Jacobs Engineering has recently installed Nick Lenzi to fill the vacant position of Project Manager at the WRC. Mr. Lenzi has met with staff to discuss his qualifications and to review the expectations and priorities of the Village regarding operation of the treatment facility.

Mr. Lenzi has previously spent time at the WRC both as an Intern and while working for Jacobs Engineering at the West Chicago plant. He is a State of Illinois Class 1 operator, holds a collection systems operator license, and has significant training and experience in asset and data management, and financial systems

### **PROCLAMATION**

### Recognizing the Accomplishments of the Carolshire Commons Condominiums Association Board

WHEREAS, 45 representatives from Carolshire Commons Condominiums attended the February 16, 2016, Village Board meeting to express concerns about their Association Board, property management activities, and the overall living conditions at Carolshire Commons Condominiums; and

WHEREAS, in April of 2016, Carolshire Commons Condominium unit owners voted to remove the Carolshire Commons Condominiums Association Board, and elected a new Association Board; and

WHEREAS, in its first several months, the new Association Board hired a professional management company, undertook an assessment of bank accounts and financial records, and established open lines of communication with the Village regarding the court-ordered Consent Decree that was the result of the 2013 lawsuit filed by the Village against the previous Association Board; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, the Association Board secured a construction loan to enable Property Maintenance Code violation abatement work to proceed as required under the Consent Decree; and

WHEREAS, by the summer of 2018, reconstruction of the entire parking lot was complete and architectural canopies were added to the buildings; and

WHEREAS, in October 2018, Village inspectors confirmed that all 665 Property Maintenance Code violations required to be addressed under the Consent Decree were abated; and

WHEREAS, at the end of 2018, the Police Department reported that calls for service to Carolshire, and major crimes reported at Carolshire, dropped by approximately 50% compared to 2013; and

WHEREAS, having satisfied the requirements of the Consent Decree, the Mayor and Trustees directed that the Consent Decree be vacated, and on January 3, 2019, the Consent Decree was vacated in DuPage County Court; and

WHEREAS, the hard work and determination of the Association Board and unit owners have brought about meaningful improvements to the living conditions, quality of life and safety at Carolshire Commons Condominiums.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, that the Carolshire Commons Condominiums Association Board is hereby recognized for its efforts in developing a positive relationship with the Village, for improving the quality of life for residents, and for becoming a good neighbor and asset to the Village of Carol Stream.

Contract Accounts Clerk Position – GovTemps USA

Beginning in July of 2017, the Finance Department budget included the services of a full-time contract position staffed through GovTemps USA to supplement our workforce primarily due to ongoing new initiatives related to the Water Loss Taskforce and the new multi-year AMR meter change-out program. This position was previously staffed by Paulina Gajowniczek who was recently hired by the Village into the position of Financial Analyst. Paulina has also assumed the duties of accounts payable and will replace Sue Sullivan who will retire on January 18<sup>th</sup>.

To ensure no disruption to the AMR replacement program, we asked GovTemps to provide available interested candidates to staff the vacant position. Accounting Manager Barb Wydra and myself interviewed Alyssa Retske on January 8. We found Ms. Retske's background and skill set to be a good match for the position and recommend she fill the current contract vacancy.

The attached contract has a term of one year and conforms with similar agreements executed with GovTemps over the past several years. The contract rate of \$1,120 per week is included within the current year budget and is also consistent with the pay scale for existing Accounts Clerk positions within the Finance Department.

Should you concur with this recommendation, this item may be placed on the Village Board's January 22, 2019 meeting agenda for further consideration and action.

#### EMPLOYEE LEASING AGREEMENT

THIS EMPLOYEE LEASING AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made this 23rd day of January 2019 ("Effective Date") by and between GOVTEMPSUSA, LLC, an Illinois limited liability company ("GovTemps"), and Village of Carol Stream (the "Municipality") (GovTemps and the Municipality may be referred to herein individually as "Party" and collectively as the "Parties").

#### RECITALS

The Municipality desires to lease certain employees of GovTemps to assist the Municipality in its operations and GovTemps desires to lease certain of its employees to the Municipality on the terms and conditions contained herein.

#### **AGREEMENT**

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth below, and other good and valuable considerations, the receipt and sufficiency of which are mutually acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

### SECTION 1 SCOPE OF AGREEMENT

Section 1.01. Worksite Employee. The Municipality hereby agrees to engage the services of GovTemps to provide, and GovTemps hereby agrees to supply to the Municipality, the personnel fully identified on Exhibit A hereto, hereinafter the "Worksite Employee." Exhibit A to this Agreement shall further identify the employment position and/or assignment ("Assignment") the Worksite Employee shall fill at the Municipality and shall further identify the base compensation for each Worksite Employee, as of the effective date of this Agreement. The Parties agree that Exhibit A shall establish the framework by which GovTemps shall hire and supply the Worksite Employee and shall not represent a binding obligation that the Municipality accept placement for any Worksite Employee identified on Exhibit A. The Municipality shall provide written direction to GovTemps as to the specific need and details for each Worksite Employee at any time during the term of this Agreement. Exhibit A may be amended from time to time by a replacement Exhibit A signed by both GovTemps and the GovTemps shall have the authority to assign and/or remove the Worksite Employee, provided, however, that the Municipality may request, in writing, at the sole discretion of the Municipality, that GovTemps remove the Worksite Employee and such request shall not be withheld by GovTemps. The Parties hereto understand and acknowledge that the Worksite Employee shall be subject to the Municipality's day-to-day supervision.

Section 1.02. Independent Contractor. GovTemps and Worksite Employee are and shall remain independent contractors, and not employees, agents, partners of, or joint venturers with, the Municipality. The Worksite Employee shall remain the employee of GovTemps at all times during the term of this Agreement. GovTemps shall have no authority to bind the Municipality to any commitment, contract, agreement or other obligation without the Municipality's express written consent.

### SECTION 2 SERVICES AND OBLIGATIONS OF GOVTEMPS AND MUNICIPALITY

- Section 2.01. Payment of Wages. GovTemps shall timely pay the wages and related payroll taxes of the Worksite Employee from GovTemps's own account in accordance with federal and Illinois law and GovTemps's standard payroll practices. GovTemps shall withhold from such wages all applicable taxes and other deductions elected by the Worksite Employee. GovTemps shall timely forward all deductions to the appropriate recipient as required by law. The Municipality hereby acknowledges that GovTemps may engage a financial entity to maintain its financing and record keeping services, which may include the payment of wages and related payroll taxes in accordance with this Section 2.01. The Municipality agrees to cooperate with any such financial entity to ensure timely payment of (i) wages and related payroll taxes pursuant to this Section 2.01, and (ii) Fees pursuant to Section 3.03.
- **Section 2.02.** Workers' Compensation. To the extent required by applicable law, GovTemps shall maintain and administer workers' compensation, safety and health programs. GovTemps shall maintain in effect workers' compensation coverage covering all Worksite Employee and complete and file all required workers' compensation forms and reports.
- Section 2.03. Employee Benefits. GovTemps shall provide to Worksite Employee those employee benefits fully identified on Exhibit B hereto. GovTemps may amend or terminate any of its employee benefit plans according to their terms. All employee benefits, including severance benefits for Worksite Employee will be included in Fees payable to GovTemps under Section 3.01 of this Agreement. At no time shall the Municipality City be required to pay any amount in addition to the fees set forth in Section 3.01 and Exhibit A.
- Section 2.04. Vacation, Sick and Personal Leave. The Worksite Employee shall not be entitled to any paid leave during his or her placement for employment with the Municipality. Should the Worksite Employee be absent from work for whatever reason, the Municipality notify GovTemps within forty-eight (48) hours of the absence, and GovTemps shall deduct the absence from the fees due pursuant to Section 3.01, provided that if an absence injury occurs on a Friday or weekend, said absence shall be reported on the next business day.
- Section 2.05. Maintenance and Retention of Payroll and Benefit Records. GovTemps shall maintain complete records of all wages and benefits paid and personnel actions taken by GovTemps in connection with any of the Worksite Employee, shall retain control of such records at such GovTemps location as shall be determined solely by GovTemps, and shall make such records available as required by applicable federal, state or local laws.
- **Section 2.06. Other Obligations of GovTemps**. GovTemps shall be responsible for compliance with any federal, state and local law that may apply to its Worksite Employee(s).
- Section 2.07. Direction and Control. The Parties agree and acknowledge that the Municipality has the right of direction and control over the Worksite Employee, including matters of discipline, excluding removal or reassignment, as provided for by Section 1.01. The Worksite Employee shall be supervised, directly and indirectly, and exclusively by the Municipality's supervisory and managerial employees.

Section 2.08. Obligations of the Municipality. As part of the employee leasing relationship, the Municipality hereby covenants, agrees and acknowledges:

- (a) The Municipality shall comply with OSHA and all other health and safety laws, regulations, ordinances, directives, and rules applicable to the Worksite Employee or to his or her place of work;
- (b) With respect to the Worksite Employees, the Municipality shall comply with all applicable employment-related laws and regulations, including and, without limitation, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, (Title VII), the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), the Age Discrimination in Employment Act (ADEA), the Equal Pay Act of 1963, the Civil Rights Acts of 1866 and 1871 (42 U.S.C. § 1981), the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993, the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, the National Labor Relations Act, the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, the Illinois State Constitution, the Illinois Human Rights Act, and any other federal, state or local law, statute, ordinance, order, regulation, policy or decision regulating wages and the payment of wages by GovTemps, prohibiting employment discrimination or otherwise establishing or relating to rights of employees;
- (c) The Municipality shall retain the right to exert sufficient direction and control over the Worksite Employee as is necessary to conduct the Municipality's business and operations, without which the Municipality would be unable to conduct its business, operation or comply with any applicable licensure, regulatory or statutory requirements;
- (d) The Municipality shall, at its sole discretion, have the right to have the Worksite Employee removed at any time and for any reason, in accordance with Section 1.01;
- (e) The Municipality agrees that the Municipality shall pay no wages, salaries or other forms of direct or indirect compensation, including employee benefits, to Worksite Employee and that Worksite Employee shall receive all direct or indirect compensation including employee benefits from GovTemps;
- (f) The Municipality shall report to GovTemps any injury to any Worksite Employee of which it has knowledge within forty-eight (48) hours of acquiring such knowledge, provided if an injury occurs on a Friday, weekend or holiday, said injury shall be reported on the next business day. If a Worksite Employee is injured in the course of performing services for the Municipality, the Municipality and GovTemps shall follow the procedures and practices regarding injury claims and reporting, as determined by GovTemps. Upon receipt of notification from GovTemps or its insurance carrier that an injured Worksite Employee is able to return to work and perform "light duty," the Municipality may, but shall not be required, to make available an appropriate light duty work assignment for such Worksite Employee, but only if such light duty assignment is available and feasible; and
- (g) The Municipality shall report all on-the-job illnesses, accidents and injuries of the Worksite Employee to GovTemps within forty-eight (48) hours following notification of said injury by employee or employee's representative, provided if an illness, accident or injury occurs on a Friday, weekend or holiday, said illness, accident or injury shall be reported on the next business day.

### SECTION 3 FEES PAYABLE TO GOVTEMPS

Section 3.01. Fees. The Municipality hereby agrees to pay GovTemps fees for the services provided under this Agreement in the form of the base compensation as identified by the parameters set forth on Exhibit A and specifically agreed to at the time the Worksite Employee is placed with the Municipality. Fees shall not become due until the Worksite Employee is placed with the Municipality and actually begins working. Fees shall be paid for the actual days worked by the Worksite Employee, provided the Municipality reports said absence in accordance with Section 2.04, and any fees due shall be reduced to account for any reported absences of the Worksite Employee.

Section 3.02. Increase in Fees. There shall be no increase in fees during the term of this Agreement. Provided, however, should the Municipality decide to increase the base compensation as provided for and identified on **Exhibit A**, the fee shall be adjusted as set forth in Section 3.01

Section 3.03. Payment Method. Following the close of each month during the term of this Agreement, GovTemps shall provide the Municipality a written invoice for the fees owed by the Municipality pursuant to this Agreement for the prior month. Within thirty (30) days following receipt of such invoice, the Municipality shall pay all invoiced amounts by check, wire transfer or electronic funds transfer to GovTemps to an account or lockbox as designated on the invoice.

### SECTION 4 INSURANCE

Section 4.01. General and Professional Liability Insurance. The Municipality shall maintain in full force and effect at all times during the term of this Agreement a Comprehensive (or Commercial) General Liability and Professional Liability (if applicable) insurance policy or policies (the "Policies"), with minimum coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$3,000,000 aggregate. At a minimum, the Policies shall insure against bodily injury and property damage liability caused by on-premises business operations, completed operations and/or products or professional service and non-owned automobile coverage.

At all times during the term of this Agreement, GovTemps shall procure and maintain insurance to protect GovTemps from claims arising out of Commercial General Liability and Professional Liability, with minimum coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate.

Section 4.02. Certificate of Insurance. Upon request, either Party shall provide the other Party with one or more Certificates of Insurance, verifying the Municipality's compliance with the provisions of Section 4.01.

