The Village Board formally approved the purchase of eight (8) Ford Police Utility Vehicles as part of the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative contract for a total cost of \$307,280.

Professional Services Contract for Police Department Interior Renovations:

The Village Board approved a Professional Services Contract with FGM Architects in the amount of \$39,400 for design and construction documents and not to exceed \$25,000 for services related to bidding and construction administration on the Police Department Interior Renovations Project.

Ordinance No. 2022-04-17 amending Section 13-3-13 of the Village Code pertaining to Water and Sewer Rates:

The Village Board approved increasing the standard billing rate for water services from \$8.38 to \$8.69 per 1,000 gallons metered and the standard billing rate for sewer services from \$4.66 to \$4.90 per 1,000 gallons of metered water use effective May 1,2022.

The Village Board approved an Illinois Department of Transportation Preliminary Engineering Services Agreement Supplement #1 for Federal Participation with regard to the Fair Oaks Safety Improvements Project from Judith Lane to Riviera Court in the amount of \$13,866.00.

Raffle License Application – Carl Sandburg Elementary School PTA:

The Village Board approved a raffle license and waived the fee and manager's fidelity bond for their Trivia Night fundraiser and 50/50 raffle to be held at the American Legion Post 76 on May 7, 2022.

Regular Bills and Addendum Warrant of Bills:

The Village Board approved payment of Regular Bills dated April 4, 2022 in the amount of \$631,418.95. The Village Board approved the payment of Addendum Warrant of Bills from March 22, 2022 thru April 4, 2022 in the amount of \$665,069.05.

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

Trustee Garvey welcomed Assistant Director of Public Works Brad Fink and stated that he looks forward to working with him.

Trustee Berger welcomed aboard Assistant Director of Public Works Fink, and thanked the members of the Sikh community who came out for tonight's meeting and shared an overview of their culture and religion.

Trustee Zalak welcomed Assistant Director of Public Works Fink; announced the Wayne Township Electronics Recycling Program April 23rd from 9-11am; reported that April is Distracted Driving Month, with Chief Holmer confirming that Carol Stream officers are out this month focusing enforcement efforts on distracted driving violations; reminded the public that the Rotary Club Community Food Drive is continuing until April 23rd; wished the White Sox a very good year; and asked that we keep the military and first responders in our thoughts and prayers.

Trustee Gieser welcomed aboard Assistant Director of Public Works Fink and thanked him for choosing Carol Stream; gave details on the Independence Day parade and fireworks on July 2^{nd} ; and reported that parade fundraisers will be coming up and announced in meetings and on social media.

Trustee Frusolone welcomed Assistant Director of Public Works Fink; thanked the Sikh community members for attending tonight's meeting and giving us more knowledge of their culture and beliefs; reported April as Autism Awareness Month with a shout-out to her autistic nephew who has made some amazing accomplishments; and wished everyone a happy spring.

Village Clerk Schwarze welcomed aboard Assistant Director of Public Works Fink; congratulated Mr. Mago and his community on the Sikh Awareness Month Proclamation; reported April as Earth Day month with environmental opportunities such as a free Rain Barrel Webinar on April 9th, bike trails cleanup on April 23rd and Pond and Stream Sweep on May 21st; warned of coyote spottings on nearby trails and in backyards; and reminded residents to shop and dine in Carol Stream.

Assistant to the Village Manager Messino reported April being National Child Abuse Prevention Month. She encouraged the public to call the DCFS Hotline for any suspected child abuse and to please reach out to our Carol Stream Social Services Department who are here to help.

Village Attorney Rhodes welcomed Assistant Director of Public Works Fink and reported on two pieces of proposed legislation impacting Carol Stream: HB4169 which would increase the LGDF to 8% and raise our municipal revenues, and SB2298 concerning TIF which would limit municipal economic development opportunities. He shared that the IML encourages Board Members to personally call their legislators concerning both pieces of legislation within five days.

Village Manager Mellor thanked the Village Board for their commitment and comments concerning the FY23 proposed budget; confirmed that the draft budget is now available for review, a public hearing notice will be published in the April 6th Examiner, and the public hearing and final budget adoption will be included in the April 18th Board Meeting agenda; announced seasonal code enforcements focusing on parking lot pavement and fences in disrepair; reported that most permit applications and payments are now available online; announced that concrete work is about to begin in industrial areas; and reminded motorists to be extra cautious driving in these construction zones.

Mayor Pro Tem McCarthy welcomed Assistant Director of Public Works Fink; thanked the Sikh community for coming out tonight and sharing their culture and beliefs; reminded motorists to slow down and watch for kids playing in and near streets; reminded dog owners to clean up after their pets; and asked that residents help clear out stormwater drains that appear clogged.

