Capital improvement activities associated with the Water and Sewer Fund are contained within that fund since those projects are directly funded by water and sewer rates and users of the system.

In August 2021 the Village Manager approved an Engineering Services Agreement (ESA) with Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. (CBBEL) for design and bidding assistance for the Fullerton Avenue water tower painting and repair project. That work has been concluded and the Village Board awarded a bid to a contractor to perform the painting and repair services at the January 17, 2022, Village Board meeting. The proposed FY23 budget includes \$45,000 for construction oversight services.

The painting and repair work is highly specialized and requires oversight by an experienced resident engineer to ensure that work is performed in accordance with project specifications. CBBEL performed these services for Carol Stream on the Lies Road Tower Project in 2021 and has conducted oversight work on similar projects for a variety of municipal and non-municipal clients. The work under the proposed agreement (attached) will include: contract administration, shop drawing review and construction observation services. CBBEL will review all applications for payment and make recommendation to the Village¹.

Staff recommends that the Village Board approve and authorize the Village Manager to sign the attached Engineering Services Agreement with Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd., for Construction Engineering Services for painting and minor repairs to Tower #4 in the amount of \$43,846.

Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. (CBBEL) is pleased to submit this proposal to provide construction engineering services for the Rehabilitation of the Fullerton Avenue 500,000 Gallon Legged High Tank. Below is our Understanding of the Assignment, Scope of Services and Estimated Fee.

UNDERSTANDING OF THE ASSIGNMENT

The Village of Carol Stream is seeking an engineering consultant to perform construction engineering services related to the Rehabilitation of the Fullerton Avenue 500,000 Gallon Legged High Tank located near Fullerton Avenue and Schmale Road in Carol Stream, Illinois. The engineering consultant will perform Phase III construction engineering services. The Village would like to advertise the project for bid no later than November 2021 with construction starting in spring of 2022.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Task 1 – Construction Observation Services:

<u>Task 1A – Contract Administration</u>: Under this task CBBEL will provide the preparation of a Notice of Award, a Notice to Proceed and coordinate a preconstruction conference with the relevant parties involved. We will review contractor's payment applications and prepare change orders for the Village's approval, and coordinate and process paperwork and forms required by the Village.

CBBEL will review Contractor's construction schedule and sequence(s); listing of materials and equipment submittals; general correspondence procedures; site access; staging areas required; traffic control; subcontractors; and submittals for payment. Shop drawing review procedures will be discussed during the preconstruction conference and in particular, the Contractor will be advised that material and equipment is not to be installed prior to completion of the shop drawing review process.

Task 1B – Shop Drawing Review / Construction Observation Services: CBBEL estimates this project will take approximately 16 weeks from May 1, 2022 to September 1, 2022 to complete. Under this task CBBEL will provide a part-time Resident Engineer (10 hours/week for 16 weeks) for the work to be performed in the 2022 construction season. The Resident Engineer (RE) will perform the following duties:

- Log all Contractor data received and maintain a log book of shop drawings and submissions so as to track the status of submittals.
- Review Contractor's submittals for compliance with the intent of the Contract Documents.
- Prepare shop drawing review correspondence providing Contractor with our review comments and if submittals comply with intent of Contract Documents.
- Notify the Village of deficiencies, deviations of substitutions. With the notification, provide the Village with an opinion for acceptance or denial, and request direction from the Village regarding the deviation or substitution.
- Advise the Village when disapprovals may be necessary due to failing to conform to the Contract Documents.
- Provide office support to the Resident Engineer related to interpretation of Contract Documents.
- Maintain office files of project correspondence.
- When present on site, observe the progress and quality of the executed work and determine if the work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents. The Resident Engineer will keep the Village informed of the progress of the work.
- Serve as the Village's liaison with the Contractor working principally through the Contractor's field superintendent.
- Attend construction conferences. Maintain and circulate copies of meeting notes.
- Provide clarification(s) related to the intent of the Contract Documents.
- Review the Contractor's schedule at construction conferences and compare actual progress of work to Contractor's proposed construction schedule.
- Review Contractor's procedure for maintaining record drawings and field changes which may occur during the course of work.
- Maintain orderly files for correspondence, reports of job conferences, shop drawings and other submissions, reproductions or original Contract Documents including all addenda, change order and additional drawings issued subsequent to the award of the contract.
- Record the names, addresses and phone numbers of all contractors, subcontractors and major material suppliers in a field diary.
- For days in which the RE is present on site, keep a daily report book, which shall contain a daily report and quantity of hours on the job site, weather conditions, list of visiting officials, daily activities, job decisions and observations as well as general and specific observations and job progress.
- For milestone inspections of the blasting of the interior and exterior of the standpipe, CBBEL will employ the services of Nelson Tank Engineering Company who will climb the tank and perform the visual inspections in areas where CBBEL cannot climb to because of our insurance restrictions. Their fees are included in our construction engineering fee total.
- Prior to final walk through, submit to the Contractor a list of observed items (punch list) requiring correction.
- Verify that punch list items have been addressed and corrections have been made.
- Coordinate and conduct the final walk through with the Village, prepare a final punch list (if required).
- Verify that all the items on the final punch list have been corrected and make recommendations to the Village concerning acceptance of the project.

- Except upon written instructions of the Village, the Resident Engineer shall not authorize any deviation from the Contract Documents.
- Determine if the project has been completed in accordance with the Contract Documents and that the Contractor has fulfilled all of their obligations.

No other representation, express or implied, and no warranty or guarantee is included or intended in this Agreement, or in any report, opinion, document, or otherwise.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary which may be contained in this Agreement or any other material incorporated herein by reference, or in any Agreement between the Client and any other party concerning the Project, the Engineer shall not have control or be in charge of and shall not be responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of construction, or the safety, safety precautions or programs of the Client, the construction contractor, other contractors or subcontractors performing any of the work or providing any of the services on the Project. The Engineer also reserves the right to retain hard copy originals of all Project Documentation delivered to the Client in machine readable form, which originals shall be referred to and shall govern in the event of any inconsistency between the two.

