Chairman Parisi read a statement regarding conducting the meeting electronically per the Governor's Disaster Proclamation reissued November 13, 2020, and the Governor's Executive Orders. Public comments will be addressed at the appropriate time. Mr. Farace added no emails or public comments have been submitted prior to the meeting.

Chairman Parisi asked for questions or comments pertaining to the declaration. There were none.

20-0027- My Property Holdings, LLC (Crash Champions) / 125 Stark Drive - Special Use Permit for an Auto Repair Storage Garage, Zoning Map Amendment from B-2 to B-3, Setback Variation, Fence Code Variation and Gary Avenue Corridor Review

Chairman Parisi swore in Matt Ebert, Mark Kehoskie, Jorge Herrera, Gabe Garcia and Quinten Hoogenboom representatives of Crash Champions, 125 Stark Dr., Carol Stream, IL.

Mr. Kehoskie stated that he is requesting approval of a map amendment from B-2 to B-3, a special use permit for an auto repair storage garage and two variance requests, one to reduce the required corner side yard from 100 feet to 64 feet, and one to allow a fence to be located in the front yard. Additionally, the petitioner hopes to receive approval under the Gary Avenue corridor review. The petitioner believes it meets the findings of fact as identified by the Village Code for each request.

Chairman Parisi asked for questions or comments from the public. There were none.

Chairman Parisi asked Mr. Farace for the Staff Report.

Mr. Farace stated that the petitioner is seeking approval of a rezoning request from B-2 (general retail district designation) to B-3 (service district). B-3 is designed to provide more diversified business types which by the nature of their use place a greater impact on the land and the surrounding uses which are both commercial and industrial, with unincorporated properties to the North and West. Staff is supportive of the upgrades being proposed to both the building and the site itself and is comfortable to rezone the property to B-3.

Mr. Farace stated staff is also supportive of the special use for an auto repair storage garage request to have the vehicles stored on the property in conjunction with automotive repair or body work. The building is just under 15,000 square feet and will be renovated with some additional repair equipment and installation of spray booths inside as well as a detail area and office space. There will also be a 6,500 square foot addition on the south side to include the body shop extension, office and restroom space, and lobby or entrance. Façade and landscape upgrades were also proposed. The property has more than enough parking to meet the needs or demands of our code requirements. Based on the abundance of parking and upgrades being proposed, staff can support the special use request.

Mr. Farace mentioned the building setback along Stark Drive which is the same within the B-3 District as it would be along Gary Avenue because it is technically a front yard or corner side yard. Due to the building addition proposed, the 100 feet setback would be reduced to 64 feet. Usually larger buildings like shopping centers are setback farther from the roadway, but this building will still be set back a decent distance from Stark Drive. There will be landscaping and the drive aisle and parking itself in between the right of way along Stark Drive and the building. Staff feels comfortable with supporting the variation request in this instance.

Mr. Farace stated the fence variation is to allow a fence to be located in the front of the building where the storage area will be located for vehicles needing service. The fence is decorative, will have stone panels in between PVC posts and those posts will have decorate caps. It will be stylish and be 200 feet away from the roadway itself. This has been allowed at other locations, however, because there is no back area on this property, there is not any other location for vehicles to be stored. Given the distance from the roadway and the fact it will be a nicely designed fence, staff feels comfortable supporting the variation to allow a fence to be located in front of the building.

Mr. Farace stated the Gary Avenue corridor review encapsulates everything, building and site design, landscaping, fencing and signage. Site design has no substantial changes other than modifying the parking area on the south side due to the addition. An elongated landscape island centrally located on the property as well as landscaping along the foundation of the building and the perimeter of the property all meet our requirements along Gary Avenue. In regards to architectural design, the masonry on the existing building will be stained a grayish color with additional charcoal brick with stainless metal panels on the addition will be installed. The fence will be nicely designed and there will be a monument style sign along both Gary Avenue and Stark Drive that also meets our requirements of being more decorative. Although staff recommends landscape around the base of the sign located on Gary Avenue, we are supportive of all requests for the project and are recommending approval.

Chairman Parisi asked for questions from the Commission.

