Assistant Village Attorney Milluzzi welcomed the new Police Department employees.

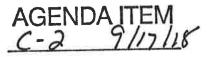
Village Manager Breinig stated the Village has begun enforcing the massage parlor ordinance and licensing requirements. Compliance checks will start in October.

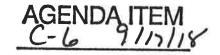

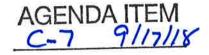

On May 19, 2014, a contract with GovTempsUSA was approved for an Office Manager in the Village Manager's Office. The arrangement was in lieu of a Village employee with benefits (pension and health insurance). This enabled the Village to obtain the services of an extremely knowledgeable professional while saving money. This arrangement continues to provide high quality services at the savings envisioned.

The initial agreement was for the period May 7, 2014 through December 31, 2014. The arrangement was subsequently extended for one-year terms on January 1, 2015, January 1, 2016, January 1, 2017 and January 1, 2018.

Attached for your review and consideration, you will find Exhibits A and B to the Agreement with GovTempsUSA. Exhibit A has been revised to reflect a 2.5% increase in the hourly rate. The annual cost of \$80,059.20 continues to compare favorably with the cost of a full-time employee with benefits. The FY 2019-20 budget will incorporate the new rate.

Staff recommends approval of the revisions to the Agreement with GovTempsUSA for the period January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 at a cost of \$80,059.20, as articulated in Exhibit A. All other terms of the Agreement approved May 19, 2014 remain unchanged.

- 2. To protect, indemnify, hold and save harmless and defend the "Second Party" against any and all claims, costs causes, actions and expenses, including but not limited to attorney's fees incurred by reason of a lawsuit or claim for compensation arising in favor of any person, including the employees or officers or independent contractors or subcontractors of the first and second parties, on account of personal injuries or death, or damages to property occurring, growing out of, incident to, or resulting directly or indirectly from the performance by the "First Party" hereunder, whether such loss, damage, injury or liability is contributed to by the negligence of the "Second Party" whether latent or patent, or from other causes whatsoever, except that the "First Party" shall have no liability or damages or the costs incident thereto caused by the sole negligence of the "Second Party".
- 3. To keep in force, to the satisfaction of the "Second Party", at all times during the performance of the work referred to above, Commercial General Liability Insurance and Automobile Liability Insurance with Bodily Injury limits of not less than \$1,000,000 and Property Damage Insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000. The "First Party" agrees that at any time upon the demand of the "Second Party" proof of such insurance coverage as will be submitted to the "Second Party". There shall be no additional charge for said insurance to the "Second Party".
- 4. To furnish any affidavit or certificate, in connection with the work covered by this agreement as provided by law.

