PUBLIC HEARING:

Commissioner Spink moved and Commissioner Petella made the second to open the Public Hearing. The motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

Case # 15058 – Sindy Rogers / Manhattan's American Bar and Grill – 300 S. Schmale Rd Special Use Permit – Outdoor Seating Area

Chairman Pro-Tem Joseph swore in the witness, Sam Salahi, Architectural & Services, Ltd, 123 W. Front Street Suite 202, Wheaton, IL 60187 and Sindy Rogers, Manhattans, 300 S. Schmale Road, Carol Stream, IL 60188.

Mr. Salahi stated that Sindy Rogers is the owner of Manhattan's American Bar and Grill located at 300 S. Schmale Road and she would like construct to an addition in the rear of the existing building to allow for an outdoor seating area, small gaming room, an outdoor freezer and a storage room. He stated that the outdoor freezer would only be accessible from the inside of the building. He stated that the deck would have room for eight to nine tables and would be covered with a pergola for shade. He stated that the deck area will be surrounded by a 4' metal fence, landscaping and bollards. He stated that the new addition will be constructed with the same type of materials as the existing building. He stated that the petitioner has agreed to construct a new trash enclosure.

Chairman Pro-Tem Joseph asked Mr. Bastian for the staff report. Mr. Bastian stated that Ms. Swati Pandey the Development Service Technician would be presenting the staff report. Ms. Swati Pandey

stated that the petitioner is requesting approval for a Special Use Permit to allow outdoor seating, ancillary to a restaurant allowing the service and consumption of alcohol. She stated that it will be a rear addition with a 782 square foot deck and the area would have room for 8 tables with a total of 32 seats and the deck would be enclosed with a 4' fence that would also have an emergency gate for egress. She stated that staff's analysis included the compatibility with the surrounding uses and staff found that there would be minimal or no impact on the surrounding uses. She stated that in regards to safety staff has asked the petitioner to install one bollard for every parking space to provide safety and security for the deck area and she stated that the petitioner has agreed to this. She stated that some of the other concerns that staff had during a site inspection was the lack of a trash enclosure and the maintenance of the parking lot. She stated that the petitioner has agreed to install a new trash enclosure and patch, sealcoat and restripe the entire parking lot.

Ms. Pandey stated that staff recommends approval of the Special Use Permit subject to the conditions listed on pages 4 & 5 in the staff report.

Chairman Pro-Tem Joseph asked if anyone from the audience had any questions.

There were no questions from the audience.

Chairman Pro-Tem Joseph asked if any of his fellow Commissioners had any questions.

Commissioner Petella wanted to know if the door to the freezer would open only to the inside of the restaurant. Commissioner Petella wanted to know what the freezer would look like from the outside and where the mechanical equipment would be for the freezer. Commissioner Petella wanted to know what type of machines would be in the slot room. Commissioner Petella wanted to know it the petitioner agreed to patching, sealcoating and restriping the parking lot.

Mr. Salahi stated that the freezer would only open to the inside of the restaurant. 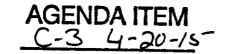

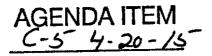

PC/ZBA Case 15058, Manhattan's American Bar & Grill: 300 S. Schmale Road Special Use Permit for Outdoor Seating, Ancillary to a Restaurant, Including

the Service and Consumption of Alcohol

Manhattan's American Bar & Grill is requesting approval of a Special Use Permit to allow an outdoor seating area. Outdoor seating area, ancillary to a restaurant, including the service and consumption of alcohol, is a Special Use in the B-3 General Retail District. The restaurant owner is planning an expansion project which includes building an outdoor seating area as a customer amenity and adding an outdoor freezer and a small video gaming room inside the building to accommodate the needs of the growing business.

The 782-square-foot outdoor deck with pergola is proposed as an addition at the rear of the building on an existing grass area. The deck would be enclosed with a four-foot high metal fence with an emergency egress gate. The gate would provide egress only from the deck, and the seating area could not be accessed from the parking lot. The deck would accommodate eight tables with seating for 32 people. The outdoor seating area would have outdoor speakers to play light music for the customers. and would also have a security camera installed which would be monitored by the restaurant staff inside the building. The installation of the outdoor freezer would result in the elimination of one parking space in the northwest corner of the building. An existing four-foot sidewalk on the north side of the proposed deck would be removed and replaced with landscaping. The deck on all three sides would be landscaped with evergreen shrubs. The outdoor seating area would be surrounded by parking on all sides of the deck. Each parking space would have a bollard installed to provide safety and protect against a possible vehicle impact to the deck area.

The staff report presenting the request, with supporting documentation, was transmitted to the Village Board with the PC/ZBA packet on April 10, 2015. At their April 13, 2015, meeting, by a vote of 6-0, the PC/ZBA recommended approval of the Special Use Permit to allow outdoor seating ancillary to a restaurant, including the service and consumption of alcohol, subject to the conditions recommended in the staff report.

