General Fund FY19 Revenue Projections

- Without the introduction of new revenues, total GF revenues for FY19 are projected to be \$2.4 million below FY18 budgeted revenues, not surprising as our revenue base has been impacted by large taxpayer losses and new State fees.
- Perhaps a better comparison without new revenues, projected revenue growth for FY19 is only \$350,000 or 1.3% compared to estimated FY18 revenues.
- In December 2017, a number of revenue alternatives were reviewed. At that time, an increase in our home rule sales tax and creating a local motor fuel tax appeared to be among the most viable alternatives.
- Due to the State requirement for earmarking roadway fees/taxes for related construction and maintenance activities, we would preliminarily view a local motor fuel tax as a dedicated revenue stream to our Capital Projects Fund.

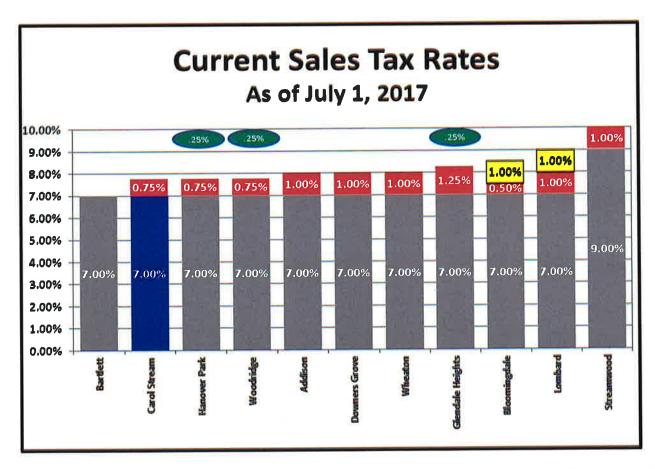

Proposed Increase in Home Rule Sales Tax

- Village's current rate at 0.75%

Alcohol Concession Agreement-2018 Summer Concert Series

Attached for your review and consideration is an updated agreement between the Village and Carol Stream Rotary Club for the sale of beer and hard lemonade at the upcoming 2018 Summer Concert Series at the Town Center. The Rotary Club has been licensed to sell alcohol at the Summer Concert Series for the last four years. The Rotary Club has sold alcohol without incident during this time period. Other than some minor updating, the agreement is unchanged from last year.

The Rotary Club raised over \$7,340 at the 2017 Summer Concert Series. This money has been allocated for local community projects, such as Christmas Sharing, local food pantries, Glenbard North Post Prom, college scholarships for Carol Stream residents, and the like. The agreement for 2018 contemplates continued community support from proceeds.

Staff recommends approval of the agreement.

VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM AND CAROL STREAM ROTARY CLUB SUMMER CONCERT SERIES AGREEMENT

This agreement is by and between the Village of Carol Stream (the Village) and the Carol Stream Rotary Club (Rotary).

- A. The Village intends to host an event known as the "Summer Concert Series" from June 7, 2018 through August 9, 2018 at the Ross Ferraro Town Center. The Village desires to allow the sale of alcoholic beverages in the form of Beer & Hard Lemonade for the Thursday Night Concerts as part of the Summer Concert Series.
- B. Rotary has provided volunteer services dispensing beer, wine and alcohol coolers capably for the past four summer concert series. Further, Rotary donates proceeds of beverage sales to charitable causes in the Village.
- C. Rotary desires to provide volunteer services for the Village in connection with its 2018 Summer Concert Series and the Village desires that Rotary provide its volunteer services to purchase, sell and dispense beer and hard lemonade for the Village's 2018 summer concerts.
- D. The parties wish to document in writing their respective duties and obligations in connection with alcoholic beverage sales for the 2018 concert series.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the Terms and conditions of this Agreement, and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated by reference and made a part of this Agreement.
- 2. Patrons will not be allowed to leave the Town Center Concert area with beer or hard lemonade including areas outside of the concert music area, in the parking lot, in vehicles or on any street within the Village of Carol Stream.
- 3. Rotary shall apply for and obtain a local liquor license for alcoholic beverage sales. This is required for Rotary to obtain its license from the State for serving beer and hard lemonade at the event. Rotary needs the local liquor license at least one month in advance of the event in order to obtain the State license.
- 4. Rotary shall contract for and obtain the products to be sold at the concert events. The products shall be beer and hard lemonade. All products shall be dispensed to patrons in aluminum bottles/cans and sold to patrons for \$5.00 each for a 16 oz. beer or a 12 oz. 14 oz. hard lemonade. In lieu of a per person drink limit, Rotary Club Members assigned to serve will be required to diligently look for signs of intoxication and to deny service to those patrons.
- 5. Rotary shall obtain dram shop insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 insuring both the Village and Rotary for alcoholic beverage sales. The Village, its officers, agents and employees shall be listed as an insured on a primary and non-contributory basis. Rotary shall provide the Village with a copy of the certificate of

insurance and State of Illinois Liquor Control Commission Special Event License prior to the 2018 concert events.

