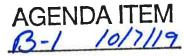

#### PROPERTY TAX PUBLIC FORUM

Mayor Saverino commented on why we are here and asked for public participation.

Finance Director Jon Batek presented slides showing the need for a more stable revenue source and more specifically a property tax as follows:

#### Background:

- The Village last imposed a property tax in the 1970's but it was discontinued due to developer-related revenues during the Village's rapid growth years.
- Current revenue sources are increasingly volatile due to:
  - Heavy reliance on Sales Tax
  - State cuts to Municipal Revenue (LGDF, PPRT, Sales Tax)

• Past Village Board Strategic Plans and Budget Workshops focused on greater stability for the funding of Village operations and capital improvements.

#### Recent Public Meeting Discussions:

- 1. <u>August 5, 2019</u> Presented an updated Financial Profile and Peer Comparison showing key financial metrics for Carol Stream compared to 10 municipal peer organizations.
- 2. <u>August 19, 2019</u> Presented Current Revenue and Expenditure Trends and a Plan for Improving Long-term Financial Stability. This included a discussion of sustaining Village operations (General Fund) and a review of Capital Improvement Plan funding levels if a property tax were implemented.

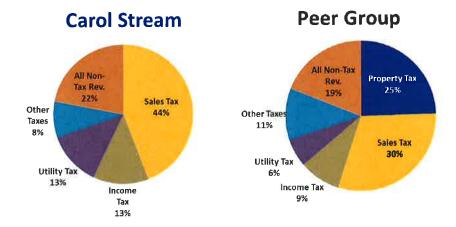

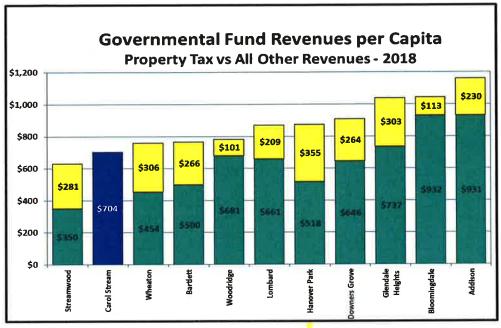

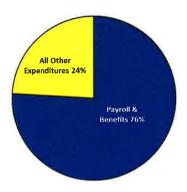

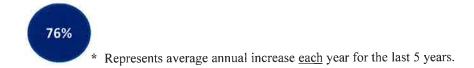
#### 5 Year General Fund Expenditures

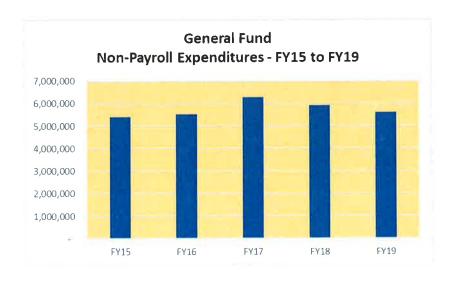

#### 5 Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP)

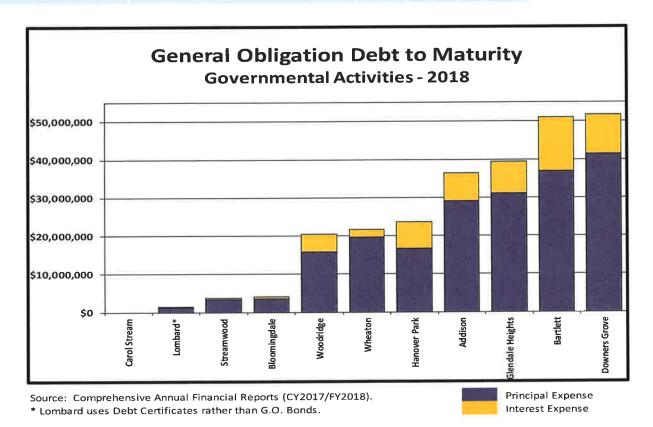
- The 5 year CIP currently projects reserve will be depleted during the 3<sup>rd</sup> year (FY22) of the 5 year plan.
- This assumes no surplus transfers from the General Fund.
- The amount and availability of regular General Fund surpluses are not as reliable as in years' past. There have been no transfers made in the last 2 years.
- Without additional regular funding, the scope of capital infrastructure improvements will need to be cut back significantly.

