### Case #23-0030 - E.P. Doyle & Sons, LLC/Bartel's Auto Clinic - 160 S. Gary Avenue

Special Use Permit for Auto Repair Zoning Variation Gary Avenue Corridor Review

Acting Chairman Tucek swore in Mr. Tim Doyle, 1100 Wheaton Oaks Ct, Wheaton, Illinois, and asked him to provide his presentation.

Mr. Doyle stated we are missing some key members, but Ann is representing Partners and Design so if there are any questions relative to the architecture she can speak about that. We are here as the design builder and leading the effort for the Bartel family to mimic what they currently have right now at the corner of St. Charles and Gary. Their business has really taken off not only at this location but in other communities that they serve. They were the original owners of that property and developed it all except for that one acre out lot to the south. They are starting to have a parking problem because they are just too busy. They looked at a couple different options of adding on and it made the most sense, with the existing utilities and existing right-of-ways, to build another facility. The new facility will be very similar and we've made some improvements like a wider, deeper work base and more parking. This building will be less public driven, meaning the public won't come into as much as the current building, and more mechanic and building service driven. We have been working with Staff very well over the last several months and we have prepared a solid proposal and have met most of the requirements they are looking for.

Mr. Berisha started the Staff Report by stating Bartels is currently at 190 S. Gary Avenue and they own the one acre parcel at 160 S. Gary Avenue where they are proposing the development of the new repair facility. It will be 8,481 square feet and the primary purpose is to accommodate the growing needs of the business, alleviate some parking restraints and better serve customers.

Staff did conduct a parking study for this facility and, based on the requirements in our UDO, this facility will have 6,656 square feet of net floor area (per the code, the requirement states one parking space for every 250 square feet of net floor area) so they will require 13 spaces and one space per service bay. There will be ten service bays in the new facility for a total of 23 required spaces. They will have 50 spaces in the new development which exceeds the maximum permitted number. This was reviewed by Staff and believe it to be necessary in order for this facility to properly function and alleviate those parking constraints.

The minimum setback for a rear yard is 20 feet in the Industrial District. Bartels is proposing to reduce that to 16 feet 6 inches in order to maximum the working space inside the building, parking spaces and accommodate the service bays correctly. Bartels has contacted the property owner directly to the west, Artlow Systems, and they have confirmed there is no opposition to the variation being granted.

Staff has reviewed and is also supportive of the variation. Access to the site will be from a driveway off Gary Avenue and a sidewalk for customers to travel between the two facilities.

The trash enclosure will be located on the northwest corner of the building and the rooftop units will not be visible due to the height of the roofline. The exterior of the building will be insulated, precast concrete panels along with color bands on the sides of the building. The style and design will mimic the existing Bartel's Auto Clinic and Staff believes it will compliment the existing building and enhance the subject property which is currently vacant.

The landscaping proposed will consist of tree and shrub groupings on every parking lot island as well as along the Gary Avenue frontage for parking lot screening. There will also be foundation landscaping along the north and east sides of the building which will make it a more aesthetically pleasing site. Staff has reviewed the requests and recommend approval.

Acting Chairman Tucek asked for questions from the audience and there were none.

Acting Chairman Tucek asked for questions from the Commission.

Commissioners Morris and Pelella had no questions.

Commissioner Meneghini asked if they will be able to comply with the eight conditions.

Mr. Doyle stated yes we reviewed them all and we have no problem complying.

Commissioner Battisto asked about the current overflow of cars.

Mr. Doyle stated on average they are short now by about ten spaces. On the new building they will be adding 10 more stalls which is ten more spaces with 30 extra and I think that is going to come out almost perfect.

Acting Chairman Tucek stated it almost looks as if there is landscaping between the bike path and Gary Avenue. Is the petitioner responsible for that landscaping. But they are not there now though so the petitioner is not responsible for it.

Mr. Farace replied correct.

Commissioner Meneghini redirected and apologized for asking a question and not calling Mr. Doyle back up to the podium in order to hear his response.

Commissioner Petella moved and Commissioner Meneghini seconded the motion with no further discussion.

PC/ZBA Case 23-0030, Bartel's Auto Clinic – 160 S. Gary Avenue, Special Use Permit for an Auto Repair and Service Facility, Rear Yard Building Setback

Variation, and Gary Avenue Corridor Review

Tom Grotts, with E.P. Doyle & Son, on behalf of Patrick Bartel, owner of Bartel's Auto Clinic, requests approval of a Special Use Permit for an Auto Repair and Service facility, and a rear yard building setback Variation for the development of new Bartel's Auto Clinic facility at 160 S. Gary Avenue. The development will be an 8,481 square foot facility with 10 service bays. There will be 50 parking spaces to accommodate the growing needs of the business and to better serve customers. The parking spaces will exceed the maximum allowed, which is 20 percent beyond the minimum, but staff has reviewed the proposal and agrees that it is necessary for the development to function properly. Section 16-3-9 of the UDO states that the minimum setback for a rear yard is 20 feet in the Industrial District. Bartel's Auto Clinic proposes to reduce the rear yard property setback to 16 feet six inches. The Variation will maximize the working space inside the facility and is needed for the service bays to be built properly. Community Development staff and Engineering have reviewed the site plan and are supportive of the Variation. Architecturally, the new Bartel's facility will mimic the existing one in regard to design and with the proposed foundation and perimeter landscaping, staff believes the new facility will complement the existing facility and will provide another attractive site along the Gary Avenue corridor.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the PC/ZBA packet on July 21, 2023. At its meeting on July 24, 2023, by a vote of 5-0, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Special Use Permit, Zoning Variation, and Gary Avenue Corridor Review, subject to the conditions in the July 24, 2023 staff report.

If the Village Board concurs with the PC/ZBA recommendation, they should approve the Special Use Permit, and the Variation for Bartel's Auto Clinic, subject to the conditions contained within the Ordinance, and adopt the necessary Ordinance. Review and approval of Gary Avenue Corridor Review is not required.

Proposed Amendment to § 13-2-37 of the Village Code - Sewer Line

Maintenance/Replacement

At the July 17, 2023 regular Village Board meeting the Village Board directed staff to develop a Code amendment to address sanitary sewer service line repairs that occur under the roadway in the Village public right of way. This amendment was drafted to provide some relief to property owners who experience breaks in their private sanitary sewer service lines that occur under the Village roadway in consideration of some public benefit that otherwise would not occur if the repair were not made.

The grant would reimburse residents 50% of repair or replacement costs of their service lines falling under the Village roadway up to \$10,000 under conditions specified in the proposed Code amendment (attached) and later in a grant application.

### Several points to consider:

- The program would only be available prospectively (not for prior service line repairs) and subject to a determination that the roadway surface could be compromised if the repair was not made.
- The property owner would be responsible for televising and recording the exact location of the service line issue to enable Village staff to determine whether the flow blockage is a maintenance or a repair issue and whether it is under the Village roadway or on private property.
- The Code, as amended would provide relief to all property owners experiencing service line breaks under the roadway (the current Code language also applies to all property owners).
- The maximum proposed grant amount is \$10,000.
- A sewer rate adjustment may be required depending on the level of participation in and amount of grant disbursements for this new program.

Residents who need to repair their service lines under the Village roadway would need to obtain a permit and secure quotes from a licensed plumber or sewer contractor before performing any work. The Village will assemble a list of qualified, licensed contractors for property owner consideration but not endorsement by the Village.

The property owner will be responsible for securing the permit and contracting the work, who would then submit a copy of the paid contractor invoice to the Village for reimbursement of 50% of the cost up to the maximum reimbursement of \$10,000. The proposed amendment (addition of section (F)) is attached to this memo.

### § 13-2-37 SEWER LINE MAINTENANCE/ REPLACEMENT.

- (A) The property owner is responsible for the maintenance and repair of the private sewer line from their structure to the main sewer or public sewer including the connection into the main/public sewer.
- (B) In the event the property owner finds it necessary to excavate the private sewer line for maintenance or replacement, such excavation shall be the property owner's responsibility.
- (C) In those instances when property owners have had to excavate and as a result the sidewalk, curb and street have been dug out or damaged, the property owner will be responsible for the restoration of the street (surface and sub-surface) curb and sidewalk.
- (D) In those instances where division (C) of this section is involved, it is recommended tunneling under the curb and sidewalk whenever practical. Sidewalk and curb must be cut when removal is required.
- (E) All work, as it is related to the replacement and/or repair of the private sewer line, shall be in conformance with the village standard construction specifications and will be inspected by a duly authorized agent of the village during the repair and replacement.
- (F) The Village will participate in the repair or replacement of a private sanitary sewer service line located under the paved roadway within the Village's right-of-way subject to the following:
  - 1. The sanitary sewer service line has been televised by the property owner and based on the evidence provided to the Village, to include video and evidence of location of the potential issue, the Village Engineer or Public Works Director have determined the sewer service line under the paved roadway presents the potential to damage the Village's paved roadway or the Village's sewer main if uncorrected; and
  - 2. The only method of repair or replacement of the sanitary sewer service line requires excavation of the Village's paved roadway.
  - 3. The Village will reimburse the property owner fifty-percent (50%) of the costs toward the repair or replacement of the private sanitary sewer line under the Village paved roadway and pavement repair in an amount not to exceed \$10,000. The applicant will be responsible for all additional costs associated with the sanitary sewer service line repair or replacement in excess of these amounts.
  - 4. The applicant will indemnify, hold and release the Village from any and all liability arising from the repair of the sanitary sewer service line by the Village.
  - 5. Repair or replacement of any private sanitary sewer line outside of a Village paved roadway will be not be eligible for reimbursement and shall remain the responsibility of the homeowner pursuant to subsections (A) through (E) of this section.
  - 6. In all cases, maintenance of the entire private sanitary sewer service line shall remain the responsibility of the property owner, including but is not limited to flushing to clear blockages and root cutting in the property owner's service line.

### **BACKGROUND**

Together with the Public Works and Finance Departments, we maintain a replacement schedule for vehicles within the Police Department. Over the past 2-3 years, we have experienced order cancelations and delays due to supply chain problems. We have had to be creative in finding and purchasing police cars. While we have seen some improvement, delays remain and the car market continues to be uncertain. Due to this uncertainty among manufacturers, we ordered cars from both Dodge and Ford last year with the understanding that we did not have to accept them if/when they arrived. We over-ordered because we were uncertain whether the orders would actually be fulfilled by the manufacturers.

This year's replacement schedule plans for the following four cars to be replaced:

2017 (#676)	Dodge Charger	103,000
2013 (#632)	Jeep Cherokee (unmarked)	114,000
2014 (#641)	Dodge Ram Pickup	90,000

### **SUBJECT**

We recently learned that both Dodge and Ford have produced the cars from our orders last year, which means that we have nine cars available to us. Ford has also reported that they are reducing their production quantities for next year.

I recommend that we purchase six cars of the nine that are available. In addition to the replacements planned in the budget, this will allow us to replace two additional patrol cars that are a bit older, but have lower miles on them. These two cars will be reassigned as training cars, and will replace cars that are much older and have over 100,000 miles on them. This will finally put us in a position of turning a corner to put the overall fleet on more solid ground. While these two additional cars were not part of the FY 24 replacement plan, they are older

cars for which we had deferred replacement; they also experience intermittent problems (part of the reason that their miles are lower). I have reviewed this plan with the Finance Director and there are funds available in the vehicle replacement fund to support this purchase.

