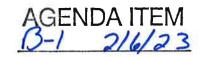

Trustee Gieser proposed treating Cannabis Dispensaries the same as Alcoholic Liquor Dealers with a distance buffer requirement of 100 feet from "any place of worship, school, hospital, home for aged or indigent persons or for veterans, their spouses and children, or any military or naval station". Pursuant to a discussion among Village Board members, Trustee Berger moved and Trustee Gieser made the second to modify the Text Amendment to Allow Adult Use Cannabis Dispensaries as a Special Use in the B-3 District by changing the distance buffer requirement from 1,000 feet to 100 feet. Item H.1. Presentation on Phase II of PWC Improvements was pulled off the Consent Agenda by Trustee McCarthy to allow for a separate presentation by Public Works Director Modaff. Upon conclusion of the presentation, the Village Board directed staff to proceed to Phase II engineering and bidding services and return to the Village Board in February with a proposed design/bidding services agreement.

Item I.1. Ordinance Amending Chapter 16 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances (Adult Use Cannabis Dispensaries as a Special Use in the B-3 District) was pulled off the Consent Agenda by Trustee Garvey in order to register his opposition. After discussion among Village Board members, Trustee Berger made the motion and Trustee Gieser made the second to approve Amending Chapter 16 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances (Adult Use Cannabis Dispensaries as a Special Use in the B-3 District) as modified with a distance buffer requirement of 100 feet from "any place of worship, school, hospital, home for aged or indigent persons or for veterans, their spouses and children, or any military or naval station". The results of the roll call vote were as follows:

Item I.2. Ordinance Amending Chapter 11, Intoxicating Liquor, Article 2, Alcoholic Liquor Dealers of the Village of Carol Stream Code of Ordinances in regards to the Sale of Alcoholic Liquor at Gas Stations was pulled off the Consent Agenda by Trustee Garvey in order to have a separate discussion before the vote. Village Board members questioned the logic of allowing single servings of hard liquor to be sold at gas stations, while prohibiting the sale of single servings of beer. Trustee Gieser made the motion and Trustee McCarthy made the second to amend the proposed Ordinance to remove the provision in sections M.1. and M.2. prohibiting the sale of single servings of beer, and to allow for the sale of single servings of all types of alcoholic beverages including beer, wine and hard liquor. The results of the roll call vote were as follows:

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

Trustee Berger acknowledged Martin Luther King Day, and suggested honoring his memory by doing a little more for our community, helping others and standing up for what's right throughout the year.

Trustee Garvey thanked Assistant to the Village Manager Messino for her exemplary service to Carol Stream; and shared his observation of Martin Luther King's enormous impact on our culture and society.

Trustee Zalak congratulated the winners and thanked the judges and all residents who participated in the recent Holiday Decorating Contest; shared some of the facts he learned about Martin Luther King and read one of his quotes: "The ultimate measure of a man is not where he stands in moments of comfort and convenience, but where he stands in time of challenge and controversy"; shared his message to be kind to each other, try to get along, and agree to disagree; and asked that we keep our first responders and military in our thoughts and prayers, especially those police officers who witnessed the recent tragedy at Community Park.

Trustee Gieser congratulated the winners and thanked all participants in the Holiday Decorating Contest who helped make our community brighter this holiday season; shared two of his favorite Martin Luther King quotes: "Life's most persistent and urgent question is, What are you doing for others?" and "We must accept finite disappointment, but never lose infinite hope"; and thanked Assistant to the Village Manager Messino for all she did for our community and wished her the best in her new endeavors.

Trustee McCarthy shared his thoughts on Martin Luther King Day by encouraging everyone to find time to be better to each other; congratulated the winners and thanked the judges and all participants in the Holiday Decorating Contest; reported details on the upcoming Bags for Life Tournament including dates, sponsorships and names of charities being helped; and encouraged everyone to partake in the Bags Tournament, noting that it's not just about raising money, but also creating a sense of community.