Section 4.03. Automobile Liability Insurance. If the Worksite Employee drives a Municipal or personal vehicle for any reason in connection with his or her Assignment, the Municipality and GovTemps shall both maintain in effect automobile liability insurance which

shall insure the Worksite Employee, GovTemps and the Municipality against liability for bodily injury, death and property damage.

### SECTION 5 DURATION AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

Section 5.01. Effective and Termination Dates. The Effective Date of this Agreement is the date that this Agreement is last signed by GovTemps on the signature page (the "Effective Date"). The period during which the Worksite Employee works at the Municipality is defined as the ("Term"). The Term commences on the Effective Date and will continue for the period identified on the attached Exhibit A, or until it is terminated in accordance with the remaining provisions of this Section 5. For the purposes of this Agreement, the date on which this Agreement expires and/or is terminated is the ("Termination Date").

Section 5.02. Termination of Agreement for Failure to Pay Fees. If the Municipality fails to timely pay the fees required under this Agreement, GovTemps may give the Municipality notice of its intent to terminate this Agreement for such failure and if such failure is remedied within thirty (30) days, the notice shall be of no further effect. If such failure is not remedied within the thirty (30) day period, GovTemps shall have the right to terminate the Agreement upon expiration of such remedy period.

Section 5.03. Termination of Agreement for Material Breach. If either Party materially breaches this Agreement, the non-breaching Party shall give the breaching Party notice of its intent to terminate this Agreement for such breach and if such breach is remedied within ten (10) days, the notice shall be of no further effect. If such breach is not remedied within the ten (10) day period, the non-breaching Party shall have the right to immediately terminate the Agreement upon expiration of such remedy period.

Section 5.04. Termination of Agreement For Reason Other than Material Breach. Either Party may terminate this Agreement for reason other than material breach by giving fourteen (14) days prior written notice to the other Party. Upon such termination, GovTemps shall be paid for the time period through the effective date of termination.

Section 5.05. Termination of Agreement to execute Temp-to-Hire Arrangement. At the end of the term of the agreement, as outlined in Section 5.01, the Municipality may hire the Employee as a permanent employee of the Municipality. If the Municipality exercises this option, the sum of two weeks gross salary is payable to GovTempsUSA, LLC within thirty (30) days of the permanent employment date. If the Municipality does not exercise the Temp-to-Hire Arrangement by the end of the contract, as outlined in Section 5.01, it agrees not to extend an offer of employment to the Employee for two years after the conclusion of this agreement. If an offer is made within two years after the conclusion of this agreement, as outlined in Section 5.01, then the two weeks gross salary fee is payable to GovTempsUSA, LLC within thirty (30) days of the permanent employment date.

### SECTION 6 NON-SOLICITATION

Section 6.01. Non-Solicitation. The Municipality acknowledges GovTemp's legitimate interest in protecting its business for a reasonable time following the termination of this Agreement. Accordingly, the Municipality agrees that during the term of this Agreement and for a period of two (2) years thereafter, the Municipality shall not solicit, request, entice or induce Worksite Employee to terminate his or her employment with the GovTemps, nor shall the Municipality hire Worksite Employee as an employee.

Section 6.02. Injunctive Relief. The Municipality recognizes that the rights and privileges granted by this Agreement are of a special, unique, and extraordinary character, the loss of which cannot reasonably or adequately be compensated for in damages in any action at law. Accordingly, the Municipality understands and agrees that GovTemps shall be entitled and limited to equitable relief, including a temporary restraining order and preliminary and permanent injunctive relief, to prevent or enjoin a breach of Section 6.01 this Agreement.

**Section 6.03. Survival.** The provision of this Section 6 shall survive any termination of this Agreement.

### SECTION 7 DISCLOSURE AND INDEMNIFICATION PROVISIONS

Section 7.01. Indemnification by GovTemps. GovTemps agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the Municipality and its related entities or their agents, representatives or employees (the "Municipality Parties") harmless from and against all claims, liabilities, damages, attorney's fees, costs and expenses ("Losses") (a) arising out of GovTemps's breach of its obligations under this Agreement, (b) related to the actions or conduct of GovTemps and its related business entities, their agents, representatives and employees, including the Work Site Employees (the "GovTemps Parties"), taken or not taken with respect to the Worksite Employees that relate to events or incidents occurring during or subsequent to the term of this Agreement, and (c) arising from any act or omission on the part of GovTemps or any of the GovTemps Parties.

Section 7.02. Indemnification by the Municipality. The Municipality agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the GovTemps Parties harmless from and against all Losses (a) arising out of the Municipality's breach of its obligations under this Agreement, and (b) arising from any act or omission on the part of the Municipality or any of the Municipality Parties. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Municipality shall have no obligations to the GovTemps Parties under this Section with respect to Losses arising out of events or incidents occurring before or after the term of this Agreement.

Section 7.03. Indemnification Procedures. The Party that is seeking indemnity (the "Indemnified Party") from the other Party (the "Indemnifying Party") pursuant to this Section 7, shall give the Indemnifying Party prompt notice of any such claim, allow the Indemnifying Party to control the defense or settlement of such claim and cooperate with the Indemnifying Party in all matters related thereto; provided however that, prior to the Indemnifying Party assuming such defense and upon the request of the Indemnified Party, the Indemnifying Party shall demonstrate to the reasonable satisfaction of the Indemnified Party that the Indemnifying Party (a) is able to fully pay the reasonably anticipated indemnity amounts under this Section 7 and (b) takes steps satisfactory to the Indemnified Party to ensure its continued ability to pay such amounts. In the

event the Indemnifying Party does not control the defense, the Indemnified Party may defend against any such claim at the Indemnifying Party's cost and expense, and the Indemnifying Party shall fully cooperate with the Indemnified Party, at no charge to the Indemnified Party, in defending such potential Loss, including, without limitation, using reasonable commercial efforts to keep the relevant Worksite Employee available. In the event the Indemnifying Party controls the defense, the Indemnified Party shall be entitled, at its own expense, to participate in, but not control, such defense. The failure to promptly notify the Indemnifying Party of any claim pursuant to this Section shall not relieve such Indemnifying Party of any indemnification obligation that it may have to the Indemnified Party, except to the extent that the Indemnifying Party demonstrates that the defense of such action has been materially prejudiced by the Indemnified Party's failure to timely give such notice.

**Section 7.04. Survival of Indemnification Provisions**. The provisions of this Section 7 shall survive the expiration or other termination of this Agreement.

### SECTION 8 ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

Section 8.01. Amendments. This Agreement may be amended at any time and from time to time, but any amendment must be in writing and signed by all of the Parties to this Agreement.

Section 8.02. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Parties and their respective heirs, successors, representatives and assign. Neither Party may assign its rights or delegate its duties hereunder without the express written consent of the other Party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

**Section 8.03. Counterpart Execution.** This Agreement may be executed and delivered in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. This Agreement may be executed and delivered via facsimile.

**Section 8.04. Definitions.** Terms and phrases defined in any part of this Agreement shall have the defined meanings wherever used throughout the Agreement. The terms "hereunder" and "herein" and similar terms used in this Agreement shall refer to this Agreement in its entirety and not merely to the section, subsection or paragraph in which the term is used.

Section 8.05. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties regarding GovTemps's provision of Worksite Employee to the Municipality, and contains all of the terms, conditions, covenants, stipulations, understandings and provisions agreed upon by the Parties. This Agreement supersedes and takes precedence over all proposals, memorandum agreements, tentative agreements, and oral agreements between the Parties, made prior to and including the date hereof, and not specifically identified and incorporated in writing into this Agreement. No agent or representative of either Party hereto has authority to make, and the Parties shall not be bound by or liable for, any statement, representation, promise, or agreement not specifically set forth in this Agreement.

Section 8.06. Further Assurances. Each of the Parties shall execute and deliver any and all additional papers, documents and other assurances and shall do any and all acts and things reasonably necessary in connection with the performances of their obligations hereunder and to carry out the intent of the parties hereto.

**Section 8.07. Gender.** Whenever the context herein so requires, the masculine, feminine or neuter gender and the singular and plural number shall each be deemed to include the other.

Section 8.08. Notices. Notices given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall either be served personally or delivered by certified first class U.S. Mail, postage prepaid and return receipt requested or by overnight delivery service. Notices also may effectively be given by transmittal over electronic transmitting devices such as Telex or facsimile machine if the Party to whom the notice is being sent has such a device in its office, provided that a complete copy of any notice shall be mailed in the same manner as required for a mailed notice.

Notices shall be deemed received at the earlier of actual receipt or three days from mailing date. Notices shall be directed to the Parties at their respective addresses shown below. A Party may change its address for notice by giving written notice to the other Party in accordance with this Section:

Section 8.09. Section Headings. Section and other headings contained in this Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not affect in any way the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.

Section 8.10. Severability. If any part or condition of this Agreement is held to be void, invalid or inoperative, such shall not affect any other provision hereof, which shall continue to be effective as though such void, invalid or inoperative part, clause or condition had not been made.

Section 8.11. Waiver of Provisions. The failure by one Party to require performance by the other Party shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any such breach, nor of any subsequent breach by the other Party of any provision of this Agreement. Such waiver shall not affect the validity of this Agreement, nor prejudice either Party's rights in connection with any subsequent

action. Any provision of this Agreement may be waived if, but only if, such waiver is in writing signed by the Party against whom the waiver is to be effective.

Section 8.12. Confidentiality. Each Party shall protect the confidentiality of the other's records and information and shall not disclose confidential information without the prior written consent of the other Party. Each Party shall reasonably cooperate with the other Party regarding any Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request calling for production of documents related to this Agreement.

Section 8.13. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois applicable to contracts made and to be performed entirely within such state, except the law of conflicts. The parties agree that any claims, disputes, actions or causes of action arising out of this Agreement or relating to the breach thereof shall be brought before a court of proper jurisdiction in Lake County, Illinois.

Bid Assistance Services and Construction Oversight – Fuel Storage Tank

Removal and Installation – Integrity Environmental Services, Inc.

The current Capital Projects Fund includes funding for the removal of the fueling station at the Public Works Center, including three 8,000 gallon underground tanks, conduit and cable, dispensers and canopy. In addition, the project will include installation of a small above ground diesel fuel storage tank and dispenser. The Village shifted to fueling off-site in 2017 through the State of Illinois' WEX program; with few exceptions all vehicles fuel at local retail outlets. One underground storage tank has been kept active for diesel vehicles that are not easily filled at gas stations (tractors, mowers, etc.).

Staff used the Qualification Based Selection (QBS) process to solicit firms with experience with this type of project. Two submittals were received and both firms were interviewed and rated. Based upon their submittal and experience Integrity Environmental Services (IES) was selected to negotiate a scope of services and cost. The services to be included are as follows:

- Analysis of existing equipment, conditions, records and drawings
- Project design, preparation of bid documents and bidding assistance
- Construction management and quality assurance services
- Contact administration services
- •Soil sample collection and analysis and preparation of State Fire Marshall documentation

Most of the tasks in the scope of services are proposed at a not-to-exceed amount totaling \$22,980. Oversight of the soil collection, sampling and analysis is estimated at \$7,700, but will ultimately be determined by the extent of the soil that must be removed depending of the presence of contamination. Therefore, I am estimating the cost of the services not-to-exceed \$35,000. The CIP includes a total of \$150,000 for the project.

Staff recommends that the Village Board approve the attached Engineering Services Agreement with Integrity Environmental Services, Inc., for Engineering Design, Bid Assistance and Construction Oversight Services for removal and installation of fuel storage tanks in an amount not-to-exceed \$35,000.

Once again, we would like to thank you and the Village of Carol Stream for inviting us to participate in this professional services firm selection process. Further, we are very pleased to have been invited to prepare and offer this Engineering Services Agreement proposal detailing the following tasks we will provide:

- Task 1- Preliminary Analysis
- Task 2A- Project Design and Engineering and Preparation of Bidding Documents
- Task 2B- Bidding Assistance
- Task 3A- Construction Management and Quality Assurance Services
- Task 3B- Contract Administration Services
- Task 4- UST System Removal Project Management, Soil Sample Collection and Analysis, and Preparation of OSFM Site Assessment Report

The type, location, configuration, and size if the existing fueling system and its equipment and components are clearly understood, as are the needs and area(s) associated with the new diesel fuel aboveground tank installation portion of this project. The scope of services required are also clearly understood as listed above and as further detailed below. Please note, as discussed at our recent Statement of Qualifications meeting, the professional services tasks for this project have been expanded to include Tasks 2B, 3B, and 4 above. All data and information gathered will result in a comprehensive analysis, which will subsequently be integrated into the technical design documents, specifications, and plans to ensure all appropriate equipment, components, and features correspond to the Village's diesel fuel consumption and distribution needs.

Based on the project scope as it is understood, and as described above, our not-to-exceed fee for providing the Task 1 services (Preliminary Analysis), will be \$2,850.

### Task 2A- Project Design and Engineering and Preparation of Bidding Documents:

Integrity Environmental Services, Inc. will prepare technical plans and specifications for the removal of the existing fuel dispensing facility, including the USTs and piping, the canopy structure, dispensers and fuel island, related concrete slabs, electrical items, and all other equipment, features, and components that are no longer needed. The plans and specifications will also include backfill materials and surface pavement sections to ensure proper site restoration requirements are met. In addition, we will prepare technical plans and specifications for the installation of a small aboveground diesel fuel storage tank for the facility, including all communications and electrical needs.

