Mr. Breinig commented that since the budget has been printed, there have been two amendments that have been put forward. These were reviewed with the Board at the Budget Workshops. The first is in terms of the Water and Sewer Fund, water billing revenues were decreased by \$267,763, \$274,527 and \$274,944 in FY 07, 08 and 09 respectively. Most importantly, even with those reductions and projected revenues, the budget remains in the black every year. The second thing is that the Village Hall parking lot is being replaced in Fiscal Year 07 and the addition of that project at \$295,000 is proposed for inclusion into the budget as well. Finance Director Stan Helgerson said that the in reviewing the notice he said that since the Capital Improvement Program is a separate fund, he did that, in error, he did not include those numbers in the public notice, so an additional CIP fund amount, \$8,017,000 needs to be added for the Capital Improvement projects for the upcoming fiscal year also.

There were no comments or questions from those in attendance at the call for public hearing. Trustee Fenner said that she is pleased to see that the budget shows all three years in the black, which shows it appears that the economy is improving and things are getting better. Trustee Stubbs moved and Trustee Gieser made the second to close the public hearing. The results of the roll call vote were:

2006 Official Zoning Map: Resolution 2181:

At their meeting on April 11, 2006, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals recommended approval of the 2006 Official Zoning Map in accordance with staff recommendations. The Board concurred with the recommendations and adopted Resolution

2181, A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM.

Final PUD-Special Use- shopping plaza/drive-up service: Ord. 2006-04-18:

At their meeting on April 11, 2006, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals recommended approval of a final planned unit development and a special use for a shopping plaza and a special use for drive-up window service in accordance with staff recommendations. The Board concurred with the recommendation and adopted Ordinance 2006-04-18, AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT PLAN AND SPECIAL USES FOR A SHOPPING PLAZA AND DRIVE-UP SERVICE WINDOW – (SE CORNER OF ARMY TRAIL ROAD AND KUHN ROAD).

Off the table: Duke appeal- Gary Ave. Master Plan denial – 121-131 North Ave.:

The Board took off the table the matter of the request from Duke Construction to appeal the decision of the Plan Commission denying Duke's Proposed Gary Avenue Master Plan for the property at 121-131 E. North Avenue. Duke needs approvals of a Final Plat of Resubdivision, rezoning from I Industrial District to B-3 Service District and Gary Avenue Master Plan for a proposed subdivision to create two 0.6-acre commercial lots on the east side of Gary Avenue north of North Avenue. The Plan Commission, which has the approval authority for Gary Avenue Corridor Review, denied the proposed Master Plan. The Board remanded this matter back to the Plan Commission for re-consideration.

Year end Budget Transfers:

The Board approved year-end budget transfers as explained in the April 13, 2006 memo to the Village Manager from the Finance Director.

2006 Flexible Pavement Project-Section 06-00049-00-FP:

The Board approved an award of bid for the 2006 Flexible Pavement Project – Section 06-00049-00 FP to Plote Construction, Inc. at the bid unit prices submitted.

Ord. 2006-04 16: Approve Annual Budget:

The Board adopted Ordinance 2006-04-16, AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM FOR THE YEAR COMMENCING MAY 1, 2006 AND ENDING APRIL 30, 2007.

Ord. 2006-04-17: Amend Number of Class C Liq. Lic. Code:

The Board adopted Ordinance 2006-04-17, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 11, ARTICLE 2 OF THE CAROL STREAM CODE OF ORDINANCES BY INCREASING THE NUMBER OF CLASS C LIQUOR LICENSES FROM 215 TO 16 – (GOODIE'S DELI AND LIQUOR, INC. – 1270 KUHN ROAD).

Ord. 2006-04-19: Requiring CATV System to obtain franchise agreement:

The Board adopted Ordinance 2006-04-19, AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING COMMUNITY ANTENNA TELEVISION SYSTEMS TO OBTAIN FRANCHISES.

Resolution 2182: Adopt 2006/07 Employee Pay Plan:

The Board adopted Resolution 2182, A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE 2006-07 EMPLOYEE PAY PLAN FOR THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM.

Request: CS Library-Temp. approval of special use permit:

The Board approved a temporary special use permit to the Carol Stream Public Library to allow an Arts and Crafts Fair to be held at property they own at 480 N. Kuhn Road on May 13, 2006.

Tree lighting ceremony request:

The Board approved the purchase of an enhanced 22' Christmas tree for the Tree Lighting Ceremony at Town Center from Temple Display in the amount of \$6,152.61.

Regular Bills, Addendum Warrant of Bills, Treasurer's Report 3/31/06:

The Board approved the payment of the Regular Bills in the amount of \$399,990.87.

The Board approved the payment of the Addendum Warrant of Bills in the amount of \$621,788,81.

The Board received the Treasurer's Report for month ending March 31, 2006.

