In this case, the subject property is subject to an Operation and Easement Agreement (OEA), which contains restrictions regarding development of the property. Tyndale's purchase of the subject property is contingent upon a release from the OEA, which they are working toward but which has not yet occurred. As such, Tyndale has been unable to close on the purchase of the subject property, and requests approval of an extension of the execution date for Ordinance 2022-10-44 to May 31, 2023.

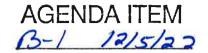

Chairman Parisi swore in Mr. Eric Carlson from ECA Architects and asked him to give his presentation.

Mr. Carlson stated he is speaking on behalf of the applicant, Mr. Rushi Shah, who is present and the owner of the Mag Mile Captial. Mr. Shah is looking to redevelop the existing office building at 400 Main Place into 18 residential units with some studio, 1, 2 and 3 bedroom apartments. The building itself will stay the same but the site will be redeveloped. A realignment of the parking will allow for additional spaces and the area along the west end of the building will be converted to parking also. The other two buildings to the west are also part of the purchase and use a shared parking lot. Reconfiguring the parking will make it more cohesive and include the middle building. We are adding some sidewalks that connect the building with the other existing building along with a gazebo area to be utilized by all three buildings. The façade and entryway will remain the same but we are adding an elevator to meet ADA requirements. We are also enhancing the lobby, adding a formalized entry on the west side and replacing the gravel on the south side with some grass per Staff's recommendation.

Chairman Parisi asked for any comments or questions from the audience and there were none.

Mr. Farace stated Mag Mile Capital is the new owner of the three buildings located on Executive Drive and Main Place. They will be repurposing the existing office building to provide 18 additional apartment units. The parking lot will be reconfigured and expanded with an additional lot on the southern end, some parking islands will be added with landscaping as well as some additional landscaping around the

building. The parking meets the necessary requirements. Staff is supportive of this request, with conditions, and is recommending approval.

Chairman Parisi asked for comments or questions from the Commission.

Commissioner Meneghini had no questions at this time.

Commissioner Morris asked what the demographics will be and if they are going to install a playground.

Mr. Carlson stated there is an existing playground.

Chairman Parisi swore in Mr. Rushi Shah so he can answer that question.

Mr. Shah stated there would be mostly families with one or two kids.

Commissioner Petella asked about the trailers in the south parking lot and asked if he planned to put trailers there. He also asked if he read the eight recommendations from Staff and was willing to comply.

Mr. Shah stated that was an old picture and he does not plan to put any trailers in that lot. He also said he is aware of the eight conditions and is willing to comply.

Commissioner Tucek asked if the trash containers could be more centrally located and had a construction concern.

Mr. Shah stated each building has a trash container nearby.

Mr. Farace said if any construction takes place by the other businesses, they would be several feet on Mr. Shah's property and they will be installing a fence on that side.

Commissioner Battisto had no questions.

Commissioner Meneghini asked Mr. Shah if he would be able to comply with the eight conditions recommended by Staff.

Mr. Shah replied yes.

Chairman Parisi asked about the comment on the site plan reading 'concrete to remain' and inquired if that was pertaining to the service drive.

Mr. Carlson stated that area had some old sidewalk and will be replaced with grass.

Commissioner Petella moved and Commissioner Tucek seconded the motion with no further discussion.

Case #22-0051 - Carol Stream Animal Hospital - 160 W. Elk Trail

Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Boarding and Kennel Facility (Indoor)

Chairman Parisi swore in Dr. Mondrian Contreras from Carol Stream Animal Hospital and asked him to give his presentation.

Dr. Contreras stated original plan did not include the outdoor training areas and just reflected grass. The three fenced in areas, approximately 20 x 30, will be used for training purposes and used about 10 percent of the time.

Chairman Parisi asked for comments or questions from the audience and Mr. Farace stated a comment was received and it should be on record.

Mr. Farace stated the comment is from Michelle and Robert Kronam, 161 W. Elk Trail. The email was titled "Fence Change for Carol Stream Central Bark". The email read: We are opposed to the fence change and outdoor use for Central Bark. Our main concern is them not being able to abate barking dogs outside in the yard. There are THREE people in this building that work nights and SLEEP during the daylight hours so ANY barking will DISTURB their rest to be able to work and perform their overnight jobs! It also will interfere with quiet enjoyment that is guaranteed under village and Illinois state law! We as the village vote NO to the proposed change and have Central Bark stick with the original plan of a wooden privacy fence with soundproof panels. Thank You for this consideration!

Dr. Contreras replied that dogs will bark, but by having the outdoor, fenced in areas we will be able to control the barking. Also, all dogs have to pass a behavioral assessment. Any dog that continually barks inside will not be allowed to remain in our facility because that dog is in distress. In addition, the average decibel of a screaming child is 90 decibels. An average decibel rating of a barking dog is 80 decibels.

Mr. Farace stated Dr. Contreras is seeking an amendment for a Special Use Permit he received last year for a kennel and boarding facility indoors. Central Bark is a franchise with two other locations in Illinois. The training area kennels are outdoor. The Lakehaven Apartment Complex is located to the south; to the north are the Carolshire Condominiums (where the Kronam's live) across the street. To the west is Park District Property where the path and Mitchell Lake is located. Staff was under the impression the dogs would be limited to indoor activity, and a wood fence was proposed on the other sections that the Park District did not repair. Now Dr. Contreras is proposing to maintain the 6-foot chain link fence, add an angled extension at the top bringing the total height to 7 feet (allowed per code) and install mesh screening on the entire fence. Each 20 x 30 fenced, training area will have 12 dogs per one employee. The rear area would be used for agility training which is one dog and one employee. In general, Staff is supportive of the proposal but would like feedback from the Commission on the following: Amount of dogs inside was projected to be 70-80 dogs. If each training area has 12 dogs that would be about half of the dog population outside and are concerned that might be excessive. Staff thought maybe the dogs outside for training could be limited. Staff is also working with Dr. Contreras on the plans regarding the utility easement on the west side of the property. Staff recommends approval but questions if there should be a limit to the number of dogs outside.

Chairman Parisi asked what the intent of the slope or angle at the top of the fence.

Dr. Contreras replied that it would not be barbed wire, but to protect the dogs if they were able to get over the first two fences.

Chairman Parisi asked for comments or questions from the Commission.

Commissioner Battisto stated there are only close neighbors (approximately 40 feet) on the rear side of the property and because of that distance, he does not have a concern. Regarding limiting the number of dogs, I really do not have a number to suggest.

Commissioner Tucek stated he does not know a number for limiting dogs, but is concerned about a dog walking on the path might bark and then trigger all the other dogs outside to bark. He also asked what the purpose of the mesh is in the fencing.

Dr. Contreras replied the fenced areas are further away from the path. Dogs will bark but it will not be excessive.

Someone in the audience wanted to speak and Chairman Parisi received approval from the Commission to allow.

Mr. Bruce Keril, partner to Dr. Contreras, stated the first nine sections of the fence to the gate, along the pond, would have a see through mesh from the parking lot to the first gate so people can see coming out of the lot. It will be a solid mesh around the whole building so you cannot see through it.

Commissioner Petella stated with 12 dogs in each training area you will have 36 dogs outside which is a lot and you're going to have barking and there is no way to stop it. I am not sure how one person can train 12 dogs at a time, but people have a legitimate concern especially right behind you. Will you always have people outside with the dogs.

Dr. Contreras responded there would always be a person in each training area and the most dogs in each area will be twelve but could have less.

Chairman Parisi asked if the number 12 was determined by the amount of space.

Dr. Contreras stated that was instituted for three years because it used to be 20. This is a franchise decision because the training is more successful with no more than 12 dogs.

Chairman Petella asked what kind of surface will be inside the three fenced areas, what he plans to do if the dogs are territorial and constantly bark which might have screaming people on the phones, and what are the hours employees will be with the dogs.

Dr. Contreras said a synthetic turf will be used and the dogs cannot be territorial at all and will not be allowed at the facility. We do not want screaming people on the phones because it is not good for business. People will be with the dogs from 6:30 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. but nobody on the premises overnight.

Chairman Parisi asked what is commonplace and compare yourself to a different franchise or provide an industry norm.

Dr. Contreras stated the model for every franchise is to get as many dogs as you can and have the largest number of dogs per person as legally possible. I do not know what that number is. The difference between us is we are teachers, not lifeguards.

Commissioner Morris asked if dogs are left overnight because the owners are on vacation and if there is an area for them to go and how often is that area cleaned.

Dr. Contreras stated there is an area and it is cleaned up multiple times per day.

Commissioner Meneghini asked what the thinking was behind going from 25 dogs to 12.

Dr. Contreras stated the reasoning behind it was we are able to interact with them better, group them better and decrease the number of injuries and sicknesses for whole health purposes.

Chairman Parisi asked if there is excessive barking and there was a recommendation for an action plan, what would be your action plan or what would you do if a repeated caller complained about the barking.

Dr. Contreras stated my action would be to have less playgroups and less dogs running outside at one time.

Chairman Parisi reiterated stating you would reduce the frequency of the playgroups outside.

Dr. Contreras said he was correct.

Commissioner Battisto stated our role as Commissioners is to zero in on the noise issue because that is what our residents would want us to do a good job of. The 2-3 yard distance from the closest resident, should be enough distance for the noise to not be a major problem.

Chairman Parisi stated the acoustics will travel separately whether it is winter or summer but landscaping would affect the sound, but I'm not going to promote landscaping because that would provide a nightmare for you. I am also not concerned with the neighbor across the way. Most of the sound will travel to the west where the pond is located. A wooden fence might help a little more, but the sound will just bounce off the fence and go up. My recommendation would be to have an understanding with Dr. Contreras that if the barking sound becomes an issue, he will be able to abate it.

Commissioner Petella moved and Commissioner Battisto seconded the motion with no further discussion.

PC/ZBA Case 22-0020, Revir Carol Stream, LLC – 400 Main Place, Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Planned Development and Shared Parking Facility Permit

Mr. Rushi Shah with Revir Carol Stream, LLC, requests approval of an Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Planned Development at 400 Main Place. Mr. Shah purchased the subject property, and the two adjacent apartment buildings to the west, in 2021. The apartment and office development was approved as a Planned Development (PD) in the 1960s, and the subject building was home to offices for The Evangelical Alliance Mission (TEAM) for several years. The office building is now vacant. Mr. Shah proposes to repurpose the office building with 18 apartments in the two-story building, with nine units per story. The subject building, along with the other two apartment buildings, will be renamed "Prairie Landing."

Along with the construction of the 18 apartments within the building, additional improvements include the reconfiguration, repaving, and expansion of the parking lot, the installation of sidewalks to connect with public sidewalks along adjacent roadways, the installation of a gazebo and illuminated pathways internal to the development, and the installation of landscaping and fencing. The repurposing of the vacant office building with apartments to blend with existing apartments on Executive Drive will provide additional residences for members of the community, and site upgrades will meet PD standards as outlined in the UDO. It should be noted that the applicant has prepared a declaration of cross and reciprocal parking easements, which allows for access between and sharing of parking spaces on the subject property at 400 Main Place, and the parking lot located at the 390 Executive Drive building to the west. The attached Special Use ordinance includes a provision approving the shared parking facility permit.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the PC/ZBA packet on November 23, 2022. At its meeting on November 28, 2022, by a vote of 6-0, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Special Use Amendment subject to the conditions in the November 28, 2022 staff report.

If the Village Board concurs with the PC/ZBA recommendation, they should approve the Amendment to the Special Use Permit for a Planned Development and Shared Parking Facility Permit for Revir Carol Stream, LLC, subject to the conditions contained within the Ordinance, and adopt the necessary Ordinance.

PC/ZBA Case 22-0051, Carol Stream Animal Hospital (Central Bark) - 160 W. Elk Trail, Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Kennel and Boarding Facility (Indoor)

Dr. Mondrian Contreras with the Carol Stream Animal Hospital requests approval of an Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Kennel and Boarding Facility (Indoor) at 160 W. Elk Trail. Dr. Contreras purchased the subject property from the Carol Stream Park District (previously used as a daycare center), to establish an indoor doggie day care and kennel/boarding facility. The subject property is adjacent to the Carol Stream Animal Hospital. Previous approvals from 2021 included a special use for a kennel and boarding facility (indoor), map amendment to rezone the subject property from R-4 to B-2, text amendment to allow an indoor kennel/boarding facility in the B-2 District as a special use, and variation to allow a fence in the front yard. Dr. Contreras is preparing to open the facility under the Central Bark franchise.

Dr. Contreras is seeking to amend the special use to allow for limited outdoor activity and modifications to fencing around the property. Limited outdoor training activity will occur in three fenced-in areas on the west side of the property, with up to 12 dogs in each fenced-in area, with one employee monitoring each fencedin area. In addition, the rear of the property will be utilized for one-on-one agility training. Fencing around the property on its west, south, and east sides is proposed to be modified, from an originally approved wood fence to keeping the existing chain link and installing a mesh material on the fence for screening purposes.

Discussion took place at the November 28, 2022 PC/ZBA meeting regarding the number of dogs proposed to be outside, and if there should be a limit on said number, along with the proposed screening modifications. It was the consensus of the PC/ZBA that there would not need to be a limit on the number of dogs outside, but stipulated that if there are noise complaints from surrounding properties from the facility, then an action plan by the applicant will need to be put in place to remedy the situation immediately. In addition, the PC/ZBA deemed the fencing with mesh material to be acceptable.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the PC/ZBA packet on November 23, 2022. At its meeting on November 28, 2022, by a vote of 6-0, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Special Use Amendment, subject to the conditions in the November 28, 2022 staff report.

If the Village Board concurs with the PC/ZBA recommendation, they should approve an Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Kennel and Boarding Facility (Indoor) for Carol Stream Animal Hospital (Central Bark), subject to the conditions contained within the Ordinance, and adopt the necessary Ordinance.

Consolidation

At the Village Board meeting on May 16, 2022, the Board concurred with the recommendations made by the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals (PC/ZBA) at its meeting on April 25, 2022, regarding the Zoning Map Amendment, Special Use Permit for a Union Hall and Training Facility, and Front Yard Building Setback Variation requests for the Chicagoland Laborers' District Council Training and Apprenticeship Fund/LiUNA at 4N210 Old Gary Avenue. The subject property was also recently annexed into Carol Stream.

