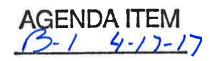

WHEREAS, the Village encourages residents and the general public to participate in any of the upcoming environmental events or efforts in observance of this year's Earth Day:

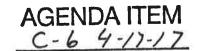

Approval to purchase four (4) replacement squad cars

The Police Department requests approval to purchase one (1) Administration squad and three (3) Patrol squads from Thomas Dodge.

The department has identified the need to replace Administration squad 672. This is consistent with our vehicle replacement plan that systematically identifies vehicles that are reaching their optimal service life. Squad 672, a 2007 Ford Explorer, is nearing the end of its service life. This vehicle is 10 years old and currently has over 60,000 miles on it. Squad 672 will be transferred to Investigations to be used as a surveillance vehicle once its replacement has been properly outfitted.

Squad 623, 624, and 625 are Dodge Chargers that we purchased to replace the outgoing Ford Crown Victoria. The squads have spent their entire service, under heavy use, as zone cars on daily patrol. Squad 623 currently has approximately 76,000 miles on it. Squad 624 has approximately 84,000 and squad 625 has approximately 89,000. Each of these squads has reached the end of its optimal service life as a patrol car. They will remain in service until each of their replacements are received, up-fitted, tested, and placed into service. The process of ordering, receiving and up-fitting a new police vehicle can take up to 6 months.

I propose that we replace squads 672, 623, 624, 625 with 2017 Dodge Charger Police Pursuit Vehicles under the Southwest Conference of Mayors Cooperative bid pricing. One administrative package Charger to replace 672 for a price of \$24,287 and (3) Patrol package Chargers at \$24,497 each (\$73,491 total). Total cost for all four vehicles is \$97,778. This price is below the budgeted amount for the vehicles. The cooperative vendor is Thomas Dodge, 9604 Indianapolis Blvd., Highland, IN 46322.

The new Chargers will be all-wheel drive, improving safety and drivability in foul weather. The new Chargers will be out-fitted with a factory installed back-up cameras and sensors to increase safety and reduce the incidents of backing crashes. Additionally, they will be outfitted with cutting edge Watchguard in-car camera systems. The Watchguard system records in high definition video. It consists of 3 camera heads that record simultaneously. One forward facing camera records in the standard 68 degree viewing angle. The second forward facing camera records in a pillar to pillar near 180-degree panoramic viewing angle. This camera will allow us to capture incidents that are often missed by the standard camera head. The audio recording capabilities of this system are also far superior to our outgoing system. Videos from this system will be wirelessly uploaded to our new Watchguard server system, greatly reducing the manhours required to manually uploading the videos.

Award of Contract - Aztec Sanitary Sewer Lining Project

Sanitary sewer surcharging in homes on Aztec Drive was a problem in heavy rainfall events of the early 2000's. A sanitary sewer reconstruction project was planned and budgeted for over \$200,000. However, when the subdivision was constructed south of Glenbard North High School, a sanitary bypass sewer was constructed parallel to Kuhn Road in order to divert Western Trails flow from Aztec Drive. This resolved the problem for the most rainfall events and the project was placed on hold.

Video from the sanitary sewer revealed cracks and open joints in the pipe that allowed roots to intrude and collect debris, sometimes restricting or blocking flow in the pipe. Generally, the pipe is in good condition so a sewer lining project was considered. The short length of the project resulted in uneconomical quotes from sewer lining contractors.

This year, staff became aware of a joint bid project available through the Municipal Partnering Initiative (MPI), led by the Village of Lombard, including Elmhurst and Bensenville. Bids were opened on March 24th and Hoerr Construction Inc. from Peoria was the low bidder at \$1,120,925. Carol Stream's portion of the bid is \$32,396.

The CIP budget for this year included \$50,000 for the project, the bid is \$17,604 (35%) under budget. Engineering staff therefore recommends that the Aztec Drive Sanitary Sewer Lining Project be awarded to Hoerr Construction, Inc. at the unit prices bid pursuant to the provisions of Section 5-8-3 (B) and Section 5-8-14 (L) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

The preconstruction phase has now proceeded to the point where the Construction Manager has provided the Final Guaranteed Maximum Price for the Construction. Northern Illinois University (NIU) Award of Contract

In 2011, the Village Board adopted a goal to incorporate GIS functions in all departments. Subsequently in 2014 they adopted another goal to accelerate and incorporate enterprise wide GIS applications. The Village has committed to this endeavor by budgeting over \$187,000 per year including \$39,000 for a NIU GIS intern and \$148,200 for GIS Consortium (GISC) services in FY18.