Last week, the Village Board provided preliminary approval for the purchase of the six cars so that we could release any that we did not want; and, take possession of the ones we do want.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

I recommend that we waive competitive bidding as authorized in section 5-8-14 of the Village Code, and purchase one (1) Ford Police Utility from Currie Motors for a total cost of \$43,277; and, five (5) Dodge Durangos from Thomas Dodge in Indiana for a total cost of \$205,787. Currie Motors holds the State of Illinois contract for the Ford Utilities; and, Thomas Dodge was able to fulfill the order for cars at a lower cost than the state contract.

The Village Board is asked to provide retroactive approval for this purchase.

Recommendation to Award to Chicago Sign Company for the Purchase of Replacement

Electronic Message Sign (500 Gary Avenue)

The adopted FY24 Budget included funds for the replacement of the electronic message board along 500 Gary Avenue in front of the Gregory J. Bielawski Municipal Facility. The current sign, installed by Chicago Signs in 2006 for \$45,698, is past its useful life with replacement parts no longer available.

Village staff solicited quotes from three companies and received the following pricing:

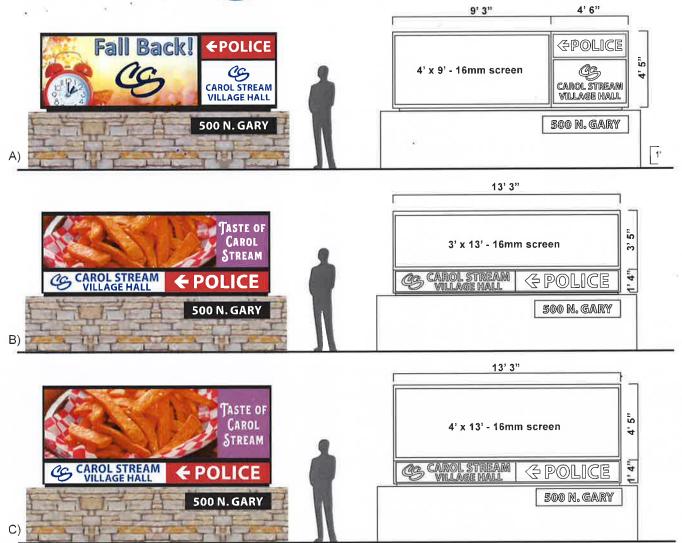
- 1. Chicago Sign Company \$63,295
- 2. Allegra \$69,195
- 3. Parvin Clauss \$79,864

Chicago Signs has previously installed signage for the Carol Stream Library and Park District and provided the lowest pricing options with Option C being the same dimensions as the existing sign panels. Due to the unique characteristics of the purchasing of an electronic sign of this type and familiarity with Chicago Signs, a waiver of competitive bidding pursuant to Section 5-8-14 (M) of the Municipal Code is being requested. Staff recommends entering into a purchasing contract with Chicago Sign Company in the amount of \$63,295. Adequate funds are available for this purchase.

Recommendation for Purchase of a Public Works Skid Steer

The FY24 Budget includes \$85,000 in the Vehicle Replacement Fund for the purchase of a new skid steer to replace the existing unit #81. This existing 2005 skid steer has surpassed its useful service life and is primarily used by the Public Works Street Division for brush removal, snow removal, salt loading, brine making, concrete removal, dirt and mulch loading, as well as installing snow equipment on various large dump trucks.

Over the past six months Public Works demoed skid steers manufactured by CAT, CASE, John Deere, Bobcat, and New Holland. The Street, Water & Sewer, and Garage Divisions participated in the review of each unit including operating the equipment in actual field conditions. Staff selected the Bobcat model S76 skid steer that best suit our needs. The proposed unit will include a standard skid steer bucket, a concrete breaker, a set of hydraulic pallet forks, and a hydraulic snow blower attachment to assist in our snow removal efforts.

Staff has found the Bobcat S76 skid steer available under a joint-bid resource via Sourcewell (contract #040319-CEC) for \$88,915.00. The dealer has also offered a trade-in on the Village's existing skid steer in the amount of \$15,250.00. Because this unit is an older model (2005) and our Fleet Supervisor's assessment of its current condition and value, this offer appears to represent a very attractive trade-in price. The total purchase price with trade-in is \$73,665.00.

If approved, staff will complete up-fitting with a bucket scale that will allow us to more accurately track salt usage, channel 4 radio, necessary safety lighting, and decals at an additional estimated cost of \$10,000. The total cost of the new skid steer with trade-in and upfitting will be approximately \$83,665.00.

It is recommended that the Village Board approve a Motion to purchase a 2023 Bobcat S76 skid steer from Atlas Bobcat under Sourcewell Contract #040319-CEC in the amount of \$88,915.00, and accept \$15,250.00 for trade-in of the existing skid steer, pursuant to the provisions of Section 5-8-3(B) and subsection 5-8-14(L) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

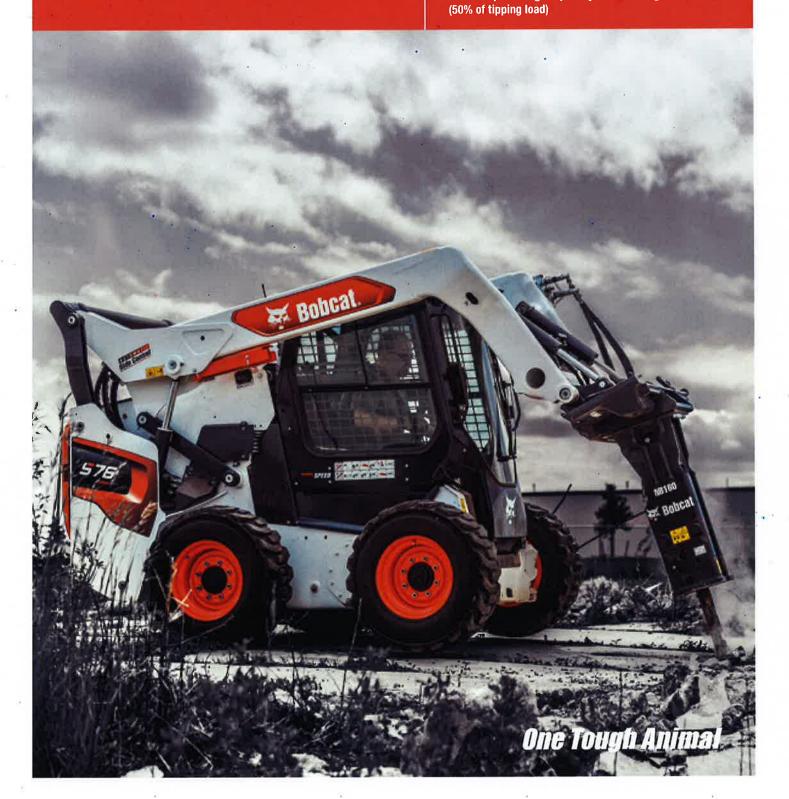

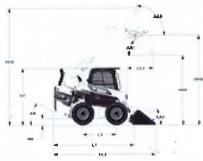

Recommendation to Repair the Roof at the Public Works Center North Garage

In April 2023 the roofing shingles on the south half of the Public Works Center (PWC) North Garage sustained significant damage from a storm that passed through Carol Stream. The extent of the damage to the shingles requires a complete replacement. Staff solicited quotes to remove the existing shingles down to the sheathing and install a new roof. The following roofing companies submitted proposals:

STA Enterprises, Inc. \$36,222.00 Charles Copley Roofing, Inc. \$41,410.00 Olsson Roofing Company, Inc. \$62,815.00

While proposals were being requested, staff worked with Intergovernmental Risk Management Agency (IRMA) to confirm the roof replacement would be covered by insurance. IRMA reviewed the proposal from Charles Copley Roofing, Inc. and approved the replacement value of \$40,112.23. The Village has received \$37,563.04 and IRMA will submit the remaining balance of \$2,549.28 once the work is completed.

Staff has worked with Charles Copley Roofing, Inc. in the past with excellent results. Most recently in 2020, Charles Copley Roofing, Inc. repaired the roof on the Well House at the PWC.

Staff recommends that the Mayor and Board approve a motion waiving competitive bidding and authorizing the proposal from Charles Copley Roofing, Inc. for the replacement of the south half of the PWC North Garage in the amount of \$41,410.00.

### **CAUSE OF LOSS**

The member submitted a claim for wind damage to a south facing slope of the public works north garage roof. According to the member heavy winds on March 31, 2023, damaged the shingles along the south slope of the public works garage. No interior water leaking was reported. Photographs from our inspection are attached.

### **SUBROGATION**

Based on our findings, please advise us if you wish us to comment further regarding this aspect of the claim. We leave the subrogation venture to your company's discretion.

### SALVAGE

Not involved.

### ADJUSTMENT What has been done

Our inspection revealed damage to the south facing slope only. No evidence of wind or hail damages were revealed to the north facing slope.

After our inspection, we prepared a detailed estimate for the replacement of the south facing slope. Please note the member's contractor, Charles Copley Roofing, also recommends replacing the south slope due to wind damages as well.

The estimate received from the member's contractor was in the amount of \$41,410.00. We completed a price comparison estimate and calculated a replacement cost loss of \$40,112.32. We do not know if the difference has to do with the contractor charging the member material sales tax since it was not broken down in lump sum format. Depreciation was applied to materials only in the amount of \$2,549.28 thereby arriving at an actual cash value loss of \$37,563.04. If you are agreed to our calculations, we would recommend issuing payment to the member in this amount.

Recommendation for Purchase of Mobile Lift Columns

The FY24 budget includes \$70,000 for the purchase of four (4) mobile lift columns for use in the fleet maintenance garage. These columns are intended to supplement the existing mobile lift column that were purchased in 2017. The additional mobile lift columns will offer immediate benefits for safely lifting any vehicles in the Village fleet anywhere on the Public Works Center grounds.

The proposed Stertil-Koni mobile lift columns are offered by Safetylane Automotive Equipment through the Sourcewell joint-purchasing cooperative Contract #013020-SKI. Each unit will be programed to work with the existing four (4) mobile lift columns and has a 18,500 pound lifting capacity, which enables staff to lift the new combination sewer machine and our largest dump trucks (even fully-loaded with salt). The price to purchase four (4) additional mobile lift columns would be \$67,012.61.

It is recommended that the Village Board approve a Motion to purchase four (4) mobile lift columns from Safetylane Automotive Equipment under Sourcewell Contract #013020-SKI in the amount of \$67,012.61 pursuant to the provisions of Section 5-8-3(B) and subsection 5-8-14(L) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

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#### I. LEGAL NOTICE – INVITATION FOR BIDS

The Village of Carol Stream, Illinois will receive Sealed Bids for a Public Works Construction contract that will pave approximately 900 lineal feet of 8 foot wide hot-mix asphalt and 3,100 lineal feet of 10 foot wide hot-mix asphalt for the purposes of a multi-use trail. The aggregate base has been rough-graded by others, but it will need to be prepped before paving. All final landscaping will be by others under a different contract.

The deadline to submit Sealed Bids is 10:15 AM CDT on Wednesday, August 2, 2023.