LiUNA has been operating from its main facility at 1200 Old Gary Avenue since the 1990s, and has also been operating a small training facility on the 4N210 Old Gary property since it was purchased in 2020. A condition of approval of the zoning requests earlier this year was to consolidate all of the LiUNA lots into one lot. Staff from Community Development, Engineering Services and the Village Clerk's office have reviewed the plat and recommend approval of the document.

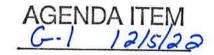

The Village Board, at its November 7, 2022 regular public meeting, discussed whether there was a desire to revisit the zoning for Adult Use, Recreational Cannabis Dispensaries (AURCDs) and expand opportunities for them in Carol Stream. There appeared to be a majority of the Board that wished to revisit AURCD zoning to expand business opportunities for this use in Carol Stream in light of the increased activity and approvals for such businesses amongst our neighbors. It was also asked whether time still permitted an advisory referendum to be placed on the April ballot.

Staff and the Village Attorney were directed to check the timeliness of an advisory referendum for the April 4, 2023 ballot, to research the zoning regulations of nearby communities having adult use, recreational cannabis dispensaries (review attached) and develop options to expand zoning for AURCDs for Board consideration (zoning change maps of various options attached). Also attached is a memo from Jim Rhodes on the procedures for placing an advisory referendum on the ballot including restrictions on involvement of municipal employees and officials and general guidelines for a ballot question.

There was also a discussion of the revenue generating potential for AURCD sales in Carol Stream at the November 7 Board meeting. Any cannabis specific tax (up to 3%) would have to be approved by ordinance and filed with the Illinois Department of Revenue prior to April 1 for IDOR to begin collections of the tax on July 1, 2023. So, in line with needed zoning changes that may delay a dispensary until the summer of 2023, this would also delay taxes that may lag with it. If the Board chooses to place a referendum on the upcoming April ballot and no tax ordinance is adopted and filed with IDOR by April 1, 2023, the next effective date of any cannabis excise tax would be January 1, 2024 (ordinance deadline for that is October 1, 2023). IDOR only implements on January 1 or July 1. Alternatively, the Board may pass an ordinance enacting a municipal cannabis tax for filing with IDOR prior to April 1, 2023, which would allow for collection of any AURCD taxes after July 1, 2023. Many municipalities had done this when the law went into effect, even though they do not currently have any AURCDs in their towns. Attached is a 2021 list showing those communities that have enacted such an ordinance.

To further update you on other, recent municipal Boards' actions on adult use, recreational cannabis dispensaries in our area, the following are noteworthy:

• A dispensary in Roselle was reviewed by their Village Board, received unanimous approval from their Plan Commission, and was approved.

- Glendale Heights, had two proposed dispensaries that were recommended for approval by their Plan Commission last month, but both were turned down by their Village Board on 11/3/22.
- The second of two allowable AURCDs was approved (6-2) in St. Charles on 11/21/22.

Staff and the Village Attorney attempted to develop a referendum question that addressed whether residents wished to expand adult use recreational cannabis dispensary zoning. This was a somewhat difficult task due to the fact that the Village already allows such a use however, very limited to one current location, and because the question must present a complex issue in simple, unambiguous language and cannot be a compound question (it is required to be answered with a simple "Yes" or "No" response). The attached advisory referendum resolution provides our suggestion of an appropriate question for voters, if the Board chooses to go this route.

Since our last meeting, there appears to be a growing interest in attracting AURCD uses by the County and neighboring municipalities. A referendum could necessarily delay location of any dispensary and imposition of associated tax revenues. Because of the limitations related to a referendum and a majority of the Board's desire to revisit adult use recreational cannabis dispensary zoning opportunities in Carol Stream, the logistics of placing this question on an advisory referendum for the April 4, 2023 ballot may run counter to the intent of a majority of the Board to provide additional opportunities for Adult Use Recreational Cannabis Dispensaries and the associated sales tax revenues they generate.

Should the Village Board wish to conduct an advisory referendum on AURCD zoning, the attached resolution would need to be approved by the Village Board on or before January 17, 2023 and certified by DuPage County on or before January 26, 2023.

If the Village Board wishes to wait to approve a municipal cannabis tax ordinance until after receiving the results of an advisory referendum on April 4, 2023, and a decision is made to expand AURCD opportunities in Carol Stream, the earliest the tax could be collected, should an AURCD be approved to locate in Carol Stream, would be on January 1, 2024.

Alternatively, if the Village Board wishes expand AURCD zoning and have the Plan Commission review zoning changes for AURCD's, staff would prepare a report for Plan Commission consideration based on input from the Village Board on preferred zoning classification and distancing requirements. A public hearing could be scheduled by the Plan Commission as early as January 9, 2023 and a recommendation on zoning and distancing changes could be presented to the Village Board for final consideration at the January 16, 2023 Board meeting.

I am requesting direction on the following:

- Does the Village Board wish to forego an advisory referendum and schedule a public hearing for Plan Commission consideration of text amendments to the UDO to rezone Adult Use Recreational cannabis Dispensaries?
- Does the Village Board wish to consider enacting a municipal cannabis tax ordinance for filing with IDOR prior to April 1, 2023, which would allow for collection of any AURCD taxes after July 1, 2023?

Based on the information presented in the table, the zoning regulations for adult use cannabis dispensaries vary significantly among the area municipalities researched.

Buffering Scenario Maps

We have prepared three maps with different buffer distances to illustrate the properties in Carol Stream on which a cannabis dispensary may be able to locate under each scenario. All maps have the O-S Office Service District (shown in light blue) and the B-3 General Business District (shown in red) zoning layer turned on, which reflects an assumption that these would be the zoning districts in which the Village Board would wish to have adult use dispensaries be allowed (they are already special uses in the O-S District). Following is a brief description of each map.

Map 1: 100-Foot Buffer – This map is intended to reflect the same setback or buffer requirements as currently exist for establishments offering the retail sale of alcohol, as set forth in Chapter 11 of the municipal code, which is a 100-foot setback from any church (place of worship), school (interpreted to include public and private school and daycares), and home for aged (nursing homes).

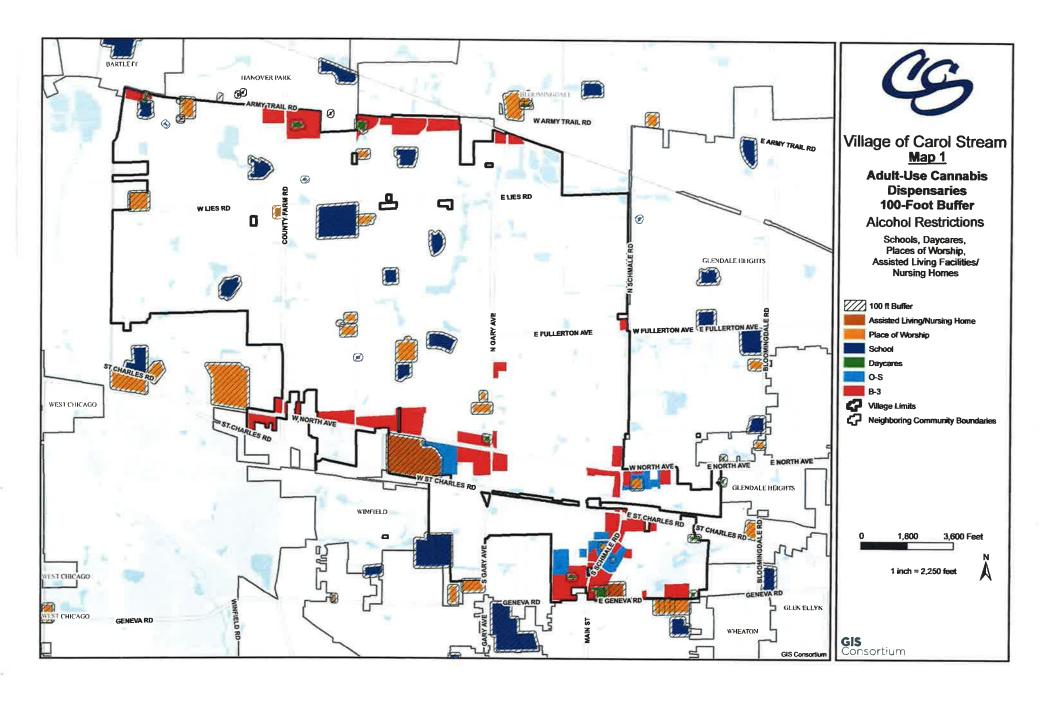
Map 2: 500-Foot Buffer – This map applied a 500-foot buffer around all schools, daycares and places of worship.

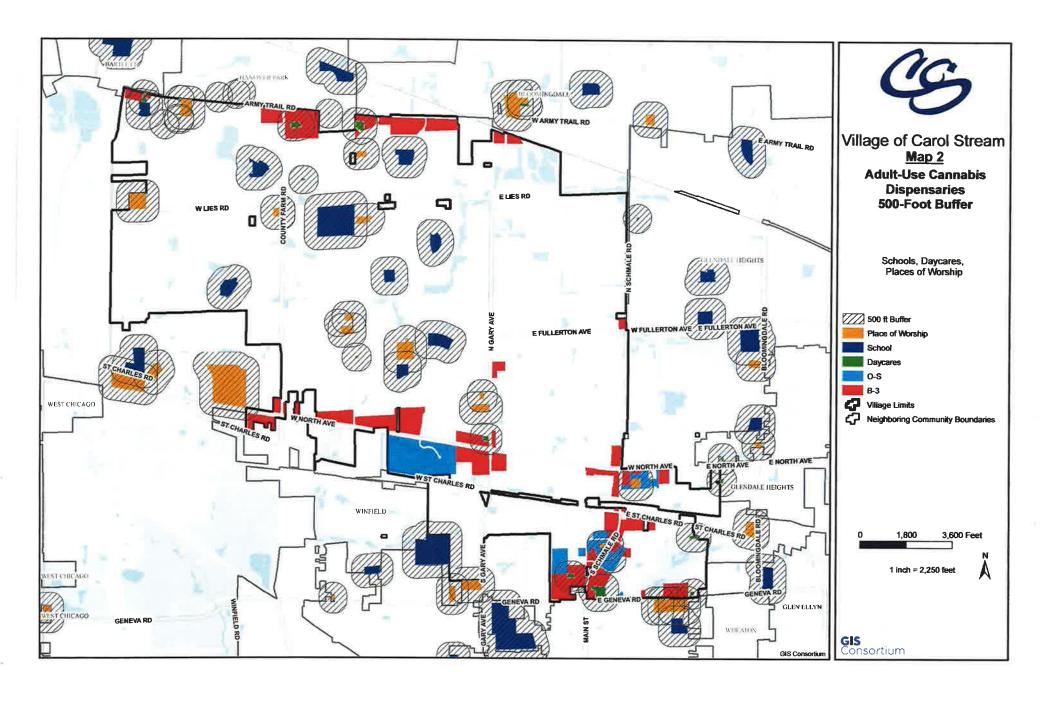
Map 3: 1,000-Foot Buffer – This map applies a 1,000-foot buffer around all schools, daycare and places of worship.

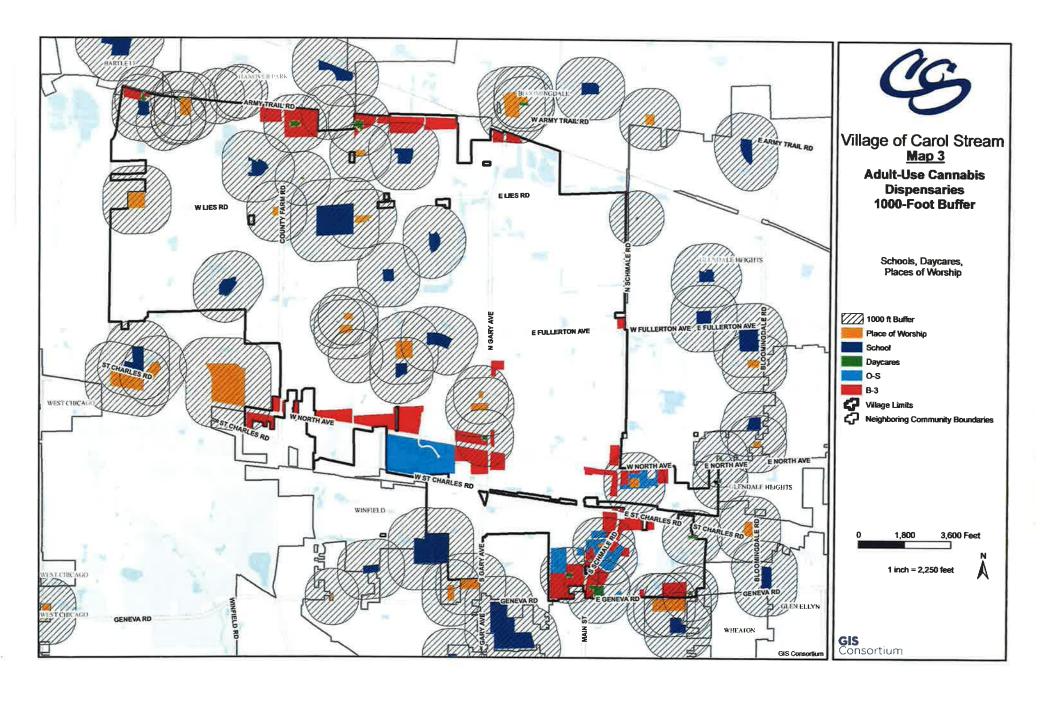
As noted, the maps illustrate properties that could be available for an adult use cannabis dispensary should the Village Board approve the corresponding changes to the text of the Unified Development Ordinance. In the event that the Village Board wished to continue to require Special Use approval for adult use cannabis dispensaries as is currently the case in the O-S District, the approval of a cannabis dispensary at a specific location in the Village would remain subject to staff review, a public hearing before the Plan Commission, and ultimately a final vote by the Village Board.

Advisory Referendum Procedures

At the Village Board meeting of November 7, 2022, the Mayor and Board of Trustees discussed placing a referendum question on the ballot for the April 4, 2023, Consolidated Election with respect to the Village's zoning of cannabis dispensaries. State law provides for two types of referendum questions, binding and advisory. Where state statute or the Illinois Constitution requires a local government to seek voter approval in order to take a specific action, a binding referendum question is required. For example, a local government may be required by state statute to receive voter approval by referendum prior to levying a particular tax. Advisory referenda are public questions used solely to seek the opinion of the voters on a particular subject. Advisory referenda have no binding effect upon the local government. Notwithstanding the results of an advisory referendum, the public body is free to act in any manner authorized by law. There is no statutory or constitutional requirement of voter approval in order for a municipality to provide zoning regulations with respect to cannabis dispensaries. Thus, any referendum dealing with this issue would be advisory.

