The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Frank Saverino, Sr. and the roll call read by Village Clerk Laura Czarnecki. The result of the roll call vote was as follows:

#### Village Hall Remodeling

Mark Bushhouse updated the Village Board on the four (4) options for remodeling/adding to the existing Village Hall or to build a new facility including cost options. He reviewed plan options 1 & 2 with the Village Board.

#### **BOARD UPDATE**

#### **STUDY GOALS:**

Determine the condition of the existing building, the village hall & police department's current and long term facility space needs, and find the best option to maintain, remodel, expand and/or replace the facility.

#### A. PROCESS:

- 1. Facility Evaluation
  - a. Complete and reviewed at the last Board meeting
- 2. Space Needs Analysis
  - a. Complete and reviewed at the last Board meeting
- 3. Facility Improvement Options and Budgets
  - a. Based upon Board direction from this update meeting, the Architect and staff worked to develop the 4 options as requested.
  - b. These include::
    - 1) Repairs and code required changes, updates to the building's finishes and furniture, plus additions and major remodeling to meet the space program recommendations
    - 2) The above, plus partial demolition of the existing building, possible land acquisition and additions and changes to the building, site layout and parking
    - 3) Construction of an all new police station on another site and remodeling to the village hall for the departments that remain
    - 4) Construction of an all new facility to house the village hall and police on another site and then sell the current site for its highest and best use
  - c. Meeting on Thursday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>, with the Board to review the developed options and their potential budget requirement for Board selection of the best overall approach
  - d. Board to consider possible other facility options and/or timing and funding for the facility improvements

#### **B. FINDINGS**

- 1. Facility Evaluation COMPLETE
- 2. Space Needs COMPLETE
  - a. The facility should be approximately 54,730 SF to adequately support the near term staffing levels plus approximately 6 new work spaces to allow some minor growth and/or change in the years that follow
- 3. OPTION 1
  - a. Site and blocking floor plans provided to show the improvements expected
  - b. Includes remodeling to the entire facility, additions as required to meet the space program and minor site changes/repairs as necessary.
    - i. Total Estimated Project Budget: \$10,136,072 to \$12,396,534

#### 4. OPTION 2

- a. Site and blocking floor plans provided to show the improvements expected
- b. Includes demolition of the one level portion of the building that is then replaced by a three level addition (lower level, main level and upper level). Also includes remodeling of the remaining portions of the building and minor site changes/repairs as necessary:
  - i. Total Estimated Project Budget: \$13,096,836 to \$15,650,442

#### 5. OPTION 3

- a. No drawings provided since new facility is contemplated to be located on an unknown site.
- b. Includes construction of an all new police facility on another site and full remodeling to the existing village hall.
  - i. Total Estimated Project Budget: \$22,398,350 to \$26,035,050

#### 6. OPTION 4

- a. No drawings provided since new facility is contemplated to be located on an unknown site
- b. Includes construction of an all new combined police and village hall facility on another site
  - i. Total Estimated Project Budget: \$23,599,455 to \$26,568,176

#### C. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Board review and give direction on the options presented
- 2. Board review and give direction on the budgets presented
- 3. Board review and direct Architect and staff to investigate any other facility improvement options with their associated estimated budgets as the Board would determine to be in the best interests of the Village OR select the option that is in the best interests of the Village and direct staff to develop a funding plan for Board review at a future Board meeting.

Concept A Site Plan, Concept B Site Plan and Options 1 through 4 are attached and made part of the March 3, 2016 Special Workshop Meeting minutes.

Exterior brick colors can be permanently stained or bricks found to match existing color.

Timeline: 8 to 9 months for planning and design; 16 to 18 months for construction.

Option 2 – Police Department issues include having investigations upstairs and rest of Police Department downstairs. Officers carrying equipment from basement to main level.

Option 2 – Possibly moving little used Board Room upstairs.

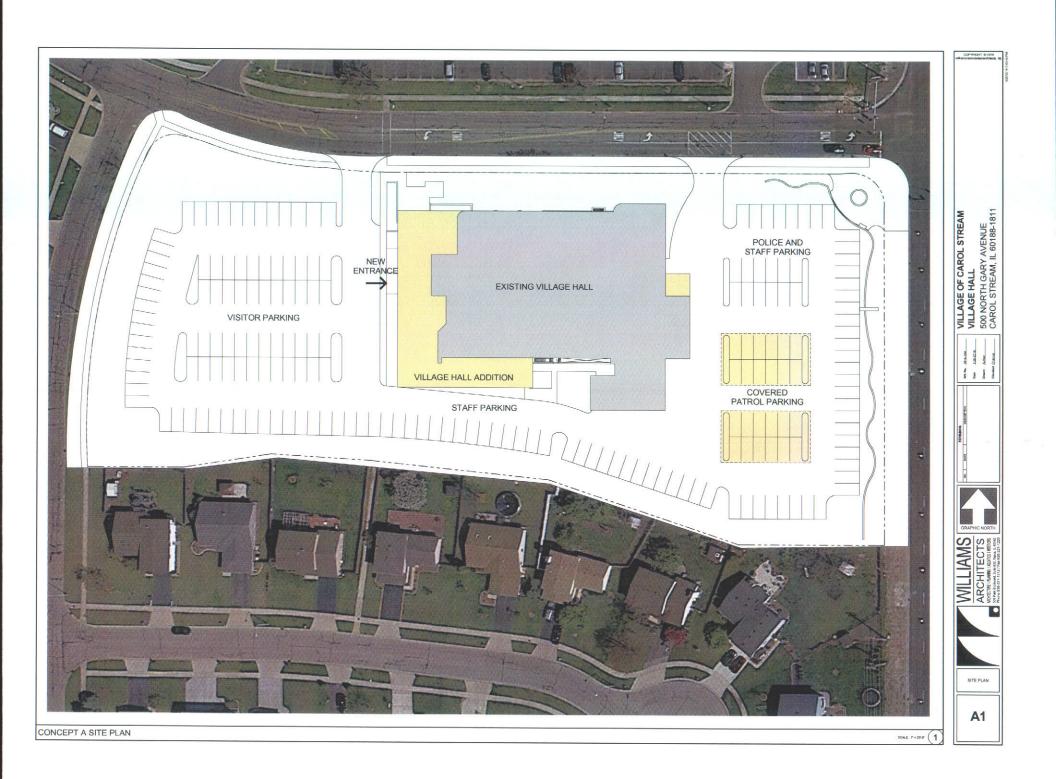
Option 3 – Dramatically increases ongoing operating costs due to redundancy. If the Village Board temporarily changes 50% reserve policy to 25% we could find \$10 million in cash reserves as long as Board realizes we need to be more frugal, reduce our CIP expectations and replenish our reserves. We would still need to issue debt secured with a property tax levy which could be abated each year.