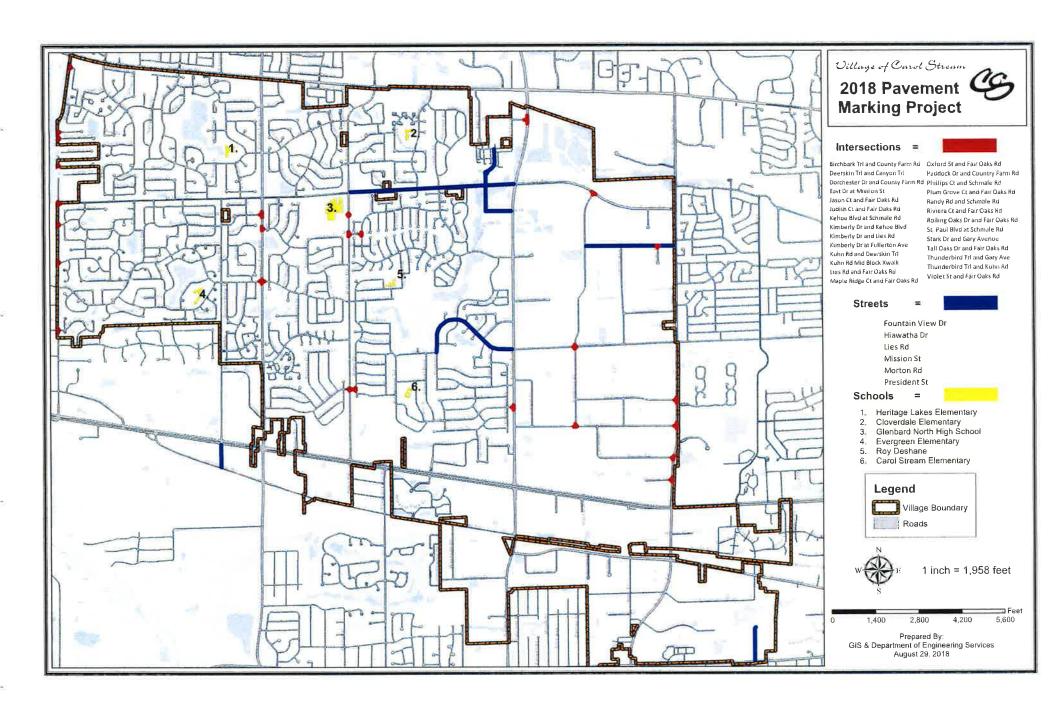

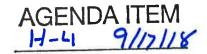

Amendment #1 to the Engineering Services Agreement for the Lies Road

LAFO Project from Gary Avenue to Schmale Road

In February of this year, the Village Board awarded a design contract to TranSystems Corporation for the referenced project in the amount of \$39,010. During the design process, it was noted that trucks rode over the curbs due to the intersection constraints. We then decided to widen the intersections of Kimberly Drive and Carol Court with Lies Road to better accommodate semitrailers.

This change in scope led to additional design work including; additional surveying at the intersections, coordination with utility companies located behind the curb, revising plans and document to be submitted to IDOT for approval, and environmental testing to meet Clean Construction Demolition Debris (CCDD) regulations for soils removed behind the curb for roadway widening. The total fee for this additional work is \$7,701 raising the total contract to \$46,711.00.

Engineering staff has reviewed the attached Amendment Agreement and recommend it be approved in the amount of \$7,701 to TranSystems Corporation for the Lies Road LAFO Project. The new contract total of \$46,711 remains within the budget of \$84,000.00.

AMENDMENT SCOPE OF ENGINEERING SERVICES

The following scope items were added to the project:

CE Group 1

Initially, this project was intended to be processed as a Local Agency Functional Overlay, following corresponding guidelines. The Village requested widening the radii on the southwest and southeast corners of Lies Road and Kimberly Drive and the southwest corner of Lies Road and Carol Court. This additional work was not eligible under LAFO guidelines and Phase 1 needed to be elevated to a CE Group 1 with no report (BLR 19100). The LAFO form submitted to IDOT was disregarded and the CE I was prepared and submitted. (8 hours)

Radii Widening Design

A design vehicle was selected and modeled through each of the Lies Road intersections at Kimberly Drive and Carol Court with Autoturn. This modeling identified the path swept by the design vehicle, establishing the widening limits at the southwest and southeast corners of Lies Road and Kimberly Drive and the southwest corner of Lies Road and Carol Court. Design included curb and gutter radii, proposed pavement elevations, proposed pavement design and proposed drainage structures. (44 hours)

Utility Coordination

The original LAFO project did not require coordination with the utility companies. Excavation for the intersection widening posed potential conflicts with underground utilities, and coordination became required to determine if relocation of utilities was necessary. (8 hours)

Recommendation to Reject All Bids, Waive Competitive Bidding and Award a Contract

for Sidewalk Saw-cutting Services - Safety Services and Assessment

The current budget includes funding for sidewalk maintenance to remove tripping hazards identified in the annual sidewalk inspection program. The inspection program identified 483 locations where saw-cutting will remove the hazard. There is \$22,500 remaining in the sidewalk repair budget for this work in the current fiscal year.

Due to the significant number of locations requiring repair and unit prices obtained in late fiscal year for this type of work, staff solicited bids to both complete the entire project and the total number of squares which could be completed if the Village decided to not exceed the specific budgeted amount.

A bid process was recently held and three bids were received and opened on September 10, 2018, at the Public Works Center, with the following results:

Two of the bids submitted were found to be non-responsive:

- Safe Step failed to submit a cost to complete the entire project (based on their unit price to complete 340 locations they would not have been the low bidder);
- Safety Services & Assessment inadvertently utilized the bid form from the prior year's project. However, their bid did reflect the costs proposed for completing the work as detailed in the specifications in this year's bid packet. Furthermore, the bidder submitted at staff's request a written statement (attached) that they did use the wrong form but that the costs submitted in fact reflect their intended bid for the work as specified.