The Client understands that the automated conversion of information and data from the system and format used by the Engineer to an alternate system or format cannot be accomplished without the introduction of inexactitudes, anomalies, and errors. In the event Project Documentation provided to the Client in machine readable form is so converted, the Client agrees to assume all risks associated therewith and, to the fullest

extent permitted by law, to hold harmless and indemnify the Engineer from and against all claims, liabilities, losses, damages, and costs, including but not limited to attorney's fees, arising therefrom or in connection therewith.

The Client recognizes that changes or modifications to the Engineer's instruments of professional service introduced by anyone other than the Engineer may result in adverse consequences which the Engineer can neither predict nor control. 7. They cannot be used by Client or others on extensions of the Project or any other project. Any reuse, without specific written verification or adaptation by Engineer, shall be at Client's sole risk, and Client shall indemnify and hold harmless Engineer from all claims, damages, losses, and expenses including attorney's fees arising out of or resulting therefrom.

The Engineer shall have the right to include representations of the design of the Project, including photographs of the exterior and interior, among the Engineer's promotional and professional materials. The Engineer's materials shall not include the Client's confidential and proprietary information if the Client has previously advised the Engineer in writing of the specific information considered by the Client to be confidential and proprietary.

- 8. <u>Standard of Practice</u>: The Engineer will strive to conduct services under this agreement in a manner consistent with that level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the profession currently practicing in the same locality under similar conditions as of the date of this Agreement.
- Compliance With Laws: The Engineer will strive to exercise usual and customary professional care in his/her efforts to comply with those laws, codes, ordinance and regulations which are in effect as of the date of this Agreement.

With specific respect to prescribed requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 or certified state or local accessibility regulations (ADA), Client understands ADA is a civil rights legislation and that interpretation of ADA is a legal issue and not a design issue and, accordingly, retention of legal counsel (by Client) for purposes of interpretation is advisable. As such and with respect to ADA, Client agrees to waive any action against Engineer, and to indemnify and defend Engineer against any claim arising from Engineer's alleged failure to meet ADA requirements prescribed.

Further to the law and code compliance, the Client understands that the Engineer will strive to provide designs in accordance with the prevailing Standards of Practice as previously set forth, but that the Engineer does not warrant that any reviewing agency having jurisdiction will not for its own purposes comment, request changes and/or additions to such designs. In the event such design requests are made by a reviewing agency, but which do not exist in the form of a written regulation, ordinance or other similar document as published by the reviewing agency, then such design changes (at substantial variance from the intended design developed by the Engineer), if effected and incorporated into the project documents by the Engineer, shall be considered as Supplementary Task(s) to the Engineer's Scope of Service and compensated for accordingly.

10. <u>Indemnification</u>: Engineer shall indemnify and hold harmless Client up to the amount of this contract fee (for services) from loss or expense, including reasonable attorney's fees for claims for personal injury (including death) or property damage to the extent caused by the sole negligent act, error or omission of Engineer.

Client shall indemnify and hold harmless Engineer under this Agreement, from loss or expense, including reasonable attorney's fees, for claims for personal injuries (including death) or property damage arising out of the sole negligent act, error omission of Client.

In the event of joint or concurrent negligence of Engineer and Client, each shall bear that portion of the loss or expense that its share of the joint or concurrent negligence bears to the total negligence (including that of third parties), which caused the personal injury or property damage.

Engineer shall not be liable for special, incidental or consequential damages, including, but not limited to loss of profits, revenue, use of capital, claims of customers, cost of purchased or replacement power, or for any other loss of any nature, whether based on contract, tort, negligence, strict liability or otherwise, by reasons of the services rendered under this Agreement.

- 11. Opinions of Probable Cost: Since Engineer has no control over the cost of labor, materials or equipment, or over the Contractor(s) method of determining process, or over competitive bidding or market conditions, his/her opinions of probable Project Construction Cost provided for herein are to be made on the basis of his/her experience and qualifications and represent his/her judgement as a design professional familiar with the construction industry, but Engineer cannot and does not guarantee that proposal, bids or the Construction Cost will not vary from opinions of probable construction cost prepared by him/her. If prior to the Bidding or Negotiating Phase, Client wishes greater accuracy as to the Construction Cost, the Client shall employ an independent cost estimator Consultant for the purpose of obtaining a second construction cost opinion independent from Engineer.
- 12. <u>Governing Law & Dispute Resolutions</u>: This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with Articles previously set forth by (Item 9 of) this Agreement, together with the laws of the **State of Illinois**.

Any claim, dispute or other matter in question arising out of or related to this Agreement, which can not be mutually resolved by the parties of this Agreement, shall be subject to mediation as a condition precedent to arbitration (if arbitration is agreed upon by the parties of this Agreement) or the institution of legal or equitable proceedings by either party. If such matter relates to or is the subject of a lien arising out of the Engineer's services, the Engineer may proceed in accordance with applicable law to comply with the lien notice or filing deadlines prior to resolution of the matter by mediation or by arbitration.

The Client and Engineer shall endeavor to resolve claims, disputes and other matters in question between them by mediation which, unless the parties mutually agree otherwise, shall be in accordance with the Construction Industry Mediation Rules of the American Arbitration Association currently in effect. Requests for mediation shall be filed in writing with the other party to this Agreement and with the American Arbitration Association. The request may be made concurrently with the filing of a demand for arbitration but, in such event, mediation shall proceed in advance of arbitration or legal or equitable proceedings, which shall be stayed pending mediation for a period of 60 days from the date of filing, unless stayed for a longer period by agreement of the parties or court order.

The parties shall share the mediator's fee and any filing fees equally. The mediation shall be held in the place where the Project is located, unless another location is mutually agreed upon. Agreements reached in mediation shall be enforceable as settlement agreements in any court having jurisdiction thereof.