Assistant to the Village Manager Messino gave her final report and farewell. She shared that Carol Stream Public Works was her first full-time job, and she thanked Village staff and the Village Board for giving her the opportunity to learn, grow and run with some of her "quirkier inspirations" in her nearly nine years serving our community. She expressed gratitude for the opportunity to be a member of the Carol Stream family.

Village Clerk Schwarze thanked Assistant to the Village Manager Messino for all she has done for Carol Stream and stated that she will be greatly missed; read a favorite Martin Luther King quote: "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that"; reminded residents of the Rotary Club coat drive ending January 26th; gave an update on the Consolidated Election for which early voting starts February 23rd; extended the invitation to join her and husband Greg in a

cleanup of the Carol Stream section of the Great Western Trail on April 29th; and encouraged residents to shop and dine Carol Stream.

Village Attorney Rhodes congratulated Assistant to the Village Manager Messino on her new position; thanked her for her assistance over the years which made his job much easier; and wished her all the best.

Village Manager Mellor offered clarification on video gaming history in Carol Stream: he reported that in 2013 when Carol Stream first implemented video gaming terminals there were 9 facilities having a total of 40 video gaming terminals with revenues of about \$30,000; currently we have 21 facilities with 120 video gaming terminals, and have generated over the last decade total revenue of approximately \$2.2 million.

Mayor Saverino reported the sad news of two longtime Carol Stream residents who passed away last week, and that his wife was taken back to the hospital this morning in serious condition; thanked all the people who decorated for the Holiday Decorating Contest, both winners and losers; commended Public Works for a great presentation tonight; commended the Police Department for their work, especially the officers who witnessed the recent Community Park tragedy; and stated that he is looking forward to the election.

Inc., for Phase II Planning and Design for PWC Phase II Improvements

On August 1, 2022, the Village Board approved an architectural and engineering services agreement for the preliminary planning and design of Phase II improvements at the Public Works Center (PWC)¹ and a remote parcel at the WRC. Following completion of that work, a presentation was made to the Village Board at the January 16 meeting; the Village Board authorized staff to prepare a recommendation for final design and bidding services.

Attached is an Amendment to the original Architectural Services Agreement, which includes completion of design, construction of bidding documents and review of bids and recommendation for award. The cost for this work is \$187,460. The Village Attorney has reviewed and approved the attached proposed Amendment.

Staff recommends a Motion to authorize the Village Manager to execute an Amendment to the Architectural Services Agreement approved by the Village Board on August 1, 2022, with Kluber, Inc., for final design and bidding services for the Public Works Facilities Phase II Improvements Project up to the amount of \$187,460.

¹ Phase II improvements are focused on outdoor storage needs and exterior yard improvements, including: relocation of the Police impound lot and PW spoil and raw material storage to the vacant parcel adjacent to the WRC, re-purposing of existing raw material storage bins, demolition of spoil storage bins and improvement of site drainage to eliminate runoff.

Recommendation for Purchase of a Combination Vacuum/Flusher Truck

The Public Works Department purchased its first combination vacuum/flusher truck in 2012 for \$331,500. A combination vacuum/flusher truck is routinely used to support several critical services, including: flushing blockages and cutting root concentrations in storm and sanitary sewer pipes, hydro-excavation for exposing underground utilities in need of repair, working in concert with sewer pipe televising and storm sewer inlet and catch-basin cleaning.

When the existing unit was purchased, staff estimated the unit's service life would be approximately twenty (20) years and the cost of replacement would be nearly \$600,000. However, this was the first combination unit purchased by the department and its frequency of use was underestimated and expected service life was over-estimated. The vehicle has seen considerably heavier use in the past several years due to an increased focus on storm sewer inlet and catch-basin cleaning, driving higher maintenance and repair costs. In the past four years, maintenance and repair costs totaled just under \$97,000, representing eighty-percent (80%) of lifetime maintenance costs. In talking with other agencies about life expectancy for this type of vehicle, we have learned that 10-12 years is a more reasonable expectation.