Please note, these technical plans and specifications, as well as the front-end contractual specifications sections further described below, will be for experienced, qualified, State-registered contractor public bidding. Since only a State-registered tank contractor can apply for removal and installation permits through the Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM) and the Village of Carol Stream (as applicable), all permitting will be performed and completed upon contract execution with the successful bidding tank contractor.

Our specifications/bidding documents will also include the Village's front-end contractual documents, or our front-end documents consistent with the Village's requirements. These front-end sections will include, but not be limited to, general conditions, special conditions, special provisions, schedule information, instructions to bidders, and a detailed bid form.

Our project design will also include the preparation of detailed plan drawings for all aspects of the removal/demolition portion of the project, including site restoration, as well as for the installation of the aboveground diesel fuel tank with all new features, components, etc. Our plans will include scaled AutoCAD drawings prepared in accordance with the Village's format and standards. It is understood that all plan documents are subject to review and revision as the design process develops.

It is also understood that the front-end specification sections, the technical specification sections, and the plan drawings; collectively titled as the bidding documents, will include all items and requirements listed and noted on Pages 3 and 4 of the Village's initial Request for Qualifications (RFQ) document. All work will be specified, and ultimately performed, in accordance with all current codes, standards, and regulations, of all entities involved.

Based on the project scope as we understand it to date, and as described above, our not-to-exceed fee for providing project design and bidding document (Project Specification and Project Drawings) preparation services will be \$6.840.

### Task 2B- Bidding Assistance:

As we discussed and as requested, Integrity Environmental Services, Inc. will also assist the Village with all aspects and services associated with the contractor bidding process. We will assist the Village with the preparation of a Legal Notice as required for public advertisement in the publication of your choice. During the bidding process, Integrity Environmental Services, Inc. will also conduct a Pre-Bid Meeting and a walk-through of the sites/areas to address any questions from prospective bidding contractors. The Pre-Bid Meeting and walk-through will be conducted by our office and documented by the preparation and distribution of Meeting Minutes.

During the bidding process, we will also respond to questions from bidders, as well as your office by issuing addenda, if required. After bids are received, we will assist with the opening of bids, provide a tabulation of bids, and will assist your office in determining the lowest responsive bidder so that a contract can be awarded. Additionally, the bidding phase of this project can include the prequalification, reference review, and vetting of bidders prior to award recommendation.

Our not-to-exceed fee for providing all bidding assistance services, as described above, will be \$2,280.

#### Task 3A- Construction Management and Quality Assurance Services:

Integrity Environmental Services, Inc. will provide a qualified and experienced project manager to represent the Village and to perform construction management of the project in accordance with the project specifications and plans. Our preliminary project duration estimate for the physical contracted work is approximately fifteen (15) business days. As such, and in consideration of providing on-site project management duties at crucial times during construction (i.e. during OSFM inspections, key system installation dates, quality assurance support, substantial and final completion walk-thoughs, etc.), we estimate that we will incur eighty (80) hours for this item.

We will also collect and review all contractor submittals and conduct a Pre-Construction Meeting with the contractor of award and Village personnel, again documented by preparation and distribution of Meeting Minutes. Additionally, we will provide the Village with a final inspection report, "as-built" drawings, final specifications from equipment manufacturers, and any required contractor testing results for permeant record. Compliance verification will also be provided as part of the contractor close-out process.

Once again, we are estimating at this time that our project manager will incur approximately eighty (80) hours of site time during this project. Using our typical project management hourly rate of \$85 per hour, \$6.800 should be budgeted for this phase/task.

The designated hourly rates for our team will be as follows:

- -Ben Kelderhouse, P.E.- \$95/hour (site time will be reduced \$85/hour)

### Task 3B- Contract Administration Services:

As we discussed and as requested, Integrity Environmental Services, Inc. will also provide important administration services associated with the contractor's contract with the Village. Our contract administration services will include, but not be limited to, contract (Owner-Contractor Agreement) preparation, insurance and bonding document review and processing, Change Order processing (if required), pay request review and approval, project close-out paperwork, etc.

Our not-to-exceed fee for performing the contract administration services associated with this project will be \$2.850.

### Task 4- UST System Removal Project Management, Soil Sample Collection and Analysis, and Preparation of OSFM Site Assessment Report:

As discussed, the OSFM governs the removal of UST systems in Illinois. The OSFM also enforces UST removals, subsequent excavation soil sampling, and reporting requirements to document the success of the tank removal work. The OSFM representative must be on-site to witness the tank removal effort and to make a determination as to the existence of a petroleum release.

Please note, in the event that impacted soils are discovered during or following the tank removal work, an incident number assignment will be required as instructed by the OSFM representative. The assignment of a release incident number triggers the involvement and requirements of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) Leaking UST (LUST) Program. If a No Further Remediation (NFR) declaration and letter from the IEPA are the goal regarding closure, the IEPA LUST Program regulations must be followed and additional environmental consulting, testing, and reporting fees will likely apply. If this becomes the case, a supplemental proposal will be transmitted to the Village addressing these additional IEPA steps and tasks.

The professional environmental services needed to satisfy the regulatory requirements of the OSFM in association with the removal of the subject UST systems, are further detailed in the paragraphs that follow.

### UST System Removal Project Management-

As noted above, there are specific requirements enforced in Illinois by the OSFM regarding the removal of UST systems, as well as for documenting the environmental condition of surrounding soils. A representative from the OSFM must be present at the time of the tank removal work, not only to witness the removal effort, but also to make a determination as to the existence of impacted soils and the necessity of an incident number. Integrity Environmental Services, Inc. will provide an experienced and qualified environmental project manager to oversee the UST removal effort, document all activities, communicate with the OSFM inspector as needed, and to represent the Village during the work.

Our representative will also collect and generate all necessary documentation for permanent record and reporting purposes. Additionally, we will visually examine and continually screen soils with a Photoionization Detector (PID), collect and examine all required soil samples, and document all field observations and conditions.

We are pleased to note that the fees for our UST system removal project management are already accounted for in Task 3A above.

### UST Excavation Soil Sample Collection and Analysis-

The OSFM also enforces the requirement of obtaining and analyzing tank excavation and product piping trench soil samples following the removal of UST systems. This soil sampling requirement is enforced regardless of a tank's age, use history, or the assignment of an incident number. This soil sample data must be included in the Site Assessment Report (UST Removal Report), also required by the OSFM.

Based on the sizes (capacities) of the USTs, their age, the underground piping spans, and the products being stored, we estimate that twenty (20) excavation/trench soil samples will require BTEX, PNA, and MTBE, and Total/TCLP-Lead laboratory analysis.

The fee for the analysis of these soil samples, as proposed and as estimated above will be \$7,700 (20 samples @ \$385/sample).

OSFM Site Assessment Report (UST Removal Report)-

Formerly called a UST Removal Report, the preparation of a Site Assessment Report is required by the OSFM to detail the UST removal effort. This report must include permit documentation, a brief site history and narrative, site and removal drawings, liquid waste manifests, the tank destruction certificate(s), laboratory data, photographs, etc. In addition, this report must conclude with the OSFM's Notification Form and Certificate of Removal, certifying that the tanks were properly removed in accordance with regulatory requirements.

Our fees associated with the preparation of this OSFM Site Assessment Report will not exceed \$1,360.

Please note, if additional time, samples, etc. are required because of the environmental condition of the soil samples retrieved or due to unforeseen conditions, we will notify your office immediately. We will not proceed with any additional work without your prior consent and approval. Additionally, please note, all project data and analytical results are confidential and for your exclusive use or for those specifically designated by your office. We will not discuss the data obtained or generated during this project with any other party without your prior consent.

Once again, please note, a supplemental proposal will be transmitted separately addressing additional IEPA steps and tasks that will be required if an incident number is assigned to the property in connection with these USTs.

In summary, the fee schedule for all professional services tasks detailed in this proposal will be as follows:

• Task 2A- Project Design and Engineering and Preparation of Bidding Documents = \$6,840 (not-to-exceed)

1) Examination by Contractor

The Contractor shall carefully examine the site or materials and become familiar with the conditions under which he/she will have to execute the required work. Failure to do so will in no way relieve the Contractor of their responsibility or increase the charges incurred by the Village.

2) Compliance with Applicable Laws, Ordinances, and Regulations

The Contractor shall strictly comply with all applicable Federal, State, and Local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and applicable standards for the duration of the Village's working relationship with the Contractor.

3) Taxes, Licenses, Permits, and Certificates

The Contractor shall pay all sales, use, property, income, and other taxes that are lawfully assessed against the Village or the Contractor in connection with the Contractor's facilities and the work included in this contract. By law, the Village is exempt from paying Federal Excise Tax, State and Local Retailers' Occupation Tax, State and Local Service Occupation Tax, Use Tax, and Service Use Tax. Contractor is responsible for obtaining required permits from the Village of Carol Stream and all associated permit fees will be waived.

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the Village. At the option of the Village, either: the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retention as respects the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers; or the Contractor shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigation, claim administration and defense expenses.

The Contractor shall furnish the Village with certificates of general liability insurance naming the Village, it officials, agents, employees and volunteers as additional insureds, and with original endorsements effecting coverage required prior to commencement of any work. Contractor shall submit a Certificate of general liability Insurance on an ISO or equivalent form indicating the Village of Carol Stream as an additional insured on a primary and non-contributory basis. The certificates and endorsements for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf and shall be in a form acceptable to the Village. The insurance afforded by the policy shall not be suspended, voided, canceled, reduced in coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice by certified mail return receipt requested has been given to the Village by the Contractor. Such notice shall be addressed as shown in the heading of the endorsement.

Any failure by the Contractor to comply with reporting provisions of the policy shall not affect coverage provided to the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers. The insurer shall waive all rights of subrogation against the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers for losses arising from work performed by the Contractor for the Village.

### 7) Accident Prevention and Notification

The Contractor shall be responsible for initiating, maintaining, and supervising all safety precautions and programs in connection with its work on this project, including those that warn and guard the public against the hazards created by the work. Existing facilities, including grounds, structures, landscaping, and so forth, shall be protected by the Contractor. Precautions shall be exercised at all times for the protection of its employees and subcontractors, and will exercise care for the protection of property and persons at the project work site. The safety provisions of all applicable laws, regulations, and codes shall be observed, including the climination of known and observed hazards, and applicable work safety training. If, in the opinion of the Village, a hazardous condition exists and the Contractor fails to correct the condition, or to protect the public, the Village may order the necessary precautions to safeguard the public, the cost of which will be deducted from payments due the Contractor. Flagrant disregard for the safety of the public shall constitute just reason for the Village to order cessation of work.

In the event of accidents of any kind which involve the general public and/or private or public property in the Village or in any way related to this work, the Contractor shall immediately notify the Village. Upon request of the Village, the Contractor shall provide such accounting of details and/or copy of written accident and other reports as the Village may require. The Village bears no responsibility for damage done to existing utilities during construction. The Contractor shall provide copies of any documents, related to the accident, to the Village at the same time that the reports and/or information are forwarded to any other interested parties. All repairs of damage shall be made to the satisfaction of the Village. Failure to repair damage shall be just cause for withholding payment for work that becomes due.

### 8) Site Condition / Trespass on Land / Clean-Up

The Contractor shall confine their operations and storage of materials and equipment to the job site. The Contractor shall have control over his/her employees' parking of automobiles on the site. The Contractor shall keep the site neat and shall clean up any debris when directed to do so by the Village. Upon completion of the improvement, the site shall be left in a condition acceptable to the Village. Failure to keep the site neat, or clean up debris when directed to do so shall be just cause for withholding payment due the Contractor and final acceptance will not be made until the site is in a condition acceptable to the Village.

### 9) Prevailing Wages

Prevailing wages are required on this project. The Contractor shall be thoroughly familiar with and maintain compliance at all times with the provisions of 820H.CS 130/0.01 et seq., entitled "an Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics, and other workers employed in any public works by the state, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works".

### 10) Employees and Conduct

The Contractor shall prohibit any drinking of alcoholic beverages or use of any controlled substances, except by a doctor's prescription, by any of its employees while in the course of performing their duties under this contract. In the event that any of the Contractor's employees is deemed by the Village to be unfit or unsuitable to perform the services under this Agreement as a result of intoxication, drug use, or by virtue of abusive or obnoxious behavior, then, upon formal, written request of the Village, the Contractor shall remove such employee from work within the Village and furnish a suitable and competent replacement employee.

### 11) Non-Performance; Default

If the Contractor fails to observe the established scope of work that has been detailed in the Agreement, or modified in writing via addendum or change order, the Village shall serve notice to the Contractor that the items in non-compliance must be rectified. Failure to do so may result in non-payment to the Contractor until all items are brought into compliance.

12) Indemnity Hold Harmless Provision

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor hereby agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless, individually and collectively, the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers, against all injuries, deaths, loss, damages, claims, patent claims, suits, liabilities, judgments, costs and expenses, which may in any way accrue against, the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers arising in whole or in part or in consequence of the performance of the work by the Contractor, its employees, or subcontractors, or which may in any way result therefore, except that arising out of the sole legal cause of the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers, and the Contractor shall, at its own expense, appear, defend and pay all charges of attorneys and all costs and other expenses arising therefore or incurred in connection therewith, and, if any judgment shall be rendered against the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers, in any such action, the Contractor shall, at its own expense, satisfy and discharge same.

