PURPOSE

This purpose of this memorandum is to provide direction to the Village Board regarding the above-referenced public hearing noticed for the March 2, 2020, Village Board meeting.

DISCUSSION

As the Village Board is aware, staff has been working on a project that would redevelop three parcels totaling 1.67-acres at the northeast corner of Schmale Road and Geneva Road with a fueling station and convenience store on the corner parcel and new commercial use in a building on the north parcel. In September 2019, the Village of Carol Stream and City of Wheaton entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement providing for disconnection of the corner parcel from Wheaton, thereby allowing for annexation of the parcel to Carol Stream, in exchange for revenue sharing from the new fueling station and convenience store.

The Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PC/ZBA) recommended approval of the various zoning and development applications at its meeting on December 9, 2019. Since that time, staff and the developer have been negotiating an Annexation Agreement and a Subdivision and Development Agreement. In anticipation that the Annexation Agreement would be ready for the Village Board to conduct the required public hearing at its meeting on March 2, 2020, staff arranged for publication of the public notice to allow the hearing to occur. Although the Annexation Agreement is close to being finalized, the agreement is not yet ready for Village Board action.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Village Board open and then immediately continue the public hearing to the March 16, 2020, Village Board meeting.

Recommendation to Adopt a Green Infrastructure Policy

In June 2019 the DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference revised its "Policies and Procedures of the DuPage Council" for the "Surface Transportation Program" (STP). A new scoring methodology was implemented, which includes a section titled "Green Infrastructure Planning Factor". Within that factor, a documented "Green Infrastructure Policy" is worth 20% of the available points.

Existing regulations, such as the DuPage County Countywide Stormwater and Floodplain Ordinance (DCSFPO) and the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) General Permit (ILR40), already require action on the part of municipalities to address pollutants from its street network. It is widely understood that urban streets, with their exposure to a myriad of pollutants and direct connection via the associated storm sewer systems, are a significant detractor of surface water quality. The enclosed policy aligns the planning for capital improvement projects with these regulations, as well as with available outside funding sources to strike a balance between environmental stewardship and fiscal responsibility.

Therefore, we recommend that the enclosed Green Infrastructure Policy be presented to the Village Board under "Staff Reports and Recommendations" for their review and acknowledgement before implementation by the Engineering Services Department.

Green Infrastructure Policy

Intent

It is the intent of this Green Infrastructure Policy to establish guidelines for evaluating and implementing green infrastructure into capital projects on the Village's roadway infrastructure as a follow-up to the recommendations provided in the Village's Comprehensive Plan published in June 2016.

Purpose

According to the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Water Quality Scorecard (EPA 231B09001), "Many communities face challenges when balancing water quality protection with accommodating new growth and development. Conventional development practices cover large areas with roads, driveways, and buildings. Rainwater cannot infiltrate these impervious surfaces, running off the land at much higher levels than would naturally occur. Each time it rains, the collective force of this runoff scours streams, erodes stream banks, and carries large quantities of sediment and pollutants into water bodies." For the Village of Carol Stream, where few vacant properties exist within and adjacent to its corporate limits, the balance is now typically between water quality protection and maintaining the expected level of service from its residents and public officials.

Background

Within 13 years after its incorporation, the Village of Carol Stream adopted its first ordinance requiring that stormwater management be incorporated into most future development. This early adoption resulted in a majority of the Village's roadway system being tributary to a stormwater facility (i.e. retention or detention pond), with a large percentage of those facilities being owned and maintained by either the Village or the Carol Stream Park District. Since the early 2000's, native vegetation has been maintained along the Village's retention shorelines in order to improve water quality by filtering nutrients and preventing soil erosion. In 2019, the Village converted one of its dry-turf detention areas into a native-vegetated wetland bottom.

As a nearly built-out community, the Village's capital improvement plan for its roadways currently focuses mostly on preventative maintenance and resurfacing. However, as the Village's network ages, reconstructions will become a larger portion of the roadway projects, which will increase the opportunity for incorporating more green infrastructure practices than were typically done in the past.

