

SECTION 1: Linda Mehring should be commended for her dedication to the Village, the Public Works and IT Departments and her co-workers during her tenure.



Award of Phase I Design Services to Engineering Resource Associates, Inc.

The rear yards of residents living along Clearwater Court and Kalamazoo Court have been experiencing drainage problems due to a failing Village underdrain system. Engineering Staff sent a request for qualifications (RFQs) to five engineering firms. A consultant selection committee determined Engineering Resource Associates, Inc. (ERA) to be the highest-ranked firm based on the selection criteria. On June 04, 2018, the Board authorized staff to request a proposal from ERA and begin contract negotiations.

On June 07, 2018, ERA provided a scope of services (SOS) and fee of \$32,115.00. Staff indicated the fee needed to be reduced and a revised SOS and fee of \$25,835.00 was received on June 08, 2018. Staff reviewed the revised SOS and fee and found it to be acceptable.

The fee is largely driven by the following four components of the SOS: (1) topographic/boundary survey and the development of (2) design alternatives, (3) conceptual plans/exhibits, and (4) cost estimates. Staff believes that the level of detail agreed to in these components are necessary to adequately address the anticipated concerns of affected residents. Staff also believes that providing this detail in Phase I will then result in a lower negotiated fee for Phase II services.

Engineering staff therefore recommends award of a contract for a cost not to exceed \$25,835.00 to Engineering Resource Associates, Inc. for Phase I Design Services.

Purchase of AMR's for the AMR Replacement Program

The current budget provides funding for the implementation of an AMR Replacement Program. Specifically, the budget includes \$342,500 for the purchase of approximately 2,400 AMR's and associated supplies. Due to necessary start-up time to hire staff and establish workflows and processes, we do not expect to complete 2,400 installations in this first year.

Staff is preparing for the program and will need to place an initial order of supplies with an expected delivery time of 4-6 weeks. Midwest Meter, Inc., has provided the attached letter verifying Midwest Meter's status as the sole provider of this product in our area. Following the Village Board's approval, staff intends to order the AMR's in bunches throughout the year to avoid storage and inventory management problems.

Staff recommends that the Village Board approve a Motion authorizing the purchase of AMR's from Midwest Meter, Inc., in the amount of \$300,000.00, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 5-8-3(B) and 5-8-14(C) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

Updated Hotel / Motel Use Tax Ordinance

Presented for Village Board review and consideration at their June 18, 2018 meeting are proposed updates to the Village's current hotel tax ordinance. The current ordinance has not been updated in more than a decade and lacks a number of desirable components including:

- 1. Late fees and penalty provisions.
- 2. Village right to review books and records of hotel/motel operators.
- 3. Exemptions for long-term stays. We cannot collect taxes on continuous stays of 30 days or longer per statute.
- 4. Establishing a tax return format provided by the Village.

There is no change in tax rate or other substantive changes that would impact current operators. The proposed changes are largely housekeeping adjustments that bring our ordinance more in line with those of other communities.

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5, ARTICLE 9 OF THE CAROL STREAM CODE OF ORDINANCES PERTAINING TO THE MUNICIPAL HOTEL TAX

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois is a home rule unit of government under Section 6(a); Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and may exercise powers pertaining to its local governmental affairs; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Village's home rule authority, the Village currently imposes a hotel/motel tax of 5% of the room rental rate (not including taxes or other non-room rental charges added to the hotel or motel bill), for each such hotel or motel room rented for every 24-hour period or fraction thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, finds that it is in the best interests of the Village to revise the hotel/motel tax as set forth herein.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, in the exercise of its home rule powers, as follows:

### **SECTION 1:**

The Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, Chapter 5, "Taxation and Finance", Article 9 "Municipal Hotel Tax" is hereby amended and as amended shall read as follows:

# ARTICLE 9 HOTEL / MOTEL USE TAX

#### 5-9-1 DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this chapter, the following words as used herein shall be construed to have the meanings herein ascribed:

**HOTEL OR MOTEL.** Any building or buildings in which the public may, for rent, obtain living quarters, sleeping or housekeeping accommodations. The term includes inns, motels, tourist homes or courts, lodging houses, rooming houses and apartment houses.

**HOTEL OR MOTEL ROOM.** A room within a structure offered for rental on a daily basis and containing facilities for sleeping.

**OWNER.** Any person having an ownership interest in or conducting the operation of a hotel or motel or receiving the consideration for the rental of such hotel or motel room.

**PERMANENT RESIDENT.** Any person who occupies or has rented any hotel or motel room for at least thirty (30) consecutive days.

