The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Frank Saverino, Sr. and the roll call read by Village Clerk Laura Czarnecki. The result of the roll call vote was as follows:

FY 2018/19 Budget Workshop

Finance Director Jon Batek reviewed possible new revenue sources with the Village Board to make up losses in Village revenues from the loss of Office Depot, the State of Illinois and other sources. Staff will not have a revenue recommendation until the 2019 budget expenditures are developed.

FY19 Preliminary Budget Discussion Revenue Sources included:

- Property Tax
- Home Rule Sales Tax
- Local Motor Fuel Tax
- Food and Beverage Tax
- Utility Tax-Water

• Stormwater Utility Fee

Property tax likely an FY 2020 Option. Home Rule sales tax very popular among Carol Stream peers. The Village of Carol Stream is at the low end of home rule sales tax rate. A rate increase of .25% should generate approximately \$1.3 million. Trustees LaRocca and McCarthy feel this is a good option.

Gas tax –Local MFT. Trustee Frusolone and the other Trustees likes this option as non-village residents contribute to this revenue. Trustees generally favored this tax option. Gas tax revenues must be used for road projects and would free up GCF dollars, previously used for road work.

Food and Beverage $\tan - a$ 1% $\tan w$ ould generate about \$525,000. Trustee McCarthy would not want the home rule sales $\tan w$ and the food and beverage $\tan w$ to apply simultaneously. Trustee Frusolone is concerned with the amount of staff time to administer this $\tan w$. Mayor Saverino wants to give staff all the tools it needs to fund Village operations. Trustee McCarthy not wild about this revenue source.

Utility Tax (water) – not a popular or prevalent source of income among our peers. Trustee Frusolone prefers other revenue options to a utility tax on water.

Stormwater Utility Fee – fee would apply to all property based on their impermeable surface (commercial, industrial, residential and religious, etc.) The Village Board felt this was a very confusing revenue source. This would be controversial. A Storm water fee would take over a year to implement and require public meetings to educate the residents.

Water Meter Pilot Program Review

Director of Public Works Phil Modaff reviewed highlights of the Village's water meter program which include:

Program Highlights

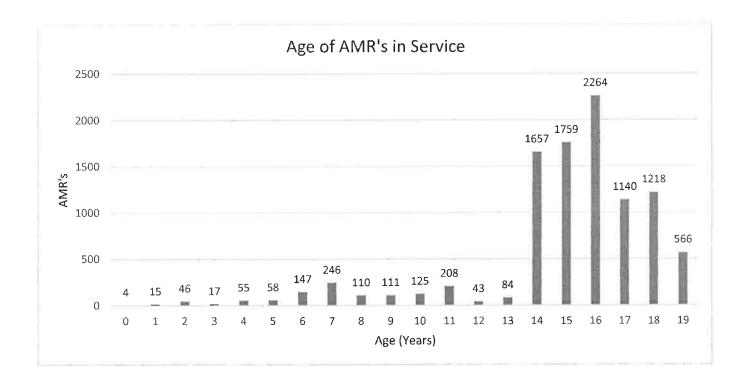
- ▶ 115 meters tested
- ► Greater than 25 years old
- ▶ Meters removed and sent to third-party testing company
- ► Tested at three flow levels low, medium and high

Testing Results

- ► American Water Works Association Standard: "accurate" meters are those that test within 3% of actual flow
- ▶ At the **low flow rate** meters tested on average at 95.17% accuracy. At this flow rate 65% tested within the standard.
- ▶ At the **medium flow rate** meters tested on average at 99.43% accuracy. At this flow rate 97% tested within the standard.
- ▶ At the **high flow rate** meters tested on average at 99.24% accuracy. At this flow rate 99% tested within the standard.
- ▶ Conclusion: assuming the meters less than 25 years old are operating with similar or better results, mass meter replacement is not warranted at this time.

Emerging Issue

- ▶ An Automatic Meter Reading device (AMR) is installed with each meter.
- The AMR does not measure water consumption, but rather captures the consumption as measured and recorded by the meter.
- ▶ The AMR is the transmitting device which is read by vehicle-mounted, meter reading equipment.
- ▶ The AMR is powered by a battery (the meter has no power source).
- ► There are currently 10,000 AMR's in service (on meters under 2")
- ▶ 85% of AMR's in service are greater than 13 years old
 - ▶ The oldest AMR's (installed pre-2005) have a life-expectancy of 10 years (initially thought to be 7-8 years)
 - \blacktriangleright AMR's installed starting in 2005 have a life expectancy of 10-15 years
 - ▶ AMR's installed starting in 2012 have a life expectancy of 20 years.