The Village's Department of Engineering Services will be accepting Sealed Bids via the electronic bidding process from QuestCDN's VirtuBid<sup>TM</sup>/vBid<sup>TM</sup>. QuestCDN's process requires that the Village of Carol Stream pre-qualify Bidders before they can access the electronic bidding process. This pre-qualification will be based on the criteria listed in the INSTRUCTIONS FOR BIDDERS, but it will not supersede the process for CONSIDERATION OF BIDS after the PUBLIC OPENING OF BIDS.

A public bid opening will be held immediately after the submittal deadline. Interested parties will have the option of attending either in-person at the Village Hall's Board Room (2<sup>nd</sup> Floor) or virtually (link will be available via the Village's website by the morning of the opening).

#### II. INSTRUCTIONS FOR BIDDERS

#### 1. INVITATION FOR BIDS

Bidders will be furnished with an Invitation for Bids stating the location and description of the Work contemplated, the estimated quantities of Work to be performed, the amount of the Bid Deposit, requirements pertaining to labor, and the date, time and place of filing and opening Bids. All documents bound with or attached to the Invitation for Bids shall be considered a part thereof, and shall not be detached or altered.

#### 2. INTERPRETATION OF ESTIMATE OF QUANTITIES

An estimate of quantities of the Work to be done and materials to be furnished under the Specifications is given in the Bid Documents. It is given as a basis for comparison of Bids and the Award of the Contract. The Village and Engineer do not expressly or by implication agree that the actual quantities involved will correspond therewith; nor shall the Bidder plead misunderstanding or deception because of such estimate of quantities pertaining to the Work.

Payment will be based on the actual quantities of Work performed, in accordance with the Contract, at the Contract unit prices. No allowance will be made for any change in anticipated profits due to an increase or decrease in the original estimate of quantities. The Village reserves the right to omit items entirely, or to increase or decrease items as provided in III.1.9 ALTERATIONS, CANCELLATIONS, EXTENSIONS & DEDUCTIONS. and III.2.5 CHANGE ORDERS.

#### 3. EXAMINATION OF BID DOCUMENTS AND SITE OF WORK

The Bidder shall, before submitting a Bid, carefully examine the Bid Documents, Form of Contract, and Contract Bonds. They shall inspect in detail the site of the proposed Work and be familiar with the local conditions affecting the CONTRACT and the detailed requirements of construction. If the Bid is accepted, they will be responsible for all errors in their Bid resulting from their failure or neglect to comply with these instructions. The Village or Engineer will, in no case, be responsible for any change in anticipated profits resulting from such failure or neglect.

All information available to the Village, if any, on subsurface exploration will be made available for examination by prospective Bidders. When the Bid Documents include information pertaining to sub-surface explorations, borings, test pits, and other preliminary investigations, such information is included only for the convenience of the Bidder. The Village or Engineer assumes no responsibility whatever in respect to the sufficiency of the information, and there is no guaranty, either expressed or implied, that the conditions indicated are representative of those existing throughout the Work, or that unanticipated developments may not occur.

When the Bid Documents include information pertaining to the location of underground utility facilities, such information is only included for the convenience of the Bidder. The Village or Engineer assumes no responsibility whatever in respect to the sufficiency or accuracy of the information, or lack of information, relative to the location of underground utility facilities.

#### 4. PREPARATION OF THE BID

Each Bidder shall submit a stipulated sum for furnishing the services as set forth in the Contract Documents contained in the Bid Documents. For the Bid to be complete, it must contain fully-executed versions of the "Bidder's Proposal" form, including fully-executed versions of all submittal items shown on the Bid Submittal Checklist therein. Bids shall be in strict conformity with the Contract Documents and any applicable Addenda.

#### 5. REJECTION OF BIDS

Bids that contain omissions, erasures, alterations, additions not called for, conditional or alternate Bids, unless called for, irregularities of any kind, or Bids otherwise regular which are not accompanied by the proper Bid Deposit (aka Bid Guaranty) will be rejected as non-responsive. Rejection of a Bid based upon time of completion shall be permitted only when it is specifically stated in the Bid Documents that time of completion will be a basis for Award. However, in accordance with the Village of Carol Stream's Municipal Code of Ordinances Section § 5-8-7, the OWNER shall have the authority to reject all bids, parts of bids or all bids for any one or more supplies or contractual services included in the proposed contract, when the public interest will be served thereby. The Village also reserves the right to waive such technical error as may be deemed best for the interest of the Village.

#### 6. BID DEPOSIT

Each Bid shall be accompanied by a "Cash Bond" in the sum of not less than five percent (5%) of the amount of the Bid as a guarantee that the Bidder will enter into a contract in accordance with its Bid if awarded the Contract by the Village. The Cash Bond shall be made payable to the "Village of Carol Stream, Illinois". In lieu of a "Cash Bond", a Certified Check, Cashier's Check or Bid Bond in the same amount and drawn in favor of the same payee, will be acceptable. If using a Bid Bond, the Bidder shall complete the Illinois Department of Transportation's Bureau of Local Roads Form BLR 12230 LOCAL AGENCY PROPOSAL BID BOND.

The Bid Deposits of all except the three lowest responsive and responsible bidders on each contract will be returned within fourteen (14) calendar days after the opening of the Bids. The Bid Deposit of the accepted Bidder will be returned after acceptance by the Village of a satisfactory Performance Bond where such bond is required, or upon execution of the Contract where no Performance Bond is required. The remaining Bid Deposits of each Bidder will be returned within fourteen (14) calendar days after the Village Board has awarded the Contract.

#### 7. DELIVERY OF BIDS

Bids shall be delivered prior to the time and at the place indicated in the LEGAL NOTICE – INVITATION FOR BIDS. Bid's submitted as a hard copy shall be placed in an envelope sealed and plainly marked to indicate its contents with the following information: Bidder's name, address, subject matter and project name as indicated in the LEGAL NOTICE – INVITATION FOR BIDS, as well as the designated date and time of the Bid opening. Only sealed Bids will be accepted.

Bids will not be opened unless they are received at the place of letting and prior to the time stated in the LEGAL NOTICE – INVITATION FOR BIDS. It is the sole responsibility of the Bidder to see that the Bid is complete and received on time.

#### 8. WITHDRAWAL OF BID

Permission will be given a Bidder to withdraw a Bid if they make a request in writing, including electronic mail, before the time for opening Bids.

#### 9. MODIFICATION OF BIDS

Modification of bids shall be made in writing, including electronic mail, and must be received at the bid opening office before the time for opening bids. The modifications shall not reveal the total bid price, but shall provide a modified bid unit price and an addition or subtraction amount so that the final bid price can be determined only after the sealed bid is opened.

#### 10. PUBLIC OPENING OF BIDS

Bids will be opened and read publicly at the time and place specified in the Invitation for Bids. Bidders, their authorized agents, and other interested parties are invited to be present.

#### 11. DISQUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

In accordance with the Village of Carol Stream's Municipal Code of Ordinances Section §5-8-6, the Contract shall be awarded to the lowest, responsible Bidder. In determining the "lowest responsible Bidder", in addition to price, the Village shall consider the following:

- 1) The ability, capacity and skill of the Bidder to perform the contract or provide the service required;
- 2) Whether the Bidder can perform the contract or provide the service promptly, or within the time specified, without delay or interference;
- 3) The character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience and efficiency of the Bidder.
- 4) The quality of performance of previous contracts or services by the Bidder;
- 5) The previous and existing compliance by the Bidder with laws and ordinances relating to the contract or service;
- 6) The sufficiency of the financial resources and ability of the Bidder to perform the contract or provide the service.
- 7) The quality, availability and adaptability of the supplies, or contractual services to the particular use required;
- 8) The ability of the Bidder to provide future maintenance and service for the use of the subject of the Contract; and
- 9) The number and scope of conditions attached to the Bid.

#### 12. RESPONSIBLE BIDDER'S DOCUMENTATION

No award will be made to any Bidder who cannot satisfy to the Village that they have sufficient ability and experience in this class of work, as well as sufficient capital and equipment to do the

job and complete the work successfully within the time named (i.e. responsible). The Village's decision or judgment on these matters shall be final, conclusive, and binding. The Village may make such investigations as it deems necessary. The Bidder shall furnish to the Village, under oath if so required, all information and data the Village may request for the purpose of investigation.

Bidders will not be able to access the electronic bidding module until the Village of Carol Stream marks them as pre-qualified on the plan holder list. In order to be pre-qualified, Bidders must submit the required documentation electronically to the Engineering Services Department at <a href="mailto:EngineeringServices@carolstream.org">EngineeringServices@carolstream.org</a>. Due to the administrative requirements and time constraints for the pre-qualification process to occur prior to the PUBLIC OPENING OF BIDS as dictated by the Village's electronic bid process, the aforementioned inclusion on the plan holder list does not warrant that Bidders are determined to be "responsible" in accordance with DISQUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS. The Village reserves the right to continue its investigation into its determination of whether or not the Bidder is "responsible" as part of its CONSIDERATION OF BIDS.

In order to assist the Village in its determination of the Bidder as "responsible", the Bidder shall provide references of the detail and format dictated under XI PRE-QUALIFICATION & REFERENCES. The Bidder must provide a duplicate of the form for any significant sub-contractor (i.e. those responsible for >25% of the Total Bid Price) to complete and include with its Bid.

#### 13. BIDDER'S QUESTIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS

Should a Bidder find any discrepancies, omissions, ambiguities, or conflicts among the Contract Documents, or be in doubt about their meaning, the Bidder shall advise the Director of Engineering Services, via e-mail at engineeringservices@carolstream.org, no later than five (5) working days prior to the date for Delivery of Bids. Any questions received after such time shall be answered at the sole discretion of the Village. The Village will not accept any oral questions nor make, or be responsible for, any oral instructions.

The Director of Engineering Services will review the matter raised and, if in their opinion the information sought is not already indicated or specified, or clarification is necessary, will issue an Addendum to the Invitation for Bid. Any failure by the contractor to do so will not relieve them from responsibility for successfully performing the work. The Village assumes no responsibility for any misunderstanding or representations concerning conditions made by its officers or employees prior to the execution of this contract, unless such understanding or representations made are specifically incorporated into the contract. No additional allowance will be granted because of lack of knowledge or such conditions.

#### 14. ADDENDA TO THE INVITATION FOR BID

The Village reserves the right to modify this Invitation for Bid, including the date and time for Delivery of Bids. A copy of such Addendum will be provided to all Bidders known to the Village and will be made available on the Village's website. The Village will not assume any responsibility for the receipt of any Addendum. In all cases it shall be the Bidder's responsibility to obtain any Addenda issued.

#### 15. CONSIDERATION OF BIDS

The Bids received will be compared on the basis of the summation of the products of the items of Work listed and unit prices offered. In case of discrepancy between the gross sums and the unit prices shown in the Bid, the unit prices shall govern, and any errors found in said gross sums shall be corrected. In awarding Contracts, the Village will, in addition to considering the amounts stated in the Bid, take into consideration the responsibility of the various Bidders per the DISQUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS and RESPONSIBLE BIDDER'S DOCUMENTATION, as wells as from other investigations which the Village may elect to make.

#### 16. AWARD OF OPTIONS

The Village will decide whether or not to exercise each option at the time of award. The pricing for any awarded options will be included in its evaluation of the total price for award.