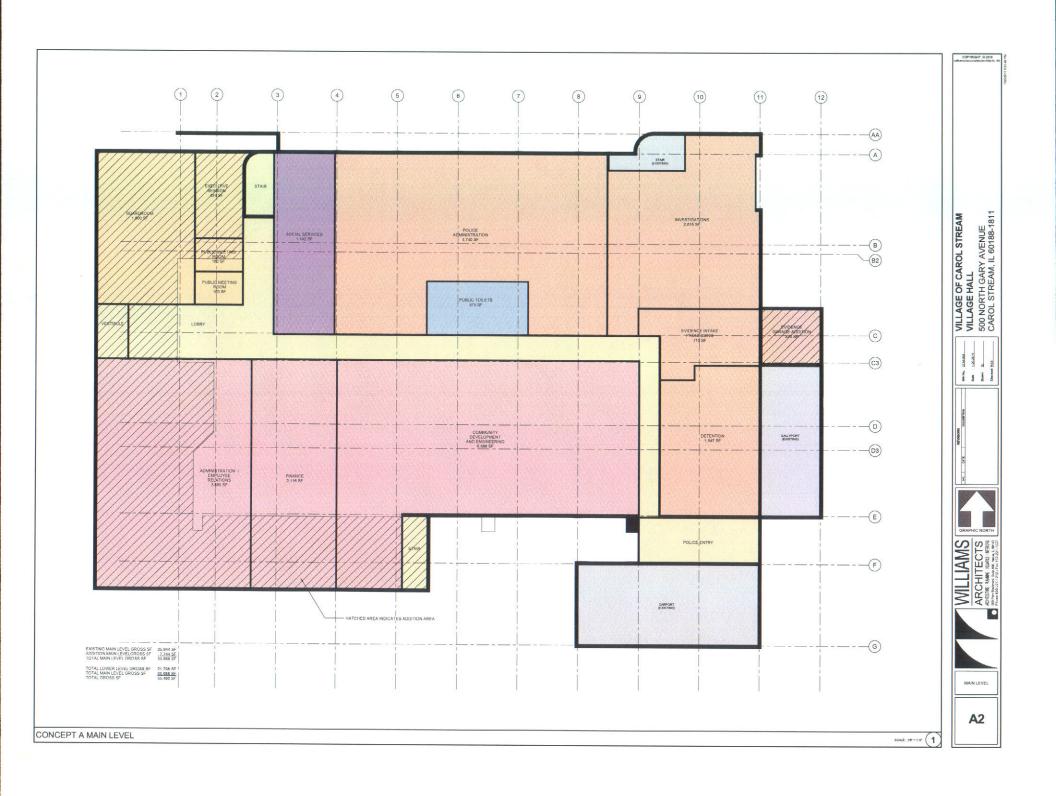
Plan 2 seems to be the best option as long as it's acceptable to the operating departments. Trustees Schwarze, McCarthy, LaRocca and Mayor Saverino – Village Board concurred to eliminate options 3 & 4.

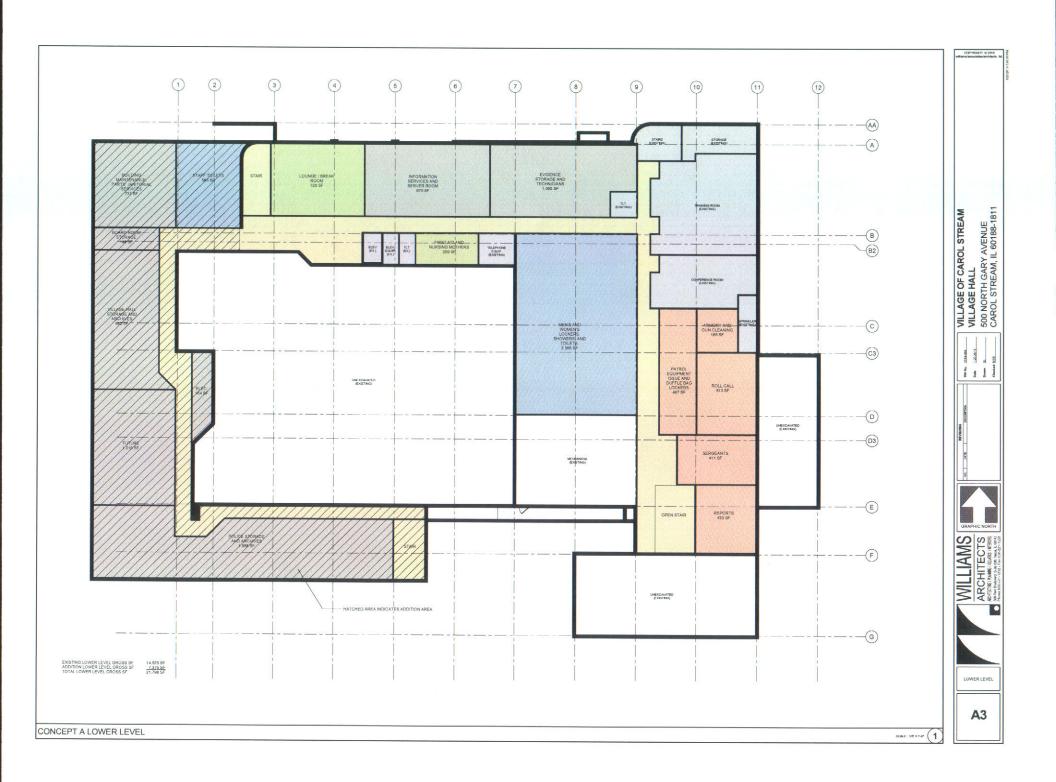
Trustee Frusolone does not want cost of building construction to be used as an excuse not to give out raises.