If the Village Board concurs with the PC/ZBA recommendation for approval of a Special Use Permit to allow outdoor seating ancillary to a restaurant for Manhattan's American Bar & Grill at 300 S. Schmale Road, they should approve the Special Use Permit, subject to the conditions contained within the Ordinance, and adopt the necessary Ordinance.

Salt Purchase – Winter 2015/16 DuPage County Contract

Historically, the Village has ordered road salt through the State of Illinois CMS joint requisition program. For the 2014-15 winter season the Village split its salt purchase between the state program and a new DuPage County joint purchase opportunity. Our experience with the County program was positive both from the administrative end with the County and the delivery side.

Staff recently advised the County that it wished to participate in their joint purchase for the coming winter season, as did thirty-nine (39) other agencies throughout the County. The factors considered in favoring the County program over the state program are as follows:

- The State CMS program is increasingly unpredictable.
 - o Prices vary from one municipality to the next (this year prices ranged from \$55/ton to over \$120/ton)
 - o Due to the format of the CMS program some municipalities did not even receive a bid on their salt needs, leaving them to fend for themselves
- The **DuPage County** program is more flexible and predictable
 - o provides an early delivery option which we took advantage of this year
 - o allows a purchase range of 80% to 130% of base order (State range is 80% to 120%)
 - o all participants in the County program were covered by the contract (everyone got salt)
 - o all participants in the County program paid the same price per ton
- The diversification we hoped for in the current year by splitting the order between the state and county was not truly realized since our supplier under both contracts was Morton Salt. Therefore, had there been any supply problems we probably wouldn't have fared any better than if we had ordered through one or the other.

Under the Joint Purchasing Act the Village is able to secure goods and services under the same terms and conditions as were secured through a public bid conducted by another agency. Last year, DuPage County conducted a public bid for the purchase of road salt and included a provision for pricing to be extended to other municipal agencies. DuPage County Bid #14-084 was opened on April 17, 2014, with the following results for the early delivery option:

	COST
VENDOR	(per ton)
Morton Salt	\$70.44
Cargill De-icing	\$70.78
North American Salt	\$71.23
Detroit Salt	\$75.48

We have just been informed that Morton Salt has agreed to provide salt at the same price for the coming year. For comparison, the City of Naperville conducted their own bid last month and received prices above \$80/ton. The \$70.44/ton cost secured by the County program is very favorable to the Village compared to our budget assumptions:

- Budgeted = \$225,000
 - Assumptions:
 - \$75/ton
 - **3,000** tons
- Based upon an assessment of our stockpile a month earlier we advised the County we would want a base order of 2,100 tons (with option for anywhere from 80 130% of base order).
- Based upon their now secured price of \$70.44/ton:
 - o If we take base order of 2,100 tons our cost would be \$147,925 (\$77,075 under budget)
 - o If we take 130% of base order our cost would be \$192,300 (\$32,700 under budget)
 - o If we take 80% of base order our cost would be \$118,340 (\$106,660 under budget)

The Public Works Department recommends that the Board approve a Motion authorizing a base order of 2,100 tons (with an option to take between 80% and 130%) of rock salt from Morton Salt, Inc., in accordance with terms and conditions as established under DuPage County Bid #14-084.

Ratification of Change Order #1 - WRC Pump Rehab Project

On February 17, 2015, the Village Board approved a contract with DPS Equipment Services, Inc., for the WRC Pump Rehab Project in the amount of \$349,000.00. The project includes removal, sandblasting, inspection, re-flighting and re-coating of one primary and one secondary screw pump, along with removal and inspection of gear boxes associated with each pump.

The gear box for the primary screw pump revealed wear on a pinion gear in the gear reducer. The contractor and the construction engineer (CH2MHill) recommend replacement. In order to keep the project moving a field change order (copy attached) was approved by the Director of Public Works following consultation with, and authorization by, the Village Manager. The cost of the replacement is \$3,964; the project is approximately \$89,000 under the budgeted amount.

Staff recommends that the Mayor and Board approve a Motion ratifying Change Order #1 to the WRC Pump Rehab Project Project in the amount of \$3,964.00.

In September of 2014 the Village Board approved the "Local Agency Agreement for Federal Participation" to use ITEP funding to purchase temporary and permanent easements for the Fair Oaks/West Branch Bike Trail. It was estimated that \$96,000 would be required, with 50% from ITEP funds and 50% from Village and Township funds.