The Contractor expressly understands and agrees that any performance bond or insurance policies required by the contract, or otherwise provided by the Contractor, shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify, keep and save harmless and defend the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers, and to pay expenses and damages as herein provided. The Contractor further agrees that to the extent that money is due the Contractor by virtue of the contract, an amount of said money as shall be considered necessary in the judgment of the Village, may be retained by the Village to protect itself against said loss until such claims, suits, or judgments shall have been settled or discharged and/or evidence to that effect shall have been furnished to the satisfaction of the Village

13) Termination for Default

The Contract will remain in force for the full period specified and until the Village determines that all requirements and conditions have been satisfactorily met and the Village has accepted the work, and thereafter until the Contractor has met all requirements and conditions relating to the work, including warranty or guarantee periods. However the Village will have the right to terminate this Contract sooner if the Contractor has failed to perform satisfactorily the work required, as determined by the Village in its discretion.

In the event the Village decides to terminate this Contract for failure to perform satisfactorily, the Village will give the Contractor at least thirty (30) calendar days written notice before the termination takes effect. Such thirty (30) day period shall commence upon the mailing of notice by the Village. If the Contractor fails to cure the default within the thirty (30) days specified in the notice and the Contract is terminated for the Contractor's failure to provide satisfactory Contract performance, any portion of the costs not paid to the Contractor shall be forfeited to the Village in order to cover the costs related to remedying the Contractor's failure to provide satisfactory Contract performance. At the option of the Village, the Contractor may be given additional time to cure the defaults.

Except as otherwise directed by the Village, or in the case of termination for default (in which event the Contractor may be entitled to cure, at the option of the Village) the Contractor shall stop work on the date of receipt of notice of the termination or other date specified in the notice, place no further orders or subcontracts for materials, services, or facilities except as are necessary for the completion of such portion of the work not terminated, and terminate all contractors and subcontracts (if applicable) and settle all outstanding liabilities and claims.

14) Force Majeure

Neither party will be liable to the other for any failure or delay in rendering performance arising out of causes beyond its control and without its fault or negligence. Such causes may include, but not be limited to, acts of God or the public enemy, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, and unusually severe weather; but the failure or delay must be beyond its control and without its fault or

negligence. Dates or times of performance will be extended to the extent of delays excused by this section, provided that the party whose performance is affected notifies the other promptly of the existence and nature of such delay.

15) Notification to Other Party

The Contractor shall contact the Village of Carol Stream Department of Public Works at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to starting work. All official notifications between the parties shall be in writing and delivered to the other party at their respective mailing addresses via certified mail; hand delivered; or via e-mail or acknowledged facsimile.

16) Project Scope and Amendments

The Contractor shall employ only workmen skilled in their trade and shall furnish full-time supervision of all work. An English-speaking supervisor shall be at the site whenever construction is in progress. The supervisor shall have authority to receive and carry out instructions from the Village. The lack of a competent supervisor on the site during construction shall be just cause for the Village to order the work to cease.

Any additions or changes to the scope of work for the project, or actions/activities of the Contractor which would incur project costs that were of an optional nature, will require written pre-approval by an authorized individual of the Village. The Village reserves the right to order additional work/materials at the cost originally proposed by the Contractor.

17) Severability

Any provision of these terms and conditions that is prohibited or unenforceable under the laws of the State of Illinois shall be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability, without impairing or invalidating the remaining provisions of these terms and conditions. All agreements shall be deemed made in, and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois, County of DuPage.

18) Standard of Care

In performing the services described in this Agreement, Contractor will exercise the degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by reputable companies performing the same or similar services.

19) Guarantee

All work and materials furnished under this contract shall be guaranteed by the Contractor against defects failure, improper performance and non-compliance with the contract documents for a period of two (2) years after completion and acceptance of the work under this contract. During the guarantee period, the Contractor shall repair and replace, at his/her own expense, when so ordered by the Village, all work that develops defects whether these defects may be inherent in the materials furnished or workmanship performed.

20) Final Acceptance and Payment

The work shall not be accepted by the Village until the Village has determined that all work is complete and in accordance with the specifications. Final payment will be made when the work is accepted by the Village.

21) Competency of Contractor

No purchase order shall be authorized for, nor contract to any person, firm, or corporation that is in arrears or is default to the Village upon any debt contract, or other obligation or who has failed to perform faithfully any previous contract with the Village.

22) Equal Employment Opportunity

In the event of the contractor's non-compliance with the provisions of this equal employment opportunity clause, the Illinois Human Rights Act or the Rules and Regulations of the Illinois Department of the Human Rights ("Department"), the Contractor may be declared ineligible for future contracts or subcontracts with the State of Illinois or any of its political subdivisions or municipal corporations, and the contract may be cancelled or voided in whole or in part, and such other sanctions or penalties may be imposed or remedies invoked as provided by statute or regulation. During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:

- 1. That it will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, marital status, national origin, or ancestry, age, physical or mental handicap unrelated to ability, or an unfavorable discharge from the military service; and further that it will examine all job classifications to determine if minority persons or women are under utilized and will take appropriate affirmative action to rectify any such under utilization.
- 2. That, if it hires additional employees in order to perform this contract or any portion thereof, it will determine the availability (in accordance with the department's rules and regulations) of minorities and women in the area(s) from which it may reasonably recruit and it will hire for each job classification for which employees are hired in such a way that minorities and women are not under utilized.
- 3. That, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by it or on its behalf, it will state that all applicants will be afforded equal opportunity without discrimination because of race, color, religion, sex. marital status, national origin or ancestry, age, physical or mental handicap unrelated to ability, or an unfavorable discharge from military service.
- 4. That it will send to each labor organization or representative of workers with which it has or is bound by a collective bargaining or other agreement or understanding, a notice advising such labor organization or representative of the contractor's obligations under the Illinois Human Rights Act and the Department's Rules and Regulations. If any such labor organization or representative fails or refuses to cooperate with the contractor in its efforts to comply with such act and rules and regulations, the contractor will promptly so notify the department and the contracting agency and will recruit employees from other sources when necessary to fulfill its obligations thereunder.
- 5. That it will submit reports as required by the department's rules and regulations, furnish all relevant information as may from time to time be requested by the department or the contracting agency, and in all respects comply with the Illinois Human Rights Act and the Department's rules and regulations.
- 6. That it will permit access to all relevant books, records, accounts, and work sites by personnel of the contracting agency and the department for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with the Illinois Human Rights Act and the Department's rules and regulations.
- 7. That it will include verbatim or by reference the provisions of this clause in every subcontract it awards under which any portion of the contract obligations are undertaken or assumed, so that such provisions will be binding upon such subcontractor. In the same manner as with other provisions of this contract, the contractor will be liable for compliance with applicable provisions of this clause by such subcontractors; and further it will promptly notify the contracting agency and the department in the event any subcontractor fails or refuses to comply therewith. In addition, the contractor will not utilize any subcontractor declared by the Illinois Human Rights Commission to be ineligible for contracts or subcontracts with the State of Illinois or any of its political subdivisions or municipal corporations.

### Subcontracts

Each public subcontractor shall in turn include the equal employment opportunity clause set forth within these rules and regulations in each of its subcontracts under which any portion of the contract obligations are undertaken or assumed, said inclusion to be either verbatim or by reference so that the provisions of the clause will be binding upon such subcontractors.

Contracts or Subcontracts with Religious Entities -

The requirements of the equal employment clause set forth above with respect to non-discrimination because of religion shall not apply to a religious corporation, association, educational institution or society with respect to the employment of individuals of a particular religion for the carrying on by such corporation, association, educational institution or society of its activities.

### 23) Compensation

The compensation for the work shall be in accordance with the proposal attached hereto and incorporated herein. Contractor shall invoice the Village following completion of the services and Village shall make payment within thirty (30) days.

2019-20 GIS Consortium Service Provider Contract

In November of 2015 the Village had joined the GIS Consortium (GISC) and entered into an contract with the GIS service provider, Municipal GIS Partners, Inc. (MGP). The contract provides GIS program staffing consisting of an Onsite Analyst, Shared Analyst, Client Account Manager and Manager. To hire this staff would be cost prohibitive for the Village.

On April 6, 2015 the Village entered into an updated GISC Service Provider Contract. This contract allowed for the Village to add Supplemental Statements of Work every January 1<sup>st</sup> without having to amend the contract. The GISC is on a calendar fiscal year rather than a May 1<sup>st</sup> fiscal year.

Since joining the consortium, the Village has made significant progress integrating and improving our GIS capabilities. Currently MGP is working on the following projects:

- a. Cartegraph Integration
- b. Continued Development of Utility Data
- c. Sanitary Sewer Pipe and Manhole Summary for Redzone
- d. Address integration with Village Systems
- e. Police Zone and Block Maps
- f. Various Story Maps
- g. Cartegraph Asset Visualization Improvements
- h. Police Crash Incident BI Layers
- i. Community Development Project Maps

The GISC negotiated the MGP employee contract rates for the Supplemental Statement of Work. The hours allocated in the agreement are based off the original GIS Services Provider contract with MGP and our agreement with GISC. No hour or service changes have been requested. For reference, the 2018 contract was a not to exceed amount of \$143,139.70, the 2019 total cost is \$142,278.15 for a savings of \$861.55.

Information Technology has reviewed the Supplemental Statement of Work and found it to be acceptable. Therefore staff recommends an award of Supplemental Statement of Work contract to MGP at a cost not to exceed \$142,278.15

### Supplemental Statement of Work

Pursuant to and in accordance with Section 1.2 of that certain GIS Consortium Service Provider Contract dated May 1, 2015 (the "Contract") between the Village of Carol Stream, an Illinois municipal corporation (the "Municipality") and Municipal GIS Partners, Incorporated (the "Consultant"), the parties hereby agree to the following SUPPLEMENTAL STATEMENT OF WORK, effective January 1, 2019 ("SOW"):

### Description of Additional Services:

Section 3 of the Attachment 1 to the Contract ("Attachment 1") shall be deleted and replaced with the following language:

"The Consultant will provide the necessary resources to support the GIS program. The allocation of these resources will be reasonably commensurate with the level of expertise required to fulfill the specific task which includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- A. The Onsite Analyst provides the daily operation, maintenance, and support of the program for the Municipality. The Onsite Analyst is responsible for database management and data quality, map and product development, user training and help-desk, project identification and program documentation.
- B. The Shared Analyst provides technical support to the Onsite Analyst and the Municipality including trouble-shooting and project implementation. The Shared Analyst is responsible for developing, testing, and managing the GISC shared solutions including the standard data model and processes, centralized databases, and software applications.
- C. The Client Account Manager is responsible for the coordination and operation of the program for the Municipality including leadership alignment and reporting, planning and budgeting, resource allocation, and performance management.
- D. The Manager is responsible for the overall GISC program including the development and implementation of new shared opportunities based on the direction and instructions of the GISC Board of Directors."

### 2. Project Schedule/Term:

Pursuant to Section 5.2 of the Contract, this SOW shall extend the Initial Term for an additional one (1) year period. For the avoidance of doubt, this Renewal Term shall commence on May 1, 2019 and remain in effect for one (1) year.

### 3. Projected Utilization:

As set forth in Section 4.1(c) of the Contract, the project utilization shall adjust each calendar year in accordance with the annual rates approved by the Board of Directors of GISC. The projected utilization for the calendar year beginning January 1, 2019 and ending December 31, 2019 is set forth in this SOW as follows:

- A. 1151 hours of Onsite Analyst
- B. 233 hours of Shared Analyst
- C. <u>115</u> hours of Client Account Manager
- D. 59 hours of Manager

### 4. Service Rates:

As set forth in Section 4.1(c) of the Contract, the service rates shall adjust each calendar year in accordance with the annual rates approved by the Board of Directors of GISC. The service rates for the calendar year beginning January 1, 2018 and ending December 31, 2018 is set forth in this SOW as follows:

- A. \$ 84.00 per hour for Onsite Analyst
- B. \$103.75 per hour for Shared Analyst
- C. \$111.95 per hour for Client Account Manager
- D. \$144.85 per hour for Manager

Total Not-to-Exceed Amount for Services (Numbers): \$142,278.15

Total Not-to-Exceed Amount for Services (Figures): one hundred forty-two thousand, two hundred seventy-eight and 15/100 dollars.

In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between the terms of this SOW and the Contract or any previously approved SOW, the terms of this SOW shall govern and control with respect to the term, projected utilization rates, service rates and scope of services. All other conflicts or inconsistencies between the terms of the Contract and this SOW shall be governed and controlled by the Contract. Any capitalized terms used herein but not defined herein shall have the meanings prescribed to such capitalized term in the Contract.

### **BACKGROUND**

The purpose of this memorandum is to discuss the Carol Stream Police Department's participation in a K-9 program funded by the Narcotics and Currency Interdiction Team (hereinafter referred to as NARCINT). Information contained in this document will discuss NARCINT's proposal to outfit Officer Zakerski, the Department's representative in NARCINT, with a single-purpose K-9 as a tool to better execute his current assignment.