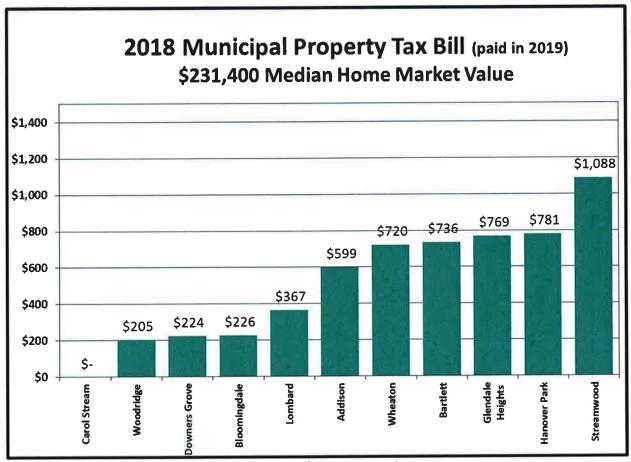

#### Capital Improvement Program Expenditures

- The CIP requires approximately \$5.6 million in regular annual funding per year over the next 5 years (net of programmed grant and other cost sharing funding).
- With \$2.5 million of current funding, this leaves a shortfall of about \$3.1 million per year to adequately fund the program.

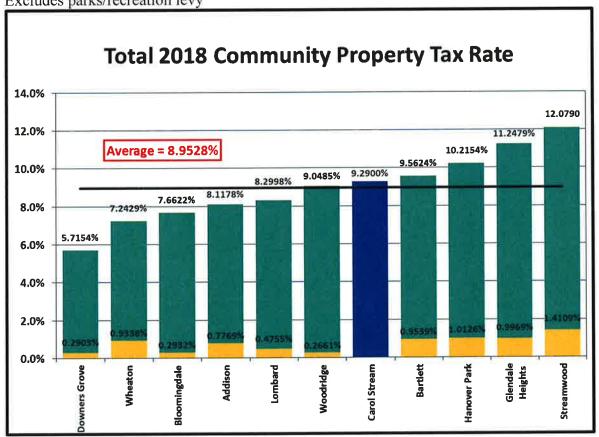

#### General 2019 Property Tax Levy Timeline

- > September, 2019 Carol Stream Library Board considers their 2019 property tax request and forwards to Village.
- October, 2019 Village adopts a resolution recording the determination of the amounts of money estimated to be needed from the property tax. This would include both Library and Village estimate.
- November, 2019 A public hearing would be noticed and required prior to adoption of the combined Village/Library levy. Once public hearing is closed, the Board may approve the levy by ordinance later the same meeting.
- December, 2019 Levy must be filed in the DuPage County Clerk's Office no later than the last Tuesday in December.

#### Public Participation included:

Jack Krans talked about IMRF and the State of Illinois pension system. He is concerned that raising taxes will drive people away from the State. Mr. Krans talked about public schools and charter schools and internet education. Village Board encouraged Mr. Krans to speak to the school board as the Village has no control over teacher pensions.

John Zimmerman thanked the Village Board for their response on high water bills. He stated the property tax would place additional burden on tax payers and is concerned whether the Board has done everything it can to prevent a property tax. Mr. Zimmerman stated salaries are higher and wonders if the Village has done everything it can related to high staff costs. He asked if there is more we can do to increase sales tax? Mr. Zimmerman stated he is concerned with the Village Hall renovation and the fact that the Village has depleted reserves. He would like the Village to form a committee similar to flooding for property tax.