Since then, Santacruz Associates (the Village's property negotiator) has come to terms with the property owner for the cost to dedicate the easement. An offer of \$3,000 has been accepted by the Public Guardian and documents are ready to be recorded. After payment, the Village will receive 50% (\$1,500) from ITEP funds through IDOT and 25% (\$750) from the Township. Additional easements are also being purchased from two property owners on St. Charles and Fair Oaks Roads.

Engineering staff therefore recommends that payment of \$3,000 be made to; Gerald L. Berg and Jean L. Berg, as Trustees of Trust Agreement dated, the 14th day of January, 1989, and known as Trust Number 1

2015 Asphalt Restorative Sealer

During the recession, the Village began reducing the size of its asphalt overlay program, known as the "Flexible Pavement Project". This created a larger backlog of pavements that are in an advanced state of deterioration. Some of these problems have been addressed by increasing the size of our pavement patching projects, and restoring funding to the Flexible Pavement Project.

Currently, we have an Asphalt Rejuvenator Project that is used for pavements in good condition less than 10 years old. The product used is known as "GSB-88" and is not appropriate for older pavements. In order to keep these older pavements serviceable until they can be resurfaced with new asphalt, we are proposing to use a "Restorative Sealer" known as CRF designed to fill the gap between early preventative maintenance and total replacement.

Similar to the GSB-88, CRF is a proprietary product that is unable to be competitively bid. Staff therefore investigated and negotiated a proposal based on similar sized contracts in our area. This year we are proposing to apply restorative sealer to about 51,000 SY of residential streets that were paved about 12 years ago, and may need some patching, but still serviceable.

The negotiated price was \$1.17 per SY (last year was also \$1.17) for 50,992 SY and a total cost of \$59,660.64. This maintenance procedure was budgeted at \$417,000 for all restorative and rejuvenation projects, in the pavement maintenance portion of the Capital Improvements Program budget. Additional pavement rejuvenation projects will be awarded in the future.

Engineering staff recommends that the bid process be waived and the 2015 Asphalt Restorative Sealer Project be awarded to CAM, LLC of Sugar Grove in the amount of \$59,660.64.

WHEREAS, Village staff has prepared and presented to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream a proposed annual budget for the FY15/16 fiscal year beginning May 1, 2015, and ending April 30, 2016 as set forth in "Exhibit A" to this ordinance as attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, following due and proper publication of public notice in <u>The Examiner</u> on April 8, 2015, a public hearing was held on April 20, 2015, to consider the proposed annual budget for the FY15/16 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the proposed annual budget has been made conveniently available for public review and inspection at least 10 days prior to passage in the office of the Carol Stream Village Clerk, the Carol Stream Public Library and on the Village's web site, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream deem it in the best interest of the Village to adopt the budget proposed by the Budget Officer, as revised at the direction of the Mayor and Board of Trustees;

Now, Therefore, Be it Hereby Ordained by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, in the Exercise of its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

SECTION 1: The annual expenditure Budget for the FY15/16 fiscal year, beginning May 1, 2015, and ending April 30, 2016, for the Village of Carol Stream, is in the amount of Forty Eight Million Five Hundred Thirty Six Thousand Twenty Six Dollars, (\$48,536,026); as set forth in "Exhibit A", as attached hereto, is hereby adopted and authorized.

SECTION 2: That the adoption of the foregoing annual budget shall be in lieu of the Appropriation Ordinance required in Section 8-2-9 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

SECTION 3: The budget hereby approved shall be printed and bound and a certified copy of this Ordinance and a copy of the printed and bound budget shall be filed with the DuPage County Clerk in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 4: The Finance Director is authorized and directed to transfer the sum of

Two Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,100,000) from General Corporate Fund cash reserve balances to the Capital Projects Fund to support improvements to the Village's public infrastructure assets. This transfer is consistent with the Village's established policies and past practices with respect to reserve balances and continues to be the primary funding source for improvements to the Village's roadway, storm water, public facility and other infrastructure systems which are completed in the Capital Projects Fund.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT TO ALLOW AN OUTDOOR SEATING AREA ANCILLARY TO A RESTAURANT IN THE B-3 ZONING DISTRICT (MANHATTAN'S AMERICAN BAR & GRILL, 300 S. SCHMALE ROAD)

WHEREAS, Sindy Rogers, hereinafter referred to as the Petitioner, has petitioned the Village of Carol Stream for a Special Use Permit to allow an outdoor seating area ancillary to a restaurant in the B-3 Zoning District, as provided in Sections 16-9-3(C)(16) and (17) and Section 16-9-4(C)(1) of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, on the property legally described in Section 1 herein and commonly known as 300 S. Schmale Road, Carol Stream, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 16-15-8 of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals at regular meetings thereof, held a public hearing on the above petition on April 13, 2015, following proper legal notice of said public hearing, after which by a vote of 6 - 0 the Commission recommended to the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village that a Special Use Permit be approved; and