The NIU GIS intern's provide support to our GISC service provider (MGP, Inc.). The Interns are capable of performing many GIS services at a far lower rate saving the Village money. MGP will direct the activities of the GIS interns.

NIU has provided us with a contract that provides 1,820 GIS intern hours for a cost not to exceed \$39,000, which is at the budget amount of \$39,000. See attached. Staff has reviewed the contract, found it acceptable and recommend award of the contract to NIU for \$39,000.

PROJECT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made between the Board of Trustees of Northern Illinois University, hereinafter called the "UNIVERSITY," with principal offices at Sponsored Programs Administration, 301 Lowden Hall, DeKalb, Illinois 60115, and the Village of Carol Stream, hereinafter called the "SPONSOR," with principal offices at 500 North Gary Avenue, Carol Stream, IL 60188.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the SPONSOR and the UNIVERSITY desire to enter into an agreement pertaining to a Project investigation in accordance with the Statement of Work in Appendix A; and

WHEREAS, the investigation is to be funded by the SPONSOR and carried out by the UNIVERSITY under the terms and conditions specified herein; and

WHEREAS, the performance of such investigation is of mutual interest to the SPONSOR and the UNIVERSITY, and is consistent with the instructional, scholarship and research objectives of the UNIVERSITY as a non-profit, tax-exempt educational institution.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. STATEMENT OF WORK

The UNIVERSITY agrees to use reasonable efforts to perform the project as described in the Statement of Work, which is incorporated herein and attached as Appendix A. These efforts are hereinafter called the "Project." The UNIVERSITY shall perform this effort consistent with reasonable standards of professionalism applied in related fields. The Project is entitled, "GIS Design and Implementation for the Village of Carol Stream."

2. PRINCIPAL INVESTIGATOR

The Principal Investigator assigned by the UNIVERSITY for directing the performance of the Project is Professor Ryan James. If for any reason the Principal Investigator withdraws from serving as principal investigator, the UNIVERSITY and the SPONSOR shall endeavor to agree upon a successor. If the parties are unable to agree upon a successor, SPONSOR shall have the right to terminate this Agreement in the manner provided in the paragraph 7 entitled Termination.

3. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

The work shall be performed during the period from 05/01/17 through 04/30/18. This date may be extended under the same terms or such other terms as may be mutually agreed upon.

4. COST OF RESEARCH

This agreement is to be considered a *cost reimbursement contract* for a total cost not to exceed \$39,000. Costs are to be established as outlined in the attached scope of work. The SPONSOR shall not be obligated to reimburse the UNIVERSITY in excess of the contract price, unless and

until SPONSOR has notified NIU, in writing, that such a contract price has been increased and this contract amended to provide for such an increase.

NIU shall invoice SPONSOR on a monthly basis, based upon an hourly rate of \$19.50 per hour worked by the NIU students, subject to verification of the time sheets by the SPONSOR and the UNIVERSITY. From that sum, the UNIVERSITY will ensure that the students are paid the normative rate and that any appropriate fringe benefits are received. Payment is to be made by SPONSOR to the UNIVERSITY no later than 30 days after receipt of the invoice.

The UNIVERSITY is not obligated to expend any other funds on the Project, and the SPONSOR is not obligated to pay the UNIVERSITY in excess of the above stated amount.

5. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

If the Project results in any new, patentable development, the parties shall negotiate disposition of such developments in good faith.

6. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- A. Prior to disclosure of Proprietary Information to UNIVERSITY by SPONSOR, SPONSOR shall notify Principal Investigator of its intent to disclose Proprietary Information; and Principal Investigator shall have the right to decline receipt of said information. Said Proprietary Information shall be sent only to Principal Investigator.
- B. Each party to this Agreement agrees to treat Proprietary Information received from the other with the same degree of care with which it treats its own Proprietary Information and further agrees not to disclose such Proprietary Information to a third party without prior written consent from the party disclosing Proprietary Information.
- C. The foregoing obligations of non-disclosure do not apply to Proprietary Information which:
 - (a) was known to the recipient prior to the disclosure hereunder;
 - (b) was received from a third party not under an obligation of confidence to recipient;
 - (c) is in the public domain at the time of disclosure hereunder or subsequently entered the public domain without the fault of the recipient;
 - (d) has been independently developed by an employee of recipient that has not had access directly or indirectly to Proprietary Information, and recipient can substantiate any claim of independent development by written evidence; or

- (e) is required to be disclosed by law.
- D. Confidential Information must be written and clearly marked "CONFIDENTIAL" or reduced to writing within thirty (30) days after nontangible disclosure ("Confidential Information").
- E. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing, neither party hereto shall have any obligation of confidentiality under this Agreement after the third anniversary of the conclusion of Period of Performance.

7. TERMINATION

This Project may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days' written notice. In the event of termination by the SPONSOR, the UNIVERSITY will be reimbursed for all costs incurred and all non-cancellable commitments at the time of termination. In the event of termination by the UNIVERSITY, any unexpended or unobligated balance of funds advanced by the SPONSOR shall be refunded to the SPONSOR. The provisions of Articles 5, 6, and 9 shall survive any termination of the Agreement.

8. USE OF THE NAME OF THE PARTIES

Neither the SPONSOR nor the UNIVERSITY shall make use of the existence of the Agreement, nor use the other's name or the name of any member of its staff, for publicity or advertising purposes except with the consent of and to the extent approved by the other party. For the UNIVERSITY, such approval will be obtained from Sponsored Programs Administration.

9. PUBLICATION

The UNIVERSITY shall have the right to publish or otherwise disclose the results of this Project, provided that the Principal Investigator first provides the SPONSOR with a copy of the proposed publication at least thirty (30) days in advance of submission for publication. The SPONSOR shall have thirty (30) days after the receipt of the publication or presentation to review it. The Principal Investigator shall modify said publication in order to comply with reasonable requests by the SPONSOR.

10. REPORTS

A final report will be submitted to the SPONSOR by the Principal Investigator within ninety (90) days of the termination of this Agreement.

11. WARRANTIES AND INDEMNIFICATION

THE UNIVERSITY MAKES NO REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, REGARDING ITS PERFORMANCE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE MARKETABILITY, USE OR FITNESS FOR ANY PARTICULAR PURPOSE OF THE PROJECT RESULTS DEVELOPED UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, OR THAT SUCH RESULTS DO NOT INFRINGE UPON ANY THIRD PARTY'S PROPERTY RIGHTS. The SPONSOR agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the

UNIVERSITY and its employees and agents against any and all costs, damages and expenses, including attorney's fees, arising from any claims, damages and liabilities asserted by third parties arising from the SPONSOR'S use of said results.

12. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party shall assign its rights under this agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, UNIVERSITY hereby consents to the assignment of this agreement by SPONSOR to any present or future wholly-owned affiliate of SPONSOR or to any successor in interest of the entire business of SPONSOR as a result of a merger, consolidation or purchase as long as the assignee expressly accepts in writing all the obligations and responsibilities of SPONSOR under this agreement.

13. GOVERNING LAW

This agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois. This agreement is subject to all applicable rules and regulations of the Board of Trustees of Northern Illinois University and the laws of the United States and the State of Illinois.

14. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

Scope of Work Attachment A

Attached is a scope of work for the proposed contract between Northern Illinois University and Village of Carol Stream Geographic Information System (GIS) Design and Implementation program. Northern Illinois University has been supplying a student worker and project oversight to the Village of Carol Stream for a number of years to assist in the design and implementation of GIS for the Village. This proposal outlines NIU's interest in continuing the program from May 1, 2017-April 30, 2018, under the supervision of Dr. Ryan James. This awarded sum will allow NIU to provide one Graduate Assistant (GA) and one undergraduate intern for 14 weeks in the summer semester and 36 weeks in the academic year; the GA and undergraduate intern will each work 20 hours a week. During this time period, the student workers and Dr. James will provide the Village of Carol Stream with GIS database updating and management, data migration, map generation for immediate use and long term planning projects, as well as engage in GIS-based spatial analysis to aid policy formulation and administrative management for Carol Stream. Dr. James will visit the Village three times during the year (once each semester) to monitor workflows and student performance, as well as to provide additional GIS guidance.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM IN THE AMOUNT OF \$67,472,066 FOR THE FY17/18 FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING MAY 1, 2017, AND ENDING APRIL 30, 2018

