone watches C-Span and sees the debating and positioning going on, this is partisan wrangling. The Carol Stream Village Board is elected on a non-partisan basis, not as a Republican or a Democrat, so this is a much more cohesive environment. While there may be a difference of opinion, but that is more from an understanding of the situation, or in how something may affect the community. Mr. Diamond said that this Village Board only deals with Village issues because there are other bodies that deal with schools, parks, libraries and the Fire Protection District issues. Mr. Breinig said that both Staff and the Board would welcome any feed-back the students may wish to share. He noted that anyone can go to the website and find everything that is on the agenda as well as the back-up material for each issue.

Trustee McCarthy thanked the students for their interest in local government and noted that his pet project is the Youth Council, which gives the youth of the community a voice in the future direction of the Village. Trustee McCarthy issued and invitation to any high school youth to come to the Youth Council meetings and see what the group is all about. He reminded everyone that spring is coming and kids will be out playing ball and riding bikes, so pay attention for them when you are driving. He reminded everyone again to change the batteries in smoke detectors, as Trustee Schwarze said two weeks ago.

Trustee Schwarze said that a very positive discussion was done during the Listening Post about the environment and how to get people "urgently motivated" to take action to make our community more aware of environmental issues. He noted that Lights Out America will be on March 29 from 8 to 9 pm and residents are asked to turn out non-essential lights to save energy and money. He stated that there was good Police work in regard to the tragic incident that happened. Lastly Trustee Schwarze urged everyone to Shop Carol Stream.

Trustee Gieser said that he and the Mayor had a very positive experience visiting the 2nd grade students at Evergreen Elementary School and the Fun Fair on Saturday. He said that he attended the Chamber of Commerce fund raiser raffle and that he and Trustee McCarthy were in Washington DC for the National League of Cities Conference and they had positive meetings with Senator Durbin and Congressman Roskam's Staff.

Village Manager Breinig stated that the Executive Session that was scheduled will not be necessary.

Mayor Saverino thanked the Staff and the Board for taking care of business while he was out of town. He said that he was amazed at the political questions that 2nd graders are interested in. He commended the Police Chief and his officers for the good handling of a bad situation. Mayor Saverino also asked drivers in the Village to look out for kids at play as the weather gets nicer.

NEW BUSINESS:

#08011: ALTER GROUP – 680-690 E. NORTH AVENUE

Final Plat of Resubdivision

John Coleman, Vice President of the Alter Group appeared before the Commission. He explained that the request for a resubdivision in order to create two commercially viable lots. This resubdivision will also eliminate the non-conformity that the southern lot does not abut a street. The resubdivision would include the creation of a flag lot that would allow monument signs for the existing building and a proposed building for the second lot.

Mr. Svalenka gave an abbreviated staff report, saying that Joseph Ash of the law offices of Ash, Anos, Freedman & Logan, LLC, representing the Alter Group, Ltd, is requesting approval of a Final Plat of Resubdivision for the 6.366-acre property at 680-690 E North Avenue, on the south side of North Avenue approximately 800 feet west of President Street. The subject property includes two subdivided lots that are both owned by the Alter Group. The southern 3.005-acre lot is improved with a 23,966 square foot office

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building and associated parking. The northern 3.361-acre lot is vacant. Vehicular access to the office building is from North Avenue via a driveway across the northern lot within an ingress-egress easement. The Alter Group intends to construct a new office building on the northern lot. A building could be constructed on the northern lot without any resubdivision. However, the permanent ground sign for the southern lot is located along North Avenue on the northern lot in an easement, and the sign code allows only one ground sign per street frontage on each lot. Therefore, in order to allow both buildings to have ground signs along North Avenue, the petitioner has proposed a resubdivision of the two lots so that they both have frontage on North Avenue.