WHEREAS, the Combined Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its Findings and Recommendations regarding the Special Use with the Mayor and Board of Trustees, and the Mayor and Board of Trustees have duly considered said Findings and Recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS. IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS. AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

The Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village, after examining the Petitions for a Special Use Permit for an outdoor seating area and the Findings and Recommendations of the Combined Plan Commission / Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined and find that the requested Special Use Permit:

- 1. Is deemed necessary for the public convenience at the location. The applicant is attempting to expand the existing restaurant and offer the outdoor dining experience as requested for many years by its customers. Outdoor seating is a common amenity offered by many restaurants to grow business and enhance the dining experience. This use would serve the public convenience.
- 2. Will not be unreasonably detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort, or general welfare. Provided that employees are properly trained, as required, and proper care and supervision is provided in the service of alcoholic beverages, the requested Special Use should not be detrimental to or endanger public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare.
- 3. Will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish

and impair property values within the neighborhood. The restaurant is surrounded by similar uses in the business district. The restaurant with outdoor alcoholic beverage service should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity, nor substantially diminish or impair property values within the neighborhood.

- 4. Will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding property for uses permitted in the district. The restaurant serving alcoholic beverages and offering outdoor seating may draw additional customer traffic to the restaurant, which may be a catalyst for other improvement and property development in the area, and should not be an impediment to property improvement.
- 5. Will provide adequate utilities, access roads, drainage, and other important and necessary community facilities. Utilities and community facilities either have been or will be provided.
- 6. Will conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as such regulations may in each instance be modified by the Board of Trustees. The outdoor seating area is expected to operate and conform to all applicable regulations and any conditions of approval as determined by the Plan Commission and the Village Board.

SECTION 2:

A Special Use Permit is hereby approved and granted, subject to the conditions set forth in Section 3, to allow an outdoor seating area ancillary to a restaurant in the B-3 Zoning District upon the real estate commonly known as 300 S. Schmale Road, Carol Stream, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

Lot 1 in Leetz's Subdivision, being a subdivision of the south 200.0 feet of the east 650.0 feet (as measured at right angles) of the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 4, Township 39 North, Range 10 East of the Third Principal Meridian, (except that part lying easterly of the center line of State Aid Route 36 (Schmale Road), in the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois according to the plat thereof recorded August 22, 1977, as Document No. R77-73307.

SECTION 3:

The approval of the Special Use Permit granted in Section 2 herein is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That bollards must be placed at such locations as to prevent a vehicle from impacting the outdoor seating area, and the bollards must be of adequate design and installation as to withstand vehicular impact;
- 2. That the landscape materials must be installed as shown on the plan and that all materials must be maintained in a neat and healthy condition, with

dead or dying materials being replaced in accordance with the approved plan on an annual basis;

- 3. That all trash dumpsters and recycling containers placed outdoors must be kept within a code compliant trash enclosure, and that the enclosure gates must be closed and latched at all times, except when trash containers are being accessed by employees or emptied by the trash collection service;
 - 4. That a trash receptacle must be added within the outdoor dining area;
- 5. That four handicapped parking spaces must be provided, in accordance with the Illinois Accessibility Code requirements;
- 6. That a building permit must be obtained for the proposed trash enclosure and the parking lot maintenance work, which must include patching, sealcoating and restriping of the entire parking lot;
- 7. That parking spaces must be striped in accordance with the Village's looped striping detail;
- 8. That the restaurant and bar area must be adequately staffed by BASSET-trained Manhattan's employees and a security camera installed to ensure that the area where alcoholic beverages may be consumed will be properly monitored;
- 9. That the business and property must be operated and maintained in accordance with all applicable state, county and village codes and requirements.

SECTION 4:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form, provided, however, that this Ordinance is executed by the owners or such other party in interest, consenting to and agreeing to be bound by the terms and conditions contained within this Ordinance. Such execution and delivery to the Village shall take place within sixty (60) days after the passage and approval of this Ordinance or within such extension of time as may be granted in the discretion of the corporate authorities, by motion.

SECTION 5:

The failure of the owner or other party in interest, or a subsequent owner or other party in interest, to strictly comply with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance, after execution of this Ordinance, shall subject the owner or party in interest to the penalties set forth in Section 16-17-7 A and B of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, and/or termination of the special use permit after notice and public hearing in accordance with the procedures required by the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances.

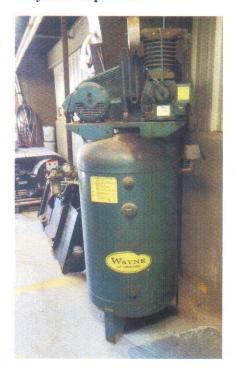

PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to request approval from the Village Board for the referenced vehicle to be declared surplus in order that it be disposed of and replaced with a new vehicle.