- 13. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>: The terms of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns: provided, however, that neither party shall assign this Agreement in whole or in part without the prior written approval of the other.
- 14. <u>Waiver of Contract Breach</u>: The waiver of one party of any breach of this Agreement or the failure of one party to enforce at any time, or for any period of time, any of the provisions hereof, shall be limited to the particular instance, shall not operate or be deemed to waive any future breaches of this Agreement and shall not be construed to be a waiver of any provision, except for the particular instance.
- 15. Entire Understanding of Agreement: This Agreement represents and incorporates the entire understanding of the parties hereto, and each party acknowledges that there are no warranties, representations, covenants or understandings of any kind, matter or description whatsoever, made by either party to the other except as expressly set forth herein. Client and the Engineer hereby agree that any purchase orders, invoices, confirmations, acknowledgments or other similar documents executed or delivered with respect to the subject matter hereof that conflict with the terms of the Agreement shall be null, void & without effect to the extent they conflict with the terms of this Agreement.
- 16. <u>Amendment</u>: This Agreement shall not be subject to amendment unless another instrument is duly executed by duly authorized representatives of each of the parties and entitled "Amendment of Agreement".

- 17. <u>Severability of Invalid Provisions</u>: If any provision of the Agreement shall be held to contravene or to be invalid under the laws of any particular state, county or jurisdiction where used, such contravention shall not invalidate the entire Agreement, but it shall be construed as if not containing the particular provisions held to be invalid in the particular state, country or jurisdiction and the rights or obligations of the parties hereto shall be construed and enforced accordingly.
- 18. <u>Force Majeure</u>: Neither Client nor Engineer shall be liable for any fault or delay caused by any contingency beyond their control including but not limited to acts of God, wars, strikes, walkouts, fires, natural calamities, or demands or requirements of governmental agencies.
- 19. <u>Subcontracts</u>: Engineer may subcontract portions of the work, but each subcontractor must be approved by Client in writing.
- 20. Access and Permits: Client shall arrange for Engineer to enter upon public and private property and obtain all necessary approvals and permits required from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project. Client shall pay costs (including Engineer's employee salaries, overhead and fee) incident to any effort by Engineer toward assisting Client in such access, permits or approvals, if Engineer perform such services.
- 21. <u>Designation of Authorized Representative</u>: Each party (to this Agreement) shall designate one or more persons to act with authority in its behalf in respect to appropriate aspects of the Project. The persons designated shall review and respond promptly to all communications received from the other party.
- 22. <u>Notices</u>: Any notice or designation required to be given to either party hereto shall be in writing, and unless receipt of such notice is expressly required by the terms hereof shall be deemed to be effectively served when deposited in the mail with sufficient first class postage affixed, and addressed to the party to whom such notice is directed at such party's place of business or such other address as either party shall hereafter furnish to the other party by written notice as herein provided.
- 23. <u>Limit of Liability</u>: The Client and the Engineer have discussed the risks, rewards, and benefits of the project and the Engineer's total fee for services. In recognition of the relative risks and benefits of the Project to both the Client and the Engineer, the risks have been allocated such that the Client agrees that to the fullest extent permitted by law, the Engineer's total aggregate liability to the Client for any and all injuries, claims, costs, losses, expenses, damages of any nature whatsoever or claim expenses arising out of this Agreement from any cause or causes, including attorney's fees and costs, and expert witness fees and costs, shall not exceed the total Engineer's fee for professional engineering services rendered on this project as made part of this Agreement. Such causes included but are not limited to the Engineer's negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability or breach of contract. It is intended that this limitation apply to any and all liability or cause of action however alleged or arising, unless otherwise prohibited by law.

24. <u>Client's Responsibilities</u>: The Client agrees to provide full information regarding requirements for and about the Project, including a program which shall set forth the Client's objectives, schedule, constraints, criteria, special equipment, systems and site requirements.

The Client agrees to furnish and pay for all legal, accounting and insurance counseling services as may be necessary at any time for the Project, including auditing services which the Client may require to verify the Contractor's Application for Payment or to ascertain how or for what purpose the Contractor has used the money paid by or on behalf of the Client.

The Client agrees to require the Contractor, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the Engineer, its consultants, and the employees and agents of any of them from and against any and all claims, suits, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, and costs ("Losses"), including but not limited to costs of defense, arising in whole or in part out of the negligence of the Contractor, its subcontractors, the officers, employees, agents, and subcontractors of any of them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless of whether or not such Losses are caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder. Specifically excluded from the foregoing are Losses arising out of the preparation or approval of maps, drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, change orders, designs, or specifications, and the giving of or failure to give directions by the Engineer, its consultants, and the agents and employees of any of them, provided such giving or failure to give is the primary cause of Loss. The Client also agrees to require the Contractor to provide to the Engineer the required certificate of insurance.

The Client further agrees to require the Contractor to name the Engineer, its agents and consultants as additional insureds on the Contractor's policy or policies of comprehensive or commercial general liability insurance. Such insurance shall include products and completed operations and contractual liability coverages, shall be primary and noncontributing with any insurance maintained by the Engineer or its agents and consultants, and shall provide that the Engineer be given thirty days, unqualified written notice prior to any cancellation thereof.

In the event the foregoing requirements, or any of them, are not established by the Client and met by the Contractor, the Client agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Engineer, its employees, agents, and consultants from and against any and all Losses which would have been indemnified and insured against by the Contractor, but were not.

When Contract Documents prepared under the Scope of Services of this contract require insurance(s) to be provided, obtained and/or otherwise maintained by the Contractor, the Client agrees to be wholly responsible for setting forth any and all such insurance requirements. Furthermore, any document provided for Client review by the Engineer under this Contract related to such insurance(s) shall be considered as sample insurance requirements and not the recommendation of the Engineer. Client agrees to have their own risk management department review any and all insurance requirements for adequacy and to determine specific types of insurance(s) required for the project. Client further agrees that decisions concerning types and amounts of insurance are

specific to the project and shall be the product of the Client. As such, any and all insurance requirements made part of Contract Documents prepared by the Engineer are not to be considered the Engineer's recommendation, and the Client shall make the final decision regarding insurance requirements.