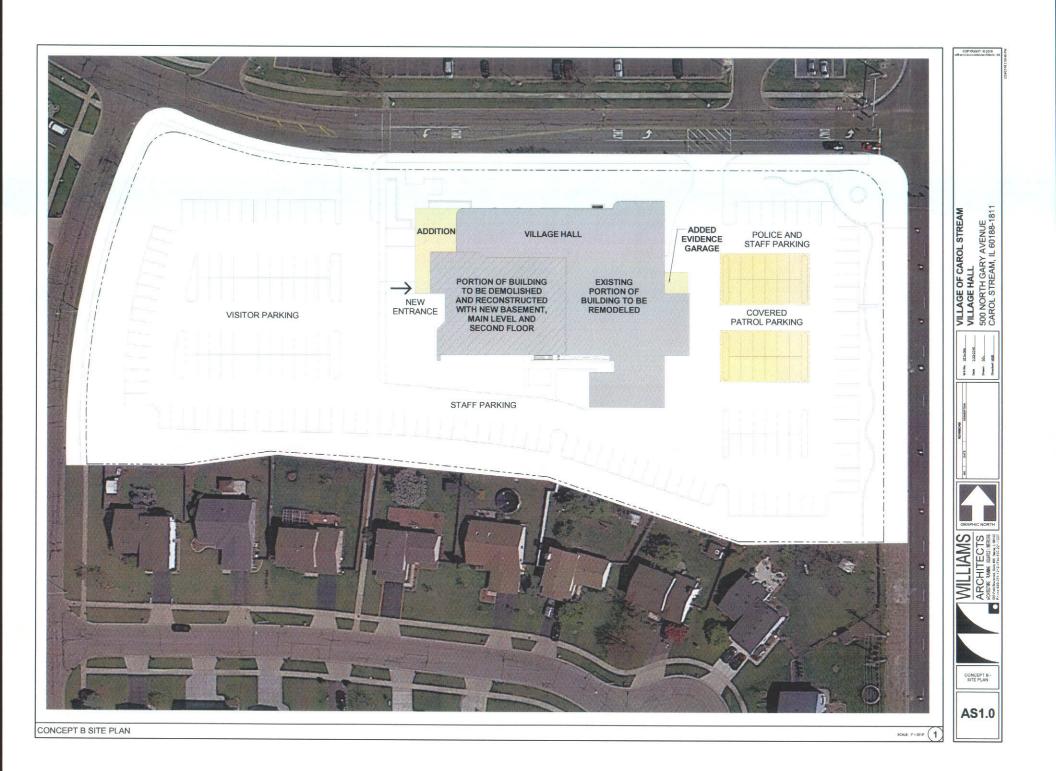

#### Water & Sewer Fund FY 16/17

- Focus is different than General Governmental Funds.
- Enterprise Operation. Cost of providing service is covered by rates charged to users of the Water and Sanitary Sewer systems. 95% of all revenues come directly from water/sewer rates.

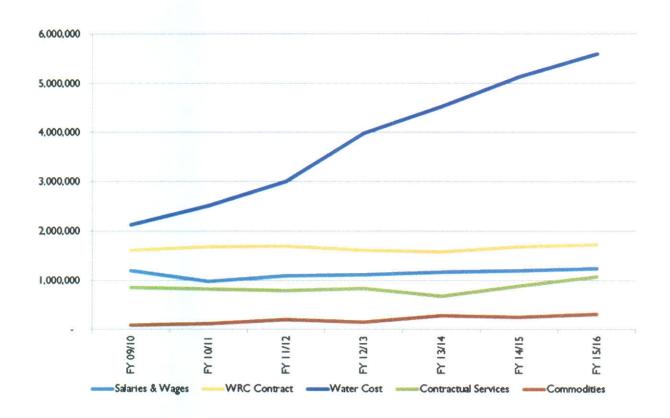
- Funding used exclusively for Water/Sewer operating and capital costs (no subsidies from General Fund or other funds).
- Rates must be set to cover day to day system operating expenses as well as provide for current and future capital replacements and rehabilitations.
- 1. We will review the past and present financial condition of the Water/Sewer Fund as well as the forecasted financial plan to meet the needs of the system into the future.
- 2. We will show the impact of rate changes on operating expenditures as well as capital funding.
- 3. We will make a recommendation for water/sewer rates beginning May 1, 2016 as well as solicit Village Board feedback on rate preferences.

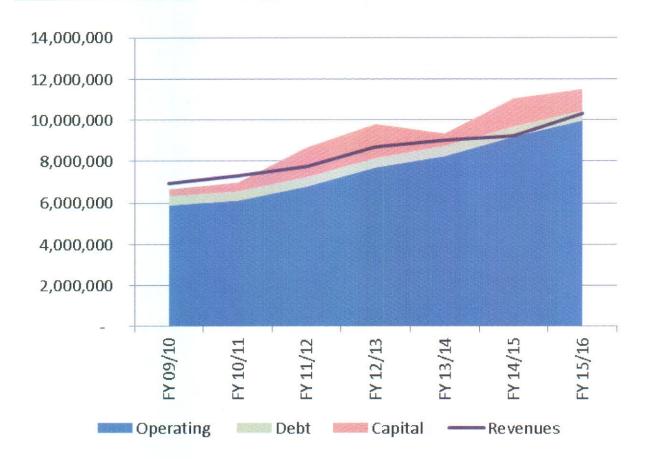

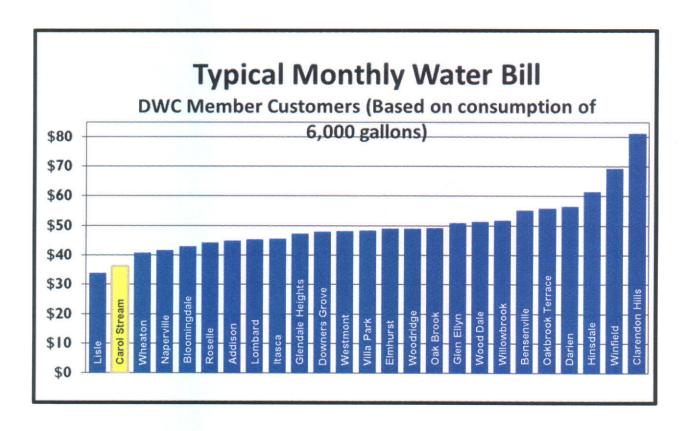
- Water Costs have had the most notable impact on Fund performance.
- We have drawn from reserves in each of the last 5 years to complete Capital Projects.
- In the last 2 years, the Fund is not raising enough money to fully cover Operating Expenses and no new reserves are being generated for future Capital Projects.
- Based on the current proposed budget, cash reserves available for Capital Projects will be reduced to zero within the next 3 years and the Water & Sewer Fund will be unable to meet the policy minimum 25% Operating Reserve.

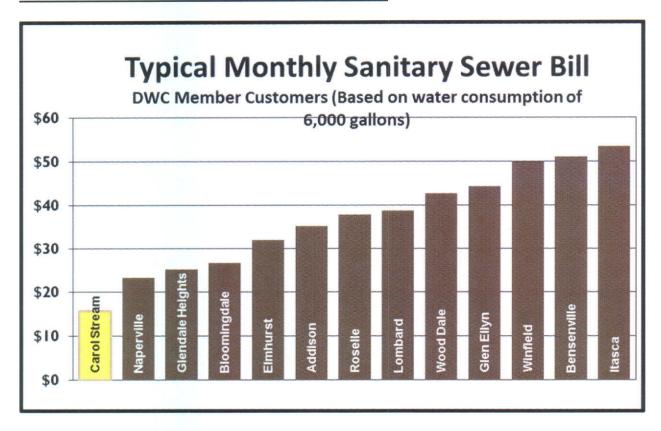

- During the 7 year period of Chicago / DWC rate increases, Carol Stream chose to restrict its increases in water rates to cover ONLY our added water purchase costs.
- Reserves were adequate, thus minimize financial impact to customers.

- Thus today, we are not covering our operating costs and are generating nothing for future capital.