**RESIDENT EMPLOYEE.** Any person who works and lives in the same hotel or motel.

# 5-9-2 TAX; INCIDENCE; PAYMENT; COLLECTION

- A. Tax Imposed: A tax is hereby levied and imposed upon the use and privilege of renting, leasing, or letting a hotel or motel room within the Village at a rate of five percent (5.0%) of the room rental rate (not including taxes or other non-room rental charges added to the hotel or motel bill), for each such hotel or motel room rented for every 24-hour period or fraction thereof.
- B. Incidence of Tax: The ultimate incidence of and liability for payment of the tax is to be borne by the person who seeks the privilege of occupying the hotel or motel room, such person hereinafter referred as to as renter.
- C. Payment of Tax: The tax herein levied shall be paid in addition to any and all other taxes and charges. It shall be the duty of the owner of every hotel or motel to secure the tax from the renter of the hotel or motel room and to pay the tax over to the Village under the procedures prescribed in this Chapter.
- D. Collection: Every person required to collect the tax levied by this Chapter shall secure the tax from the renter at the time he collects the rental payment for the hotel or motel room. The amount due under the tax provided in this Chapter shall be stated separately upon the invoice, receipt or other statement or memorandum given to the renter at the time of payment.

# 5-9-3 BOOKS AND RECORDS; INSPECTIONS; CONTENTS

- A. The Village Finance Director, or any person certified by him as his deputy or representative, may enter the premises of any hotel or motel for inspection of books and records in order to effectuate the proper administration of this Chapter and to assure the enforcement of the collection of the tax imposed.
- B. No person shall prevent, hinder or interfere with the Finance Director or his duly authorized deputy or representative in the discharge of his duties under this Chapter.
- C. It shall be the duty of every owner to keep accurate and complete books and records to which the Finance Director or his duly authorized deputy or representative shall at all times have full access, which records shall include a daily sheet showing:
  - 1) The number of hotel or motel rooms rented during the 24-hour period, including multiple rental of the same hotel or motel room where such shall occur; and

2) The actual hotel or motel receipts collected for the date in question.

# 5-9-4 REPORTING; TRANSMITTAL; PENALTY

- A. Monthly Reporting: The owner or owners of each hotel or motel within the Village shall file monthly tax returns, on a form approved by the Village, showing tax receipts received with respect to each hotel or motel during each reporting period. The returns shall be due on or before the last day of the calendar month next following the end of the monthly filing period. All returns shall be for full calendar months as provided herein.
- B. Transmittal of Tax: The tax shall be due on the day the monthly return is due as provided herein. At the time of filing such returns, the owner shall pay to the Finance Director all taxes, interest and penalties, if any, due for the period to which the return applies.
- C. Penalty: If for any reason any tax is not paid when due, a penalty at the rate of one percent (1%) of total taxes due per 30-day period, or any portion thereof, shall be added and collected.

#### 5-9-5 PROCEEDS

All proceeds resulting from the collection of the tax under this Chapter, including interest and penalties, shall be paid into the Treasury of the Village and shall be credited to and deposited in the General Fund of the Village.

#### 5-9-6 EXEMPTION

The tax imposed by Section 5-9-2 of this Chapter shall not apply to permanent residents or resident employees.

#### 5-9-7 PENALTIES

Any owner or person found guilty of violating, disobeying, omitting, neglecting or refusing to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be punished, upon conviction thereof, by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the first offense, and not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the second and each subsequent offense in any 180-day period. A separate and distinct offense shall be deemed committed each day upon which said violation shall continue.

#### 5-9-8 SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this Chapter and the application thereof to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

### **SECTION 2:**

Those sections, paragraphs, and provisions of the Village of Carol Stream Code of Ordinances which are not expressly amended or repealed by this Ordinance are hereby re-enacted, and it is

expressly declared to be the intention of this Ordinance not to repeal or amend any portions of the Village of Carol Stream Code of Ordinances other than those expressly amended or repealed in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

# **SECTION 3:**

The invalidity of any section or provision of this Ordinance hereby passed and approved shall not invalidate other sections or provisions thereof.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2018-06-\_\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM,
DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS ASCERTAINING THE
PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES FOR LABORERS, WORKERS AND
MECHANICS EMPLOYED ON PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS OF SAID VILLAGE

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works." approved June 26, 1941, as amended, (820 ILCS 130/1-12); and,

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Carol Stream employed in performing construction or public works for said Village of Carol Stream.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of this Village is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in DuPage County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June of the current year, a copy

of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the Village of Carol Stream. The definition of any terms appearing in this ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of this Village to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Village this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The Village Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area that the determination of prevailing wages has been made or by posting on the Village website <a href="www.carolstream.org">www.carolstream.org</a> a notice

of its determination with a hyperlink to the prevailing wage schedule for DuPage County that is published on the official website of the Illinois Department of Labor.

Such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of the Village of Carol Stream.

SECTION 7: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

### **Explanations DUPAGE COUNTY**

IRON WORKERS AND FENCE ERECTOR (WEST) - West of Route 53.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

#### **EXPLANATION OF CLASSES**

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

TRAFFIC SAFETY - work associated with barricades, horses and drums used to reduce lane usage on highway work, the installation and removal of temporary lane markings, and the installation and removal of temporary road signs.

#### **CERAMIC TILE FINISHER**

The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

#### LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.