- 6. The hours for the Beer Garden shall be determined by the Village, in its sole discretion. Hours for sale of alcoholic beverages shall be from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on the following concert nights:
 - Thursday June 7, 2018
 - Thursday June 14, 2018
 - Thursday June 21, 2018
 - Thursday June 28, 2018
 - Thursday July 12, 2018
 - Thursday July 19, 2018
 - Thursday July 26, 2018
 - Thursday August 2, 2018
 - Thursday August 9, 2018
- 7. The Village shall provide security for the Town Center area where alcoholic beverages are sold and stored during the events. This shall specifically include a secure storage location for alcoholic beverages used at the Town Center. The Village shall provide tables and chairs for Rotary use while selling and dispensing alcoholic beverages. The Village shall provide ice and/or refrigerated storage for Rotary use to cool alcoholic beverage products.
- 8. Rotary shall be responsible for selling alcoholic beverages only as described above and for dispensing the products to patrons of legal drinking age. All Rotary volunteers selling or serving alcoholic beverages shall be Basset trained. The Rotary Club shall be responsible for checking the ages of patrons seeking to be served products to determine that they are of legal age and affixing wristbands to those of legal age. Rotary shall sell and serve products only to those patrons wearing wristbands.
- 9. The Village shall be responsible for clean-up of the Town Center concert area, including cleaning tables, restrooms and removing trash. Rotary shall be responsible for maintaining/cleaning their alcoholic beverage sales area and removal/storage of coolers, tables, chairs and beverages used for the sale of their product.
- 10. Rotary shall be responsible for providing sufficient and appropriate staffing to dispense the products to the patrons during the hours specified above.
- 11. Rotary agrees to use proceeds from the sale of alcoholic beverages at the Summer Concert Series to support charitable endeavors within the Village of Carol Stream.
 - 12 Either party may terminate this agreement upon 14 days written notice.

Execute an Agreement Between the Village and Clarke Environmental Mosquito

Management, Inc., for Mosquito Abatement Services

In prior years the Village has secured mosquito abatement services through cooperative agreements with both Bloomingdale and Wayne Townships. The agreement for services in the Bloomingdale Township section of the Village is current; the Wayne Township agreement is up for renewal to cover the period 2018 through 2021.

The program includes the following services:

- General Services: Survey and mapping of area, record keeping, public relations, educational materials, customer service hotline, insurance, reporting and regulatory compliance.
- Surveillance and monitoring: Modeling to predict arrival, brood and annoyance periods, and weather monitoring.
- Larval Control: Inspections of breeding sites and customer complaint areas, application of larval control materials in flood areas and application of materials in catch basins.
- Adult control: Eight (8) community-wide sprays as well as targeted sprays for special events and areas of recorded high nuisance.

Wayne Township contributes ten-percent (10%) toward the total cost of services for the agencies covered by the agreement (Bartlett, Carol Stream, Hanover Park and Wayne). The total value of services for the Carol Stream area in each year of the agreement will be \$37,000; the annual cost to Carol Stream will be \$33,300.

It is recommended that the Mayor and Village Board approve a Motion authorizing the Village Manager to execute an agreement between the Village and Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management, Inc., for mosquito abatement services for the period 2018 through 2021.

¹ This is the same annual cost for each year of the last agreement term (2014 - 2017).

Sand Filter Building to Brown and Root Industrial Services in the Amount of

\$31,968.22, Pursuant to the Provisions of Section 5-8-3(B) and subsection 5-8-14(K)

of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances

The condition of masonry on the exterior of the WRC sand filter building has been deteriorating for several years. We have done minor patchwork over the years, including as recently as last summer. However, the severity of the deterioration has grown worse, especially with the freeze thaw cycles we have experienced this winter season.

The current budget did not anticipate this project, but current year-end estimates in the Construction line item of the budget reveal that we can expect to come in approximately \$41,000 under budget. Therefore, we recommend proceeding with this work as soon as weather permits in the current fiscal year.

A competitive proposal has been secured from Brown & Root, a JOC contractor that the Village has employed for many projects over the past several years. Until recently, Brown & Root's contract services were available under a DuPage County Job Order Contract, but that contract expired in December 2017. Brown & Root also has a National Intergovernmental Purchase Alliance (NIPA) contract for construction maintenance services under a similar JOC arrangement with a governmental unit in Texas (Region 4 Education Service Center). Staff has reviewed the Request for Proposal, the Region 4 Education Service Center award approval (attached) and the NIPA Notice of Award of Contract to Brown & Root Industrial Services (attached).