At 6:39 p.m., Trustee Garvey moved and Trustee Frusolone made the second to adjourn the meeting to Executive Session to discuss deliberations concerning salary schedules for one or more classes of employees pursuant to 5/ILCS 120/2(c)(2), then to adjourn directly from Executive Session. Section 2-3-6 of the Village Code addresses the process for bad debt write-off and authorizes the administrative approval by the Village Manager for any uncollectible items that total less than \$2,500 per year in the aggregate with no individual item in excess of \$500. Any items above these thresholds need to be approved through Village Board action.

As staff begins preliminary planning for the audit of our financial statements for the year ending April 30, 2022, we present one item on the Village's outstanding accounts receivable listing for consideration of write-off. As this item totals \$659.00, it requires a motion of the Village Board for approval.

This receivable item relates to unreturned uniform equipment by a former Community Service Technician who abruptly resigned and moved. The attached memorandum from Chief Holmer documents the department's efforts at collection of this property which have been unsuccessful.

I recommend this item be placed on an upcoming Village Board agenda for authorization to remove this item from the Village's accounts receivable.

You may recall that Vanessa Fuentes was employed by the Village as a Community Service Technician, and resigned in January of 2021 after a long leave of absence. Fuentes abruptly resigned without prior notice and stopped communicating with the department. In fact, she refused to return for what is customarily an arranged turn-in of equipment issued to employees by the department.

While much of her equipment was contained in her locker at the department, her department-issued badges and a few other items were not on site. Staff attempted to arrange for the return of this equipment; however, Fuentes reported that she did not know where the items were because she had moved and could not find them. Staff continued to call her, but she ignored phone calls. We requested that Finance create an invoice which was sent to her in hopes of pressuring her to return the items out of fear of having to pay for them. These requests were also ignored.

The badges are entered into LEADS as lost or stolen. I recommend that you consider writing off the invoice.

The Board of Trustees approved the professional services agreement with Engineering Resource Associates, Inc. (ERA) for the Phase II Engineering of Klein Creek Streambank Stabilization – Section I project on 03/01/2021 in the amount of \$135,789.00. Previously approved amendments 01 and 02 total \$6,652.80, which equates to 4.8% of the original amount.

To alleviate the flooding caused by the existing WRC bridge being too low, the streambank stabilization project will include its demolition in the contract documents. The construction of the new pedestrian bridge, however, will be incorporated into separate contract documents for the multi-use trail extension along Klein Creek to Kuhn Road. However, DuPage County Stormwater has requested that the final design for the pedestrian bridge be included in our application for a floodway permit.

The costs to prepare a General Plan and Elevation sheet for the use of permitting the pedestrian structure that will replace the existing bridge near the Water Reclamation Center is \$2,200.00. When added to the previous amendments, the total amendment cost of \$8,852.80 is 6.5% of the original agreement amount.

Therefore, staff recommends amending the professional services agreement (PO 462-643) with ERA in accordance with the Village's Purchasing Procedures Policy and Section §5-8-3 of the Village Code for the pedestrian bridge design in the not-to-exceed, cost plus fixed fee amount of \$2,200.00. No change will occur to the completion date of April 30, 2022.

Now that the design has progressed enough to be certain of their size and location, staff is requesting that ERA complete the preliminary structural design of the retaining walls for inclusion with the contract bid documents to be used by the contractor in development of the shop drawings. The costs to prepare the design and drawings is \$3,333.00.

The Carol Stream Park District is interested in improving the sled hill that is located immediately south of the "Kids World" playground in the northeast corner of Armstrong Park. This design will determine the potential costs or savings from using some or all of the excess spoils from the streambank stabilization. The costs to prepare the design and drawings is \$4,200.00 and an extension of the current contract completion date of April 30, 2022 by 31 calendar days has been requested.

When added together, the total amendment cost of \$7,533.00 is 6.6% of the original agreement amount. 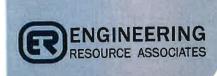

To establish market level with regard to compensation, comparable communities are asked for the minimum and maximum salary for all position classifications similar to those of the Village of Carol Stream¹. All comparable data is evaluated for position similarity, and then assessed for accuracy. Upon completion of this process, formulas are applied to calculate both the market average (50th percentile) and the market upper one-third level (66% percentile) of maximum salaries by position classification. The current maximum salary for each Village of Carol Stream position classification is then evaluated against the preferred average to upper one-third level range. From our maximum salaries, a mathematical formula is applied to determine the minimum salary resulting in a pay range spread of 29.75%. A general review of comparable minimums is then performed to ensure a competitive starting salary.

Comparable communities are then asked for their anticipated or actual general wage adjustment (GWA) for the upcoming year. This information, along with internal union settlements, the consumer price index (CPI) and the employment cost index (ECI) are analyzed, and a GWA recommendation is made.

¹ For the purpose of this report, data was collected as of January 2022.

In addition, communities are asked for salary data related to performance-based increases. Each community's data is calculated, to determine the average maximum adjustment for performance. This average, along with all other budgetary factors is used to prepare a recommendation in this area.

Finally, the core benefits including holidays, personal days and vacation are analyzed to ensure continued comparability.