Advisory Questions

Section 3.1-40-60 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/3.1-40-60, provides that "by a vote of the majority of the members of the city council, the council may authorize an advisory question of public policy to be placed on the ballot at the next regularly scheduled election in the municipality. The city council shall certify the question to the proper election authority, which must submit the question at an election in accordance with the Election Code."

Pursuant to Section 28-1 of the Illinois Election Code, "[a]dvisory questions of public policy shall be submitted to referendum pursuant to Section 28-5 or pursuant to a statute which so provides." 10 ILCS 5/28-1.

¹ References to City Council and Village Board are interchangeable under this provision of the Illinois Municipal Code.

Required Timelines to Initiate and Process an Advisory Referendum for the April 4, 2023, Consolidated Election

Any resolution authorizing the submission of a public question must be adopted and filed with the local election authority (Village Clerk) not less than 79 days before a regularly scheduled election. 10 ILCS 5/28-2(c). Thereafter, not less than 68 days before a regularly scheduled election, the Village Clerk is to certify the public question to the appropriate election authority. 10 ILCS 5/28-5.

Based on the deadlines in the Election Code and the upcoming election dates, below is a summary of the dates for required action by the Board:

Restrictions on Involvement of Municipal Employees and Officials

The following information is important and should be considered relative to any efforts by the Village, or their elected or appointed officials or employees acting in their official capacities, to promote any referendum. As explained below, a municipality may not take any action to suggest support for or against a referendum. It may, however, disseminate factual information relating to a referenda question. Criminal sanctions can be assessed against persons convicted of violating the applicable laws.

The following is a summary of the law pertaining to municipalities promoting referenda:

- Under the Illinois Election Code, municipalities, including their officials and employees, cannot use public funds to urge a voter to vote for or against any proposition. But a municipality may use public funds to disseminate factual information relating to any referendum proposition. 10 ILCS 5/9-25.1(b).
- Violations of Election Code: First time violation is a Class B misdemeanor (maximum \$1,500 penalty plus up to 6 months jail time); and second or subsequent violations are a Class A misdemeanor (maximum \$2,500 penalty plus up to 364 days jail time).
- Under the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act, municipalities, including their officials
 and employees, cannot: plan, conduct, or participate in a public opinion poll for or against
 a referendum question; survey or gather information from potential or actual voters to
 determine probable vote outcome for or against a referendum question; assist at the polls

for or against any referendum question; prepare, circulate, review, or file any petition for or against any referendum question; and distribute, prepare, or mail campaign literature, campaign signs, or other campaign material for or against any referendum question. 5 ILCS 430/1-5(4)-(8), (11)-(13).

 Violations of State Officials and Employees Ethics Act: violation is a Class A misdemeanor (maximum \$2,500 fine, plus up to 364 day's jail time).

At the end of this Memorandum, I have attached copies of the aforementioned laws.

Residents or businesses may organize campaigns and spend their own private funds urging votes for or against the referendum. However, if private expenditures for or against a referendum exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), the resident or business must register with the State Board of Elections as a ballot initiative committee. See 10 ILCS 5/9-1.8(e).

Referendum Question

There are very few rules governing the wording of an advisory referendum. The referendum must be confined to one topic, cannot contain any alternative or compound questions. It must set forth a single question, capable of being answered either "yes" or "no". Thompson v. Conti, 39 III.2d 160 (1969).

Under the current Village Zoning Code, Adult Use Cannabis Dispensaries are allowed in the Office and Service District of the Village as a special use. In addition, no Adult Use Cannabis Dispensary may be located within 1,000 feet of the property line of a pre-existing public or private preschool, elementary school or secondary school; a day care center, park, place of worship or public library located within or outside of the Village. At the current time, only one property within the Village is zoned Office and Service District and is not located within 1,000 feet of the property line of a pre-existing public or private preschool, elementary school or secondary school; a day care center, park, place of worship or public library located within or outside of the Village. Should the Village desire to allow Adult Use Cannabis Dispensaries upon other properties within the Village, the Zoning Code would have to be amended to allow Adult Use Cannabis Dispensaries in commercial zoning districts and reduce the distance limitations referenced above.

Applicable State Laws

Illinois Election Code: 10 ILCS 5/9-25.1

Section 9-25.1. Election interference.

- (a) As used in this Section, "public funds" means any funds appropriated by the Illinois General Assembly or by any political subdivision of the State of Illinois.
- (b) No public funds shall be used to urge any elector to vote for or against any candidate or proposition, or be appropriated for political or campaign purposes to any candidate or political organization. This Section shall not prohibit the use of public funds for dissemination of factual information relative to any proposition appearing on an election ballot, or for dissemination of information and arguments published and distributed under law in connection with a proposition to amend the Constitution of the State of Illinois.
- (c) The first time <u>any person violates any provision of this Section, that person shall be guilty of a Class B misdemeanor</u>. Upon the second or any subsequent violation of any provision of this Section, the person violating any provision of this Section shall be guilty of a <u>Class A misdemeanor</u>. (Source: P.A. 87-1052.)

State Officials and Employees Ethics Act: 5 ILCS 430/1-5

Section 1-5. Definitions. As used in this Act:

"Prohibited political activity" means:

- (4) <u>Planning, conducting, or participating in a public opinion poll in connection with</u> a campaign for elective office or on behalf of a political organization for political purposes <u>or for or against any referendum question.</u>
- (5) <u>Surveying or gathering information from potential or actual voters in an election to determine probable vote outcome in connection with a campaign for elective office or on behalf of a political organization for political purposes or for or against any referendum question.</u>
- (6) <u>Assisting at the polls on election day</u> on behalf of any political organization or candidate for elective office or for or against any referendum question.
- (7) <u>Soliciting votes</u> on behalf of a candidate for elective office or a political organization or <u>for or</u> against any referendum question or helping in an effort to get voters to the polls.
- (8) <u>Initiating for circulation, preparing, circulating, reviewing, or filing any petition</u> on behalf of a candidate for elective office <u>or for or against any referendum question</u>. ***
- (11) <u>Distributing, preparing for distribution, or mailing campaign literature, campaign signs, or other campaign material</u> on behalf of any candidate for elective office or <u>for or against any referendum question</u>.
 - (12) Campaigning for any elective office or for or against any referendum question.
- (13) Managing or working on a campaign for elective office or for or against any referendum question.

5 ILCS 430/5-15

(a) <u>State employees shall not intentionally perform any prohibited political activity during any compensated time (other than vacation, personal, or compensatory time off). State employees shall not</u>

intentionally misappropriate any State property or resources by engaging in any prohibited political activity for the benefit of any campaign for elective office or any political organization.

- (b) At no time shall any executive or legislative branch constitutional officer or any official, director, supervisor, or State employee intentionally misappropriate the services of any State employee by requiring that State employee to perform any prohibited political activity (i) as part of that employee's State duties, (ii) as a condition of State employment, or (iii) during any time off that is compensated by the State (such as vacation, personal, or compensatory time off).
- (c) A State employee shall not be required at any time to participate in any prohibited political activity in consideration for that State employee being awarded any additional compensation or employee benefit, in the form of a salary adjustment, bonus, compensatory time off, continued employment, or otherwise.
- (d) A State employee shall not be awarded any additional compensation or employee benefit, in the form of a salary adjustment, bonus, compensatory time off, continued employment, or otherwise, in consideration for the State employee's participation in any prohibited political activity.
- (e) Nothing in this Section prohibits activities that are otherwise appropriate for a State employee to engage in as a part of his or her official State employment duties or activities that are undertaken by a State employee on a voluntary basis as permitted by law.
- (f) No person either (i) in a position that is subject to recognized merit principles of public employment or (ii) in a position the salary for which is paid in whole or in part by federal funds and that is subject to the Federal Standards for a Merit System of Personnel Administration applicable to grant-in-aid programs, shall be denied or deprived of State employment or tenure solely because he or she is a member or an officer of a political committee, of a political party, or of a political organization or club.

Illinois Election Code: Article 28. Submitting Public Questions

10 ILCS 5/28-1:

Section 28-1. The initiation and submission of all public questions to be voted upon by the electors of the State or of any political subdivision or district or precinct or combination of precincts shall be subject to the provisions of this Article.

Questions of public policy which have any legal effect shall be submitted to referendum only as authorized by a statute which so provides or by the Constitution. Advisory questions of public policy shall be submitted to referendum pursuant to Section 28-5 or pursuant to a statute which so provides. ***

Whenever a statute provides for the initiation of a public question by a petition of electors, the provisions of such statute shall govern with respect to the number of signatures required, the qualifications of persons entitled to sign the petition, the contents of the petition, the officer with whom the petition must be filed, and the form of the question to be submitted. If such statute does not specify any of the foregoing petition requirements, the corresponding petition requirements of Section 28-6 shall govern such petition.

Irrespective of the method of initiation, not more than 3 public questions other than (a) back door referenda, (b) referenda to determine whether a disconnection may take place where a city coterminous with a township is proposing to annex territory from an adjacent township, (c) referenda held under the provisions of the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law in the Property Tax Code, (d) referenda held under Section 2-3002 of the Counties Code, or (e) referenda held under Article 22, 23, or 29 of the Township Code may be submitted to referendum with respect to a political subdivision at the same election.

If more than 3 propositions are timely initiated or certified for submission at an election with respect to a political subdivision, the first 3 validly initiated, by the filing of a petition or by the adoption of a resolution or ordinance of a political subdivision, as the case may be, shall be printed on the ballot and submitted at that election. However, except as expressly authorized by law not more than one

proposition to change the form of government of a municipality pursuant to Article VII of the Constitution may be submitted at an election. If more than one such proposition is timely initiated or certified for submission at an election with respect to a municipality, the first validly initiated shall be the one printed on the ballot and submitted at that election.

(10 ILCS 5/28-2: Section 28-2. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Section, <u>petitions for the submission</u> of public questions to referendum must be filed with the appropriate officer or board not less than 92 days prior to a regular election to be eligible for submission on the ballot at such election; and petitions for the submission of a question under Section 18-120 or Section 18-206 of the Property Tax Code must be filed with the appropriate officer or board not more than 10 months nor less than 6 months prior to the election at which such question is to be submitted to the voters.

(c) Resolutions or ordinances of governing boards of political subdivisions which initiate the submission of public questions pursuant to law must be adopted not less than 79 days before a regularly scheduled election to be eligible for submission on the ballot at such election.

(10 ILCS 5/28-5) Section 28-5. Not less than 68 days before a regularly scheduled election, each local election official shall certify the public questions to be submitted to the voters of or within his political subdivision at that election which have been initiated by petitions filed in his office or by action of the governing board of his political subdivision.

Local election officials and circuit court clerks shall make their certifications, as required by this Section, to each election authority having jurisdiction over any of the territory of the respective political subdivision in which the public question is to be submitted to referendum. ***

10 ILCS 5/28-6:

Section 28-6. Petitions; filing.

(a) On a written petition signed by a number of voters equal to at least 8% of the total votes cast for candidates for Governor in the preceding gubernatorial election by the registered voters of the municipality, township, county or school district, it shall be the duty of the proper election officers to submit any question of public policy so petitioned for, to the electors of such political subdivision at any regular election named in the petition at which an election is scheduled to be held throughout such political subdivision under Article 2A. Such petitions shall be filed with the local election official of the political subdivision or election authority, as the case may be. Where such a question is to be submitted to the voters of a municipality which has adopted Article 6, or a township or school district located entirely within the jurisdiction of a municipal board of election commissioners, such petitions shall be filed with the board of election commissioners having jurisdiction over the political subdivision.

WHEREAS, on June 25, 2019, Governor Pritzker signed the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act which legalized the sale, possession, and use of cannabis for recreational purposes by persons 21 years and older; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act a municipality may regulate or ban cannabis businesses in its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, on December 16, 2019, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village passed Ordinance 2019-12-52, entitled "An Ordinance Amending Chapter 16 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Carol Stream and which Ordinance regulated Adult Use Cannabis Dispensaries within the Village; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Carol Stream Zoning Code, Adult Use Cannabis Dispensaries are allowed only within the Office and Service District as a special use and may not be located within 1,000 feet of the property line of a pre-existing public or private preschool, elementary school or secondary school; a day care center, park, place of worship or public library located within or outside of the Village; and

WHEREAS, under the current regulations only one property within the Village is eligible to receive a special use for a cannabis dispensary and it is unlikely that a cannabis dispensary would be located upon this property; and

WHEREAS, the DuPage County Board has voted to allow cannabis dispensaries within the unincorporated areas of the County and has identified 57 of the 107 dispensary sites with County District No 6, with 20 of those sites adjacent to the boundaries of the Village of Carol Stream; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village find that is in the best interests of the residents, property owners and taxpayers of the Village to approve this Resolution so that the non-binding advisory public question set forth below in Section 2 shall appear on the ballot for the April 4, 2023 Consolidated Election.

On May 19, 2014, a contract with GovTempsUSA was approved for an Office Manager in the Mayor and Village Manager's Office. The arrangement was in lieu of a Village employee with benefits (pension and health insurance). This enabled the Village to obtain the services of an extremely knowledgeable professional while saving money. This arrangement continues to provide high quality services at the savings envisioned.

The initial agreement was for the period May 7, 2014 through December 31, 2014 and has since been extended in each fiscal year through the present.

Attached for your review and consideration, you will find Exhibits A and B to the Agreement with GovTempsUSA. Exhibit A has been revised to reflect a 3½ % increase in the hourly rate from \$42.05/hour to \$43.42/hour. The annual cost of \$90,306.58 continues to compare favorably with the cost of a full-time employee with benefits.

I am recommending approval of the revisions to the Agreement with GovTempsUSA for the period January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 at a cost of \$90,306.58 as articulated in Exhibit A. All other terms of the Agreement approved May 19, 2014 remain unchanged. I have discussed the agreement with Mayor Saverino and he concurs with this recommendation. There are sufficient funds budgeted for this expenditure.