#### 17. AWARD OF CONTRACT

Except in cases where the Village exercises the right to reject any or all Bids, the Contract will be awarded, as soon as practicable, after the opening of the Bids.

If a Contract is not awarded within forty-five (45) days after the opening of Bids, a Bidder may file a written request with the Village for the withdrawal of their Bid or the Award date may be extended by mutual consent of the Village and Bidder. The Village will have a maximum of five (5) days after the receipt of such request to Award the Contract or release the Bidder from further obligation by return of the Bidder's Bid Deposit.

#### 18. EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT

The successful Bidder shall provide the Village with an executed Contract, an acceptable Performance Bond and Labor & Material Bond, and acceptable insurance certificates, as provided herein, within fifteen (15) calendar days after receipt of the Notice of Award and the Form of Contract, included herein in draft form for reference.

Any changes requested by the successful Bidder to the Form of Contract prior to its execution that are deemed by the Village as unacceptable will be considered as a II.19 FAILURE TO EXECUTE CONTRACT.

#### 19. FAILURE TO EXECUTE CONTRACT

Failure on the part of the successful Bidder to provide the documents set forth in the paragraph EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT, it will be considered as just cause for the rescission of the Award and the forfeiture of the Bid Deposit to the Village, not as a penalty but in payment of liquidated damages sustained as a result of such failure.

#### III. GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

#### 1. SCOPE OF SERVICES.

#### 1.1 ENGAGEMENT OF CONTRACTOR.

The Village hereby engages the Contractor, and the Contractor hereby agrees to perform and/or provide all Work, labor, materials, equipment and services and do all else required to complete the Project in accordance with and as set forth within this Contract and the Contract Documents identified herein.

#### 1.2 CONTRACT AND CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

The Contract Documents represent the entire and integrated agreement between the Parties hereto and supersedes prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral. The Contract Documents shall consist of this Contract between the Village and Contractor and those other documents identified and listed on the XII FORM OF CONTRACT and any written modifications issued after execution of the Contract signed by both the Village and Contractor.

#### 1.3 WORK.

The term "Work" means all of the services required by the Contract Documents, and includes all labor, materials, equipment, tools, and other facilities and services provided or to be provided by the Contractor in order to fulfill the Contractor's obligations under the Contract. The Contractor shall provide an adequate number of competently trained and skilled personnel with sufficient supervision to provide the services as set forth in the Contract Documents. The Contractor shall schedule and perform the Work to meet the requirements of the Village. All services shall be provided in compliance with the Contract Documents shall be performed in a good and workmanlike manner. The Contractor shall supervise and direct the Work using Contractor's best skill and judgment. The Contractor shall keep the premises and surrounding area free from accumulation of debris and trash related to the Work.

#### 1.4 MEETING BEFORE WORK COMMENCES.

It is mandatory that the Contractor meet with the Director of Engineering Services or his designee(s) prior to the start of work in order to review the contract specifications, designate the appropriate project contacts, and the manner in which work will be proceeding, among other items.

Upon execution of the contract with the successful bidder, the Village will schedule a meeting with the Contractor. The Contractor shall submit his progress schedule at or before this meeting. In attendance shall be the Contractor's representative on the job, i.e. Construction Superintendent or Foreman. On or before this meeting, the Contractor and Village Engineer shall inspect the work site to determine the existing conditions.

Purpose. To discuss and resolve any problems regarding the work prior to the Contractor starting work. This includes the schedule of construction operations and interpretation of the Special Provisions and/or plans.

Attendance. Representatives of the Village, the Contractor, significant sub-contractors, and utility company representatives, if utility work or adjustments are required. The Village may request any other person as may be deemed necessary to plan for the work.

Specification information regarding source of materials, who is responsible for testing of

materials, what, if any, work will be subcontracted, responsibility for maintaining traffic or detours, and any other coordination issues relating to the work are to be discussed.

A roster will be prepared which will list the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all parties concerned. Emergency contact persons and 24-hour a day phone numbers shall be listed.

#### 1.5 CONTROL OF MATERIALS AND INSPECTIONS BY VILLAGE.

#### 1.5.1 MATERIAL QUALITY & INCORPORATION INTO THE WORK

It is the intent of the Specifications that all materials shall be new, meet all quality requirements of the Contract, and that they shall be incorporated in such a manner as to produce completed construction which is workmanlike and acceptable in every detail. The cost of collecting and furnishing of samples of all test material shall be borne by the Contractor. The cost of all testing shall be borne by the Village. In lieu of samples and at the Village's sole discretion, the Contractor may provide the Village with letters of certification from each supplier that all materials used in the work comply with the Contract Documents. Only materials which conform to the requirements of these Specifications shall be incorporated in the Work.

#### 1.5.2 DEFECTIVE MATERIALS

All materials not conforming to the requirements of the Contract shall be considered as defective and shall be removed from the Work. If in place, they shall be removed by the Contractor at their expense and replaced with acceptable materials. No defective materials, the defects of which have been subsequently corrected, shall be used until approval has been given. Upon failure of the Contractor to comply forthwith with any written order of the Village pursuant to the provisions of this Contract, the Village shall have authority to remove and replace defective materials and to deduct the cost of removal and replacement from any moneys due or to become due the Contractor.

#### 1.5.3 INSPECTION OF COMPLETED WORK

The Village shall have the right to inspect any services or completed work specified herein. Upon a determination that such work has not been completed in accordance with the Contract, the Village may order that such corrective action be taken as necessary to complete the Work.

#### 1.6 PUBLIC SAFETY AND CONVENIENCE:

The Contractor is solely responsible for ensuring that all work performed under this agreement is conducted in a safe manner and that all employees performing work for the contractor have received safety training on a regular and consistent basis and is in compliance with OSHA and other regulatory provisions.

#### 1.7 DAMAGES TO PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY.

Any damage of public or private property caused by the Contractor's operations shall be resolved with the property owner within ten (10) days after damage occurs to the satisfaction of the Village. The Contractor shall inform the Village of any damage caused by the Contractor's operation on the day such damage occurs. Should the damage not be rectified within the time frame agreed upon or to the satisfaction of the Village, the Village reserves the right to repair or replace that which was damaged or assess the Contractor such cost as may be reasonable and related to damaged caused by the Contractor, and deduct these costs from any payment due the Contractor.

#### 1.8 SUBLETTING.

Contractor shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet, subcontract or otherwise dispose of this contract or any or all of his right, title, or interest therein, or his power to execute such contract, to any other person, firm, or corporation, without the prior written consent of an authorized representative of the Village of Carol Stream. In no case shall consent relieve the Contractor from his obligations under this Contract or change the terms of this Contract.

Notwithstanding consent to subcontract approved by the Village, the Contractor shall perform with the Contractor's own organization, work amounting to not less than 50 percent of the total contract cost, and with materials purchased or produced by the Contractor. The Village may request the Contractor provide proof that any proposed subcontractor has the experience, ability, and equipment the work requires.

The Village may order the Contractor to remove a subcontractor who does not perform satisfactory work or does not possess the integrity, experience, ability, and equipment the work requires in accordance with the terms and conditions of this contract. The Contractor shall comply at once and shall not employ the subcontractor for any further work under this contract.

#### 1.9 ALTERATIONS, CANCELLATIONS, EXTENSIONS & DEDUCTIONS.

The Village reserves the right to alter the program, add such work as may be necessary, and delete such work that might not be necessary to accomplish such changes that the Village staff feels appropriate in order to develop a program that is within available funding capabilities. The procedures for alterations or changes in quantities shall generally follow Section 104.02 of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.

#### 1.10 REPRESENTATION BY THE CONTRACTOR.

The Contractor represents that it is financially solvent, has the necessary resources, is sufficiently experienced and competent to perform and complete the execution of the Work necessary to complete the Project.

#### 1.11 WORK HOURS.

The Contractor's operations will be considered exempt from the Village's Code addressing noise pollution per the exemption listed under §14-2-16(H)(4) in order to maximize the amount of time the Contractor has for performing the Work "in-the-dry".

However, the Contractor's equipment during the hours that would otherwise be prohibited shall be designed or operated in a manner such that the noise pollution reaching residential property is below 61 dB(A). Additional restrictions on the bypass pumping operations are detailed in Error! Reference source not found.

#### 1.12 PERMITS.

The Village has or will obtain the following Federal, State and local permits, which includes the payment of all associated fees, required to complete the Work. The Contractor is therefore obligated to ensure that its own means and methods, when not specifically prescribed within these Contract Documents, adhere to the permit conditions contained therein.

#### 1.13 USE OF FIRE HYDRANTS.

Under no circumstances shall water for construction purposes be drawn from any public or private fire hydrant. Water for construction purposes is only available to the Contractor from the

Public Works Facility, 124 Gerzevske Lane, Carol Stream, IL 60188. Access to the Facility is restricted, so the Contractor shall coordinate with the Director of Public Works ahead of time. The water is available at no additional cost when used in conjunction with this Work.

Fire hydrants shall be accessible at all times to the Fire Department. No material or other obstructions shall be placed within ten (10) feet of a fire hydrant.

#### 2. COMPENSATION AND METHOD OF PAYMENT.

#### 2.1 CONTRACT AMOUNT & PROGRESS PAYMENTS.

The Village agrees to pay the Contractor for the performance of the Work of this Contract for the completion of the Project, subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the Contract Sum as shown on IV SCHEDULE OF PRICES. Contractor may invoice the Village for Work completed at intervals not to exceed a monthly basis. Such progress payments will be made by the Village for all Work completed in a satisfactory manner and in accordance with the specifications stated herein, in accordance with the Illinois Prompt Payment Act. Ten per cent (10%) of each progress payment will be withheld by the Village until Substantial Completion.

#### 2.2 APPLICATION FOR PAYMENTS & WAIVERS OF LIEN.

The Contractor shall submit an application for payment in an approved format ("Application for Payment") to the Village for payments under this Contract. The Village requires for each Application for Payment, a properly completed Contractor's Affidavit setting out, under oath, the name, address and amount due or to become due, of each subcontractor, vendor, or party included in that payment.

#### 2.2.1 PARTIAL OR FULL WAIVER OF LIEN

For every party listed, the Contractor shall also provide a full or partial waiver of lien, as appropriate, before a payment will be made to the Contractor. The Contractor's partial or final waiver of lien must be included. Payment certificates shall not be issued by the Village or its designated representative without such lien waiver and Contractor's sworn statements unless they are conditioned upon such waivers and statements.

#### 2.2.2 FINAL RELEASE AND WAIVER OF ALL LIENS

Upon satisfaction of the terms and conditions of the Contract and prior to final payment, the Contractor agrees to provide the Village with a final release and waiver of all liens covering all Work performed under the Contract relative to the Project including all Work performed by all subcontractors. Said final release and waiver of all liens shall identify and state that all contractors and subcontractors have been paid in full and there are no contract balances outstanding and owed to any such contractors or subcontractors.

#### 2.2.3 FINAL PAYMENT

The Village may withhold final payment until all services, reports, and/or other deliverables specified herein have been completed in a form satisfactory to the Village. Final payment will be made by the Village only upon inspection of the Work, completion of any punch list items, and after receipt of final release and waiver of liens.