DISCUSSION

Community Development was assigned the 2002 Impala during 2014 for use by the contract Property Maintenance Inspector, after the vehicle was decommissioned by the Engineering Services Department. The vehicle is now 13 years old, and the Public Works Department's Garage Supervisor has judged that replacement would be more cost-effective than continued maintenance. The FY16 budget includes \$17,500 to replace the 2002 Impala with a new pickup truck, which would be assigned to one of the full-time Code Professionals, and that person's assigned vehicle would then be reassigned to the part-time Property Maintenance Inspector.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the 2002 Impala be declared surplus by the Mayor and Board of Trustees, and that the Community Development Director be authorized to dispose of the vehicle either by auction or by trade-in as part of the purchase of the budgeted replacement vehicle.

Engineering Services Agreement for Federal Participation Supplement No. 1 – West Branch/Fair Oaks Road Bike Trail

In January of 2014 the Village Board approved the original engineering services agreement with TranSystems for the referenced project. Since then there have been numerous changes in the scope of the project that have increased the cost of preparing construction drawings and negotiating easement acquisitions. These changes include; including additional cross sections and retaining walls to accommodate the changing topography along the road right-of-ways, designing storm sewer to avoid additional easement purchases, preparing additional exhibits and documents for property owners involved in easement acquisitions, and replacing intersection lighting at the request of Public Works.

The total amount requested for these changes is \$22,238.52. The original contract was for \$161,328, making the revised contract \$183,566.52. This amount is available in our Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) grant funding, however the remaining funds would not have been adequate to fully fund the construction engineering and inspection portion of the project. We have requested and received additional ITEP funding to cover the shortage and advised the Wayne Township Road District of the situation. This does not affect the actual construction funding (Surface Transportation Program) and is still within budget.

The memo to award the Construction Engineering Contract further explains the funding and how the additional ITEP funding is to be used. Engineering staff therefore recommends that the "Preliminary Engineering Services Agreement For Federal Participation Supplement #1" with TranSystems Corporation be approved in the amount of \$22,238.52 and four copies be sent to IDOT for their approval.

 prepared or obtained in accordance with this AGREEMENT shall be made available, upon request, to the LA or to the STATE,
 without restriction or limitation as to their use.

- 3. That all reports, plans, estimates and special provisions furnished by the ENGINEER shall be in accordance with the current Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, Bureau of Local Roads and Streets Administrative Policies, Federal-Aid Procedures for Local Highway Improvements or any other applicable requirements of the STATE, it being understood that all such furnished documents shall be approved by the LA and the STATE before final acceptance. During the performance of the engineering services herein provided for, the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any loss or damage to the documents herein enumerated while they are in the ENGINEER's possession and any such loss or damage shall be restored at the ENGINEER's expense.
- 4. That none of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall be sublet, assigned or transferred to any other party or parties without written consent of the LA. The consent to sublet, assign or otherwise transfer any portion of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall not be construed to relieve the ENGINEER of any responsibility for the fulfillment of this agreement.
- To maintain, for a minimum of 3 years after the completion of the contract, adequate books, records and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipients and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with the contract; the contract and all books, records and supporting documents related to the contract shall be available for review and audit by the Auditor General and the STATE; and to provide full access to all relevant materials. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the STATE for the recovery of any funds paid by the STATE under the contract for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.
- 6. The payment by the LA in accordance with numbered paragraph 3 of Section II will be considered payment in full for all services rendered in accordance with this AGREEMENT whether or not they be actually enumerated in this AGREEMENT.
- 7. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any and all damages to property or persons arising out of an error, omission and/or negligent act in the prosecution of the ENGINEER's work and shall indemnify and save harmless the LA, the STATE, and their officers, agents and employees from all suits, claims, actions or damages of any nature whatsoever resulting there from. These indemnities shall not be limited by the listing of any insurance policy.
- 8. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by the LA upon giving notice in writing to the ENGINEER at the ENGINEER's last known post office address. Upon such termination, the ENGINEER shall cause to be delivered to the LA all drawings, plats, surveys, reports, permits, agreements, soils and foundation analysis, provisions, specifications, partial and completed estimates and data, if any from soil survey and subsurface investigation with the understanding that all such material becomes the property of the LA. The LA will be responsible for reimbursement of all eligible expenses to date of the written notice of termination.
- 9. This certification is required by the Drug Free Workplace Act (30ILCS 580). The Drug Free Workplace Act requires that no grantee or contractor shall receive a grant or be considered for the purpose of being awarded a contract for the procurement of any property or service from the State unless that grantee or contractor will provide a drug free workplace. 1. Additional Cross Sections

Cross sections were proposed at intervals of 100 feet, but we decided to show them every 50 feet as the terrain is constantly changing and sections were needed more frequently to better represent the conditions. The additional cross sections also helped better define the proposed retaining walls. An additional 40 cross sheets were prepared as part of the final plans.