NARCINT is a Task Force administered by the Illinois State Police with funding from the federal government. Local jurisdictions, such as Carol Stream, assign officers to NARCINT on a temporary basis. Salary and overtime costs for the officer are reimbursed by NARCINT per an intergovernmental agreement. NARCINT also provides Officer Zakerski with a vehicle and cell phone. Additionally, all training and necessary equipment needed, for Officer Zakerski, is funded by NARCINT.

NARCINT has a primary objective to identify inter-state narcotic traffickers and conduct lawful seizures of narcotics and ill-gotten currency, which are transported on inter-state roadways and rail systems. To assist NARCINT agents in accomplishing this mission, the organization's administration has decided to utilize single-purpose trained K-9s to help agents during investigations. NARCINT Director, Lieutenant Pat Murphy of the Illinois State Police, has identified two officers currently assigned to NARCINT that possess the work ethic and dedication to be tasked as K-9 handlers. One of those individuals is Carol Stream Police Department Officer Andrew Zakerski. The other officer, Ken Norbut of the Chicago Ridge Police Department, has already started the program and is close to implementing his K-9 partner in a work capacity.

### **NARCINT'S PROPOSAL**

NARCINT will incur nearly all costs associated with outfitting Officer Zakerski as a K-9 Handler while in his capacity as a NARCINT Inspector. Items covered by NARCINT funding will be the following:

- The purchase of the K-9.

- The entire cost of the three-week training for the canine and Officer Zakerski at the VonBernd K9 Training Center in Terre Haute, Indiana.
- The cost of annual Illinois state certification for the canine.
- All additional training that may be needed for the canine while assigned to NARCINT.
- An outdoor dog run built at Officer Zakerski's home, complete with a cement pad.
- Dog crate and feeding bowls that will be stored at Officer Zakerski's home.
- All time necessary to care for the K-9

\*\*While assigned to NARCINT, Officer Zakerski's duty time is managed by his supervisors at NARCINT in accordance with their rules and regulations. As such, the time required to care for the K-9, (training, veterinary visits and daily care etc.), will be accounted for within his regular work hours. These hours are monitored by NARCINT Director Lieutenant Pat Murphy, and documented daily on the Village of Carol Stream time sheet.

Though the K-9 will be purchased by NARCINT, by law, that agency would not be able to own the rights to the animal. NARCINT will sell the K-9 ownership rights to the Carol Stream Police Department for \$1.00 United States Currency, or the Carol Stream Police Department will purchase the K-9 directly from VonBernd for \$1.00 United States Currency. To facilitate the purchase of a vehicle, the mobile kennel equipped with temperature control devices that are mandated by law, the kennel at OFC Zakerski's home, and any smaller equipment needs the K-9 may require, NARCINT will issue a \$55,000 procurement to the Carol Stream Police Department. The issued funds will be used by the department to purchase the above listed items. All training and yearly certifications that OFC Zakerski and the K-9 must maintain will be paid for by NARCINT while OFC Zakerski is assigned to NARCINT.

The Carol Stream Police Department will be responsible for the following items associated to the canine program:

- Annual food cost for the K-9
- Annual veterinary costs for the K-9
- Gas and maintenance for the K-9 vehicle
- Liability Insurance (no additional costs)
- \*\* It should be noted that seized narcotic funds within the 1505 account would be used to pay these fees, resulting in zero actual costs to the Village of Carol Stream.

The K-9 that will be purchased to partner with OFC Zakerski is currently at the VonBernd K-9 Training Center in Terre Haute, Indiana. To meet the needs of NARCINT, the K-9 will be trained as single-purpose narcotics dog. There are two-types of police K-9, single-purpose and dual-purpose. A single-purpose K-9 is trained in just one discipline, such as narcotics detection. A dual-purpose K-9 is trained in either narcotics, explosive, or cadaver detection *plus* a biting component. Without being trained in "biting," the K-9 in this program will be used solely to detect the location of specific narcotics.

### **CONCLUSION**

Officer Zakerski is assigned to the NARCINT Task Force, and as such, is provided with all the necessary training and tools to facilitate his job while there. NARCINT needs a K-9 handler and has chosen Officer Zakerski due to his dedication and hard work ethic. In addition to making Officer Zakerski more effective at locating narcotics, the K-9 will assist in increasing revenue streams that stem from state and federal asset forfeitures. At any given time, multiple taskforces and narcotic groups are working in the Chicago Metropolitan Area. These taskforces from Federal, State, or Local law enforcement agencies often need the assistance of a K-9 to locate narcotics and/or currency. If the canine assists in locating currency, the handler's agency receives on average 3-5% of the total seized. These funds will come back to our 1505 account to be used in accordance with current law, which includes any costs associated with the care and maintenance of the K-9. Without our NARCINT position incorporating a K-9 program, these funds would not be provided to the Village.

Though Officer Zakerski and his K-9 partner would be assigned to NARCINT, the K-9 can still be utilized for Carol Stream Police Department use. If NARCINT is given advanced knowledge for the K-9 need, Officer Zakerski can assist in such events as search warrants, roadside safety checks, and community gatherings. However, if Officer Zakerski and the K-9 are presently involved in a NARCINT activity, that action would take precedence over a Carol Stream use. Currently, we consistently utilize K-9s from agencies in the area on a regular basis. Often, they are not available, or their response time is a substantial hindrance. We anticipate having Officer Zakerski as a NARCINT K-9 handler will help reduce the need to constantly rely on other area agencies and improve efficiency here at Carol Stream.

As previously stated, while Officer Zakerski is detailed to NARCINT, he is under the supervision of NARCINT, as would be the K-9. The K-9 is treated as another tool to do his job while in that capacity. This is not a Carol Stream Police Department K-9 program and as such does not have any impact on the recently settled F.O.P. contract. In the event that Officer Zakerski leaves NARCINT the Village has 3 options.

- Keep the K-9 and institute a program within the Police Department
- NARCINT retrains the dog, trains another handler, and we sell the dog back to NARCINT for \$1
- Officer Zakerski buys the dog from the Village for \$1 and keeps it as his personal pet.

The vehicle and equipment purchased for the K-9 with the \$55,000 of procurement funds provided by NARCINT will remain the Village's property.

The program as presented will be of no cost to the Village of Carol Stream. Any costs associated with the K-9, not directly funded by NARCINT, will be funded using current

and future 1505 asset forfeiture funds. The Village has the right end participation in NARCINT at any time, without cost or penalty. For NARCINT to select Officer Zakerski as a K-9 handler speaks volumes on the work ethic, ability, and dedication he has shown during the past two-years. A K-9 would only serve to magnify Officer Zakerski's effectiveness as a NARCINT Inspector.

Intergovernmental Agreement Between the Village and Bloomingdale Township

In prior years the Village has secured mosquito abatement services through cooperative agreements with both Bloomingdale and Wayne Townships. The Bloomingdale Township agreement has expired and the Township has negotiated a new contract with the service provider, Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management.

The Township has negotiated a new agreement with Clarke for a 4-year term with a small (1.9%) first-year increase, no increase in year two and the lesser of 2.5% or CPI-U in years three and four. In addition, the Township provides fifty-percent (50%) funding for each of the participating municipalities. Under the terms of the Agreement the costs over the next four years for mosquito abatement services in the Bloomingdale Township section of the Village would be as follows:

2019: \$34,878 2020: \$34,878

2021: \$35,750 (max.)

2022: \$36,644 (max.)

Attached you will find a cover memo from Bloomingdale Township Supervisor Michael D. Hovde, a copy of the Financial Reimbursement Agreement with Bloomingdale Township and the contract between the Township and Clarke.

I am recommending that the Mayor and Village Board adopt a Resolution authorizing execution of a Financial Reimbursement Intergovernmental Agreement between the Village and Bloomingdale Township for mosquito abatement services.

## FINANCIAL REIMBURSEMENT INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM AND BLOOMINGDALE TOWNSHIP FOR MOSQUITO ABATEMENT SERVICES

WHEREAS, Bloomingdale Township is a unit of local government established under the laws of the State of Illinois and is hereinafter referred to as the "TOWNSHIP;" and

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream is an Illinois municipal corporation and is hereinafter referred to as the "VILLAGE;" and

WHEREAS, the TOWNSHIP for a period of years has provided mosquito abatement services for TOWNSHIP residents within the VILLAGE; and

WHEREAS, the TOWNSHIP and VILLAGE have determined that it is reasonable for the VILLAGE to continue to reimburse the TOWNSHIP for a portion of the mosquito abatement services provided by the TOWNSHIP, within the Village, by Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the TOWNSHIP and VILLAGE have the legal authority to enter into this Intergovernmental Agreement pursuant to Article VII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois and 5 ILCS 220/1 et. seq.; and

WHEREAS, the TOWNSHIP has entered into a mosquito abatement contract hereinafter "CLARKE CONTRACT" with Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management, Inc., (hereinafter "CLARKE") to provide mosquito abatement services for the 2019 through 2022 mosquito seasons, a copy of the CLARKE CONTRACT being attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 2; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Agreement is to establish the VILLAGE's and TOWNSHIP's duties and rights with regard to intergovernmental cooperation for reimbursement for mosquito abatement services for the 2019 through 2022 mosquito seasons.

- 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Agreement as evidence of the intent of the TOWNSHIP and VILLAGE and as representing substantive covenants between them.
- 2. Subject to the termination provisions, and the provisions regarding potential increases or decreases in the level of mosquito abatement services as described below, the VILLAGE shall pay the TOWNSHIP for mosquito abatement services provided by CLARKE within the VILLAGE, in the 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022 mosquito seasons, in those percentages and dollar amounts set forth in Appendix A of the CLARKE CONTRACT.

- 3. The VILLAGE shall have the right to terminate its participation in the TOWNSHIP'S mosquito abatement program and this Agreement at any time in the sole discretion of the Corporate Authorities of the VILLAGE. Any and all sums due from the VILLAGE up to the date of termination shall be paid by the VILLAGE to the TOWNSHIP at the appropriate percentage as set forth in Appendix A. After termination, no further payments will be required by the Village. Written notice of the VILLAGE'S termination shall be provided by facsimile or e-mail, and regular mail to the Bloomingdale Township Supervisor and CLARKE.
- 4. The VILLAGE's sole duty and obligation under this Agreement is to reimburse the TOWNSHIP. The VILLAGE shall have no contractual privity with CLARKE under this Agreement and shall have no right to control, supervise, or otherwise direct CLARKE'S mosquito abatement activities within the VILLAGE; except insofar as the VILLAGE may exercise its ordinary and routine public health, safety, and welfare controls during any mosquito abatement activity.
- 5. This Agreement shall expire on December 31, 2022, or on any date the VILLAGE provides written notice of its intent to terminate this Agreement. This Agreement shall not automatically renew after December 31, 2022, despite automatic renewal provisions contained in the CLARKE AGREEMENT.
- 6. If during the term of this Agreement the VILLAGE elects to increase the service level of mosquito abatement, beyond the scope identified in the CLARKE AGREEMENT, it shall be responsible to pay the TOWNSHIP the entire amount attributable to the increase caused by that level of service. If the VILLAGE elects to decrease the level of mosquito abatement service during the term of this Agreement, its proportionate share payable to the TOWNSHIP will be decreased accordingly. The VILLAGE shall notify the TOWNSHIP of its direction to increase or decrease the service level in writing. The TOWNSHIP shall thereupon notify CLARKE of the VILLAGE's direction.
- 7. During the term of this Agreement the VILLAGE shall have the right to contact the TOWNSHIP and provide any and all information relevant to CLARKE's performance of the CLARKE CONTRACT within the VILLAGE. The TOWNSHIP shall be responsible to communicate the VILLAGE's position to CLARKE and to make certain that CLARKE corrects or remediates any difficulties or concerns that the VILLAGE has with regard to performance of the mosquito abatement services within the VILLAGE.
- 8. The TOWNSHIP and the VILLAGE agree that CLARKE is the TOWNSHIP's independent contractor with regard to the mosquito abatement services described herein. It shall be the responsibility of the TOWNSHIP, and not the VILLAGE, to secure any and all indemnifications and hold harmless agreements the TOWNSHIP deems necessary and appropriate from CLARKE prior to CLARKE's commencement of the performance of its mosquito abatement services within the VILLAGE.
- 9. The TOWNSHIP shall be responsible for directing CLARKE to maintain its independent contractor status while working within the VILLAGE and not to undertake any action which could be interpreted to establish that CLARKE is an apparent agent of the VILLAGE.

- 10. The TOWNSHIP shall require CLARKE to name the VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM as an additional insured on CLARKE'S general commercial liability, auto liability and, if applicable, umbrella policies of CLARKE'S activities in the performance of its mosquito abatement activities in the VILLAGE in accordance with this Agreement.
- 11. The TOWNSHIP shall invoice the VILLAGE for its 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022 proportionate share of CLARKE's mosquito abatement services over four payments on April 1, May 1, June 1, and July 1 of each calendar year. The VILLAGE shall reimburse the TOWNSHIP for amounts due within thirty (30) days of receipt of the invoice. The VILLAGE shall be entitled to receive written confirmation of the completion of work or a treatment from the TOWNSHIP upon written request.
- 12. This Agreement may not be assigned or transferred without mutual written consent of the TOWNSHIP and the VILLAGE.
- 13. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the VILLAGE and the TOWNSHIP and all prior discussions and negotiations associated herewith are merged herein. Any amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be by mutual written consent only.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the VILLAGE and TOWNSHIP have approved this Intergovernmental Agreement by resolution or ordinance and execute the same in conformance therewith.