REGULAR MEETING:

An Ordinance approving an amendment to a preliminary planned unit development plan and approving a partial final planned unit development plan –Heritage Plaza Shopping Center:

Mr. Diamond said that there are two slight changes for the Ordinance that was prepared for this matter. In the second Whereas Clause there is language that make it appear as if the Plan Commission had approved this. Actually, the Plan Commission did not give an affirmative recommendation so the language about the determination being made by the Plan Commission should go into the next Whereas Clause, which would be the material regarding the determination by the Village Board. "This Village Board would find that it does not find pose a negative effect on property values in the area, would not be detrimental to the public health, safety or general welfare." This just shifts the two languages. Finally, one other modification, at the last meeting, the Board asked for and the developer agreed to do a traffic study with regard to ingress and egress to the property and therefore a new #11 is added as a condition, "The owner shall submit to the Village a traffic study prepared by a recognized expert on ingress and egress access to the site. This issue will be reviewed by the Village Board at the time of final site plan approval at which time the Village may exercise its' reasonable legislative discretion." Attorney Greg Dose, representing the developer, has agreed to that language. Mr. Breinig commented that the reason for this is because there are concerns about the right in/right out possibility on County Farm Road from what would be their new drive and concerns about pedestrian safety to cross from parking to the new stores.

Trustee Stubbs said that is the primary reason he did not want this on the consent agenda. Trustee Fenner moved and Trustee McCarthy made the second to adopt Ordinance 2006-04-20, AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO A PRELIMINARY PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT PLAN AND APPROVING A PARTIAL FINAL PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT PLAN – (HERITAGE PLAZA SHOPPING CENTER) as amended with the additions made previously. 


Stormwater Management & Conveyance Easement

Lies Road Bikeway Temporary and Permanent Easements

in Veteran's Park

The Village has received a grant of easement from the Carol Stream Park District to construct the Lies Road Bikeway. This easement was required due to minimum separation requirements from the path to streetlights.

Decorative streetlights were installed by Town and Country along Lies Road, and due to the narrow right-of-way and five-lane roadway, inadequate parkway remains for the path. The Park District is granting the Village a 5' permanent easement and a 10' temporary grading easement along the north property line of Veteran's Park so that the bike path will maintain adequate separation from the new decorative streetlights.

Engineering staff therefore recommends acceptance of these easements from the Carol Stream Park District for the purpose of constructing the Lies Road Bikeway.

PERMANENT BIKE PATH AND LANDSCAPE EASEMENT



Attached you will find correspondence from Covered Bridges, L.P. advising that they have acquired Covered Bridges Apartments and would like to begin rehabilitation within the complex. As the e-mail indicates, Covered Bridges, L.P. intends to reinvest up to \$19,000,000 in the property.

As noted, financing is being pursued through the Illinois Finance Authority (IFA). IFA has programs available for acquisition, rehabilitation and construction of apartment complexes. These programs target low and moderate-income households, including the disables and elderly. Financing is done through tax-exempt bonds at sub-prime interest rates. Federal tax law places limitations on the aggregate amount of these bonds that can be issued in Illinois.

Currently each Home Rule community in Illinois is allocated an amount equal to \$80.00 per capita. The state has identified Carol Stream's population for these purposes at 40,267. Carol Stream's allocation for 2006 is \$3,221,360. Covered Bridges, L.P. has requested that the Village cede the allocation to the project.

Attached for your review and consideration is a resolution ceding the \$3,221,360 allocation for stated purposes to IFA for financing at Covered Bridges Apartments. In taking this action there is no cost to the Village nor is any obligation assumed by the Village. Covered Bridges, L.P. has asked that the Village waive any fee that might be charged to cede the allocation. Staff recommends that no fee be charged. This recommendation is based upon the commitment displayed by Covered Bridges, L.P. to improve the complex. Previously economic pressures in the rental marketplace had caused the property to decline. Since assuming ownership Covered Bridges, L.P. has met

with the Police Department to identify problems and work on corrective measures. The new manager has a proven track record and has had good experiences with the Police Department in the past. Some improvements are already underway; a permit application has been submitted to replace the intercom system. Staff welcomes the proposed investment into Covered Bridges and is optimistic about the future of the complex.

Procedures for allocations to Home Rule communities require action to be taken prior to May 1, 2006. IFA has advised that action at the May 1 Village Board meeting will meet this requirement. If the Village fails to act, the allocation will revert to the state and Covered Bridges, L.P. will need to apply for an allocation through the state at an increased cost. Ceding the allocation will ensure that Carol Stream's allocation goes to a local project and will help reduce borrowing costs for that project. Staff recommends approval of the ordinance.