Staff has reviewed the plat for conformance with the Subdivision Code and with the requirements of the B-2 General Retail District, which is the zoning classification for the property. The plat designates the new northern lot as Lot 1A and the new southern lot as Lot 1B. We note that the proposed Lot 1A would conform to the Subdivision Code and the requirements of the B-2 General Retail District, and would have access to North Avenue via the existing ingress-egress easement. We note that the proposed Lot 1B would be a flag lot

Staff finds the proposed resubdivision to be in conformance with the Subdivision Code and with the requirements of the B-2 General Retail District, with the exception of a few minor details. The plat includes signature blocks, which indicates that this is a Final Plat of Resubdivision. However, the drawing is titled as a Preliminary Plat. Therefore, if the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals were to recommend approval of the Final Plat of Resubdivision, staff would advise that the recommendation include the condition that the title be corrected to indicate that this is a Final Plat before the plat is brought to the Village Board for final approval. The Engineering Services Department has reviewed the plat and recommends approval contingent upon minor corrections to the signature blocks, including minor language corrections, adding a School District Boundary Statement, and replacing the County Engineer Certificate with an IDOT approved certificate. Therefore, if the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals were to recommend approval of the Final Plat of Resubdivision, staff would advise that the recommendation include the condition that the signature blocks and certificates be revised to the satisfaction of the Engineering Services Department before the plat is brought to the Village Board for final approval.

Staff recommends approval of the Final Plat of Resubdivision in accordance with §7-2-6 of the Subdivision Code, subject to the following conditions:

That the title of the plat be corrected to indicate that it is a Final Plat of Resubdivision before the plat is brought to the Village Board for final approval; and,

That the signature blocks and certificates be revised to the satisfaction of the Engineering Services Department before the plat is brought to the Village Board for final approval.

Commissioner Spink asked if the petitioner was in agreement with the recommendations and was told that they do agree.

Chairman Michaelsen asked about the maintenance of the access road and Mr. Coleman noted that there is an easement agreement in which the maintenance will be done as required and the costs will be shared between the two buildings.

Commissioner Hundhausen moved and Commissioner Christopher made the second to recommend approval of the Final Plat of Subdivision for the property at 680-690 East North Avenue in accordance with the recommendations of Staff. The results of the roll call vote were:

Declaring April Severe Weather Preparedness Month in Carol Stream

Whereas, the transition from winter to spring brings with it the likelihood for severe weather and potential tornado activity; and

Whereas Northern Illinois has experienced recent weather events such as the 1990 Plainfield tornado leaving 29 dead, 2004 Utica tornado leaving 9 dead, and the 2007 Carol Stream microburst that heavily damaged an apartment complex, displacing over 100 residents and causing thousands of dollars in property damage; and

ACT when severe weather is imminent...this gives residents and employees sufficient time to seek safe shelter; and

Whereas, a combination of weather monitoring technology, trained weather spotter networks, and personal disaster preparedness education will work to prepare our community to effectively prepare, respond to and recover from a severe weather event; and

Final Plat of Resubdivision

Joseph Ash of the law offices of Ash, Anos, Freedman & Logan, LLC, representing the Alter Group, Ltd, is requesting approval of a Final Plat of Resubdivision for the 6.366-acre property at 680-690 E North Avenue, on the south side of North Avenue approximately 800 feet west of President Street. The subject property includes two subdivided lots that are both owned by the Alter Group. The southern 3.005-acre lot is improved with a 23,966 square foot office building and associated parking. The northern 3.361-acre lot is vacant. Vehicular access to the office building from North Avenue is via a driveway across the northern lot within an ingress-egress easement. The Alter Group intends to construct a new office building on the northern lot, which could be done without any resubdivision. The desire is for each building to have its own ground sign; however, the Sign Code allows only one ground sign per street frontage, and the southern lot has no street frontage. Therefore, in order to allow both buildings to have ground signs along North Avenue, the petitioner has proposed a resubdivision of the two lots so that they both have frontage on North Avenue.

