# AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN PROPERTY TO THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS (200 W. NORTH AVENUE) PIN 02-32-301-017

WHEREAS, Bank Financial FSB, as trustee under a trust agreement dated December 20, 2006, and known as Trust Number 0914 and VP Ventures, LLC, as the beneficial interest holder of said trust, (the "Owners") duly executed and filed with the Village Clerk a petition for annexation requesting that the tract of land comprising approximately 5.4 acres, bounded by North Avenue on the north and legally described on the Plat of Annexation attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof (the "Property") be annexed to the Village of Carol Stream; and

WHEREAS, the Property is not within the corporate limits of any municipality, but is contiguous to the corporate limits of the Village of Carol Stream; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, in the exercise of its home rule authority, as follows:

# **SECTION 1:**

That the foregoing recitals be incorporated in this Ordinance as if restated in their entirety.

That the Property, and that part of unincorporated North Avenue contiguous thereto, be and the same are hereby annexed to and made a part of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois.

That the Village Clerk is hereby directed to record with the Recorder of Deeds and to file with the County Clerk a certified copy of this Ordinance, together with the Plat of Annexation attached hereto.

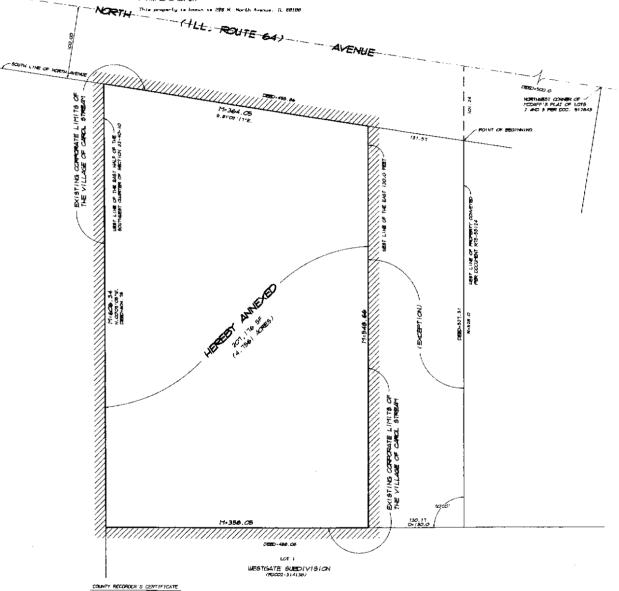

# **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this memorandum is to seek re-approval from the Village Board of the annexation of the 4.75-acre property at 200 W. North Avenue.

# BACKGROUND

The Community Development Department recently had occasion to evaluate the Village's corporate boundary, using a comparison of Village records versus DuPage County records. This evaluation resulted in the discovery of some discrepancies in the Village's corporate boundary. After further study, we determined that the discrepancies were the result of annexation ordinances and/or plats of annexation that were not recorded properly with the DuPage County Recorder. Consequently, DuPage County records reflect that several properties that the Village believed it had annexed technically remain unincorporated.

Staff provided information to the Village Attorney about each of the four properties that were not properly recorded, and depending on the specific circumstances of each case, the Village Attorney has provided guidance as to the actions that need to be taken to properly complete each annexation. Staff will be coordinating the final steps to properly record each annexation over the coming months. Village Board action will be required in each case.

# **DISCUSSION**

In 2008, the Village Board adopted Ordinance 2008-08-46, "An Ordinance Annexing Certain Property to the Village of Carol Stream (200 W. North Avenue)". The Village Board also adopted ordinances granting the zoning approvals necessary to allow for the development of a Value Place Hotel and an inline retail center on the property, which is located immediately west of the Brunswick Zone property at 170 W. North Avenue. Construction of that development never commenced.

As you know, Community Development has recently been working with a developer who is seeking formal zoning approvals to redevelop the Brunswick Zone property. The proposed redevelopment site includes the property at 200 W. North Avenue that was the subject of Ordinance 2008-08-46. As the Plan Commission/Zoning Board of Appeals public hearing regarding the proposed redevelopment of the properties at 170 and 200 W. North Avenue is scheduled for June 22, 2015, correction of the outstanding annexation issue involving the 200 W. North Avenue property is timely.

Although Ordinance 2008-08-46 was not properly recorded, the Village Attorney has advised that the previous owner of the 200 W. North Avenue property took all actions necessary with respect to the annexation agreement. They signed a Petition to Annex, filed the necessary documents for zoning approvals, and appeared during the public hearings. In this case, the original plat of annexation could not be located. Staff has worked with a registered surveyor in the area to have a new plat of annexation for the property prepared, which is attached to the Ordinance in this packet.

# RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Village Board take the necessary action to complete the annexation of the property at 200 W. North Avenue, as was originally directed in 2008. If the Village Board concurs, they should approve the plat of annexation and the ordinance annexing the property, which will then be recorded by the Village Clerk's office with the DuPage County Recorder of Deeds.

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An ACT regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works." approved June 26, 1941, as amended, (820 ILCS 130/1-12); and,

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village of Carol Stream employed in performing construction or public works for said Village of Carol Stream.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAROL STREAM, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of this Village is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in DuPage County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June of the current year, a copy

of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the Village of Carol Stream. The definition of any terms appearing in this ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of this Village to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Village this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The Village Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area that the determination of prevailing wages has been made, a notice of its determination in substantially the following form:

"Please take notice that the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Carol Stream, DuPage County, Illinois, has investigated and ascertained the prevailing rate of wages in accordance with Chapter 820 ILCS 130/1-12, Illinois Compiled Statutes, and that a copy of such determination is on file in the office of the Village Clerk of the Village of Carol Stream, and is available for public inspection by any interested party".

Such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of the Village of Carol Stream.

SECTION 7: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its p

DUPAGE COUNTY

IRON WORKERS AND FENCE ERECTOR (WEST) - West of Route 53.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

### EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

TRAFFIC SAFETY - work associated with barricades, horses and drums used to reduce lane usage on highway work, the installation and removal of temporary lane markings, and the installation and removal of temporary road signs.

### CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walis, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The bandling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

### COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN

Low voltage installation, maintenance and removal of telecommunication facilities (voice, sound, data and video) including telephone and data inside wire, interconnect, terminal equipment, central offices, PABX, fiber optic cable and equipment, micro waves, V-SAT, bypass, CATV, WAN (wide area networks), LAN (local area networks), and ISDN (integrated system digital network), pulling of wire in raceways, but

not the installation of raceways.

MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all material that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installation of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone, granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and exteriors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and exterior which are installed in a similar manner.

MATERIAL TESTER I: Hand coring and drilling for testing of materials; field inspection of uncured concrete and asphalt.

MATERIAL TESTER II: Field inspection of welds, structural steel, fireproofing, masonry, soil, facade, reinforcing steel, formwork, cured concrete, and concrete and asphalt batch plants; adjusting proportions of bituminous mixtures.

## IANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

MATERIAL TESTER & MATERIAL TESTER/INSPECTOR I AND II

Notwithstanding the difference in the classification title, the classification entitled "Material Tester I" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector I". Likewise, the classification entitled "Material Tester II" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester II" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector II".

# **DEFINITION:**

Under the direction of the Finance Director, performs a variety of professional, supervisory and technical duties related to the accounting functions of the Village. Oversees the daily operations of the Financial Management Department including general ledger accounting, utility billing, cash receipts and accounts receivable, accounts payable and purchasing, payroll, vehicle and business registration, parking citations, cash management and general customer service. Responsibilities include the supervision and training of department staff.

- Ensures completion and timely filing of all audit-related compliance reports including Annual Treasurer's Report, State Comptroller's Annual Financial Report (AFR), TIF Reports, Department of Insurance Annual Report for the Police Pension Fund and continuing bond disclosures as required.
- Oversees the operation of the Department's financial software products. Acts as liaison between internal
  Information Systems staff and software vendor to ensure timely upgrades. Coordinates training as needed to
  internal staff on new software features and functions. Acts as local administrator for user credentials and
  permissions.
- Provides support in the preparation of the annual Village Budget. Assists in the preparation of the Financial Management Department budget. Assists the Finance Director and other departments with budget analysis and preparation of various reports to facilitate preparation of year end estimates and budget projections.
- Prepares spreadsheets, analysis, develops and maintains databases and ad hoc reports, prepares correspondence, writes reports and develops operating policies. Designs and implements appropriate internal control policies and procedures.
- Prepares various monthly financial statements and reports including operating reports, balance sheets, water billing analysis and statement of investments.
- Ensures compliance with all State and Federal regulatory requirements related to employment taxes, vendor
  payments and grants.
- Addresses inquiries and complaints from citizens and others regarding services provided by the department.
   Ensures maintenance of high customer service standards.

- Provides supervision, training, and guidance for department staff, including regular performance feedback and annual performance evaluations. Coordinates department workflow, job assignments and leave requests.
- Maintains departmental records in compliance with required retention parameters. Coordinates the disposal
  of records as permitted.