The Village has adopted the DuPage County Countywide Stormwater & Floodplain Ordinance (DCSFPO), which requires that, with some exceptions and thresholds, any net new impervious area is treated by at least one Post-Construction Best Management Practice (PCBMP). In addition, proper maintenance of Village-owned roadways and storm sewers to protect surface runoff quality is a requirement of the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) General Permit (ILR40).

Village-wide Guidelines

The following guidelines will be used during the planning stages to determine whether new green infrastructure practices will be incorporated into future projects even when not required by applicable regulations (i.e. DSCFPO, CWA Section 404 permit, etc.):

- Refer to DuPage County's Water Quality Watershed-Based Plans for guidance on specific project elements that could be included with a project within one of the Village's three sub-watershed areas (Klein Creek, Winfield Creek, and West Branch DuPage River – Unnamed Tributaries).
- Refer to the grant criteria for DuPage County Stormwater's Water Quality Improvement Program grant and IEPA 319 when planning for green infrastructure to maximize the likelihood of receiving funding.
- Favor retrofitting existing infrastructure over creating new infrastructure.
- Favor treatment of runoff through large-scale, regional PCBMP's over providing multiple, parallel (i.e. not part of a treatment train), small-scale PCBMP's.
- Example: Identify retrofit opportunities for any publicly-owned stormwater facilities that are downstream of the proposed project.
- When large-scale PCBMP's are not viable, favor the use of replacing existing stormwater junctions with Manufactured Stormwater Treatment Devices (MTD). Otherwise, placement of any new MTD's should favor placement near the outfall in order to maximize their coverage area.

Federal-Aid Urban (FAU) Routes

By their nature FAU routes tend to be part of larger projects that have more design and budgeting flexibility for retrofitting with green infrastructure than local routes. The FAU routes within the Village are listed below along with some specific improvements that may be considered during the planning stage.

Lies Road

- Portions of this route are tributary to the following Village-owned stormwater facilities that already include native-vegetated shorelines and where continued maintenance is beneficial to treating the roadway runoff:
 - o Mill Valley Pond
 - o Carol Stream Venture West
 - o Town Center North Pond
 - o Carol Point Wetland
- Portions of this route are tributary to detention facilities where water quality treatment could be enhanced by converting the turf-grass and concrete-lined channels to native-vegetation:
 - o Brookstone West
 - o Country Glen Unit Two
 - o Cambridge Point Unit 12
 - o Carol Point Northeast
- Portions of the roadway are tributary to the following Carol Stream Park District owned and maintained stormwater facilities where intergovernmental cooperation to enhance their vegetation and pollutant control elements may be cost-effective for treating existing or additional roadway runoff:
 - o Jirsa Park
 - o Tedrahn Park
 - o Heritage Lakes
 - o Simkus Pond
 - o Veterans Park Ponds

Fullerton Avenue

- A large portion of the roadway is tributary to the Kimberly North Subdivision stormwater facilities, which are privately owned and maintained. Any major project should analyze the benefits of a public-private partnership to retrofit the facility in order to increase their effectiveness for both flood protection and runoff treatment.
- The entire roadway is routed through Jay Stream Pond before discharging into Klein Creek, which is a Village-owned and maintained stormwater facility with native-vegetated shorelines. Planning should include analyzing any enhancements or additions to its pollutant control elements.
- The stretch between Gary Avenue and the CN Railroad Crossing is still partially a rural cross-section with roadside ditches used for runoff conveyance. The design should investigate retrofitting these into PCBMP's over replacing them with traditional gray infrastructure (i.e. curb & gutter).