The staff report presenting the requested Final Plat of Resubdivision, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PC/ZBA) packet on March 21, 2008. At their March 24, 2008, meeting, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Final Plat of Resubdivision, with conditions, by a vote of 6-0. The PC/ZBA recommendation included the following conditions:

• That the title of the plat be corrected to indicate that it is a Final Plat of Resubdivision before the plat is brought to the Village Board for final approval; and,

• That the signature blocks and certificates be revised to the satisfaction of the Engineering Services Department before the plat is brought to the Village Board for final approval.

The title of the revised plat dated March 20, 2008, has been corrected to indicate that it is a Final Plat of Resubdivision. As noted in the attached memo from the Director of Engineering Services, staff has reviewed the revised plat and has determined that the signature blocks and certificates have been revised to the satisfaction of the Engineering Services Department, and the plat is acceptable.

Change Order #1 - Repainting of Tower #2

The painting contractor for repainting of Tower #2 has brought to my attention that the insulation that currently wraps the 12" riser pipe inside the stem of Tower #2 has dried out to the point that moisture has gotten into the outside of the riser pipe and is causing surface deterioration. The surface rust is not severe, but since we are repainting all other surfaces inside the tank, I believe it wise that we have the insulation removed and also repaint the riser pipe. I believe that the existing pipe insulation has not been removed since the tank was built in 1961.

A proposal was secured from Jetco, Ltd. in the amount of \$8,660 to remove all existing insulation, sandblast and repaint the pipe and then reinsulated the riser pipe with 2" thick insulation and install an aluminum jacket over the insulation. Unfortunately, I did not include this work in the original preparation of the repainting specifications. Considering the amount of work involved in removing, repainting and installing the insulation, I believe the proposal from Jetco, Ltd. is reasonable and recommend the Change Order #1 in the amount of \$8,660 be approved.

The original contract amount was \$101,990, this change order represents 8.49% of the total contract price. The contractor is back on site and proposes to finish up the repainting by the end of April with no change in time for the additional work. The original contract was to be completed by May 1, 2008. The change order is attached for your review and approval.

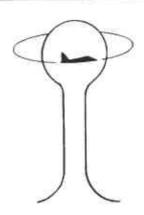

Please include the attached budget transfer request on the April 7th Village Board agenda for Mayor Saverino & the Board of Trustees consideration. A summary of the line-item transfer requests in the Town Center budget are as follows:

- 1. The Summer in the Center line-item is over-budget by \$12,922 due to additional costs for an upgrade to the Teen Stage to include additional sound, lighting, backline, stage size and screen and projector for the Guitar Hero festival offering amounting to \$7,755. An additional \$5,167 was spent developing the new Kid's Corral venue which included additional entertainers as well as a small stage. An \$11,731 transfer from the Concert Series line item and the \$1,191 from Contingency are proposed to fund the shortfall in this line item.
- 2. The Oktoberfest line-item was over-budget \$1,298 due to the rescheduling of the cancelled July 26th summer concert which was rescheduled and then subsequently charged to the Oktoberfest line-item. \$ 1,298 from Contingency is proposed for transfer to fund the shortfall in this line-item.
- 3. The Multicultural Festival was under-budgeted by \$ 5,581 (52%) with contingency funds proposed to be used to cover the shortfall. The costs for the 2005 festival totaled \$12,786 and for the 2006 festival totaled \$13,840. The 3-year average actual cost for hosting the multicultural festival is \$ 12,695.

Please include this budget transfer request on the omnibus budget amendment ordinance scheduled to be considered at the upcoming April 7th Village Board meeting. If you have any questions, please contact me at your earliest convenience.

Budget Transfer For Court Time and Overtime

The most recent expenditure report from Finance indicates that the Police Department has approximately \$7,000 remaining in the Court Time budget. It is anticipated that this budget line item will be over expended prior to the end of the fiscal year. In addition, the Overtime budget is over expended by \$14,500 at the present time.

The specific reasons for these current or anticipated overages are as follows:

Court Time

Court time is directly related to the required court appearances of our officers. This includes criminal court, DUI court, and field court. The required court appearances by our officers have exceeded our estimates.