Randall Mueller is concerned with the timing and optics of the tax. He understands the necessity for it, but would like an outline of the next few years. Mr. Mueller does not want people to move out because of a property tax and would like to see incentives for businesses to stay in Carol Stream.

Joe Scaccia stated he does not like the "reliable income" phrase and thinks the Village should change marketing of the proposal. He is concerned with the State's deficit and pension problem and would like the Village to look at everything.

Sharon Leach questioned what the Village is doing to attract more stores. She also asked if the residents have a say on a property tax or capping it. Mayor Saverino commented on economic development efforts and what the Village has accomplished.

John Torraco questioned if the property tax applies to all property owners. Mayor stated he cannot restrict which area gets taxed. Trustee Zalak stated a property tax option includes the possible elimination of vehicle stickers.

Engineering Services Director Bill Cleveland discussed the danger of deferred maintenance and the Village's grant funding efforts.

Trustee Greg Schwarze thanked everyone for attending and stated apart from vehicle stickers, residents currently do not contribute anything for the services provided.

Mayor Saverino shared DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference Legislative Committee discussion about water tower painting and how it is \$200,000 more to paint a tower because of a bill in Springfield. There are a lot of issues with the State that need to be addressed.

James Brewer asked about the Wayfair decision and if the Village is getting our fair share of internet sales. Finance department reviews sales tax reporting of village businesses and the Village has not been able to for online sales. Internet sales tax will go into effect July 1, but the Village cannot predict revenue impact.

Ron Shreve asked about the sale of cannabis in town and what is the Village Board's position. The Village is undecided at this time.

Trustee Gieser thanked everyone for attending.

Trustee Frusolone talked about economic development and stated the industrial park vacancy rate was at 25% and has gone down to single digits under 5%.

Mayor Saverino thanked everyone for attending.

There being no further business, Trustee Schwarze moved and Trustee Gieser made the second to adjourn the Special Workshop meeting. The meeting was adjourned unanimously at 11:01 a.m.

#### **PROPERTY TAX PUBLIC FORUM**

Mayor Saverino commented on why we are here and asked for public participation.

Finance Director Jon Batek presented slides showing the need for a more stable revenue source and more specifically a property tax as follows:

#### Background:

- The Village last imposed a property tax in the 1970's but it was discontinued due to developer-related revenues during the Village's rapid growth years.
- Current revenue sources are increasingly volatile due to:
  - Heavy reliance on Sales Tax
  - State cuts to Municipal Revenue (LGDF, PPRT, Sales Tax)
- Past Village Board Strategic Plans and Budget Workshops focused on greater stability for the funding of Village operations and capital improvements.

Recent Public Meeting Discussions:

- 1. <u>August 5, 2019</u> Presented an updated Financial Profile and Peer Comparison showing key financial metrics for Carol Stream compared to 10 municipal peer organizations.
- 2. <u>August 19, 2019</u> Presented Current Revenue and Expenditure Trends and a Plan for Improving Long-term Financial Stability. This included a discussion of sustaining Village operations (General Fund) and a review of Capital Improvement Plan funding levels if a property tax were implemented.