Job Order Contracting (JOC) is similar to joint purchasing of products, where one agency will seek bids for certain products (such as vehicles and road salt) and other governmental agencies are allowed under State statute to take advantage of the contract pricing. The process for selecting a JOC contractor includes a rigorous Request for Proposals (RFP) process which solicits unit pricing on thousands of work types and items. Following a review process of pricing and qualifications of participating contractors a JOC contract is awarded and allows that general contractor to be available for a wide variety of construction projects. Public Works staff provided the JOC contract project manager with a general work scope and the JOC contractor has prepared the attached detailed scope of work and cost proposal.

Staff recommends awarding a contract for tuckpointing services at the WRC sand filter building to Brown and Root Industrial Services in the amount of \$31,968.22, pursuant to the provisions of Section 5-8-3(B) and subsection 5-8-14(K) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

This JOB ORDER CONTRACT is made and entered into this 20th day of February, 2018, by and between the Village of Carol Stream (hereinafter the "Village") and Brown & Root Industrial Services (hereinafter "Contractor").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Region 4 Education Service Center (Texas) is authorized to work with National Intergovernmental Purchasing Agency (NIPA) in a Principal Procurement Agency (PPA) capacity to secure multi-state volume purchasing contracts; and

WHEREAS Region 4 Education Service Center published Request for Proposal #16-04, received and reviewed proposals and awarded Job Order Contract Number R160402 to Contractor; and

WHEREAS Region 4 Education Service Center on August 23, 2016, approved a contract for the term November 1, 2016 through October 31, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to proceed with tuckpointing exterior masonry on the WRC sand filter building (hereinafter referred to as the "Project") through the Region 4 Education Service Center Job Order Contracting, and to purchase construction services and materials under the general terms and provisions of the Region 4 Education Service Center Contract Number R160402, including all addenda issued thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor has agreed to provide such construction services and materials for the Project under the general terms and provisions of the Region 4 Education Service Center Contract Number R160402, including all addenda issued thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor has provided the Village with a proposal, which proposal has been incorporated into the Detail Scope of Work, Job Order Number CS-01-18, dated February 12, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions of this Job Order Contract Number CS-01-18, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The terms and conditions of this Job Order Contract Number CS-01-18 shall be governed by and shall include all terms and provisions of the Region 4 Education Service Center Contract Number R160402, including all addenda issued thereto, and shall be incorporated into the terms, conditions and provisions of Job Order Contract Number CS-01-18, between the parties hereto except as modified as follows:
 - A. The Scope of Work, including all labor and materials, for this Job Order Contract Number CS-01-18, and the cost of such work is hereby set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto.
 - B. Whenever within Job Order Contract Number CS-01-18 the terms Agency, City or Owner are used, those terms shall mean the Village of Carol Stream.
 - C. Prior to commencement of construction, Contractor shall provide the Village with both a Payment and Performance Bond in the amount of \$31,968.22 from a surety acceptable to the Village and in accordance with the terms set forth in AIA Document A312TM 2011.
 - D. Prior to commencement of construction, the Contractor shall provide the Village with a Certificate of Insurance for the Insurance and at such limits as set forth in Region 4 Education Service Center Contract Number R160402. The Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability policies shall contain or be endorsed to contain the Village, its officers, agents and employees as Insured and shall be primary insurance and not contribute with the Village's insurance or self-insurance. The Worker's Compensation insurer shall waive all rights of subrogation against the Village for injuries to employees of the Insured resulting from the work for the Village or use of the Village's premises or facilities.
 - E. This Job Order Contract is subject to the provisions of the Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/.01 et seq. and labor prices shall be based upon the prevailing wages in the DuPage County area as determined by the Illinois Department of Labor. The Contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Village from any failure of the Contractor to comply with the provisions of the Prevailing Wage Act.

- F. Contractor will be required to maintain all records and documents for the project in compliance with the Freedom of Information Act, 5ILCS 140/4 et seq. In addition, Contractor shall produce, without cost to the village, any records which are responsive to a request received by the Village under the Freedom of Information Act so that the Village may provide records to those requesting them within the timeframes required. If additional time is necessary to compile records in response to a request, then Contractor shall so notify the Village and if possible, the Village shall request an extension so as to comply with the Act. In the event that the Village is found to have not complied with the Freedom of Information Act, based upon Contractor's failure to produce documents or otherwise appropriately respond to a request under the Act, then Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless, and pay all amounts determined to be due including but not limited to fines, costs, attorney fees and penalties.
- G. The Contractor shall warrant the Project to be free from defects in materials and workmanship for a period of 1 year from the date of final acceptance of the completed project by the Village; provided however, that all materials that have a manufacturer's warranty in excess of 1 year shall be warranted for the full period of the manufacturer's warranty, which warranty shall be transferred to the Village on the date of final acceptance of the completed project.
- H. The Contractor shall secure all building permits for the Project within ten (10) days after the date of execution of the Contract by both Parties and the Contractor shall complete the Project within forty-five (45) days thereafter.