- 25. <u>Information Provided by Others</u>: The Engineer shall indicate to the Client the information needed for rendering of the services of this Agreement. The Client shall provide to the Engineer such information as is available to the Client and the Client's consultants and contractors, and the Engineer shall be entitled to rely upon the accuracy and completeness thereof. The Client recognizes that it is impossible for the Engineer to assure the accuracy, completeness and sufficiency of such information, either because it is impossible to verify, or because of errors or omissions which may have occurred in assembling the information the Client is providing. Accordingly, the Client agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to indemnify and hold the Engineer and the Engineer's subconsultants harmless from any claim, liability or cost (including reasonable attorneys' fees and cost of defense) for injury or loss arising or allegedly arising from errors, omissions or inaccuracies in documents or other information provided by the Client to the Engineer.
- Payment: Client shall be invoiced once each month for work performed during the preceding period. Client agrees to pay each invoice within thirty (30) days of its receipt. The client further agrees to pay interest on all amounts invoiced and not paid or objected to for valid cause within said thirty (30) day period at the rate of eighteen (18) percent per annum (or the maximum interest rate permitted under applicable law, whichever is the lesser) until paid. Client further agrees to pay Engineer's cost of collection of all amounts due and unpaid after sixty (60) days, including court costs and reasonable attorney's fees, as well as costs attributed to suspension of services accordingly and as follows:

Collection Costs. In the event legal action is necessary to enforce the payment provisions of this Agreement, the Engineer shall be entitled to collect from the Client any judgement or settlement sums due, reasonable attorneys' fees, court costs and expenses incurred by the Engineer in connection therewith and, in addition, the reasonable value of the Engineer's time and expenses spent in connection with such collection action, computed at the Engineer's prevailing fee schedule and expense policies.

Suspension of Services. If the Client fails to make payments when due or otherwise is in breach of this Agreement, the Engineer may suspend performance of services upon five (5) calendar days' notice to the Client. The Engineer shall have no liability whatsoever to the Client for any costs or damages as a result of such suspension caused by any breach of this Agreement by the Client. Client will reimburse Engineer for all associated costs as previously set forth in (Item 4 of) this Agreement.

27. When construction observation tasks are part of the service to be performed by the Engineer under this Agreement, the Client will include the following clause in the construction contract documents and Client agrees not to modify or delete it:

Kotecki Waiver. Contractor (and any subcontractor into whose subcontract this clause is incorporated) agrees to assume the entire liability for all personal injury claims suffered by its own employees, including without limitation claims under the Illinois Structural Work Act, asserted by persons allegedly injured on the Project; waives any limitation of liability defense based upon the Worker's Compensation Act, court interpretations of said Act or otherwise; and to the fullest extent permitted by law, agrees to indemnify and hold harmless and defend Owner and Engineer and their agents, employees and consultants (the "Indemnitees") from and against all such loss, expense, damage or injury, including reasonable attorneys' fees, that the Indemnitees may sustain as a result of such claims, except to the extent that Illinois law prohibits indemnity for the Indemnitees' own negligence. The Owner and Engineer are designated and recognized as explicit third party beneficiaries of the Kotecki Waiver within the general contract and all subcontracts entered into in furtherance of the general contract.

28. Job Site Safety/Supervision & Construction Observation: The Engineer shall neither have control over or charge of, nor be responsible for, the construction means, methods, techniques, sequences of procedures, or for safety precautions and programs in connection with the Work since they are solely the Contractor's rights and responsibilities. The Client agrees that the Contractor shall supervise and direct the work efficiently with his/her best skill and attention; and that the Contractor shall be solely responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures of construction and safety at the job site. The Client agrees and warrants that this intent shall be carried out in the Client's contract with the Contractor. The Client further agrees that the Contractor shall be responsible for initiating, maintaining and supervising all safety precautions and programs in connection with the work; and that the Contractor shall take all necessary precautions for the safety of, and shall provide the necessary protection to prevent damage, injury or loss to all employees on the subject site and all other persons who may be affected thereby. The Engineer shall have no authority to stop the work of the Contractor or the work of any subcontractor on the project.

When construction observation services are included in the Scope of Services, the Engineer shall visit the site at intervals appropriate to the stage of the Contractor's operation, or as otherwise agreed to by the Client and the Engineer to: 1) become generally familiar with and to keep the Client informed about the progress and quality of the Work; 2) to strive to bring to the Client's attention defects and deficiencies in the Work and; 3) to determine in general if the Work is being performed in a manner indicating that the Work, when fully completed, will be in accordance with the Contract Documents. However, the Engineer shall not be required to make exhaustive or continuous on-site inspections to check the quality or quantity of the Work. If the Client desires more extensive project observation, the Client shall request that such services be provided by the Engineer as Additional and Supplemental Construction Observation Services in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

The Engineer shall not be responsible for any acts or omissions of the Contractor, subcontractor, any entity performing any portions of the Work, or any agents or employees of any of them. The Engineer does not guarantee the performance of the

Contractor and shall not be responsible for the Contractor's failure to perform its Work in accordance with the Contract Documents or any applicable laws, codes, rules or regulations.

When municipal review services are included in the Scope of Services, the Engineer (acting on behalf of the municipality), when acting in good faith in the discharge of its duties, shall not thereby render itself liable personally and is, to the maximum extent permitted by law, relieved from all liability for any damage that may accrue to persons or property by reason of any act or omission in the discharge of its duties. Any suit brought against the Engineer which involve the acts or omissions performed by it in the enforcement of any provisions of the Client's rules, regulation and/or ordinance shall be defended by the Client until final termination of the proceedings. The Engineer shall be entitled to all defenses and municipal immunities that are, or would be, available to the Client.

29. <u>Insurance and Indemnification</u>: The Engineer and the Client understand and agree that the Client will contractually require the Contractor to defend and indemnify the Engineer and/or any subconsultants from any claims arising from the Work. The Engineer and the Client further understand and agree that the Client will contractually require the Contractor to procure commercial general liability insurance naming the Engineer as an additional named insured with respect to the work. The Contractor shall provide to the Client certificates of insurance evidencing that the contractually required insurance coverage has been procured. However, the Contractor's failure to provide the Client with the requisite certificates of insurance shall not constitute a waiver of this provision by the Engineer.