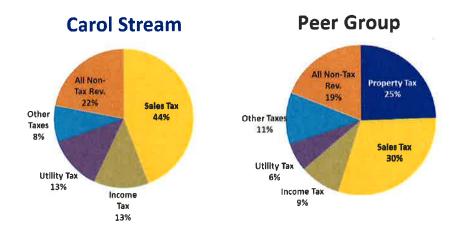

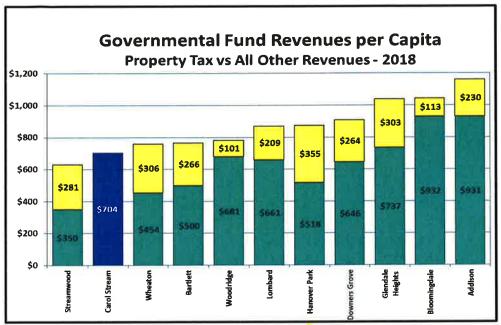

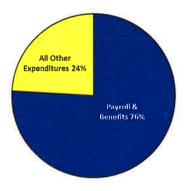

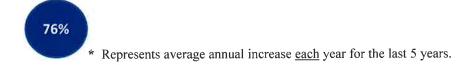
#### 5 Year General Fund Expenditures

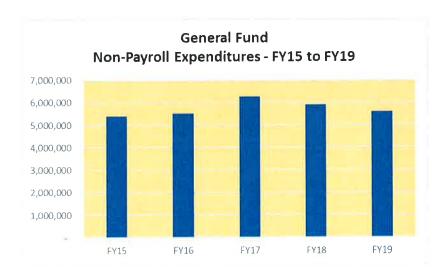

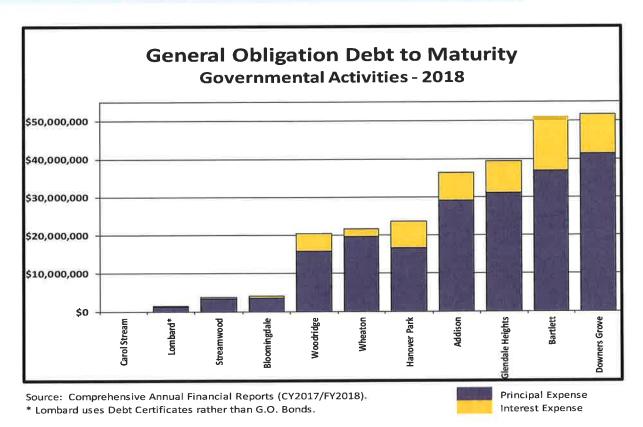
- The 5 year CIP currently projects reserve will be depleted during the 3<sup>rd</sup> year (FY22) of the 5 year plan.

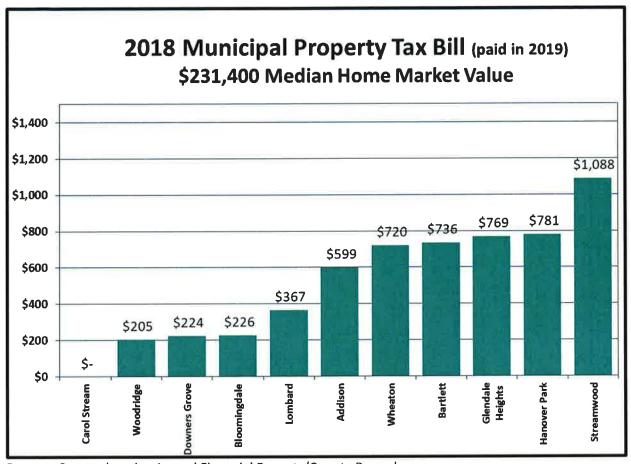

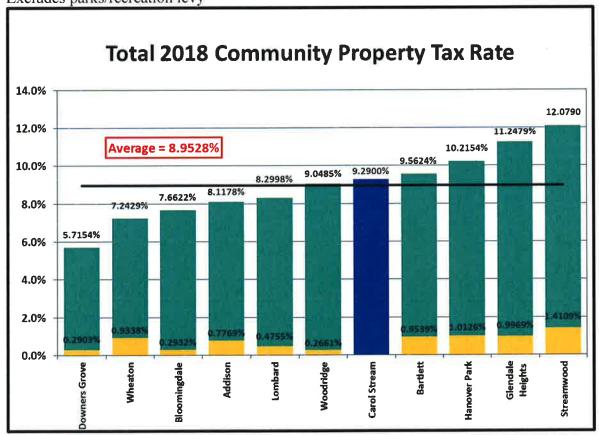

#### General 2019 Property Tax Levy Timeline

- > September, 2019 Carol Stream Library Board considers their 2019 property tax request and forwards to Village.
- October, 2019 Village adopts a resolution recording the determination of the amounts of money estimated to be needed from the property tax. This would include both Library and Village estimate.
- November, 2019 A public hearing would be noticed and required prior to adoption of the combined Village/Library levy. Once public hearing is closed, the Board may approve the levy by ordinance later the same meeting.
- ➤ December, 2019 Levy must be filed in the DuPage County Clerk's Office no later than the last Tuesday in December.