Mercedes Drive - Change to Parking Restrictions

The facility manager for Mercedes Benz recently contacted Community Development regarding car and truck parking on Mercedes Drive creating access problems to their driveways. Investigation of the complaint revealed that many vehicles parked on the roadway, particularly during shift change. The Code of Ordinances currently prohibits parking on the north side of Mercedes Drive; however, it was not posted.

Discussions with businesses and police indicated that a better solution would be to prohibit parking on the south side of Mercedes, along Mercedes Benz frontage, and along the north side between Gary Avenue and the first driveway. This allows access to the fire hydrants and watermain on the south side, and keeps the intersection with Gary Avenue clear for turning movements.

The following changes are therefore recommended to the Village Code, Chapter 8: Traffic Code, Article 6: Parking Schedules;

1. Remove from Schedule I. Parking Prohibited; Signs Required

Amendments to Carol Stream Code of Ordinances regarding

Qualifications for Board of Fire and Police Commissioners

The Illinois Municipal Code contains a provision that requires not more than two Board of Fire and Police Commissioners to be from the same political party. Thus, in order to comply with this provision, a municipality must inquire as to a potential appointee's political party affiliation.

In the case of Taylor v. Dart, 2016 IL App 143684, an Illinois Appellate Court held that the Sheriff's Merit Board was unlawfully constituted and any decisions of the Board void where a board member was not appointed in full compliance with the statutory requirements for appointment.

Based upon this decision, a municipality that does not inquire into the political party affiliation of appointees, risks having a Board of Fire and Police Commission found to be unlawfully constituted. In order to avoid this risk, a municipality must either determine the political party affiliation of its Board of Fire and Police Commissioners and ensure not more than two commissioners are from the same political party or, it must eliminate this requirement through its home rule authority.

The attached Ordinance amends the provisions of the Village's Code of Ordinances and provides that political party affiliation will not be the basis of any decision to appoint a Board of Fire and Police Commissioner. The ordinance further prohibits any inquiry into the political party affiliation of candidates for the position of Commissioner.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CAROL STREAM CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 3, BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS, ARTICLE 2. BOARD OF FIRE AND POLICE COMMISSION, SECTION 3-2-2, QUALIFICATIONS

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees have heretofore established a Board of Fire and Police Commission as provided in 65 ILCS 5.10-2.1-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees have heretofore established qualifications for the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees find that appointment to the Board of Fire and Police Commission should be based upon merit and political affiliation should play no part on the selection of persons to serve as Board of Fire and Police Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream is a home rule unit under subsection (a) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and may exercise and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of its home rule powers the Mayor and Board of Trustees find that prohibiting the appointment of Board of Fire and Police Commissioners based upon political affiliation promotes honest and open government and is in the best interests of the Village;

WHEREAS, this Ordinance supersedes the provisions of Section 10-2.1-3 to the contrary and is adopted pursuant to the Village's home rule powers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1:

The Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, Chapter 3, "Boards and Commissions", Article 2, "Board of Fire and Police Commission", Section 3-2-2, "Qualifications", is hereby amended, and as amended shall read as follows:

§ 3-2-2 QUALIFICATIONS.

- (A) The members of the Board shall be considered officers of the village. No person is eligible to hold an appointed village office who has not been a qualified voter of the village and has not resided therein at least one year next preceding his or her appointment, or who is a defaulter to the village.
- (B) No person holding an office under a municipality shall be a member of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners of the village, or the Secretary thereof.
- (C) No person shall be appointed a member of the Board who is related, either by blood or marriage up to the degree of first cousin, to any elected official of the village.
- (D) No person shall be appointed a member of the Board based upon municipal or national political party affiliation nor shall political party affiliation be a qualification for membership on the

Board. No person shall be asked their political party affiliation or be required to provide an affidavit of political party affiliation prior to being appointed a member of the Board.

SECTION 2: Those sections, paragraphs and provisions of Chapter 3 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances which are not expressly amended or repealed by this Ordinance are hereby re-enacted, and it is expressly declared to be the intention of this Ordinance not to repeal or amend any portion of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances other than those expressly amended or repealed in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: The invalidity of any section or provision of this Ordinance hereby passed and approved shall not invalidate other sections or provisions thereof.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by law.