- The replacement of AMR's over the three most recent 12-month periods is as follows:
 - **2014-15**: 236
 - 2015-16: 235

 - 2016-17: 284
 - ▶ Based on the age of AMR's in service and the life-expectancy of the various units, consideration should be given to planning for replacement of AMR's

Options

- ▶ Do nothing and replace AMR's as they fail
- ▶ Develop a replacement program

- ▶ Mass replacement (all in 1 year) over a certain age (> 14 years?)
- ▶ Phased replacement, starting with the oldest, over a period of years (3, 4, 5 years?)
- ▶ Budget for replacement
 - ► If all AMR's purchased at one time, cost is estimated at approximately \$1.1 million (assumes replacement of oldest 8,600 AMR's)
 - ▶ If planned for 2,850 per year, equipment cost would be approximately \$393,000 per year (assumes replacement of oldest 8,600 AMR's over 3 year period and current pricing)
- ▶ Do nothing" option:
 - ▶ in-house staff can attempt to keep up with failures and change out the oldest ones as we come across them.
 - ▶ If rate of failure increases significantly, more resources will need to be directed to this work
- ► Mass replacement:
 - ▶ 2-3 maintenance staff and one full-time administrative staff needed; OR,
 - ▶ Hire contractor to schedule and make replacements
- ▶ Phased replacement:
 - ► At least 1 maintenance staff (plus currently dedicated meter person)
 - ▶ Significant additional administrative hours required

Summary

- ▶ Meter replacement is not recommended at this time
- ► AMR replacement should be considered
 - ▶ Most AMR's are *well beyond* expected useful life
 - ▶ "Do nothing", one-year or multi-year program options
 - ► In-house staff capable (and willing)
 - ▶ Will impact current operations functions
 - ▶ Will impact administrative function

Staff is not recommending replacement of water meters at this time. However, 85% of the AMRs are older than 13 years and the older batteries are beginning to fail. The risk of a meter failure is a loss of water metered revenue. When an AMR fails, we do not lose the meter data, but only the ability to read the meter remotely.

Trustee McCarthy feels a phased replacement program makes sense. Trustee Frusolone asked the cost of changing AMRS in-house vs. using a contractor. Staff will look at a phased AMR replacement program using in-house employees and contractors.

There being no further business, Trustee Hennessey moved and Trustee McCarthy made the second to adjourn the Special Board meeting. The meeting was adjourned unanimously at 7:25 p.m.

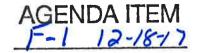
<u>SECTION 2</u>: Officer Antonio Petragallo is wished the very best of happiness and health in his continued employment with the Village of Carol Stream.

Section 5.2 (Contractor Compensation) of the current residential refuse collection agreement, approved 12-1-2014 to last through 12-31-2019, with Flood Brothers Disposal & Recycling Services Co. requires the Chicagoland CPI-U (less food & energy) be used to calculate rate adjustments for collection year 2018. The 12 month Chicagoland CPI-U less food & energy through November 2017 is + 1.8%.

Due to the closing of the Waste Management recycling facility located in Carol Stream (which accepted Carol Stream recycling for free), Flood Brothers Disposal Co. must now use more expensive agencies further away resulting in increased tip fees. Section 5.2 of the contract allows the Village Board to consider special circumstances and award an increase above the CPI-U (less food & energy) if special circumstances warrant it. Attached are the proposed 2018 collection year rates from Flood Brothers Disposal Co. that apply an approximate 3% increase in each category. This increase would be 1.2% over the current CPI-U and staff believes this is a reasonable accommodation for the change in market conditions. Also attached is a letter from Flood Brothers Disposal Co. regarding the rate increase.

Staff analyzed how the proposed rates would compare with our peer communities with a fixed rate residential refuse collection program and found whether the rate was the 1.8% allowed by contract or the 3% proposed, the Village's ranking will not change. Rankings can be reviewed below:

As demonstrated above, the proposed rates are comparable to our peers and accepting the higher rate will not affect our ranking. The new rates, if approved, will be effective January 1st and be reflected in the Jan. - Apr. 2018 invoice. In addition, Flood Brothers has requested to extend the contract through 2024 as is allowed by contract section 3.0. In consideration, for this extension Flood Brothers would hold the pricing proposed in attachment 1 through 2019, not taking the 2019 increase allowed by contract. Flood Brothers is reasonably competitive in the market and staff has been pleased with their service quality. Please include the 2018 rate proposal for Board consideration on the Dec. 18 agenda as well as the requested extension.

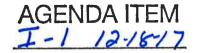

RE: Discriminatory Workplace Harassment Ordinance and Amendments

On November 16, 2017, Public Act 100-0554 was signed into law in Illinois. This Act imposes a significant legal requirement on local governmental entities with regard to their Sexual Harassment policies. Specifically, each unit of local government must adopt an ordinance or resolution establishing a policy to prohibit sexual harassment that includes a variety of components within that policy.