Findings and Recommendations

Pay Ranges

This year, Village of Carol Stream positions with range maximums that fell below the average or above the upper one-third level include:

Administrative Secretary (below 0.1%) Administrative Supervisor (below 4.15%) Assistant Finance Director (below 0.65%) Code Professional I (below 0.04%) Code Professional II (above 0.77%) Code Professional III (above 0.58%) Commander (above 0.08%)

Community Development Director (above 0.09%)

Community Service Tech (above 2.33%) Engineering Technician (above 0.72%) IT Technician (above 2.45%) Management Analyst (above 1.17%)

Public Works Supervisor (above 0.34%)

Records Clerk (above 0.67%)

Training Coordinator (below 0.49%)

With the exception of Administrative Supervisor, the differences noted were determined to be within an acceptable margin of variation. Minor variations from year to year are commonplace and caused by a variety of factors including comparable communities undergoing compensation studies, adding or eliminating positions, collective bargaining status of those positions that may be unionized elsewhere, as well as variations in the general wage adjustments provided between communities.

With regard to the position of Administrative Supervisor, given the difference in compensation beyond that of a standard general wage adjustment, it is recommended to adjust this range by 4.15%. No employees would be impacted by this recommendation as the employee within this position is sufficiently above the minimum salary.

Compensation

General Wage Adjustment

There are multiple factors used in evaluating the general wage adjustment recommendation, including adjustments provided by comparable communities, union settlements, the Consumer Price Index (CPI), and the Employment Cost Index (ECI). A synopsis of this year's data is listed below:

- The average general wage adjustment anticipated by our comparable communities is 2.4% when eliminating those that do not provide a general wage adjustment at all.
- Settled Carol Stream union contracts for May 1, 2022 with the FOP and MAP provide for a 3% general wage adjustment.
- The Consumer Price index for 2021 was 6.6%.
- The Employment Cost Index for 2021 was 2.7%.

Taking all factors into account, it is recommended that a 3% general wage adjustment be provided for all non-union positions. This recommendation allows for internal equity, reducing the likelihood of disparity between positions with similar skill levels, as well as compression

issues of supervisors with union employees. Total cost for this recommendation is estimated at \$198,000.

Merit Performance Adjustment

A survey of comparable communities confirmed that all provide performance based compensation increases (regular or step), with an average possible maximum increase of 4.2%. Internal comparability continues to allow for performance based step increases in both the Fraternal Order of Police and Metropolitan Alliance of Police union groups, with the SEIU group connected to the non-union system.

Based on the above findings, funding of a merit increase of 2.75% is recommended for FY23. This recommendation reflects the uptick in overall compensation offerings of the comparable market as well as the current inflationary environment. As with any merit system, this adjustment would be contingent upon a performance evaluation that meets standard expectations. Employees at the top of their pay range will receive this adjustment as a one-time non-recurring lump sum payment not to be made part of base compensation. Total cost for this recommendation is estimated at \$148,000².

Overall Budgetary Impact

The cost of all recommendations within this report have been budgeted and reflect 1.1% of the total general fund.

New Positions

There are six (6) new classifications that have been proposed in this year's budget. Based on an evaluation of the comparable market, the salary ranges for these positions are recommended as follows:

Administrative Intern (PT): \$22,500

Facilities Technician: \$54,409.57 - \$77,451.34

Planning Technician (PT): \$28.25 - \$40.21

Systems Administrator: \$78,088.19 - \$111,157.56 Arborist: Subject to Bargaining

Water Plant Operator: Subject to Bargaining

Title Changes

Garage Supervisor to Fleet and Facilities Supervisor

Although the Garage Supervisor has historically been involved in the oversight of facilities within the Public Works Department, technically there is no titled manager responsible for this work. With the recent change in structure within the Public Works Department to include an Assistant Public Works Director as well as a Facilities Technician, it has been determined that the current functions of Garage Supervisor will include the oversight of facilities. A title change

² Total cost estimate for the merit component includes SEIU employees as this bargaining unit receives the same merit increase opportunity as non-union employees.

only is recommended, given this new determination. This recommendation would not result in any change in compensation.

Benefits

As in the past, comparable communities were also asked for a description of key benefits including holidays, personal days, and vacation. Research continues to indicate that the Village maintains general comparability in these areas, however; there does appear to be a slight increase in personal days/floating holidays amongst our peers. While no recommendations are being made in this area, this will be something to monitor.

SECTION 3: All Village employees actively employed on 5/1/22 who are not represented by a labor organization will receive a 3% wage adjustment to their current salary effective 5/1/22 through 4/30/23.

SECTION 4: That the performance based compensation program for non-union employees will be funded at 2.75% effective 5/1/22 through 4/30/23.

SECTION 5: That the positions of Administrative Intern (PT), Arborist, Facilities

Technician, Planning Technician (PT), Systems Administrator and Water Plant

Operator will be established effective 5/1/22.

SECTION 6: That the position of Garage Supervisor will be retitled as Fleet and

Facilities Supervisor effective 5/1/22.