RE: Intergovernmental Agreement regarding Mosquito Control

After enjoying the last five years without any contract increases, Clarke is now requiring some nominal increases for pricing over the next four years for our Township-wide mosquito coverage. Clarke attributes the increase primarily to the cost increases in their materials. Our contract will continue to provide all the services of the prior years, including the eight community-wide adult sprayings. Additional truck/ATV treatments for community special events has been increased to include up to sixty treatments.

Attached please find a new Appendix A to our agreement setting forth the yearly cost for each municipality and the 50% share as covered by the Township. The increase for the 2019 season amounts to about 1.9% and will be locked in for the 2020 season without further increase. Additional increases for each of 2021 and 2022 to be at the lesser of 2.5% or the CPI-U cost of living increase from December to December. Please note the monthly installments shown are for the four months of billing, April through July.

Please review our active intergovernmental agreement and update the dates for the new contract period to be the four years of 2019 through 2022. Substitute the new Appendix A and provide the Township a copy along with your resolution approving the contract extension based on the pricing listed in the new Appendix A. We would like to make as much use of the existing intergovernmental agreements as possible to minimize new legal review. Please let us know of any issues or concerns before re-writing your prior agreements.

The term of the Agreement shall commence on the date when both parties have executed this Agreement and shall continue for a period ending on December 31, 2022 (the "Initial Term"). Unless either party hereto provides the other party with written notice at least one hundred fifty (150) days prior to the end of the Initial Term or any subsequent renewal term, this Agreement shall automatically continue to renew for additional term, each term having a duration equal to the Initial Agreement. If a party hereto fails to comply with a provision of this Agreement, then the other party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement if it gives written notice of the default to the defaulting party and the defaulting party fails to cure the default within sixty days of receipt of said notice.
- **PRICE INCREASES:** The price for the services rendered hereunder may be П. increased by Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management, Inc. ("Clarke") on the first day of any Calendar year commencing on January 1, 2021 and 2022 (a "Price Increase Date") by either the Consumer Price Index (national CPI-U December-to-December change) used to determine the property tax extension limitation (PTELL) or 2.5% ("Price Increase Percentage"), whichever is less\*. The current 2-year contract for red light camera and administrative tow hearings has expired and requires Village Board action. John Fioti has performed these services for the Village since 2009 in a fair and impartial manner. Furthermore, no adjudicated cases have been appealed in court and staff has worked effectively with Mr. Fioti to adjudicate red light camera and towing violations fairly and expeditiously.

The current rate for these services is \$500/month. Mr. Fioti is requesting a 5% fee increase. The fee increase equates to approximately \$25/month or \$300/year. Attached is a request from the Law Offices of John Fioti to renew his current contract for these services for a two-year period.

#### Bill of Sale for the Public Improvements in the Dermody Subdivision

Seller, **DPIF IL 1 NORTH AVENUE**, **LLC**, a Delaware limited liability company (the "<u>Owner</u>") is the current owner of the real property comprising the Consolidation of the Dermody Subdivision (referred to as the "<u>Subdivision</u>"), which is located at 365 North Avenue, Carol Stream, Illinois. 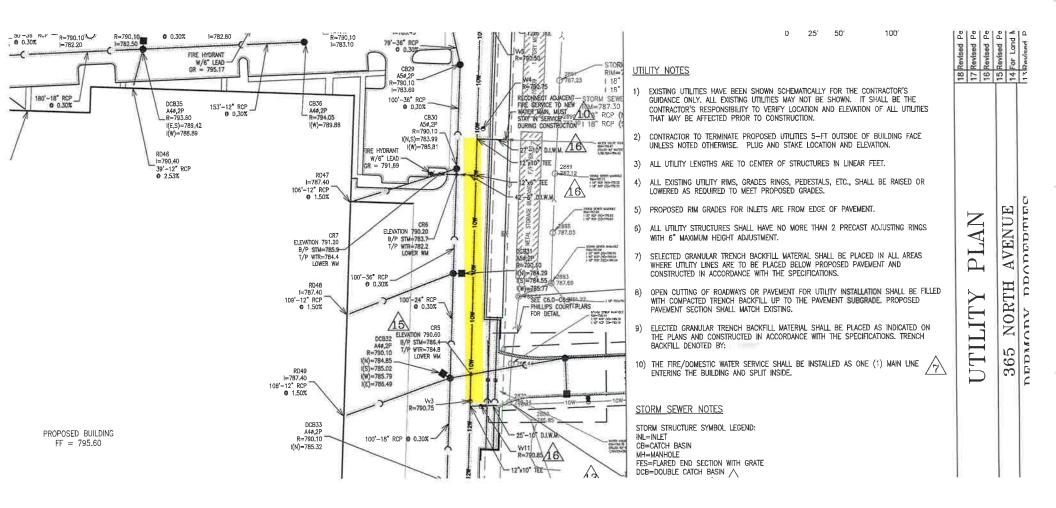

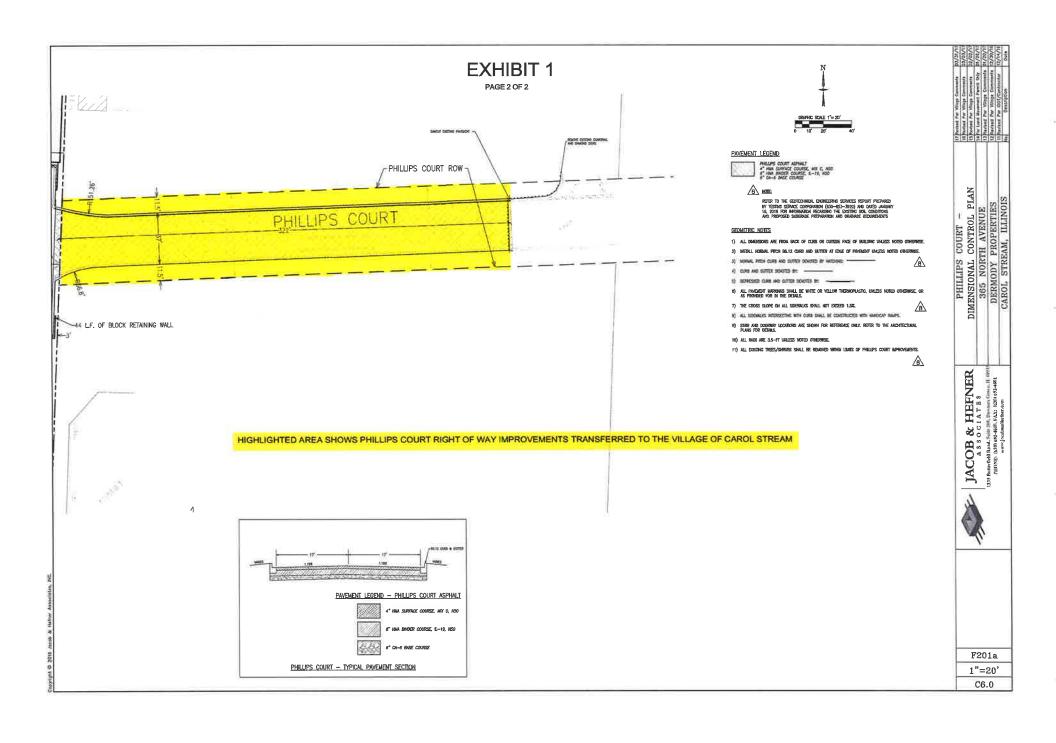

This project will be funded through the Village Motor Fuel Tax account, currently at \$3,586,226.32. As such, Illinois Department of Transportation procedures and documentation will need to be followed.

It is therefore recommended that the IDOT Resolution for Maintenance of Streets and Highways by Municipality Under the Illinois Highway Code be approved in the amount of \$2,088,287.50.

Amendment to the GIS Consortium Membership Agreement

In November of 2015 the Village had joined the GIS Consortium (GISC) and at that time entered into the membership agreement for Geographical Information Systems (GIS) and services. The purpose of the agreement was to establish an intergovernmental partnership for GIS services between all member communities. The GIS Consortium itself, is governed by by-laws established by all of the members. While the by-laws have been periodically updated to reflect the changes and growth of the consortium, the membership agreement has never been updated. As such, a review of the membership agreement was completed in 2018 to ensure that it was consistent with the by-laws.

At the November 15, 2018 GIS Consortium Board Meeting, the community members unanimously approved the amendments to the membership agreement. The changes to the agreement are minimal and are intended to create consistency between the agreement and the consortium bylaws.

#### Changes include:

- Amending the shortened name of the Consortium from GISCon to GISC
- Amending the officers to reflect the creation of an Executive Board of Directors as approved in 2017

Information Technology has reviewed the Membership Agreement and found the agreement to be consistent with the previously approved Membership agreement with only the aforementioned changes. Therefore, staff requests the Board to approve the amended agreement for Carol Stream's membership in the Geographical Information System Consortium (GISC).

# MEMBERSHIP AGREEMENT FOR A GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM CONSORTIUM

This Agreement is entered into this	day of	, 20_	, by and between
the municipalities that have executed this Agr	reement pursu	ant to its terms (	all municipalities are
collectively referred to as "Parties").			

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and Section 3 of the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act authorize and encourage the entering into of Intergovernmental Agreements between units of local government;

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement setting forth the responsibilities of the Parties with regard to the operation of a consortium to develop and share geographic information system information;

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to limit the cost of developing geographic information systems for their communities by participating in group training, joint purchasing and development and innovation sharing;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants of this Agreement and other good and valuable consideration, the Parties agree as follows:

#### I. General Purpose

The general purpose of this Agreement is to provide for an organization through which the Parties may jointly and cooperatively procure professional services for the establishment, operation and maintenance of a geographic information system for the use and benefit of the Parties.

#### II. Construction and Definitions

Section 1. The language in the text of this Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the following rules of construction:

- (a) The singular number includes the plural number and the plural the singular,
- (b) The word "shall" is mandatory; the word "may" is permissive; and
- (c) The masculine gender includes the feminine and neuter

Section 2. When the following words and phrases are used, they shall, for the purposes of this Agreement, have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this Section, except when the context otherwise indicates.

- (a) "GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM CONSORTIUM" or "GISC" means the organization created pursuant to this Agreement.
- (b) "GIS," means geographic information system.
- (c) "BOARD" means the Board of Directors of GISC, consisting of one (1) Director (and one (1) alternate Director) from each governmental unit, which is a member of GISC.
- (d) "CORPORATE AUTHORITIES" means the governing body of the member governmental unit.
- (e) "MEMBER" means a Governmental Unit, which enters into this Agreement and is, at any specific time not in default as set forth in this Agreement.
- (f) "FORMER MEMBER" means any entity, which was once a Member, but has either withdrawn from GISC or whose membership was terminated pursuant to this Agreement.
- (g) "UNIT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT" or "GOVERNMENTAL UNIT" means and includes any political subdivision of the State of Illinois or any department or agency of the state government or any city, village or any taxing body.
- (h) "SOFTWARE" means computer programs, form designs, user manuals, data specifications and associated documentation.

- (i) "SERVICE PROVIDER" means any professional services firm(s) that GISC designates as the firm(s) to establish, operate, maintain or support geographic information systems, for the Members.
- (j) "SECONDARY SERVICE PROVIDER" means a Service Provider not limited to a supplier of software, hardware, mapping or other services.
- (k) "INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY" means any and all software, data or maps generated by or for GISC. Such intellectual property shall be considered privileged and confidential trade secrets and shall constitute valuable formulae, design and research data or which Members have given substantial consideration.

#### III. Membership

Section 1. Any Governmental Unit may be eligible to become a member of GISC.

Section 2. A Governmental Unit desiring to be a member shall execute a counterpart of this Agreement and shall pay initial membership dues of a minimum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000) and a maximum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) to be pro-rated in accordance with the formula contained in Exhibit A. Payment shall be made to the Secretary-Treasurer, or equivalent, of GISC to offset the cost of the legal and administrative expenses of the formation, operation and administration of GISC.

Section 3. Members shall enter into a GIS service contract, with the Service Provider substantially conforming with the agreement attached in Exhibit B or as modified by the GISC Board, within one (1) year of signing this Agreement. Members are expected to enter into any agreements with Secondary Service Providers deemed necessary for the functioning of GISC within a reasonable time as determined by the Board of Directors. Members shall be subject to the provisions of this Agreement, including but not limited to Article XIV.

Section 4. Any Governmental Unit desiring to enter into this Agreement may do so by the duly authorized execution of a counterpart of this Agreement by its proper officers. Thereupon, the clerk or other corresponding officer of the Governmental Unit shall file a duly executed copy of the Agreement, together with a certified copy of the authorizing resolution or other action, with the GISC President. The resolution authorizing the execution of the Agreement shall also designate the first Director and alternate for the Member.