- · Performs in a backup capacity for payroll and accounts payable.
- Performs other duties as required or assigned which are reasonably within the scope of the duties enumerated above.

Given the recent resignation of Assistant Finance Director, the turnover in the position provides us the opportunity to reflect upon the needs of the Village and what changes in the position, if any, would lend themselves to the continued efficiency and effectiveness of the Finance Department.

After considering the nature of work performed by the Assistant Finance Director position over the past number of years, the job duties needed in that position fall more inline with the position description of Accounting Manager. While the Accounting Manger will still provide primary supervision of the Accountant and Accounts Clerk positions within the department, many of the higher level operational planning and strategic direction functions will be transferred to the Finance Director. Eliminating the Assistant Finance Director position and replacing it with an Accounting Manager position may also provide for a more logical future promotional path from Accountant to Accounting Manager.

The attached job description for Accounting Manager was prepared and reviewed by Employee Relations Director Caryl Rebholz. The job description and corresponding salary range was developed from similar positions within our municipal marketplace. Based on the most currently adopted Pay Plan (FY14/15), salary ranges for the Assistant Finance Director and proposed Accounting Manager position are as follows:

Assistant Finance Director (delete) \$81,314.04 - \$115,749.52

Accounting Manager (add) \$72,376.61 - \$103,027.20

### EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 15th day of June, 2015, by and between the Village of Carol Stream, a municipal corporation (hereinafter called "Employer"), and Joseph E. Breinig, (hereinafter called "Employee"), both parties agreeing as follows:

WHEREAS, the Employer desires to employ the services of the Employee as a Village Administrator of the Village of Carol Stream, which position may also be referred to as the Village Manager; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing Board of the Village, (hereinafter called "Board"), to provide certain benefits, establish certain conditions of employment and to set working conditions of the Employee; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board to secure and retain the services of the Employee and to provide inducement for him to remain in such employment; and

WHEREAS, the Employee desires to enter into a contractual arrangement with the Village wherein he shall serve as Village Manager for a period up to April 30, 2019, subject to his ability to properly perform the duties of Village Manager and to the conditions of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to provide a system whereby stability can be achieved if a need for a transition period should occur.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENANTS HEREIN CONTAINED, THE PARTIES AGREE, as follows:

- 1. <u>Duties</u>: The Employer hereby agrees to employ the Employee as Village Manager of the Village of Carol Stream in accordance with all of the provisions of the Carol Stream Code of Ordinances, which relate to the performance of that office. The Village Manager shall devote his full-time efforts to the performance of the duties of the position.
- 2. <u>Term</u>: The term of this Agreement shall be from May 1, 2015 to April 30, 2019. The employee, however, may terminate the contract by giving a minimum of sixty (60) days written notice to the Mayor. All compensation provided for in this Agreement, except for accrued benefits, including severance pay, shall cease upon the last day of the Employee's performance of full-time duties for the village in the event that the termination of the contract shall be exercised by the Employee. This Agreement is intended to establish contractual rights but not tenure or property rights.

3. Severance Pay: The Mayor after receiving a majority vote of the Board, may terminate this Agreement during its term without the requirement of stating any reason for such termination. Provided, however, in the event the Employer elects this method of terminating the Agreement or in the event that the Employee resigns, pursuant to a request of the Employer, Employee shall receive all salary and earned benefits accrued up to the date of termination and shall receive severance pay equal to four (4) months of his then-current salary and payment of all earned and accrued leaves and benefits. The Employee shall have the option of taking such severance pay in a lump sum or remaining on the Village payroll register and having the severance pay paid him on regular Village pay dates. In the event the Employee shall elect the latter option, he shall not be considered an employee for the calculation of earned benefits. Employer agrees to allow Employee to remain in the group health, life and dental insurance program and, with the Employer paying the full premiums for his then current coverages for four (4) months. Employee may remain in the insurance programs thereafter under the terms and conditions and paying the premiums in accordance with State or Federal Law.

The Board, by a majority vote, may also terminate this Agreement for just cause after affording Employee a hearing. In the event Employee is terminated for just cause, then, in that event, the Employer shall have no obligation to pay the Employee severance or continuing severance. Just cause is defined as (1) conviction of a felony, or (2) conviction of a crime relating to the performance of the job, or (3) violation of any terms of this Agreement, or (4) violation of the village's personnel regulations which would justify dismissal.

