

Trustee Berger acknowledged that Carol Stream has a lot to celebrate, especially our excellent Police Department which receives frequent accolades. He also commended the Mapleberry Pancake House owner for hosting a moving tribute to Chicago Police Officer Ella French who was killed in action just before her 30th birthday.

Trustee Garvey thanked Mr. Salerno and his family for their legacy of supporting the D.A.R.E. program, and commended the Carol Stream Police Department and Public Works for their high marks from residents on the community survey.

Trustee Zalak thanked Mr. Salerno and his family for their generous donation to the D.A.R.E. program, the community for their donations to Operation Support Our Troops, and A.A.I.M. for their tireless work to get intoxicated drivers off our roads. He reported that in addition to National Preparedness Month, it is also Suicide Prevention Month and reminded people to address the issues and seek help before it is too late. Finally, with 9/11 this weekend, he asked citizens to attend a remembrance ceremony or take a moment to remember and keep our military and first responders in our thoughts and prayers.

Trustee Gieser thanked A.A.I.M., Chief Holmer and the Carol Stream Police Department for their tireless work to keep intoxicated drivers off the road; thanked the Salerno family for their continued support of the D.A.R.E. program; applauded the work of Operation Support Our Troops and Carol Stream's contribution to the cause; reminded residents of the 9/11 ceremonies hosted by the Fire District and VFW on Saturday; and encouraged everyone to get vaccinated if they haven't already.

Trustee Frusolone thanked the Salerno family for their support of the D.A.R.E. program, applauded our Police Department as recognized experts in road safety; announced the Car Seat Safety Check on 9/25 and the First Responder Vehicle Show on 9/12 and 9/11 remembrance ceremonies at both the Fire District and Veteran's Memorial Park.

Trustee McCarthy commended our Police Department for keeping our roads safe by keeping intoxicated drivers off the roads; expressed gratitude that we can support Operation Support Our Troops; thanked Sylvia Masters of Mapleberry Pancake House for hosting the moving prayer vigil for Officer Ella French; and wished his wife Linda a happy 29th anniversary.



Attorney Rhodes congratulated Chief Holmer and all officers who received traffic safety awards tonight, and congratulated Trustee McCarthy on his wedding anniversary.

Village Manager Mellor congratulated the entire Police Department on a job well done keeping our roads safe, with special mention to Commander Cluever and Officer Stafiej who are leaders in the DUI field. He applauded Carol Stream's Police Department for being the experts who train other municipal police departments, including establishing a BASSET program in Hanover Park. He reported the upcoming 9/11 First Responder & Public Works Car Show and fall road maintenance projects which are all under budget.

Mayor Saverino thanked the Salerno family for their legacy of support for the D.A.R.E. program; applauded the Operation Support Our Troops initiative; thanked Chief Holmer for being a great leader and negotiating a four-year contract with the police union; and implored citizens to consider getting vaccinated, as 98% of Covid-hospitalizations are UNvaccinated people who are taking up hospital beds needed by others.

When we moved into the new warehouse we saw there was no drainage inside so when the trucks pull in during winter time the sludge would fall off the trucks, fall on the floor and there are no drains. This means we would have to park the vehicles outside.

Chairman Parisi asked if there were any comments or questions from the audience and there were none.

Chairman Parisi asked Mr. Farace to provide a Staff Report.

Mr. Farace stated the applicant is seeking Special Use approval for outdoor vehicle storage in the rear, or southeast corner, of the property at 490 Tower Boulevard. They are a wholesale distributer and occupy the entire building. The vans are supposed to be parked underneath a carport structure which covers about 11 spaces. Staff calculated the parking requirements for the building and there is more than adequate parking to meet the needs so staff is recommending approval of their request.

Mr. Farace stated this is the second round of Text Amendments for miscellaneous modifications to our UDO that address the following:

- Article 2 (Definitions)
- Article 3 (District Specific Standards)

- Article 5 (Development Standards)
- Article 6 (Sign Standards) of Chapter 16 (Unified Development Ordinance) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances

Mr. Farace also stated the information online for the Residential District, R-3, shows everything is labeled R-3 District except in the table where it is listed as the R-2 District. We want to modify that to reflect the R-3 District and be consistent. Also, the main change we are proposing, in conjunction with the list above, is for massage establishments to apply for Special Use in the B-2, B-3 and OS Districts. For the past few years the Village has had licensing requirements for massage establishments and there are currently about seven or eight in town. Since there have been some issues with previous locations and their license had to be suspended or revoked completely, rather than these be allowed or permitted uses, we are proposing they have to obtain a Special Use Permit in the B-2, B-3 and OS Districts. This way if someone is wanting to operate a legitimate massage establishment, they will go through the review process before the Plan Commission, receive Village Board approval and pay an additional Special Use fee. Staff is looking for a positive recommendation to all of the above modifications to the code.