The Village of Carol Stream has long maintained a policy prohibiting sexual harassment, as well as other forms of discriminatory workplace harassment, that address many of the required components in the new law. However, a review of the new law's requirements indicate that additional amendments need to be made. These amendments include:

- The options for reporting an allegation confidentially.
- Language describing protections under the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act and the Whistleblower Act.
- The legal consequences of a violation as well as knowingly making a false report.

In addition, while the Personnel Manual states that all of the rules within it also apply to all elected and appointed officers, a specific inclusion of Village officials within this policy is also required.

As a result of the above, I recommend the attached Discriminatory Workplace Harassment policy located in Chapter 1E of the Village of Carol Stream's Personnel Manual be approved by Ordinance as amended. This policy has been reviewed by Counsel.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-____

ORDINANCE APPROVING AND ADOPTING A REVISED DISCRIMINATORY WORKPLACE HARASSMENT POLICY

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream is a home rule unit of local government as provided by Article VII, Section 7 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly recently enacted Public Act 100-0554, which requires all governmental units to adopt by resolution or ordinance a policy prohibiting sexual harassment; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream has previously adopted and maintained a Discriminatory Workplace Harassment Policy within its personnel policy manual entitled the "Carol Stream Personnel Policy Manual" (the "Manual"); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream have determined that the Discriminatory Workplace Harassment Policy should be revised and codified in order to comply with Public Act 100-0554.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: The above recitals are incorporated into and made a part of this Ordinance,

SECTION 2: The Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, Chapter 1, "Government Organization" is hereby amended by adding Article 8, "Discriminatory Workplace Harassment Policy" which shall read as follows:

Article 8 Discriminatory Workplace Harassment Policy

§1-8-1 Purpose. The purpose of this Policy is to establish The Village's commitment to provide a work environment free from harassment, to define discriminatory harassment, and to set forth the procedure for investigating and resolving internal complaints of harassment.

§1-8-2 Policy.

- A. All Village employees and Village officials have a right to work in an environment free from harassment. It is critical that all Village employees and Village officials treat all other Village employees and Village officials with dignity and respect. It is the responsibility of each and every Village official, employee, supervisor and department head to make sure that there is no inappropriate behavior occurring in the workplace. Inappropriate behavior that impacts the Village work environment, or has the potential to impact the work environment will not be tolerated.
- B. Harassment of a Village official or employee by any Village official or employee on the basis of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, disability, medical condition, marital status, pregnancy, sexual orientation, gender, age, or other protected characteristic violates this policy, may be in violation of State and/or Federal law and will not be tolerated by the Village of Carol Stream. Harassment within the work environment of the Village by a contractor, business invitee guest or customer and harassment within the work environment of the Village of a contractor business, invitee, guest or customer by a Village employee or official shall be prohibited by this policy.
- **§1-8-3 Definitions.** Harassment in violation of this policy includes but is not limited to the following behaviors set forth below. For purposes of this definition, "working environment" or "workplace" is not limited to a physical location a person covered by this policy is assigned to perform his or her duties and does not require an employment relationship.
- A. For purposes of this policy, the term 'Employee' shall mean any full time, part-time or contractual employee.
- B. For purposes of this policy, the term "Official" shall mean any elected or appointed official regardless of wheher the official is compensated.
- C. Verbal Harassment Nicknames, derogatory or suggestive comments, innuendos, slurs, insults, threats, derogatory or discriminatory jokes, propositioning, or otherwise offensive words, comments or gestures on the basis of race, status, pregnancy, sexual orientation, gender, age, or other protected characteristic, whether made in general or directed to an individual, regardless of whether the behavior was intended to harass. This includes but is not limited to persistent unwelcome flirting, pressure for dates, inappropriate sexually related comments, sexual rumors, jokes, code words and stories.
- D. Physical Harassment Assault, impeding or blocking movement, leering, or the physical interference with normal work, privacy or movement. Physical harassment includes but is not limited to uninvited and/or unwanted touching, pinching, patting, hugging, kissing, grabbing, inappropriate behavior in any area of the Village, or making explicit or implied threats or promises in return for submission to physical acts.
- E. Visual Forms of Harassment Derogatory, prejudicial, stereotypical or otherwise offensive posters, signs, photographs, cartoons, e-mails, texting, cyber stalking, notes, bulletins, drawings, pictures, online postings, blogs, or social network site postings.
- F. Sexual Harassment Any unwelcome sexual advances or requests for sexual favors or any conduct of a sexual nature when (1) submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment, (2) submission to or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as the basis for an employment decision, or (3) such

conduct has the purpose or effect of substantially interfering with an individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive working environment.