Overtime

Increased demand for fee-based policing assignments, additional IDOT grant funding for traffic safety initiatives and the Bolek murder investigation.

I recommend that the Village Board approve the following budget transfers:

- \$5,000 from Personal Services Account to the Court Time Account, and
- \$80,000 from the Personal Services to the Overtime Account.

These transfers will accommodate the estimated expenses through the end of this fiscal year.

Village Wide Intersection Control Study

Engineering staff has investigated the forthcoming regulations from the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) as they relate to our Intersection Control Study in the Village. This study has been delayed in pervious years while these new rules were formulated. Although not yet published, it is almost certain that the MUTCD will be republished in its proposed form.

The biggest MUTCD change that may affect the Village, is that uncontrolled and yield controlled will need to be reanalyzed on a regular basis to ensure they remain safe, even if conditions change due to landscaping or fences. This could become unduly burdensome. Alternatively, we can create a "hierarchy of streets" based on functional classification where the lower volume street always stops for the higher volume road. More stop signs will be required, but it should create a safer driving environment for motorists.

As part of our investigation and developing a scope of work, staff has been working closely with Coulter Transportation Consulting, LLC. The hierarchy of streets concept was first proposed by Brent Coulter. He has provided a scope of services to develop a Functional Classification Map for the Village, including a technical analysis of the approach as it relates to the MUTCD, attend meetings and provide a public education component for residents and elected officials explaining neighborhood traffic control changes, and provide a traffic signal warrant analysis for Lies and Idaho including impacts at Fountain View.

Engineering Staff is providing much of the support for the study including the base map and use of the GIS for the Functional Classification Map, providing traffic count and accident data, and preparation of public education materials for distribution. Payment to Coulter Transportation Consulting, LLC will be based on an hourly rate of \$150/hr, and is not expected to exceed \$8,700 for all services, based on a conservative estimate. If we chose to analyze all intersections in the Village individually, the cost will be significantly higher.

Included in the proposed Fiscal-Year 2008-09 budget are funds to maintain the landscape right-of-ways along Village, DuPage County and State of Illinois roadways. These properties include the Town Center on Lies Road, the Municipal Center, Daylily Park on St. Charles Road and the North Avenue, Schmale Road, Gary Avenue, County Farm Road and Army Trail Road median and right-of-ways. Carol Stream is reimbursed for the cost of maintaining County and State of Illinois right of ways by DuPage County. The specifications for maintenance of these properties is at a very high level consistent with previously established Village Board guidelines and meet or exceed maintenance levels specified by IDOT for North Avenue and by DuPage County for Gary Avenue, County Farm Road and Army Trail Road. The bid specification requested a three year cost proposal with the initial term of the agreement being from May 1, 2008 through April 30, 2009 with possible renewal for an additional two years, in one-year increments. On March 19, 2008 sealed bids were opened for landscape maintenance of these properties. The results of the bid opening were as follows:

Consistent with last year it is recommended that the Village Board approve the landscape maintenance contract prior to May 1st so that the selected contractor can gear-up for spring clean-up activities and have our facilities ready for events that will be scheduled for the Town Center. Landscape contractors are also preparing their schedules and priorities for the coming year and usually give preference to clients who notify them early that they will be awarded the contract.

It is recommended that the contract for landscape maintenance services for the properties listed above be awarded to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder, TLC Landscaping, Inc. at the unit costs specified in their proposal dated March 18, 2008 (approximately \$66,245/year), for the period May 1, 2008 through April 30, 2009 with a contract option for two additional years. This cost represents an increase of ½% over the previous contract with Classic Landscaping. There are sufficient funds budgeted in the proposed Fiscal Year 2008-09 budget to pay for these expenditures. Furthermore, some of the Village's costs are offset through a reimbursement of up to \$14,210 by DuPage County for maintenance of County right-of-ways in Carol Stream. Final approval of this contract is subject to funds being included in the Fiscal Year 2009 Budget.