#### Public Participation included:

Mark Jatczak expressed concerns on the motor fuel tax fluctuation and the CIP fund.

David Desai questioned the budget shortfall on an annual basis and asked if the Village can levy a head tax. Village Board replied the Village cannot budget a deficit and is prohibited from levying a head tax.

Debra Schultz expressed concern with the Board acting in fear of a property tax freeze. She would like to see a partnership between state and local governments working together. Mayor explained existing partnerships between local taxing bodies and the quarterly meetings that exist and how we help each other.

Tom Garvey expressed concerns on the Village's reserves and where the library loan was funded. Also questioned part-time employees receiving a pension. Finance Director Batek replied that part time employees need to be under 1000 hours not to receive IMRF. Our part time employees work 998 hours. Police Pension funds were explained on how we fund based on an independent actuary's assessment of our pension liabilities and it is required to be paid. There were also capital improvement plan concerns which motor fuel tax is only used for roads, but we apply for grants which we hope to receive.

Pam White questioned why dogs need a license and not cats. She would like to see more tickets on vehicles parked over sidewalks and other means of revenue. Trustee Frusolone discussed the 4% vacancy rate in the industrial park.

John Cordell applauded the efforts of the Village Board. He questioned what will happen if residents leave, will the Village tax more or will it be lowered if the Village does not need the money? Mayor stated that Carol Stream has to file a levy with the County in December and right now it is undecided.

Sue Jefferson expressed concern that there is not a number for the property tax revenue. She questioned how will residents know when the final number will be decided? Village Board stated that it will go on a Village Board meeting and not a referendum. There will be a Public Hearing scheduled in November.

Kathy Carrier questioned the sale of adult use of marijuana and could this be an income source? Trustee Frusolone stated we do not have enough information to know what revenue would be generated. It is still an open discussion. The Village Board intends to make a decision by the end of the year.

John Howland does not want the sale of marijuana within the Village. He questioned the repair of streets and whether they could defer 2 to 3 years. Mayor Saverino explained the concept of preventative maintenance than waiting a couple of years.

David Hoover discussed TIF districts and questioned having more red light cameras. Mayor Saverino explained he would like to have more, but the County is not allowing us.

Mike Daniels asked what happened to the property on Morton and North Avenue. Mayor Saverino stated a water main went through forest preserve property to connect that allowed Winfield to annex. Mr. Daniels also asked Engineering Department to take a look at Woodhill where the road project is experience puddling issues.

Debra Schultz expressed her concerns to allow the sale of marijuana as the dispensaries will be an additional source of revenue.

Tom Garvey asked what was the name of the company the Village lost 1 million dollars in sales tax and what businesses thought. Village Manager Mellor replied that we cannot legally disclose the name. The Village Board has not heard anything from businesses located in the Industrial Park on the property tax.

Mark Jatczak questioned what we can do to prevent businesses from leaving Carol Stream? Mayor Saverino stated unfortunately Carol Stream has no financial incentive to offer for businesses.

Trustee Schwarze thanked everyone for their thoughtful and educated comments and questions. This Board takes pride in Carol Stream and it is not an easy solution. He explained how important it is to shop in Carol Stream.

Trustee LaRocca stated we would need to cut capital to balance the budget. Cutting capital just costs more money in the long term. He stated nothing is taken lightly and we care about the town and doing what is right. Trustee LaRocca thanked everyone for coming and God bless.

Trustee Gieser thanked everyone for coming and appreciates all the interest and caring enough to attend. It is not going to be an easy decision as we are all your friends and neighbors.