With an original expected replacement year of 2032, the Equipment Replacement Fund has accumulated \$359,000 towards replacement. All replacement contributions to date have been assessed to the Water/Sewer fund. However, due to significant use of the equipment on storm sewer maintenance activities, the assessment of replacement contributions should reasonably be split 50/50 between the Water/Sewer and General Funds.

The attached proposal from Standard Equipment is for a new unit at a cost of \$529,845.08¹. The vehicle is under assembly and will be completed by late-March. Approving purchase at this time will guarantee the equipment will be held for Carol Stream, with delivery at the start of the coming fiscal year.² The vehicle is available for purchase via a joint-bid contract from Sourcewell under contract number 101221-VTR (a copy of the contract cover page is attached for reference).

¹ Upon receipt of the vehicle, Public Works staff will expend approximately \$2,600 more to up-fit the truck with a radio, decals, lighting, etc.

² Standard Equipment has agreed to hold the unit for delivery after May 1 to accommodate the Village's fiscal year.

Page Two January 31, 2023

To fund a replacement of the vehicle in FY24, the Equipment Replacement Fund can provide \$266,250 of already accumulated funds, which would leave another \$266,250 to be assessed to the General Fund Streets budget. The Finance Director has indicated the General Fund is in a position to contribute this amount in FY24.

It is recommended that the Village Board approve a Motion to purchase a Vactor 2100i under Sourcewell Contract #101221-VTR in the amount of \$529,845.08, pursuant to the provisions of Section 5-8-3(B) and subsection 5-8-14(L) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

Stations Generator Replacements to Powerlink Electric, Inc.

In August 2022, the Village Board approved an engineering services agreement with Baxter & Woodman for the design and bidding services for the water pumping station generators at Kuhn Road and the Public Works Center (PWC).

You may recall, the PWC generator was planned to be replaced as part of the PWC Phase I Interior Improvements that have recently started. However, due to the procurement timing and inflationary pricing of the generator, we removed the generator from the project and recommended to package the PWC generator with the replacement of the Kuhn Rd. pumping station generator that is budgeted for FY24.

Under this plan and schedule, we would design, bid, and if approved by the Village Board, award a contract for purchase and installation of both generators in this fiscal year. Due to the projected delivery time, the generators would not be received and installed until well into FY24. Therefore expenses for both generators would be assigned to next fiscal year. The proposed FY24 budget to replace both generators includes \$325,000 in the Capital Projects Fund and \$325,000 in the Water Sewer Fund totaling \$650,000.

The proposed construction consists of replacement of the existing 350kW diesel engine generators at the Kuhn Rd Pump Station and PWC Pump Station, diesel fuel day tanks, equipment pad, exhaust and silencers, conduit and wire, Add Option #1 addition of main disconnect switches, Add Option #2 manual transfer switches, and updated control connections. Staff established two (2) add options to provide the most flexibility in the operation of the generators and to limit our reliance on the electric utility company for any future repairs.²

On Thursday, January 26th bids were opened for the project and read aloud. The following is a summary of the bids as read:

The low bid including add options was provided by Powerlink Electric, Inc. for \$439,895.00. Powerlink Electric, Inc.'s bid is \$210,105 under the proposed FY24 budget of \$650,000. Baxter & Woodman has checked references that have completed similar projects with Powerlink Electric, Inc. All have had successful results and provided positive feedback.

Public Works recommends the Kuhn Rd. and Public Works Center Water Pumping Stations Generator Replacement be awarded to Powerlink Electric, Inc. at the base bid presented plus Add Option #1 and Add Option #2, for the total amount of \$439,895.00.

Municipal Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax

On January 16, 2023, the Village Board adopted Ordinance No. 2023-01-01 amending Chapter 16 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances (Adult Use Cannabis Dispensaries as a Special Use in the B-3 District). The Village Board recognized the revenue generating potential of these types of State authorized businesses for Carol Stream.