#### 2.3 AUTHORITY TO WITHHOLD PAYMENT.

The Village may decline to pay an invoice, in whole or in part, to the extent Village decides it is necessary to protect it from loss due to any of the following:

- (i) Breach by Contractor of any of its obligations under the Contract (including the costs to Village of remedying the breach {whether by replacing or repairing the Work or otherwise} and all other costs directly attributable to other services that are required to be performed in connection with remedying such breach);
- (ii) Third-party claims filed or reasonable evidence indicating probable filing of such claims;
- (iii) Contractor's failure to properly pay subcontractors or to properly pay for equipment, materials or labor;
- (iv) Damage to Village's or another's project where such damage arises out of the actual or alleged willful misconduct or negligent acts or omissions of Contractor and subcontractors or their agents, employees or any other person to whom, directly or indirectly, Contractor or any subcontractor may be liable;
- (v) Reasonable evidence that the Work will not be completed within the time requirements specified in the Contract or for the balance of the Contract Sum or Contract Price then unpaid;
- (vi) Unsatisfactory Work performed; or
- (vii) Incomplete, inaccurate, or unauthorized billing.

#### 2.4 RECORDS.

The Contractor shall maintain records showing actual time devoted, type of Work performed per classification and costs incurred, and shall permit the Village to inspect and audit all data and records of the Contractor for Work done pursuant to this Contract.

#### 2.5 CHANGE ORDERS.

- (i) Changes in the Work may only be accomplished by a Change Order signed by the Village Manager to change the Work, Contract sum or Contract time.
- (ii) Where a Change Order or a series of Change Orders authorize or necessitate an increase or decrease in either the cost of the Project totaling \$10,000 or more or the time of completion of the Project by 30 days or more, a written determination must be prepared and signed by the Village or its designee stating that the circumstances necessitating the change in performance were not reasonably foreseeable at the time the Contract was signed; or the change is germane to the original Contract as signed; or the Change Order is in the best interest of the and authorized by law in accordance with 720 ILCS 5/33E 9. In addition, any Change Order on the Project that authorizes or necessitates any increase in the total amount of the Contract that is 50% or more of the original Contract Sum or Contract Price or that authorizes or necessitates any increase in the price of a subcontract under the Contract that is 50% or more of the original subcontract price, then the portion of the Contract that is covered by the Change Order must be resubmitted for bidding in accordance with the Public Works Contract Change Order Act (50 ILCS 525/1 et seq.).

#### 2.6 TAXES.

Contractor acknowledges that the Village is a tax exempt entity under the laws of the State of Illinois and that the Village shall, as part of its undertakings under this Contract, provide to the Contractor all certificates of exemptions and tax exempt numbers needed to entitle Contractor to purchase material and other items to be used on the Work or incorporated into the Work on a tax-exempt basis, said exemptions specifically to include but not be limited to the "Illinois Retailer's

Occupation Tax" (sales tax). Contractor shall warrant that all material costs and scheduled values have been calculated so as to give the Village its full benefit of its tax-exempt status, and Contractor shall require that all subcontracts include a requirement that subcontractors purchase materials so as to give the Village the full benefit of its tax exempt status. The Village shall not be liable for, and shall be entitled to a credit against the Contract Sum or Contract Price for any sales tax paid by Contractor or any subcontractor of any tier which is shown to have been charged to the Village as part of the Contract Sum or Contract Price, as a component of the schedule of values, as a unit price, or otherwise.

#### 2.7 ADDITIONAL SERVICES.

The Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the Village shall not be liable for any costs incurred by the Contractor in connection with any services provided by the Contractor that are outside the scope of this Contract ("Additional Services"), regardless of whether such Additional Services are requested or directed by the Village, except upon the prior written approval of the Village.

#### 2.8 PROMPT PAYMENT ACT.

All payments made under this Contract shall be made in conformance with the provisions of the Local Government Prompt Payment Act. 50 ILCS 505/1 et seq.

#### 3. CONTRACT TIME.

#### 3.1 COMMENCEMENT.

The Work on this Contract shall commence upon the issuance of a written notice to proceed. The Contractor is responsible for ensuring that the Work continue expeditiously from that date in accordance with the Time of Performance noted herein or as otherwise set forth in the notice to proceed.

#### 3.2 TIME OF PERFORMANCE.

Time is of the essence with regard to the performance of the Work related to this Contract. Failure to meet the time frame of the Contract shall be considered an occasion of default under the Contract. The Contract Time shall not be increased without the express written consent of the Village.

III.3.3 SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION.

September 1, 2023

#### 3.3 SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION.

Substantial Completion shall mean the stage in the progress of the Work when the Work is sufficiently complete so that the Village can utilize the Work for its intended use.

#### 3.4 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES.

Should the Contractor fail to complete the work within the working days stipulated in the contract, or on or before the completion date stipulated in the contract, or within such extended time as may have been allowed, the Contractor shall be liable and shall pay to the Village the rate of \$200 per working day, not as a penalty, but as liquidated damages for each working day of overrun in the contract time or beyond such extended time as may have been allowed. The liquidated damages for failure to complete the Contract on time are approximate, due to the

impracticality of calculating and providing actual delay costs. This rate establishes the cost of delay to account for administration, engineering, inspection, and supervision during periods of extended and delayed performance. The costs of delay represented by this rate are understood to be a fair and reasonable estimate of the costs that will be borne by the Village during extended and delayed performance by the Contractor of the Work, remaining incidental Work, correction of Work improperly completed, or repair of Work damaged as a result of the Contractor. The liquidated damage amount specified will accrue and be assessed until Final Completion of the total physical Work of the Contract even though the Work may be Substantially Complete. The Village will deduct these liquidated damages from any monies due, or to become due, to the Contractor from the Village.

#### 4. INSURANCE, INDEMNIFICATION, BONDS AND WARRANTY.

#### 4.1 INSURANCE.

The Contractor shall carry and maintain insurance of the types and in the amounts set forth below and, if necessary, commercial umbrella insurance, and provide the Village with certificates of insurance and endorsements prior to commencing with Work. All such insurance shall be carried with companies satisfactory to the Village and be rated at least A VII by A.M. Best Company.

#### 4.1.1 WORKER'S COMPENSATION COVERAGE

STATUTORY coverage for all persons whom the Contractor may employ directly or through subcontractors in carrying out the Work under this Contract.

#### 4.1.2 EMPLOYER'S LIABILITY

- a) \$1,000,000 minimum liability each accident for bodily injury by accident.
- b) \$1,000,000 minimum liability each employee for bodily injury by disease.

#### 4.1.3 COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY COVERAGE

Bodily injury and property damage (including Premises-Operations; Independent Contractor's; Products and Completed Operations: Broad Form Property Damage) with a limit of not less than \$5,000,000 each occurence. If such CGL insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this project/location.

CGL insurance shall be written on Insurance Services Office (ISO) occurrence form CG 00 01 10 93, or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage, and shall cover liability arising from premises, operations, independent contractors, products-completed operations, personal injury and advertising injury, and liability assumed under an insured contract (including the tort liability of another assumed in a business contract).

The Village and its officers, agents, and emplyees shall be named as additional insureds (the Additional Insureds) under the CGL, using ISO additional insured endorsement CG 20 10 or a substitute providing equivalent coverage, and under the commercial umbrella, if any. This insurance shall apply as primary insurance with respect to any other insurance or self-insurance afforded to the Additional Insureds. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Additional Insureds shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

There shall be no endorsement or modification of the CGL limiting the scope of coverage for

liability arising from pollution, explosion, collapse, or underground property damage.

#### 4.1.4 CONTINUING COMPLETED OPERATIONS LIABILITY INSURANCE

The Contractor shall maintain commercial general liability (CGL) and, if necessary, commercial umbrella liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$5,000,000 each occurrence for at least three years following Substantial Completion of the Work.

Continuing CGL insurance shall be written on ISO occurrence form CG 00 01 10 93, or substitute form providing equivalent coverage, and shall, at minimum, cover liability arising from products-completed operations and liability assumed under an insured contract. Continuing CGL insurance shall have a products-completed operations aggregate of at least two times its each occurrence limit.

Continuing commercial umbrealla coverage, if any, shall include liability coverage for damage to the insured's completed work equivalent to that provided under ISO form CG 00 01.

#### 4.1.5 COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY COVERAGE

The Contractor shall maintain, until the completion and acceptance of the Work under this Contract, insurance to protect from claims for bodily injury and property damage which may arise from the use of motor vehicles, owned hired and non-owned, engaged in various operations under this Contract. The Village its officers, agents, and emplyees shall be named as an Additional Insureds.

Limits:

Bodily Injury and Property

\$2,000,000

Damage each accident

Business auto insurance shall be written on Insurance Services Office (ISO) from CA 00 01, CA 00 05, CA 00 12, CA 00 20, or a substitute form providing equivalent liability coverage. If necessary, the policy shall be endorsed to provide contractual liability coverage equivalent to that provided in the 1990 and later editions of CA 00 01.

#### 4.1.6 UMBRELLA EXCESS LIABILITY

The Village and its officers, agents and employees shall be named as an additional insured.

Limits:

Liability Insurance:

\$1,000,000

Over Primary Commercial General \$10,000 Retention

#### 4.1.7 PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY COVERAGE (NOT REQUIRED)

#### 4.1.8 GENERAL INSURANCE PROVISIONS

The Contractor shall have the following obligations with regard to insurance coverage for the Work under the Contract:

Prior to beginning work, Contractor shall furnish the Village with a certificate(s) of insurance and applicable policy endorsement(s), executed by a duly authorized representative of each insurer, showing compliance with the insurance requirements set forth herein. All certificates of

insurance required to be obtained by the Contractor shall provide that coverages under the policies named shall not be cancelled, modified, reduced or allowed to expire without at least Thirty (30) Days prior written notice given to the Village. All certificates evidencing coverage extended beyond the date of final payment shall be provided at the time of the the final Pay Request. All certificates of insurance shall name the Village and its officers, agents and employees as Additional Insureds on a primary non-contributory basis. The actual additional insured endorsement shall be attached to the certificate of insurance.

All insurance required of the Contractor shall state that it is Primary and Non-Contributory Insurance as to all additional insureds with respect to all claims arising out of operations by or on their behalf. If additional insureds have other applicable insurance coverages, those coverages shall be regarded as on an excess or contingent basis.

If Contractor's liability policies do not contain the standard ISO separation of insured's provision, or a substantially similar clause, they shall be endorsed to provide cross-liability coverage.

The Contractor shall require that every subcontractor of any tier obtain insurance of the same character as that required of Contractor, naming the same Additional Insureds and subject to the same restrictions and obligations as set forth for the Contractor's insurance in the Contract Documents.

Under no circumstances shall the Village or any Additional Insureds be deemed to have waived any of the insurance requirements of this Contract by any act or omission, including, but not limited to:

- a. Allowing Work by Contractor or any subcontractor of any tier to start before receipt of Certificates of Insurance;
- b. Failure to examine, or to demand correction of any deficiency, of any certificate of insurance received.

The Contractor agrees that the obligation to provide insurance is solely the Contractor's responsibility and cannot be waived by any act or omission of the Village or any Additional Insureds.