The Client and Engineer waive all rights against each other and against the Contractor and consultants, agents and employees of each of them for damages to the extent covered by property insurance during construction. The Client and Engineer each shall require similar waivers from the Contractor, consultants, agents and persons or entities awarded separate contracts administered under the Client's own forces.

30. <u>Hazardous Materials/Pollutants</u>: Unless otherwise provided by this Agreement, the Engineer and Engineer's consultants shall have no responsibility for the discovery, presence, handling, removal or disposal of or exposure of persons to hazardous materials/pollutants in any form at the Project site, including but not limited to mold/mildew, asbestos, asbestos products, polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) or other toxic/hazardous/pollutant type substances.

Furthermore, Client understands that the presence of mold/mildew and the like are results of prolonged or repeated exposure to moisture and the lack of corrective action. Client also understands that corrective action is a operation, maintenance and repair activity for which the Engineer is not responsible.

Recommendation for Approval of Amendment No. 6 to the Agreement for Operations,

Maintenance and Management Services of the Water Reclamation Center (WRC)

BACKGROUND

In December 2015, the Village Board approved a ten-year agreement with OMI (now Jacobs Engineering) for operation, maintenance and management of the Water Reclamation Center (WRC). The initial agreement year covered the period from May 1, 2016 through April 30, 2017. The agreement included a provision for annual review of costs by the Village and OMI, including a formula for a default increase should the Village and OMI fail to reach agreement.

I have worked with WRC staff to review the various cost centers included in the base fee and to develop a Capital Expenditure ("CapEx") program for the coming fiscal year. The attached proposed amendment provides for a base fee of \$1,900,817, plus \$11,185² for the cost of a ComEd transfer switch replacement and \$125,000 for the annual CapEx program. The base fee was negotiated in part this year utilizing a CPI table that is specific to costs impacting the wastewater treatment industry. This was a recommendation by Jacobs which resulted in a savings of nearly \$30,000 for the Village as compared to utilizing the CPI-U table provided for in the contract's default formula. The total proposed cost for FY23 is \$2,037,002.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Village Board approve Amendment No. 6 to the Agreement for Operations, Maintenance and Management Services of the Water Reclamation Center in the amount of \$2,037,002 for the period May 1, 2022 through April 30, 2023.

¹ The agreement also provided \$50,000 of free engineering services from Jacobs in each of two five-year periods.

² This ComEd charge is included in the Agreement each year, but is not subject to an annual increase.

AMENDMENT NO. 6 TO THE AGREEMENT FOR OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE SERVICES

THIS AMENDMENT to the Agreement for Operations Management and Maintenance dated December 7, 2015 is made and entered into this 21st day of March, 2022, by and between the Village of Carol Stream, Illinois, whose address for any formal notice is 124 Gerzevske Lane, Carol Stream, IL 60188 (hereinafter "OWNER") and Operations Management International, Inc., whose address for any formal notice is 9191 South Jamaica Street, Englewood, CO 80112 (hereinafter "OPERATOR"). OWNER and OPERATOR agree as follows:

- 1. Article 4.8 is hereby deleted in its entirely and replaced with the following:

Kuhn Road Bike Path - Design Supplement #2

In August of 2013 the Village applied for Surface Transportation Program – Transportation Control Measure (STP-TCM) funding of \$275,000 for construction of the Kuhn Road Bike Path from Lies Road to Army Trail Road. We also applied for design funding from the Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) that was approved in April of 2014. The Preliminary Engineering Phase I contract was awarded in August of 2015, and IDOT approved the Preliminary Design Report in April of 2018. Agreements and contracts for the Phase III Final Design were approved by the Village in August of 2020, and by IDOT in December of 2020.

Last year it was determined that many of the clearances had expired and would need to be redone. A design supplement was approved in September of 2021 and IDOT approved \$11,402 in additional ITEP funding to help offset this cost. The current (second) design supplement is for design changes made for the property owners along Kuhn Road granting the Village right of way. Other increases included redesign of roadway at handicap ramps to meet IDOT concerns about cross slopes. This will require re-profiling roadway pavement along the curb line.

The fee for this additional work is \$7,491.00. Due to the time required to submit for additional ITEP funding, and the project letting date in June, we are not recommending additional federal funding be applied for. Adequate funding exists in the Roadway component of the Capital Projects Fund to pay for this increase. Engineering staff therefore recommends that Design Supplement #2 for the Kuhn Road Bike Path be approved in the amount of \$7,491.00.

Dear Mr. Cleveland:

As we discussed, we are submitting a second supplement request for our design contract for the Kuhn Road Bike Path project. The revised contract amount represents a significant percentage of the actual construction cost estimate, and we wanted to review the reasons why the increased design fee is necessary and why the design cost relative to the construction cost estimate is so high.

The IDOT kick-off meeting for this project was in December 2020, and the initial targeted letting was January 21, 2022. This letting was postponed to March 11, 2022 to acquire right-of-way and then again to June 17, 2022 to keep it paired with its partner project, the Lies Road Bike Path, and try to minimize costs. Lies Road is experiencing delays from the CN railroad, and it was decided to move along Kuhn Road separately, allowing it to be constructed in 2022. The delayed lettings extended our contract duration, requiring additional coordination with IDOT and re-work of our plans and specs to conform to the revised lettings.

Right-of-way acquisition of two parcels along Kuhn Road in unincorporated DuPage County was complicated when IDOT questioned taking these parcels in the name of the Village, and we needed to coordinate with DuPage County to get their approval of these takes. One of the property owners was concerned about a loss of plantings, and we redesigned the path alignment, coordinated with ComEd to remove a power pole and re-configure the service arrangement, and were successful in settlement.

In review of our pre-final PS&E, IDOT made comments about the excessive slopes on the on-street crosswalks between sidewalk ramps not meeting ADA. We weighed the approach of requesting "Maximum Extent Practical (MEP)" approvals versus re-working the elevations and slope, and we decided the MEP approach was too risky for the intended letting. With the help of the Village allowing larger patching quantities, we were able to make these revisions.