WHEREAS, Village staff has prepared and presented to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream a proposed annual budget for the FY17/18 fiscal year beginning May 1, 2017, and ending April 30, 2018 as set forth in "Exhibit A" to this ordinance as attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, following due and proper publication of public notice in <u>The Examiner</u> on April 5, 2017, a public hearing was held on April 17, 2017, to consider the proposed annual budget for the FY17/18 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annual budget has been made conveniently available for public review and inspection at least 10 days prior to passage in the office of the Carol Stream Village Clerk, the Carol Stream Public Library and on the Village's web site, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream deem it in the best interest of the Village to adopt the budget proposed by the Budget Officer, as revised at the direction of the Mayor and Board of Trustees;

Now, Therefore, Be it Hereby Ordained by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, in the Exercise of its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

SECTION 1: The annual expenditure Budget for the FY17/18 fiscal year, beginning May 1, 2017, and ending April 30, 2018, for the Village of Carol Stream, is in the amount of Sixty Seven Million Four Hundred Seventy Two Thousand Sixty Six Dollars, (\$67,472,066); as set forth in "Exhibit A", as attached hereto, is hereby adopted and authorized.

SECTION 2: That the adoption of the foregoing annual budget shall be in lieu of the Appropriation Ordinance required in Section 8-2-9 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

SECTION 3: The budget hereby approved shall be printed and bound and a certified copy of this Ordinance and a copy of the printed and bound budget shall be filed with the DuPage County Clerk in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Illinois.

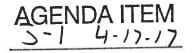
SECTION 4: The Finance Director is authorized and directed to transfer the sum of

Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) from General Corporate Fund cash reserve balances to the Capital Projects Fund to support improvements to the Village's public assets. This transfer is consistent with the Village's established policies and past practices with respect to reserve balances and continues to be the primary funding source for improvements to the Village's roadway, storm water, public facility and other infrastructure systems which are completed in the Capital Projects Fund.

RE: Non-Union Compensation Recommendation

The following recommendation for the 2017-2018 Compensation Plan reflects the Village's philosophy of maintaining comparability in pay and benefit structures within a municipal setting. The Village continues to strive to maintain just and equitable compensation when compared against both external and internal data.

In evaluating compensation, each non-union position is first evaluated based on the market. To establish market level with regard to compensation, comparable communities are asked for the minimum and maximum salary for all positions similar to those of the Village of Carol Stream¹. Each community's data is evaluated for position similarity, and then the minimum and maximum are assessed. Upon completion of this process, formulas are applied to calculate both the average and the upper one-third level of maximum salaries by position. The current maximum salary for each Village position is then evaluated against this range.

In addition to the evaluation of position ranges, comparable communities are asked for their anticipated or actual general wage adjustment for the upcoming year. This information, along with internal union settlements, the consumer price index (CPI) and the employment cost index (ECI) are analyzed, and a general wage adjustment recommendation is made.

Finally, communities are asked for salary data related to performance based increases. Each community's data is calculated, to determine an average adjustment for performance. This average, along with all other budgetary factors is used to prepare a recommendation in this area.

Below are the results of this analysis.

Compensation Recommendations

1. As stated above, there are multiple factors used in evaluating a general wage adjustment recommendation, including comparable communities, union settlements, the Consumer Price Index (CPI), and the Employment Cost Index (ECI). A synopsis of this year's data is listed below:

❖ The average general wage adjustment anticipated by our comparable communities is 2.14%.

For the purpose of this report, data was collected as of February 2016.