The only responsive bid, submitted by Hard Rock in the amount of \$32,119.50, exceeds the amount staff recommends paying for this work.

Options available at this time include:

- 1. Award the contract to low bidder Hard Rock in the amount of \$32,119.50 to complete all sidewalk locations (or in the amount of \$22,500, wherein 338 of the 483 locations will be addressed);
- 2. Reject all bids and re-bid the project;
- 3. Reject all bids, waive competitive bidding (as allowed in Village Code Section 5-8-3(B)), and award a contract to Safety Services & Assessment in the amount of \$28,675 to complete all sidewalk locations (or in the amount of \$22,500, wherein 388 of the 483 locations will be addressed)

Staff recommends Option 3 (reject all bids, waive competitive bidding and award a contract to Safety Services & Assessment) in the amount of \$28,675. While this amount exceeds the remaining budgeted amount for this work, staff recommends completing remediation of all of the identified trip hazards this fiscal year. We have identified additional available funds within the Street Maintenance budget¹ which could be re-directed to make up the shortfall on this project.

Safety Services & Assessment has successfully completed similar projects of this scope and size and provided satisfactory references from several area municipalities. In addition, earlier this year this company provided a satisfactory demonstration of their equipment, work processes and final product for the Carol Stream Public Works Department.

Staff recommends that the Mayor and Board approve a Motion rejecting all bids, waive competitive bidding and awarding a contract to Safety Services & Assessment for Sidewalk Saw-cutting Services in the amount of \$28,675, pursuant to the provisions of Section 5-8-3(B) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

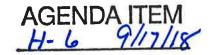

First Amendment to the Wayne Township Annexation Agreement - 27W031

North Avenue

The Wayne Township government office property at 27W031 North Avenue was annexed to Carol Stream in 2016. With annexation of the property, the Village Board also granted various zoning approvals for a planned building addition and site improvements.

The Township subsequently revised its plans for the building addition and site improvements. The revised plans were reviewed by the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PC/ZBA) in July. The PC/ZBA recommended approval of all of the amended zoning approvals, with the exception of the Township's request not to install curbed landscape islands at both ends of the row of parking near the north property line.

Because the revised building addition and site improvement plans differ from the plans attached to the original annexation agreement, an amendment to the annexation agreement is necessary. At the Village Board meeting on August 20, 2018, the Village Board conducted the public hearing for the amendment to the annexation agreement, and no comments from the public were received. Also at that meeting, the Board directed that curbed landscape need not be installed at the ends of the front row of parking, and that all work associated with the building additions and site improvements must be completed by June 1, 2020. The amendment to the annexation agreement has been revised to reflect that direction, and the Wayne Township Board approved the amendment at its meeting on September 6, 2018.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Village Board approve the attached ordinance authorizing the execution of the first amendment to the annexation agreement with Wayne Township. If the Village Board concurs, they should adopt the ordinance.

PC/ZBA Case 18-0026, Wayne Township – 27W031 North Avenue, Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Government Office and Related Uses in the R-1 District, Zoning

Code Variations, Sign Code Variation, and North Avenue Corridor Review

Randy Ramey, Wayne Township Supervisor, requests approval of an Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Government Office and Related Uses; Zoning Code Variations to reduce the parking lot greenspace from 10% to 1.5%, to not install curbed landscaped parking lot islands at the ends of the front parking row along North Avenue, and to reduce the point value of landscape material within the parking greenspace areas; a Sign Code Variation to allow a ground sign to be closer than five feet to the North Avenue property line; and North Avenue Corridor Review for the Township property at 27W031 North Avenue. As discussed at the August 20th Village Board meeting, Wayne Township proposes building additions at the southeast and northwest corners of the building, and parking lot and landscaped parking lot island near the northwest corner of the building, and installation of plant material along the North Avenue property frontage.