- 4. **Salary**: The salary for the first year of the contract from May 1, 2015 to April 30, 2016, shall be \$179,588.43. The salary for following years shall be at least at the level established for the prior year, plus a general wage adjustment granted to all other non-contract employees for the fiscal year. In addition, Employee shall be eligible to receive a performance increase on the same basis as for executive employees based upon a performance evaluation.
- 5. In addition to the salary provided in paragraph 4 of the Employment Agreement, and increases in that salary computed in accordance with Paragraph 4, the Employer shall, effective with the compensation applicable to May, 2015, and for the remaining term of this Agreement, pay as additional deferred compensation to the Employee the amount of one percent (1%) of the base salary into a qualifying deferred compensation plan selected by the Employee and approved by the Employer. The plan offered by the International City Managers Association shall be an automatically approved plan.
- 6. **Employee Evaluation**: The Board may review and evaluate the performance of the Manager as the Board determines necessary. This review and evaluation may focus upon specific criteria developed jointly by the Employee and the Board. Further, the Mayor shall, at the request of the Manager, provide him with a summary of the findings of the board, which, at his request, shall be in writing, and provide an adequate opportunity for the Employee to discuss his/her evaluation with the Board. This review

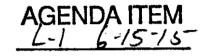
- shall take place in the last quarter of each fiscal year and the Employee shall annually notify the Mayor and Board of this obligation.
- 7. Hours of Work: It is recognized that the Employee must devote a great deal of time outside the normal office hours to the business of the employer and to that end, the Employee will be allowed to take reasonable administrative time off as he shall deem appropriate during said normal office hours.
- 8. Automobile: Employee's duties require that he shall have the exclusive use at all times during his employment with the Employer of an automobile provided to him by the Employer. The automobile may be used for business and personal purposes and the Employer shall be responsible for paying for liability, property damage and comprehensive insurance and for the purchase, operation, maintenance, repair and regular replacement of said automobile. The Village shall provide gasoline for local personal purposes. As an option, Employee may choose to accept a \$400 per month car allowance paid by Employer to Employee in lieu of providing an automobile. In such event, the Employee agrees to utilize his personal car for business purposes. If such personal car is unavailable due to repair, Employee may use another Village vehicle.
- 9. <u>Vacation, Sick Leave and Personal Leave</u>: The Employee shall be entitled to vacation, personal day, holiday, bereavement, sick leave and other leave benefits as are provided to other senior executive exempt personnel.
- 10. Health, Dental and Life Insurance: The Employer shall provide for the Employee, at the full expense of the Employer, life insurance in the amount of two (2) times the Employee's annual salary. Provided, however, that, in the event that life insurance premiums on the Employee are at least twice the amount of insurance premiums previously paid, the Employer shall have the option of paying twice the amount of the prior premium to the Employee as a cash payment to substitute for the required life insurance coverage. The Employer shall provide for the Employee and his dependents such other insurance including group health and dental insurance, as is generally provided to the other senior exempt employees of the Village, including premium payment, deductible and co-payment amounts generally applicable.
- 11. **Dues and Subscriptions**: The Employer agrees to budget and to pay for the reasonable professional dues and subscription of the Employee necessary for his participation in national, regional, State and local associations and organizations desirable for his professional participation, growth and advancement and for the good of the Employer.
- 12. Professional Development: Employer hereby agrees to budget for and to pay the reasonable travel and subsistence expenses of the Employee for professional and official travel, meetings and occasions adequate for Employee's professional development and to adequately pursue necessary official and other functions of the Employer, including, but not limited to the annual Conference of the International City/County Management Association, the State League of Municipalities and such other national, regional, State and local governmental groups and committees thereof which Employee serves as a member. Employer also agrees to budget and pay for the travel and subsistence expenses of Employee for short courses,

institutes and seminars that are necessary for his professional development and for the good of the Employer.

- 13. Other Benefits: In addition to the benefits mentioned in this Agreement, the Employee shall also be entitled to any other benefits now in force or added later to those benefits generally granted senior executive exempt employees of the Village.
- 14. <u>Indemnification</u>: Employer agrees to indemnify and defend the Employee in the manner required by State law and to pay the full cost of any fidelity or other bond required of the Employee.
- 15. **No Reduction of Benefits**: Employer shall not at any time during the term of this Agreement reduce the salary, compensation or other financial benefits of the Employee except to the degree such a reduction similarly affects all senior executive exempt employees.
- 16. Only Agreement: This Agreement shall reflect all of the negotiations of the parties and shall supercede all other earlier agreements or promises.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, the Employer has caused this Agreement to be signed and executed on its behalf by the Mayor and duly attested by its Village Clerk and the Employee has signed and executed this Agreement by adding his name hereto.