- **§1-8-4 Complaint Procedure.** The Village will investigate any allegations of discriminatory Village work environment harassment, sexual harassment or retaliation. All allegations, including anonymous reports, will be accepted and investigated regardless of how the matter comes to the attention of the Village. However, because of the difficulties associated with the investigation of workplace harassment, the claimant's willing cooperation is a vital component of an effective investigation. The following procedure has been instituted for making complaints about conduct in violation of this Policy.
- A. Any person covered by this policy observing an act of harassment or who is the object of harassment shall report the suspected harassment by a Village employee, Village official, contractor, business invitee, customer or Village guest to their immediate supervisor, department head or the Human Resources Director The report may be made initially either orally or in writing, but the Village may require a written statement as a part of the investigation.
- B. Any person covered by this policy who is experiencing what he or she believes to be an act of harassment must not assume that the Village is aware of the conduct. If there are no witnesses and a victim of harassment fails to notify the Village as provided herein, the Village will not be presumed to have knowledge of the harassment.
- C. The immediate supervisor Department Head informed of the complaint will notify the Human Resources Department within 24 hours. An investigation of the suspected harassment will be initiated at the direction of the Human Resources Department, generally within five (5) working days of notification. If deemed necessary, additional individuals may assist in the investigation. The investigation will include an interview with the person(s) who made the initial report and the person(s) toward whom the suspected harassment was directed. Any other person who may have information regarding the alleged harassment may also be interviewed.
- D. The individual conducting the investigation is responsible for preparing a written report within ten (10) working days of his/her completion of the investigation, unless extenuating circumstances prevent him/her from doing so. The report shall include a finding that the harassment has been substantiated or the harassment cannot be substantiated.
- E. Every effort shall be made to keep all matters related to the investigation and various reports as confidential as possible.
- §1-8-5 Legal Rights Under the Law. Any person covered by this policy who believes he/she has been subjected to discriminatory harassment has the right to file a complaint with the Illinois Department of Human Rights, 100 West Randolph Street, Chicago, Illinois 60601; (312) 814-6200 and/or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, 500 West Madison, Suite 2000, Chicago, Illinois 60661; 1-800-669-4000. The Illinois Human Act provides that complaints harassment must be filed within 180 days of the alleged incident. A complaint with the EEOC must be filed within 300 days of the alleged incident.
- **§1-8-6 Prohibition on Retaliation.** Any person filing a report of harassment and any person who cooperates in a harassment investigation have the right to be protected from retaliation. The Whistleblower Act, 740 ILCS 174/15(a) and the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/6-101, prohibit retaliation against a person because he/she has reported any act which he/she reasonably and in good faith believes to be unlawful harassment, or because he/she has made a charge, filed

a complaint, testified, assisted, or participated in an investigation, proceeding, or hearing with respect to any alleged harassment. Any form of retaliation, if established, is subject to administrative and/or disciplinary action

Any person covered by this policy who believes he/she has experienced or witnessed retaliation should report such conduct immediately to his/her immediate supervisor, department head, except where such person is the one accused of retaliation. In such case, the complaint should be reported to the Human Resources Director. The complaint procedures in this policy will also apply to complaints of retaliation.

§1-8-7 False Reports of Harassment. Complaints of harassment are taken seriously by the Village. The Village also recognizes that making false accusations of harassment in bad faith can have serious consequences for those who are wrongly accused. Submitting an allegation of harassment, reporting or providing information that is intentionally false or misleading is a severe offense and a violation of this policy.

§1-8-8 Consequences of Violating the Harassment Policy. Any person who violates this policy, the prohibition on Sexual Harassment contained in 5 ILCS 430/5-65, or makes a false report of harassment shall be subject to discipline including but not limited to suspension, demotion or discharge and any applicable fines and penalties established pursuant to ordinance, State law or Federal Law. Each violation shall constitute a separate offense. Any discipline imposed shall be separate and distinct from any fine or penalties imposed by a court of law or a State or Federal Agency.

SECTION 3: The provisions adopted in Section 2 herein shall be incorporated into the Village of Carol Stream Personnel Policy Manual as set forth in the attached Exhibit A and shall supersede all prior personnel and/or employee policies, including without limitation the last version of the policy approved by this Mayor and Board of Trustees.

SECTION 4: Those sections, paragraphs and provisions of the Village Code of Ordinances, which are not expressly amended by this Ordinance, are hereby reenacted, and it is expressly declared to be the intention of this Ordinance not to amend any portion of the Code of Ordinances other than as expressly amended in Section 2 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication as required by law.