Zoning Code Variations related to landscaping on the Township property were approved in 2016 when the property was annexed into the Village, but new variations need to be granted with the proposed modifications. While additional landscaped parking lot islands and plant material is proposed to be installed on the property, there will still be a deficit of greenspace and landscape material per the requirements of the Zoning Code, and specifically the North Avenue Corridor regulations. However, given the direction provided in the Zoning Code that properties developed prior to the adoption of the North Avenue Corridor regulations should be considered unique and treated with flexibility (and in the case of the Wayne Township property, developed under DuPage County codes and ordinance prior to annexation into the Village), the requested variations are reasonable.

Discussion was held at the July 23rd Plan Commission meeting regarding the inclusion of curbed landscaped islands at either end of the front parking row along North Avenue, and the applicant requested to provide painted islands instead at the August 20th Village Board meeting. The Village Board concurred with the applicant's request. In addition, it should be noted that conditions of approval in the Ordinance for the Special Use amendment and Variations include an extended construction completion date of June 1, 2020.

The staff report presenting the requests, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PC/ZBA) packet on July 20, 2018. At its meeting on July 23, 2018, by a vote of 5-1, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Special Use Amendment and Zoning Code Variations to reduce parking lot greenspace and reduce the point value of landscape material within the parking lot greenspace areas. The PC/ZBA had a split vote of 3-3 regarding the Zoning Code Variation to install curbed landscaped parking lot islands at the ends of the front parking row along North Avenue, but as stated, the Village Board provided direction to not require curbed landscaped islands and grant a variation in this case. The PC/ZBA also approved the Sign Code Variation by a vote of 4-2 and the North Avenue Corridor Review by a vote of 5-1.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018- -

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR A GOVERNMENT OFFICE AND RELATED USES IN THE R-1 DISTRICT AND ZONING CODE VARIATIONS (WAYNE TOWNSHIP, 27W031 NORTH AVENUE)

WHEREAS, Randy Ramey, on behalf of Wayne Township, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, has petitioned the Village of Carol Stream for an Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Government Office and Related Uses in the R-1 District, as provided in Section 16-8-2(C)(2)(g) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, a Variation to reduce parking lot greenspace from 10% to 1.5% as provided in Section 16-5-6(L)(3)(a) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, a Variation to not install curbed landscaped parking lot islands at the ends of the front parking row along North Avenue as provided in Section 16-5-6(L)(3)(b) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, and a Variation to reduce the point value of landscape material within the parking lot greenspace areas as provided in Section 16-5-6 (M)(3)(b) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, on the property legally described in Section 3 herein and commonly known as 27W031 North Avenue, West Chicago, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 16-15-6 and 16-15-8 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on the above petition on July 23, 2018, following proper legal notice of said public hearing, after which the Commission recommended to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village that the Special Use Amendment and Variations be approved; and

WHEREAS, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its Findings and Recommendations regarding the Special Use Amendment and the Variations with the Mayor and Board of Trustees, and the Mayor and Board of Trustees have duly considered said Findings and Recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, after examining the Petition for a Special Use Amendment for a Government Office and Related Uses, and the Findings and Recommendations of the Combined Plan Commission / Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined and find that the requested Special Use Amendment:

- 1. Is deemed necessary for the public convenience at the location. Wayne Township provides local government services to Township residents, which serves the public convenience, and will be able to expand services with the proposed building additions.
- 2. Will not be unreasonably detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare. The continued use of the property for local government services will not be unreasonably detrimental to or endanger the public

health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare, and has been designed in a safe and efficient manner.

- 3. Will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood. The continued use of the property for local government services should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity, nor substantially diminish or impair property values in the neighborhood.
- 4. Will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding property for uses permitted in the district. In general, surrounding properties are already developed, and the existing government office use and future expansion will not impede the further improvement or redevelopment of adjacent properties.
- 5. Will provide adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other important and necessary community facilities. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other public improvements are already in place.
- 6. Will conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as the Village Board may in each instance modify such regulations. The project is expected to conform to all applicable codes and requirements.