Commissioner Tucek commented about the Aldi sign and then asked if it was disrupted by the trail project moving forward and if the new sign is going where the old sign was located?

Mr. Farace stated he believed they are in similar locations which would be fine and the skeleton of the existing sign is still in place.

Chairman Parisi recommended the fencing be changed from a faux-stone with PVC (which is more of a residential type), to a corrugated metal fence for a more homogenous look for architectural purposes.

Mr. Garcia stated metal looks good for the first few years and requires a lot of maintenance and upkeep. He mentioned there will be quite a bit of plantings and landscaping in front of the fence.

Mr. Ebert asked if they would have to come back to the Plan Commission in regards to the fence.

Chairman Parisi recommended they do not have to come back to Plan Commission but staff should decide on the final fence product.

Chairman Parisi asked Mr. Kehoskie or Mr. Ebert if he was comfortable with the trash enclosure location in the front yard and recommended it be relocated to the north.

Mr. Kehoskie noted the trash enclosure Chairman Parisi is referring to is not Crash Champions.

Mr. Farace stated the dumpster is for the restaurant property which was built on an out lot.

Chairman Parisi asked for any other questions or comments from the Commission and Commissioner Tucek agreed with Chairman Parisi's assessment of the fence. Commissioners Christopher, Meneghini, Morris. Petella and Battisto had no questions or comments.

Chairman Parisi asked for a motion to recommend approval for Case No. 20-0027. Commissioner Petella moved and Commissioner Tucek seconded the motion with a condition about the fence matching the building material.

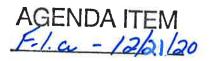

PC/ZBA Case 20-0027, My Property Holdings, LLC/Crash Champions – 125 Stark Drive, Zoning Map Amendment, Special Use for an Auto Repair Storage Garage, Zoning Code Variation, Fence Code Variation, and Gary Avenue Corridor Review

Matt Ebert, Managing Member with My Property Holdings, LLC., requests approval to rezone the property at 125 Stark Drive from B-2 General Retail District to B-3 Service District, a Special Use Permit for an Auto Repair Storage Garage, a Zoning Code Variation to reduce the corner side yard building setback from 100 feet to 64 feet along Stark Drive, a Fence Code Variation to allow a fence to be located in the front yard, and Gary Avenue Corridor Review, for a proposed Crash Champions collision center. Crash Champions proposes to occupy the building formerly occupied by Aldi, and construct a 6,500 square foot addition on the south side of the building.

Façade upgrades are proposed to provide for a more contemporary-looking building, along with the installation of landscaping along the foundation of the building, within parking lot islands, and the perimeter of the property. Decorative fencing is proposed to screen vehicle storage to the east of the existing building, and monument signage is proposed along Gary Avenue and Stark Drive. A variation is requested to reduce the building setback along Stark Drive due to the construction of the building addition, but there will still be adequate space from the roadway. In addition, a fence variation is requested for the inclusion of fencing in front of the building to screen the proposed vehicle storage area. However, the proposed fencing will be over 200 feet away from Gary Avenue, and per the recommendation of the PC/ZBA, be constructed of a material to match the materials of the building to visually blend. Staff does not believe the requested rezoning or proposed collision center project will have a negative impact on surrounding commercial and industrial properties or the community as a whole, and that the site will be a suitable location along the Gary Avenue Corridor for a service use with the enhanced modifications to the building and the site.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the PC/ZBA packet on December 11, 2020. At its meeting on December 14, 2020, by a vote of 6-0 with one member abstaining, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Zoning Map Amendment, Special Use Permit, and Zoning Code Variation subject to the conditions in the December 14, 2020 staff report.

If the Village Board concurs with the PC/ZBA recommendation, they should approve the Zoning Map Amendment to Rezone from B-2 to B-3, Special Use Permit for an Auto Repair Service Garage, and Variation for a building setback reduction, and adopt the necessary Ordinances. No Village Board action is necessary regarding the Fence Code Variation or Gary Avenue Corridor Review.