GerzevskeLane Water Tower in the Amount of \$507,620

Next year's budget (FY24) includes \$450,000 for painting and completing minor repairs to the water tower on Gerzsevske Lane. Due to an unexpectedly high preliminary estimate of cost prepared by consulting engineering firm Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. (CBBEL), the scope of this project was reduced in order to decrease the estimated cost from over \$1 million closer to the projected FY24 budget amount.¹

Staff's effort to reduce costs was aided by an inspection report from a third-party tank inspection firm that revealed the condition of the paint on the interior dry (that portion of the tank that doesn't hold the water) and exterior surfaces of the tank is in much better condition than was expected given the age (15 years). As a result, the scope was reduced to include: painting of the interior wet bowl, installing a new cathodic protection system, pit weld and weld seam, repairs, new ladder install, replacement of roof hatch and vent screening, addition of a mixing system, replacement of pit piping and upgrades and repairs to the existing electrical service. Some improvements will also be made to accommodate a future addition of a microwave communication device to support an IT Department network communication improvement.

Christopher B. Burke Engineering (CBBEL) provided consulting services to draft the bid specifications and provide bidding assistance, including an evaluation of bids and final recommendation (attached). Four bids were received with the following results²:

Staff reviewed the bid results with CBBEL and determined that low bidder Jetco's bid is responsible and responsive. Jetco completed the Lies Road project two years ago satisfactorily³.

¹ Staff bid this FY24 project at this time in order to secure competitive pricing and to ensure availability of one of the few contractors qualified to perform this work. Work would begin in May 2023.

² The full bid tabulation is attached for reference.

CBBEL has successfully worked with Jetco on several similar projects in the past and also checked references and determined Jetco is qualified to perform this specific project.

One item that drew our attention during review of bids was Jetco's price for the SCADA work. The bid specifications described this work in a manner similar to what was performed during the Lies Road project and the more recent Fullerton Avenue project. The cost of SCADA work on those towers was roughly \$12,000, while Jetco's bid included a cost of \$67,930 on this project. Staff speculated that perhaps the sub-contractor did not fully understand the scope of the SCADA work called for in the specifications. We reached out to the sub-contractor who acknowledged that their proposed cost to Jetco may have been higher than necessary, and they offered to work with CBBEL to review the scope and consider amending their proposed cost. CBBEL then worked with Jetco to confirm that a revised cost from the SCADA sub-contractor would be acceptable to him, and he agreed.

Finally, staff consulted with the Village Attorney to determine if Illinois bidding statutes would allow the Village to negotiate a revised cost for the SCADA work. Jim Rhodes confirmed that, under Illinois bidding statutes, the Village is allowed to negotiate with only the low bidder and so long as there is no change in scope in the project specifications. In this case, we meet the criteria, which allowed for a negotiated reduction in cost on this single line item.

Attached is a proposal from Jetco decreasing their bid for the SCADA line item to \$43,315 (from \$67,930 found on their bid form), thereby reducing Jetco's overall bid from \$532,235 to \$507,620. Since this project is budgeted in the coming fiscal year, the proposed budget will be amended to reflect this new total. The Finance Director has advised that this project is eligible for American Rescue Plan (ARPA) funding.

Staff recommends that the Village Board award a bid to Jetco, Ltd., in the amount of \$507,620 for painting and minor repairs to the Gerzevske Lane water tower.

Membranes for WRC

The FY23 budget includes \$438,000¹ for replacement of diffuser membranes in the WRC aeration basins and digesters. Diffuser membranes are a critical part of the airflow process in aeration basins and digesters, ensuring an evenly distributed source of air to the biology in the treatment process. On July 18, 2022, the Village Board approved a staff recommendation to purchase the replacement membranes in the amount of \$186,384 due to an anticipated long delivery time.

The Village Manager approved an engineering services agreement for design, bidding and construction oversight services with Engineering Enterprises in the amount of \$19,624. Following completion of design, the project was publicly bid and two contractors submitted bids. One of the bids (from Environmental Dynamics International) was determined to be non-responsive due to the contractor submitting a conditional bid that required proposed changes to the contract documents.² The only responsive bid was submitted by Clean Infusion, LLC, in the amount of \$175,460.

Attached is a letter from our consulting engineer summarizing bid results, reference checks and recommending award to Clean Infusion.

Clean Infusion, LLC at 2505 Shepard Boulevard Columbia, MO 65202 is the lowest responsible bidder at \$175,460.00

EEI does not have any working experience with Clean Infusion, LLC, however, we checked on a reference at the Fox River Water Reclamation District in Elgin, IL. Clean Infusion, LLC recently did a similar diffuser replacement project for their WWTP and they appeared to perform satisfactorily. We also received several other acceptable references from projects outside of Illinois. Based on these references, Clean Infusion, LLC appears to be a qualified wastewater treatment plant services firm capable of satisfactorily performing the work.

Environmental Dynamics Intl, Inc. (EDI) also submitted a bid that was higher than Clean Infusion, LLC. This bidder submitted a conditional bid that required proposed changes to the Contract Documents. The Instructions to Bidders clearly prohibits conditional bids, so this bid was deemed unresponsive.

We recommend the acceptance of the bid and approval of the award be made to the low bidder, Clean Infusion, LLC in the amount of \$175,460.00. The summary of bids is attached for your reference.

The total purchase price for the truck from Joe Rizza Ford is \$50,507.24.³ The total amount budgeted for the vehicle (including up-fitting), is \$48,000. Once the truck is received, up-fitting costs for lights, plows, radios, decals, bed lining and utility bodies would

add \$19,449.08, bringing the total cost of the vehicle to \$69,956.23 (\$21,956 over budget).4

Staff recommends that the Village Board approve a Motion authorizing the purchase of one (1) 2022 Ford F250 pick-up truck from Joe Rizza Ford in Orland Park, IL, for an amount not-to-exceed \$69,956.23 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 8, Section 5-8-14 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

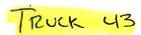

In November of 2015 the Village had joined the GIS Consortium (GISC) and entered into a service provider contract with the GIS consultant, Municipal GIS Partners Inc. (MGP Inc.). Since the initial contract, annually the GISC members negotiate a new service agreement with MGP to determine the service pricing for the upcoming year. The contract provides GIS program staffing, hardware and software required to support the core of Carol Stream's GIS program. This has proven to be a cost effective way to staff our GIS program with different levels of experience and ability.

Since joining the Consortium, the Village has made significant progress integrating and improving our GIS capabilities. Currently MGP and Village staff work collaboratively on several projects including:

- a. Continued Cartegraph Integration
- b. Continued Development of Utility Data
- c. Mapping integrations with Village Systems
- d. Police Zone and Block Maps
- e. Sex Offender Mapping
- f. Various Story Maps
- g. Cartegraph Asset Visualization Improvements
- h. Community Development Project Maps
- i. Com-Ed Address Review
- j. Snow Zone Maps

The 2023 service provider pricing has increased by 3.9% over last year. For reference, the 2022 contract was a not to exceed amount of \$149,942.00, the total cost for 2023 is \$155,790.00.

After reviewing the contract, Information Technology is agreeable to the terms outlined in the statement of work. Therefore, staff recommends an award of contract to MGP at a cost not to exceed \$155,790.00 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 8, Section 5-8-14(F) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

GIS CONSORTIUM SERVICE PROVIDER CONTRACT

This contract (this "Contract") made and entered into this 1st day of January, 2023 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the Village of Carol Stream, an Illinois municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality"), and Municipal GIS Partners, Incorporated, 701 Lee Street, Suite 1020, Des Plaines, Illinois 60016 (hereinafter referred to as the "Consultant").

WHEREAS, the Municipality is a member of the Geographic Information System Consortium ("GISC");

WHEREAS, the Consultant is a designated service provider for the members of GISC and is responsible for providing the necessary professional staffing resource support services as more fully described herein (the "Services") in connection with the Municipality's geographical information system ("GIS");

WHEREAS, the Municipality desires to engage the Consultant to provide the Services on the terms set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the Consultant hereby represents itself to be in compliance with Illinois statutes relating to professional registration applicable to individuals performing the Services hereunder and has the necessary expertise and experience to furnish the Services upon the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and of the promises hereinafter set forth, it is hereby agreed by and between the Municipality and the Consultant that:

SECTION 1 SCOPE OF SERVICES

- 1.1 <u>Statement of Work</u>. This Contract contains the basic terms and conditions that will govern the overall relationship between the Consultant and the Municipality. The Consultant will provide the Services described in the statement of work attached hereto as *Attachment 1* ("*Statement of Work*"), which shall become a part of and subject to this Contract.
- 1.2 <u>Supplemental Statements of Work</u>. Any additional services to be performed by the Consultant may be added to this Contract after the Effective Date by the mutual agreement of the parties, which agreement will be evidenced by mutual execution of a Supplemental Statement of Work which shall also be subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Contract.
- Additional Compensation. If the Consultant wishes to make a claim for additional compensation as a result of action taken by the Municipality, the Consultant shall give written notice of its claim within fifteen (15) days after occurrence of such action. Regardless of the decision of the Municipality Manager relative to a claim submitted by the Consultant, all work required under this Contract as determined by the Municipality Manager shall proceed without interruption.

1.4 <u>Contract Governs</u>. If there is a conflict between the terms of this Contract and the Statement of Work or any Supplemental Statement of Work, unless otherwise specified in such Statement of Work, the terms of this Contract shall supersede the conflicting provisions contained in such Statement of Work.

SECTION 2 PERFORMANCE OF WORK

2.1 All work hereunder shall be performed under the direction of the Village Manager or their designee (hereinafter referred to as the "*Municipality Manager*") in accordance with the terms set forth in this Contract and each relevant Statement of Work.

SECTION 3 RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

- 3.1 <u>Independent Contractor</u>. The Consultant shall at all times be an independent contractor, engaged by the Municipality to perform the Services. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to constitute a partnership, joint venture or agency relationship between the parties.
- 3.2 <u>Consultant and Employees</u>. Neither the Consultant nor any of its employees shall be considered to be employees of the Municipality for any reason, including but not limited to for purposes of workers' compensation law, Social Security, or any other applicable statute or regulation.
- 3.3 <u>No Authority to Bind</u>. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing, neither party hereto has the authority to bind the other to any third party or to otherwise act in any way as the representative of the other.

SECTION 4 PAYMENT TO THE CONSULTANT

- 4.1 <u>Payment Terms</u>. The Municipality agrees to pay the Consultant in accordance with the terms and amounts set forth in the applicable Statement of Work, provided that:
- (a) The Consultant shall submit invoices in a format approved by the Municipality.
- (b) The Consultant shall maintain records showing actual time devoted to each aspect of the Services performed and cost incurred. The Consultant shall permit the authorized representative of the Municipality to inspect and audit all data and records of the Consultant for work done under this Contract. The Consultant shall make these records available at reasonable times during this Contract period, and for a year after termination of this Contract.
- (c) The service rates and projected utilization set forth in the applicable Statement of Work shall adjust each calendar year in accordance with the annual rates approved by the Board of Directors of GISC which shall be reflected in a Supplemental Statement of Work.

- (d) Payments to the Consultant shall be made pursuant to the Illinois Local Government Prompt Payment Act (50 ILCS 505/1 et seq.).
- (e) The Municipality is a tax-exempt municipality and will provide Consultant with a copy of the Municipality's current sales tax exemption certificate. Consultant shall not charge the Municipality any tax incurred by the Consultant for these Services.
- 4.2 <u>Service Rates</u>. The fees and/or service rates set forth in the Statement of Work and Supplemental Statement of Work include all applicable federal, state, and local taxes of every kind and nature applicable to the Services as well as all taxes, contributions, and premiums for unemployment insurance, old age or retirement benefits, pensions, annuities, or similar benefits and all costs, royalties and fees arising from the use of, or the incorporation into, the Services, of patented or copyrighted equipment, materials, supplies, tools, appliances, devices, processes, or inventions. All claim or right to claim additional compensation by reason of the payment of any such tax, contribution, premium, costs, royalties, or fees is hereby waived and released by Consultant.

SECTION 5 TERM

- 5.1 <u>Initial Term</u>. Subject to earlier termination pursuant to the terms of this Contract, the initial term of this Contract shall commence on the Effective Date and remain in effect for one (1) year (the "*Initial Term*").
- 5.2 <u>Renewal Terms</u>. The Initial Term may be extended for successive one (1) year periods or for any other period as mutually agreed to in writing and set forth in a Supplemental Statement of Work executed by both parties (each, a "*Renewal Term*").
- 5.3 <u>Status of this Contract</u>. The expiration of the Initial Term or a Renewal Term shall not terminate or affect the obligations of the Parties to each other under any existing Statement of Work or Supplemental Statement of Work issued pursuant to this Contract, and such Statement of Work or Supplemental Statement of Work shall continue in full force and effect and shall continue to be governed by the terms of this Contract until the expiration or completion of such Statement of Work or Supplement Statement of Work or until such Statement of Work or Supplemental Statement of Work is itself terminated pursuant to this Contract.

SECTION 6 TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

6.1 <u>Voluntary Termination</u>. Notwithstanding any other provision hereof, the Municipality may terminate this Contract, any Statement of Work, or any Supplemental Statement of Work during the Initial Term or any Renewal Term, with or without cause, at any time upon ninety (90) calendar days prior written notice to the Consultant. The Consultant may terminate this Contract, any Statement of Work, or any Supplemental Statement of Work, with or without cause, at any time upon one hundred eighty (180) calendar days prior written notice to the Municipality.

- 6.2 <u>Termination for Breach</u>. Either party may terminate this Contract upon written notice to the other party following a material breach of a material provision of this Contract by the other party if the breaching party does not cure such breach within fifteen (15) days of receipt of written notice of such breach from the non-breaching party.
- 6.3 <u>Payment for Services Rendered</u>. In the event that this Contract is terminated in accordance with this Section 6, the Consultant shall be paid for services actually performed and reimbursable expenses actually incurred.
- 6.4 <u>Effect of Termination</u>. Termination of any Statement of Work or Supplemental Statement of Work will have no effect on this Contract. Termination of this Contract will serve to immediately terminate all open Statements of Work and Supplemental Statements of Work, absent a written agreement between the parties otherwise. Termination or expiration of this Contract, any Statement of Work, or any Supplemental Statement of Work will not affect any right or obligation of a party that comes into effect before, upon, or after such termination or expiration, or otherwise survives such termination or expiration, which was incurred by such party prior to such termination or expiration.