Water Quality Improvement Program (WQIP) grant funding for Klein Creek Streambank Stabilization – Section I Project

The Village's FY2022/23 budget for the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) includes \$3,180,000 for the subject project, which will stabilize the streambanks of Klein Creek between Thunderbird Trail and Kuhn Road. Due to various grants received, the project has been split into two parts: Section I-A from Kuhn Road to the WRC outfall and Section I-B from the WRC outfall to Thunderbird Trail.

Construction of Section I-A is being funded by the DuPage River Salt Creek Workgroup (DRSCW) up to a not-to-exceed amount of \$1,100,000 per the grant agreement in Resolution R-3234.

Construction of Section I-B is being partially funded by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's (IEPA) 319h grant of up to 50% with a not-to-exceed amount of \$500,000 per the grant agreement in Resolution R-3170 (Total award was \$1,000,000, but will be split 50/50 with Section III).

Earlier this year staff applied for \$100,000 for Section I-B from the DuPage County 2022 Water Quality Improvement Grant (WQIG) program. The County instead awarded \$125,000 for construction on a reimbursable basis.

The enclosed IGA establishes certain design features, milestone dates, and payment terms that are a condition of the grant. The design features are consistent with the design and intent of our grant agreement with the IEPA.

Except for some minor revisions, the language is substantially the same as the grant agreement passed by Resolution No. 3134 for the WQIP grant awarded to the Kehoe Boulevard Streambank Stabilization project. Therefore, staff recommends that the Village Board authorize the execution of the enclosed grant agreement, subject to Village Attorney approval.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF DUPAGE, ILLINOIS AND THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM FOR THE KLEIN CREEK STREAMBANK STABILIZATION PROJECT

This INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT is made this 10th day of May 2022 between the COUNTY OF DUPAGE, a body politic and corporate, with offices at 421 N. County Farm Road, Wheaton, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY) and VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, a body politic and corporate, with offices at 500 North Gary Avenue, Carol Stream, Illinois 60188 (hereinafter referred to as the VILLAGE).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COUNTY are public agencies within the meaning of the Illinois "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act" and as authorized by Article 7, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the purposes of the "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act" and Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois include fostering cooperation among government bodies; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly has granted the COUNTY authority to take action to manage stormwater and control flooding and to enter into agreements for the purposes of stormwater management and flood control (Illinois Compiled Statutes, Chapter 55 paragraphs 5/5-1062.3 and 5/5-15001 et. seq.); and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has adopted the DuPage County Stormwater Management Plan which recognizes the reduction of stormwater runoff and improving water quality as an integral part of the proper management of storm and flood waters; and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE has developed a conceptual design report for the design, construction, and maintenance of streambank stabilization practices installed on a segment of Klein Creek through Carol Stream (herein referred to as the "PROJECT"); and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the VILLAGE have determined that the construction of the PROJECT will benefit local citizens by improving the water quality in Klein Creek, a tributary to the West Branch DuPage River; and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE has requested COUNTY participation in cost sharing of the PROJECT through a grant from the COUNTY'S Water Quality Improvement Program in an amount not to exceed one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000); and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE shall pay PROJECT expenses to the contractors as they become due and will be reimbursed by the County for qualified expenses per this

AGREEMENT; and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE shall share any available data collected from the PROJECT for the purposes of fostering community education and improving upon similar future projects; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, the mutual covenants, terms, and conditions herein set forth, and the understandings of each party to the other, the parties do hereby mutually covenant, promise and agree as follows:

1.0 INCORPORATION AND CONSTRUCTION.

- 1.1 All recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, the same constituting the factual basis for this AGREEMENT.
- 1.2 The headings of the paragraphs and subparagraphs of this AGREEMENT are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not be deemed to constitute part of this AGREEMENT or to affect the construction hereof.

2.0 PROJECT DESCRIPTION.

- 2.1 The PROJECT involves the installation of streambank stabilization practices along 1,697 linear feet of Klein Creek between Thunderbird Trail and the Water Reclamation Center's outfall (aka Section I-B). The improvements include regrading slopes, creating meanders, installation of rock riffle substrate, wetland restoration, and native plantings. The goal of the VILLAGE is to reduce pollutant loadings associated with eroding streambanks into the Klein Creek and the West Branch DuPage River watershed.
- 2.2 The PROJECT shall be developed essentially in accord with the conceptual design report (Klein Creek Streambank Stabilization- Section I), as prepared by the VILLAGE and dated January 7, 2022, which document is incorporated herein by reference but is not attached hereto due to space limitations. The best management practices shall be maintained and monitored by the VILLAGE or its consultant.