Change Order #1 - WRC Demolition

On June 18-2007, the Village Board approved a contract to J.J. Henderson for the demolition of the East Side WRC tanks in the amount of \$422,300. After the demolition and the modification of electrical circuits to cut off power to the tanks that were demolished, it was discovered that an exhaust fan in the existing pipe gallery of the existing East Side facilities that remain had lost its power supply. It was determined that the most economical modification would be to replace the old three-phase motor that previously received power from the East Side Blower Building with a new single-phase motor that could be powered from within the existing pipe gallery.

This work was outside of the scope of the original demolition contract; therefore, a proposal was requested from J.J. Henderson to provide the necessary electrical work. Attached is the proposal and a change order in the amount of \$2,176.99 to do the necessary electrical work. This would be Change Order #1 to the project, which represents ½ of 1% of the original contract amount. Your review and approval of the attached change order is requested.

There will be another change order decreasing the contract amount because we are planning on deleting/reducing the restoration required of J.J. Henderson because of the pending walking path by Easton Park. Overall, the project is expected to be less than the original contract amount.

Water and Sewer Rate Increases

The proposed FY09 Budget includes a rate increase for both the water rate and the sewer rate. The budget proposes a \$.20/1,000 gallons increase in the water rate effective for usage beginning October 1, 2008 and a \$.11/1,000 gallons increase in the sewer rate beginning May 1, 2008.

The water rate increase reflects the amount of increase that the City of Chicago will be charging the DuPage Water Commission (DWC) who in turn will be passing that rate increase on to its members. Just as a reminder, the City of Chicago will be raising their rates by \$.23 and \$.25 in FY10 and FY11 and we anticipate raising our rate by the same amounts. The last change in the water rate was 5/1/05 when we lowered the rate by \$.20/1,000 gallons to reflect the lower cost of water charged by the DWC.

The sewer rate increase is due to cost increases in the operation. The last time that the rate was changed was 5/1/03, 5/1/04 and 5/1/05 in which it was increased by \$.20/1,000 each year to cover the debt payment requirement related to the expansion at the WRC. The last time that the rate was increased to cover the cost of the day-to-day operation was 12/01/01.

For each 1,000 gallons, the charge shall be \$2.51 per each 1,000 gallons or a fraction thereof.

As of October 1, 2008.

(B) For each resident single-family, commercial or industrial user of the combined waterworks and sewerage system within the corporate limits, the charge for water and sewer service shall be as follows:

The charge shall be \$5.76 per each 1,000 gallons or a fraction thereof.

(D) For each residential single-family and multi-family, commercial or industrial user of the sewer service only, within the corporate limit, the charge for sewer service only shall be as follows:

For each 1,000 gallons, the charge shall be \$2.51 per each 1,000 gallons or a fraction thereof.

SECTION 2: All other sections of this code not herein modified or changed shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3: After its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect for usage beginning May 1, 2008 and October 1, 2008.

Ordinance - IPBC Health Insurance Pool Renewal

The Village has been a member of the IPBC for approximately 25 years. The pool currently includes over forty municipalities and covers over 8,000 employee lives. IPBC Bylaws require that each member formally renew its membership commitment every three years.

There are several advantages to continuing our participation in the IPBC pool:

- 1. Intergovernmental pooling has proven to be an effective alternative to traditional insurance. The Village is not as vulnerable to the drastic market swings of the private insurance marketplace and rate increases have trended lower than industry standards. In fact, the IPBC's performance, i.e. rate adjustments, has been lower than the market for the last four years.
- 2. Economies are experienced from negotiating and purchasing insurance products in intergovernmental consortiums. The Village self-insures the first \$30,000 of an individual's annual health claim costs. Annual claims incurred between \$30,000 and \$125,000 are pooled and shared evenly among all IPBC members. The IPBC purchases excess insurance to cover losses over \$125,000 per claimant.
- 3. The HMO product has provided the Village a lower cost coverage alternative with annual rebate opportunities based on positive loss experience. The rebate element of IPBC's plan continues to be unprecedented in today's HMO health insurance industry.
- 4. The IBPC has expanded access to more effective cost containment options by negotiating contracts with Blue Cross Blue Shield of Illinois, Cigna and United Healthcare. All of these companies offer an extensive network of physicians and hospitals that help reduce overall plan costs.
- 5. Last year we moved our PPO coverage to Blue Cross Blue Shield to increase our innetwork utilization and to take advantage of a larger negotiated discount. So far, our innetwork utilization has increased to 97.5% (from mid 80%) and the discount has increased to 47%.