Municipalities, by ordinance, may impose a Municipal Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax on adult-use cannabis products of up to 3% of the purchase price, in 0.25% increments. Counties may also impose up to 3% within municipalities, both in 0.25% increments. The taxes imposed under this Act are in addition to all other occupation, privilege or excise taxes imposed by the State of Illinois or by any unit of local government, such as regular sales tax. The Illinois Municipal Code provides that municipal tax ordinances adopted and certified to the Illinois Department of Revenue (IDOR) on or before April 1 of any year, shall be administered and those local tax collections enforced by IDOR commencing on July 1 of the same year. Ordinances adopted and certified to IDOR on or before October 1 of any year shall be administered and collections enforced by IDOR commencing on January 1 of the following year. (65 ILCS 5/8-11-23).

Attached for the Village Board's consideration, is an Ordinance amending Chapter 5, Taxation and Finance and adding a new Article 16, Municipal Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax Adopting a Municipal Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax within the Village of Carol Stream at three percent (3%) on all retail sales of cannabis products within the Village. If the Village Board wishes to impose this tax on cannabis products, the total Village, County, RTA and State tax on cannabis products would be 14% if the Board adopts the attached Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax. The motion would be to pass the attached Ordinance Adopting a Municipal Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax within the Village of Carol Stream at the three percent (3%) rate.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A MUNICIPAL CANNABIS RETAILERS' OCCUPATION TAX WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a); Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and may exercise powers pertaining to its local governmental affairs; and

WHEREAS, Section 8-11-23 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-11-23) specifically allows home rule municipalities to impose a tax on cannabis sales made within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Village's home rule authority, the Village desires to impose a cannabis retailers' occupation tax of three percent (3%) on all retail sales of cannabis products within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, find that it is in the best interests of the Village to adopt a tax upon the retail purchase of cannabis products within the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, in the exercise of its home rule powers, as follows:

SECTION 1:

The Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, Chapter 5, "Taxation and Finance" is hereby amended by adding Article 16, "Municipal Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax", which shall read as follows:

ARTICLE 16 MUNICIPAL CANNABIS RETAILERS' OCCUPATION TAX

5-16-1 Tax Imposed; Rate

5-16-2 Collection of Tax by Retailers

5-16-1: TAX IMPOSED; Rate:

A: A tax is hereby imposed upon all persons engaged in the business of selling cannabis, other than cannabis purchased under the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act, at retail in the Village of Carol Stream at the rate of three percent (3%) of the gross receipts from such cannabis sales made in the course of that business. The tax levied in this section shall be paid in addition to any and all other taxes and charges.

B. The imposition of this tax is in accordance with and subject to the provisions of Section 8-11-23 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-11-23) in force now or as hereafter amended.

5-16-2: COLLECTION OF TAX BY RETAILERS:

- A. The tax imposed by this Article shall be remitted by retailers in the business of selling cannabis (Retailers) to the Illinois Department of Revenue (Department). Any tax required to be collected pursuant to or as authorized by this Article and any such tax collected by such retailer and required to be remitted to the Illinois Department of Revenue shall constitute a debt owed by the Retailer to the State of Illinois. Retailers may reimburse themselves for their seller's tax liability hereunder by separately stating that tax as an additional charge, which charge may be stated in combination, in a single amount, with any State tax that sellers are required to collect.
- B. The taxes hereby imposed, and all civil penalties that may be assessed as an incident thereto, shall be collected and enforced by the Illinois Department of Revenue in accordance with the provisions of Section 8-11-23 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-11-23). The Illinois Department of Revenue shall have full power to administer and enforce the provisions of this Article.
- C. The failure of a Retailer to timely collect or remit all taxes due pursuant to this Article is a violation of Carol Stream Code of Ordinances and may be subject to those penalties imposed by the Illinois' Department of Revenue applicable under the Illinois Municipal Cannabis Retailers Occupation Tax Law.
- D. The record requirements and audit procedures shall be as provided in and authorized by the Retailers Occupation Tax Act (35 ILCS 120/7 and implemented by the Illinois Department of Revenue.