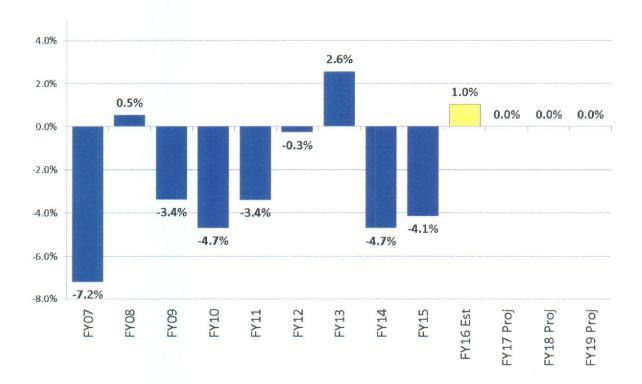

#### Water & Sewer Fund FY 16/17 - Revenues

There is an important relationship between water billed and water purchased.

Fact: Water billed is always less than water purchased.

Objective: A key measure of system efficiency is the ratio of water billed to water purchased.

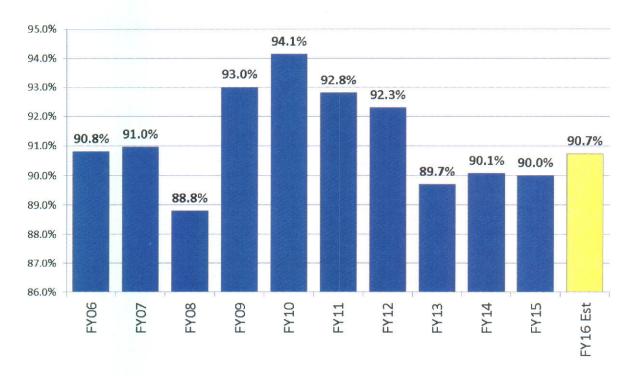
A 90% billed to purchased ratio or higher is generally believed to be an indicator of an efficient system.

#### Potential sources of unbilled water:

- Underground leaks (mains, service lines).
- Hydrant Flushing / Fire Department use.
- Illegal hydrant taps or other connections.
- Water main breaks, system flushing and testing.

Aging metering equipment, billing problems.

Good news, billed to purchased is back on the rise. Project to be approx. 91% for FYE15/16. (Has been 94.7% for the most recent 6 months)

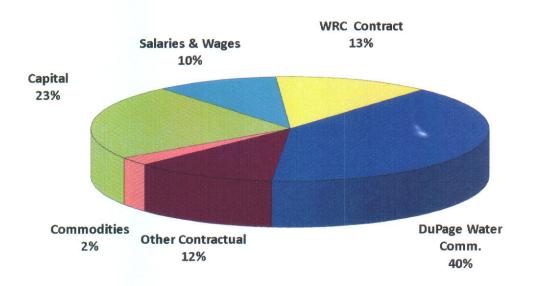

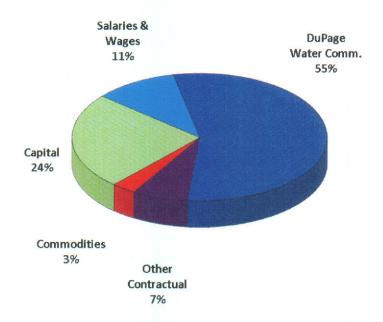

#### Rate Recommendation

- Recommend a \$0.50 rate increase eff. 5/1/16
  - Water = \$0.20 Sewer = \$0.30
  - New Combined Rate = \$10.35
  - Represents a 5% increase over the current combined rate of \$9.85.

- This will fully cover budgeted operating expenses where previous rate adjustments were unable to keep up.
- This still raises no additional funding for capital improvements.
- This would be the first of a number of annual adjustments needed to "right size" funding for the next generation of capital improvements.
- This is a more measured/conservative approach as opposed to more of a one-time large rate adjustment.

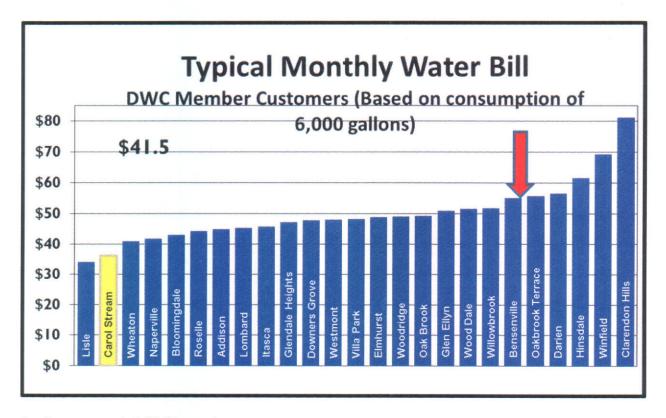

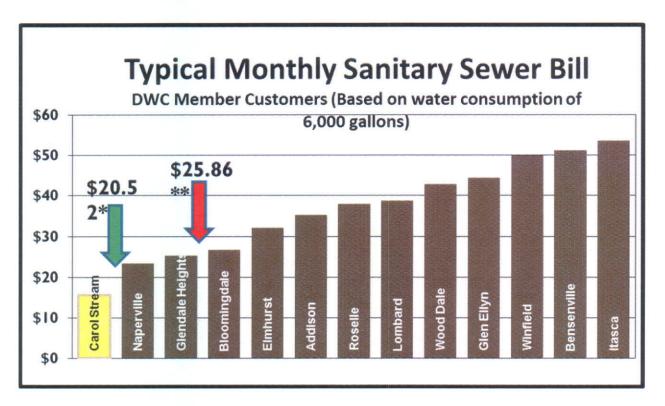

Monarch Waystation Designation

Last week, engineering staff was approached by our pond and shoreline maintenance consultant, Bedrock Earthscapes, with an opportunity to raise awareness of loss of butterfly habitat by designating a "Monarch Waystation" at the northwest corner of Gary Avenue and Lies Road. This program was created by a group called Monarch Watch in Wilmington, Delaware (monarchwatch.org). The organization is dedicated to education, conservation and research.

This property has previously received grants for habitat restoration from Trees Forever, Illinois Buffer Partnership, to plant native trees and vegetation to encourage pollinator species by the creation of natural food sources and breeding grounds. As such, native milkweed and other insect nourishment plantings were established, meeting the criteria for the Monarch Waystation.

The owner of Bedrock Earthscapes, Bill Bedrossian, made the application and purchased the information sign for the Village of Carol Stream and has offered to install the sign at his expense. Engineering staff therefore recommends the establishment of a Monarch Waystation at the northwest corner of Lies Road and Gary Avenue.

Change Order #1- Salt Purchase Contract

On April 2, 2015, the Village Board approved the purchase of salt through the DuPage County joint bid from Morton Salt, Inc., for the 2015-16 winter season. The purchase contract included a base order amount of 2,100 tons, with an option to purchase between 80% to 130% of the base amount depending on our needs. The price per ton was \$70.44, which was the same price extended from the prior years' contract. DuPage County is now preparing to go to bid for pricing for the 2016-17 season.

We are preparing to order the final 365 tons of our maximum allowable salt (130%) under the current purchase contract and will be significantly under budget after completing the purchase. Therefore, we contacted Morton Salt to see if they would sell us additional salt over and above our contractual amount at the same contract price of \$70.44/ton; Morton has agreed to do so (see copy of e-mail attached).