So therefore, it is my recommendation that the Village Board approve the attached ordinance to extend Carol Stream's period of participation in the Intergovernmental Personnel Benefit Cooperative (IPBC) for a period of three additional years through June 30, 2011.

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AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE PERIOD OF PARTICIPATION IN THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL PERSONNEL BENEFIT COOPERATIVE FOR A PERIOD OF THREE ADDITIONAL YEARS.

WHEREAS, this municipal corporation is a Member of the Intergovernmental Personnel Benefit Cooperative, ("IPBC"), which is an intergovernmental entity providing employee benefits to the officers and employees of this municipality; and

Budget Amendments are recommended for the following situations:

1. A budget amendment in the amount of \$50,000 is requested to the Municipal Garage Fuel Purchasing Account (53354). The average cost of all our fuels has been 10% greater than we had estimated over a year ago when the current budget projections were developed. Additionally the harsh winter has increased our overall fuel usage, mainly by the Public Works Street Division in its snow plowing operations.

- 2. The increase cost of fuel (purchased by the Municipal Garage and charged back to using departments) has mainly affected the Street Division's fuel account. A budget amendment in the amount of \$45,000 is requested to balance out this account (53313).
- 3. The harsh winter and plowing operations has resulted in increased overtime. A Budget amendment in the amount of \$51,000 is requested to the Street Division Overtime Account (51109).
- 4. The harsh winter and numerous snowfall events have resulted in increased use of outside contractual plowing. A budget amendment in the amount of \$91,000 is requested to balance out this account (52266).
- 5. The harsh winter and numerous snowfall events have also resulted in increased equipment repairs. The Municipal Garage purchases repair parts and the cost is charged back to using departments. A budget amendment in the amount of \$19,000 is requested to balance out the parts purchasing account (53354).
- 6. Last year we had a Well contractor Layne Western, pull well #3 for rehabilitation. After all the well components were analyzed it was determined to reconfigure the well into a submersible well, purchasing new equipment. The Village Board authorized this work. A budget amendment in the amount of \$50,000 is requested to balance out the Water Divisions maintenance & Repair Account, to which this work was charged (52244).

If the Village takes no action by May 1, 2008, the volume cap would be automatically ceded to the State of Illinois. There has been an inquiry as to whether or not the Village would be interested in selling the volume cap. If the Village were to sell the volume cap, a common fee would be 1% to 1.5% (\$34,056.95 to \$51,085.43).

Since it is not probable that the Village could sell the volume cap by May 1st, I would suggest that the Village Board pass the attached Ordinance that would reserve the Village's right to retain the volume cap beyond the May 1st deadline, allowing the Village to sell the volume cap at a later date if possible. AN ORDINANCE RESERVING VOLUME CAP IN CONNECTION WITH PRIVATE ACTIVITY BOND ISSUES, AND RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream, Du Page County, Illinois (the "Municipality"), is a municipality and a home rule unit of government under Section 6 of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Section 146 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), provides that the Municipality has volume cap equal to \$85.00 per resident of the Municipality in each calendar year, which volume cap may be reserved and allocated to certain tax-exempt private activity bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Private Activity Bond Allocation Act, 30 *Illinois Compiled Statutes 1998*, 345/1 *et seq.*, as supplemented and amended (the "Act"), provides that a home rule unit of government may transfer its allocation of volume cap to any other home rule unit of government, the State of Illinois or any agency thereof or any non-home rule unit of government; and