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A RESOLUTION CEDING THE AGGREGATE REMAINING UNUSED ALLOCATION OF 2006 PRIVATE ACTIVITY BOND VOLUME CAP OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM TO THE ILLINOIS FINANCE AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois (the "Home Rule Unit" or the "Village") is a municipality and a home rule unit of government duly organized and validly existing under Section 6(a) of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the availability of affordable housing for families and senior citizens is necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the availability of job opportunities to relieve conditions of unemployment and underemployment and the increase of business and commerce to reduce the evils associated with unemployment and underemployment are essential to the health, safety and general welfare of the Home Rule Unit; and

WHEREAS, Section 146 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Code"), as amended, and Section 1301 of the Tax Reform Act of 1986, places a ceiling (the "State's Ceiling") on the aggregate principal amount of private activity bonds (as defined in the Code) that can be issued in the State of Illinois from January 1, 2006, to and including December 31, 2006; and

WHEREAS, the Home Rule Unit's portion of the State's Ceiling for calendar year 2006 is \$80 per capita (the "Available Ceiling thereby resulting in approximately \$3,221,360 of 2006 Available Ceiling; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Home Rule Unit to transfer and reallocate the Home Rule Unit's remaining, unused Available Ceiling to the Illinois Finance Authority (hereinafter, the "Authority" or "IFA") and thereby permit the Authority to issue tax-exempt private activity bonds to finance affordable rental housing, industrial, manufacturing, and commercial projects for economic development purposes and, as initially designated, a proposed multifamily housing project to be issued on behalf of DuPage Covered Bridges, L.P. that will provide for the acquisition and substantial renovation of a 362-unit apartment property commonly known as "Covered Bridges Apartments" and located at 637 Burns Drive in Carol Stream (DuPage County), Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Home Rule Unit has issued private activity bond requiring Volume Cap to which portions of the Available Ceiling have been allocated in the aggregate principal amount of \$0 from January 1, 2006, through the date of adoption of this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Home Rule Unit has a remaining, unused balance of allocated Available Ceiling in the amount of approximately \$3,221,360 for the remainder of calendar year 2006; and

WHEREAS, under the Illinois Private Activity Bond Allocation that portion of Available Ceiling remaining unused by a Home Rule Unit, other than a municipality with over 2,000,000 inhabitants, as of May 1 of each calendar year, shall be, on June 1 of each calendar year reserved to the Governor's Office for reallocation; and

WHEREAS, under the Illinois Private Activity Bond Allocation Act, the Home Rule Unit may reallocate to the Illinois Finance Authority any remaining, unused portion of its Available Ceiling; and

WHEREAS, the Village will report this transfer of approximately \$3,221,360 (same number as above based on \$80 per capita) of Volume Cap to IFA for the DuPage Covered Bridges, L.P. Project to the Governor's Office of Management and Budget by no later than May 10, 2006, as dictated by the Governor's Office of Management and Budget's allocation guidelines; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Home Rule Unit to transfer and reallocate its approximately \$3,221,360 in unused Available Ceiling to the Authority in order to enable IFA to leverage the Village's Home Rule Ceiling to enable the financing of the DuPage Covered Bridges, L.P. project;

WHEREAS, the Authority would allow the Village to designate other priorities (if necessary) for financing other projects using any remaining, unused Available Ceiling during 2006, as appropriate if Bonds are not issued for the DuPage Covered Bridges, L.P. project October 31, 2006; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

- Section 1. That the Village of Carol Stream hereby transfers and reallocates its remaining, unused Available Ceiling of approximately \$3,221,360 to the Authority for the purposes specified above. In the event that the DuPage Covered Bridges, L.P. Project does not close by October 31, 2006, or does not use all of the Village's Available Ceiling by that date, the Village will have the right to designate priorities to the Illinois Finance Authority for applying any unused 2006 Village of Carol Stream Volume Cap, as it deems appropriate.
- Section 2. The Authority and the Home Rule Unit shall both retain a copy of this Resolution in their records for a minimum of 30 years. Notice of this Resolution together with a copy of this Resolution shall be given in writing by the Home Rule Unit to the Authority after passage and approval hereof.
- Section 3. That the officials of the Home Rule Unit are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to take all necessary or

	advisable actions in connection with the execution and implementation of this Resolution.

Dear Mr. Mayor and Village Trustees;

The purpose of this letter is to request the waiving of fees associated with the Library's Building Permit Application for the remodeling of the Youth Services Office.

The Library will be remodeling the Staff Room, taking part of it to expand the Youth Services Department office area. The addition of the 110 square foot space will add 50% on to the office area. Except for the noise of construction, the public areas of the building will not be affected.

We are requesting that the Building Permit Fees be waived to save the tax payers of Carol Stream this expense and as a consideration of one Government body to another.

Dear Mr. Breinig,

We also have an insurance agency that will be providing our policy for this event.

No one knows when a tragedy will strike, but it's nice to know that there is something available to help you and your family.