The purchase of insurance by the Contractor under this Contract shall not be deemed to limit the liability of the Contractor in any way, for damages suffered by the Village in excess of policy limits or not covered by the policies purchased.

The Contractor shall notify the Village, in writing, of any possible or potential claim for personal injury or property damage arising out of the Work of this Contract promptly whenever the occurrence giving rise to such a potential claim becomes known to the Contractor.

The Contractor further agrees to cause contractual liability endorsements to be issued by the insurance companies and attached to the above-mentioned policies to include under the coverage therein an extended obligation on the part of the insurers to insure against Contractor's contractual liability hereunder and to indemnify the Village and its agents against loss, liability, costs,

expenses, attorneys' fees and court costs, and further agrees that said coverage shall be afforded therein against all claims arising out of the operation of any structural work law or law imposing liability arising out of the use of scaffolds, hoists, cranes, stays, ladders, supports or other mechanical contrivances. Endorsements to the certificates of insurance shall include as named additional insured the Village and its officers, agents and employees.

#### 4.2 INDEMNIFICATION.

To the fullest extent permitted by Illinois law, Contractor shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Village of Carol Stream and its officers, employees and agents (collectively "Indemnitees"), from lawsuits, actions, costs (including attorneys' fees), claims or liabilities of any character (collectively "Damages") caused by, resulting from, arising out of or occurring in connection with the Contractor's performance of the Work under this Contract, provided that any such lawsuit, action, cost, claim or liability is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, or death, or to injury to or destruction of tangible property, but only to the extent caused by the negligent act or omission, intentional misconduct, or breach of applicable law of the Contractor or anyone or entity directly or indirectly employed by Contractor for whose acts Contractor may be liable. Under no circumstance shall Contractor's indemnification apply to Damages caused by the sole negligence of the Indemnitees. In connection with any such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities, the Village, its officers, agents, employees, representatives and their assigns shall have the right to defense counsel of their choice. The Contractor shall be solely liable for all costs of such defense and for all expenses, fees, judgments, settlements and all other costs arising out of such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities. Contractor shall protect, indemnify, and hold and save harmless the Village from and against any and all claims, costs, causes, actions and expenses including but not limited to legal fees, incurred by reason of Contractor's breach of any obligations under or Contractor's default of any provision of the Contract Documents.

#### 4.3 PERFORMANCE AND LABOR & MATERIAL BONDS.

The Contractor shall furnish to the Village at the time of execution of the Contract, a Performance Bond and a Labor & Material Bond, each in the full amount of the Contract Sum securing the full and faithful performance of the Contract and the payment for all labor and material furnished by the Contractor or anyone furnishing such under the Contractor's contract or a subcontract of any tier. Said bonds shall be in a form provided by the Village or otherwise acceptable to the Village. Said bonds shall be written by a surety authorized to do surety business in Illinois and acceptable to the Village, in its sole and absolute discretion. The cost thereof shall be paid by the Contractor.

#### 4.4 WARRANTY.

Contractor warrants to the Village that:

- (i) Materials and equipment furnished under this Contract will be new and of good quality unless otherwise required or permitted by the Contract Documents;
- (ii) The Work will be free from defects in materials and workmanship under normal use and service for one year from Final Completion of the Project and all deficiencies shall be corrected by the Contractor immediately upon notification from the Village.

Under this warranty, Contractor is obligated to either repair or replace, at its option, defective equipment, materials, software, or any other equipment and/or materials provided and installed on

the Project at its own expense. Contractor warrants that replacement or repaired equipment, materials, software, or any other provided and installed equipment and/or materials furnished hereunder shall be in accordance with the current industry standards and that all labor shall be performed in a workmanlike manner and in accordance with industry standards.

Any warranties provided under the Contract Documents shall not preclude the Village's right to bring any action for Contractor's breach of this Contract. Work not conforming to these requirements, including substitutions not properly approved and authorized, may be considered defective. Contractor shall finish satisfactory evidence as to the kind and quality of materials and equipment.

Contractor shall pass-through to the Village all manufacturers' warranties for the equipment and supplies installed on the Project. Contractor shall provide written evidence satisfactory to the Village prior to the commencement of the Work on the Project evidencing all equipment and/or product warranties that will pass-through to the Village.

#### 5. PREVAILING WAGES

#### 5.1 PREVAILING WAGES.

This Contract calls for the construction of a "public work" within the meaning of the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq. ("the Act"). The Contractor and all subcontractors are required to pay wage rates in accordance with the Act to all laborers, workers and mechanics.

The enactment of Public Act 100-1177, which took effect June 1, 2019, relieves local units of government from the former requirement of passing a prevailing wage ordinance, publishing it and filing it with the Illinois Department of Labor. The prevailing wage schedules for each county in the state are now ascertained by IDOL and published on its website.

The Contractor and all subcontractors are responsible for checking the IDOL's website for revisions to the prevailing wage rates. In the event that the IDOL should revise the prevailing rate of wages, then the revised rates shall apply to this Contract. In no case shall any revision in the rates of prevailing wages result in an increase in the total Contract Sum.

The Contractor certifies that it has not been found by the Illinois Department of Labor to be in violation of its obligations under the Prevailing Wage Act within the last two years and is not otherwise barred from participating and/or entering into this Contract under Section 130/11a of the Act (820 ICLS 130/11a.

#### 5.2 RECORDS AND CERTIFIED PAYROLL.

The Contractor and each of its subcontractors participating on the Project shall make and keep those records required under Section 5 of the Prevailing Wage Act. The enactment of Public Act 100-1177, which took effect June 1, 2019, required IDOL to create an electronic database of certified payrolls where the Contractor shall submit certified payrolls directly online rather than filing them with the Village.

#### 6. COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAW AND CERTIFICATIONS.

#### 6.1 COMPLIANCE WITH GOVERNMENTAL REGULATIONS.

Contractor shall comply with and perform all Work required under the Contract Documents in

conformance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and/or ordinances. This provision shall not be limited to those statutes, ordinances and/or regulations referred to herein.

#### 6.2 CERTIFICATION TO ENTER INTO PUBLIC CONTRACTS.

Contractor certifies that it is not barred from contracting with any unit of state or local government as a result of a violation of either Section 33E-3 or 33E-4 of the Illinois Criminal Code or any similar offense of any State of the United States which contains the same elements as the Illinois offenses of bid-rigging or bid rotating. Contractor shall execute the attached Certification at EXHIBIT "2".

#### 6.3 PAYMENTS TO THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE.

Contractor certifies that it is not delinquent in the payment of any taxes to the Illinois Department of Revenue. Contractor shall execute the attached Certification at EXHIBIT "3".

#### 6.4 ILLINOIS DRUG FREE WORKPLACE ACT.

In the event the Contractor has twenty-five (25) or more employees at the time of the execution of this Contract, Contractor agrees to provide a drug-free workplace in accordance with the Drug Free Workplace Act, 30 ILCS 580/1 et seq. Contractor shall execute the attached Certification at EXHIBIT "4".

#### 6.5 SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION ON PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS.

Contractor certifies that it has in place a written program which meets or exceeds the program requirements of the Substance Abuse Prevention on Public Works Projects Act (820 ILCS 265/1 et seq.), and will provide a copy thereof to the Village. Contractor shall execute the attached Certification at EXHIBIT "5".

## 6.6 ILLINOIS PUBLIC WORKS EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION ACT.

Contractor certifies that this contract shall be performed in compliance with all requirements of the Illinois Public Works Employment Discrimination Act, 775 ILCS 10/0.01 et seq.

#### 6.7 NON-DISCRIMINATION: HUMAN RIGHTS ACT.

Contractor hereby agrees that this Contract shall be performed in compliance with all requirements of the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq., and that the Contractor and its subcontractors shall not engage in any prohibited form of discrimination in employment as defined in the Act. The Contractor shall maintain, and require that its subcontractors maintain policies of equal employment opportunity which shall prohibit discrimination against any employee or applicant for employment on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, ancestry, citizenship status, age, marital status, physical or mental disability unrelated to the individual's ability to perform the essential functions of the job, association with a person with a disability, or unfavorable discharge from military service. Pursuant to Section 2-105 (A)(4) of the Illinois Human Rights Act, the Contractor and each subcontractor shall adopt and maintain a written sexual harassment policy.

#### 6.8 SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICY.

Contractor certifies that pursuant to Section 2-105 (A)(4) of the Illinois Human Rights Act, the Contractor and each authorized subcontractor has adopted and maintains a written sexual harassment policy that shall include at a minimum, the following:

- (i) The illegality of sexual harassment;
- (ii) The definition of sexual harassment under State law;
- (iii) A description of sexual harassment, utilizing examples;
- (iv) The Contractor's/subcontractor's internal complaint process, including penalties;
- (v) The legal recourse, investigative and complaint process available through the Department and Commission;
- (vi) Directions on how to contact the Department and the Commission; and
- (vii) Protection against retaliation as provided by Section 6-101 of the Illinois Human Rights Act.

A copy of these policies shall be provided to the Village on request.

#### 7. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

#### 7.1 AMENDMENT.

No amendment or modification to this Contract shall be effective until it is reduced to writing and approved and executed by the Village and Contractor in accordance with all applicable statutory procedures.

#### 7.2 ASSIGNMENT.

This Contract may not be assigned by the Village or the Contractor without the prior written consent of the other party.

#### 7.3 TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE.

Time is of the essence for the performance of the Work and the completion of the Project.

#### 7.4 VENUE AND GOVERNING LAW.

This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois and venue shall be fixed in the Eighteenth Judicial Circuit of DuPage County, Illinois.

#### 7.5 ARBITRATION AND MEDIATION.

Notwithstanding any inconsistent or contrary provision in any other provision of the Contract Documents, no claim or dispute arising under this Contract shall be subject to arbitration unless the Parties mutually agree on a submission to arbitration, which submission shall be in writing and signed by the Parties and shall set forth a specific statement of the nature of the dispute and shall contain an express statement on the limitations of the powers of the arbitrator. The Parties mutually agree that in the absence of such submission, arbitration cannot be demanded or compelled by either party.

#### 7.6 NO DAMAGES FOR DELAY.

The Contractor agrees that in the event of delay for any reason caused by any party or person, it will be fully compensated for the delay by an extension of time to complete the Contract and will not seek additional compensation.

#### 7.7 NO WAIVER BY PAYMENT.

Notwithstanding any language in the Contract Documents to the contrary, Village shall not be deemed to waive any claim or right to assert a claim by making any progress payment or final

#### 7.8 NO WAIVER OF SUBROGATION.

Notwithstanding any inconsistent or contrary provision in the Contract Documents to the contrary or inconsistent with this provision, the Village shall not be deemed to have waived any right of subrogation which it, its insurance carrier, any self-insurance risk pool or risk management association, (or any combination of these entities) may have against the Contractor, the Engineer, the Architect or any Subcontractor of any tier for any damage caused by Contractor, the Engineer, the Architect or any Subcontractor of any tier, to the Village or Village's property.