Kehoe Boulevard

- There are no Village owned or maintained stormwater facilities that collect stormwater runoff from this roadway.
- Any major project should analyze the benefits of a public-private partnership to retrofit the St. Paul Business Park stormwater facilities (East & West) in order to increase their effectiveness for both flood protection and runoff treatment.
- Planning should favor the use of bioengineering techniques in any streambank stabilization within the drainage channel between Gary Ave. and Gerzevske Ln.
- The Village will continue to partner with DuPage County Stormwater on analyzing the function of the Gary-Kehoe Reservoir to determine if any enhancements are possible to increase its effectiveness for runoff treatment without sacrificing its flood protection capacity.

Fair Oaks Road

- Portions of this route are already tributary to existing roadway PCBMPs that
 were constructed when the stretch between Plum Grove Court and Army Trail
 Road was reconstructed. Portions are also tributary to Maple Ridge Pond, which
 is a Village owned and maintained stormwater facility that already includes
 native-vegetated shorelines and where continued maintenance is beneficial to
 treating the roadway runoff.
- Portions of the roadway are tributary to the Fair Oaks Estates Ph. 1, which is a Carol Stream Park District owned and maintained stormwater facility where intergovernmental cooperation to enhance their vegetation and pollutant control elements may be cost-effective for treating existing or additional roadway runoff.
- The vast majority is still a rural cross-section with roadside ditches used for stormwater runoff conveyance. The design should investigate retrofitting these into PCBMP's over replacing with traditional gray infrastructure (i.e. curb & gutter).
- Any major project for the stretch between Lies Road and Plum Grove Court should analyze the benefits of daylighting storm sewers and culverts that run parallel, and adjacent to, the DuPage County Forest Preserve District property.

Kuhn Road

• The stretch between North Ave & St. Charles Road is still a rural cross-section with roadside ditches used for stormwater runoff conveyance. The design should investigate retrofitting these into PCBMP's over replacing with traditional gray infrastructure (i.e. curb & gutter).

Recommendation to Adopt a Complete Streets Policy

A Complete Street is defined by the National Complete Streets Coalition as one that provides safe and convenient access for all users of the road regardless of age or ability including bicyclists, pedestrians, transit users and vehicular traffic. Studies show that a Complete Streets Policy will reduce traffic congestion on our roads as well as improve access within the community. A Policy will also improve resident quality of life with more time spent walking or biking, providing enormous health benefits.

The Village previously received Surface Transportation Program (STP) and constructed the Fair Oaks Road multi-use path. We have also received STP funds and are in the design phase of the Lies Road multi-use path, the Kuhn Road multi-use path and the Southeast bike trail. We have also been awarded STP funds for numerous roadway rehabilitation projects. DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference (DMMC) and the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) distributes these STP funds based on newly modified project selection criteria which now includes new performance measures. One of these new performance measures is the adoption of a Complete Streets Policy. Having an adopted policy will increase project score and increase our chances of receiving funds for future STP funding eligible transportation projects. Incorporating Complete Streets elements in the design will further increase the project score.

With guidance from CMAP and researching with other communities that have adopted Complete Streets Policies, we developed the attached Village of Carol Stream Complete Streets Policy. With this Policy, the Village will be committed to making improvements to all forms of transportation, to reducing traffic congestion on roads and to improving access within the community for all users of streets. As recommended by CMAP, the Policy also includes clearly written exceptions for not providing compete streets elements in the design of a project.

Therefore, staff recommends adoption of the attached Complete Streets Policy.

Complete Streets Policy

Vision and Intent

The Village of Carol Stream is committed to making improvements to all forms of transportation, to reducing traffic congestion on roads and to improving access within the community for all users of streets. The Village is committed to the development of infrastructure to support alternative modes of transportation and to integrate health-conscious mobility by developing safe pedestrian and bicycle networks in the community. With this Complete Streets Policy, the Village also aims to increase access to jobs, schools, shopping, dining, parks and other recreational facilities.