EXHIBIT "A"

1E. DISCRIMINATORY WORKPLACE HARASSMENT:

Purpose: The purpose of this Policy is to establish The Village's commitment to provide a work environment free from harassment, to define discriminatory harassment, and to set forth the procedure for investigating and resolving internal complaints of harassment.

Policy: All Village employees and Village officials have a right to work in an environment free from harassment. It is critical that all Village employees and Village officials treat all other Village employees and Village officials with dignity and respect. It is the responsibility of each and every Village official, employee, supervisor and department head to make sure that there is no inappropriate behavior occurring in the workplace. Inappropriate behavior that impacts the Village work environment, or has the potential to impact the Village work environment will not be tolerated.

Harassment of a Village official or employee by any Village official or employee on the basis of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, disability, medical condition, marital status, pregnancy, sexual orientation, gender, age, or other protected characteristic violates this policy, may be in violation of State and/or Federal law and will not be tolerated by the Village of Carol Stream. Harassment within the work environment of the Village by a contractor, business invitee or customer and harassment within the work environment of the Village of a contractor business, invitee or customer by a village employee or official shall be prohibited by this policy.

Definitions:

- A. For purposes of this policy, the term Employee shall mean any full time, part-time or contractual employee.
- B. For purposes of this policy, the term "Official" shall mean any elected or appointed official regardless of whiter the official is compensated.
- C. For purposes of this definition, "working environment" or "workplace" is not limited to a physical location an employee is assigned to perform his or her duties and does not require an employment relationship.
- D. Harassment in violation of this policy includes but is not limited to the following behaviors.
- 1. Verbal Harassment Nicknames, derogatory or suggestive comments, innuendos, slurs, insults, threats, derogatory or discriminatory jokes, propositioning, or otherwise offensive words, comments or gestures on the basis of race, status, pregnancy, sexual orientation, gender, age, or other protected characteristic, whether made in general or directed to an individual, regardless of whether the behavior was intended to harass. This includes but is not limited to

- persistent unwelcome flirting, pressure for dates, inappropriate sexually related comments, sexual rumors, jokes, code words and stories.
- 2. Physical Harassment Assault, impeding or blocking movement, leering, or the physical interference with normal work, privacy or movement. Physical harassment includes but is not limited to uninvited and/or unwanted touching, pinching, patting, hugging, kissing, grabbing, inappropriate behavior in any area of the Village, or making explicit or implied threats or promises in return for submission to physical acts.
- **3. Visual Forms of Harassment** Derogatory, prejudicial, stereotypical or otherwise offensive posters, signs, photographs, cartoons, e-mails, texting, cyber stalking, notes, bulletins, drawings, pictures, online postings, blogs, or social network site postings.
- 4. Sexual Harassment Any unwelcome sexual advances or requests for sexual favors or any conduct of a sexual nature when (1) submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment, (2) submission to or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as the basis for an employment decision, or (3) such conduct has the purpose or effect of substantially interfering with an individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive working environment.

Complaint Procedure: The Village will investigate any allegations of discriminatory Village work environment harassment, sexual harassment or retaliation. All allegations, including anonymous reports, will be accepted and investigated regardless of how the matter comes to the attention of the Village. However, because of the difficulties associated with the investigation of workplace harassment, the claimant's willing cooperation is a vital component of an effective investigation. The following procedure has been instituted for making complaints about conduct in violation of this Policy.

- 1. Any person covered by this policy observing an act of harassment or who is the object of harassment shall report the suspected harassment by a Village employee Village official, contractor, business invitee, customer or Village guest to their immediate supervisor, department head, or the Human Resources Director. The report may be made initially either orally or in writing, but the Village may require a written statement as a part of the investigation.
- 2. Any person covered by this policy who is experiencing what he or she believes to be an act of harassment must not assume that the Village is aware of the conduct. If there are no witnesses and a victim of harassment fails to notify the Village as provided herein, the Village will not be presumed to have knowledge of the harassment.
- 3. The immediate supervisor or Department Head informed of the complaint will notify the Human Resources Department within 24 hours. An investigation of the suspected harassment will be initiated at the direction of the Human Resources Department, generally within five (5) working days of notification. If deemed necessary, additional individuals may assist in the investigation. The investigation will include an interview with the person(s) who made the initial report and the person(s) toward whom the suspected harassment was directed.

- Any other person who may have information regarding the alleged harassment may also be interviewed.
- 4. The individual conducting the investigation is responsible for preparing a written report within ten (10) working days of his/her completion of the investigation, unless extenuating circumstances prevent him/her from doing so. The report shall include a finding that the harassment has been substantiated or the harassment cannot be substantiated.
- 5. Every effort shall be made to keep all matters related to the investigation and various reports as confidential as possible.