#### 7.9 FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT.

The Illinois Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) has been amended and effective January 1, 2010, adds a new provision to Section 7 of the Act which applies to public records in the possession of a party with whom the Village has contracted. The Village will have only a very short period of time from receipt of a FOIA request to comply with the request, and there is a significant amount of work required to process a request including collating and reviewing the information. The Contractor acknowledges the requirements of FOIA and agrees to comply with all requests made by the Village for public records (as that term is defined by Section 2(c) of FOIA) in the undersigned's possession and to provide the requested public records to the Village within two (2) business days of the request being made by the Village. The undersigned agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Village from all claims, costs, penalty, losses and injuries (including but not limited to, attorneys' fees, other professional fees, court costs and/or arbitration or other dispute resolution costs) arising out of or relating to its failure to provide the public records to the Village under this Contract.

#### 7.10 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY PROVISIONS.

Notwithstanding any inconsistent or contrary provision in the Contract Documents, the Village shall not be deemed to have agreed to or consented to any limitation of liability provision applicable to the Contractor.

#### 7.11 AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE.

#### 7.11.1 THE VILLAGE.

The Village hereby warrants and represents to the Contractor that the persons executing this Contract on its behalf have been properly authorized to do so by its corporate authorities.

#### 7.11.2 THE CONTRACTOR.

The Contractor hereby warrants and represents to the Village that the persons executing this Contract on its behalf have the full and complete right, power, and authority to enter into this Contract and to agree to the terms, provisions, and conditions set forth in this Contract and that all legal actions needed to authorize the execution, delivery, and performance of this Contract have been taken.

#### 7.12 ENITRE AGREEMENT.

This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties to this Contract and supersedes all prior agreements and negotiations between the Parties, whether written or oral, relating to the subject matter of this Contract.

#### 7.13 COUNTERPART EXECUTION.

This Contract may be executed in several counterparts, each of which, when executed, shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

#### 7.14 PATENT AND COPYRIGHT.

The Contractor and its Surety shall pay for all royalties and/or license fees and assume all costs incident to the use in performance of the Work or the incorporation in the Work of any invention, design, process, product or device which is subject to patent or copyrights held by others, and, additionally, shall defend all suits or claims for infringements of any patent or invention right or copyrights involved in the items furnished hereunder. The Contractor and its Surety shall hold and save the Village and its officers, agents, servants and employees harmless from liability of any nature or kind, including cost and expenses, for, or on account of, any patented or unpatented invention, process, article or appliance furnished in the performance of the Contract including its use by the Village, unless otherwise specifically stipulated and agreed to in this Contract.

#### 7.15 ADVERTISEMENT.

The Contractor and subcontractor shall not display any signs, posters, or other advertising matter in or on the Work or on or around the Village property without the specified approval in writing by the Village. In addition, no advertising copy mentioning the Village or quoting the opinions of any of its employees may be released unless such copy is approved in writing by the Village before release.

#### 8. NOTICE.

#### 8.1 NOTICES REQUIRED OR PERMITTED

All notices required or permitted to be given under this Contract shall be in writing and shall be delivered (1) personally, (2) by a reputable overnight courier, or by (3) by certified mail, return-receipt requested, and deposited in the U.S. Mail, postage prepaid. Unless otherwise expressly provided in this Contract, notices shall be deemed received upon the earlier of: (a) actual receipt; (b) one business day after deposit with an overnight courier, as evidenced by a receipt of deposit; or (c) four business days following deposit in the U.S. mail, as evidenced by a return receipt. By notice complying with the requirements of this Section 8, each party shall have the right to change the address or the addressee, or both, for all future notices and communications to the other party, but no notice of a change of addressee or address shall be effective until actually received.

#### 9. TERMINATION:

#### 9.1 TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT.

The Village may cancel the Contract for breach, as determined by the Village, for items such as, but not limited to: failure to meet insurance requirements, failure to meet required performance or progress standards as described herein, or if the quality or level of service is unsatisfactory to the Village. This cause for breach may include any cessation or diminution of service which, in the opinion of the Village, is not in its best interest or any failure to comply with the terms of the Contract.

The Village shall notify the Contractor in writing of any Contract breach. The Contractor shall remedy the breach within ten (10) calendar days. If the breach is not remedied in ten (10) calendar days, the Village may cancel the Contract by giving thirty (30) days' notice in writing of its intention to cancel this Contract.

In the event of cancellation for breach, the Contractor shall be paid only for Work satisfactorily performed up to the date of cancellation.

In the event of early termination or cancellation for any cause, no payment for services performed will be made until and unless any necessary reports and/or deliverables have been provided.

#### 9.2 TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE.

The Village shall have the ability to terminate the Contract with thirty (30) days advance notice in its sole and absolute discretion. In the event of termination, Contractor shall be entitled to compensation for Work satisfactorily completed up until the point of termination.

The following Special Provisions included herein shall amend, void, supersede, or supplement the Standard Specifications as detailed herein.

Where any section, subsection, paragraph, or subparagraph of the Standard Specifications is amended, voided, or superseded by any of the following paragraphs, any provision of such section, subsection, paragraph, or subparagraph standing unaffected, shall remain in effect. The Special Provisions shall govern in lieu of any particular provision of the Standard Specifications so amended, voided, or superseded, and not in addition to the portion changed.

Where any section, subsection, paragraph, or subparagraph of the Standard Specifications is supplemented by any of the following paragraphs, the provisions of such section, subsection, paragraph, or subparagraph shall remain in effect. The Special Provisions shall govern in addition to the particular Standard Specifications so supplemented, and not in lieu thereof.

#### 1. ACCESS AND STAGING AREAS

#### 1.1 DESCRIPTION

The Work will occur entirely upon either the Carol Stream Park District's property or within the Village's property or easements. The Carol Stream Park District authorizes the Contractor temporary access to the property(s) commonly known as Memorial Park for the purposes of constructing the Work. Obtaining temporary easements through residential properties is discouraged and will be the responsibility of the successful Bidder.

#### 1.2 HAUL ROUTES

The movement of construction equipment and trucking shall occur as much as practical upon the Village-owned streets. There are four main points of access: (1) between Kuhn Road and the Water Reclamation Center's entrance; (2) the bridge between 270-290 Arrowhead Trail; (3) Bennett Drive; and (4) Memorial Park (east end only). The bridge is capable of carrying construction traffic. In general, access through the Water Reclamation Center is restricted, but may be granted on a case-by-case basis.

#### 1.3 STAGING AREAS

The main staging area will be along the access drive (McNees Drive) to the Water Reclamation Center as shown on the plans. The Carol Stream Park District will allow for staging and storing of equipment and materials only on the east end of Memorial Park.

The staging and storing of equipment and materials is prohibited on all Village-owned streets.

#### 2. REPAIR AND PREPARATION OF BASE COURSE

SSRBC 358 REPAIR AND PREPARATION OF BASE shall be incorporated in full except for the changes noted by the following:

#### 2.1 SECTION 358.01 AGGREGATE BASES

Revise only the applicable test as follows; all other requirements remain unchanged:

(b) Preparation. After the repairs have been made in the base course, any area having ruts, depressions, corrugations, excessive crown, or loose material shall be brought to a smooth grade and proper crown by repeatedly wetting with water applied by means of a sprinkler, blanding with a road grader or multiple blade maintainer, and rolling with a pneumatic tired roller. The base course shall be bladed lightly to such a depth that sufficient material will be obtained to true up the surface of the base course. During the smoothing operations, the roadbed from the edges of the base to the shoulder lines shall be bladed to a smooth uniform slope so that the surface will drain and not impound water.

After the surface of the base course has been brought to a smooth grade and proper crown, it shall be compacted by repeated wetting and rolling with a pneumatic tired roller for a period of not less than two days. During this time, the surface shall be kept in a damp condition. Before a prime coat is applied, the base shall be surface dry, but at not time shall the period of drying be less than 24 hours. When required by the Engineer, the base course shall be swept with a mechanical sweeper or hand brooms before a prime coat is applied. The sweeping shall be continued until all dust, mud and foreign material are removed. Traffic shall not be allowed upon the prepared base course after the final sprinkling, or, if a bituminous prime coat has been applied, until the Engineer has approved the penetration of the prime coat.

#### 3. WORK ZONE TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PROTECTION

SSRBC 701 WORK ZONE TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PROTECTION shall be incorporated in full except for the changes noted by the following:

#### **3.1 SECTION 701.04 GENERAL**

Revise only the applicable text as follows; all other requirements remain unchanged:

Work zone traffic control and protection shall be according to the traffic control plan and the MUTCD. The work zone signs and traffic control devices shall meet the Department's quality standards as shown in the "Traffic Control Field Manual".

The traffic control shown on the plans represents the minimum required combination of traffic control devices needed for a particular construction operation. Conditions created by the Contractor's operation which are not covered by the plans shall be delineated by devices as directed by the Engineer at no additional cost to the Department. Revisions or modifications of the traffic control shall have the Engineer's written approval.

The work zone as shown on the Plans is approximate and shall be based on maintaining two-way traffic at all times. The Contractor shall be responsible for the work zone traffic control and protection based on the conditions created by the Contractor's operations, but shall generally conform with Highway Standard 701611-01 URBAN HALF ROAD CLOSURE, MULTILANE, 2W WITH MOUNTABLE MEDIAN. The work zone traffic control and protection shall be according to the MUTCD and the devices shall meet the Illinois Department of Transportation's quality standards as shown in the "Traffic Control Field Manual". If deemed insufficient to safeguard the motoring public, the Village may direct the Contractor to provide additional devices at no additional cost to the Village.

#### 3.2 SECTION 701.08 CONTRACTOR'S OPERATIONS AND EQUIPMENT

Revise only the applicable text as follows; all other requirements remain unchanged.

The Contractor shall keep all equipment, material, and vehicles off the pavement and shoulders on the side of the pavement which is open to traffic outside of traffic and within areas delineated by traffic control devices to the satisfaction of the Village.

#### 3.3 SECTION 701.11 EQUIPMENT PARKING AND STORAGE

Replace this section in its entirety with the following:

During working hours, all vehicles and/or non-operating equipment shall be parked outside of traffic and within areas delineated by traffic control devices to the satisfaction of the Village. When not being utilized to inform and direct traffic, sign trailers, arrow boards, and portable changeable message boards shall be treated as non-operating equipment.

#### 3.4 SECTION 701.13 FLAGGERS

Revise only the applicable text as follows; all other requirements remain unchanged.

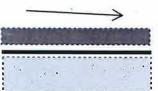
All flagger shall be certified by an agency approved by the Department. While on the job site, each flagger shall have in his/her possession a current driver's license and a current flagger certification I.D. meeting Department requirements. For non-drivers, the Illinois Identification Card issued by the Secretary of State will meet the requirement for a current driver's license. This flagger certification requirement may be waived by the Engineer for emergency situations that arise due to actions beyond the Contractor's control where flagging is needed to maintain safe traffic control on a temporary basis. A flagger shall be required whenever two-way traffic cannot be maintained and the drivers of opposing traffic cannot visually coordinate between themselves across the work zone. Additional flaggers are required if a single flagger cannot visually coordinate with the drivers of opposing traffic from a location that is outside of traffic. Flaggers need not be certified, but they cannot be assigned other duties that, in the opinion of the Village, inhibits their ability to perform this function safely and effectively.