PC/ZBA Case 20-0028, Grunt Style, LLC - 400 E. Fullerton Avenue, Special Use

Permit for Retail Sales in the Industrial District

Rick Posey, Chief Operations Officer with Grunt Style, requests approval of a Special Use permit for retail sales in the Industrial District at their facility at 400 E. Fullerton Avenue. Grunt Style is an online distributor of patriotic apparel, and proposes to have a factory outlet store at their Fullerton Avenue location where customers could come to the facility to purchase items. In order to have the retail space within the industrial building, a special use permit is requested.

The proposed factory outlet store will be 1,250 square feet, and will be located near the front of the 50,652 square foot building. The subject property contains 196 parking spaces including a row of 15 parking spaces along the front/north side of the building. In addition, there are approximately 170 employees at the facility over three shifts. Grunt Style proposes to provide "Customer Parking" signage for at least eight of the northern parking spaces, and directional signage for customers as they enter the site from Fullerton Avenue. The remainder of parking on the east and south sides of the property will more than accommodate the needs of the employees. The Special Use request is supported given the limited impact on the existing industrial use and adequate amount of parking for customers for the proposed use.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the PC/ZBA packet on December 11, 2020. At its meeting on December 14, 2020, by a vote of 7-0, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Special Use Permit subject to the conditions in the December 14, 2020 staff report.

If the Village Board concurs with the PC/ZBA recommendation, they should approve the Special Use Permit for Retail Sales in the Industrial District subject to the conditions contained within the Ordinance, and adopt the necessary Ordinance.

**PURCHASE REQUEST – PATROL VEHICLES** 

#### **Background**

Together, the Public Works and Police Departments maintain the fleet of marked and unmarked police vehicles. As part of the fleet planning and 2021 budget process, several vehicles were identified to have reached the end of their useful life and scheduled for replacement this year. The replacement of these vehicles was budgeted in the vehicle replacement fund. The determination to replace these vehicles is based on a number factors including mileage, age of the vehicle, mechanical condition, reliability, safety, operating cost, and the vehicle's ability to meet the needs of the community and the Department.

Patrol squad #634 is a 2013 Dodge Charger with over 100,000 miles. This car will have been in service for over seven years when it is replaced. Contributions have been made to the vehicle replacement fund to replace this car.

Patrol squad #635 is a 2013 Dodge Charger with over 95,000 miles. This car will have been in service for over seven years when it is replaced. Contributions have been made to the vehicle replacement fund to replace this car.

Patrol squad #636 is a 2013 Dodge Charger with over 105,000 miles. This car will have been in service for over seven years when it is replaced. Contributions have been made to the vehicle replacement fund to replace this car.

Patrol squad #637 is a 2013 Ford Explorer with over 135,000 miles. This car will have been in service for over seven years when it is replaced. Contributions have been made to the vehicle replacement fund to replace this car.

Patrol squad #639 is a 2013 Ford Explorer with over 120,000 miles. This car will have been in service for over seven years when it is replaced. Contributions have been made to the vehicle replacement fund to replace this car.

Patrol squad #647 is 2014 Dodge Charger with over 90,000 miles. This car will have been in service for over six years when it is replaced. Contributions have been made to the vehicle replacement fund to replace this car.

Patrol squad #627 is a 2012 Dodge Ram truck used by Community Service Technicians and has over 110,000 miles. This car will have been in service for over eight years when it is replaced. Contributions have been made to the vehicle replacement fund to replace this car.

CST Vehicle Addition – This proposal is to add a CST vehicle. Approximately three years ago, the third CST vehicle was not replaced because of a vacancy at the CST position. Because the position was vacant, the used by the position was not replaced. The position was ultimately filled; however, a vehicle was never put back into the fleet. Since that time, a CST has been taking a patrol squad for use. This is a hardship for several reasons. First, appropriate CST equipment does not fit well into a patrol car; second, the car is removed from use by patrol officers. Finally, it is not preferred to transport animals and bicycles in a patrol car – animals because of the smell and mess, and bicycles because of the fit. This car will be funded by deferring the replacement of car 672, a 2007 Ford Explorer assigned to the Special Operations Unit. Given its age, this car should be replaced; however, it is in relatively good condition with approximately 85,000 miles, and is used minimally.