SECTION 7 CONSULTANT PERSONNEL AND SUBCONTRACTORS

- 7.1 <u>Adequate Staffing</u>. The Consultant must assign and maintain during the term of this Contract and any renewal thereof, an adequate staff of competent employees, agents, or subcontractors ("*Consultant Personnel*") that is fully equipped, licensed as appropriate and qualified to perform the Services as required by the Statement of Work or Supplemental Statement of Work.
- 7.2 <u>Availability of Personnel</u>. The Consultant shall notify the Municipality as soon as practicable prior to terminating the employment of, reassigning, or receiving notice of the resignation of, any Consultant Personnel assigned to provide the Municipality with the Services. The Consultant shall have no claim for damages and shall not bill the Municipality for additional time and materials charges as the result of any portion of the Services which must be duplicated or redone due to such termination or for any delay or extension of the time of performance as a result of any such termination, reassigning, or resignation.
- 7.3 <u>Use of Subcontractors</u>. The Consultant's use of any subcontractor or subcontract to perform the Services shall not relieve the Consultant of full responsibility and liability for the provision, performance, and completion of the Services as required by this Contract. All Services performed under any subcontract shall be subject to all of the provisions of this Contract in the same manner as if performed by employees of the Consultant. Consultant shall be fully responsible and assumes liability for the acts and omissions of all subcontractors directly or indirectly employed by, or working at the direction of, the Consultant in the performance of the Services.
- 7.4 <u>Removal of Personnel and Subcontractors</u>. Municipality may, upon written notice to Consultant, request that any Consultant Personnel be removed or replaced. Consultant shall promptly endeavor to replace such Consultant Personnel and Municipality shall have no claim for

damages for a delay or extension of the applicable Statement of Work as a result of any such removal or replacement.

7.5 Non-Solicitation of Consultant Employees. The Municipality agrees that during the term of this Contract and for a period of one (1) year thereafter, it shall not, directly or indirectly, through any other person, firm, corporation or other entity, solicit, induce, encourage or attempt to induce or encourage any employee of the Consultant to terminate his or her employment with the Consultant or to breach any other obligation to the Consultant. The Municipality acknowledges that the aforementioned restrictive covenant contained in this Section is reasonable and properly required for the adequate protection of the Consultant's business.

SECTION 8 ACCOMMODATION OF CONSULTANT PERSONNEL; MUNICIPAL FACILITIES

- 8.1 <u>Facilities, Equipment, and Records</u>. The Municipality shall provide the Consultant with adequate and safe office space, furnishings, records, hardware, software and connectivity to fulfill the objectives of the GIS program. Facilities, equipment, and records include, but are not limited to, the following:
- (a) Office space for the Consultant's Personnel. This space should effectively and securely house all required GIS systems, peripherals and support tools. This space must be available during normal business hours;
- (b) Furnishings including adequate desk(s), shelving, and seating for the Consultant's Personnel;
 - (c) A telephone line and phone to originate and receive outside calls;
 - (d) A network connection with adequate speed and access to the internet;
- (e) Hardware, software, peripherals, and network connectivity to perform the program objectives efficiently; and
- (f) Any Municipality data or record which is necessary for carrying out the work as outlined in the Contract, Statement of Work or Supplemental Statement of Work.
- 8.2 <u>Backup and Recovery Systems</u>. The Municipality shall be responsible for installing, operating and monitoring the backup and recovery systems for all the Municipality's GIS assets that permit the Consultant to continue Services within a reasonable period of time following a disaster or outage. The Consultant shall be responsible for installing, operating and monitoring the backup and recovery systems for all Consultant's assets that permit the Municipality to continue accessing the GISC Materials and Services within a reasonable period of time following a disaster or outage.
- 8.3 <u>Right of Entry; Limited Access</u>. Consultant's Personnel performing Services shall be permitted to enter upon the Municipality's property in connection with the performance of the Services, subject to those rules established by the Municipality. Consent to enter upon a Municipality's facility given by the Municipality shall not create, nor be deemed to imply, the

creation of any additional responsibilities on the part of the Municipality. Consultant's Personnel shall have the right to use only those facilities of the Municipality that are necessary to perform the Services and shall have no right to access any other facilities of the Municipality.

SECTION 9 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION; INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY; FOIA

- 9.1 <u>Municipal Materials</u>. The Consultant acknowledges and agrees that all trademarks, service marks, logos, tradenames and images provided by or on behalf of the Municipality to the Consultant for use in performing the Services and the GIS database (including files created from the database) created by Consultant hereunder (the "*Municipal Materials*") are the sole and exclusive property of the Municipality. The Consultant acknowledges that this Contract is not a license to use the Municipal Materials except as needed to perform the Services hereunder.
- 9.2 <u>Third-Party Materials</u>. If applicable, to the extent the Consultant has agreed to obtain and/or license Third-Party Materials on behalf of Municipality, the Consultant shall obtain a license for Municipality to use the Third-Party Materials as part of the Services for the purpose specified in the applicable Statement of Work. "*Third-Party Materials*" shall include, but are not limited to, computer software, script or programming code or other materials owned by third parties and/or any software available from third parties, that is licensed by Consultant for the benefit of the Municipality.
- 9.3 <u>GISC Materials</u>. It is expressly understood that, excluding the Municipal Materials and Third-Party Materials, all members of GISC and the Consultant may use or share in any improvements or modifications incorporated into any computer software (in object code and source code form), script or programming code used or developed by the Consultant in providing Services hereunder (the "GISC Materials").
- (a) The Consultant herby grants the Municipality a limited, personal, nontransferable, non-exclusive license to use the GISC Materials solely for the purpose of and in connection with the Municipality's GIS. Upon expiration or termination of this Contract, or at such time the Municipality is no longer a member of GISC or in breach of its obligations hereunder, the Municipality shall not be entitled to or granted a license in future enhancements, improvements or modifications in the GISC Materials. The Municipality may grant a sublicense to a third party that the Municipality engages to maintain or update the GISC Materials in connection with the Municipality's GIS; provided that such third party agrees in writing to be bound by the license restrictions set forth in this Contract.
- (b) The Municipality acknowledges that the Consultant is in the business of providing staffing resource support services and that the Consultant shall have the right to provide services and deliverables to third parties that are the same or similar to the services that are to be rendered under this Contract, and to use or otherwise exploit any GISC Materials in providing such services.
- 9.4 <u>Confidential Information</u>. In the performance of this Contract, the Consultant may have access to or receive certain information in the possession of the Municipality that is not generally known to members of the public ("*Confidential Information*"). The Consultant

acknowledges that Confidential Information includes, but is not limited to, proprietary information, copyrighted material, educational records, employee data, financial information, information relating to health records, resident account information, and other information of a personal nature. Consultant shall not use or disclose any Confidential Information without the prior written consent of the Municipality. Consultant will use appropriate administrative, technical and physical safeguards to prevent the improper use or disclosure of any Confidential Information received from or on behalf of the Municipality. Upon the expiration or termination of this Contract, Consultant shall promptly cease using and shall return or destroy (and certify in writing destruction of) all Confidential Information furnished by the Municipality along with all copies thereof in its possession including copies stored in any computer memory or storage medium. The term "Confidential Information" does not include information that (a) is or becomes generally available to the public other than as a result of a breach of this Contract by the Consultant; (b) was in the Consultant's or Consultant Personnel's possession on a non-confidential basis from any source other than the Municipality, which source, to the knowledge of the Consultant, is entitled to disclose such information without breach of any obligation of confidentiality; (c) is independently developed by the Consultant without the use of or reference to, in whole or in part, any Confidential Information; (d) required to be disclosed pursuant to a court order issued by a court having jurisdiction thereof (subject to Section 9.5); or (e) information subject to disclosure under FOIA (as defined below in Section 9.6). For avoidance of doubt, it is agreed that the GISC Materials shall not be considered Confidential Information.

- 9.5 <u>Dissemination of Confidential Information</u>. Unless directed by the Municipality, Consultant shall not disseminate any Confidential Information. If Consultant is presented with a request for documents by any administrative agency or with a subpoena *duces tecum* regarding any Confidential Information which may be in Consultant's possession as a result of Services provided under this Contract, unless prohibited by law, Consultant shall immediately give notice to the Municipality with the understanding that the Municipality shall have the opportunity to contest such process by any means available to it prior to submission of any documents to a court or other third party. Consultant shall not be obligated to withhold delivery of documents beyond the time ordered by a court of law or administrative agency, unless the request for production or subpoena is quashed or withdrawn, or the time to produce is otherwise extended. Consultant shall cause its personnel, staff and subcontractors, if any, to undertake the same obligations regarding confidentiality and dissemination of information as agreed to by Consultant under this Contract.
- 9.6 Freedom of Information Act Requests. Within four (4) business days after the Municipality's Notice to the Consultant of the Municipality's receipt of a request made pursuant to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (ILCS 140/1 et seq. herein "FOIA"), the Consultant shall furnish all requested records in the Consultant's possession which are in any manner related to this Contract or the Consultant's performance of the Services, including but not limited to any documentation related to the Municipality and associated therewith. The Consultant shall not apply any costs or charge any fees to the Municipality or any other person, firm or corporation for its procurement and retrieval of such records in the Consultant's possession which are sought to be copied or reviewed in accordance with such FOIA request or requests. The Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Municipality including its several departments and including its officers and employees and shall pay all of the Consultant's Costs associated with such FOIA request or requests including Costs arising from the Consultant's failure or alleged failure to timely furnish such documentation and/or arising from the Consultant's failure or alleged

failure otherwise to comply with the FOIA, whether or not associated with the Consultant's and/or the Municipality's defense of any litigation associated therewith. In addition, if the Consultant requests the Municipality to deny the FOIA request or any portion thereof by utilizing one or more of the lawful exemptions provided for in the FOIA, the Consultant shall pay all Costs in connection therewith. As used herein, "in the Consultant's possession" includes documents in the possession of any of the Consultant's officers, agents, employees and/or independent contractors; and "Costs" includes but is not limited to attorneys' fees, witness fees, filing fees and any and all other expenses — whether incurred by the Municipality or the Consultant.

- 9.7 <u>News Releases</u>. The Consultant may not issue any news releases without prior approval from the Municipality Manager nor will the Consultant make public proposals developed under this Contract without prior written approval from the Municipality Manager.
- 9.8 <u>Survive Termination</u>. The provisions of Section 9.1 and 9.4 through and including 9.8 shall survive the termination of this Contract.

SECTION 10 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

10.1 THE REPRESENTATIONS SET FORTH IN THIS CONTRACT ARE EXCLUSIVE AND IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, ARISING BY LAW OR OTHERWISE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ANY FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES ARISING FROM TRADE USAGE, COURSE OF DEALING OR COURSE OF PERFORMANCE. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHALL EITHER THE CONSULTANT OR THE MUNICIPALITY BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER FOR ANY INDIRECT, CONSEQUENTIAL, SPECIAL OR INCIDENTAL DAMAGES, INCLUDING LOST SALES OR PROFITS, IN CONNECTION WITH THIS CONTRACT, EVEN IF IT HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES.

SECTION 11 CONSULTANT WARRANTY; INDEMNIFICATION; INSURANCE

- 11.1 <u>Warranty of Services</u>. The Consultant warrants that the Services shall be performed in accordance with industry standards of professional practice, care, and diligence practiced by recognized consulting firms in performing services of a similar nature in existence at the time of the Effective Date.
- Indemnification. The Consultant shall indemnify and save harmless the Municipality and its officers, employees, and agents from and against any and all loss, liability and damages of whatever nature, including Workmen's Compensation claims by Consultant's employees, in any way resulting from or arising out of the intentional, willful and wanton, negligent and/or gross negligent actions or omissions of the Consultant, the Consultant's employees and agents.
- 11.3 <u>Insurance</u>. The Consultant must procure and maintain, for the duration of this Contract, insurance as provided in *Attachment 2* to this Contract.

11.4 <u>No Personal Liability</u> No official, director, officer, agent, or employee of any party shall be charged personally or held contractually liable by or to the other party under any term or provision of this Contract or because of its or their execution, approval or attempted execution of this Contract.

SECTION 12 GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 12.1 Equal Employment Opportunity Clause. In the event of the Consultant's non-compliance with the provisions of this Section 12.1 or the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1-101, et seq., as it may be amended from time to time, and any successor thereto (the "Act"), the Consultant may be declared ineligible for future contracts or subcontracts with the State of Illinois or any of its political subdivisions or municipal corporations, and this Contract may be cancelled or voided in whole or in part, and other sanctions or penalties may be imposed or remedies invoked as provided by statute or regulation. During the performance of this Contract, the Consultant agrees as follows:
- (a) The Consultant will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, order of protection status, national origin or ancestry, citizenship status, age, physical or mental disability unrelated to ability, military status or an unfavorable discharge from military service; and, further, the Consultant will examine all job classifications to determine if minority persons or women are underutilized and will take appropriate affirmative action to rectify any underutilization.
- (b) That, if the Consultant hires additional employees in order to perform this Contract or any portion of this Contract, the Consultant will determine the availability (in accordance with 44 Ill. Admin. C. 750.5, et seq., as it may be amended from time to time, and any successor thereto (the "Applicable Regulations")) of minorities and women in the areas from which the Consultant may reasonably recruit and the Consultant will hire for each job classification for which employees are hired in a way that minorities and women are not underutilized.
- (c) That, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by the Consultant or on the Consultant's behalf, the Consultant will state that all applicants will be afforded equal opportunity without discrimination because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, order of protection status, national origin or ancestry, citizenship status, age, physical or mental disability unrelated to ability, military status or an unfavorable discharge from military service.
- of workers with which the Consultant has or is bound by a collective bargaining or other agreement or understanding, a notice advising the labor organization or representative of the Consultant's obligations under the Act and the Applicable Regulations. If any labor organization or representative fails or refuses to cooperate with the Consultant in the Consultant's efforts to comply with the Act and the Applicable Regulations, the Consultant will promptly notify the Illinois Department of Human Rights (the "*Department*") and the Municipality and will recruit employees from other sources when necessary to fulfill its obligations under the Contract.