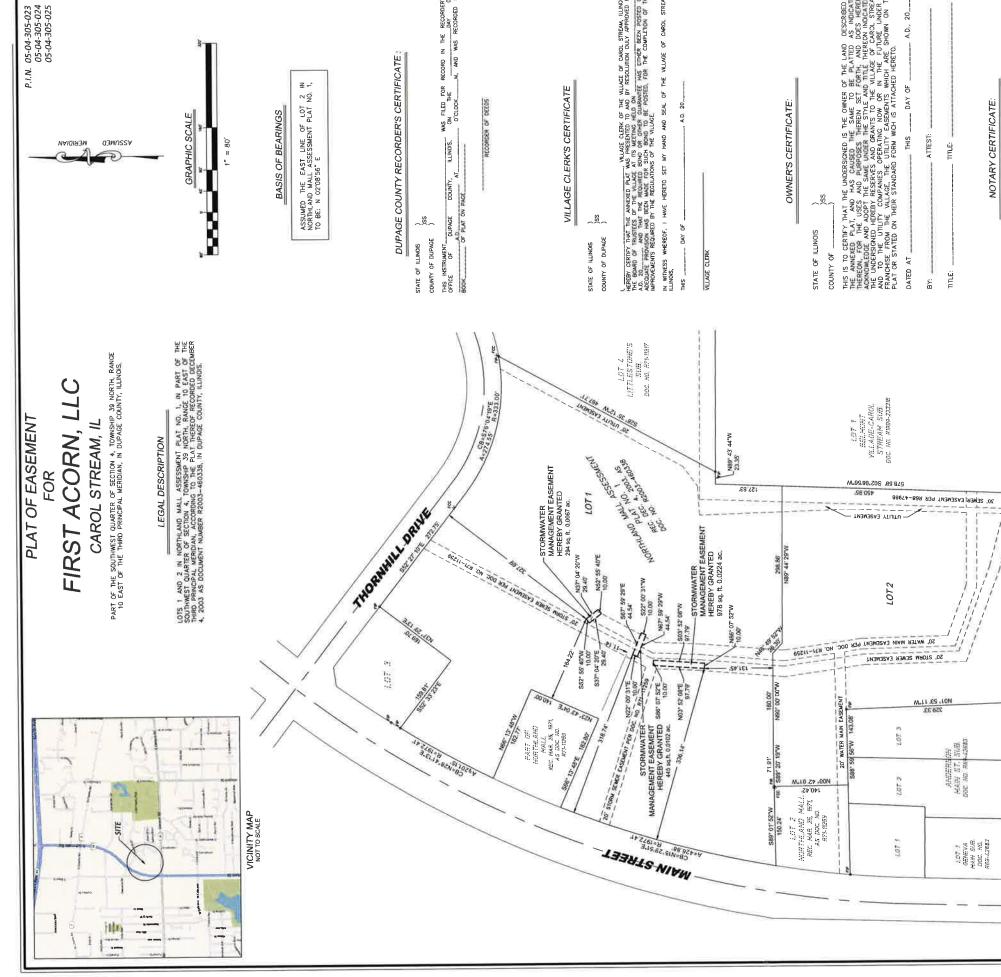

GRANT OF WATER MAIN EASEMENT

THIS GRANT OF WATER MAIN EASEMENT ("Grant of Easement") is made this 28 day of _______, 2017, by First Acorn, LLC, an Illinois limited liability company, (hereinafter referred to as the "Grantor") to the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee"). Grantor and Grantee are sometimes hereinafter referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Grantor is the owner of the real property legally described in Exhibit A-1, attached hereto and made a part hereof (hereinafter referred to as the "Grantor Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Grantee desires to construct a water main, and all facilities incidental thereto, (hereinafter referred to as the "Water Main Improvements") on a portion of the Grantor Property as shown on Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, subject to the terms and provisions hereinafter set forth, Grantor has agreed to grant the Grantee the necessary nonexclusive permanent easement and a nonexclusive temporary construction easement relative to the Water Main Improvements, as set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the terms and conditions set forth below and the benefits to be derived from this Grant of Easement, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. That the recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if set forth fully herein.
- 2. Grantor hereby grants and conveys to the Grantee a nonexclusive perpetual easement (the "Easement"), for the full and free right, privilege and authority to construct, install, reconstruct, replace, remove, repair, alter, inspect, maintain and operate a water main, and all facilities incidental thereto (the "Easement Activities"), upon, under, through, and across the property as legally described in Exhibit A-2, attached hereto and made a part hereof (the "Easement Premises"). Except for valve covers, manhole covers, buffalo boxes, fire hydrants or other similar improvements located at or above grade, the Water Main Improvements shall be located below grade.
- 3. Grantor further grants and conveys to the Grantee a nonexclusive temporary construction easement ("Temporary Easement") for the full and free right, privilege and authority to enter upon and use the property identified as "Temporary Easement Premises" as legally described in Exhibit A-3, attached hereto and made a part hereof (the "Temporary Easement Premises") for the purpose of constructing and installing the Water Main Improvements within the Easement Premises and any ancillary activities related thereto. The Temporary Easement shall terminate on the date which is twenty-four (24) months from the date of this Grant of Easement.