All Users and Modes

It is the intent of the Village of Carol Stream to accommodate all users of the roadway system in the development of roadway projects. All users include bicyclists, pedestrians, transit users, emergency responders and drivers of automobiles, transit vehicles, citizen service vehicles and freight vehicles, regardless of age or ability.

All Projects and Phases

This policy will be considered during the design of all public right of way transportation projects, including new construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, repair or maintenance.

The Village of Carol Stream is committed to coordinate with external agencies on multi-jurisdictional projects that provide regional benefits.

The Village will review all private development proposals to insure compliance with this Complete Streets Policy.

Exceptions

Exceptions to this policy will be made when:

- 1. The project involves a roadway on which non-motorized use is prohibited by law.
- 2. The cost or impact of the accommodations are excessively disproportionate to the need or probable use.
- 3. The scope of the relevant project is limited to minor maintenance activities intended to keep the roadway in serviceable condition.
- 4. There is sufficient documentation that there is no practical way to accommodate certain improvements.
- 5. There are environmental constraints or the potential for causing unsafe transportation issues.
- 6. There is clear lack of current or anticipated need for the accommodations.

Network

The Village will strive to create a comprehensive, integrated and connected network of transportation options for all modes of travel. The network shall provide safe and accessible transportation options for all users.

Jurisdiction

The Village will adhere to this Complete Streets Policy in the design of all transportation projects requiring funding or approval by:

- 1. Village of Carol Stream
- 2. DuPage County
- 3. State of Illinois
- 4. Federal Government
- 5. Private Developers

The Village of Carol Stream will continue partnerships with the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP), DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference (DMMC), Illinois Department of Transportation, DuPage County Division of Transportation, Forest Preserve District of DuPage County, local transit, local schools, local township road districts, Carol Stream Park District, Carol Stream Public Library, adjacent municipalities and other stakeholders to enhance local and regional transportation system connectivity for all users.

Design

To the extent applicable, the latest editions of the following documents are used to assist the Village in the design of its transportation projects:

- 1. Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction
- 2. Highway Capacity Manual
- 3. American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials (AASHTO) Roadside Design Guidelines
- 4. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Highway Safety Design Manual
- 5. Manual for Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD)
- 6. Public Rights of Way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG)
- 7. Carol Stream Municipal Code

Context Sensitivity

The implementation of this policy will reflect the context and character of the project surroundings. Design for transportation projects must consider the current and future land use, the local character, the existing transportation uses and the surrounding transportation network. Complete Streets elements will be considered based on whether the project is within residential districts, retail-downtown areas, major arterial roadways or industrial zones.

Performance Measures

The Village of Carol Stream will consider the following data when measuring the implementation of a complete streets approach:

- 1. Crash data
- 2. Safety analysis
- 3. Elimination of gaps, network connectivity
- 4. Total miles of multi-use trails constructed
- 5. Total miles of sidewalks constructed
- 6. Number of bicycle parking spaces installed
- 7. Number of ADA accommodations constructed
- 8. Transit ridership
- 9. Number of children walking or bicycling to school

Implementation

During the planning process for all transportation projects, the Engineering Services Department will determine if complete streets elements shall be included in the design process of a project or if a project is exempt by this Complete Streets Policy.

Assessment of the surrounding environment will be used to determine the appropriate elements of Complete Streets to incorporate. A project will have met the intent of this Complete Streets Policy when it has taken into account the safe and convenient accommodations of vehicles, pedestrians, bicyclists and transit.

Change Order No. 01: Community Park - Seeding Priority Area #1

Clean Cut Tree Services completed the work for "Community Park – Brush Clearing" on February 25, 2020. Their equipment mulched the debris better than anticipated such that a significant percentage of the area is suitable for surface broadcast of seed. It is unknown how many native species are currently dormant in the soil, but the area has degraded since it was last actively managed (> 15 years) and is therefore expected that invasive, weedy growth would dominate the recovery. Thus, seeding the native vegetation now (FY19/20) before the weedy growth establishes will save the Village additional preparatory effort (ex. herbicing, burning, etc) than if we delayed until next fiscal year or later.