SECTION 2:

Those sections, paragraphs, and provisions of the Village of Carol Stream Code of Ordinances which are not expressly amended or repealed by this Ordinance are hereby re-enacted, and it is expressly declared to be the intention of this Ordinance not to repeal or amend any portions of the Village of Carol Stream Code of Ordinances other than those expressly amended or repealed in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3:

The invalidity of any section or provision of this Ordinance hereby passed and approved shall not invalidate other sections or provisions thereof.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Illinois Department of Revenue on or before April 1, 2023.

SECTION 5:

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be become effective on July 1, 2023.

Suson LLC d/b/a Carol Stream BP located at 105 W. North Avenue currently has a Class P liquor license and is applying for a Class PL liquor license. Carol Stream BP currently sells packaged beer and wine and would like to sell all packaged alcohol. Attached for your consideration is an Ordinance decreasing their existing Class P liquor license and granting a Class PL liquor license to Suson LLC d/b/a Carol Stream BP, 105 W. North Avenue.

The application submitted by Suson LLC has found to be in order and background checks have been previously performed. Mayor Saverino as Local Liquor Commissioner is recommending issuance of this license.

Accordingly, staff recommends adoption of the attached Ordinance.

An agreement for additional STU funding of \$53,745 is required between the Village of Carol Stream and the Illinois Department of Transportation specifying the terms and conditions for the use of federal and state grant funding for construction of the referenced project. The estimated division of cost is now \$414,345 in federal funds, \$10,700 in state funds, and \$158,127 in local funds for construction and construction engineering.

The FY23 budget included \$480,000 for project construction, with \$362,300 shown as grant fund revenue and a Village share of \$117,700.00. This is the difference of \$40,427 in anticipated Village costs and an increase of \$62,745 in grant funding. Actual costs will be based off the bid unit prices in the construction contract, not the engineer's estimate of costs.

Cost sharing is 75% of construction costs (up to \$328,745) in Surface Transportation funding, and 80% of construction costs over that in ITEP funding (up to \$36,160). Construction engineering will also be paid from ITEP funding, with 80% (\$49,440) federal, 10% state, and 10% Village (\$10,700 each).

Engineering staff therefore recommends the Local Public Agency Agreement for Federal Participation Amendment #1 for the Kuhn Road Bike Trail extension be approved and five (5) originals submitted to the Illinois Department of Transportation along with the Resolution for Project Cost Increase.