SECTION 2:

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village, after examining the Petition for Variations to reduce parking lot greenspace, to not install curbed landscaped parking lot islands at the ends of the front parking row along North Avenue, and to reduce the point value of landscape material within the parking lot greenspace areas, and the Findings and Recommendations of the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined and find that, with respect to the requested Variations:

- 1. That the property in question, other than a single-family residential lot, cannot yield a reasonable return if permitted to be used only under the conditions allowed by the regulations governing the district in which it is located. As directed by the North Avenue Corridor regulations, properties that were developed prior to the adoption of the Corridor regulations are considered unique, and flexibility is to be used in the granting of variations. The Township is proposing to make attractive improvements to the building, parking lot and landscaping, but due largely to the existing developed condition of the property, they are not able to comply with specific standards.
- 2. The plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances. The condition of the property having been developed prior to the adoption of the North Avenue Corridor regulations is unique, as identified by the Zoning Code.

- 3. The variations, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality. The property is already developed. The improvements that are planned will only enhance the character of the area.
- 4. That the plight of the owner is due to the failure of a previous owner of the property in question to follow then-applicable ordinances or regulations, and where the benefit to health, safety or appearance to be derived from correcting the nonconformity would not justify the cost or difficulty of the correction. The evidence must show that the current owner had no role in the creation of the nonconformity. The plight of the owner is due largely to the existing developed condition of the property, which occurred under different codes and standards.
- 5. That the particular physical surroundings, shape, or topographical conditions of the specific property involved bring a particular hardship upon the owner as distinguished from a mere inconvenience. The hardship relates to the fact that the property was developed under different codes and standards than those under which the property is not being evaluated.
- 6. The conditions upon which the petition for the variation is based would not be applicable generally to other property within the same district. The conditions for the requested variations are not generally applicable to property within the same district, but may be present on developed, unincorporated properties that are annexed into the Village.
- 7. The granting of the variation will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to the other property or improvements in the neighborhood in which the property is located. Wayne Township is proposing upgrades and improvements to the building and property that would benefit, and not be detrimental to, the public welfare and other property within the general vicinity.

SECTION 3:

The Special Use Amendment and Variations, as set forth in the above recitals, are hereby approved and granted to Wayne Township, subject to the conditions set forth in Section 4, upon the real estate commonly known as 27W031 North Avenue, Carol Stream, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

LOT 1 (EXCEPT THE SOUTH 50 FEET OF THE WEST 100 FEET) IN JOHN ROGERS' SUBDIVISION OF PART OF LOT 6 OF PLAT OF EDWARD W. PLANE ESTATE IN SECTION 36, TOWNSHIP 40 NORTH, RANGE 9 EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, AND IN SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 40 NORTH, RANGE 10 EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF RECORDED MARCH 13, 1961 AS DOCUMENT 999466, IN DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

SECTION 4:

The approval of the Special Use Amendment and Variations granted in Sections 1 and 2 herein are subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That all terms and conditions of Ordinance No. 2016-01-04 for Wayne Township not specifically revised herein shall be hereby reaffirmed by reference;
- 2. That all improvements, including but limited to the building additions, parking lot modifications, and landscaping, must be built, installed, and maintained in accordance with the attached plans and exhibits, and shall be completed no later than June 1, 2020;
- 3. That all parking lot islands shall be curbed, excluding islands on either end of the front parking row along North Avenue;
- 4. That the landscape materials must be installed as shown on the attached landscape plan, with dead or dying materials being replaced in accordance with the approved plan on an annual basis;
- 5. That parking spaces must be striped in accordance with the Village's looped striping detail; and
- 6. That property shall be operated and maintained in accordance with all applicable state, county and village codes and requirements.

SECTION 5:

The Special Use Amendment and Variations are hereby approved and granted as set forth in the following plans and exhibits:

- 1. Site Plan (Exhibit A, dated July 9, 2018), prepared by Morris Engineering, Inc., 515 Warrenville Road, Lisle, Illinois, 60532.

SECTION 6:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form, provided, however, that this Ordinance is executed by the owners or such other party in interest, consenting to and agreeing to be bound by all of the terms and conditions contained within this Ordinance. Such execution and delivery to the Village shall take place within sixty (60) days after the passage and approval of this Ordinance or within such extension of time as may be granted in the discretion of the corporate authorities, by motion.

SECTION 7:

The failure of the owner or other party in interest, or a subsequent owner or other party in interest, to strictly comply with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance, after execution of this Ordinance, shall subject the owner or party in interest to the penalties set forth in Section 16-17-7 A and B of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, and/or termination of the special use permit after notice and public hearing in accordance with the procedures required by the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

The proposed term for the successor agreement is October 1, 2018 until terminated by either the employer (Village) or employee (myself). Compensation and terms of the agreement are substantially similar to those of the current Village Manager agreement.