Section 5. The Charter Members shall be the Members consisting of Glencoe, Highland Park, Lincolnshire and Park Ridge.

Section 6. Any Member joining GISC agrees, upon joining, that if it is to become a Former Member, it will be bound by all of the obligations of a Former Member as set forth in this Agreement.

Section 7. Former members will require a favorable vote of two-thirds (2/3) majority of the Board of Directors in order to rejoin the GISC.

#### IV. Board of Directors

Section 1. The governing body of GISC shall be its Board of Directors. Each Member shall be entitled to one (1) Director, who shall have one (1) vote.

Section 2. Each Member shall also be entitled to one Alternate Director who shall be entitled to attend meetings of the Board and who may vote in the absence of the Member's Director.

Section 3. The Corporate Authorities of each Member shall appoint Directors and Alternate Directors. In order for GISC to develop data processing and management information systems of maximum value to Member Governmental Units, the Members shall appoint, as their Director and Alternate, a chief administrative officer, a department head and employees with significant management responsibility and experience. Directors and Alternates shall serve without compensation from GISC.

Section 4. A vacancy shall immediately occur in the office of any Director upon his resignation, death, removal by the Corporate Authorities of the Member, or ceasing to be an employee of the Member.

#### V. Powers and Duties of the Board

Section 1. The powers and duties of the Board shall include the powers set forth in this Article.

Section 2. It shall take such action, as it deems necessary and appropriate to accomplish the general purposes of the organization in negotiating with a Service Provider to determine

annual rates and usage levels for the members and other ancillary powers to administer GISC.

- Section 3. It may establish and collect membership dues.
- Section 4. It may establish and collect charges for its services to Members and to others.
- Section 5. It may exercise any other power necessary and incidental to the implementation of its powers and duties.

#### VI. Officers

Section 1. The officers of the Executive Board and their powers and duties are defined in the By-Laws.

#### VII. Financial Matters

- Section 1. The fiscal year of GISC shall be the calendar year.
- Section 2. An annual budget for the next fiscal year shall be adopted by the Board at the annual meeting by December 31st of each year. Copies shall be provided to the chief administrative officer of each Member.
- Section 3. The Board shall have authority to adjust cost sharing charges for all Members in an amount sufficient to provide the funds required by the budgets of GISC.

Section 4. Billings for all charges shall be made by the Board and shall be due when rendered. Any Member whose charges have not been paid within 90 days after billing shall be in default and shall not be entitled to further voting privileges or to have its director hold any office on the Board and shall not use any GISC facilities or programs until such time as such Member is no longer in default. Members in default shall be subject to the provisions within this Agreement. In the event that such charges have not been paid within 90 days of such billing, such defaulting Member shall be deemed to have given, on such 90<sup>th</sup> day, notice of withdrawal from membership. In the event of a bona fide dispute between the Member and the Board as to the amount which is due and payable, the member shall nevertheless make such payment in order to preserve its status as a Member, but such payment may be made under protest and without prejudice to its right to dispute the amount of the charge and to pursue any legal remedies available to it. Withdrawal shall not relieve any such Member from its financial obligations as

set forth in this Agreement.

Section 5. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall prevent the Board from charging nonmembers for services rendered by GISC, on such basis, as the Board shall deem appropriate.

Section 6. It is anticipated that certain Members may be in a position to extend special financial assistance to GISC in the form of grants. The Board may credit any such grants against any charges, which the granting Member would otherwise have to pay. The Board may also enter into an agreement, as a condition to any such grant, that it will credit all or a portion of such grant towards charges, which have been made or in the future may be made against one or more specified Members.

Section 7. The Board, in accordance with procedures established in the By-Laws may expend board funds. The Board must authorize all expenditures by simple majority.

#### VIII. Termination of Membership

Section 1. Failure to enter into an agreement with the Service Provider within one (1) year of GISC's designation of the Service Provider shall be cause for the termination of membership. A 30-day written notice will be given to a Member that fails to enter into an agreement with the Service Provider as provided in this Section. Upon the failure to enter into an agreement at the end of the thirty-day (30) notice period, its membership shall be terminated.

Section 2. Failure to enter into an agreement within thirty 30 days of expiration of the previous agreement with Service Provider shall result in membership termination.

Section 3. A member may be terminated for cause based on an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Board of Directors.

Section 4. Upon termination of any Member, the Member shall be responsible for:

- (a) All of its pro-rated share of any obligations;
- (b) Its share of all charges to the effective date of termination; and
- (c) Any contractual obligations it has separately incurred with GISC or the Service Provider.

Section 5. A Member terminated from membership at a time when such termination does not result in dissolution of GISC, shall forfeit its claim to any assets of GISC. Any terminated

Member shall be subject to the provisions described elsewhere in this agreement.

#### IX. Withdrawal

Section 1. Any Member may at any time give written notice of withdrawal from GISC. The nonpayment of charges as set forth in this Agreement or the refusal or declination of any member to be bound by any obligation to GISC shall constitute written notice of withdrawal.

- (a) Actual withdrawal shall not take effect for a period of six (6) months from the date of such notification.
- (b) Upon effective withdrawal the withdrawing member shall continue to be responsible for:
  - (i) All of its pro-rated share of any obligations;
  - (ii) Its share of all charges to the effective date of termination;
  - (iii) Any contractual obligations it has separately incurred with GISC or the Service Provider(s).

Section 2. A Member withdrawing from membership at a time when such withdrawal does not result in dissolution of GISC shall forfeit its claim to any assets of GISC. Any Member that withdraws shall be subject to the provisions of this Agreement. In addition, any Member withdrawing shall promptly remove, at its own expense, any and all software, maps or other data that was not developed exclusively for the Member's benefit, except under terms as provided for elsewhere in this Agreement. The withdrawing Member shall, within thirty (30) days of withdrawal, file a certification with the Board, verifying compliance with this Section.

#### X. Dissolution

Section 1. GISC shall be dissolved whenever:

- (a) A sufficient number of Members withdraw from GISC to reduce the total number of Members to less than two (2) or
- (b) By two-thirds (2/3) vote of all Directors.

Section 2. In the event of dissolution, the Board shall determine the procedures necessary to affect the dissolution and shall provide for the taking of such measures as promptly as

circumstances permit subject to the provisions of this Agreement.

Section 3. Upon dissolution, after payment of all obligations the remaining assets of GISC shall be distributed among the then existing Members in proportion to their contributions to GISC during the entire period of such Member's membership, as determined by the Board. The computer software that GISC developed for its membership shall be available to the Members, subject to such reasonable rules and regulations, as the Board shall determine.

Section 4. If, upon dissolution, there is an organizational deficit, such deficit shall be charged to and paid by the Members and Former Member in accordance with obligations as described in Article IX on a pro-rata basis, the pro-rata basis is calculated from the Members' contributions to GISC during the two (2) years preceding the date of the vote to dissolve.

Section 5. In the event of dissolution the following provisions shall govern the distribution of computer software owned by GISC:

- (a) All such software shall be an asset of GISC.
- (b) A Member may use any software developed during its membership in accordance with this agreement, upon:
  - (i) Paying any unpaid sums due GISC,
  - (ii) Paying the costs of taking such software, and
  - (iii) Complying with reasonable rules and regulations of the Board relating to the taking and use of such software. Such rules and regulations may include a reasonable time within which any Member must take such software.

#### XI. General Conditions

Section 1. Notice. All notices hereunder shall be in writing, and shall be deemed given when delivered in person or by United States certified mail, with return receipt requested, and if mailed, with postage prepaid. All notices shall be addressed as follows:

If to GISC:

President of GISC

With a copy to the GISC Secretary-Treasurer, or equivalent.

If to Member:

Each party shall have the right to designate other addresses for service of notices, provided notice of change of address is duly given.

Section 2. The Parties certify that they are not barred from entering into this Agreement as a result of violations of either Section 33E-3 or Section 33E-4 of the Illinois Criminal Code and that they each have a written sexual harassment policy in place in full compliance with 775 ILCS 5/2-105(A)(4).

#### XII. Duration

This agreement shall continue in effect indefinitely, until terminated in accordance with its terms or until GISC is dissolved.

#### XIII. Member Software Usage

Section 1. No Member or Former Member shall:

- (a) Permit any other parties to use, modify, translate, reverse engineer, decompile, disassemble (except to the extent applicable laws specifically prohibit such restriction) or create derivative works based on the software;
- (b) Copy the software, unless part of normal backup procedures;
- (c) Sell, rent, lease, license, give away or grant a security interest in or otherwise transfer rights to the software; or
- (d) Remove any proprietary notices or labels on the software without written permission from the Board.

Section 2. In the event of default, withdrawal or termination of membership of a

Member, that Member may use, under license granted by the Board, any software developed during its membership upon:

- (a) Paying to the Board any unpaid sums due GISC and
- (b) Paying any reasonable costs established by the Board for licensing such software.

#### XIV. Service Provider

Section 1. For the purposes of this article, the Service Provider is defined as the Service Provider and Secondary Service Provider.

- Section 2. The term of any Service Provider shall be as set forth in the Service Provider Agreement.
- Section 3. The Board may at any time by a majority vote name a new Service Provider, whose term shall begin at such time as the Board may authorize.
- Section 4. A Service Provider's term shall be renewed upon such terms as the Board may approve.
- Section 5. The Board may terminate the services of a Service Provider at any time, subject only to the Service Provider agreement.
- Section 6. The Board may enter into agreements with more than one Service Provider if it deems it appropriate to do so.

#### XV. Intellectual Property

- Section 1. Members agree that no assignments, licenses, sales, authorization of reuse by others, giveaways, transfer or any other grant of Intellectual Property rights will be made to any third party without written permission from the Board.
- Section 2. It is understood that this Agreement does not grant to any Member or any employees, partners or other business associates thereof, any rights in any Intellectual Property or any inherent protectable interests, except those specifically provided by this Agreement.

#### XVI. Execution of Agreement

This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall for all purposes be deemed to be an original; and all such counterparts, or as many of them as GISC and the Members or additional Members shall preserve undestroyed, shall together constitute but one and the same instrument.

### Supplemental Statement of Work

Pursuant to and in accordance with Section 1.2 of that certain GIS Consortium Service Provider Contract dated May 1, 2015 (the "Contract") between the Village of Carol Stream, an Illinois municipal corporation (the "Municipality") and Municipal GIS Partners, Incorporated (the "Consultant"), the parties hereby agree to the following SUPPLEMENTAL STATEMENT OF WORK, effective January 1, 2019 ("SOW"):

### Description of Additional Services:

Section 3 of the Attachment 1 to the Contract ("Attachment 1") shall be deleted and replaced with the following language:

"The Consultant will provide the necessary resources to support the GIS program. The allocation of these resources will be reasonably commensurate with the level of expertise required to fulfill the specific task which includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- A. The Onsite Analyst provides the daily operation, maintenance, and support of the program for the Municipality. The Onsite Analyst is responsible for database management and data quality, map and product development, user training and help-desk, project identification and program documentation.
- B. The Shared Analyst provides technical support to the Onsite Analyst and the Municipality including trouble-shooting and project implementation. The Shared Analyst is responsible for developing, testing, and managing the GISC shared solutions including the standard data model and processes, centralized databases, and software applications.
- C. The Client Account Manager is responsible for the coordination and operation of the program for the Municipality including leadership alignment and reporting, planning and budgeting, resource allocation, and performance management.
- D. The Manager is responsible for the overall GISC program including the development and implementation of new shared opportunities based on the direction and instructions of the GISC Board of Directors."

## 2. Project Schedule/Term:

Pursuant to Section 5.2 of the Contract, this SOW shall extend the Initial Term for an additional one (1) year period. For the avoidance of doubt, this Renewal Term shall commence on May 1, 2019 and remain in effect for one (1) year.

## Projected Utilization:

Amendment to the Resolution approving a Local Agency Agreement with

IDOT for Lies Road LAFO (Gary Avenue to Schmale Road)

In October of 2018 the Village Board approved a Local Agency Agreement for Federal Participation and a Resolution for funding the Lies Road paving project. Staff submitted the agreement and resolution for IDOT review last year.

On Tuesday, IDOT requested that the agreement be modified to include additional addendum attachments. In addition to the location map and resolution, they have requested the DuPage County agreement to maintain the Schmale Road guardrail, the Grant of Easement from the Chicago Central and Pacific Railroad, and Grant Accountability and Transparency Act (GATA) uniform reporting requirements.

Rather than simply resigning the agreement, it was decided to amend the resolution to provide a clear paper trail. Engineering staff therefore recommends that the amendment to the resolution be approved and the Local Agency Agreement be signed by the Mayor.