Legal Rights Under the Law: Any person covered by this policy who believes he/she has been subjected to discriminatory harassment has the right to file a complaint with the Illinois Department of Human Rights, 100 West Randolph Street, Chicago, Illinois 60601; (312) 814-6200 and/or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, 500 West Madison, Suite 2000, Chicago, Illinois 60661; 1-800-669-4000. The Illinois Human Act provides that complaints harassment must be filed within 180 days of the alleged incident. A complaint with the EEOC must be filed within 300 days of the alleged incident.

Prohibition on Retaliation: Any person filing a report of harassment and any person who cooperates in a harassment investigation have the right to be protected from retaliation. The Whistleblower Act, 740 ILCS 174/15(a) and the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/6-101, prohibit retaliation against a person because he/she has reported any act which he/she reasonably and in good faith believes to be unlawful harassment, or because he/she has made a charge, filed a complaint, testified, assisted, or participated in an investigation, proceeding, or hearing with respect to any alleged harassment. Any form of retaliation, if established, is subject to administrative and/or disciplinary action

Any person covered by this policy who believes he/she has experienced or witnessed retaliation should report such conduct immediately to his/her immediate supervisor, department head or to the Human Resources Director. The complaint procedures in this policy will also apply to complaints of retaliation.

False Reports of Harassment: Complaints of harassment are taken seriously by the Village. The Village also recognizes that making false accusations of harassment in bad faith can have serious consequences for those who are wrongly accused. Submitting an allegation of harassment, reporting or providing information that is intentionally false or misleading is a severe offense and a violation of this policy.

Consequences of Violating the Harassment Policy: Any person who violates this policy, the prohibition on Sexual Harassment contained in 5 ILCS 430/5-65, or makes a false report of harassment shall be subject to discipline including but not limited to suspension, demotion or discharge and any applicable fines and penalties established pursuant to ordinance, State law or Federal Law. Each violation shall constitute a separate offense. Any discipline imposed shall be separate and distinct from any fine or penalties imposed by a court of law or a State or Federal Agency.

On July 15, 2013, the Village entered into a Redevelopment Agreement (RDA) with Caputo's that in part provided for the sharing of sales tax receipts. In October, Caputo's advised that they were developing an online and phone order grocery and liquor delivery service through LBR a subsidiary of Caputo's. Caputo's requested an amendment to the RDA to include sales made through LBR.

Attached you will find an amendment to the 2013 RDA incorporating LBR sales. As you will note, Caputo's has executed the agreement. Staff recommends approval of the attached Resolution authorizing execution of the accompanying First Amendment to Redevelopment Agreement.

Liquor licensing permitting sales by LBR is expected to be presented for your consideration shortly.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING A FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN CAPUTOS NEW FARM PRODUCE CAROL STREAM, INC., 520 EAST NORTH AVENUE, LLC AND THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM

WHEREAS, on or about the 15th day of July, 2013, the Village entered into a Redevelopment Agreement with Caputos New Farm Produce Carol Stream, Inc. ("Caputos") and 520 East North Avenue, LLC ("520") (the "Redevelopment Agreement") pursuant to its home rule authority and the provisions of the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act, 65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-1 et seq. (the "TIF Act"); and

WHEREAS, under the terms and conditions of the Redevelopment Agreement, Caputos and 520 agreed to redevelop a parcel of property located at the southwest corner of North Avenue and Schmale Road within the Village with an approximately 312,000 square foot building and to operate thereon an approximately 70,000 square foot Angelo Caputo's Fresh Farms Market retail food and grocery store and an approximately 242,000 square foot regional warehouse, corporate offices and distribution facility for Caputo's regional retail and wholesale food and grocery business; and

WHEREAS, under the terms and conditions of the Redevelopment Agreement, the Village agreed to provide Caputos and 520 with an Incentive in the amount of Three million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (the "Incentive Amount") for the sole purpose of reimbursing Caputos and 520 for Eligible Redevelopment Costs, as that term is defined under the provisions of the TIF Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Redevelopment Agreement, the Incentive Amount is to be paid from Net Incremental Property Taxes, as provided in the TIF Act, and in addition from Sales Tax Revenue (as defined within the Redevelopment Agreement) pursuant to the Village's home rule authority; and

WHEREAS, the Developer desires to operate on the Redevelopment Parcel, an online and phone order grocery and liquor delivery service through LBR, a subsidiary of Caputos; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has requested that the term Sales Tax Revenue, as defined within the Redevelopment Agreement be amended to include Retailers' Occupation Taxes and Service Occupation Taxes generated from sales by LBR; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees find that it is in the best interests of the Village to amend the Redevelopment Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, hereby approve the First Amendment to Redevelopment Agreement between Caputo's New Farm Produce Carol Stream, Inc., an Illinois corporation, 520 East North Avenue, LLC, an Illinois Limited Liability Corporation, ("520"), LBR Importing and Distributing, Inc., an Illinois Corporation ("LBR") and the Village of Carol Stream, as attached hereto.