PC/ZBA Case 21-0046, BC Merchants – 490 Tower Boulevard, Special Use Permit for

Outdoor Storage

Mr. Brian Ciske with BC Merchants requests approval of a Special Use Permit for outdoor storage of fleet vehicles on the 490 Tower Boulevard property.

BC Merchants is a wholesale liquor distributor, and a 12-foot tall carport structure is proposed to cover 11 parking spaces in the southeast corner of the property. Vans which make deliveries for the business will be parked under the carport. The subject property contains a sufficient number of parking spaces per the UDO to accommodate required parking demand, and the proposed carport will not have a negative impact on surrounding properties.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the PC/ZBA packet on September 10, 2021. At its meeting on September 13, 2021, by a vote of 7-0, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Special Use request subject to the conditions in the September 13, 2021 staff report.

If the Village Board concurs with the PC/ZBA recommendation, they should approve the Special Use Permit for Outdoor Storage for BC Merchants, subject to the conditions contained within the Ordinance, and adopt the necessary Ordinance.

PC/ZBA Case 21-0047, Text Amendment for the Miscellaneous Modifications to

the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO)

This is the second round of "fine tuning" for the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) now that staff has been utilizing the Code since its adoption in July 2021. Staff reviewed the UDO and presented modifications in Article 2 (Definitions), Article 3 (District Specific Standards), Article 4 (Use Specific Standards), Article 5 (Development Standards), and Article 6 (Sign Standards) of the UDO at a public hearing before the PC/ZBA on September 13, 2021. The PC/ZBA recommended approval of the proposed text amendments by a vote of 7-0.

The PC/ZBA also recommended approval of text amendments related to massage establishments. As the Board is aware, in 2018, the Village created a massage establishment licensing program through the adoption of the Massage Establishment Licensing Ordinance to develop more effective regulations for massage businesses due to recurring issues with illegal activities. The program included the adoption of licensing procedures and operational regulations for massage establishments, and established a license suspension and revocation procedure. In order to curb future revocations and encourage legitimate massage establishment owners to operate in town, a special use approval process is now proposed. It should be noted that regulations are proposed for massage establishments as the principal use or business; massage therapy that is ancillary to a medical or physical health use will not require special use approval (as already stipulated in the Massage Establishment Licensing Ordinance).

If the Village Board concurs with the PC/ZBA recommendation regarding the text amendments associated with Unified Development Ordinance, they should approve the amendments and adopt the necessary Ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR OUTDOOR STORAGE (BC MERCHANTS, 490 TOWER BOULEVARD)

WHEREAS, Brian Ciske with BC Merchants, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, has petitioned the Village of Carol Stream for a Special Use Permit for Outdoor Storage in accordance with Section 16-3-11 of the Unified Development Ordinance, on the property legally described in Section 2 herein and commonly known as 490 Tower Boulevard, Carol Stream, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 16-8-4 (L) of the Unified Development Ordinance, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on the above petition on September 13, 2021 following proper legal notice of said public hearing, after which the Commission recommended to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village that the Special Use Permit be approved; and

WHEREAS, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its Findings and Recommendations regarding the Special Use Permit with the Mayor and Board of Trustees, and the Mayor and Board of Trustees have duly considered said Findings and Recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, after examining the Petition for the Special Use Permit, and the Findings and Recommendations of the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined and find that the requested Special Use Permit:

- 1. Is deemed necessary for the public convenience at the location. The storage of covered fleet vehicles will provide an amenity to the business, which will be able to conduct business operations more efficiently.
- 2. Will not be unreasonably detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare. The proposed carport will be constructed in a manner that should not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare.
- 3. Will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood. The carport will be located in the rear of the property and should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other properties in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor diminish or impair property values within the area.
- 4. Will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding property for uses permitted in the district. Surrounding properties are already developed. As such, there should be no impact on the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding properties.