Our Pond Shoreline and Wetland Maintenance contractor submitted the following table of costs per acre for labor, equipment, and material specific to Priority Area #1 as shown on the enclosed exhibit. The sub-area between the lagoon shoreline and bike path from bridge-to-bridge is approximately 2.25 acres and would be seeded with Mix #3 for a cost of \$4,239.00. The 2.75 acres south of the bike path is still heavily wooded, so the remaining \$761.00 will be used to spread a custom Native Grass mix in the area adjacent to the bike path. With the exclusion of forbs, this is a relatively economical mix when accounting for the seeds per square footage rate that it provides.

1) Economy mix	5-6 grasses and 10-13 forbs	\$1,165.00 / acre
2) Basic mix	5-6 grasses and 20-24 forbs	\$1,585.00 / acre
3) Low-profile mix	5-6 grasses and 25-32 forbs	\$1,884.00 / acre
4) Native Grass mix	5-6 grasses (no forbs)	\$327.25 / acre

Engineering's budgeted expenditures for Property Maintenance (01620600-52272) is \$104,150.00, with \$55,657.21 currently available per MUNIS. After subtracting \$31,000 in Board-approved deferments and \$19,600 in encumbrances, there remains \$5,057.21 left in the budget, mostly due to cost efficiencies and reductions in scope of work in other areas.

Therefore, we recommend that the FY 2019/20 Pond Shoreline and Wetland Maintenance previously awarded to Bedrock Earthscapes, LLC be amended in the amount of \$5,000.00 in accordance with the Purchasing Procedure Manual (09/04/07), § 5-8-14(B) of the Municipal Code, and the enclosed Change Order form.

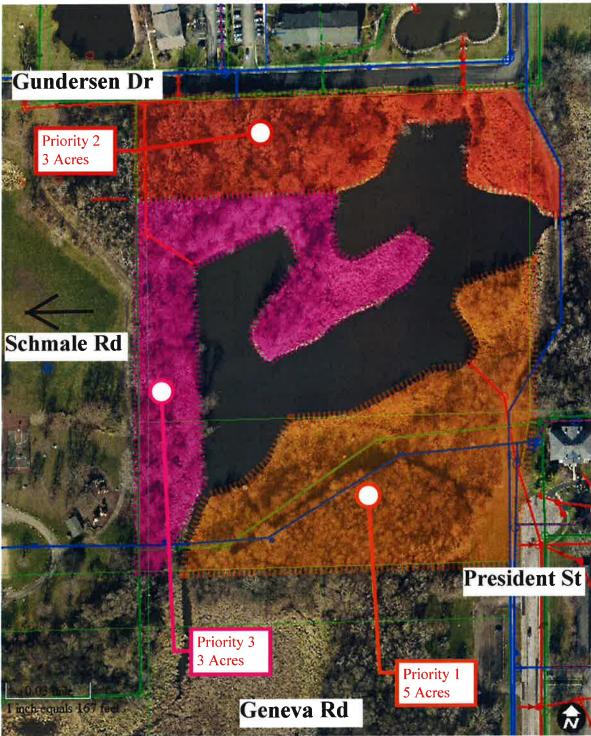

Telephone System Upgrade

Included in this year's fiscal budget are funds to upgrade the existing phone system to improve reliability and system capabilities to meet the requirements of the Village staff. The phone system consists of the frontend desk phones and back-end equipment including, multiple phone controllers, call recording and voicemail systems. The existing phone system was installed in 2006-07 and though we have completed minor hardware and software upgrades to the back-end equipment, a full hardware upgrade has not been possible due to incompatibilities. To date we have experienced some minor errors as a result of the aging equipment, but in mid-September of 2019, we had experienced a service disruption at the Village Hall. The root cause of the outage was determined to be related to a failing phone controller.