In addition to the age, high mileage, general mechanical condition, and heavy duty use of these vehicles (except the addition of the CST truck), recent vehicle inspections have revealed that they have corrosion from salt exposure, numerous dings and dents, and rising maintenance costs from year to year.

These vehicles have reached the end of their useful life and replacement is recommended. Staff works diligently to determine which vehicles and emergency equipment will meet their needs in a fiscally responsible way. It has been determined that some diversity in the fleet is preferred, provides for flexibility in use, and protects against large scale product recalls. Additionally, reusing the vehicle equipment between the same models is advantageous. Therefore, it is recommended that squads 637 & 639 should be replaced with two (2) 2021 Ford Explorers; squads 634 & 635 should be replaced with (2) 2021 Dodge Chargers; squads 636 & 647 should be replaced with (2) Dodge Durangos; and squad 627 and the additional CST vehicle should be (2) 2021 Dodge Ram trucks.

#### Subject

The State of Illinois, the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative, and the South Suburban Mayor's Conference Contract are all joint purchasing programs which exemplify the benefits of intergovernmental cooperation on a statewide or regional basis. As depicted above, the best pricing for all vehicles is realized through the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative and the dealers who were awarded the individual contracts.

#### **Budget Impact**

With the exception of the additional new CST truck described above, all of the seven replacement vehicles have been budgeted for in the vehicle replacement fund. The additional new CST truck will be funded by deferring the purchase of a different vehicle which was funded for replacement. The total cost of these eight vehicles is \$249,146.

#### **Recommendation**

Staff has researched specifications that will allow the Village to obtain the equipment which best meets the needs of the Police Department at the most competitive price. I am recommending approval to purchase the following: (2) 2021 Dodge Charger Police vehicles from Roesch Chrysler of Bensenville, IL in the amount of \$55,330; (2) 2021 Dodge Durango Police vehicles from Roesch Chrysler of Bensenville, IL in the amount of \$67,962; (2) 2021 Dodge Ram Police pickup trucks from Roesch Chrysler of Bensenville, IL in the amount of \$55,608; and, (2) 2021 Ford Police Utility vehicles from Currie Motors of Frankfort, IL in the amount of \$70,246.

## AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR AN AUTO REPAIR STORAGE GARAGE, AND ZONING CODE VARIATION (MY PROPERTY HOLDINGS, LLC./CRASH CHAMPIONS, 125 STARK DRIVE)

**WHEREAS**, Matt Ebert, Managing Member with My Property Holdings, LLC, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, has petitioned the Village of Carol Stream for a Special Use Permit for an Auto Repair Storage Garage, as provided in Section 16-9-4 (C)(4) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, and a Variation to reduce the corner side yard building setback from 100 feet to 64 feet in accordance with Section 16-9-4 (G)(2)(e) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, on the property legally described in Section 3 herein and commonly known as 125 Stark Drive, Carol Stream, Illinois; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 16-15-8 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on the above petition on December 14, 2020 following proper legal notice of said public hearing, after which the Commission recommended to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village that the Special Use Permit and Variation be approved; and

**WHEREAS**, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its Findings and Recommendations regarding the Special Use Permit and Variation with the Mayor and Board of Trustees, and the Mayor and Board of Trustees have duly considered said Findings and Recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

#### **SECTION 1:**

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, after examining the Petition for the Special Use Permit, and the Findings and Recommendations of the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined and find that the requested Special Use Permit:

- 1. Is deemed necessary for the public convenience at the location. The proposed collision center will provide an additional service use for residents, businesses, and visitors at this location.
- 2. Will not be unreasonably detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare. It is not believed that the proposed collision center should be detrimental to or endanger public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare.
- 3. Will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood. The proposed collision center use should not have a negative impact on surrounding uses, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood.

- 4. Will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding property for uses permitted in the district. The majority of the surrounding properties are already developed. The establishment of the collision center should not impede future improvements of surrounding properties.
- 5. Will provide adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other important and necessary community facilities. *Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other public improvements are already in place.*
- 6. Will conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as the Village Board may in each instance modify such regulations. The project is expected to conform to all applicable codes and requirements.