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Sections 16-8-4 (K) and 16-8-4 (L) of the Unified Development Ordinance, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on the above petition on July 24, 2023 following proper legal notice of said public hearings, after which the Commission recommended to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village that the Special Use Permit and Variation be approved; and

**WHEREAS,** the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its Findings and Recommendations regarding the Special Use Permit and Variation with the Mayor and Board of Trustees, and the Mayor and Board of Trustees have duly considered said Findings and Recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

#### **SECTION 1:**

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, after examining the Petition for the Special Use Permit, and the Findings and Recommendations of the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined and find that the requested Special Use Permit:

- 1. Is deemed necessary for the public convenience at the location. The new auto repair and service facility is necessary for public convenience because it will alleviate parking constraints and meet the growing needs of Bartel's Auto Clinic.
- 2. Will not be unreasonably detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare. The new auto repair and service facility will not in any way endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare.
- 3. Will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood. Other properties classified with the Industrial designation have received Special Use approval for auto repair and service facilities with no apparent injury to the use or enjoyment of properties in the immediate vicinity, or diminution or impairment to property values within the neighborhood.

- 4. Will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding property for uses permitted in the district. Surrounding properties are already developed. As such, there should be no impact on the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding properties.
- 5. Will provide adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other important and necessary community facilities. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other public improvements will be put in place for the proposed development.
- 6. Will conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as the Village Board may in each instance modify such regulations. The proposal is expected to conform to all applicable codes and requirements.

#### **SECTION 2:**

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village, after examining the Variation request, and the Findings and Recommendations of the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined and find that, with respect to the requested Variation:

- 1. The requested variation arises from conditions that are unique to the subject property, that are not ordinarily found in the same zoning district and that are not a result of the owner's intentional action. The variation is requested in order to maximize working space inside the proposed facility and parking spaces for customers and employees outside of the facility.
- 2. The variation to be granted will not alter the essential character of the neighborhood in which the subject property is located, nor substantially or permanently impair use or development of adjacent property. Staff does not believe the variation will alter the essential character of the neighborhood, similar variation requests have been granted to allow deviations to the larger building setback requirement.
- 3. The strict application of the applicable standards will constitute an unnecessary physical hardship (not economic hardship) because the property cannot be used for an otherwise allowed use without coming into conflict with applicable site development standards. In order for the proposed facility to function and operate properly, a properly sized building and adequate parking are necessary.
- 4. The variation is the minimum action necessary to alleviate the hardship and observes the spirit of this UDO. Staff believes the variation is the minimum action necessary for Bartel's Auto Clinic to operate the proposed facility properly.
- 5. The variation desired will not adversely affect the public health, safety, or general welfare or impair the purposes or intent of the UDO or the comprehensive plan. Staff does not believe the granting of the variation will be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to the other property or improvements in the neighborhood in which the property is located.

#### **SECTION 3:**

The Special Use Permit and Variation, as set forth in the above recitals, are hereby approved and granted to Bartel's Auto Clinic, subject to the conditions set forth in Section 4, upon the real estate commonly known as 160 S. Gary Avenue, Carol Stream, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

LOT 4 IN BARTEL INDUSTRIAL PARK SUBDIVISION, BEING A SUBDIVISION OF PART OF THE NORTH ½ OF SECTION 5, THE NORTH 39 NORTH, RANGE 10 EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF RECORDED FEBRUARY 10, 2003 AS DOCUMENT R2003-053467 IN DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

Hereinafter referred to as the Subject Property.

#### **SECTION 4:**

The approval of the Special Use Permit and Variation granted in Sections 1 and 2 herein are subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That all improvements, including but not limited to the building, parking lot, and landscaping, must be built, installed, and maintained in accordance with the attached plans and exhibits;
- 2. That the landscape materials must be installed as shown on the attached landscape plan and that all materials shall be maintained in a healthy condition, with dead or dying materials being replaced in accordance with the approved plan on an annual basis;
- 3. That all repair and service work shall occur inside the building;
- 4. That no trucks or trailers shall be allowed to be stored in the parking lot;
- 5. That parking lot lighting which meets requirements of the UDO shall be required;
- 6. That all trash, refuse and recycling containers must be kept within the dumpster enclosure on the west side of the property, and that the gates to the enclosure must be kept closed at all times except when employees are accessing the enclosure or when the waste hauler is servicing the property;
- 7. That if any additional ground-mounted or roof mounted mechanical and utility equipment is installed, said equipment shall be screened per requirements of the UDO; and

8. That the site and business must be maintained and operated in accordance with all State, County and Village codes and regulations.

#### SECTION 6:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form, provided, however, that this Ordinance is executed by the owners or such other party in interest, consenting to and agreeing to be bound by all of the terms and conditions contained within this Ordinance. Such execution and delivery to the Village shall take place within sixty (60) days after the passage and approval of this Ordinance or within such extension of time as may be granted in the discretion of the corporate authorities, by motion.

#### **SECTION 7:**

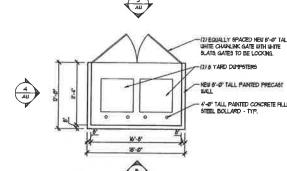

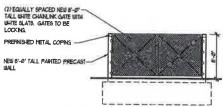


DUMPSTER ENCLOSURE PLAN

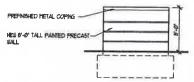

BARTEL'S AUTO CLINIC S Gary Avenue, Carol Stream, overall site Plan

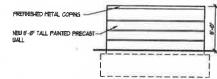

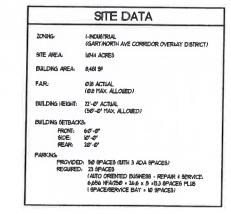


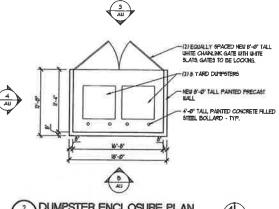
4 DUMPSTER ENCLOSURE ELEVATION

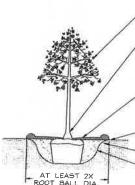

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CAROL STREAM CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 13, ARTICLE 2, SECTION 13-2-37 SEWER LINE MAINTENANCE/ REPLACEMENT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, Chapter 13, Article 2, Section 13-2-37 is hereby amended in its entirety which shall read as follows:

#### 13-2-37 Sewer Line Maintenance/Replacement

- (A) The property owner is responsible for the maintenance and repair of the private sewer line from their structure to the main sewer or Public Sewer including the connection into the main/Public Sewer.
- (B) In the event the property owner finds it necessary to excavate the private sewer line for maintenance or replacement, such excavation shall be the property owner's responsibility.
- (C) In those instances when property owners have had to excavate and as a result the sidewalk, curb and street have been dug out or damaged, the property owner will be responsible for the restoration of the street (surface and sub-surface) curb and sidewalk.
- (D) In those instances where Subsection C. is involved, it is recommended tunneling under the curb and sidewalk whenever practical. Sidewalk and curb must be cut when removal is required.
- (E) All work, as it is related to the replacement and/or repair of the private sewer line, shall be in conformance with the Village standard construction specifications and will be inspected by a Duly Authorized Agent of the Village during the repair and replacement.
- (F) The Village will participate in the repair or replacement of a private sanitary sewer service line located under the paved roadway within the Village's right-of-way subject to the following:
  - 1. The sanitary sewer service line has been televised by the property owner and based on the evidence provided to the Village, to include video and evidence of location of the potential issue, the Village Engineer or Public Works Director have determined the sewer service line under the paved roadway presents the potential to damage the Village's paved roadway or the Village's sewer main if uncorrected; and
  - 2. The only method of repair or replacement of the sanitary sewer service line requires excavation of the Village's paved roadway.
  - 3. The Village will reimburse the property owner fifty-percent (50%) of the costs toward the repair or replacement of the private sanitary sewer line under the Village paved roadway and pavement repair in an amount not to exceed \$10,000. The applicant will be responsible for all additional costs associated with the sanitary sewer service line repair or replacement in excess of these amounts.
  - 4. The applicant will indemnify, hold and release the Village from any and all liability arising from the repair of the sanitary sewer service line by the Village.

- 5. Repair or replacement of any private sanitary sewer line outside of a Village paved roadway will be not be eligible for reimbursement and shall remain the responsibility of the homeowner pursuant to subsections (A) through (E) of this section.
- 6. In all cases, maintenance of the entire private sanitary sewer service line shall remain the responsibility of the property owner, including but is not limited to flushing to clear blockages and root cutting in the property owner's service line.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by law.

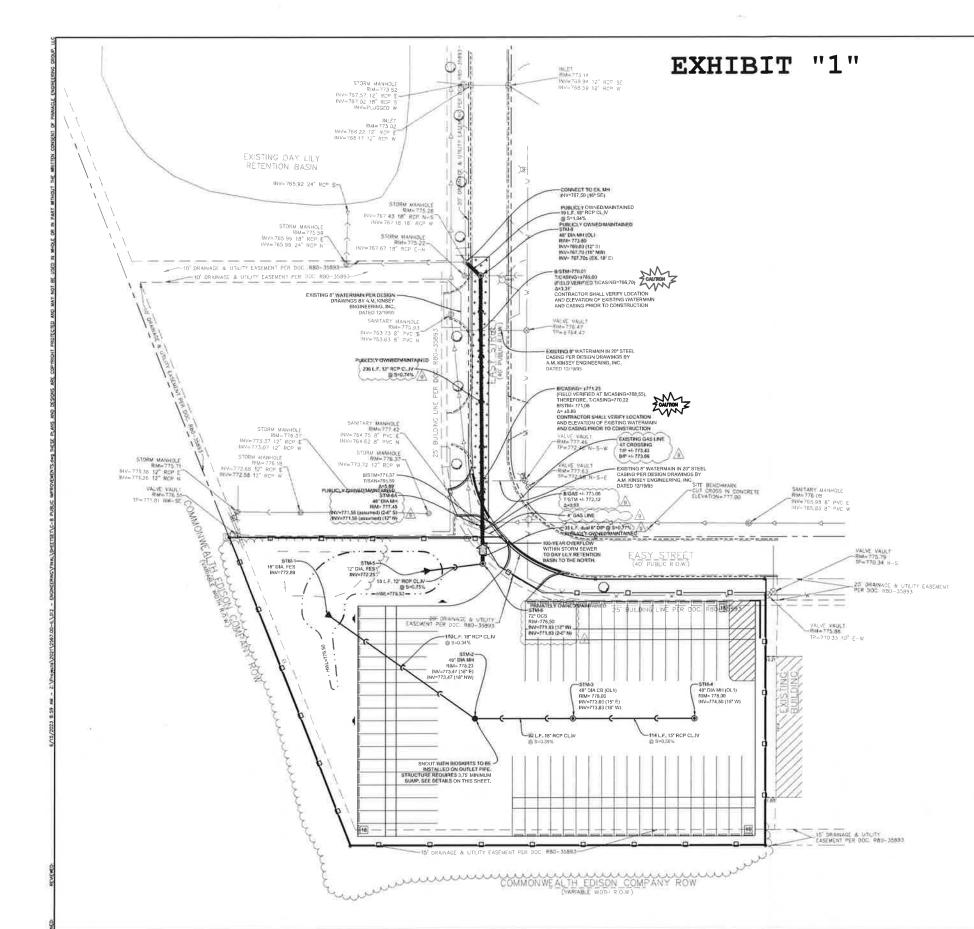

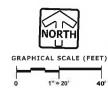

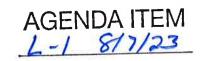