Rather than replace the back-end equipment, staff recommends upgrading the existing hardware and then upgrade the software to the latest version. This approach will reduce our total project costs and provide a reliable foundation for the telephone network.

With the front-end telephone equipment approaching 15 years old, when phones fail, IT has found it increasingly difficult to find like replacements. As a result of the phone scarcity, replacement equipment has been determined by phone controller compatibility and phone availability. This approach has started to create an ad-hoc phone network requiring increased administration. With the upgrade of the back-end equipment, staff is recommending the replacement of all front-end equipment for full compatibility and manufacturer support.

Pricing for this project has been secured from our current phone provider quoted from the pre-bid Sourcewell (formally NJPA) National Joint Purchasing Cooperative NJPA#022719-MBS contract. For reference, Sourcewell pre-bids goods and services for Government, Education and other public entities. Considering our current telephone partner, Telephone Innovations Group (TIG) has secured the pre-bid contract pricing and has demonstrated a strong competency with Mitel equipment, staff requests the budgeted funds be unencumbered and recommends awarding a contract of service for the upgrade of the Village of Carol Stream's telephone system to TIG in the amount of \$44,550.40.

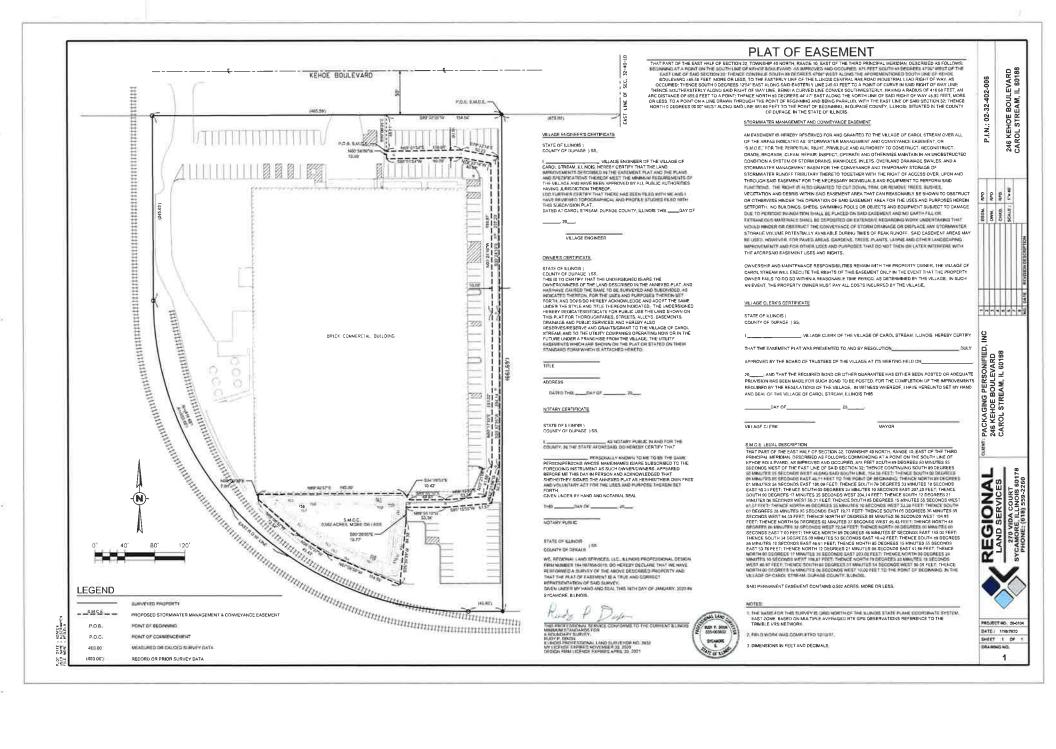

This year the funds raised will be donated towards the Cosley Zoo expansion and the American Heart Association, as well as Rotary charitable causes.

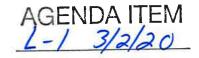