- (e) That the Consultant will submit reports as required by the Applicable Regulations, furnish all relevant information as may from time to time be requested by the Department or the Municipality, and in all respects comply with the Act and the Applicable Regulations.
- (f) That the Consultant will permit access to all relevant books, records, accounts and work sites by personnel of the Municipality and the Department for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with the Act and the Department's Rules and Regulations.
- (g) That the Consultant will include verbatim or by reference the provisions of this Section 12.1 in every subcontract awarded under which any portion of the Contract obligations are undertaken or assumed, so that the provisions will be binding upon the subcontractor. In the same manner as with other provisions of this Contract, the Consultant will be liable for compliance with applicable provisions of this Section 12.1 by subcontractors; and further the Consultant will promptly notify the Municipality and the Department in the event any subcontractor fails or refuses to comply with the provisions. In addition, the Consultant will not utilize any subcontractor declared by the Illinois Human Rights Commission to be ineligible for contracts or subcontracts with the State of Illinois or any of its political subdivisions or municipal corporations.
- 12.2 <u>No Collusion</u>. The Consultant represents and certifies that the Consultant is not barred from contracting with a unit of state or local government as a result of (i) a delinquency in the payment of any tax administered by the Illinois Department of Revenue unless the Consultant is contesting, in accordance with the procedures established by the appropriate revenue act, its liability for the tax or the amount of the tax, as set forth in Section 11-42.1-1 et seq. of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-42.1-1 et seq.; or (ii) a violation of either Section 33E-3 or Section 33E-4 of Article 33E of the Criminal Code of 1961, 720 ILCS 5/33E-1 et seq.
- 12.3 <u>Sexual Harassment Policy</u>. The Consultant certifies that it has a written sexual harassment policy in full compliance with Section 2-105(A)(4) of the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/2-105(A)(4).
- 12.4 Compliance with Laws and Grants. Consultant shall give all notices, pay all fees, and take all other action that may be necessary to ensure that the Services are provided, performed, and completed in accordance with all required governmental permits, licenses, or other approvals and authorizations that may be required in connection with providing, performing, and completing the Services, and with all applicable statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations, including without limitation the Fair Labor Standards Act; any statutes regarding qualification to do business; any statutes prohibiting discrimination because of, or requiring affirmative action based on, race, creed, color, national origin, age, sex, or other prohibited classification, including, without limitation, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 et seq., and the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq. Consultant shall also comply with all conditions of any federal, state, or local grant received by Municipality or Consultant with respect to this Contract or the Services.
- 12.5 <u>Assignments and Successors</u>. This Contract and each and every portion thereof shall be binding upon the successors and the assigns of the parties hereto; provided, however, that

no assignment, delegation or subcontracting shall be made without the prior written consent of the Municipality.

- 12.6 <u>Severability</u>. The parties intend and agree that, if any paragraph, subparagraph, phrase, clause, or other provision of this Contract, or any portion thereof, shall be held to be void or otherwise unenforceable, all other portions of this Contract shall remain in full force and effect.
- 12.7 <u>Third Party Beneficiary</u>. No claim as a third party beneficiary under this Contract by any person, firm, or corporation other than the Consultant shall be made or be valid against the Municipality.
- 12.8 <u>Waiver</u>. No waiver of any provision of this Contract shall be deemed to or constitute a waiver of any other provision of this Contract (whether or not similar) nor shall any such waiver be deemed to or constitute a continuing waiver unless otherwise expressly provided in this Contract.
- 12.9 <u>Governing Laws</u>. This Contract shall be interpreted according to the internal laws, but not the conflict of laws rules, of the State of Illinois. Venue shall reside in Cook County, Illinois.
- 12.10 <u>Headings</u>. The headings of the several paragraphs of this Contract are inserted only as a matter of convenience and for reference and in no way are they intended to define, limit, or describe the scope of intent of any provision of this Contract, nor shall they be construed to affect in any manner the terms and provisions hereof or the interpretation or construction thereof.
- 12.11 <u>Modification or Amendment</u>. This Contract constitutes the entire Contract of the parties on the subject matter hereof and may not be changed, modified, discharged, or extended except by written amendment or Supplemental Statement of Work duly executed by the parties. Each party agrees that no representations or warranties shall be binding upon the other party unless expressed in writing herein or in a duly executed amendment hereof.
- 12.12 <u>Attachments</u>. Attachments 1 and 2 are attached hereto, and by this reference incorporated in and made a part of this Contract. In the event of a conflict between any Attachment and the text of this Contract, the text of this Contract shall control.
- 12.13 <u>Rights Cumulative</u>. Unless expressly provided to the contrary in this Contract, each and every one of the rights, remedies, and benefits provided by this Contract shall be cumulative and shall not be exclusive of any other such rights, remedies, and benefits allowed by law.
- 12.14 <u>Good Faith Negotiation</u>. Before commencing any legal action, the parties agree to enter into good faith negotiations to resolve any controversy, claim, or dispute ("*Dispute*"). Such good faith negotiations shall commence promptly upon a party's receipt of notice of any Dispute from the other party and continue for a period of fourteen (14) days or any period of time as mutually agreed upon.
- 12.15 <u>Notices</u>. All notices, reports and documents required under this Contract shall be in writing (including prepaid overnight courier, electronic transmission or similar writing) and shall

be given to such party at its address or e-mail address set forth below, or at such other address or e-mail address as such party may hereafter specify from time to time. Each such notice shall be effective (i) if given by first class mail or prepaid overnight courier, when received, or (ii) if sent to an e-mail address, upon the sender's receipt of an acknowledgment from the intended recipient (such as by the "return receipt requested" function, as available, return e-mail or other written acknowledgment).

- 12.16 Force Majeure. No party to this Contract shall be responsible or liable for, or deemed in breach hereof because of, any delay in the performance of its respective obligations under this Contract to the extent that such delay is due substantially to circumstances beyond the party's reasonable control and without the fault or negligence of the party experiencing such delay. Such circumstances may include, but are not limited to, any act of God, fire or other casualty, epidemic, quarantine, "stay home" or similar order, epidemic, quarantine, "stay home" or similar order, strike or labor dispute, embargo, war or violence, act of terrorism, or any law, order, proclamation, ordinance, demand, requirement, action or inaction of any national, state, provincial, local, or other government or governmental agency (each, a "Force Majeure"). Upon the occurrence of a Force Majeure, the party experiencing the Force Majeure shall notify the other party in writing immediately following such Force Majeure, but in no case later than three (3) business days after such party becomes aware of the occurrence of the Force Majeure. The written notification shall provide a reasonably detailed explanation of the Force Majeure.
- 12.17 <u>Counterpart Execution</u>. This Contract, Statement of Work or any Supplemental Statement of Work may be executed in several counterparts, each of which, when executed, shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 12.18 <u>Tort Immunity Defenses</u>. Nothing contained in the Contract is intended to constitute, and nothing in the Contract will constitute, a waiver of the rights, defenses, and immunities provided or available to the Municipality under the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act, 745 ILCS 10 et seq. or any other applicable State law.

Attachment 1 - Statement of Work

To GIS Consortium Service Provider Contract

About Municipal GIS Partners (MGP)

MGP (the Consultant) is the Service Provider to the GIS Consortium (GISC). It is necessary that each GISC member enter into an annual agreement with the Consultant (GISC Service Provider) to maintain their standing as a GISC member.

GISC Membership includes:

- Complete GIS program staffing with technology cost distribution across GISC members
- User and license access to all membership solutions and products
- Access to and participation in collaborative opportunities to share ideas and solutions

The Included Services section below expands on services provided by this agreement.

General Purpose

The Consultant will perform all or part of the Village of Carol Stream (the Municipality) geographic information system (GIS) management, development, operation, and maintenance as directed by the Municipality. In addition to supporting the GIS program, the Consultant will identify opportunities for continued program development and enhancement.

Program Staffing

The Consultant provides all the requisite staffing and skillsets required to manage the Municipality program including:

- Technical professionals assigned directly to the Municipality
- Advanced technical support staff for analysis, system integration, and escalation
- Systems analysts for ensuring product, solution, and infrastructure performance
- Professional program managers for ensuring service levels

Direct Program Hours

Services related to the direct management, development, operation, and maintenance of the Municipality program required to support the system

Team Access During Normal Working Hours

The Consultant typically works Monday through Friday 8:00AM to 5:00PM. The Municipality has direct access to the staff assigned to the Municipality. Alternatively, the Municipality can call the Consultant's general telephone number or submit an email to Consultant's service desk for service.

Emergency Event Support

The Consultant will support Municipality emergency events within a reasonable timeframe of notification and work to staff the event for its duration. These services are not limited to normal business hours.

The Service Level section below expands on the program staffing services included in this agreement.

Staffing Allocation

Pursuant to the GISC membership agreement and bylaws all members must contract for a service level consistent with the allocation practices as prescribed by the GISC. The direct program staffing allocation for the Municipality for this agreement period is:

Agreement Period: January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023

Direct Program Hours: 1,154.00

Onsite presence: Average of 10.82 days per month; estimated based upon 90 percent of the direct program hours, provided the Municipality and Consultant shall consult with each other in good faith from time to time on the advisability of flexible work arrangements whereby the program hours may be completed off-site, particularly in circumstances where the assigned staff and program are meeting or exceeding expectations.

Fees and Expenses

The monthly fee for the staffing allocation is \$12,982.50 per month. The total contract value for the agreement period is \$155,790.00.

Included Services

This section identifies the professional staffing, products and solutions, and business structures included in this service agreement. The Municipality is responsible for identifying and prioritizing the aspects of the services that are most important. The Consultant is responsible for implementing those priorities and communicating progress.

Staffing and Program Management

The Consultant provides the required staffing and organization with the skills and expertise to manage, develop, and maintain the system per the Municipality's priorities which includes GISC shared infrastructure, platforms, products and solutions. Services include:

- 1. Program consulting and reporting with all Municipality departments
- 2. Data creation, management, and quality control
- 3. Project identification, management, and delivery
- 4. Shared solution implementation
- 5. ERP and department system GIS integration
- 6. User training and onboarding
- 7. Resource management and scheduling

Data Management

The Consultant is responsible for managing the GIS and related data based on priorities as directed by the Municipality.

Primary Layers:

Addresses, parcels, buildings, streets, railroads, water utilities, sewer utilities, municipal boundary, zoning districts, planned unit developments, variances, TIF districts, special use permits, annexations, signs, trees, recreation areas, bike paths, water features, school districts, emergency response boundaries, refuse collection, and legislative districts.

Municipality Priority Layers

The Consultant's local government data model has over 260 standard layers. Included in this service is the identification, creation, and management of layers as directed by the Municipality.

Attachment 2 - Insurance

To GIS Consortium Service Provider Contract

Consultant's Insurance

Consultant shall procure and maintain, for the duration of this Contract, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property, which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Consultant, its agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

- A. Minimum Scope of Insurance: Coverage shall be at least as broad as:
 - 1. Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability occurrence form CG 0001 with the Municipality named as additional insured, on a form at least as broad as the ISO Additional Insured Endorsement CG 2010 and CG 2026.
 - 2. Insurance Service Office Business Auto Liability coverage form number CA 0001, Symbol 01 "Any Auto" with the Municipality named as additional insured, on a form at least as broad as the ISO Additional Insured Endorsement.
 - 3. Workers' Compensation as required by the Labor Code of the State of Illinois and Employers' Liability insurance (the policy shall include a 'waiver of subrogation').
- B. Minimum Limits of Insurance: Consultant shall maintain limits no less than:
 - 1. <u>Commercial General Liability</u>: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. The general aggregate shall be twice the required occurrence limit. Minimum General Aggregate shall be no less than \$2,000,000 or a project/contract specific aggregate of \$1,000,000.
 - 2. <u>Business Automobile Liability</u>: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
 - 3. <u>Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability</u>: Workers' Compensation coverage with statutory limits and Employers' Liability limits of \$500,000 per accident.
- C. <u>Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions</u>: Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the Municipality. At the option of the Municipality, either: (1) the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as it respects the Municipality, its officials, agents, employees and volunteers; or (2) the Consultant shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigation, claim administration and defense expenses.

- D. <u>Other Insurance Provisions:</u> The policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:
 - 1. General Liability and Automobile Liability Coverages: The Municipality, its officials, agents, employees and volunteers are to be covered as insureds as respects: liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Consultant; products and completed operations of the Consultant; premises owned, leased or used by the Consultant; or automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the Consultant. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the Municipality, its officials, agents, employees and volunteers.
 - 2. The Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary as respects the Municipality, its officials, agents, employees and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Municipality, its officials, agents, employees and volunteers shall be excess of Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
 - 3. Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the Municipality, its officials, agents, employees and volunteers.
 - 4. The Consultant's insurance shall contain a Severability of Interests/Cross Liability clause or language stating that Consultant's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
 - 5. If any commercial general liability insurance is being provided under an excess or umbrella liability policy that does not "follow form," then the Consultant shall be required to name the Municipality, its officials, employees, agents and volunteers as additional insureds
 - 6. All general liability coverages shall be provided on an occurrence policy form. Claims-made general liability policies will not be accepted.
 - 7. The Consultant and all subcontractors hereby agree to waive any limitation as to the amount of contribution recoverable against them by the Municipality. This specifically includes any limitation imposed by any state statute, regulation, or case law including any Workers' Compensation Act provision that applies a limitation to the amount recoverable in contribution such as *Kotecki v. Cyclops Welding*. Consultant agrees to indemnify and defend the Municipality from and against all such loss, expense, damage or injury, including reasonable attorneys' fees, which the Municipality may sustain as a result of personal injury claims by Consultant's employees, except to the extent those claims arise as a result of the Municipality's own negligence.
- E. <u>All Coverages</u>: Each insurance policy required by this paragraph shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be suspended, voided, cancelled, reduced in coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the Municipality.

- F. <u>Acceptability of Insurers</u>: Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a Best's rating of no less than A-, VII and licensed to do business in the State of Illinois.
- G. <u>Verification of Coverage</u>: Consultant shall furnish the Municipality with certificates of insurance naming the Municipality, its corporate authorities, officials, officers, agents, employees, and volunteers as additional insured's and with original endorsements, affecting coverage required herein. The certificates and endorsements for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. The certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the Municipality before any work commences. The Municipality reserves the right to request full certified copies of the insurance policies and endorsements.

2022 Property Tax Levy - Final Adoption

With the November 7th approval of the resolution estimating the amounts needed for the 2022 property tax levy, the remaining step in the process is adoption of a final tax levy ordinance. This is scheduled for the December 5th Village Board meeting.

A public hearing on the final proposed property tax levy is not required this year based on the requirements set forth in the Truth in Taxation Act.

To recap:

- 1. The Village levy amount is proposed at \$3,800,000 and represents <u>no</u> <u>increase</u> from the prior year levy.
- 2. The Library's levy amount is proposed at \$3,804,461 and represents an increase of \$60,000 from their 2021 levy. This is an increase of 1.6% over last year.

For reference, the maximum levy increase allowed for 2022 under the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law (a/k/a "tax cap" law) is the amount of increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) of **5.0%**. The Village, as a home rule unit, is not subject to tax caps, however has elected not to increase its levy in each of the last three years.