- 4. Grantor hereby agrees with Grantee that Grantee (by or through its authorized officers, employees, agents and contractors) may, at any and all times designated herein, when necessary to do so, go upon, over and across the Grantor Property (excluding any portions of the Grantor Property improved with buildings or other structures) to access the Easement Premises; provided that Grantee shall use reasonable efforts to minimize any interruption or interference with the use or occupancy of the Grantor Property by Grantor, its tenants, occupants or other parties claiming any interest by or through Grantor, its predecessors, successors and assigns.
- 5. The Easement and the Temporary Construction Easement shall be used and enjoyed solely by Grantee and its duly authorized officers, agents, contractors or employees to conduct the Easement Activities in accordance with this Grant of Easement. Grantee shall not assign its rights under this Grant of Easement in whole or in part or grant permission to traverse, enter upon the Grantor Property or otherwise use the Easement Premises or the Temporary Easement Premises to any other person or entity. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantor shall be permitted to assign all of Grantee's rights hereunder to any governmental authority or duly franchised entity that has been charged with the legal responsibility for the provision of public water utilities in the Village of Carol Stream and that has assumed all of Grantee's obligations under this Grant of Easement.
- 6. The Grantor reserves the right to use of the Easement Premises and the Temporary Easement Premises for any lawful purpose and to grant other parties the right to use the Easement Premises and Temporary Easement Premises, except that any structure on the Easement Premises (other than any structures existing as of the

date of this Grant of Easement) or any use of the Easement Premises (other than rights granted prior to the date hereof) shall not unreasonably interfere with Water Main Improvements located in the Easement Premises or the Easement Activities granted hereunder. Grantee's rights under this Grant of Easement shall be and remain subject to the rights of others to whom any right, title or interest in or to Grantor Property (including without limitation, the Easement Premises and Temporary Easement Premises) has been previously granted and Grantee shall not interfere with such rights. Except as otherwise expressly set forth in this Grant of Easement, Grantor reserves all right, title and interest with respect to the Grantor Property.

7. The Grantee shall, (and shall cause its officers, agents, employees, and contractors) to promptly, and as soon as practicable after engaging in any Easement Activities, restore to its former condition any portion of the Grantor Property and improvements thereon which are disturbed or altered in any manner by such Easement Activities, at the Grantee's sole cost and expense.

Grantee, as part of any approval process or other exercise of Grantee's governmental authority, shall not require the Grantor to plant any shrubs, trees, bushes or other plants within the Easement Premises and hereby waives and discharges Grantor from all such requirements. Grantor shall not plant any shrubs, trees, bushes or other plants within the Easement Premises that interfere with the Water Main Improvements and the Grantee shall have the right to remove any such shrubs, trees, bushes or other plants that interfere with the Water Main Improvements. The removal of any such shrubs, trees, bushes or other plants interfering with the Water Main Improvements within the Easement Premises shall not be deemed to be a violation of

any development condition imposed by Grantee on Grantor or the Grantor Property. The obligations of Grantee under this paragraph shall survive any assignment by Grantee of this Easement and shall remain the personal obligations of Grantee. The invalidity or unenforceability of any of the obligations of Grantee under this paragraph shall invalidate the remaining provisions of this paragraph.

Without limiting any other obligation of Grantee under this Grant of Easement, Grantee shall use reasonable efforts to confine all Easement Activities requiring the disruption or removal of soils to unimproved areas and to the extent any driveways or parking areas need to be disrupted, Grantee shall coordinate the scheduling of such work with Grantor so as to minimize any disruption of operations on Grantor Property.