Trustee Zalak stated he has only been a Trustee for 6 months and this is not his idea. He thanked everyone for coming and appreciates resident's educated questions.

Trustee Frusolone thanked everyone for coming. There has been a lot of social media coverage and it speaks volumes of the residents attending. Staff takes pride in what they do and have been working hard. Please continue to ask questions. The Village will update our website and social media as more questions come in and will publicize when discussion is being made.

Trustee McCarthy agreed with everyone and stated yes we are listening to Carol Stream residents and we are hearing you.

Director of Public Works Phil Modaff discussed the innovations in Public Works and rehabbing trucks. Public Works takes measures to keep trucks in good shape and explained how they get a truck for a third of the cost. Solicited donations (\$14,000 raised) for the pink (breast cancer) truck. We collaborate with area towns to save money and spoke of the many cost savings efforts Public Works accomplished.

Mayor Saverino stated he will think about the comments tonight. He is proud of the work the Village does and the quality of life in the Village whether it be our fire district, schools, etc. Our Police department keep us safe. We all work with other towns to save money. Mayor Saverino appreciates staff, but unfortunately we are at the mercy of the State. The Village Board are your neighbors. Mayor Saverino loves Carol Stream and the residents. He thanked everyone for coming and residents are welcomed to come on Sunday.

There being no further business, Trustee McCarthy moved and Trustee Gieser made the second to adjourn the Special Workshop meeting. The meeting was adjourned unanimously at 8:59 p.m.

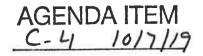

**SAN Replacement Nexsan** 

Included in this year's fiscal budget are funds to purchase a storage area network (SAN) to replace our existing storage environment. If approved, the new storage equipment will serve as the central storage repository for all network systems, application systems and end user files. The aged equipment will be repurposed for back-up services and operation continuity serving as a redundant storage unit for critical systems.

Various manufacturers were considered as replacements for our storage equipment with key considerations being cost, technology, performance, scalability and warranty. Three manufacturers were ultimately selected for final consideration and although each manufacturer has an extensive product line, only entry to midgrade storage products were considered.

- Option 1. The Nimble solution is a midgrade HPE SAN and is noted for using advanced analytics to predict equipment failures. Whereas the software was impressive, this model offered the lowest initial drive capacity and though expandable, would require additional disks and disk shelves to be purchased when the Village's storage requirements increase. The remaining features were comparable to the other evaluated SANs.
- Option 2. Much like the Nimble, the Western Digital Tegile T4200 provides the technology, performance and full support for our enterprise hypervisor. Also similar to the Nimble solution, it ships fully populated which limits the expandability of the system. Future growth is possible with the purchase of additional hardware.

Option 3. Of all the SANs considered, the Nexsan concisely addresses the Village's core needs. Whereas the Nimble is touted for its management software, the Nexsan is regarded as a solid trouble-free hardware platform. The disk chassis ships half-populated providing staff with the ability to double storage capacity by adding hard drives as needed. No costly additional disk chassis or shelves would be required. Furthermore, the hypervisor integration was outstanding and the software features are rightsized and not overly complicated. To summarize, the Nexsan provides the core features we require without over complicating the equipment.

For pricing comparison, quotes were requested from five authorized Nexsan resellers.

As illustrated in the table above, USI Corp is 23% lower than the next lowest quote for the identical equipment.

Considering that the Nexsan's solution meets all of our immediate and foreseeable future requirements and USI Corp has provided the lowest quote, staff recommends awarding a contract for purchase of the above noted equipment to USI Corp in the amount of \$52,399 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 8, Section 5-8-14(F) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances. There are sufficient funds in the budget to pay for these expenditures.

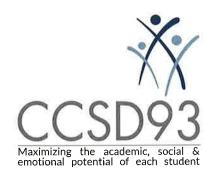

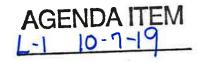

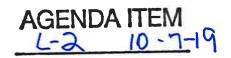