Since the current price has been in place for two years, the pricing for the 2016-17 season is not yet known and we have funding still available in the current fiscal year, we are recommending that we purchase an additional 335 tons before the end of the fiscal year. We will coat the salt with an organic compound and use a conveyor to load the salt. This will fill the dome in advance of next winter while remaining under budget in the current year and allow us to reduce the amount we have to order next year. For instance, the proposed budget assumes the purchase of 3,000 tons next year; by filling the dome now we will be able to reduce our order for next year to 1,500 tons (with an option to buy between 80% and 130% of that amount).

Staff recommends that the Mayor and Board approve a Motion authorizing Change Order #1 to the Salt Purchase Contract in the amount of \$23,597.40.

On Thursday, March 10th at 11:00 AM bids were opened for the referenced project and read aloud. The following is a summary of the bids as read;

A bid irregularity of \$18,000 was noted in Builder's Paving bid, making the actual bid \$3,871,384.75. This had no effect on their placement or the overall bid opening.

The budget for the Flexible Pavement Project is \$4,340,000 for this year including \$3,960,000 for streets and \$380,000 for the Simkus Parking Lot. The low bid from Plote Construction included \$2,810,657.08 for the streets and \$302,094.80 for the Simkus Center Parking Lot. Both bids were much lower than expected primarily due to lower fuel costs. The Carol Stream Park District has reviewed the bids and requested that we award the Alternate to pave the Simkus Parking Lot. A separate Intergovernmental Agreement was also approved describing terms and conditions of the projects.

Engineering staff therefore recommends the 2016 Flexible Pavement Project be awarded to Plote Construction, Inc. of Hoffman Estates including Alternate 1 "Simkus Center Parking Lot" at the bid unit prices attached.

CDM Smith, Inc.

In 2003 the US EPA began requiring all smaller communities to comply with NPDES storm water permit (ILR 40) regulations that were previously directed at larger municipalities (Phase I). This second initiative directed at small MS4s was called Phase II and included the Village. The ILR 40 permit required small MS4s to adopt a Storm Water Management Program (SWMP) within five years that included six minimum control measures each with its own set of best management practices (BMPs). In July 2006 the Village updated its SWMP to comply with these regulations.

The initial NPDES ILR 40 permit expired in 2009. It was reissued, but expired in 2014. It wasn't until just recently, February 10, 2016, that IEPA issued a new revised NPDES ILR 40 permit. The new permit became effect March 1st and the Village has 90 days or by June 1st to submit a new NOI meeting all the new IRL 40 permit requirements. In addition the Village must initiate updating its SWMP and make any necessary changes to its storm water pollution prevention plan (SWPPP) requirements by September 1st.

Engineering staff made comments during the public review and comment period as did numerous other municipalities as well as environmental advocacy groups (EAGs). Judging by the initial draft we anticipated we could accomplish the changes in-house. However, after review of the final NPDES ILR 40 permit it became readily apparent we could not. The final permit that was issued had numerous and significant changes from the draft. The following list identifies some of requirements that will have the most impact on the Village:

- 1. Annual public meetings are now required for all NOIs and SWMPs allowing the public to provide their adequacy. In addition environmental justice areas must be identified along with implementing special accommodations to ensure public participation is afforded to these areas.
- 2. The Village must take into account climate change in the design, operation, education and maintenance of all BMPs, soil erosion control measures, flood control and storm water management facilities. There is no definition, standard or guidance as to what degree we must take this into account.

- 3. There are additional training programs will need to be implemented that include different employee groups as well as our contractors and many are required to be performed annually.
- 4. Design, install, implement, and maintain effective pollution prevention measures that will reduce the discharge of pollutants to the maximum extent practicable. There is no definition for the term "maximum extent practicable" nor is there a standard.
- 5. A program must be developed that assess the ability of all existing storm water management facilities including BMPs, flood control facilities and other water quality control elements to reduce pollutants and the volume generated from storm water runoff.
- 6. Develop a program where all existing flood control techniques are evaluated to determine the feasibility for pollution control retrofits. The Village has over 260 storm water management facilities that may eventually have to be retrofitted.
- 7. Inspection of all storm sewer outfalls with major/high priority outfall inspections being performed annually.
- 8. Inspection of all municipal BMPs.
- 9. The village will need to incorporate total maximum daily loads (TMDLs) for chloride as well as any future TMDLs into our NOI and SWMP.

Due to our inability to meet the deadlines imposed by EPA we requested and obtained a quote from CDM Smith, Inc. to provide NPDES ILR 40 permit support and preparation of the required Notice of Intent (NOI). CDM Smith was chosen because of their extensive national experience and expertise in developing NOIs and SWMPs. I have also worked with them on several DRSCW initiatives and found them to be very knowledgeable with many aspects of storm water management and familiar with the region. Staff has reviewed the proposal and found it acceptable. Therefore, Engineering recommends entering into an Engineering Services Agreement with CDEM Smith, Inc. for the NPDES MS4 permit support and preparation of the required NOI in an amount not to exceed \$12,570.

The SWMP and SWPPP requirement updates can't be undertaken until the NOI has been completed. Once finished we will seek another proposal to perform these updates thereby bringing them into compliance.

- d. Review options and program elements with Village staff; receive direction
- e. Finalize MS4 program elements
- 3. Produce NOI document
  - a. Develop draft NOI document, address Village staff comments
  - b. Develop final NOI document

CDM Smith proposes a fee of \$12,500 including labor and all direct expenses to complete the scope of work. Hour and fee estimates by task are presented below.

**Desktop Computer Equipment Purchase** 

Included in this year's fiscal budget is \$38,500 to purchase 35 new computers to replace the aging desktop computers and terminal systems through-out the Village. There was no pre-selected hardware brand for this purchase. In an effort to secure the best pricing for the Village, staff had identified the desktop hardware system requirements and contacted various vendors to provide quotes for computer models that met our specifications. Staff did not advise the vendors to quote a particular computer brand, it was incumbent on the reseller to identify the brand/model and provide the Village with the best possible pricing. The vendors were given the opportunity to quote any major desktop brand and model that met our requirements (DELL, HP, Lenovo, etc). In some cases the vendor only quoted the brand they were able to quote competitively, other vendors quoted multiple brands.

The below chart illustrates the price comparison per unit, please note the purchase price will be extended to reflect a quantity of 35.

As illustrated in the table above, MNJ Technologies was able to provide a quality branded desktop at the lowest cost per unit. Considering better pricing proved to be unavailable for identical equipment, it is recommended that we waive competitive bidding and award of contract for purchase of above noted equipment to MNJ Technologies at a total cost of \$33,976.60 (\$970.76 x quantity 35) which is \$4,523.40 under the budgeted amount. There are sufficient funds in the budget to pay for these expenditures.

Water and Sewer Rate Ordinance - May 1, 2016

Transmitted with this memorandum is an ordinance establishing water and sewer rates effective May 1, 2016.