SECTION 2. The Mayor and Village Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the First Amendment to Redevelopment Agreement on behalf of the Village of Carol Stream.

SECTION 3. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption and approval in the manner provided by law.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

This First Amendment is made and entered into this _____ day of November, 2017, by and between the Village of Carol Stream, Illinois, an Illinois home rule municipal corporation (the "Village") and Caputo's New Farm Produce Carol Stream, Inc. ("Caputos"), and Illinois corporation, 520 East North Avenue, LLC, an Illinois Limited Liability Corporation, ("520") and LBR Importing and Distributing, Inc., and Illinois Corporation ("LBR"). (Caputos, 520 and LBR are collectively referred to as the "Developer"). The Village and the Developer and sometimes referred to herein individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".)

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on or about the 15th day of July, 2013, the Village entered into a Redevelopment Agreement with Caputos and 520 (the "Redevelopment Agreement") pursuant to its home rule authority and the provisions of the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act, 65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-1 et seq. (the "TIF Act"); and

WHEREAS, under the terms and conditions of the Redevelopment Agreement, Caputos and 520 agreed to redevelop a parcel of property located at the southwest corner of North Avenue and Schmale Road within the Village with an approximately 312,000 square foot building and to operate thereon an approximately 70,000 square foot Angelo Caputo's Fresh Farms Market retail food and grocery store and an approximately 242,000 square foot regional warehouse, corporate offices and distribution facility for Caputo's regional retail and wholesale food and grocery business; and

WHEREAS, under the terms and conditions of the Redevelopment Agreement, the Village agreed to provide Caputos and 520 with an Incentive in the amount of Three million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (the "Incentive Amount") for the sole purpose of reimbursing Caputos and 520 for Eligible Redevelopment Costs, as that term is defined under the provisions of the TIF Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Redevelopment Agreement, the Incentive Amount is to be paid from Net Incremental Property Taxes, as provided in the TIF Act, and in addition from Sales Tax Revenue (as defined within the Redevelopment Agreement) pursuant to the Village's home rule authority; and

WHEREAS, the Developer desires to operate on the Redevelopment Parcel, an online and phone order grocery and liquor delivery service through LBR, a subsidiary of Caputos; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has requested that the term Sales Tax Revenue, as defined within the Redevelopment Agreement be amended to include Retailers' Occupation Taxes and Service Occupation Taxes generated from sales by LBR; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have agreed to amend the Redevelopment Agreement in accordance with the terms and conditions of this First Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and conditions of this First Amendment, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties agree that the Redevelopment Agreement is hereby amended as follows:.

1. The recitals set forth above are hereby restated and incorporated by reference herein.

- As of the date of this First Amendment above written, LBR shall become a Party to the Redevelopment Agreement. LBR agrees to be fully bound by the provisions of the Redevelopment Agreement.
- 3. The term "Developer" as set forth in Section II., E. of the Redevelopment Agreement is amended to read as follows:
 - "Developer" means Caputo's New Farm Produce Carol Stream, Inc., an Illinois corporation, 520 East North Avenue, LLC, an Illinois Limited Liability Corporation, and LBR Importing and Distributing, Inc., operating either jointly or individually. For purposes of this Agreement, Captuo's New Farm Produce, Inc., 520 East North Avenue, LLC, and LBR Importing and Distributing, Inc., are both jointly and severally liable for all requirements of the Developer under the terms of this Agreement.
- 4. The term "Sales Tax Revenue" as set forth in Section II, S. of the Redevelopment Agreement is amended to read as follows:
 - "Sales Tax Revenue" means fifty per cent (50%) of the net portion of taxes imposed by the State of Illinois for distribution to the Village pursuant to the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act, 35 ILCS 120/1 et seq. and the Service Occupation Tax Act, 35 ILCS 115/1 et seq. and which are collected by the State from the Developer from sales by Caputo's New Farm Produce Carol Stream, Inc. and LBR Importing and Distributing, Inc., on or within the Redevelopment Parcel and distributed to the Village, less the Village's ten percent (10%) contribution to the TIF Fund as provided and required by Section 11-74.4-8 of the Act which shall be contributed from such taxes. The term Sales Tax Revenue shall not include any other taxes imposed by the Village or received by the Village from the State of Illinois ("State") or otherwise, however, in the event that the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act or the Service Occupation Tax Act are repealed, the term Sales Tax Revenue shall include any tax that the Illinois Legislature enacts in replacement of, in whole or in part, the Retailers' Occupation Tax Act or the Service Occupation Tax Act. If a governmental or legislative body enacts any law or statute which results in any material changes or amendments to the foregoing sales tax provisions, which changes or amendments prohibit the Village from complying with this Agreement or which materially and adversely affect the Village's ability to comply herewith, then the Village and Developer will re-evaluate the incentive to be provided and may elect to amend the incentives and inducements set forth herein.
- 5. Except as provided in Paragraphs 3 and 4 herein, all terms used herein shall have the same meaning as defined within the Redevelopment Agreement.
- 6. Section VI. E. of the Redevelopment Agreement is amended by adding the following sentence:
 - The Developer, its successor and/or assigns shall, from the date of the First Amendment and for the remainder of the term of the Redevelopment Agreement, maintain and operate an online and phone order grocery and liquor delivery business upon the Redevelopment Parcel.
- 7. Section VII. of the Redevelopment Agreement is amended by adding a new Subsection I. which reads as follows:

- I. The Developer further warrants and represents that from the date of the First Amendment and for the remainder of the term of the Redevelopment Agreement:
 - The corporate headquarters and offices of LBR shall be the Redevelopment Parcel and the Redevelopment Parcel shall be the place from which all phone order and online grocery and liquor sales shall be fulfilled, managed and directed.
 - All sales personnel exercising the discretion and authority to solicit phone and online grocery and liquor sales and to bind LBR to such sales shall be located upon the Redevelopment Parcel.
 - 3. The Redevelopment Parcel shall be the location where all phone or online purchase orders for groceries and liquor are accepted on behalf of LBR.
 - 4. The Redevelopment Parcel shall be the location where payment for all phone and online sales of groceries and liquor are tendered and received and from which any invoices are issued with respect to such sales.
 - All inventory of groceries and liquor sold through phone or online sales by LBR shall be located upon the Redevelopment Parcel.
- 8. Section X of the Redevelopment Agreement is hereby amended by adding a new subsection C, which reads as follows:
 - C. The Developer shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Village, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, actions, civil liabilities, damages, or losses of revenue and all costs and expenses, including but not limited to attorneys fees and expenses, (collectively "Losses") arising out of (1) any violation of the Developer's representations and warranties contained in Section VII. Subsection I. or, (2) any court or governmental agency, having jurisdiction over the collection or distribution of Retailers' Occupation Taxes under 35 ILCS 120/1 et seq. or Service Occupation Taxes under 35 ILCS 115/1 et seq., determination that the distribution of such taxes from phone or online sales of groceries and/or liquor should not have been made to the Village or that any payments of Sales Tax Revenue or any portion of Sales Tax Revenue made or to be made to the Developer, are contrary to law.

In the event of an adverse lower court or agency ruling, any payments found to be improper shall be suspended during the pendency of any appeal thereof, but such payments shall be reinstated retroactively if such adverse ruling is reversed by the reviewing court or agency. The Village shall not seek to set aside, or otherwise challenge, its obligations under this Agreement during the pendency of any appeal. In the event of the entry of an order (and upon the exhaustion of any right to appeal) which declares that any distribution of Retailers' Occupation Taxes or Service Occupation Taxes to the Village or any payment of Sales Tax Revenue, or portion thereof, to the Developer are contrary to law, the obligations under this Agreement with respect to such payments shall terminate. Should such order require the Village to reimburse the Illinois Department of Revenue or any applicable taxing districts any amounts previously paid to Developer, the Developer shall repay such amounts to the Village.

- 9. In accordance with Illinois Law, 50 ICLS 105/3.1, an authorized director of LBR shall submit a sworn affidavit to the Village disclosing the identity of every owner and beneficiary who has or who obtains any interest, real or personal, in the Project and any shareholder entitled to receive more than 71/2% of the total distributable income of LBR. The sworn affidavit shall be substantially similar to the one described in **Exhibit I** of the Redevelopment Agreement. Said affidavit shall be updated as necessary.
- 10. Except as provided in this First Amendment, all provisions of the Redevelopment Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, it being the intent of the Parties to amend the Redevelopment Agreement only to the extent set forth in this First Amendment. In the event of any conflict between the terms, conditions and provisions of the Redevelopment Agreement and this First Amendment, the terms, conditions and provisions of this First Amendment shall control.
- 11. The effective date of this First Amendment shall be the day upon which this First Amendment is approved by the Village, with said date being inserted on page 1 hereof.

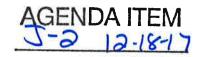

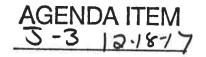

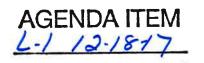