3.0 FUNDING.

3.1 The total water quality related PROJECT costs are estimated to be one million nine hundred thirty-nine thousand four hundred seventeen dollars and twenty

cents (\$1,939,417.20). The cost share is as follows, unless otherwise agreed to in writing as provided in Paragraph 3.2 below:

VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM	\$1,814,417.20
COUNTY OF DUPAGE	\$ 125,000.00
TOTAL	\$1,939,417.20

- 3.2 The VILLAGE shall be responsible for bearing any cost overruns or expenses in excess of the funding listed in Paragraph 3.1, regardless of the cause, unless the VILLAGE and COUNTY agree to apportion such extra costs before they are incurred.
- This AGREEMENT shall in no way obligate the VILLAGE to undertake this PROJECT if the VILLAGE in its sole discretion determines that it is no longer in the VILLAGE'S best interest to proceed with this PROJECT. However, in the event the PROJECT is not substantially completed by November 30, 2023, the VILLAGE shall promptly reimburse the COUNTY any monies paid by the COUNTY to the VILLAGE pursuant to this AGREEMENT. The VILLAGE'S right to retain the COUNTY'S reimbursement of PROJECT costs is expressly conditioned upon the VILLAGE'S timely and satisfactory completion of the PROJECT.
- 3.4 The VILLAGE may only seek COUNTY reimbursement for allowable PROJECT expenses. Allowable PROJECT expenses incurred and paid by the VILLAGE in relation to the PROJECT shall include third-party professional services related to the construction of the PROJECT (construction management, etc.), construction (labor and materials), bid advertising, etc. Notwithstanding the foregoing, allowable expenses shall not include the VILLAGE'S administrative costs, overhead, payroll, land acquisition, legal or accounting services.

4.0 VILLAGE'S RESPONSIBILITIES.

- 4.1 The VILLAGE shall be responsible for the preparation of the plans, specifications, and bid documents for the PROJECT, together with the advertisement and award of all PROJECT-related public bids. The VILLAGE shall select, and contract with, all vendors providing professional services for the PROJECT.
- 4.2 The VILLAGE shall be responsible for successful completion of all phases of the PROJECT, from design and construction through maintenance.
- 4.3 The VILLAGE shall be responsible for securing all local, county, state, and federal permits necessary for completion of the PROJECT.

- 4.4 The VILLAGE shall be responsible for submitting copies of all permit applications and related correspondence to the COUNTY in a timely manner to ensure sufficient review by the COUNTY. The purpose of the COUNTY'S review shall be for the sole purpose of documenting whether PROJECT work components qualify as allowable expenses.
- 4.5 The VILLAGE shall be responsible for obtaining all required land rights necessary for the completion of the PROJECT.
- 4.6 The VILLAGE shall not be reimbursed by the COUNTY for work undertaken prior to the signing of this AGREEMENT.
- 4.7 The VILLAGE may enter into additional agreements to secure its portion of the local PROJECT costs.
- 4.8 The VILLAGE shall submit no more than one invoice per month to the COUNTY during the construction of the PROJECT. Under no circumstances should the COUNTY be invoiced more than one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000). The invoice shall show the quantities and cost per item and be summarized by PROJECT area.
- 4.9 The VILLAGE shall make direct payments, or cause to have payments made, to all parties providing services related to this PROJECT. This requirement will not affect the COUNTY'S obligation to reimburse the VILLAGE in the amounts herein agreed upon, nor shall this provision affect the VILLAGE'S obligation to repay the COUNTY in the event the PROJECT is not undertaken or completed, as established in Paragraph 3.3.
- 4.10 The VILLAGE shall make any data collected from the PROJECT available to the COUNTY upon reasonable request by the COUNTY.
- 4.11 The COUNTY shall not be responsible for or have control over the design, construction, means, methods, techniques or procedures with respect to any work performed for the PROJECT. The VILLAGE and VILLAGE'S contractors shall be solely responsible for the safety of all individuals performing work on the PROJECT. The VILLAGE shall take such measures as are necessary to ensure that its contractors maintain the PROJECT areas in a safe condition and install appropriate barricades and warning signs, and the VILLAGE shall strictly enforce or cause to have strictly enforced all applicable safety rules and regulations. This provision is not intended to create any new burden or liability for the VILLAGE beyond the usual burdens and liabilities for a municipality in the construction of public improvements. This section is intended merely to relieve the COUNTY from such liabilities in this PROJECT. COUNTY'S role in conducting any review or granting any consent or approval relates solely to the PROJECT'S eligibility under the COUNTY'S Water Quality Improvement Program.

4.12 The VILLAGE must acknowledge the COUNTY using logo(s) and wording provided by the COUNTY in permanent onsite signage and other promotion of the PROJECT including, but not limited to, printed materials, press releases and presentations.