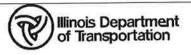

#### **Agreement Provisions**

### THE LPA AGREES:

- To acquire in its name, or in the name of the **STATE** if on the **STATE** highway system, all right-of-way necessary for this project in accordance with the requirements of Titles II and III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, and established State policies and procedures. Prior to advertising for bids, the **LPA** shall certify to the **STATE** that all requirements of Titles II and III of said Uniform Act have been satisfied. The disposition of encroachments, if any, will be cooperatively determined by representatives of the **LPA**, and the **STATE** and the **FHWA**, if required.
- To provide for all utility adjustments, and to regulate the use of the right-of-way of this improvement by utilities, public and private, in accordance with the current Utility Accommodation Policy for Local Agency Highway and Street Systems.
- (3) To provide for surveys and the preparation of plans for the proposed improvement and engineering supervision during construction of the proposed improvement.
- (4) To retain jurisdiction of the completed improvement unless specified otherwise by addendum (addendum should be accompanied by a location map). If the improvement location is currently under road district jurisdiction, an addendum is required.
- To maintain or cause to be maintained, in a manner satisfactory to the **STATE** and the **FHWA**, the completed improvement, or that portion of the completed improvement within its jurisdiction as established by addendum referred to in item 4 above.
- (6) To comply with all applicable Executive Orders and Federal Highway Acts pursuant to the Equal Employment Opportunity and Nondiscrimination Regulations required by the U.S. Department of Transportation.
- To maintain, for a minimum of 3 years after final project close-out by the STATE, adequate books, records and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipients and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with the contract; the contract and all books, records and supporting documents related to the contract shall be available for review and audit by the Auditor General and the department; and the LPA agrees to cooperate fully with any audit conducted by the Auditor General and the STATE; and to provide full access to all relevant materials. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the STATE for the recovery of any funds paid by the STATE under the contract for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.
- (8) To provide if required, for the improvement of any railroad-highway grade crossing and rail crossing protection within the limits of the proposed improvement.
- (9) To comply with Federal requirements or possibly lose (partial or total) Federal participation as determined by the FHWA.
- (10) (State Contracts Only) That the method of payment designated on page one will be as follows:
  - Method A Lump Sum Payment. Upon award of the contract for this improvement, the **LPA** will pay to the **STATE** within thirty (30) calendar days of billing, in lump sum, an amount equal to 80% of the **LPA**'s estimated obligation incurred under this Agreement. The **LPA** will pay to the **STATE** the remainder of the **LPA**'s obligation (including any nonparticipating costs) within thirty (30) calendar days of billing in a lump sum, upon completion of the project based on final costs.
  - Method B Monthly Payments. Upon award of the contract for this improvement, the LPA will pay to the STATE, a specified amount each month for an estimated period of months, or until 80% of the LPA's estimated obligation under the provisions of the Agreement has been paid, and will pay to the STATE the remainder of the LPA's obligation (including any nonparticipating costs) in a lump sum, upon completion of the project based upon final costs.
  - Method C Progress Payments. Upon receipt of the contractor's first and subsequent progressive bills for this improvement, the LPA will pay to the STATE within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt, an amount equal to the LPA's share of the construction cost divided by the estimated total cost, multiplied by the actual payment (appropriately adjusted for nonparticipating costs) made to the contractor until the entire obligation incurred under this Agreement has been paid.

Failure to remit the payment(s) in a timely manner as required under Methods A, B, or C, shall allow the **STATE** to internally offset, reduce, or deduct the arrearage from any payment or reimbursement due or about to become due and payable from the **STATE** to **LPA** on this or any other contract. The **STATE**, at its sole option, upon notice to the **LPA**, may place the debt into the Illinois Comptroller's Offset System (15 ILCS 405/10.05) or take such other and further action as my be required to recover the debt.

- (11) (Local Contracts or Day Labor) To provide or cause to be provided all of the initial funding, equipment, labor, material and services necessary to construct the complete project.
- (12) (Preliminary Engineering) In the event that right-of-way acquisition for, or actual construction of, the project for which this preliminary engineering is undertaken with Federal participation is not started by the close of the tenth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the project is federally authorized, the LPA will repay the STATE any Federal funds received under the terms of this Agreement.
- (13) (Right-of-Way Acquisition) In the event that the actual construction of the project on this right-of-way is not undertaken by the close of the twentieth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the project is federally authorized, the LPA will repay the STATE any Federal Funds received under the terms of this Agreement.

(14) (Railroad Related Work Only) The estimates and general layout plans for at-grade crossing improvements should be forwarded to the Rail Safety and Project Engineer, Room 204, Illinois Department of Transportation, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois, 62764. Approval of the estimates and general layout plans should be obtained prior to the commencement of railroad related work. All railroad related work is also subject to approval be the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC). Final inspection for railroad related work should be coordinated through appropriate IDOT District Bureau of Local Roads and Streets office.

Plans and preemption times for signal related work that will be interconnected with traffic signals shall be submitted to the ICC for review and approval prior to the commencement of work. Signal related work involving interconnects with state maintained traffic signals should also be coordinated with the IDOT's District Bureau of Operations.

The **LPA** is responsible for the payment of the railroad related expenses in accordance with the **LPA**/railroad agreement prior to requesting reimbursement from IDOT. Requests for reimbursement should be sent to the appropriate IDOT District Bureau of Local Roads and Streets office.

Engineer's Payment Estimates shall be in accordance with the Division of Cost on page one.

- (15) And certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief its officials:
  - (a) are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency;
  - (b) have not within a three-year period preceding this Agreement been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements receiving stolen property;
  - (c) are not presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity (Federal, State, local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in item (b) of this certification; and
  - (d) have not within a three-year period preceding the Agreement had one or more public transactions (Federal, State, local) terminated for cause or default.
- (16) To include the certifications, listed in item 15 above, and all other certifications required by State statutes, in every contract, including procurement of materials and leases of equipment.
- (17) (State Contracts) That execution of this agreement constitutes the **LPA**'s concurrence in the award of the construction contract to the responsible low bidder as determined by the **STATE**.
- (18) That for agreements exceeding \$100,000 in federal funds, execution of this Agreement constitutes the LPA's certification that:
  - (a) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or any employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement;
  - (b) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress, in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying", in accordance with its instructions;
  - (c) The **LPA** shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all subawards at all ties (including subcontracts, subgrants and contracts under grants, loans and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.
- (19) To regulate parking and traffic in accordance with the approved project report.
- (20) To regulate encroachments on public right-of-way in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- (21) To regulate the discharge of sanitary sewage into any storm water drainage system constructed with this improvement in accordance with current Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- To complete this phase of the project within three (3) years from the date this agreement is approved by the **STATE** if this portion of the project described in the Project Description does not exceed \$1,000,000 (five years if the project costs exceed \$1,000,000).
- To comply with the federal Financial Integrity Review and Evaluation (FIRE) program, which requires States and subrecipients to justify continued federal funding on inactive projects. 23 CFR 630.106(a)(5) defines an inactive project as a project which no expenditures have been charged against Federal funds for the past twelve (12) months.
  - To keep projects active, invoicing must occur a minimum of one time within any given twelve (12) month period. However, to ensure adequate processing time, the first invoice shall be submitted to the **STATE** within six (6) months of the federal authorization date. Subsequent invoices will be submitted in intervals not to exceed six (6) months.
- The LPA will submit supporting documentation with each request for reimbursement from the STATE. Supporting documentation is defined as verification of payment, certified time sheets or summaries, vendor invoices, vendor receipts, cost plus fix fee invoice, progress report, and personnel and direct cost summaries.and other documentation supporting the requested reimbursement amount (Form BLRS 05621 should be used for consultant invoicing purposes). LPA invoice requests to the STATE will be submitted with sequential invoice numbers by project.

The **LPA** will submit to the **STATE** a complete and detailed final invoice with applicable supporting documentation of all incurred costs, less previous payments, no later than twelve (12) months from the date of completion of this phase of the improvement or from the date of the previous invoice, which ever occurs first. If a final invoice is not received within this time frame, the most recent invoice may be considered the final invoice and the obligation of the funds closed.

- The LPA shall provide the final report to the appropriate STATE district within twelve months of the physical completion date of the project so that the report may be audited and approved for payment. If the deadline cannot be met, a written explanation must be provided to the district prior to the end of the twelve months documenting the reason and the new anticipated date of completion. If the extended deadline is not met, this process must be repeated until the project is closed. Failure to follow this process may result in the immediate close-out of the project and loss of further funding.
- (26) (Single Audit Requirements) That if the **LPA** expends \$750,000 or more a year in federal financial assistance they shall have an audit made in accordance with 2 CFR 200. **LPA**s expending less than \$750,000 a year shall be exempt from compliance. A copy of the audit report must be submitted to the **STATE** (Office of Finance and Administration, Audit Coordination Section, 2300 South Dirksen Parkway, Springfield, Illinois, 62764), within 30 days after the completion of the audit, but no later than one year after the end of the **LPA**'s fiscal year. The CFDA number for all highway planning and construction activities is 20.205.
  - Federal funds utilized for constructon activities on projects let and awarded by the **STATE** (denoted by an "X" in the State Contract field at the top of page 1) are not included in a **LPA**'s calculation of federal funds expended by the **LPA** for Single Audit purposes.
- That the **LPA** is required to register with the System for Award Management or SAM (formerly Central Contractor Registration (CCR)), which is a web-enabled government-wide application that collects, validates, stores, and disseminates business information about the federal government's trading partners in support of the contract award and the electronic payment processes. To register or renew, please use the following website: <a href="https://www.sam.gov/portal/public/SAM/#1">https://www.sam.gov/portal/public/SAM/#1</a>.
  - The **LPA** is also required to obtain a Dun & Bradstreet (D&B) D-U-N-S Number. This is a unique nine digit number required to identify subrecipients of federal funding. A D-U-N-S number can be obtained at the following website: <a href="http://fedgov.dnb.com/webform">http://fedgov.dnb.com/webform</a>.

### THE STATE AGREES:

- (1) To provide such guidance, assistance and supervision and to monitor and perform audits to the extent necessary to assure validity of the **LPA**'s certification of compliance with Titles II and III requirements.
- (2) (State Contracts) To receive bids for the construction of the proposed improvement when the plans have been approved by the **STATE** (and **FHWA**, if required) and to award a contract for construction of the proposed improvement, after receipt of a satisfactory bid.
- (3) (Day Labor) To authorize the **LPA** to proceed with the construction of the improvement when Agreed Unit Prices are approved, and to reimburse the **LPA** for that portion of the cost payable from Federal and/or State funds based on the Agreed Unit Prices and Engineer's Payment Estimates in accordance with the Division of Cost on page one.
- (4) (Local Contracts) For agreements with Federal and/or State funds in engineering, right-of-way, utility work and/or construction work:
  - (a) To reimburse the **LPA** for the Federal and/or State share on the basis of periodic billings, provided said billings contain sufficient cost information and show evidence of payment by the **LPA**;
  - (b) To provide independent assurance sampling, to furnish off-site material inspection and testing at sources normally visited by **STATE** inspectors of steel, cement, aggregate, structural steel and other materials customarily tested by the **STATE**.

#### IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

- (1) Construction of the project will utilize domestic steel as required by Section 106.01 of the current edition of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction and federal Buy America provisions.
- That this Agreement and the covenants contained herein shall become null and void in the event that the **FHWA** does not approve the proposed improvement for Federal-aid participation within one (1) year of the date of execution of this Agreement.
- (3) This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties, their successors and assigns.
- For contracts awarded by the **LPA**, the **LPA** shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the award and performance of any USDOT assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The **LPA** shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of USDOT assisted contracts. The **LPA**'s DBE program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by USDOT, is incorporated by reference in this Agreement. Upon notification to the recipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the **STATE** may impose sanctions as provided for under part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for

enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31U.S.C. 3801 et seq.). In the absence of a USDOT – approved **LPA** DBE Program or on State awarded contracts, this Agreement shall be administered under the provisions of the **STATE**'s USDOT approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program.

- In cases where the **STATE** is reimbursing the **LPA**, obligations of the **STATE** shall cease immediately without penalty or further payment being required if, in any fiscal year, the Illinois General Assembly or applicable Federal Funding source fails to appropriate or otherwise make available funds for the work contemplated herein.
- (6) All projects for the construction of fixed works which are financed in whole or in part with funds provided by this Agreement and/or amendment shall be subject to the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.) unless the provisions of that Act exempt its application.

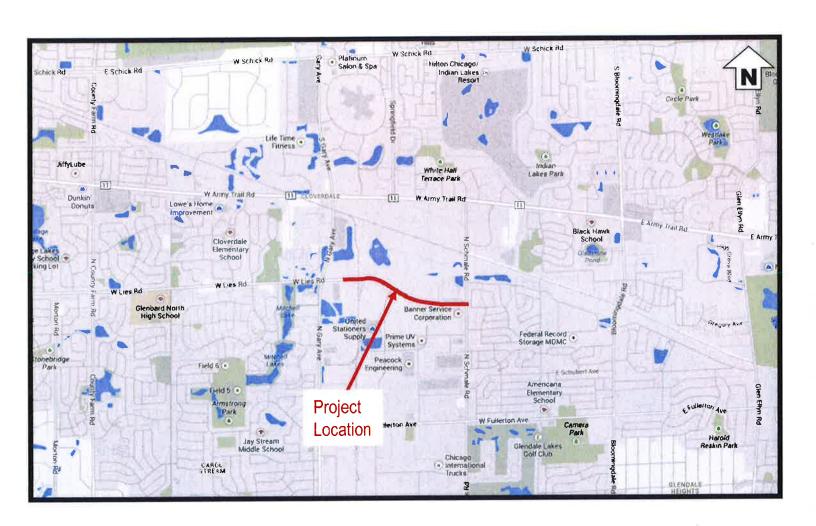