As recommended in the Water and Sewer Fund budget workshop meeting on March 7<sup>th</sup>, a rate increase for water (\$0.20 per 1,000 gallons) and sewer (\$0.30 per 1,000 gallons water used) is needed to fully cover operating costs of the Fund for the upcoming May 1, 2016 to April 30, 2017 fiscal year.

As indicated, we have been drawing from reserves for a number of years to complete capital improvements and rehabilitations of system infrastructure assets. While this is an acceptable use of Fund reserves, these balances are declining and will not be available much beyond the forecast 3 year financial plan. The 3 year financial plan still relies heavily on reserve balances (rather than current rates) to complete scheduled capital improvements.

I have updated some of the key Water and Sewer Fund summaries on the attached pages which show a positive balance of \$91,124 in the FY16/17 "Net Income / (Loss) Before Capital" subtotal and reflects the recommended rate impact to the Fund. Note that this is before the \$3.2 million in scheduled capital improvements and required debt payments.

As we mentioned in the budget review workshop on March 7<sup>th</sup>, the upcoming FY16/17 budget includes a number of studies and system evaluations which will provide further insight into the condition and needs of the aging water and sanitary sewer infrastructure. We expect that this will bring us greater focus on future capital funding needs that will drive future rate and financing discussions.

As you are aware, even considering the proposed rate adjustments for May 1, Carol Stream continues to have among the lowest combined water and sewer rates among DuPage Water Commission communities.

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 13-3-13 OF THE VILLAGE CODE PERTAINING TO WATER AND SEWER RATES

WHEREAS, the Village of Carol Stream owns and operates a combined water and sanitary sewerage system that serves all residents and businesses in the Village of Carol Stream and some of the adjacent unincorporated areas; and

WHEREAS, all of the funds required for the operation, maintenance and improvement of the system come from the users of the system, essentially through a system of user rates and charges; and

WHEREAS, the Village's proposed Water and Sewer Fund Budget for the new fiscal year beginning May 1, 2016 through April 30, 2017 projects that anticipated revenues to be generated from current water and sewer rates will be insufficient to cover proposed operating expenses necessary to maintain the water and sanitary sewer systems in good working order; and

WHEREAS, an increase in the water rate of \$0.20 per 1,000 gallons billed to Carol Stream water customers is necessary to offset the Village's costs of maintaining a safe and reliable potable water distribution system; and

WHEREAS, an increase in the sanitary sewerage rate of \$0.30 per 1,000 gallons of water billed is necessary to ensure sufficient funds are generated to meet the continued operational and maintenance costs of the sanitary sewerage collection and treatment systems,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Section 13-3-13 of the Village Code of Ordinances,
Subsections (B), (C) and (D) of the Village of Carol Stream pertaining to Water and
Sewer Rates is and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

§13-3-13 RATES

(B) For each residential single-family, commercial or industrial user of the combined waterworks and sewerage system within the corporate limits, the charge for water and sewer service shall be as follows:

The charge shall be \$10.35 per each 1,000 gallons or a fraction thereof.

(C) For each residential single-family and multi-family, commercial, or industrial user of water service only, within the corporate limits, the charge for water service only shall be as follows:

For each 1,000 gallons, the charge shall be \$6.93 per each 1,000 gallons or fraction thereof.

(D) For each residential single-family and multi-family, commercial or industrial user of the sewer service only, within the corporate limits, the charge for sewer service only shall be as follows:

For each 1,000 gallons, the charge shall be \$3.42 for each 1,000 gallons or fraction thereof.

SECTION 2: All other sections of the code not herein modified or changed shall remain in full force and effect.

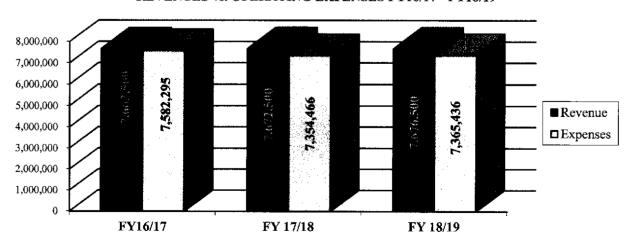

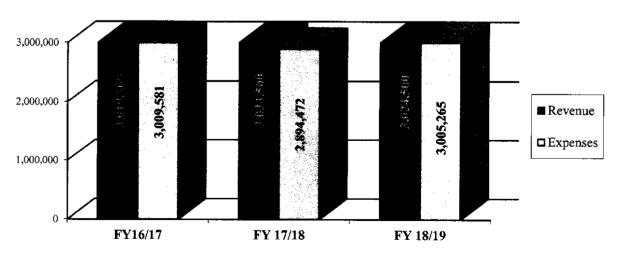

WHEREAS, Grantor has agreed to grant the Grantee the necessary nonexclusive permanent easement and a temporary construction easement relative to the Water Main Improvements, as set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration in hand paid, receipt of which is

hereby acknowledged, the terms and conditions set forth below and the benefits to be derived from this Grant of Easement, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. That the recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if set forth fully herein.
- 2. The Temporary Easement shall terminate on the date which is twenty-four (24) months from the date this Grant of Easement is recorded.

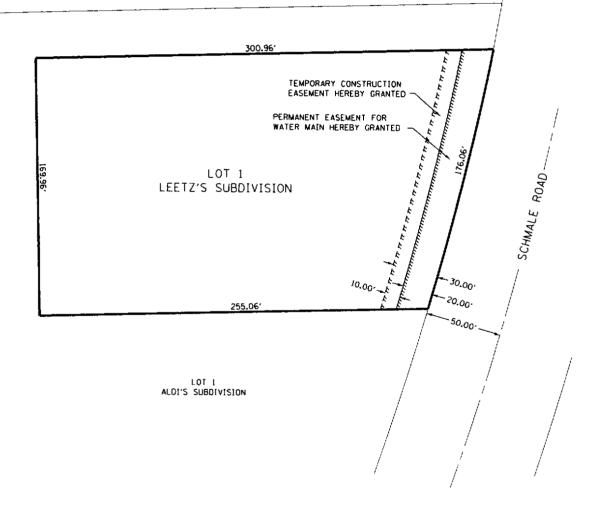

Simkus Center Parking Lot Paving - Intergovernmental Agreement with the Carol Stream Park District to Define Rights and Obligations

In the fall of last year the Carol Stream Park District asked the Village if we would consider including the Simkus Center parking lot in our Flexible Paving Project in order to benefit from "economics of scale". The Park District hired a consultant to determine quantities and gave us the information for inclusion in our bid packet. These quantities were included as an alternate in the bid in case the Park District chose not to approve the work.

The contract to perform this work will only be between the Village of Carol Stream and Plote Construction, the low bidder. It was therefore determined that an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) was required to define the rights and obligations of each party. The Park District will have their own consulting engineer for inspection and material testing. The Village will make payment to the contractor and invoice the Park District for their work.