2. Additional Retaining Walls

We proposed to include the retaining wall design in our plan and profile sheets, but conditions required that we prepare four separate sheets for all the wall details.

3. Storm Sewer Design

Storm sewer was designed for the project at locations not originally scoped along Fair Oaks Road at Timber Lane, Lies Road to the retaining wall at Station 365+00, Judith Lane and Jason Court, and along St. Charles Road at Wayne Oaks and Benjamin Middle School.

4. Lighting

The Village wanted to replace the existing light poles in conflict with the proposed path alignment rather than relocate the existing poles. We prepared the helix foundation detail, pole detail, and specs for foundation, pole and luminaire. We also prepared a draft letter for Carol Stream to request the use of proprietary items.

5. Additional ROW Services

We proposed 32 hours for ROW services in addition to those by Santacruz to help prepare exhibits for property negotiations. The property owner negotiations have been challenging are requiring more of our time than originally proposed. We anticipate spending 36 hours beyond the original scope.

Engineering Services has received a proposal from TranSystems Corporation to provide construction management and material inspection services for the referenced project. The construction costs of the project are being funded through the Surface Transportation Program (STP) and engineering and easements are being funded through the Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP). Federal funding necessitates that special procedures and documentation be required beyond the expertise of Village staff.

The project is currently anticipated to be bid on a June or July IDOT Region One letting in Springfield. Easement acquisitions need to be certified prior to being considered for a bid letting date. To date, one easement has been acquired, another offer has been informally accepted, and one property is still in negotiations.

Costs have also increased since the original funding application was submitted in 2009, and a request for additional ITEP funding was approved this week in the amount of \$52,500. Increases to the Village and Township share of the engineering costs will be less than \$2,000 each, which is within the limits set by the Intergovernmental Agreement.

TranSystems Corporation has been involved with the project since its inception by helping to obtain the original and supplemental funding, and preparing preliminary and final engineering plans. The cost estimate for consultant services is \$180,613.24 of which 80% (\$144,490.59) will be paid with federal ITEP funds and the remaining 20% (\$28,891.12) will be split equally between the Township and Village (\$14,449.06 each). These amounts are within budget as is the estimated construction cost.

Engineering staff therefore recommends that the Construction Engineering Services Agreement For Federal Participation with TranSystems Corporation be approved in the amount of \$180,613.24.

- e. Inspection of all materials when inspection is not provided at the sources by the STATE BMPR, and submit inspection reports to the LA and the STATE in accordance with the STATE BMPR "Project Procedures Guide" and the policies of the STATE.
- f. For Quality Assurance services, provide personnel who have completed the appropriate STATE BMPR QC/QA trained technician classes.
- g. Inspect, document and inform the LA employee in Responsible Charge of the adequacy of the establishment and maintenance of the traffic control.
- h. Geometric control including all construction staking and construction levouts.
- i. Quality control of the construction work in progress and the enforcement of the contract provisions in accordance with the STATE Construction Manual.
- j. Measurement and computation of pay items.
- k. Maintein a daily record of the contractor's activities throughout construction including sufficient information to permit verification of the nature and cost of changes in plans and authorized extra work.
- I. Preparation and submission to the LA by the required form and number of copies, all partial and final payment estimates, change orders, records, documentation and reports required by the LA and the STATE.
- m. Revision of contract drawings to reflect as built conditions.
- Act as resident construction supervisor and coordinate with the LA employee in Responsible Charge.
- Engineering services shall include all equipment, Instruments, supplies, transportation and personnel required to perform the duties of the ENGINEER in connection with the AGREEMENT.
- 3. To furnish the services as required herein within twenty-four hours of notification by the LA employee in Responsible Charge,
- To attend meetings and visit the site of the work at any reasonable time when requested to do so by representatives of the LA or STATE
- 5. That none of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall be sublet, assigned or transferred to any other perty or parties without the written consent of the LA. The consent to sublet, assign or otherwise transfer any portion of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall not be construed to relieve the ENGINEER of any responsibility for the fulfillment of this AGREEMENT.
- 6. The ENGINEER shall submit involces, based on the ENGINEER's progress reports, to the LA employee in Responsible Charge, no more than once a month for partial payment on account for the ENGINEER's work completed to date. Such invoices shall represent the value, to the LA of the partially completed work, based on the sum of the actual costs incurred, plus a percentage (equal to the percentage of the construction engineering completed) of the fixed fee for the fully completed work.
- 7- That the ENGINEER is qualified technically and is entirely conversant with the design standards and policies applicable to improvement of the SECTION; and that the ENGINEER has sufficient properly trained, organized and experienced personnel to perform the services enumerated herein.
- 8. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for the accuracy of the ENGINEER's work and correction of any errors, omissions or ambiguitles due to the ENGINEER'S negligence which may occur either during prosecution or after acceptance by the LA. Should any damage to persons or property result from the ENGINEER's error, omission or negligent act, the ENGINEER shall indemnify the LA, the STATE and their employees from all accrued claims or liability and assume all restitution and repair costs arising from such negligence. The ENGINEER shall give immediate attention to any remedial changes so there will be minimal delay to the contractor and prepare such data as necessary to effectuate corrections, in consultation with and without further compensation from the LA.
- 9. That the ENGINEER will comply with applicable federal statutes, state of Illinois statutes, and local laws or ordinances of the LA.
- 10. The undersigned certifies neither the ENGINEER nor I have:
 - employed or retained for commission, percentage, brokerage, contingent fee or other considerations, any firm or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for me or the above ENGINEER) to solicit or secure this AGREEMENT;