- ❖ The Village of Carol Stream has three (3) active collective bargaining agreements, with an average adjustment of 2.75% on May 1, 2017.
- ❖ The Consumer Price index for 2016 was 1.9%.
- ❖ The Employment Cost Index for 2016 was 3%.

Taking all factors into account, it is recommended that a 2.75% general wage adjustment be provided for non-union positions. This recommendation allows for internal equity, reducing the likelihood of disparity between positions with similar skill levels, as well as that of supervisors with union employees. Although somewhat above our external comparable data, this difference will be off-set by the comparable merit recommendation below. Total cost for this recommendation is estimated at \$165,000.

2. The survey of comparable communities confirmed that over 90% continue to provide performance based compensation, with an average possible increase of 3.29%. In addition, internal comparability continues to allow for step increases for all other employee groups covered by a collective bargaining agreement.

Based on this information as well as the general wage adjustment recommendation above, it is recommended to fund this year's performance based compensation program at 2.5% effective May 1, 2017. As with any merit system, this adjustment would be contingent upon a "meets expectations" or above performance evaluation. Employees at the top of their pay range with "meets expectations" or above performance will receive this adjustment as a one-time non-recurring lump sum payment not to be made part of base compensation. Total cost for this recommendation is estimated at \$117,000.

3. This year, the maximum salary of one position (Accountant) was determined to be above the market level (upper one-third). **Based on this data, it is recommended to freeze the pay range of this position.** The incumbent in this position is not at maximum salary, and would not be immediately impacted.

Example

With a 2.75% general wage adjustment, if a position is found to be more than 2.75% above the upper one-third level, that position's <u>range</u> would be frozen. The incumbent employee would move 2.75% as long as the result does not cause the employee to be above the maximum of the range.

4. This year, the maximum salary of two positions (Assistant Village Manager and Employee Relations Generalist) was determined to be below the market level (average). Based on this data, it is recommended to adjust the salary <u>ranges</u> of these positions to the market level (average). Incumbents in these positions would not be immediately affected if they are not near the current minimum salary. However; if an incumbent is at or near the minimum salary, that person would be adjusted to the new minimum.

Example

With a 2.75% general wage adjustment, if a position is found to be more than 2.75% below average, that position's <u>range</u> will be increased to the market level. The

incumbent employee would only move 2.75% unless the result left an employee below the minimum salary of the pay range.

The recommendations above provide for both internal and external equity within the municipal government market. It should also be noted that that the cost for these adjustments are fully funded in the proposed FY17-18 budget.

Position Recommendations

1. Position Conversion: The current position of Data Coordinator works within Public Works to provide technical support of databases and develop procedures to insure a high level of data quality within the department. As a result of various large scale initiatives that have been undertaken elsewhere throughout the Village (LAMA, GIS, Asset Management, etc.), it has become evident that a Village wide data management plan needs to be implemented to provide a central repository for common, clean data to be used and reused in multiple systems. A central repository will afford the ability to manage data in one system, reducing errors and technical issues while leveraging record links across all departments.

Based on this need, it is recommended to eliminate the Data Coordinator position within the Public Works Department and to create a Database Developer position within the Information Technology Department. While there are similarities between a Data Coordinator and a Database Developer, the latter involves larger and more complex projects, and will require SQL programming language skills. A review of the market indicates a salary range for this recommended position is consistent with that of IT Technician.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE 2017-18 EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION PLAN FOR THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM

WHEREAS, as part of the budgeting process for the Village of Carol Stream, the Village Board of Trustees annually approves and adopts an employee pay plan schedule; and

WHEREAS, an employee pay plan schedule has been found to be in the best interests of the Village of Carol Stream; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, in the exercise of its home rule powers, as follows:

SECTION 1: With the exception of the positions of Accountant, Assistant Village Manager, and Human Resources Generalist, all pay ranges of non-union positions will be increased by 2.75% effective 5/1/17.

SECTION 2: The pay range of Accountant will be frozen and reevaluated in the 2018-19 fiscal year.

SECTION 3: The pay ranges of Assistant Village Manager and Human Resources Generalist will be increased by 3.8% and 3.66% respectively to adjust these position ranges to market level.

SECTION 4: All Village employees actively employed on 5/1/17 who are not represented by a labor organization will receive a 2.75% wage adjustment to their current salary effective 5/1/17 through 4/30/18.