#### SECTION 2:

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village, after examining the Variation request, and the Findings and Recommendations of the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined and find that, with respect to the requested Variation:

- 1. That the property in question, other than a single-family residential lot, cannot yield a reasonable return if permitted to be used only under the conditions allowed by the regulations governing the district in which it is located. The building expansion will provide additional service and office space for the proposed use, while still maintaining an appropriate distance from the adjacent roadway within the B-3 District.
- 2. The plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances. Though there are no unique circumstances for the subject property, similar variation requests have been granted to allow deviations to the larger building setback requirement within the B-3 District for smaller buildings.
- 3. The variations, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality. If the variation is granted, it is not believed the essential character of the locality will be altered with the reduced building setback given the proposed landscaping and spacing between the one-story addition and the Stark Drive right-of-way.
- 4. That the plight of the owner is due to the failure of a previous owner of the property in question to follow then-applicable ordinances or regulations, and where the benefit to health, safety or appearance to be derived from correcting the nonconformity would not justify the cost or difficulty of the correction. The evidence must show that the current owner had no role in the creation of the nonconformity. The plight of the owner is not due to the action of a previous property owner, and this criterion is not applicable.

- 5. That the particular physical surroundings, shape, or topographical conditions of the specific property involved bring a particular hardship upon the owner as distinguished from a mere inconvenience. Particular physical surroundings or topographical conditions do not necessarily bring about a hardship, but the addition has been designed to blend with the rest of the existing building, with landscaping to screen and beautify the addition from its street view.
- 6. The conditions upon which the petition for the variations are based would not be applicable generally to other property within the same district. Other properties zoned B-3 have been granted building setback variations, normally geared toward smaller commercial or service buildings which are still appropriately spaced and screened from adjacent roadways.
- 7. The granting of the variations will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to the other property or improvements in the neighborhood in which the property is located. *If granted, the variations will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to surrounding property owners.*

#### **SECTION 3:**

The Special Use Permit and Variation, as set forth in the above recitals, are hereby approved and granted to My Property Holdings, LLC./Crash Champions subject to the conditions set forth in Section 4, upon the real estate commonly known as 125 Stark Drive, Carol Stream, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

LOT 1 IN ALDI 2 SUBDIVISION, BEING A SUBDIVISION IN PART OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 20, TOWNSHIP 40 NORTH, RANGE 10, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF RECORDED APRIL 26, 2004 AS DOCUMENT R2004-108204 IN DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

hereinafter referred to as the Subject Property.

#### **SECTION 4:**

The approval of the Special Use Permit and Variation granted in Sections 1 and 2 herein are subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That the landscape materials must be installed as shown on the attached landscape plan (except as may be amended to address recommended conditions herein), and that all materials shall be maintained in a healthy condition, with dead or dying materials being replaced in accordance with the approved plan on an annual basis;
- 2. That the landscape plan shall be revised and approved by the Community Development Director to illustrate the following:
  - a. Evergreen shrubs and groundcover/flowers shall be installed around the base of the monument sign along Gary Avenue;

- 3. That all rooftop mounted mechanical equipment shall be fully screened by the metal panel screening, or with supplemental screening if said screening in not tall enough to screen the equipment;
- 4. That the owner must install additional landscape materials in the future, subject to the approval of the Community Development Director, to screen yet-unknown ground-mounted mechanical and utility equipment;
- 5. That parking spaces shall be striped in accordance with the Village's looped striping detail;
- 6. That all trash dumpsters and recycling containers placed outdoors must be kept within a code compliant trash enclosure, and that the enclosure gates must be closed and latched at all times, except when trash containers are being accessed by employees or emptied by the trash collection service;
- 7. That the applicant must obtain the required sign permit prior to the installation of any new signage;
- 8. That the applicant must obtain a building permit for parking lot sealcoating, resurfacing, and restriping, prior to said work;
- 9. That a Knox padlock shall be provided on any security gates, and the Carol Stream Fire Protection District and Village Police Department shall be provided keys to said padlock for access onto the property;
- 10. That any and all vehicle maintenance work shall occur inside the building and not outside of the building;