WHEREAS, it is now deemed necessary and desirable by the Municipality to reserve all of its volume cap allocation for calendar year 2008 to be applied toward the issuance of private activity bonds (the "Bonds"), as provided in this Ordinance, or to be transferred, as permitted by this Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1. That, pursuant to Section 146 of the Code and the Act, the entire volume cap of the Municipality for calendar year 2008 is hereby reserved by the Municipality, which shall issue the Bonds using such volume cap, or shall use or transfer such volume cap, without any further action required on the part of the Municipality, and the adoption of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be an allocation of such volume cap to the issuance of the Bonds or such other bonds; provided, that any such transfer shall be evidenced by a written instrument executed by the Mayor or any other proper officer or employee of the Municipality.

SECTION 2. That the Municipality shall maintain a written record of this Ordinance in its records during the term that the Bonds or any other such bonds to which such volume cap is allocated remain outstanding.

SECTION 3. That the Mayor, the Village Clerk and all other proper officers, officials, agents and employees of the Municipality are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents and certificates as may be necessary to further the purposes and intent of this Ordinance.

That the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be SECTION 4. separable, and if any section, phrase or provision of this Ordinance shall for any reason be declared to be invalid, such declaration shall not affect the remainder of the sections, phrases and provisions of this Ordinance.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to convey a request from the Wheaton Christian Center (WCC) regarding the required improvements to their property, and to make a recommendation.

BACKGROUND

On September 5, 2006, The Village Board approved Ordinance No. 2006-09-50, granting a request from the Wheaton Christian Center at 610 E. North Avenue to allow for the operation of a private elementary school and a furniture resale Years earlier, in 1999, the WCC had successfully fundraising operation. petitioned the Village for a rezoning of the former K-Mart property to the B-4 Office, Research and Institutional Building District, and for approval of a Special Use Permit for a Regional Religious Institution. The special use granted in 1999 contained conditions of approval pertaining to building façade and parking lot landscaping improvements, and this work had not yet been done at the time of the 2006 request. In order to address this issue, Ordinance No. 2006-09-50 includes a condition whereby architectural plans for the improvements required by the 1999 ordinance must be submitted within one year's time, which was September 5, 2007, and the improvements completed within two years, September 5, 2008.

On September 17, 2007, the Village Board approved by motion a request from WCC for a seven-month suspension of enforcement of the requirements of Ordinance 2006-09-50. This was done in part in recognition of the hardships caused by the microburst event in March 2007; however, the primary reason for the extension was the WCC's decision to pursue a significant change in the redevelopment plan for the property. Mr. James Ward, Executive Administrator, indicated that the WCC intended to prepare plans for a partial commercial development on the property and request zoning approvals. A concept plan (attached) was presented showing approximately 40,000 sf of the existing building being converted to commercial, with two outlot buildings sized at 5,500 sf and 9,560 sf. Mr. Ward indicated the WCC would be retaining NAI Hiffman to assist in the redevelopment project, and he expected to submit plans soon.

DISCUSSION

Attached is a letter from James Ward requesting a 12-month extension of the suspension of enforcement granted by the Village Board in September. As indicated in the attachment to Mr. Ward's letter, the WCC has retained NAI Hiffman's services; however, no plans have been submitted at this time. Staff recently met with Mr. Ward and representatives from NAI Hiffman to discuss the project, and the zoning approvals necessary to make the commercial development possible. Because of the mixed-use nature of the proposed redevelopment, it appears a text amendment to the Zoning Code would be necessary, as well as North Avenue Corridor Review and perhaps a Planned Unit Development Plan. NAI Hiffman indicated that they were be prepared to submit plans for zoning approvals within two to three months.