Following adoption of the final tax levy ordinance, it will be filed in with the County Clerk's Office no later than the last Tuesday in December as required by statute.

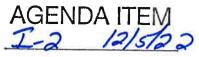

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR A PLANNED DEVELOPMENT AND A SHARED PARKING FACILITY PERMIT (REVIR CAROL STREAM, LLC – 400 MAIN PLACE)

WHEREAS, Rushi Shah, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, has petitioned the Village of Carol Stream for an Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Planned Development in accordance with Section 16-7-6 of the Unified Development Ordinance, on the property legally described in Section 1 herein and commonly known as 400 Main Place, Carol Stream, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 16-8-4 (L) of the Unified Development Ordinance, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on the above petition for a Special Use Amendment on November 28, 2022, following proper legal notice of said public hearing, after which the Commission recommended to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village that the Special Use Amendment be approved; and

WHEREAS, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its Findings and Recommendations regarding the Special Use Amendment with the Mayor and Board of Trustees, and the Mayor and Board of Trustees have duly considered said Findings and Recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

The Special Use Amendment, as set forth in the above recitals, is hereby approved and granted to Revir Carol Stream, LLC, subject to the conditions set forth in Section 2, upon the real estate commonly known as 400 Main Place, Carol Stream, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

LOT A IN T.E.A.M. DIVISION OF LOT 1 IN CARL A. GUNDERSEN'S SUBDIVISION UNIT NUMBER TWO, A SUBDIVISION IN THE WEST HALF OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 4, TOWNSHIP 39 NORTH, RANGE 10 EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MEDIDIAN, ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF RECORDED JULY 28, 1977 AS DOCUMENT 77-63839, IN THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, IN DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

hereinafter referred to as the Subject Property.

SECTION 2:

The approval of the Special Use Amendment granted in Section 1 herein is subject to the following conditions:

1. That all terms and conditions of Ordinance No. 77-07-39 not specifically revised herein shall be hereby reaffirmed by reference;

- 2. That all improvements, including but limited to the building, parking lot, fencing, and landscaping, must be built, installed, and maintained in accordance with the attached plans and exhibits;
- 3. That the landscape materials must be installed as shown on the attached landscape plan, and that all materials shall be maintained in a healthy condition, with dead or dying materials being replaced in accordance with the approved plan on an annual basis;
- 4. That a guaranty, in the form of a letter of credit or performance bond, approved by the Village Attorney and the Community Development Director, or a cash deposit made with the Village Treasurer for 20% of the total cost estimate of landscaping for the construction in January 1 dollars for the current year, shall be provided by the applicant for all required landscape improvements. Such guaranty shall be executed before building permits are issued. The 20% landscaping deposit shall be held in escrow for a period of 18 months past the time of planting and will be refunded on approval of the village, unless extended by the village per § 16-8-4(N)(10)(c);
- 5. That any required landscaped area, greater than 150 square feet in area, shall be provided with an underground irrigation system or be provided with a portable water supply within 50 feet of said landscaped areas, unless otherwise approved by the Engineering Services Director to accommodate native grasses. No part of an irrigation system may be installed in village right-of-way;
- 6. That parking lot lighting which meets requirements of the Unified Development Ordinance shall be required;
- 7. That permit drawings shall include the removal of concrete and gravel areas south of the subject building and restoration of the area with turf and landscape materials, and replacement of any existing deteriorated sidewalk areas on the property with new concrete sidewalk; and
- 8. That the site must be maintained and operated in accordance with all State, County and Village codes and regulations.

SECTION 3:

The approval of the Shared Parking Facility Permit granted herein is subject to the following conditions:

1. Authorization of the shared parking facility for the properties at 400 Main Place, 390 Executive Drive, and 392 Executive Drive will continue in effect only as long as the shared parking agreement, binding on all parties, remains in force. Should the agreement cease to be in force, parking must be provided as otherwise required by Section 16-5-2, or a new shared parking permit must be entered into and approved by the Village of Carol Stream within 60 days of termination of the original shared parking permit.

PLANNED DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS:

§ 16-7-3 STANDARDS FOR REVIEW.

Approval of development through the use of a planned development, including modifications to conventional zoning and subdivision regulations, is a privilege and will be considered by the village only in direct response to the accrual of tangible benefits from the planned development to the village or the neighborhood in which it would be located. These benefits shall be in the form of exceptional amenifies, outstanding environmental, landscape, architectural or site design, or the conservation of special man-made or natural features of the site. In reviewing an application for a planned development, the Plan Commission and/or Village Board, as the case may be, shall be required to make certain findings based on the following standards:

- (A) Required findings. No application for a planned development shall be approved unless all the following findings are made about the proposal:
- (7) Adequate buffering. The planned development shall have adequate landscaping, public open space, and other buffering features to protect uses within the development and surrounding properties.
- (B) Modification standards. In addition to the findings required above, the following standards shall be utilized in considering applications for modifications of the conventional zoning and subdivision regulations for a planned development. These standards shall not be regarded as inflexible but shall be used as a framework by the viltage to evaluate the quality of the amenities, benefits to the community, and design and desirability of the proposal.
- (7) Landscape conservation and visual enhancement. The existing landscape and trees in a planned development shall be conserved and enhanced, as feasible, by minimizing tree and soil removal, and the conservation of special landscape features such as streams, ponds, groves, and land forms. The addition or use of larger trees, shrubs, flowers, fountains, ponds, special paving amenities will be encouraged to the extent of their appropriateness and usefulness to the planned development and the likelihood of their continued maintenance.

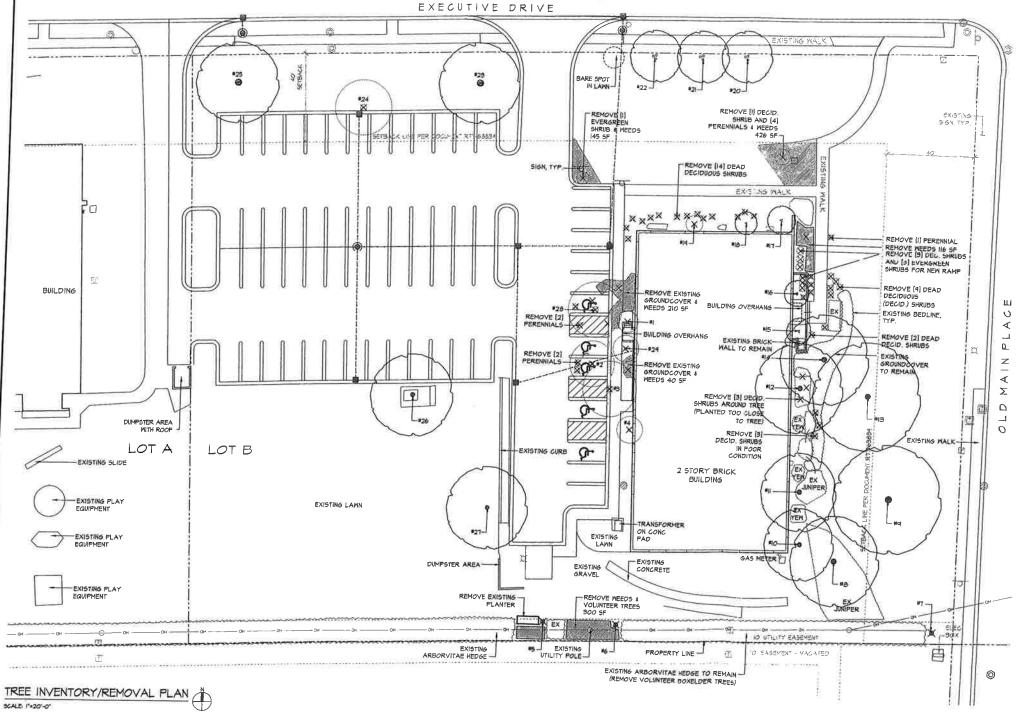

DECLARATION OF CROSS and RECIPROCAL PARKING EASEMENTS

This Declaration of Cross and Reciprocal Parking Easements Agreement (this "**Declaration**") is made as of September __, 2022 by **Revir Carol Stream**, **LLC**, an Illinois limited liability company ("**Owner**").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Owner is the fee simple owner of those certain parcels of land commonly known as 400 South Main Place Carol Stream, IL ("Parcel A"), 390 Executive Drive, Carol Stream, IL ("Parcel B") and 392 Executive Drive, Carol Stream, IL ("Parcel C"), which are all described in Exhibit A;

WHEREAS, Owner desires to create certain perpetual cross and reciprocal easements for the benefit of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C pursuant to the terms and conditions hereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, Owner hereby creates and grants the following easements:

1. CROSS EASEMENTS FOR INGRESS AND EGRESS; UTILITIES. Owner, as the record owner of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C hereby creates and grants, for the benefit of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, permanent, appurtenant, non-exclusive cross-easements for the purposes of use in common by the respective owners of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, of vehicular and pedestrian ingress, egress, parking passage and delivery between Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, including, without limitation, access for lessees, invitees, employees and licensees of each owner of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, on, over, upon and across the driveways, and drive aisles (the "Ingress and Egress Easements"). In addition, the owners of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C shall each retain any and all rights to use of existing drainage, piping, and other utilities that traverse between, through, and under Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, and neither the owner of Parcel A or Parcel B or Parcel C shall take any such actions to interfere with the use of such utilities without the authorized written consent of the owner of the other Parcel. The use of the Easement Area by persons or entities entitled to use the same ("Persons") shall be reasonable and in common with all other such Persons. Neither Owner, nor

any successor owners or lessees of either of Parcel A or Parcel B or Parcel C, nor their permittees lawfully occupying all or a portion of either Parcel A or Parcel B or Parcel C, shall obstruct or interfere with the free flow of pedestrian and vehicular traffic over the Easement Area. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the free flow of pedestrian and vehicular traffic may be obstructed or interfered with solely to the extent necessary for reasonable repair and maintenance of the Easement Area, for traffic regulation and control within the Easement Area, and to prevent a dedication thereof or the accrual of any prescriptive rights by any Person or entity therein; provided, however, that any such obstruction or interference shall only be allowed if prior written notice thereof is given to the owner of the parcel affected by such obstruction or interference. The Ingress and Egress Easements granted hereunder shall include the right to enter upon the Ingress and Egress Easements to construct, install, maintain, repair and replace curbs, curb cuts, paving, concrete, signage and related driveway facilities and walkways. All easements granted hereunder shall exist by virtue of this Declaration, without the necessity of confirmation by any other document.

- 2. MAINTENANCE. The owners of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, shall each be responsible for the full costs and expenses, to maintain in good condition and repair, or cause to be maintained and kept in good condition and repair (including replacement as necessary), the portions of the Easement Area actually owned by the respective owner. The forgoing obligation to maintain, repair and keep in good condition and repair, shall, without limiting its generality, include the following:
 - A. Maintaining the surface at such grade and levels that the areas of the Ingress and Egress Easements may be used and enjoyed as a contiguous and homogeneous area, and maintaining the surface in a level, smooth and evenly-covered condition with the type of surfacing material originally installed or such substitute as shall in all material respects be substantially similar or better in quality, use and durability; and
 - B. Removing all papers, debris, snow, ice, filth and refuse and otherwise thoroughly cleaning the areas to the extent reasonably necessary to keep the areas in a neat, clean and orderly condition; and
 - C. Placing, keeping in repair and replacing any necessary and appropriate directional signs, striping, markers and lines; and operating, keeping in repair and replacing, when necessary, such artificial lighting facilities as will be reasonably required.

3. INSURANCE.

- A. Owner and/or any successor owners of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C with respect to the Easement Area located on its respective Parcel, shall maintain and cause to be maintained in full force and effect commercially reasonable standard of insurance.
- B. The liability insurance required under this Section 3 shall include all of the following: (a) a provision naming the owner(s) and/or lessee(s) of the other Parcel as an additional insured; (b) a provision that the policy may not be canceled or materially reduced in amount or coverage without at least 30 days' prior written notice by the insurer to each

insured and any additional insureds; (c) a provision for severability of interests; (d) a provision that an act or omission of one of the insureds or additional insureds which would void or otherwise reduce coverage, shall not reduce or void the coverage as to the other additional insureds of the insured, respectively; and (e) a provision for contractual liability coverage with respect to the indemnity obligation contained in Section 7 of this Declaration.

- C. All insurance required by this Section 3 shall be procured from companies licensed in the state of Illinois and shall be rated by Best's Insurance Reports not less than A-, class VIII. The insurance may be carried under (a) an individual policy covering Parcel A or Parcel B or Parcel C, (b) a blanket policy or policies which include other liabilities, properties and locations of such party, or (c) a combination of any of the foregoing insurance programs. To the extent any deductible is permitted or allowed as a part of any insurance policy carried by a party in compliance with this Section 3, such party shall be deemed to be covering the amount of such deductible under an informal plan of self-insurance. Each party agrees to furnish to any party requesting the same, certificates of insurance evidencing that the insurance required to be carried by such requested party is in full force and effect.
- 4. COVENANTS TO RUN WITH THE LAND. This Declaration and the easements, rights and obligations granted and created herein, are intended to create mutual and reciprocal benefits, servitudes, rights, obligations and restrictions between the areas of the Ingress and Egress Easements and the Parcels; shall constitute covenants running with the land pursuant to Illinois law; and shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Owner, the Owner's successors (by merger, consolidation or otherwise) and assigns, lessees, the successor owners of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, their respective successors (by merger, consolidation or otherwise) and assigns, and all other Persons acquiring any interest in either Parcel A or Parcel B or Parcel C, or any portion thereof.
- 5. NOT A PUBLIC DEDICATION. Nothing contained in this Declaration shall be deemed to be a gift or dedication of any portion of the area of the Ingress and Egress Easements to the general public or for the general public or for any public purposes whatsoever, it being the intention of the Declarant that this Declaration and the easements granted hereunder shall be strictly limited to and for the purposes herein expressed.
- 6. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF; COST OF ENFORCEMENT. In the event of any breach, violation, or threatened breach or violation of the rights granted or created under this Declaration, the non-breaching party shall, in addition to any and all other remedies available to it, be entitled to enforce this Declaration by injunctive relief or otherwise. The prevailing party in any action to enforce this Declaration or otherwise arising out of this Declaration shall be entitled to recover from the non-prevailing party all reasonable legal costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred in connection with such action.
- 7. INDEMNITY; NO LIENS. The owners or lessees of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, their respective successors and/or assigns, shall indemnify, assume the defense of and hold free and harmless the other, from and against any and all obligations, liabilities, claims, demands, loss,

damage, injury, suit, causes of action, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees) incurred by, or awarded against the indemnified party relating to or arising out of the activities of the indemnifying party, or the injury to or death of any person, or damage to the property of any person which shall occur on the Parcel owned by each indemnifying party, except for claims caused by the negligence or willful act or omission of the indemnified party, its lessees, occupants, licensees, concessionaires, agents, servants, or employees, or the agents, servants, or employees of any lessee, licensee or concessionaire thereof. Neither the Owner nor any successor owner or lessee of Parcel A or Parcel B or Parcel C shall suffer or permit any lien of mechanics or materialmen or others to be placed against the Easement Area or any other portion of Parcel A or Parcel B or Parcel C with respect to work or services claimed to have been performed for, or materials claimed to have been furnished to, such party or its agents pursuant to this Declaration.