The Park District approved the IGA at their meeting on March 14<sup>th</sup> and requested the Village award the Simkus Parking Lot work. Therefore, we recommend approval of the Resolution Authorizing the Execution of an IGA between the Carol Stream Park District and the Village of Carol Stream for paving the Simkus Center Parking Lot.

## AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM AND THE CAROL STREAM PARK DISTRICT (SIMKUS CENTER)

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement") is entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2016, by and between the VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM (hereinafter referred to as the "VILLAGE") and the CAROL STREAM PARK DISTRICT (hereinafter referred to as the "DISTRICT"). The VILLAGE and the DISTRICT are hereinafter sometimes individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively referred to as the "Parties."

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, on an annual basis the VILLAGE conducts a Flexible Pavement Project for the removal and replacement of asphalt, sidewalks, curbs, gutters and manhole repair and replacement upon certain streets located within the boundaries of the VILLAGE; and

WHEREAS, the District is the owner of the property known as the Simkus Recreation Center, 849 W. Lies Road, Carol Stream, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the District has determined that the parking lot at the Simkus Recreation Center is in need of reconstruction including the removal and replacement of asphalt, sidewalk and curb removal and replacement, structure adjustment and installation of pavement markings (the Simkus Project); and

WHEREAS, in order to benefit from reduced pricing for increased quantities and shared project costs, and to reduce the overall cost of the Simkus Project, the District has requested that the VILLAGE bid the Simkus Project as part of its 2016 Flexible Pavement Project; and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE has agreed to include the Simkus Project as an alternative within its bid documents for the 2016 Flexible Pavement Project and, upon the approval of the District, to enter into a contract with the lowest responsible bidder for the Simkus Project work, as more fully set forth within this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the District has agreed to pay the full costs of the Simkus Project and to take such other actions as are set forth in this Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, Article VII, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and 5 ILCS 220/1, *et seq.* authorize units of local government to contract or otherwise associate among themselves to obtain or share services, to exercise, combine or transfer any power or function, in any manner not prohibited by law, to use their credit, revenues and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interests of the DISTRICT and the VILLAGE to enter into this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the mutual covenants and agreements contained therein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. <u>INCORPORATION OF PREAMBLES.</u> The preambles hereto, as set forth above, are incorporated herein by reference and are made part hereof.
- 2. VILLAGE RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS. In relation to the Simkus Project:
  - A. The VILLAGE shall, as part of its 2016 Flexible Pavement Project competitive bid process, include within the bid documents, specifications for the Simkus Project as a separate bid item. The specifications shall provide those items as attached hereto in Exhibit "A".
  - B. Upon receipt and opening of all bid proposals, the VILLAGE shall determine, in accordance with applicable law, the lowest responsible bidder for the 2016 Flexible Pavement Project and the Simkus Project.
  - C. Upon receipt of a written notice to proceed from the District, the VILLAGE shall include the Simkus Project as part of the overall contract for the 2016 Flexible Pavement Project. However, if the lowest responsible bidder for the Flexible Pavement Project is not the lowest responsible bidder for the Simkus Project, the VILLAGE may refuse to enter into a contract solely for the Simkus Project.
  - D. In the event the VILLAGE determines that it is in its best interests to reject all bids for the 2016 Flexible Pavement Project, the VILLAGE shall have no obligation to award any bid or to enter into any contract solely with respect to the Simkus Project.
  - E. The Special Provisions as set forth within the Bid Documents shall be applicable to all work performed with respect to the Simkus Project.
  - F. The VILLAGE shall have no obligation to provide any construction management or supervision for the Simkus Project.
  - G. Upon award of the bid and contract approval, the VILLAGE shall hold a pre-construction meeting for the purpose of discussing the timing, schedule and other requirements for completion of the Projects.
  - H. All work to be performed for the Simkus Project shall comply with all federal, state laws and regulations and the VILLAGE of Carol Stream

Code of Ordinances.

I. As the contracting party, in the event of any dispute with respect to the work performed for the Simkus Project, the VILLAGE shall have the sole right to determine whether the work has been completed in accordance with the bid specifications, special provisions and the contract documents.

#### 3. <u>DISTRICT RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS.</u> In relation to the Simkus Project:

- A. The DISTRICT may, in its discretion, request that the VILLAGE contract with the lowest responsible bidder to perform the work on the Simkus Project. The DISTRICT shall, have the right to reject to Simkus Project bid for any reason. The DISTRICT shall, within five (5) days of the bid opening, advise the VILLAGE in writing as to whether it desires the VILLAGE to include the Simkus Project within the contract award. The contract price shall be the actual cost of quantities at the unit prices bid.
- B. Upon award of the contract for the Simkus Project, the DISTRICT shall grant the VILLAGE and the Contractor with full access to the Project Area.
- C. The DISTRICT shall employ, at its sole cost and expense, such persons or consultants as it deems necessary to perform construction supervision on the Simkus Project; it being expressly understood that the VILLAGE shall have no obligation to provide any construction supervision or management for the Simkus Project. Should any claim or dispute arise with respect to the performance of the work, the DISTRICT shall notify the VILLAGE of such claim or dispute, in writing.
- D. In the event that the Simkus Project is included within the award of bid, a DISTRICT representative shall be present and participate in the preconstruction meeting.
- E. The DISTRICT shall be obligated to secure, in a timely manner, any state, county or local permits necessary for the completion of the Simkus Project.
- F. The VILLAGE shall provide the DISTRICT with copies of any requests for partial or final payment, lien waivers and other supporting documents. Within five (5) days of receipt of such documents, the DISTRICT shall provide the VILLAGE with any objections to the payment request documents. Notwithstanding the foregoing, it is expressly understood that the VILLAGE shall have the sole right to determine whether to issue partial or final payment to the contractor.
- G. The DISTRICT shall, upon receipt of a payout approval from the Village for the project costs, pay to the VILLAGE the all costs associated with the

- SIMKUS PROJECT, based upon the bid proposal, quantities provided, and any DISTRICT approved change orders. Such payment(s) shall be made to the Village within fourteen (14) days of receipt of such bill.
- H. Upon completion of the SIMKUS Project work and final payment to the Contractor, the VILLAGE shall have no further obligations with respect to this Agreement.
- 4. <a href="INSURANCE OBLIGATIONS">INSURANCE OBLIGATIONS</a>. The VILLAGE agrees to require any contractor to include the DISTRICT, and its park commissioners, officers, officials, employees, volunteers and agents, as additional insureds on the insurance policies required of the contractor relative to the Simkus Project, which insurance policies shall be written with insurers and in amounts as set forth in the bid documents.