- agreed, as an express or implied condition for obtaining this AGREEMENT, to employ or retain the services of any firm or person in connection with carrying out the AGREEMENT or
- c) paid, or agreed to pay any firm, organization or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for me or the above ENGINEER) any fee, contribution, donation or consideration of any kind for, or in connection with, procuring or carrying out the AGREEMENT.
- are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency;
- have not within a three-year period preceding the AGREEMENT been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against
 them for commission of fraud or criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain or performing a public
 (Federal, State or local) transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezziement, theft,
 forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements or receiving stolen property;
- are not presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a government entity (Federal, State or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph (e) of this certification; and
- have not within a three-year period preceding this AGREEMENT had one or more public transactions (Federal, State or local) terminated for cause or default.
- 11. To pay its subconsultants for satisfactory performance no later than 30 days from receipt of each payment from the LA.
- 12. To submit all Invoices to the LA within one year of the completion of the work called for in this AGREEMENT or any subsequent Amendment or Supplement.
- 13. To submit BLR 05613, Engineering Payment Report, to the STATE upon completion of the work called for in the AGREEMENT.
- 14. To be prequalified with the STATE in Construction Inspection when the ENGINEER or the ENGINEER's assigned staff is named as resident construction supervisor. The onsite resident construction supervisor shall have a valid Documentation of Contract Quantities certification.
- 15. Will provide, as required, project inspectors that have a valid Documentation of Contract Quantities certification.
- II. THE LA AGREES,
- To furnish a full time LA employee to be in Responsible Charge authorized to administer inherently governmental PROJECT
 activities.
- 2. To furnish the necessary plans and specifications.
- 3. To notify the ENGINEER at least 24 hours in advance of the need for personnel or services.
- 4. To pay the ENGINEER as compensation for all services rendered in accordance with this AGREEMENT, on the basis of the following compensation formulas:

- 5. To pay the ENGINEER using one of the following methods as required by 49 CFR part 26 and 605 ILCS 5/5-409:

 - a) For the first 50% of completed work, and upon receipt of monthly invoices from the ENGINEER and the approval thereof by the LA, monthly payments for the work performed shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER, such payments to be equal to 90% of the value of the partially completed work minus all previous partial payments made to the ENGINEER.
 - b) After 50% of the work is completed, and upon receipt of monthly invoices from the ENGINEER and the approval thereof by the LA, monthly payments covering work parformed shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER, such payments to be equal to 95% of the value of the partially completed work minus all previous partial payments made to the ENGINEER.
 - c) Final Payment Upon approval of the work by the LA but not later than 80 days after the work is completed and reports have been made and accepted by the LA and the STATE, a sum of money equal to the basic fee as determined in this AGREEMENT leas the total of the amounts of partial payments previously paid to the ENGINEER shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER.

- a) For progressive payments Upon receipt of monthly invoices from the ENGINEER and the approval thereof by the LA, monthly payments for the work performed shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER, such payments to be equal to the value of the partially completed work minus all previous partial payments made to the ENGINEER.
- b) Final Payment Upon approval of the work by the LA but not later than 60 days after the work is completed and reports have been made and accepted by the LA and STATE, a sum of money equal to the basic fee as determined in this AGREEMENT less the total of the amounts of partial payments previously paid to the ENGINEER shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER.
- 6. The recipient shall not discriminate on the basis on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the sward and performance of any DOT-assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The recipient shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts. The recipient's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by DOT, is incorporated by reference in this agreement. Implementation of finis program is a legal obligation and failure to carry out its terms shall be treated as violation of this agreement. Upon notification to the recipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the Department may impose sanctions as provided for under part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31U.S.C. 3801 et seq.).
- 7. To submit approved form BC 775 (Exhibit C) and BC 776 (Exhibit D) with this AGREEMENT.