This project suffers from being relatively small with a lower construction cost yet requiring all the design elements and IDOT coordination of any other project. The design fee on Lies Road, for example, is proportionally lower, since the path length is 40% longer than the Kuhn Road project.

We appreciate your consideration and are available to discuss this request further.

Project - Change Order No. 1

On September 6, 2021, the Village Board awarded the referenced project to Scanlon Excavating and Concrete, Inc. in the amount of \$164,830.00.

After the project was awarded Engineering and Public Works staff found five (5) additional drainage structures that were creating hazardous sink holes in the roadway and in need of immediate repair. The total value of the additional repairs along with final measured quantities is \$28,112.80.

Additionally, two pay items that were not included in the contract became a necessary part of the project. Unit pricing for Detectable Warnings at a cost of \$35.00 per Square Yard and unit pricing for Sidewalk Removal with Landscape Restoration at a cost of \$5.00 per Square yard is also included as part of Change Order No. 1. These unit prices are typical values that we have seen in other contracts with similar work. The total cost for this additional work is \$1,915.00.

The budget for the project is \$195,000.00, comprised of \$145,000.00 in funds budgeted for the Roadway Drainage Improvements along with \$50,000.00 budgeted for Public Detention Rehabilitation. The revised contract value including Change Order No. 1 will be \$194,857.80, under the budget by \$142.20.

Staff recommends approval of Change Order No. 1 in the amount of \$30,027.80. for the 2021 Drainage Improvements Project.

Alcohol Concession Agreement-2022 Summer Concert Series

Attached for your review and consideration is an updated agreement between the Village and Carol Stream Rotary Club for the sale of beer, wine, hard seltzer, and hard cranberry lemonade at the upcoming 2022 Summer Concert Series at the Town Center. The Rotary Club has been licensed to sell alcohol at the Summer Concert Series for the last six years excluding concerts affected by Pandemic Mitigations. The Rotary Club has sold alcohol without incident during this time period. Other than some minor updating, the agreement is unchanged from 2019.

The Rotary Club raised over \$8,100 at the 2019 Summer Concert Series. This money has been allocated for local community projects, such as Christmas Sharing, local food pantries, Glenbard North Post Prom, college scholarships for Carol Stream residents, the Humanitarian Service Project, and the like. The agreement for 2022 contemplates continued community support from proceeds.

Staff recommends approval of the agreement.

VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM AND CAROL STREAM ROTARY CLUB SUMMER CONCERT SERIES AGREEMENT

This agreement is by and between the Village of Carol Stream (the Village) and the Carol Stream Rotary Club (Rotary).

- A. The Village intends to host an event known as the "Summer Concert Series" from June 16, 2022 through July 28, 2022 at the Ross Ferraro Town Center. The Village desires to allow the sale of alcoholic beverages in the form of Beer, Wine, Hard Cranberry Lemonade, and Hard Seltzer for the Thursday Night Concerts as part of the Summer Concert Series.
- B. Rotary has provided volunteer services dispensing beer, wine and alcohol coolers capably for the past six summer concert series excluding those affected by Pandemic Mitigations. Further, Rotary donates proceeds of beverage sales to charitable causes in the Village.
- C. Rotary desires to provide volunteer services for the Village in connection with its 2022 Summer Concert Series and the Village desires that Rotary provide its volunteer services to purchase, sell and dispense beer, wine, and hard lemonade for the Village's 2022 summer concerts.
- D. The parties wish to document in writing their respective duties and obligations in connection with alcoholic beverage sales for the 2022 concert series.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the Terms and conditions of this Agreement, and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated by reference and made a part of this Agreement.
- 2. Patrons will not be allowed to leave the Town Center Concert area with beer, wine, hard cranberry lemonade, or hard seltzer including areas outside of the concert music area, in the parking lot, in vehicles or on any street within the Village of Carol Stream.
- 3. Rotary shall apply for and obtain a local liquor license for alcoholic beverage sales. This is required for Rotary to obtain its license from the State for serving beer, wine, hard lemonade, and hard seltzer at the event. Rotary needs the local liquor license at least one month in advance of the event in order to obtain the State license.
- 4. Rotary shall contract for and obtain the products to be sold at the concert events. The products shall be beer, wine, hard seltzer, and hard cranberry lemonade. All products shall be dispensed to patrons in aluminum bottles/cans and sold to patrons for \$5.00 each for a 16 oz. beer, 6 oz. plastic bottles of wine, or a 12 oz. 14 oz. hard cranberry lemonade. In lieu of a per person drink limit, Rotary Club Members assigned to serve will be required to diligently look for signs of intoxication and to deny service to those patrons.
- 5. Rotary shall obtain liquor liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 insuring both the Village and Rotary for alcoholic beverage sales. The Village, its

officers, agents and employees shall be listed as an insured on a primary and non-contributory basis. Rotary shall provide the Village with a copy of the certificate of insurance, additional insured endorsement and State of Illinois Liquor Control Commission Special Event License prior to the 2022 concert events.

- 6. The hours for the Beer Garden shall be determined by the Village, in its sole discretion. Hours for sale of alcoholic beverages shall be from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on the following concert nights (including a possible rain date to be determined):
 - Thursday June 16, 2022
 - Thursday June 23, 2022
 - Thursday July 7, 2022
 - Thursday July 14, 2022
 - Thursday July 21, 2022
 - Thursday July 28, 2022
 - To Be Determined Rain Date
- 7. The Village shall provide security for the Town Center area where alcoholic beverages are sold and stored during the events. This shall specifically include a secure storage location for alcoholic beverages used at the Town Center. The Village shall provide tables and chairs for Rotary use while selling and dispensing alcoholic beverages. The Village shall provide ice and/or refrigerated storage for Rotary use to cool alcoholic beverage products.
- 8. Rotary shall be responsible for selling alcoholic beverages only as described above, for complying with all State of Illinois and Village of Carol Stream regulations regarding the sale of alcoholic beverages and for checking the identification and dispensing the products to patrons of legal drinking age. All Rotary volunteers selling or serving alcoholic beverages shall be Basset trained. The Rotary Club shall be responsible for checking the ages of patrons seeking to be served products to determine that they are of legal age and affixing wristbands to those of legal age. Rotary shall sell and serve products only to those patrons wearing wristbands.
- 9. The Village shall be responsible for clean-up of the Town Center concert area, including cleaning tables, restrooms and removing trash. Rotary shall be responsible for maintaining/cleaning their alcoholic beverage sales area and removal/storage of coolers, tables, chairs and beverages used for the sale of their product.
- 10. Rotary shall be responsible for providing sufficient and appropriate staffing to dispense the products to the patrons during the hours specified above.
- 11. Rotary agrees to use proceeds from the sale of alcoholic beverages at the Summer Concert Series to support charitable endeavors within the Village of Carol Stream.
 - 12 Either party may terminate this agreement upon 14 days written notice.