#### 5. <u>DISTRICT INDEMNIFICATION OF VILLAGE.</u>

- A. The DISTRICT shall indemnify and hold harmless the VILLAGE, and its elected officials, officers, agents, volunteers and employees, for any claims or losses, including, but not limited to, attorney's fees, costs and expenses of litigation, in connection with any and all injuries or damages of any kind or nature, which may arise, either directly or indirectly, out of the Simkus Project, the performance of the work thereto, or the performance of this Agreement.
- B. The DISTRICT shall indemnify and hold harmless the VILLAGE with respect to any claim, demand, action, lawsuit, proceedings or liability, (including but not limited to attorney's fees, costs and expenses of litigation), brought against the VILLAGE by the Contractor with respect to or arising out of the Simkus Project.
- 6. THIRD PARTIES AND DEFENSES. This Agreement is entered into for the benefit of each of the Parties, solely, and not for the benefit of any third party. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of any privileges, defenses or immunities which either Party may have under the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act with respect to any claim brought by a third party.
- 7. Notice or other writings which either Party is required to, or may wish to, serve upon the other Party in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

- 10. <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT.</u> This Agreement contains the entire understanding between the Parties and supersedes any prior understanding or written or oral agreements between them regarding the within subject matter. There are no representations, agreements, arrangements or understandings, oral or written, between and among the Parties hereto relating to the subject matter of this Agreement which are not fully expressed herein.
- 11. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u> This Agreement shall be deemed dated and become effective on the date the last of the Parties execute this Agreement as set forth below.

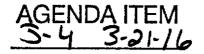

# AGREEMENT FOR REGULATION OF PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES AT A SHOPPING CENTER IN THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM

THIS AGREEMENT FOR REGULATION OF PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES AT A SHOPPING CENTER IN THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM (this "Agreement"), made and entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of March,2016, by and between the VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, a municipal corporation of the State of Illinois (the "Village") and PILOT TRAVEL CENTERS LLC, a Delaware limited liability company (the "Owner")

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Owner is the owner of a commercial facility (the "Shopping Center") which will include a parking area located within the limits of the Village, which is legally described in Appendix A attached to this Agreement and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, Owner desires to enter into an agreement with the Village in order to grant the Village rights to regulate the parking of motor vehicles in the parking area shown on Appendix B attached to this Agreement and incorporated herein by this reference, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 625 ILCS 5 sections 11-209 & 11-209.1, Illinois Compiled Statutes; and

WHEREAS, The Village and Owner have the requisite power and authority to enter into this Agreement on the terms, provisions, and conditions contained herein:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The Village hereby agrees to establish and enforce the following parking regulations within the Parking Area:
  - a. Stop signs within the jurisdiction of Carol Stream shall be posted at all exits from the Parking Area and the driver of a vehicle emerging from the Parking Area shall stop such vehicle immediately prior to driving onto a public sidewalk or street and shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian as may be necessary to avoid collision, and upon entering the public street or roadway shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching on said public street or roadway;
  - b. The standing or parking of any motor vehicle on a roadway or driveway which lies directly in front of the store located within the Shopping Center shall be prohibited, except that the Owner shall have the right to establish a loading zone in size and location acceptable to Owner, in Owner's sole and absolute discretion. If the Owner desires to establish such a loading zone, the Owner shall obtain, erect, and maintain at his own expense, suitable signs for this purpose;

- c. The prohibition of parking by vehicles not driven by or used by handicapped persons in parking spaces designated only for use by the handicapped;
- d. No commercial vehicle or truck shall be parked in the Parking Area for longer than two (2) hours and that signs advising commercial vehicle and truck drivers of the two (2) hour parking limitation must be posted on-site as shown on the signage plans;
- e. The removal and storage of any vehicle parked within the Parking Area which is left unattended for a period of two (2) days in such a manner as to constitute an obstruction to traffic or where stopping, standing or parking is prohibited. The Village may remove and impound such vehicle where it shall remain until a charge is made for the removal and storage in accordance with ordinance provisions. In the event that a vehicle is removed and impounded at the request of the Owner and the Village is unable to recover the cost for storing such vehicle, that amount shall be payable by the Owner.
- 2. The Owner does hereby agree to erect signs consistent with the manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways relating to the aforesaid regulations at the appropriate places within the Shopping Center;
- 3. The Owner does hereby agree to bear the costs and expenses of obtaining, erecting (consistent with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Street and Highways) and maintaining any and all signs necessary to the enforcement of the aforesaid regulations.
- 4. Intentionally Deleted.
- 5. The Village hereby agrees to regulate the parking of automobiles in the Parking Area of the Shopping Center to enforce the aforesaid regulations as provided herein.
- 6. Where any owner or user of a vehicle shall use or permit the use of a vehicle in a manner contrary to the regulations contained within this Agreement, the Village will enforce its ordinances and those State Traffic Code provisions against such person.
- 7. It is mutually agreed that this Agreement shall cover a period of one (1) year from the date hereof and shall be self-renewing for periods of one (1) year each thereafter, not to exceed a period of 20 years, unless same is canceled by not less than thirty (30) days written notice by either party to the other of its intention to cancel same.

The Owner hereby agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend (including the payment of all costs and attorney's fees) the Village, its officers and agents, in connection with any and all action or claims for any loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring as a consequence of the acts or omissions of the Owner, its officers agents and employees with respect to the performance of this agreement and the Owner shall procure insurance to protect, hold harmless and indemnify the Village pursuant thereto. Such insurance shall be in the minimum amount of one million dollars, and shall be in such form and with such company as shall be approved by the corporate authorities. Neither the amount of the insurance, nor a failure of the insurance company to pay, shall limit the obligation of the owner to indemnify, hold harmless and defend.
- 10. In consideration for the performance by the Village of the police services herein specified, the Village shall be paid the sum of \$0.00 per month. The Village shall, in the exercise of its' sole discretion, determine when the press of regular police business shall preclude the furnishing of extra police services under this Agreement.
- 11. The sole remedy available to the Village or Owner, upon any breach of this Agreement by the other party, shall be the cancellation of this Agreement under its terms. It is of the essence of this Agreement, that the parties shall not be liable in money damages for any breach of this Agreement.
- 12. This Agreement shall be construed, governed and administered in accordance with the laws of the state in which the Shopping Center is located.

The Information Technology department has identified the attached list of electronics to be no longer valuable to the Village. Some phone equipment, though no longer valuable for Village operations, does present a buy-back opportunity through Verizon. The exact buy-back value cannot be determined until it is evaluated by their recycler. I am asking the Village Board declare the list of electronic equipment surplus. Please see Attachment "Exhibit A"

We will use a combination of buy-back programs and recyclers including Carol Stream recycler, Com2 to properly dispose of, recycle and/or sell all equipment. All computer hard drives that have data on them will be destroyed by one of two methods. If the computer is to be resold, the computer hard drive will be wiped; using the US Department of Defense Data Security Standard DoD 5220.22 M and a Certificate of Recycle will be issued by the recycler. If the computer is to be destroyed, a Certificate of Destruction will be issued for that machine and hard drive. All phone equipment will be reset prior to being released to any outside reseller offering a buyback program.

Staff recommends that these items be declared surplus by the Mayor and the Board of Trustees and that the Information Technology Director be authorized to sell back or properly dispose of the equipment.