5.0 **COUNTY'S RESPONSIBILITIES.**

- 5.1 The COUNTY shall reserve the right to review the PROJECT'S plans and specifications, prior to the VILLAGE'S advertisement for contract services, together with any subsequent change orders, addendums, or revisions thereto ("CONTRACT DOCUMENTS"), for the purpose of verifying that PROJECT components qualify for reimbursement through the COUNTY'S Water Quality Improvement Program. The COUNTY shall promptly provide the VILLAGE with any recommended changes to the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS for PROJECT components to qualify for reimbursement.
- 5.2 The COUNTY shall cost share in the PROJECT as follows:
 - 5.2.1 The COUNTY shall reimburse the VILLAGE for approved costs associated with the PROJECT which have been incurred and paid for by the VILLAGE, as specified in Paragraph 3.1.
 - 5.2.2 The total reimbursement amount paid by the COUNTY shall not exceed one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000).
 - In the event PROJECT costs total less than one million nine hundred thirty-nine thousand four hundred seventeen dollars and twenty cents (\$1,939,417.20), the COUNTY'S total reimbursement amount shall be not be more than twenty five percent (25%) of the actual total PROJECT costs. Any amounts overpaid by the COUNTY shall be promptly refunded by the VILLAGE.
 - 5.2.4 The COUNTY shall not be obligated to pay invoices received after November 30, 2023, regardless of when the work was completed and notwithstanding that the COUNTY'S contribution limit has not been reached.
- The COUNTY shall be allowed unlimited, but reasonable, access to the PROJECT area to observe and review PROJECT work and work documents (i.e., plans, change orders, field orders, manager diaries, etc.) for the limited purpose of determining eligibility for COUNTY reimbursement, and the use of all data collected as part of the PROJECT. The COUNTY shall provide the VILLAGE reasonable advance notice of when the COUNTY requires such access.

6.0 GOVERNMENT REGULATIONS.

The VILLAGE shall comply with all local, county, state and federal requirements now in force, or which may hereafter be in force, pertaining to the PROJECT.

7.0 INDEMNIFICATION.

- 7.1 The VILLAGE shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the COUNTY or any of its officials, officers, employees, and agents from and against all liability, claims, suits, demands, liens, proceedings and actions, including reasonable costs, fees and expense of defense, arising from, growing out of, or related to, any loss, damage, injury, death, or loss or damage to property resulting from, or connected with, the VILLAGE 'S performance under this AGREEMENT to the fullest extent the VILLAGE is so authorized under the law; provided, however, that the VILLAGE shall not be obligated to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the COUNTY for any negligent or intentional wrongful misconduct or omissions by COUNTY officials, employees, agents, contractors or personnel.
- 7.2 The VILLAGE shall require each consultant and contractor responsible for the construction of the PROJECT to name the VILLAGE and COUNTY as an additional insured party on said vendor's liability insurance policy. Further, the VILLAGE shall require that its consultants and contractors indemnify, defend and hold harmless the VILLAGE and COUNTY, its officers, employees and elected officials from and against any claims, liability or judgments resulting from, or caused by, the negligence or willful conduct of such consultant and/or contractor.
- 7.3 Nothing contained herein shall be construed as prohibiting the COUNTY, its officials, directors, officers, agents and employees, from defending through the selection and use of their own agents, attorneys and experts, any claims, suits, demands, liens, proceedings and actions brought against them. Pursuant to Illinois law, any attorney representing the COUNTY, under this paragraph or paragraph 7.1 is to be the State's Attorney, in accord with the applicable law. The COUNTY'S participation in its defense shall not remove the VILLAGE'S duty to indemnify, defend, and hold the COUNTY harmless, as set forth above. Moreover, indemnity as provided in this AGREEMENT shall not be limited by reason of any insurance coverage maintained by the VILLAGE or its consultants, contractors or agents. The VILLAGE'S indemnification of the COUNTY shall survive the termination, or expiration, of this AGREEMENT.

8.0 AMENDMENT OR MODIFICATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

- 8.1 The parties may modify or amend terms of this AGREEMENT only by a written document duly approved and executed by both parties, excluding term extensions as provided for in the following provision.
- 8.2 Notwithstanding Paragraph 8.1, above, the term for performing this AGREEMENT may be extended by any suitable COUNTY designated form, signed by both parties without formal amendment pursuant to Paragraph 8.1, above.

9.0 TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT.

- 9.1 The term of this AGREEMENT shall begin on the date the AGREEMENT is fully executed, and shall continue in full force and effect until the earlier of the following occurs:
 - 9.1.1 November 30, 2023, or to a new date agreed upon by the parties.
 - 9.1.2 The completion by the VILLAGE and COUNTY of their respective obligations under this AGREEMENT, in the event such completion occurs before November 30, 2023.

10.0 ENTIRE AGREEMENT.

- 10.1 This AGREEMENT, including matters incorporated herein, contains the entire AGREEMENT between the parties.
- There are no other covenants, warranties, representations, promises, conditions or understandings, either oral or written, other than those contained herein.
- 10.3 This AGREEMENT may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall for all purposes be deemed to be an original and all of which shall constitute the same instrument.
- 10.4 In the event of a conflict between the terms or conditions of this AGREEMENT and any term or condition found in any exhibit or attachment, the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT shall prevail.