I am honored and privileged to have been selected as Carol Stream's next Village Manager and I look forward to serving the Mayor, Village Board, staff and community as its new Village Manager. I, along with staff, look forward to working with you on the many challenges that lie ahead.

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 17th day of September, 2018, by and between the Village of Carol Stream, an Illinois municipal corporation (hereinafter called "Employer"), and Robert J. Mellor, (hereinafter called "Employee"), both parties agreeing as follows:

WHEREAS, the Employer desires to employ the services of the Employee as a Village Administrator of the Village of Carol Stream, which position may also be referred to as the Village Manager; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village, (hereinafter called "Board"), to provide certain benefits, establish certain conditions of employment and to set working conditions of the Employee; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board to secure and retain the services of the Employee and to provide inducement for him to remain in such employment; and

WHEREAS, the Employee desires to enter into a contractual arrangement with the Village wherein he shall serve as Village Manager for a period including the term of the current Mayor/Village President of the Village of Carol Stream, subject to his ability to properly perform the duties of Village Manager and to the conditions of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to provide a system whereby stability can be achieved if a need for a transition period should occur.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENANTS HEREIN CONTAINED, THE PARTIES AGREE, as follows:

- 1. <u>Duties</u>: The Employer hereby agrees to employ the Employee as Village Manager of the Village of Carol Stream in accordance with all of the provisions of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, which relate to the performance of that office. The Village Manager shall devote his full-time efforts to the performance of the duties of the position.
- 2. **Term**: The term of this Agreement shall for an indefinite term until terminated by either Employer or Employee as provided in this Agreement. The Employee may terminate the contract by giving a minimum of sixty (60) days written notice to the Mayor. All compensation provided for in this Agreement, except for accrued benefits, including severance pay, shall cease upon the last day of the Employee's performance of full-time duties for the

Village in the event that the termination of the contract shall be exercised by the Employee. This Agreement is intended to establish contractual rights but not tenure or property rights.

3. Severance Pay: The Mayor after receiving a majority vote of the Board may terminate this Agreement during its term without the requirement of stating any reason for such termination. Provided, however, in the event the Employer elects this method of terminating the Agreement or in the event that the Employee resigns, pursuant to a request of the Employer, Employee shall receive all salary and earned benefits accrued up to the date of termination and shall receive severance pay equal to five (5) months of his then-current salary and payment of all earned and accrued leaves and benefits. The Employee shall have the option of taking such severance pay in a lump sum or remaining on the Village payroll register and having the severance pay paid him on regular Village pay dates. In the event the Employee shall elect the latter option, he shall not be considered an employee for the calculation of earned benefits. Employer agrees to allow Employee to remain in the Village group health, life and dental insurance program and, with the Employer paying the full premiums for his then current coverages for five (5) months. Employee may remain in the insurance programs thereafter under the terms and conditions and paying the premiums in accordance with State or Federal Law.

The Board, by a majority vote, may also terminate this Agreement for just cause after affording Employee a hearing. In the event Employee is terminated for just cause, then, in that event, the Employer shall have no obligation to pay the Employee severance or continuing severance. Just cause is defined as (1) conviction of a felony or crime of moral turpitude, or (2) conviction of a crime relating to the performance of the job, or (3) is found to have engaged in sexual harassment or sexual discrimination, or (4) is found to have violated of any terms of this Agreement, or (4) is found to have committed any act of dishonesty or fraud with respect to the Village or a violation of the Village's personnel regulations, which would justify dismissal.