SECTION 5: Employees in the positions of Assistant Village Manager or Human

Resources Generalist who fall below the minimum salary of their position will receive a

wage adjustment greater than 2.75% to reach the minimum salary of that position

effective 5/1/17 through 4/30/18.

SECTION 6: That the performance based compensation program for non-union

employees will be funded at 2.5% effective 5/1/17.

SECTION 7: That the position of Data Coordinator will be eliminated effective

5/1/17.

SECTION 8: That the position of Database Developer will be created effective

5/1/17.

SECTION 9: That the 2017-2018 Employee Pay Plan schedule for the Village of

Carol Stream, as attached to this Resolution as Attachment "A", shall be adopted by

the Village of Carol Stream for all present Village employees, executive and non-

RE: Surplus Property

In 2004, through ILEAS via a federal grant, our Department was issued 120 Avon airpurifying respirators (APR). This was in response to the attack on the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001. Avon subsequently changed the service life of the APRs from 20 years to 10 years. In effect, the APRs cannot be utilized by our Department due to the expiration of the 10-year service life of the APR. Avon also informed ILEAS that the expired APRs could not be refurbished to extend the service life due to the exorbitant cost of the equipment and process in doing so.

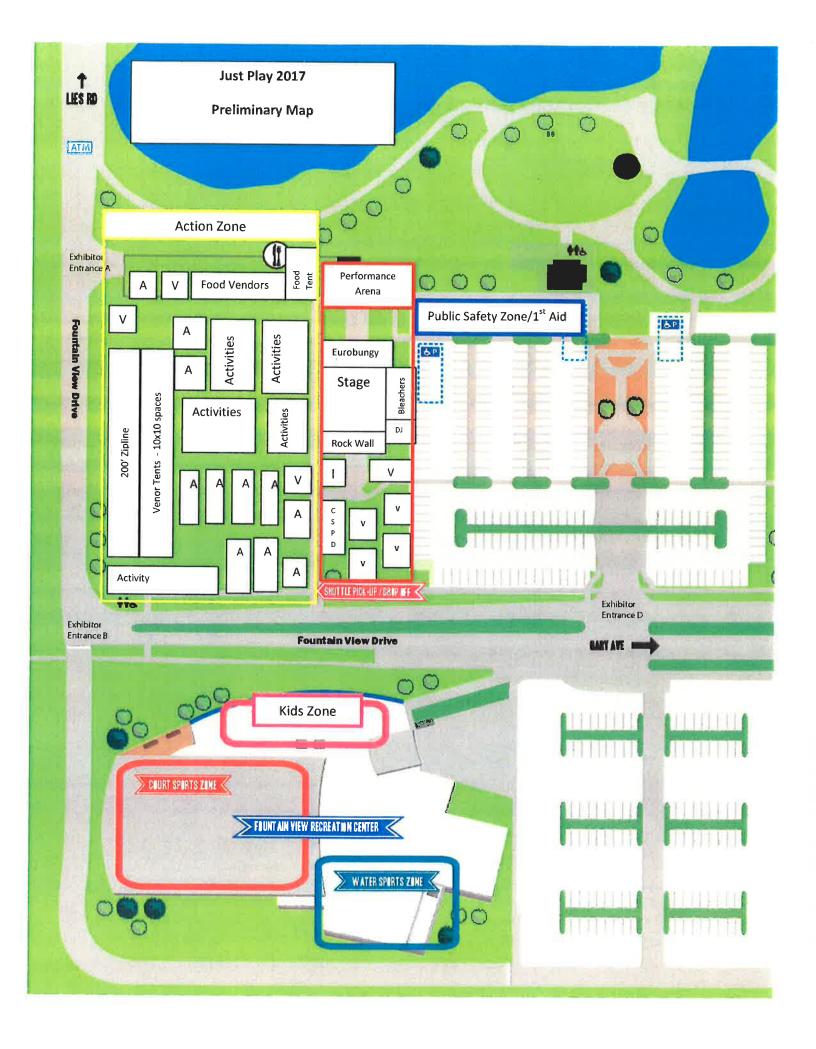