- 8. NON-MERGER. The easements and the rights and obligations granted and created by this Declaration are for the mutual benefit and protection of the present and all future owners of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C. If at any time there should be common ownership of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, then it is the intention of the parties hereto that there be no merger of the easements into the respective fee estate, but rather the easements and the rights, benefits, obligations, restrictions and burdens shall be separately preserved for the benefit of all future owners and lessees of the respective properties.
- lessee of Parcel A or Parcel B or Parcel C, to perform, fulfill or observe any agreement to be performed, fulfilled or observed by any Parcel owner hereunder, and such failure shall continue for 30 days following notice of such failure to such party, or immediately in situations involving potential danger to the health or safety of persons in, on or about the property subject to this Declaration, the owner or lessee of a Parcel may, at its election, cure such failure or breach for and on behalf of the other party, and any amount which a party expends for such purpose, will be paid to the non-defaulting party on demand, without contest, upon delivery of the non-defaulting party's invoice, together with interest at the lower of (i) the rate of 10% per annum, or (ii) the maximum rate permissible from time to time under applicable law, from the date of the expenditure to the date of payment in full. No default under this Declaration shall entitle any Party to terminate, cancel or otherwise rescind this Declaration or the easements granted thereby; provided, however, this limitation shall not affect any other rights or remedies the Parties may have by reason of any default under this Declaration.
- 10. MODIFICATIONS. Except as expressly provided in this Declaration, this Declaration may not be modified in any respect whatsoever or rescinded, in whole or in part, or terminated, except by the consent of the owners and/or ground lessees of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C, and then only by written instrument duly executed, acknowledged by the owners and/or ground lessees, of Parcel A and Parcel B and Parcel C and recorded in the public records of DuPage County, Illinois.
- 11. **RESERVED RIGHTS.** Each Party reserves the right to temporarily close off a portion or all of the Easement area as may be needed to improve or maintain its driveways and drive aisles on its Parcel for such reasonable periods of time as may be necessary to complete such work. Before any Party closes off any portion of the Easement located upon their Parcel, it will make a

good faith effort to notify the other Parties in writing of such action to limit any unreasonable interference with the operation of the other Party's Parcel.

12. NOTICE. Notices or other communication hereunder shall be in writing and shall be sent certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, or by other national overnight courier company, or personal delivery. Notice shall be deemed given upon receipt or refusal to accept delivery. Each party may change from time to time their respective address for notice hereunder by like notice to the other party. A copy of the Notice may be sent to the taxpayer of record. The notice addresses of the Parcel Owners as of the date hereof are as follows:

- 13. GOVERNING LAW and VENUE. This Declaration shall, in all respects, be governed, construed, applied, and enforced in accordance with the law of the State of Illinois without giving effect to principles of conflict of laws and shall benefit and shall be binding upon the Parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. The Parties hereby consent to exclusive jurisdiction and venue in the county where the Property is located.
- 14. SEVERABILITY. Each provision of this Declaration and the application thereof to the Parcels are hereby declared to be independent of and severable from the remainder of this Declaration. If any provision contained herein shall be held to be invalid or to be unenforceable or not to run with the land, such holding shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remainder of this Declaration. In the event the validity or enforceability of any provision of this Declaration is held to be dependent upon the existence of a specific legal description, the parties agree to promptly cause such legal description to be prepared. Ownership of the Parcels by the same person or entity shall not terminate this Declaration nor in any manner affect or impair the validity or enforceability of this Declaration.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-___-

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR A KENNEL AND BOARDING FACILITY (INDOOR) (CAROL STREAM ANIMAL HOSPITAL, 160 W. ELK TRAIL)

WHEREAS, Dr. Mondrian Contreras, owner of the Carol Stream Animal Hospital, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, has petitioned the Village of Carol Stream for an Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Kennel and Boarding Facility (Indoor), as provided in Section 16-3-11 of the Unified Development Ordinance, on the property legally described in Section 2 herein and commonly known as 160 W. Elk Trail, Carol Stream, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 16-8-4 (L) of the Unified Development Ordinance, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on the above petition on November 28, 2022, following proper legal notice of said public hearing, after which the Commission recommended to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village that the Special Use Amendment be approved; and

WHEREAS, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its Findings and Recommendations regarding the Special Use Amendment with the Mayor and Board of Trustees, and the Mayor and Board of Trustees have duly considered said Findings and Recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, after examining the Petition for the Special Use Amendment, and the Findings and Recommendations of the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined and find that the requested Special Use Amendment:

- 1. Is deemed necessary for the public convenience at the location. The facility will provide a service and will be considered a public convenience at the subject location.
- 2. Will not be unreasonably detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare. Overall, the facility and limited outdoor activity should not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort, or general welfare.
- 3. Will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood. Fencing with a screening mechanism should limit potential adverse impacts on surrounding properties, along with monitoring or limiting the number of dogs outside of the facility.

- 4. Will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding property for uses permitted in the district. It is not believed that the proposed facility should have an impact on the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding properties.
- 5. Will provide adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other important and necessary community facilities. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other public improvements are in place.
- 6. Will conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as the Village Board may in each instance modify such regulations. The project is expected to conform to all applicable codes and requirements.

SECTION 2:

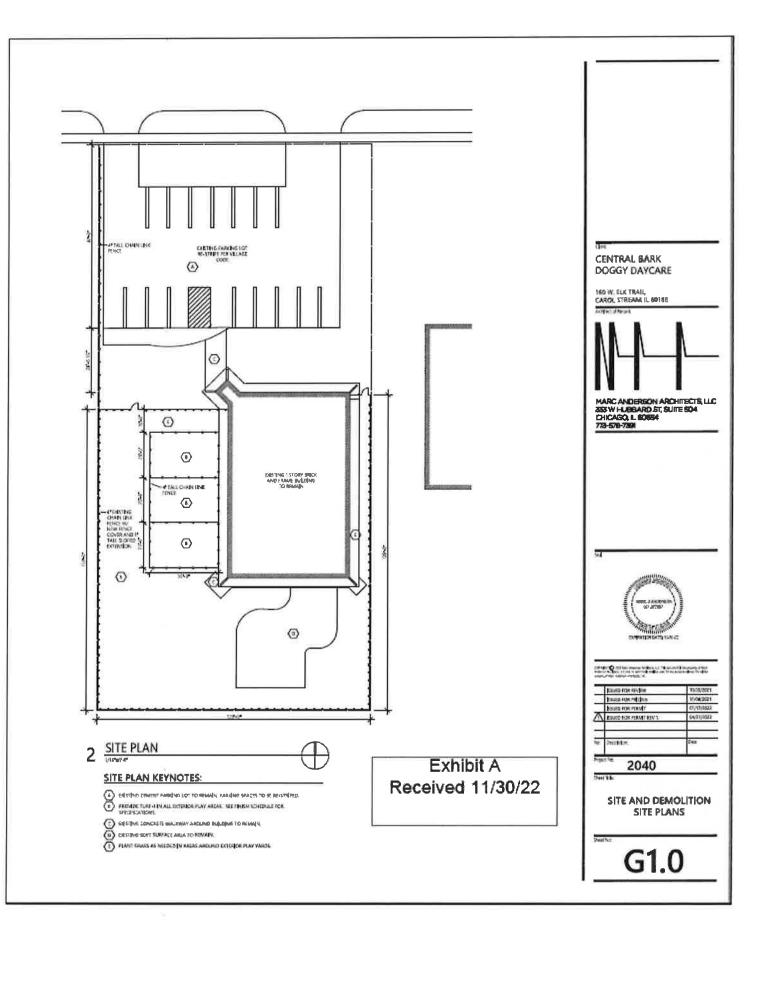

Six-Month Extension of Execution of Ordinance No. 2022-10-44

Mr. Eric Prechtel, on behalf of Tyndale House Ministries, requests approval of an extension for the execution of Ordinance No. 2022-10-44. On October 3, 2022, the Village Board adopted Ordinance No. 2022-10-44, which granted approval of an Amendment to a Special Use Permit for a Planned Development (PD) and Rear Yard Building Setback Variation for Tyndale House Ministries at 504 S. Schmale Road. Tyndale House proposes to construct a 53,000 square foot addition onto their southern warehouse building. The addition will be located on a lot that is currently designated as Lot 1 in the Geneva Crossing Phase II development. The lot will be consolidated with the main Tyndale House lot and removed from the Geneva Crossing Phase II PD. A variation was also approved to reduce the addition's rear yard building setback from 40 feet to 30 feet.

Section 6 of Ordinance No. 2022-10-44 requires the owner of the subject property to deliver to the Village an executed copy signed by the owner within sixty (60) days after passage and approval, resulting in an execution deadline date of December 2, 2022. However, an extension may be granted at the discretion of the corporate authorities by motion. The subject property is subject to an Operation and Easement Agreement (OEA), which contains certain restrictions regarding development of the property. Tyndale's purchase of the subject property is contingent upon the release from the OEA. While the current property owner continues to work diligently towards obtaining the signatures required for the release, the signatures have not yet been acquired. As such, Tyndale has been unable to close on the purchase of the subject property. For these reasons, Tyndale is requesting that Village grant an extension of the execution date for Ordinance No. 2022-10-44 to May 31, 2023, which is one hundred eighty (180) days from the date of the original expiration. Staff supports the execution extension in this instance, and believes that Tyndale will diligently work to execute the ordinance and move forward with the building addition project once the release from the OEA has been accomplished.

If the Village Board concurs with staff's recommendation, they should approve the six-month execution extension request for Ordinance No. 2022-10-44, for Tyndale House Ministries at 504 S. Schmale Road, to a date certain of May 31, 2023, and adopt the necessary Ordinance.

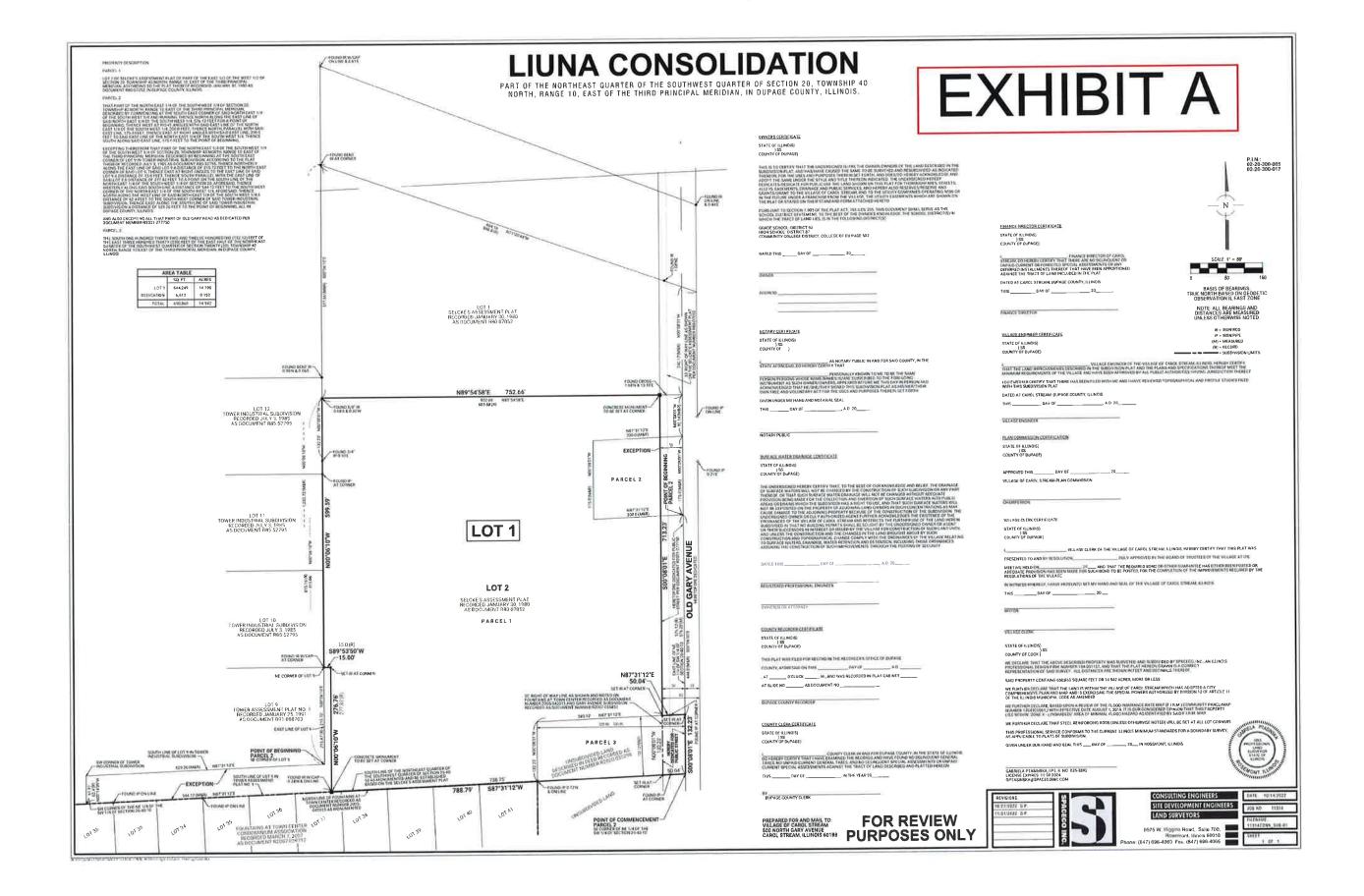

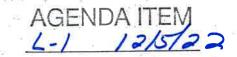