- 8. All work, labor, services, equipment, tools and materials to be performed, furnished or used directly or indirectly in, or in connection with, the Easement Activities, and all other matters and things to be performed, furnished or used, or expenses to be paid, under the term of this Grant of Easement, are to be at the sole expense of the Grantee, and all such work shall be performed promptly and completed in each instance with diligence and as soon as reasonably practicable after commencement thereof. Grantee shall not cause or suffer or permit to be created any mechanics' or materialmen's liens or claims against the Grantor Property or any portion thereof. Grantee shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Grantor from and against any such claims or liens.
- 9. Grantee shall obtain all necessary permits and approvals and shall otherwise comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances in the conduct of the Easement Activities. Prior to any entry upon the

Grantor Property and throughout the applicable Easement Activities, Grantee shall cause all contractors performing Easement Activities to carry commercial general liability insurance in customary form and amounts for the type of activity contemplated and shall cause such contractors to add Grantor, its tenants and their respective agents and employees as additional insureds to such coverage. Upon request, Grantee shall promptly cause certificates of insurance evidencing such coverage to be issued and delivered to Grantor; provided, that Grantor's failure to request or demand the production of such certificates, the failure of such certificates to meet the requirements of this Grant of Easement and the form or amounts of any insurance shall not in any way release or limit the liability of any contractor or Grantee.

- 10. Except in the event of an emergency, Grantee shall give Grantor notice of Grantee's intention to perform any construction, reconstruction, removal or replacement of the Water Main Improvements at least seven (7) days prior to the date upon which such work is to commence. In the event of an emergency, Grantee shall make reasonable efforts to give prior notice to Grantor and, if unable to do so, shall provide notice as soon as reasonably possible subsequent to the commencement of such work. In connection with non-emergency notice hereunder, Grantee shall concurrently provide to Grantor (a) a description of the work to be performed and (b) the projected dates of commencement and completion of the work. Grantee shall not be required to provide any notice for routine maintenance or inspection with respect to the Water Main Improvements.
- 11. Grantee covenants the following with respect to the initial Water Main Improvements: (i) Grantee will use its best efforts to use directional boring of the Water

Main Improvements to be located within any driveway areas, subject to any field conditions or other conditions that require changes during construction; (ii) improvements located on driveway areas and the flow of traffic shall not be unreasonably disrupted or affected during construction and installation of the Water Main Improvements; (iii) no construction materials or equipment shall be stored on Grantor Property, and (iv) construction access will limited to the Schmale Road right-of-way.

- 12. Grantee hereby agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Grantor Group from and against any and all liability, loss, claims, demands, liens, damages, actions, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees, legal costs) and for any and all loss of life, injury to persons or damage to property which arises from negligent or willful acts or omissions of the Grantee, its officers, agents, employees and contractors (the Grantee Group) in the performance of the Easement Activities.
- 13. Such perpetual Easement as is herein granted shall run with the land and the covenants, agreements, terms, conditions, obligations, rights and interests herein contained or provided for shall be likewise binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the Grantor and Grantee, and their respective heirs, executors, successors, grantees, legal representatives and assigns.

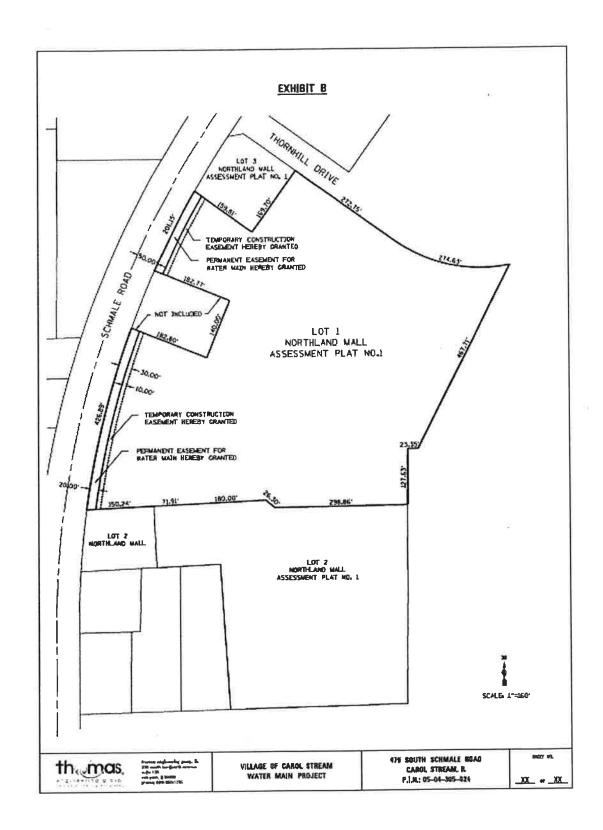

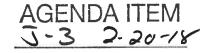

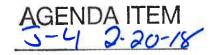
The Public Works Department has identified the following item that is no longer of use and recommends it be declared surplus for the purpose of selling at auction:

Spencer Power Mizer Multi-stage Centrifugal Cast Blower

Serial Number: 802151 CO3 Model Number: C51R2644IA1

This blower was removed from the west blower building at the WRC in preparation for installation of the faulty HSI blower next month. The new blower has a larger footprint than the HSI blower it is replacing, making the removal of this additional blower also necessary. This older-model Spencer blower is a redundant unit, and there are two others in place in that building that provide additional redundancy. Therefore, it is no longer needed.