- 5. Will provide adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other important and necessary community facilities. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other public improvements are in place.
- 6. Will conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as the Village Board may in each instance modify such regulations. *The project is expected to conform to all applicable codes and requirements.*

SECTION 2:

The Special Use Permit, as set forth in the above recitals, is hereby approved and granted to BC Merchants subject to the conditions set forth in Section 3, upon the real estate commonly known as 490 Tower Boulevard, Carol Stream, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

LOT 1, IN TOWER BOULEVARD BUSINESS PARK 1ST RESUBDIVISION, BEING A PART OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 IN SECTION 28, TOWNSHIP 40 NORTH, RANGE 10, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF RECORDED AUGUST 21, 1998, AS DOCUMENT NO. R98-171715, IN DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

hereinafter referred to as the Subject Property.

SECTION 3:

The approval of the Special Use Permit granted in Section 1 herein is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That all improvements must be built, installed, and maintained in accordance with the attached plans and exhibits, and that a building permit shall be required prior to the installation of the carport structure; and
- 2. That the site and business must be maintained and operated in accordance with all State, County and Village codes and regulations.

SECTION 4:

The Special Use Permit is hereby approved and granted as set forth in the following plans and exhibits:

- 1. Plat of Survey denoting fleet vehicle storage location (Exhibit A, received August 3, 2021).
- 2. Carport Detail (Exhibit B, received August 3, 2021).

SECTION 5:

Such execution and delivery to the Village shall take place within sixty (60) days after the passage and approval of this Ordinance or within such extension of time as may be granted in the discretion of the corporate authorities, by motion.

SECTION 6:

The failure of the owner or other party in interest, or a subsequent owner or other party in interest, to strictly comply with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance, after execution of this Ordinance, shall subject the owner or party in interest to the penalties set forth in Section 16-8-5 of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance and/or termination of the special use permit after notice and public hearing in accordance with the procedures required by the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.





AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 16 OF THE CAROL STREAM CODE OF ORDINANCES

(UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE – MISCELLANEOUS MODIFICATIONS AND MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENTS AS SPECIAL USES)

WHEREAS, the Village Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals, after proper notice being given, conducted a public hearing on September 13, 2021, regarding text amendments to amend Section 16-2-1 regarding miscellaneous definitions; to amend Section 16-3-4 regarding the R-3 Suburban Residence District; to amend Table 16-3-11 (E) regarding massage establishments as special uses and other miscellaneous modifications; to amend the table of contents for Article 4 (Use Specific Standards) to include Massage Establishments and other miscellaneous modifications; to amend Section 16-4-13 regarding vehicle sales and rental; to amend Section 16-4-18 regarding outdoor storage in the Industrial District; to amend Section 16-4-22 regarding Special Exhibitions, Shows, and Special Events; to add Section 16-4-27 regarding use specific standards for Massage Establishments; to amend Section 16-5-2 regarding off-street parking requirements for commercial vehicles in residential districts and parking requirements for massage establishments; to amend Section 16-6-4 regarding maximum sign area for wall signs and maximum height for multitenant monument signs in the B-3 District; to amend Figure 16-6-4 regarding multitenant monument signs; and to amend Section 16-6-9 regarding placement of multitenant monument signs in the B-3 District; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has filed its Findings and Recommendations regarding the text amendments with the Mayor and Board of Trustees, and the Mayor and Board of Trustees have duly considered said Findings and Recommendations; and

WHERAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees find it to be in the best interests of the Village to amend the Code of Ordinances as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Chapter 16, Article 2, Section 1 of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended to include the following:

§ 16-2-1 DEFINITIONS - A.

ACCESS DRIVE. An unobstructed way of specified width containing a drive or roadway that provides vehicular access within a development and connects to a public street.

SECTION 2: That Chapter 16, Article 2, Section 13 of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended to include the following:

§ 16-2-13 DEFINITIONS - M.

MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENT. Any establishment having a fixed place of business where any person, firm, association or corporation engages in or carries on, or permits to be engaged in or carried on, a business of providing massages.

SECTION 3: That Chapter 16, Article 2, Section 15 of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

- § 16-2-15 DEFINITIONS O.
- (G) **OUTDOOR DISPLAY AND/OR SALE OF MERCHANDISE.** The placement of goods for sale or advertisement outside of a building or structure on the same zoning lot and in conjunction with the primary use found on the lot.

SECTION 4: That Chapter 16, Article 2, Section 15 of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

- § 16-2-15 DEFINITIONS O.
- (L) **OUTDOOR VEHICLE STORAGE.** The commercial storage, in an unenclosed area, of any vehicles, recreational vehicles, and trailers, including vehicles associated with vehicle sales and rental uses.

SECTION 5: That Chapter 16, Article 3, Table 16-3-4 (D) of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

(B) Storage areas for vehicles for sale or rent shall be screened on all sides facing a public right-of-way with the requirements for parking lot perimeter landscape as detailed in § 16-5-56. The Community Development Director may approve alternate placement of the required landscape material.