REQUEST TO PURCHASE – VEHICLES

BACKGROUND

Together with the Public Works and Finance Departments, we maintain a replacement schedule for vehicles within the Police Department. Unfortunately, we have been experiencing delays and canceled orders for vehicles due to supply chain problems. Recently, the Village Board approved a "pre-order" for several patrol vehicles in an effort to lock in a purchase with a dealership when the vehicles arrived. Within two weeks of the Board's approval, we were contacted by the dealership who reported that the manufacturer had shut down production and the order would not be fulfilled. This has turned out to be true for Dodge and Ford – the manufacturers of patrol vehicles.

In each of the FY22 and FY23 budgets, we have an administrative vehicle scheduled for replacement. Additionally and in anticipation of on-going difficulty procuring patrol vehicles, we're preparing to transfer a "patrol purpose" vehicle currently being used in administration to patrol and replace it with an administrative vehicle.

SUBJECT

Due to the shortage of cars available as part of state purchasing contracts, we located three low-mileage, used cars that will suit our needs at Joe Cotton Ford. Additionally, this will assist us in making another car available for patrol use. Knowing that Cotton could not hold these cars until the next Village Board meeting, the Village Manager consulted with the Board to propose the purchase of three used cars to be used for administrative purposes. Trustees expressed support for the purchase of three cars from Joe Cotton Ford. Those vehicles are described as:

- 2020 Ford Escape Hybrid, 19,650 miles, \$31,820
- 2020 Chevrolet Equinox, 13,200 miles, \$28,890
- 2020 Ford Explorer, 17,740 miles, \$42,890

With approval from Village Trustees, these vehicles were purchased and delivered on March 9, 2022.

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend this information be forwarded to the Village Board and request that the Board retroactively approve the sole source purchase of three cars from Joe Cotton Ford in Carol Stream for a total amount, inclusive of dealer fees, of \$105595.72. Inclusive of fees, the figures for each vehicle are below. These cars are funded in the vehicle replacement fund.

We are continuing to explore options to procure patrol vehicles; however, I expect long delays.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT - FGM ARCHITECTS

BACKGROUND

The FY23 police department budget proposal includes a plan to reconfigure space within the police department to address issues related to operational inefficiencies. With assistance from an architect, we have developed ideas which will improve upon the location of the interview rooms, better utilize space in the Investigations Section, eliminate cubicles in a hallway, and reduce disruption caused by the current design.

SUBJECT

In anticipation of this project, it was determined that we could likely extend a contract for architectural services in the current fiscal year, and be ready to bid the project at the start of FY23. Of course, this assumes that the project is approved.

We have a proposal from FGM Architects for architectural services; specifically for design and the production of construction documents. FGM is the firm used by the Village for design services related to the build-out of the training room/emergency operations center last year. They were the most responsible bidder for that project, and we were pleased with their work. Their proposal for this project is only slightly more than for the training room, and this project is more complex.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Village enter into a contract with FGM Architects in the amount of \$39,400 for design and construction documents. Additionally and similar to the training room project, it is recommended that we allow a not to exceed amount of \$25,000 for services related to bidding and construction administration on this project. Funding for this contract would be expensed to the capital improvements fund.

1.0 SCOPE OF PROJECT

The Village of Carol Stream, also referred to as the Owner, would like to renovate several areas on the first floor of the police station to increase functionality and better separate victims from suspects. The renovations would provide better workspace for investigations, crime prevention, traffic, and administrative support. Furthermore, victim and suspect interview rooms will be spatially separated to ensure to inadvertent contact between parties is avoided. The scope of the project includes interior finishes and modifying HVAC and electrical work to accommodate the renovations. See the attached Conceptual Floor Plan, revised February 1, 2022.

FGMA also understands that the Owner will be acting as the construction manager for the project and will be soliciting bids and overseeing the construction.

2.0 SCOPE OF ARCHITECT'S SERVICES

FGM Architects Inc., hereinafter referred to as FGMA or Architect, shall provide the following Architectural Services for the Project:

- .4 Hazardous Material Remediation (asbestos, lead, etc.).
- 2.3 Consultants: FGM has included the services of W-T Engineering for HVAC, electrical, and fire protection engineering.

3.0 ARCHITECT'S COMPENSATION

The Owner shall compensate FGM Architects for professional Architectural services rendered in connection with the Project under this Proposal as follows:

3.1 For all professional services in connection with Architectural Design and Construction Document Services as described in Paragraph 2.0 above, we propose the following fee:

Design and Construction Documents - Lump Sum Fee of \$39,400.00

Bidding and Construction Administration – at an hourly rate. We suggest that the Village of Carol Stream allow an amount of \$25,000.00 for these services which FGMA will not exceed without prior authorization in writing.

3.2 Reimbursable Expenses

In addition to the compensation above, FGM shall be reimbursed for additional expenses in connection with the Project, invoiced to the Owner at One Hundred Ten Percent (1.10) times Architect's actual direct cost of same, for the below items. We recommend establishing a Reimbursable Allowance of \$500, which FGM shall not exceed without prior written approval of the Owner. Reimbursable Allowance includes costs for items below.