Staff believes that the commercial development as proposed by the Wheaton Christian Center would be beneficial to the Carol Stream community, if successful. Although nothing has yet been submitted to the Village in terms of an application for development approvals, it is understandable that, in light of today's economy, the WCC needs to be cautious in their contemplated venture into commercial development. Some progress has been made in that the WCC has brought NAI Hiffman into the project as promised, and has met with staff to discuss the project. Therefore, based on the WCC continuing to prosecute their proposed redevelopment project, staff can support the WCC's request for another extension of enforcement of the requirements of Ordinance 2006-09-50. However, if the Village Board were willing to grant the request, staff suggests they do so with conditions that call for the WCC to carry out their proposed project in good faith as promised.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that, if the Village Board were willing to grant the WCC's request, they should pass the following motion:

Motion to direct staff to suspend enforcement of Condition of Approval No. 7 of Ordinance No. 2006-09-50 for an additional 12 months, to April 5, 2009, with the following conditions:

- 1. The WCC should demonstrate progress during the term of the extension. Such progress would include the submittals of applications for zoning approvals and for building permits.
- 2. Staff should monitor the progress of the project and provide status reports to the Village Board.
- 3. The extension is subject to revocation should the Village Board conclude that the project is not being implemented.

In September 2007, the Village Staff granted a petition from Wheaton Christian Center Church requesting a seven-month suspension of enforcement of the requirements of Ordinance No. 2006-09-50. The request was made due to an unforeseen tragic event suffered by our ministry, and due to a significant change of our original facility development plans.

FACILITY DEVELOPMENT PLANS UPDATE

During the time of this suspension, WCC Leadership has been aggressively moving forward in developing plans regarding building renovation, exterior improvements, and commercial development of the WCC Property, which will address the requirements of condition #7 outlined in Ordinance No. 2006-09-50. We feel that the plans will be most beneficial to Wheaton Christian Center Church and the Carol Stream Community.

Since our last letter of petition, WCC Leadership has retained the development and brokerage services of NAI Hiffman Commercial Real Estate Services, to partner with us in simultaneously planning and completing all property improvements, and establishing a retail component to the property. We believe that the strength and experience of NAI Hiffman will help WCC Leadership expedite the process, and successfully complete the proposed development project.

It is mutually agreed between WCC Leadership and our NAI Hiffman partners that additional time is needed to appropriately research and complete our future development plans. Upon completion of the predevelopment phase, our intent is to make a formal, thorough presentation to the Village Board in response to the conditions set forth in the Ordinance.

We respectfully request your support in granting Wheaton Christian Center Church an additional twelve-month suspension of enforcement of the requirements of Ordinance No. 2006-09-50. We believe that twelve months will give us sufficient time to

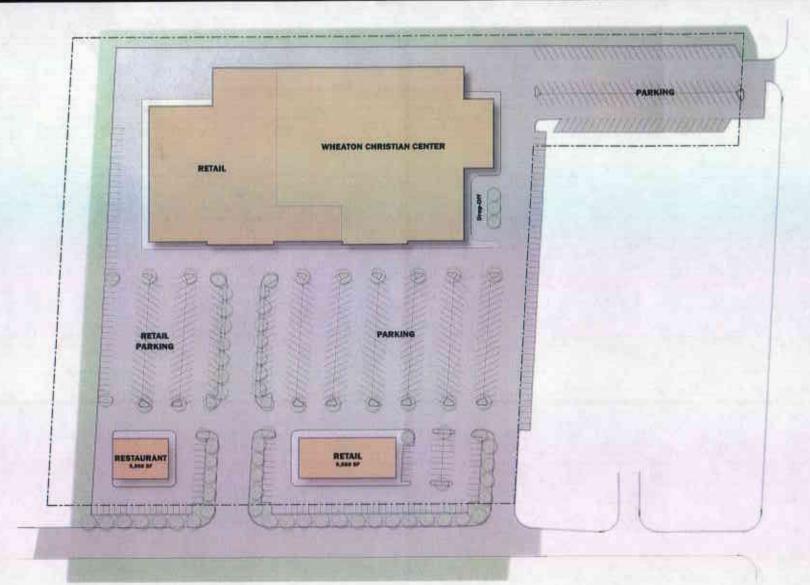