SECTION 9: That Chapter 16, Article 4, Section 18 of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

§ 16-4-18 OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES AND OPERATIONS, PERMANENT., AND OUTDOOR VEHICLE STORAGE IN THE INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT.

Outdoor activities and operations and outdoor vehicle storage, excluding storage for vehicle sales and rental uses shall be subject to the following provisions:

- (A) Screening of outdoor activities and operations and outdoor vehicle storage in the I District.
- (1) Outdoor activities and operations and outdoor vehicle storage shall not be visible from:
 - (a) Adjacent non-industrial property;
 - (b) The right-of-way of the following roadways:
 - I. Gary Avenue;
 - II. North Avenue;
 - III. East Lies Road; and
 - IV. Schmale Road.
- (2) The following minimum screening requirements shall apply to outdoor activities and operations and outdoor vehicle storage adjacent to or visible from areas identified in § 16-4-18(A)(1).
- (a) A solid wall or fence not less than six feet and not more than eight feet in height along all property frontages identified in § 16-4-18(A)(1).
- (b) A landscape strip not less than five feet wide located in front of the wall or fence. The required landscape materials shall conform to all requirements for transition area landscape found in § 16-5-5.
- (3) The following minimum screening requirements shall apply to outdoor activities and operations and outdoor vehicle storage not adjacent to or visible from areas identified in § 16-4-18(A)(1).
- (a) A fence, which conforms to all fence material requirements detail in § 16-5-9 and is not less than six and not more than eight feet in height.
- (b) A landscape strip not less than five feet wide located in front of the fence wall. The required landscape materials shall conform to all requirements for transition area landscape found in § 16-5-56.
 - (4) General screening requirements.
 - (a) No screening wall or fence shall be located within a required front yard.
- (b) Screening walls and fences shall be architecturally compatible with the primary structure.
- (B) Screening of outdoor activities and operations in the B-1, B-2, B-3, and O-S Districts.
 - (1) Outdoor activities and operations shall not be visible from:
 - (a) Any public right-of-way;
 - (b) Any residential property.
- (2) The following minimum screening requirements shall apply to outdoor activities and adjacent to or visible from areas identified in § 16-4-18(B)(1):
- (a) A solid wall or fence not less than six feet and not more than eight feet in height along all property frontages identified in § 16-4-18(B)(1).

- (b) A landscape strip not less than five feet wide located in front of the wall or fence. The required landscape materials shall conform to all requirements for transition area landscape found in § 16-5-5.
- (3) The following minimum screening requirements shall apply to outdoor activities and operations not adjacent to or visible from areas identified in § 16-4-18(B)(1).
- (a) A fence, which conforms to all fence material requirements detail in § 16-5-9 and is not less than six and not more than eight feet in height.
- (b) A landscape strip not less than five feet wide located in front of the masonry wall. The required landscape materials shall conform to all requirements for transition area landscape found in § 16-5-56.

SECTION 10: That Chapter 16, Article 4, Section 22 of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

§ 16-4-22 OUTDOOR SPECIAL EXHIBITIONS, SHOWS OR SPECIAL EVENTS SALES.

The Chief of Police, or his/her designee, shall review the plan to make certain that adequate provision has been made for the safe ingress and egress of vehicles to the site and to and from parking areas, the marking of parking areas and maneuvering lanes and lighting for evening events.
- (E) Temporary signs and attention-getting devices, which may otherwise be prohibited in Article 6, such as pennants, streamers, balloons, inflatable shapes or vehicle signs, may be authorized with the approval of a Temporary Use Permit. Detailed information regarding the type, number, placement and duration of proposed temporary signs and attention-getting devices must be included with the Temporary Use Permit application, and shall be subject to the following provisions:
- 1. Temporary signs or attention getting devices must be properly anchored or secured and must be maintained in good condition; and
- 2. Temporary signs or attention getting devices installed in association with a grand opening event may remain in place for a maximum of 30 days.

 - i. In keeping with the overall design and architecture of the building;
- ii. A minimum of 20 feet from the primary wall sign and other secondary wall signs;
 - iii. A maximum of 50% of the size of the primary wall sign;
 - iv. Accessory to the building's primary wall sign; and
- v. The total area of all primary and secondary wall signs does not exceed the maximum wall sign area as established in $\S 16-6-4(A)(1)(a)$.



The maximum permitted height of a multitenant monument sign in the O-S or I District, or in the B-3 District if the property is less than five acres in area and contains less than 25,000 square feet of building floor area, shall not exceed ten feet.