- 3.2.1 Expense of postage and/or delivery.
- 3.2.2 Expenses of any specialty consultants with Owner's prior approval.
- 3.2.3 Expense of Contract Document printing for permit submittal.
- 3.2.4 Any fees paid by FGM to authorities having jurisdiction over the project with Owner's prior approval.

Local travel (travel less than 100 miles), phone, fax, and printing of review sets shall not be charged as a Reimbursable Expense.

- 3.3 If specialty consultants are required, FGM shall be reimbursed for consultant expenses in connection with the Project, invoiced to the Owner at One Hundred Ten Percent (1.10) times Architect's actual direct cost of same.
- 3.4 Payments shall be made by the Owner to FGM upon receipt of FGM's invoice in accordance with the Local Government Prompt Payment Act.
- 3.5 Non-payment of invoices shall constitute grounds for discontinuing service.
- 3.6 The terms of this Proposal are based upon services commencing within 30 days and all services being

completed within two months thereafter.

4.0 Form of Agreement

Upon review and approval of this proposal, FGM and the Village of Carol Stream shall enter into a Contract using AIA Form of Agreement or similar as mutually acceptable, for the services outlined in this proposal. Due to the limited scope of work for this project, we suggest using AIA Document B104 Standard Abbreviated Form of Agreement Between Owner and Architect that was utilized for the Public Works Entry Renovation Project.

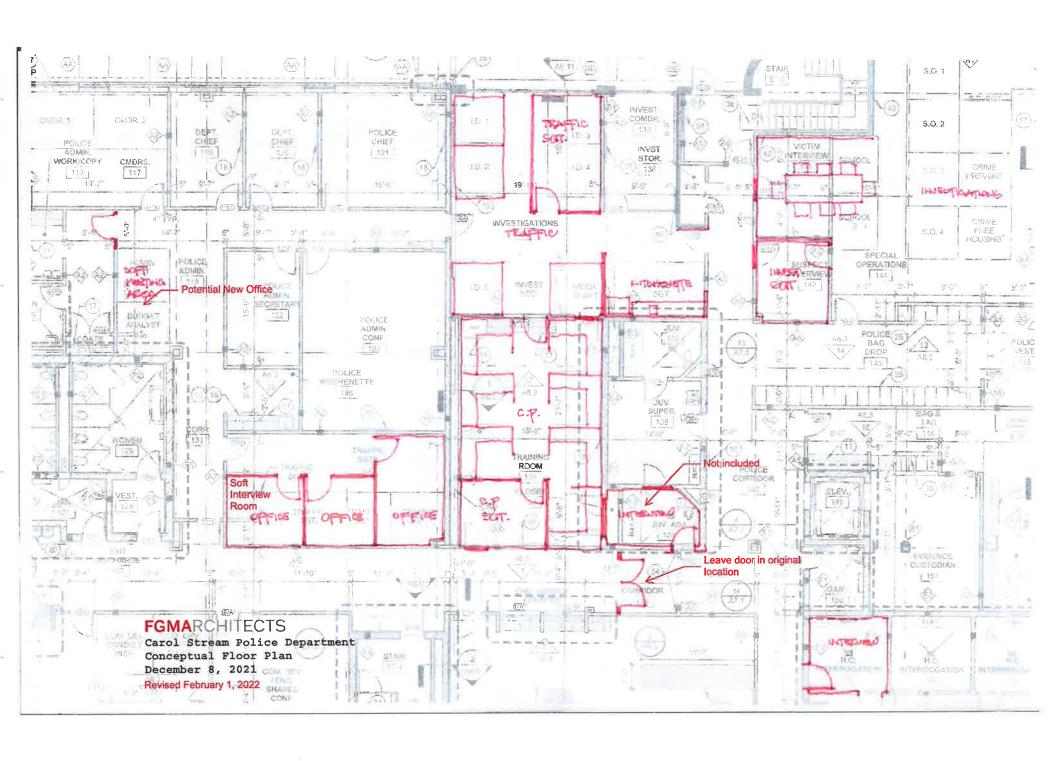

Ordinance 2021-08-33, adopted by the Village Board on August 2, 2021, approved miscellaneous modifications to the UDO, including minor word changes to the fence regulations in Article 5 (Development Standards) of the UDO. Specifically, the modification revised language regarding fences in exterior side yards abutting major streets as defined within the UDO (roads such as Army Trail Road, County Farm Road, Kuhn Road, Fair Oaks Road, and Lies Road).

In the packet for the August 2, 2021 meeting, the Village Board received two ordinances – a "redlined" version illustrating all proposed changes, and a "clean" copy of the ordinance which presented all proposed changes in their final form. Additional words were inadvertently removed from the "clean" copy of the ordinance, which was subsequently approved.

The incorrect language in $\S 16-5-8(D)(2)(b)(II)$ approved in August 2021 reads as follows: Fences in exterior sides yards abutting a street and shall meet material and design requirements of $\S 16-5-8(D)(3)(c)$ and (D)(3)(d).

The corrected language for § 16-5-8(D)(2)(b)(II) is as follows: Fences in exterior side yards abutting a major street as set forth in § 16-5-2(F)(2)(d) shall meet the material and design requirements of § 16-5-8(D)(3)(c) and (D)(3)(d).

In consultation with the Village Attorney, these typographical errors can be corrected through a scrivener's error ordinance, which is attached. If the Village Board concurs with correcting the typographical changes, they should approve and adopt the necessary Ordinance.

Fences in exterior sides yards abutting a major street as set forth in § 16-5-2 (F)(2)(d) and shall meet the material and design requirements of § 16-5-8(D)(3)(c) and (D)(3)(d).

SECTION 2: Those sections, paragraphs and provisions of Chapter 16 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances which are not expressly amended or repealed by this Ordinance are hereby re-enacted, and it is expressly declared to be the intention of this Ordinance not to repeal or amend any portion of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances other than those expressly amended or repealed in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

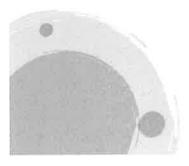