11.0 SEVERABILITY.

11.1 In the event any provision of this AGREEMENT is held to be unenforceable or invalid for any reason, the enforceability thereof shall not affect the remainder of the AGREEMENT. The remainder of this AGREEMENT shall be construed as if not containing the particular provision and shall continue in full force, effect, and enforceability, in accordance with its terms.

12.0 GOVERNING LAW.

- 12.1 The laws of the State of Illinois shall govern this AGREEMENT as to both interpretation and performance.
- 12.2 The venue for resolving any disputes concerning the parties' respective performance, or failure to perform, under this AGREEMENT, shall be the judicial circuit court for DuPage County.

13.0 NOTICES.

13.1 Any required notice shall be sent to the following addresses and parties:

14.0 WAIVER OF/FAILURE TO ENFORCE BREACH.

14.1 The parties agree that the waiver of, or failure to enforce, any breach of this AGREEMENT by the remaining party shall not be construed, or otherwise operate, as a waiver of any future breach of this AGREEMENT. Further the failure to enforce any particular breach shall not bar or prevent the remaining party from enforcing this AGREEMENT with respect to a different breach.

15.0 NO WAIVER OF TORT IMMUNITIES

Nothing contained in any provision of this Agreement is intended to constitute nor shall constitute a waiver of the defenses, privileges or immunities available to the parties under the Illinois Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act.

As part of the development of the property located at 425 E. Geneva Road and 521 S. Schmale Road, 425 E Geneva LLC proposed to extend public watermain located on both parcels and within a twenty foot wide public watermain easement adjacent to Schmale and Geneva Roads. This watermain connects to the Village's water system at each end.

The developer has submitted the necessary paperwork including: waivers of lien and a bill of sale. Engineering and Public Works staff have inspected the items to be accepted and any deficiencies have been corrected. The Village Attorney has reviewed and approved the bill of sale.

We therefore recommend that the public improvements related to 425 E. Geneva Road and 521 S. Schmale Road, Vequity Fuel Station Development be accepted by the Village of Carol Stream and the Security for Public Improvements in the amount of \$67,545.25 be reduced to a maintenance period amount of \$6,754.53 (10%) for a period of one year.

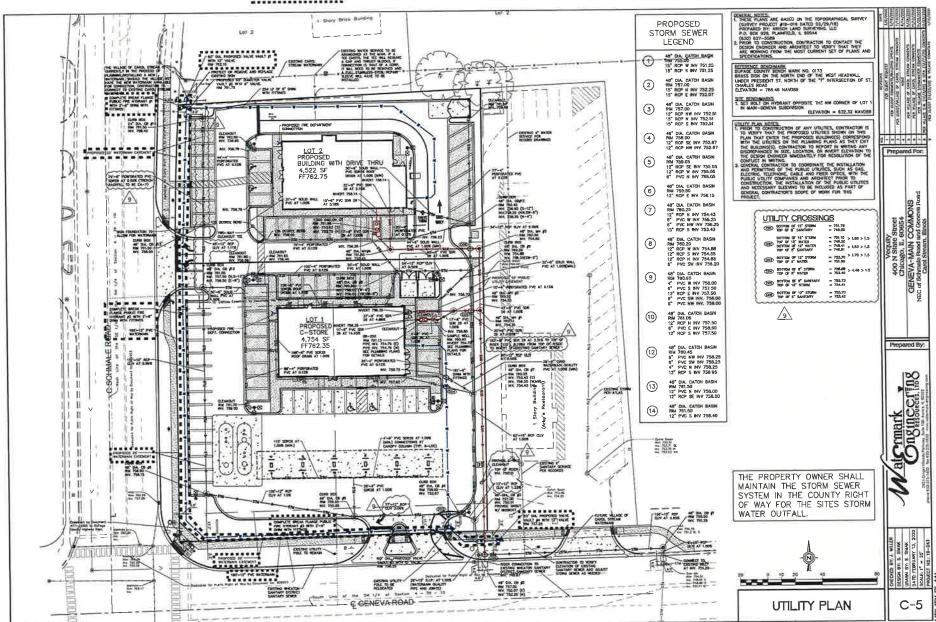

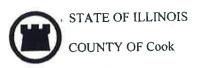

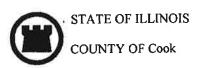

Attached for Village Board consideration is a budget amendment ordinance for our current year FY22 that will conclude on April 30, 2022.

During the year there were a few instances where expenditures have exceeded the previously approved FY22 budget that give rise to the proposed amendments:

- 1. There were a few purchases from the Federal Asset Seizure Fund during the year that were not anticipated including the procurement of mats for the Police training room and investigative computer equipment. Periodic allocations of funds received from Federal cases are restricted exclusively for law enforcement purposes and are not to be used to replace "regular" municipal funding of law enforcement activities provided in the General Fund.
- 2. Due to recent supply chain challenges in procuring vehicle replacements, a number of Police Department administrative vehicles were authorized for replacement in anticipation of some local availability.
- 3. A budget amendment is needed in the newly created American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Fund to account for grant funded expenditures supporting the October 2021 COVID-19 vaccination booster event at the Fountain View Recreation Center.
- 4. Principal payments on the developer note related to the North Avenue / Schmale Road TIF Fund were greater than originally budgeted because revenues from the TIF exceeded original projections.