SECTION 17: That Chapter 16, Article 6, Section 9 (A) of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

(A) Placement of signs on lots. No sign shall be placed closer than five feet to any lot line, excluding multitenant monument signs for properties in the B-3 District that are at least five acres in area or larger and contain a minimum of 25,000 square feet of

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 16 OF THE CAROL STREAM CODE OF ORDINANCES

(UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE – MISCELLANEOUS MODIFICATIONS AND MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENTS AS SPECIAL USES)

SECTION 14: That Chapter 16, Article 6, Section 4 (A)(1)(a), (d), and (d)(I)(v) of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

§ 16-6-4 PERMANENT SIGNS REQUIRING A PERMIT.

- (A) Standards for permanent signs requiring a permit.
 - (1) Wall signs. (See Figure 16-6-4(A)(1))
- (a) Sign area. The maximum permitted sign area of wall signs in the B-1, B-2, B-3, O-S, and I Districts shall not exceed 10% of the total area of the wall face on which the sign is to be located, or 500 square feet, whichever is less. The maximum permitted sign area of wall signs in the R-1, R-2, R-3, and R-4 Districts shall not exceed 5% of the total area of the wall face on which the sign is to be located, or 300 square feet, whichever is less.
- (b) *Height*. No wall sign shall protrude above the highest roof line or above the top of the parapet wall or mansard roof.
- (c) *Projection.* Wall signs must not extend more than 12 inches from the wall of the building or structure to which it is attached and shall maintain a vertical clearance of seven feet.
 - (d) Number of signs. (See Figure 16-6-4(A)(l)(d)(iii))
- I. Single tenant buildings shall be permitted one wall sign per lot frontage along a public right-of-way or private access drive.
- II. Multi-tenant buildings shall be permitted one wall sign per unit per frontage along a public right-of-way or private access drive.
- III. A maximum of four secondary wall signs may be authorized for buildings with lineal frontage in excess of 75 feet by the Community Development Director provided such additional signage is:
 - i. In keeping with the overall design and architecture of the building;
- ii. A minimum of 20 feet from the primary wall sign and other secondary wall signs;
 - iii. A maximum of 50% of the size of the primary wall sign;
 - iv. Accessory to the building's primary wall sign; and
- v. The total area of all primary and secondary wall signs does not exceed the maximum wall sign area as established in § 16-6-4(A)(1)(a).


SECTION 15: That Chapter 16, Article 6, Section 4 (A)(3)(b) of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

§ 16-6-4 PERMANENT SIGNS REQUIRING A PERMIT.

Permanent signs including wall signs, monument signs, awning or canopy signs, and projecting signs, shall be permitted in the zoning district shown in Table 16-6-4(B) only after the issuance of a sign permit in accordance with § 16-8-3.

- (A) Standards for permanent signs requiring a permit.
 - (3) Multitenant monument signs. (See Figure 16-6-4(A)(3)).
- (a) Sign area. The maximum permitted sign area of a multitenant monument sign in the B-1, B-2, O-S, or I Districts shall not exceed 96 square feet. The maximum permitted sign area of a multitenant monument sign in the B-3 District shall not exceed 160 square feet.
- (b) *Height*. The maximum permitted height of a multitenant monument sign in the B-1 or B-2 District shall not exceed six feet. The maximum permitted height of a multitenant monument sign in the B-3 District shall not exceed 25 feet if the property is five acres in area or larger and contains a minimum of 25,000 square feet of building floor area. The maximum permitted height of a multitenant monument sign in the O-S or I District, or in the B-3 District if the property is less than five acres in area and contains less than 25,000 square feet of building floor area, shall not exceed ten feet.

SECTION 16: That Chapter 16, Article 6, Figure 16-6-4(A)(3) of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:



SECTION 17: That Chapter 16, Article 6, Section 9 (A) of the Carol Stream Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

§ 16-6-9 GENERAL STANDARDS FOR ALL SIGNS (SEE FIGURE 16-6-9(A)).

(A) Placement of signs on lots. No sign shall be placed closer than five feet to any lot line, excluding multitenant monument signs for properties in the B-3 District that are at least five acres in area or larger and contain a minimum of 25,000 square feet of building floor area, which shall be set back a minimum of 40 feet from any property line, or unless otherwise specific herein. No sign of any type shall be located within the 25 foot sight triangle of a corner lot, unless the height of the sign is no more than 30 inches above the crown of the adjacent road. No sign shall be placed at any location on any lot in such a manner as to obstruct the view of traffic.