III. It is Mutually Agreed.

- 1. That the ENGINEER and the ENGINEER's subcontractors will maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to cost incurred and to make such materials available at their respective offices at all reasonable times during the AGREEMENT period and for three years from the date of final payment under this AGREEMENT, for inspection by the STATE, Federal Highway Administration or any authorized representatives of the federal government and copies thereof shall be furnished if requested.
- That all services are to be furnished as required by construction progress and as determined by the LA employee in Responsible Charge. The ENGINEER shall complete all services specified herein within a time considered reasonable to the LA, after the CONTRACTOR has completed the construction contract.
- 3. That all field notes, test records and reports shall be turned over to and become the property of the LA and that during the performance of the engineering services herein provided for, the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any loss or damage to the documents herein enumerated while they are in the ENGINEER's possession and any such loss or damage shall be restored at the ENGINEER's expense.
- 4. That this AGREEMENT may be terminated by the LA upon written notice to the ENGINEER, at the ENGINEER's last known address, with the understanding that should the AGREEMENT be terminated by the LA, the ENGINEER shall be paid for any services completed and any services partially completed. The percentage of the total services which have been rendered by the ENGINEER shall be mutually agreed by the parties hereto. The fixed fee stipulated in numbered paragraph 4d of Section II shall be multiplied by this percentage and added to the ENGINEER's actual costs to obtain the earned value of work performed. All field notes, test records and reports completed or partially completed at the time of termination shall become the property of, and be delivered to, the LA.
- 5. That any differences between the ENGINEER and the LA concerning the interpretation of the provisions of this AGREEMENT shall be referred to a committee of disinterested parties consisting of one member appointed by the ENGINEER, one member appointed by the LA, and a third member appointed by the two other members for disposition and that the committee's decision shall be final.
- 6. That in the event the engineering and inspection services to be furnished and performed by the LA (including personnel furnished by the ENGINEER) shall, in the opinion of the STATE be incompetent or inadequate, the STATE shall have the right to supplement the engineering and inspection force or to replace the engineers or inspectors employed on such work at the excense of the LA.

- That the ENGINEER has not been retained or compensated to provide design and construction review services relating to the contractor's safety precautions, except as provided in numbered paragraph 1f of Section I.
- 3. This certification is required by the Drug Free Workplace Act (30ILCS 580). The Drug Free Workplace Act requires that no grantee or contractor shall receive a grant or be considered for the purpose of being awarded a contract for the procurement of any property or service from the State unless that grantee or contractor will provide a drug free workplace. False certification or violation of the certification may result in sanctions including, but not limited to, suspension of contract or grant payments, termination of a contract or grant and debarment of contracting or grant opportunities with the State for at least one (1) year but no more than five (5) years.

For the purpose of this certification, "grantee" or "contractor" means a corporation, partnership or other entity with twenty-five (25) or more employees at the time of issuing the grant, or a department, division or other unit thereof, directly responsible for the specific performance under a contract or grant of \$5,000 or more from the State, as defined in the Act.

The contractor/grantee certifies and agrees that it will provide a drug free workplace by:

- (a) Publishing a statement:
 - (1) Notifying employees that the unlewful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance, including cannabis, is prohibited in the grantee's or contractor's workplace.
 - (2) Specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition.
 - (3) Notifying the employee that, as a condition of employment on such contract or grant, the employee will:
 - (A) abide by the terms of the statement; and
 - (B) notify the employer of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than five (5) days after such conviction.
- (b) Establishing a drug free ewareness program to inform employees about:
 - (1) the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
 - (2) the grantee's or contractor's policy of maintaining a drug free workplace;
 - (3) any available drug counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance program; and
 - (4) the penalties that may be imposed upon an employee for drug violations.
- (c) Providing a copy of the statement required by subparagraph (a) to each employee engaged in the performance of the contract or grant and to post the statement in a prominent place in the workplace.
- (d) Notifying the contracting or granting agency within ten (10) days after receiving notice under part (8) of paragraph (3) of subsection (a) above from an employee or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction.
- (e) Imposing a sanction on, or requiring the satisfactory participation in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program by, any employee who is convicted, as required by section S of the Drug Free Workplace Act.
- (f) Assisting employees in selecting a course of action in the event drug counseling, treatment and rehabilitation is required and indicating that a trained referral team is in place.
- (g) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug free workplace through implementation of the Drug Free Workplace Act.
- 9. The ENGINEER or subconsultant shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the performance of this AGREEMENT. The ENGINEER shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR part 26 in the administration of DOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the ENGINEER to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this AGREEMENT, which may result in the termination this AGREEMENT or such other remedy as the LA deems appropriate.

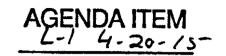