- 4. **Salary**: The salary beginning October 1, 2018, shall be \$203,550. The salary for following years beginning May 1, 2019, shall be at least at the level established for the prior year, plus a general wage adjustment granted to all other non-contract employees for the fiscal year. In addition, Employee shall be eligible to receive a performance increase on the same basis as for executive employees based upon a performance evaluation.
- 5. In addition to the salary provided in paragraph 4 of the Employment Agreement, and increases in that salary computed in accordance with Paragraph 4, the Employer shall, effective with the compensation applicable to May, 2019, and for the remaining term of this Agreement, pay as additional deferred compensation to the Employee the amount of one percent (1%) of the base salary into a qualifying deferred compensation plan selected by the Employee and approved by the Employer. The plan offered by the International City Managers Association shall be an automatically approved plan.
- 6. **Employee Evaluation**: The Board may review and evaluate the performance of the Manager as the Board determines necessary. This review and evaluation may focus upon specific criteria developed jointly by the

Employee and the Board. Further, the Mayor shall, at the request of the Manager, provide him with a summary of the findings of the board, which, at his request, shall be in writing, and provide an adequate opportunity for the Employee to discuss his/her evaluation with the Board. This review shall take place in the last quarter of each fiscal year and the Employee shall annually notify the Mayor and Board of this obligation.

- 7. **Hours of Work:** It is recognized that the Employee must devote a great deal of time outside the normal office hours to the business of the Employer and to that end, the Employee will be allowed to take reasonable administrative time off as he shall deem appropriate during said normal office hours.
- 8. Automobile: Employee's duties require that he shall have the exclusive use at all times during his employment with the Employer of an automobile provided to him by the Employer. The automobile may be used for business and personal purposes and the Employer shall be responsible for paying for liability, property damage and comprehensive insurance and for the purchase, operation, maintenance, repair and regular replacement of said automobile. The Village shall provide gasoline for local personal purposes. As an option, Employee may choose to accept a \$400 per month car allowance paid by Employer to Employee in lieu of providing an automobile. In such event, the Employee agrees to utilize his personal car for business purposes. If such personal car is unavailable due to repair, Employee may use another Village vehicle.
- 9. <u>Vacation, Sick Leave and Personal Leave</u>: The Employee shall be entitled to vacation, personal day, holiday, bereavement, sick leave and other leave benefits as are provided to other senior executive exempt personnel.
- 10. Health, Dental and Life Insurance: The Employer shall provide for the Employee, at the full expense of the Employer, life insurance in the amount of two (2) times the Employee's annual salary. Provided, however, that, in the event that life insurance premiums on the Employee are at least twice the amount of insurance premiums previously paid, the Employer shall have the option of paying twice the amount of the prior premium to the Employee as a cash payment to substitute for the required life insurance coverage. The Employer shall provide for the Employee and his dependents such other insurance including group health and dental insurance, as is currently being provided and generally provided to the other senior exempt employees of the Village, including premium payment, deductible and copayment amounts generally applicable to employees hired prior to May 1, 1993.
- 11. <u>Dues and Subscriptions</u>: The Employer agrees to budget and to pay for the reasonable professional dues and subscription of the Employee necessary for his participation in national, regional, State and local associations and organizations desirable for his professional participation, growth and advancement and for the good of the Employer.
- 12. **Professional Development**: Employer hereby agrees to budget for and to pay the reasonable travel and subsistence expenses of the Employee for professional and official travel, meetings and occasions adequate for Employee's professional development and to adequately pursue necessary official and other functions of the Employer, including, but not limited to the annual Conference of the International City/County Management

Association, the State League of Municipalities and such other national, regional, State and local governmental groups and committees thereof which Employee serves as a member. Employer also agrees to budget and pay for the travel and subsistence expenses of Employee for short courses, institutes and seminars that are necessary for his professional development and for the good of the Employer.

- 13. Other Benefits: In addition to the benefits mentioned in this Agreement, the Employee shall also be entitled to any other benefits now in force or added later to those benefits generally granted senior executive exempt employees of the Village.
- 14. **Indemnification**: Employer agrees to indemnify and defend the Employee in the manner required by State law and to pay the full cost of any fidelity or other bond required of the Employee.
- 15. **No Reduction of Benefits**: Employer shall not at any time during the term of this Agreement reduce the salary, compensation or other financial benefits of the Employee except to the degree such a reduction similarly affects all senior executive exempt employees.
- 16. **Only Agreement:** This Agreement shall reflect all of the negotiations of the parties and shall supercede all other earlier agreements or promises.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Employer has caused this Agreement to be signed and executed on its behalf by the Mayor and duly attested by its Village Clerk and the Employee has signed and executed this Agreement by adding his name hereto.