Staff recommends that this item be declared surplus by the Mayor and Board of Trustees and that the Public Works Director be authorized to dispose of the item through public auction.

Electric Supply Auction

In January 2017 the Village Board approved a resolution authorizing the Mayor or his designee to execute an agreement for the purchase of electric utility service for our large commercial accounts based on the low bid received by our consultant Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Cooperative (NIMEC). At the time several small accounts were not included in the bid. Since NIMEC has historically provided better rates than ComEd we are proposing to secure lower rates by using NIMEC's existing agreement with Dynergy for our pumping based accounts and move the remaining street light accounts to the Constellation agreement, if the rate is less, where the majority of street lights are charged.

The current ComEd commercial rate is 7.275 cents, Dynergy has recently quoted 5.8 cents; the Village is expecting a more favorable rate with Dynergy than ComEd. Constellation has recently quoted a streetlight rate of 3.868 cents which is slightly over the ComEd rate of 3.852 cents. NIMEC expects ComEd to increase street light rates this June and recommends we lock in the Constellation rate if it provides a quote equal to or better than the current ComEd street light rate.

Our consultant, David Hoover, has provided a memo (attached) addressing the accounts currently held with ComEd. At the time of rate acceptance the Village will be able to lock in a rate for up to three years. Locking in a multi-year rate has the advantage of allowing staff to budget electricity expenses with more certainty and potentially avoids future market rate increases. The downside is that if rates decline, we would not be able to access the lower rate.

To accept the quoted rates, we will need to enter into an agreement with the lowest cost rate supplier on the day the rate is quoted. Staff recommends approving the attached resolution allowing NIMEC to bring forward updated rate quotes for the remaining small accounts and to allow the Mayor or designee to enter into an agreement with the lowest cost electricity supplier subject to final contract review.

NIMEC

The Village has worked with NIMEC since 2001 and has a good working relationship. Since 2007 when the power market was deregulated, NIMEC has been managing the purchase of the Village's larger accounts (water pumping and street lighting) on the open market. NIMEC purchases with 100+ other northern Illinois communities, leveraging the collective volumes to negotiate lower rates that what individual municipalities could negotiate on their own.

We recently discovered that the Village's smaller accounts were not included in NIMEC's bid. As NIMEC has consistently bettered the ComEd base rate for small commercial accounts, we recommend moving the following accounts from ComEd to NIMEC:

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A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE NORTHERN ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC COLLABORATIVE (NIMEC) AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO APPROVE A CONTRACT WITH THE LOWEST COST ELECTRICITY PROVIDER FOR A PERIOD UP TO 36 MONTHS.

WHEREAS the Village of Carol Stream ("The Village") is a municipality in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and,

WHEREAS, on January 2, 2007, the State of Illinois implemented a plan to deregulate Commonwealth Edison; and,

WHEREAS, as a result of this deregulation, electricity may be purchased based on market price and Commonwealth Edison is no longer the sole supplier of electricity in northern Illinois, resulting in new electricity suppliers being able to compete against Commonwealth Edison, and competitive market forces dictating the price of electricity; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream has selected the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative (NIMEC) to serve as the Village's broker relative to the acquisition of electrical energy for Village accounts, due to NIMEC's municipal experience and the fact that NIMEC is the largest municipal Collaborative in northern Illinois it can secure more competitive pricing than can be provided individually to a single municipality; and,

WHEREAS, the amount of compensation that NIMEC receives, if the Village chooses the NIMEC electricity supplier, is included in the electricity prices supplied by NIMEC, so there will be no direct payment made to NIMEC by the Village; and,

WHEREAS the Village has been working with NIMEC since 2008, and the Village has enjoyed a good working relationship with NIMEC regarding its larger accounts; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to enter the market to secure a fixed rate for the smaller commercial accounts, up to 36 months in term.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative (NIMEC) has been appointed the Village's broker for purposes of obtaining an electricity supply for the Village's municipal needs.

SECTION 2: That the Mayor or his designee is authorized to negotiate energy rates directly with suppliers in an effort to secure lower energy costs.

SECTION 3: That in light of the time constraints and procedures required, applicable to the acceptance of a competitive electricity rate, once the updated rates are received by NIMEC, the Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to sign the contract with the most optimal rate, with the Mayor being hereby directed to place said contract on the first available Village Board regular meeting following the execution thereof by the Mayor, for ratification by the Village Board.

SECTION 4: That the Mayor or his designee is authorized to name the Village Manager as the Mayor's designee in matters concerning the bid.

<u>SECTION 5:</u> The Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form, as provided by law.