If you find these proposed amendments to be in order, I would recommend this item be placed on the April 18th Village Board agenda for consideration.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM IN THE AMOUNT OF \$68,423,151 FOR THE FY22/23 FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING MAY 1, 2022, AND ENDING APRIL 30, 2023

WHEREAS, Village staff has prepared and presented to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream a proposed annual budget for the FY22/23 fiscal year beginning May 1, 2022, and ending April 30, 2023 as set forth in "Exhibit A" to this ordinance as attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, following due and proper publication of public notice in <u>The Examiner</u> of Carol Stream on April 6, 2022, a public hearing was held on April 18, 2022, to consider and receive public comment on the proposed annual budget for the FY22/23 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annual budget has been made available for public review and inspection at least 10 days prior to passage on the Village's web site, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream deem it in the best interest of the Village to adopt the budget proposed by the Budget Officer, as revised at the direction of the Mayor and Board of Trustees;

Now, Therefore, Be it Hereby Ordained by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, in the Exercise of its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

SECTION 1: The annual expenditure Budget for the FY22/23 fiscal year, beginning May 1, 2022, and ending April 30, 2023, for the Village of Carol Stream, is in the amount of Sixty Eight Million Four Hundred Twenty Three Thousand One Hundred Fifty One Dollars, (\$68,423,151); as set forth in "Exhibit A", as attached hereto, is hereby adopted and authorized.

SECTION 2: That the adoption of the foregoing annual budget shall be in lieu of the Appropriation Ordinance required in Section 8-2-9 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

SECTION 3: The budget hereby approved shall be printed and bound and a certified copy of this Ordinance and a copy of the printed and bound budget shall be filed with the DuPage County Clerk in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 4: The Finance Director is authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$4,500,000 from General Corporate Fund cash reserve balances to the Capital Projects Fund to support improvements to the Village's public infrastructure assets. This transfer is consistent with the Village's established policies and past practices with respect to reserve balances.

Attached is a request from Village Attorney, Jim Rhodes on behalf of his law firm, Klein, Thorpe and Jenkins, Ltd., for a rate increase for Village legal services. KTJ is requesting a rate increase of \$7.00/hour for legal counsel or an increase of about 3.25% over their current rate. Subject to Village Board approval, their rate for the various legal services they provide would be increased as reflected below:

In recognition of the budgetary constraints and revenue shortfalls we experienced over the past 3-years, KTJ have not proposed an increase in their fees since 2019. Staff have been satisfied with the services of Village Attorney, Jim Rhodes and the KTJ law firm over the past twelve years and they have represented the Village well providing sound legal opinions and counsel. The proposed rates for legal services are in line with the Village Attorney fees charged in other comparable municipalities and with other KTJ clients. Mayor Saverino has expressed his satisfaction with the legal services provided by the Village Attorney and his associates and is supportive the requested rate increase. Subject to Village Board concurrence, the requested rate increase would become effective on May 1, 2022.

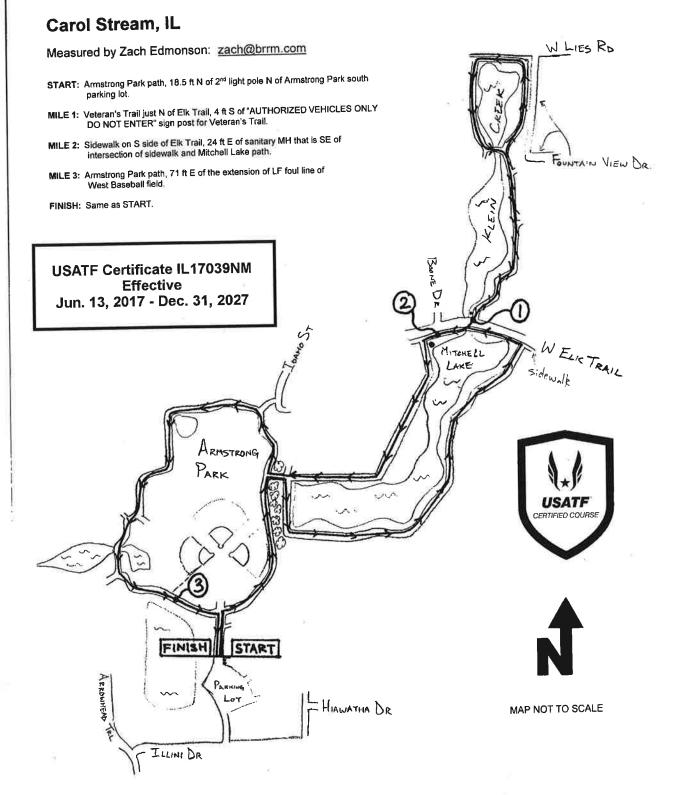