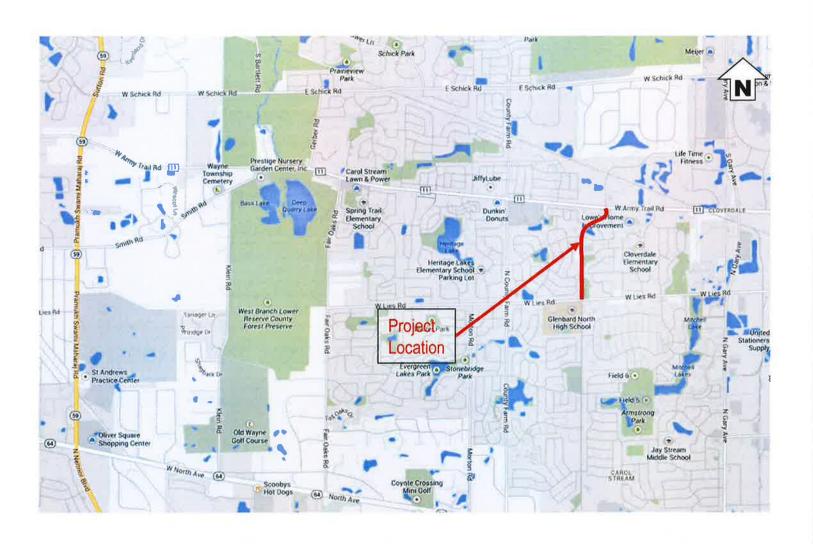

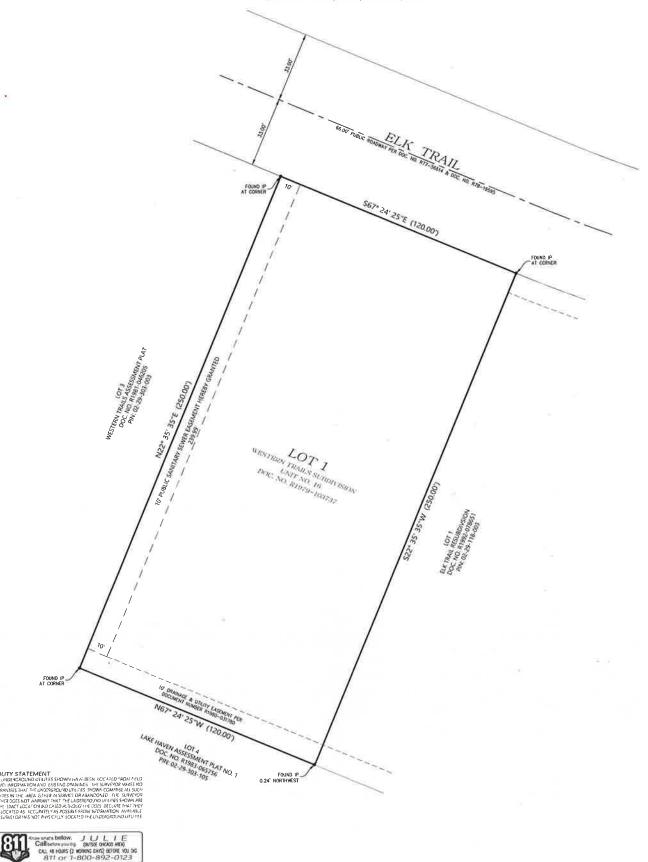
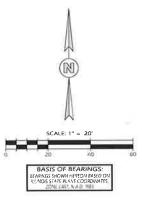

Electric Supply Auction

In January 2017 the Village Board approved a resolution authorizing the Mayor or his designee to execute an agreement for the purchase of electric utility service for our large and small commercial accounts based on the low bid received by our consultant Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Cooperative (NIMEC). These accounts include our lift stations and water tower pumping stations. That contract subsequently expired and was renewed in 2020. Our current large commercial accounts contract expires in May, 2023 and the new contract bid date is March 2rd. A second bid for Village street lights will take placed in late May/early June.

The current ComEd commercial rate is 9.665 cents, Constellation is currently at 4.206 cents; the Village is expecting a more favorable rate with again than ComEd.

Locking in a multi-year rate has the advantage of allowing staff to budget electricity expenses with more certainty and potentially avoids future market rate increases. The downside is that if rates decline, we would not be able to access the lower rate.

To accept the quoted rates, we will need to enter into an agreement with the lowest cost rate supplier on the day the rate is quoted. Staff recommends approving the attached resolution allowing NIMEC to bring forward updated rate quotes and to allow the Mayor or designee to enter into an agreement with the lowest cost electricity supplier subject to final contract review. This resolution would apply to the bids being received on March 2 as well as the subsequent bid for street lights in late May/early June.

WHEREAS the Village of Carol Stream ("The Village") is a municipality in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and,

WHEREAS, on January 2, 2007, the State of Illinois implemented a plan to deregulate Commonwealth Edison; and,

WHEREAS, as a result of this deregulation, electricity may be purchased based on market price and Commonwealth Edison will no longer be the sole supplier of electricity in northern Illinois, resulting in new electricity suppliers being able to compete against Commonwealth Edison, and competitive market forces dictating the price of electricity; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream has selected the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative (NIMEC) to serve as the Village's broker relative to the acquisition of electrical energy for Village facilities, due to NIMEC's municipal experience and the fact that NIMEC is the largest municipal Collaborative in northern Illinois which will be aggregating the energy needs of 150 government members of the Collaborative in order to secure more competitive pricing based in higher volumes than can be provided individually to a single municipality; and,
